## The Obama Timeline – Part II

## The Doomed Presidency

August 2014

On August 1—after a mere 90 minutes—Hamas (which perhaps confused hours with minutes) violates a 72-hour cease fire with Israel with a suicide bombing, an attack on Israeli forces, and the hostage-taking of an Israeli soldier by dragging him into one of its children-dug terror tunnels. [The Israelis later report that the abducted soldier, Hadar Goldin, was killed in the action.] A naive Secretary of State John Kerry expresses shock that the terrorists would violate the cease fire, and states, "Hamas, which has security control over the Gaza Strip, must immediately and unconditionally release the missing Israeli soldier, and I call on those with influence over Hamas to reinforce this message. The international community must now redouble its efforts to end the tunnel and rocket attacks by Hamas terrorists on Israel and the suffering and loss of civilian life." The somewhat less naive White House press secretary, John Earnest, calls the Hamas action a "rather barbaric violation" of the cease fire. Israel responds with tank fire and air strikes. Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu says Hamas fighters will "bear the consequences of their actions." [62299, 62307, 62308, 62312, 62319, 62325, 62345, 62370, 62373, 62378]

In a letter to United Nations Secretary General Ban Ki-moon, Israeli Ambassador to the U.N. Ron Prosor calls for a condemnation of Hamas and states, "While Israel agreed to this cease-fire to allow humanitarian relief for the people of Gaza, Hamas agreed so that it could plan and carry out an attack and kidnap a soldier. Hamas has sent hundreds of suicide bombers into our cities and towns and kidnapped our children. In the last month, Hamas has also launched 3,073 rockets into Israel. How much more evidence is needed before the United Nations will finally designate Hamas as a terrorist organization and call for its disarmament?" [62308]

Remarkably, at an emergency meeting of the United Nations Human Rights Council, U.N. High Commissioner for Human Rights Navi Pillay not only criticizes Israel for its operation in Gaza, she absurdly complains that it is not fair that it protects its own citizens with its Iron Dome missile defense system: "No such protection has been provided to Gazans against the shelling." (She stops short of demanding that Israel provide Hamas with ammunition for its weapons.) [62343, 62344]

Michael Scheuer, who headed the CIA's Osama Bin Laden unit during 1995–1999, appears on *Fox & Friends* and refutes Clinton's claim that the risk of killing civilians led him to reject a request to go after Osama bin Laden. (Scheuer's appearance is prompted by the release of an audio recording of Clinton telling an audience on September *10*, 2001 that he would have had to "destroy a little town called Kandahar in Afghanistan and kill 300 innocent women and children, and then I would have been no better than him [bin

Laded]." Of course, by supposedly saving 300 innocent lives, Clinton paved the way for the loss of more than 3,000 lives on September 11, the day after his speech.) Scheuer counters that the attack "would have killed no one but Taliban people... and Osama bin Laden and his crew. ... What really disgusted me about it [Clinton's statement] is, not only is he a liar, ... what papers do you think Sandy Berger stole out of the archives...?" (In 2005 former Clinton National Security Advisor Berger was sentenced to 100 hours of community service and probation and fined \$50,000 for illegally removing highly classified documents from the National Archives and intentionally destroying some of them. What Berger destroyed and why he destroyed it remains a mystery, but it is almost certain that his actions were intended to protect Clinton.) Scheuer calls Clinton "a monumental liar" and a "coward" who failed on several occasions to kill Osama bin Laden when he had the opportunity. (For the record, Kandahar is not a "small town." It is the second largest city in Afghanistan. Its population is about 500,0000. Timeline readers are well aware that Obama's National Security Advisor, Susan Rice, persuaded Clinton to not accept Sudan's offer to turn over bin Laden. Former Clinton staffer Mansoor Ijaz stated that efforts to capture or kill Osama bin Laden were "overruled every single time by the State Department, by Susan Rice and her cronies, who were Hell-bent on destroying the Sudan." The anti-Semite Rice, wife of ABC news producer Ian Cameron, also encouraged Clinton to do nothing to stop the Rwanda genocide. Russia grants NSA whistleblower Edward Snowden an additional three years of asylum. [62600]

Former Congressman Barney Frank (D-MA) tells HuffingtonPost.com, "The [ObamaCare] rollout was so bad, and I was appalled—I don't understand how [Obama] could have sat there and not been checking on that on a weekly basis. But frankly, he should never have said as much as he did, that if you like your current health care plan, you can keep it. That wasn't true. And you shouldn't lie to people. And they just lied to people. ...He should have said, 'Look, in some cases the health care plans that you've got are really inadequate, and in your own interests, we're going to change them. But that's not what he said. Any smart political adviser would have said, 'Don't lie to people, because you're gonna [sic] get caught up in it and it's gonna [sic] have this tsunami that you now have. My political motto, very simple. I have always told the truth, and nothing but the truth—but I don't volunteer the whole truth in every situation." (At Townhall.com Rich Galen writes, "Barney Frank isn't endorsing Ted Cruz for President any time soon and still supports Obamacare, but that quote will likely show up in political ads this Autumn.") The Department of Labor reports that only 209,000 jobs were added in July, and the employment rate increased from 6.1 to 6.2 percent. The number of unemployed women increased by 227,000 in July. About 11.4 million Americans have left the workforce since Obama entered the White House. According to CNSNews.com, "In July 2014, there were 92,001,000 Americans, 16 and over, who were classified as 'not in the labor force,' meaning they not only did not have a job, but they didn't actively seek one in the last four

weeks. This number has increased by 11,472,000 since January 2009, when the number of Americans not in the labor force was 80,529,000." There are about 147.265 million workers in the United States; in 2007 the number was about 147.315 million. There are therefore fewer Americans working than before Obama took office—despite the fact that the population has grown substantially during the same period. Fewer people are working and providing for more who are not working. (It is worth noting that the unemployment rate does not, of course, reflect "forced retirements"—individuals who want to work but lost their jobs and happened to be old enough to collect retirement benefits. They may be retired, but would rather actually keep working. One study suggest that as many as 15 percent of retirements since 2008 have been a result of the bad economy, rather than an actual desire to retire.) [62327, 62328, 62347, 62351, 62352, 62635]

Economist Peter Schiff tells Finance. Yahoo.com, "People are losing their full-time jobs, housing is terrible, the price of food and utilities are rising. The economy is rolling over and the euphoric effects of cheap money are wearing off. ... The economy is not recovering the way the Fed believes it is and all [Federal Reserve Board chairman Janet Yellen] can do is buy more bonds, buy more mortgages, and print more money. This will help in the short run but undermine the economy in the long run." [62333, 62334]

CNSNews.com reports that Congresswoman Rosa DeLauro (D-CT) introduced this week the Sugar-Sweetened Beverages Tax (SWEET Act), which aims to institute a tax of one cent per teaspoon—4.2 grams—of sugar, high fructose corn syrup or caloric sweetener." (Although the manufacturers of beverages will have to pay the tax, it will obviously be passed on to consumers in the form of higher prices.) [62426]

At a press conference, Obama says, "We have unequivocally condemned Hamas and the Palestinian factions that were responsible for killing two soldiers, and abducting a third, almost minutes after a ceasefire was announced. That soldier needs to be unconditionally released, as soon as possible. ... I think it's going to be very hard to put a ceasefire back together again if Israel and the international community aren't comfortable if Hamas can follow through [sic]....No country can tolerate missiles raining down on its cities... no county can or would tolerate tunnels being dug under their land..." Obama says the economy is "booming." (It is not. A mere 209,000 jobs were created in July, which is not even enough to keep up with population growth. About 44,000 of the 209,000 jobs went to 16–19 year olds; another 159,000 went to workers age 55–69. That leaves a mere 6,000 for everyone else—including more than two million college graduates each year.) Amazingly, Obama also says, "we tortured some folks" when discussing the Senate report that reviewed the CIA's interrogation and detention policies: "In the immediate aftermath of 9/11, we did some things that were wrong. We did a whole lot of things that were right, but we tortured some folks. We did things that were contrary to our values. That's what that report reflects... The character of our country has to be measured in part not by what we do when things are easy but what we do when things are hard [sic; difficult]." (To admit that terrorist detainees—which he calls "folks"—were mistreated by the CIA and to use the word torture when many would disagree with the description, is giving propaganda ammunition to America's enemies. Obama either does not care or is blissfully unaware that he is doing so.) Shamelessly, Obama asks, "I thought that you guys were going to ask me how I was going to spend my birthday." (Obama's birthday is August 4. The Republican National Committee plans to send him a copy of the U.S. Constitution as a gift, hoping he might perhaps read it.) Obama also says, "If I had the power to raise the federal minimum wage on my own, or enact fair pay and paid leave for every worker on my own, or make college more affordable on my own, I would have done so already. If I could do all that, I would have gotten everything done in like [sic] my first two years." (In other words, "If I could just be made dictator, I would not have to deal with Congress.") Obama, of course, does not address the fact that "fair pay" has been federal law since 1964, nor does he mention the cost of "paid leave" for workers, nor does he explain how he could magically "make college more affordable." (One cannot simply issue an executive order decreeing that college be made "more affordable." He would have to lower the cost of higher education—a task which would involve measures he would be unwilling to take.) [62425]

At Townhall.com University of Maryland economist Peter Morici later notes, "The jobless rate may be down from its recession peak of 10 percent, but much of this results from adults, discouraged by the lack of decent job openings, have quit altogether. They are neither employed nor looking for work [and are therefore not counted as "unemployed" by the government, even though they are]. ...Many Americans who would like full time jobs are stuck in part-time positions, because businesses can hire desirable part-time workers to supplement a core of permanent, full-time employees, but at lower wages. And Obamacare's employer health insurance mandates will not apply to workers on the job less than 30 hours a week. ...The economy has created only about 6 million new jobs during the Bush-Obama years, whereas the comparable figure during the Reagan-Clinton period was about 40 million. A recent study by the Center for Immigrants, whereas none were created for native-born Americans. ...Since 2000, GDP growth has averaged 1.7 per year, whereas during the Reagan-Clinton years, it was 3.4 percent." With Senators leaving town for their August recess and the House still trying to put together some type of immigration legislation, Obama says, "I'm going to have to act alone because we don't have enough resources. In the end, the challenge I have right now is that they are not able to act even on what they say their priorities are." (It should be noted that Obama had pledged to veto the House bill that had been proposed by Republicans anyway, so it hardly makes any difference whether they pass a bill.) Michael Steel, spokesman for House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH), states, "When it comes to the humanitarian crisis on our southern border, …Obama has been completely AWOL—in fact, he has made matter worse by flip-flopping on the 2008 law that fueled the crisis. Senate Democrats have left town without acting on his request for a border supplemental.

Right now, House Republicans are the only ones still working to address this crisis." [62323]

Colorado begins issuing drivers licenses and identification cards to illegal immigrants. [62303]

Congressman Luis Gutierrez (D-IL) criticizes Republicans for not passing immigration legislation, saying, "It is almost as if they despise all of our children." (Gutierrez apparently does not understand that "our" children" are U.S. citizens—not the citizens of Mexico, El Salvador, Honduras, and Guatemala. The border crossers are not only from those four nations, of course. Illegal immigrants from west Africa, the Middle East, and China are also entering the United States via Mexico.) Congressman Tony Cardenas (D-CA) charges, "Republicans want to indiscriminately return children to their deaths!" [62297, 62329, 62401]

CNN's Dana Bash, who one day earlier chastised House Republicans for not passing immigration legislation, decides to instead criticize them for trying to do something. She tweets, "There is something surreal about all this gop effort to pass a house border bill that's going no where & never was. Total show vote—" (Bash, born Dana Ruth Schwartz, was married to Jeremy Bash and then CNN's John King; they separated in 2012. Bash's father is an ABC News producer.) [62298]

Ayaan Hirsi Ali, a Somalian refugee and human rights activist now living in the United States and who was raised as a Muslim, tells IsraelHayom.com, "This is not naiveté anymore. This is called wishful thinking. They say that Islam is a religion of peace and compassion, but that is what we want, that is what it should be, it's not what it is. There's a difference. We're just not being realistic. I think that the State of Israel is different. You are living in a hornets' nest. Israelis cannot pretend for too long, if you have tunnels being dug under you and rockets flying above you. ... Every Friday my father and brother had to go to a mosque [while living in Saudi Arabia], and on their way back they sometimes walked by the 'chop chop' square, where people's hands were cut off, people were flogged, people were stoned, people's heads were cut off. That is the Islam of Hamas. Back in the 1970s it seemed to me that it was a Saudi thing, but now it has become an international thing. ... You can negotiate with fellow human beings with whom you have some kind of common ground. The assumption as we negotiate is that there is fair play. The problem with negotiating with Hamas is that they have a vision, a certain kind of utopia. And for that utopia to be realized, the State of Israel must be completely destroyed. Shariah law has to be established, ideally, all over the world. [They believe] You can never trust a Jew, you can never trust a Christian. That is the utopia. Women have to behave a certain way, they have to be locked up, it is very totalitarian. You can negotiate until you are as blue in the face as the American flag, but it will never yield anything on the other side." [62288, 62289]

The Hamas fighters will eagerly sacrifice their lives, says Ali, "because of their philosophy on life and death. They welcome death, death, death. In the Hamas narrative,

which is also the Wahabi narrative and the Salafi narrative, you get to ecstasy and self actualization after you die, not before you die-don't be silly. So now you have millions of people who welcome death, and that is very confusing for Westerners to understand. They do not want to understand. For somebody like John Kerry it is too much to understand. It is illogical for us. Our logic is that we love life. ... It is so clear what is going to happen. All these countries that are now condemning Israel will find themselves in exactly the same position as Israel. Some countries more than others. They will have young [Muslim] populations that are having many more children than they are, who are high on this doctrine of death. They will be faced with completely revamping their ideas and ideals. You can already see in countries like England, where the Islamist population is very big. In France they've given up in a way. Belgium is another country very few people talk about. I was [a member of] parliament in The Hague; there is a neighborhood now called the Shariah triangle. There is a Shariah triangle in Brussels and in many other places." Ali ridicules his calls for a cease fire in Gaza: "If there was an organization like Hamas on the Mexican border or the Canadian border with the U.S., and a foreign power would say to Obama 'you have to sign a cease-fire,' he would not agree. No American would agree. No one in the world would accept that. ... For the Israeli government, like all governments, the first obligation is to protect the citizens from domestic and external threats. The removal of the tunnels built by Hamas is a number one priority for the Israeli government. It doesn't matter what people outside of the Israel say. If I were an Israeli citizen I would expect that." [62288, 62289, 62687]

The U.S. Senate approves \$225 million in spending for new Iron Dome system components to enable Israel to maintain its missile defense system. Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) states, "The Iron Dome missile defense system has played a critical role in defending Israel's population from rocket attacks launched by Hamas from within the Gaza Strip. The Iron Dome system will remain essential to Israel's security until a cease fire is achieved, and it will remain vital afterwards as well, because this defensive system helps blunt the impact of one of Hamas' preferred tools of terror. By passing this bipartisan measure, we send a message to Hamas that its terrorist tactics and its attempts to terrorize Israel's populace will not succeed. And we can help Israel defend its civilian population against indiscriminate attacks as it continues its campaign—Operation Protective Edge—to destroy the often-Iranian-supplied weapons stockpiled within Gaza." (In the House, socialist Muslim Congressman Keith Ellison—whose real name is Hakim Muhammad—votes against the legislation.) [62312, 62437, 62438]

Rabbis Marvin Hier and Abraham Cooper, of the Simon Wiesenthal Center, state, "Mr. Kerry rushed to Jerusalem to pressure Israel to accept yet another ceasefire with terrorist Hamas. Less than 90 minutes later two Israeli soldiers were dead and an Israeli soldier kidnapped by the terrorists. He should now rush back to the region with no other agenda than obtaining the immediate release of the kidnapped Israeli soldier. He should insist that Qatar and other supporters of Hamas demand the soldier's immediate release. Israel has the full support of world Jewry to permanently eliminate the threat of Hamas. The Wiesenthal Center further demands that European leaders... arrest all those involved in

the explosion of violent anti-Semitism across the continent by supporters of Hamas." [62312, 62477]

Algemeiner.com reports, "Gershon Baskin, who has been Israel's top negotiator on Hamas matters and was a key figure in the talks over kidnapped soldier Gilad Shalit, tweets: '[The] Al Qassam [brigade] just signed the death sentenced of many Hamas leaders. There will not be another Schalit deal.'" [62312]

At Townhall.com Mona Charen reports, "Last week, *The Washington Post's* Tehran, Iran, correspondent was arrested. The charges are unspecified, but according to the paper, Jason Rezaian, 38; his Iranian wife, Yeganeh Salehi; and two other U.S. citizens were detained. State Department spokesman Marie Harf issued a protest that didn't even rise to the level of tepid, saying 'Our highest priority is the safety and welfare of U.S. citizens abroad.' Reassured? Rezaian and the others join a list of Americans held captive—many for years and years." [62305]

The Washington Post obtains a copy of a "global warming" memorandum from Senator Patty Murray (D-WA) that essentially gives Democrat Senators canned "talking points" to use as they discuss "climate change" with their constituents. Murray warns that warmer weather "will put added stress on bridge supports and public transit systems, requiring substantial additional investment." She claims that "climate change, if left unaddressed, will add tens and potentially hundreds of billions of dollars in fiscal costs over the next decade alone, with much larger costs in later decades. ... Without action, climate change will undoubtedly affect our country's ability to produce goods and services, costing jobs and weakening growth. These effects are already being felt due to events such as Hurricane Sandy-which was estimated to have caused \$65.7 billion in economic damage—as well as the massive droughts gripping parts of the country." DailyCalelr.com writes, "Democratic claims that 'extreme weather' was becoming more common as carbon dioxide levels increase have been disputed by scientists who say the data tells a different story. 'It is misleading and just plain incorrect to claim that disasters associated with hurricanes, tornadoes, floods or droughts have increased on climate timescales either in the United States or globally,' University of Colorado climate scientist Dr. Roger Pielke said in his testimony before the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee last year. 'It is further incorrect to associate the increasing costs of disasters with the emission of greenhouse gases.' 'Hurricanes have not increased in the U.S. in frequency, intensity or normalized damage since at least 1900,' Pielke added. 'The same holds for tropical cyclones globally since at least 1970.'" Congressman Eric Cantor (R-VA), who lost his GOP primary election to challenger Dave Brat, announces his resignation effective August 18. Cantor says, "I want to make sure that the constituents in the 7th District will have a voice in what will be a very consequential lame-duck session." (Virginia Governor Terry McAuliffe can call a special election in November, allowing Cantor's successor to serve immediately, rather than wait until January. Of course, the more cynical might point out that the sooner Cantor leaves office, the sooner he can become a lobbyist—after a required one-year waiting period.) [62314, 62321]

The Associated Press reports on a July 24–28 AP-GfK poll—burying Obama's 40/59 percent approval/disapproval ratings more than half-way down the story. "Asked about world trouble spots: -- 42 percent say the conflict between Israel and Hamas is 'very' or 'extremely' important to them; 60 percent disapprove of the way Obama has handled it. - 40 percent consider the situation in Afghanistan highly important; 60 percent disapprove of Obama's handling of it. -- 38 percent give high importance to the conflict in Ukraine; 57 percent disapprove of what Obama has done about that. -- 38 percent find the situation in Iraq of pressing importance; 57 percent disapprove of Obama's handling of it." In a July Kaiser Family Foundation survey, 53 percent view the Affordable Care Act unfavorably—an increase of eight points since the July poll. The "no opinion" percentage fell from 16 to 11 percent. [62316]

Meriam Ibrahim, the Sudanese woman who was sentenced to death for daring to be a Christian, arrives safely in the United States with her American husband, Daniel Wani, and their two children. [62326]

Attorney Orly Taitz reports, "Federal Judge Andrew Hanen issued an order to show cause for Barack Obama, for Jeh Johnson, the Secretary of the Secretary of Homeland Security, for Sylvia Burwell, the Secretary of Health and Human Services to Show Cause why he should not rule for the Plaintiff, Dr. Orly Taitz, ESQ, in a case Taitz v Jeh Johnson, Secretary of Homeland Security, Sylvia Burwell, Secretary of Health and Human Services, Barack Obama and Border Patrol. An Application for Stay/Injunction filed by Taitz in the Southern District of TX, is seeking a stay (stop) of transportation of illegal aliens, who illegally crossed the border in TX, all over the nation and quarantine of the illegals at Border Patrol of FEMA facilities for at least 2 months necessary until these people are deported or: 1. there is a signed release by a US licensed doctor, stating that they do not carry infectious diseases and 2. a criminal record from the country of origin, stating that the illegals, invading US, do not have a criminal record in the countries of origin and do not belong to drug cartels, gangs and terrorist organizations and 3. there is a signed order by a federal judge stating that these people have legal bases to reside in the US 4. Taitz is seeking an order by the court deeming DACA (deferred action for child arrivals) memorandum by Obama, which defers deportations of illegals, to be unconstitutional and unlawful and null and void." Maricopa County, Arizona Sheriff Joe Arpaio tells TruNews.com his cold case posse's investigation of Obama's forged birth certificate could lead to a grand jury review of evidence. [62335, 62336]

The *Chattanooga Times Free Press* posts a Clay Bennett cartoon showing Obama wearing a hooded sweatshirt, carrying a can of Arizona Watermelon Fruit Juice Cocktail and a bag of Skittles, and being followed by George Zimmerman—who wears a sweatshirt that reads, "Impeachment." (The newspaper then deletes the item from the cartoonist's online file—apparently after more than a few reader complaints about playing the race card in defense of Obama. Of course, in addition to the cartoon suggesting that Republicans who endorse impeachment are racist thugs, it also suggests Obama is a drug user: when mixed with the cold medicine NyQuil, the items carried by Obama/Trayvon Martin are used to make a drug known as "Sizzurp" or "Purple Drank.") On the floor of the House of Representatives, Congressman Tom Marino (R-PA) asks why the Democrats did not pass immigration legislation when they controlled both the House and the Senate in 2009 and 2010. The remark sets off thin-skinned House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA), who was Speaker of the House in those years. She shouts at Marino, crosses the aisle, wags her finger at the Congressman, and calls him a "liar" and an "insignificant person." (Actor James Woods tweets, "Pelosi may actually be mentally ill. Her behavior is becoming unhinged. This is no laughing matter.") Obama and his fellow Democrats did not pass "comprehensive immigration reform" when they controlled both the House and the Senate because they knew it would be controversial and any blame for the problems it caused would be placed on them. Obama wants the legislation to be bipartisan so the Republicans can share in the blame—and so that conservatives who oppose amnesty will be so angered that they will either start a third party or stop voting altogether. (Obama thinks he can harm the GOP by suckering them into passing amnesty legislation. He is correct.) [62355, 62356, 62362, 62366, 62399, 62400, 62431, 62454, 62505]

House Republicans vote 223–189 to pass a border crisis bill that, according to CBSNews.com, "would allocate \$694 million to the cash-strapped agencies handling the crisis, including \$35 million tacked on at the last minute to reimburse states such as Texas who have sent the National Guard to the border to help deal with the crisis. Without a fresh infusion of funding, Immigration and Customs Enforcement is scheduled to run out of money in mid-August, according to the Department of Homeland Security, and Customs and Border Patrol will run out of money only a month later." (The Senate will not approve the legislation, and Obama—who calls the bill "extreme and unworkable"—would veto even if it were to reach his desk.) "GOP leaders on Friday also passed a bill that would bar …Obama from continuing or expanding the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program, which suspends the threat of deportation for certain immigrants brought to the U.S. illegally as children. The second bill was largely seen as a way to bolster conservative support for the funding measure." [62337, 62338]

Meanwhile, the Senate fails to pass any border crisis legislation. But the Senate plan may be to take up the House measure in September, and during a House-Senate conference insert amnesty language. House Republicans would then be forced to vote against the legislation, giving Democrat candidate candidates the opportunity to call then antiminority all the way up to election day. (The House may have been better off passing nothing, as being accused of inaction is perhaps less harmful than being called anti-Hispanic. On the other hand, the Democrats would call them anti-Hispanic and anti-children anyway.)

At Townhall.com, Leah Barkoukis describes some of the amenities at an illegal immigrant "detention center" in Karnes City, Texas: "suites with bunk beds, flat screen TV sets, play tables for kids, stuffed animals, a landline phone, and new clothes... basketball courts, ping-pong tables, a weight room, a soccer field, a future playground, and access to a dentist, health care, education, a library, Internet, a hair salon, and a cafeteria, which will serve 'residents' three all-you-can-eat meals per day. ... The newly refurbished facility can house 532 illegal immigrants at an estimated \$74,000 per day." [62346]

DailyMail.co.uk reports, "The dead bodies of illegal immigrants are turning up in south Texas as Central Americans pour across the U.S.-Mexico border, and a veterinarian who ranches cattle 70 miles from ground zero has the photos to prove it. Dr. Mike 'Doc' Vickers of Brooks County, Texas showed some of the grisly images to MailOnline, all of them far too grotesque to publish unedited. One picture shows a corpse propped up against a tree near his ranch in Brooks County, his eyes missing [probably plucked out by falcon] and dried blood cascading down his shirtless body. ...Vickers, 64, told MailOnline on Wednesday that since 2012 his organization, the Texas Border Volunteers, has counted 259 dead bodies in his native Brooks County alone, including those of children. 'And we're probably only finding 20 per cent of them. A lot of people die out here.' 'We find a hell of a lot of women,' he said. 'Three of the last ones who have died on my ranch have been women. We found a dead 12-year-old boy on my neighbor's property.' ... The federal government doesn't keep statistics on how many dead immigrants' bodies are recovered, [a] DHS official told MailOnline." The House and Senate leave Washington, D.C. for a five-week recess. Obama will spend 15 days vacationing in Martha's Vineyard between August 9 and 24. (According to Congresswoman Marsh Blackburn (R-TN), the House has passed 356 bills that are being ignored by the Senate. She states, "We are calling on Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid to get off his self-constructed throne, roll up his sleeves and get back to work. Real lives, a real economy, and a true American recovery hang in the balance.") [62414]

On August 2 the Associated Press reports, "Following the quick collapse of the cease-fire in Gaza, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu told the White House not to force a truce with Palestinian militants on Israel. Sources familiar with conversations between Netanyahu and senior U.S. officials, including Secretary of State John Kerry, say the Israeli leader advised the Obama administration 'not to ever second guess me again' on the matter. The officials also said Netanyahu said he should be 'trusted' on the issue and about the unwillingness of Hamas to enter into and follow through on cease-fire talks. ...]T]op Israeli officials questioned the effort to forge the truce, accusing the U.S. and the United Nations of being naive in assuming the radical Hamas movement would adhere with its terms. The officials also blamed the Gulf state of Qatar for not forcing the militants to comply. ... Despite the collapse of the truce, Obama credited Kerry for his work with the United Nations to forge one. Thousands of pro-Hamas demonstrators march in Washington, D.C. In an interview with *The Economist*, Obama says that businesses "always complain about regulation. That's their job. Let's look at the track record. Let's look at the facts. Since I have come into office, there's almost no economic metric by which you couldn't say that the US economy is better and that corporate bottom lines are better. None. So if, in fact, our policies have produced a record stock market, record corporate profits, 52 months of consecutive job growth, 10million new jobs, the deficit being cut by more than half, an energy sector that's booming, a clean-energy sector that's booming, a reduction of carbon pollution greater than the Europeans or any other country, a housing market that has bounced back, and an unemployment rate that is now lower than it was pre-Lehman—I think you'd have to say that we've managed the economy pretty well and business has done okay. It probably cuts into certain profit centres in their businesses. I understand why they would be frustrated by it, but the flip side of it is that they'd be even more unhappy if the global financial system unravels. Nobody has more of a stake in it than them." "... If you look at what's happened over the last four or five years, the folks who don't have a right to complain are the folks at the top. Where we have made less progress than I would like, and is my obsession since I came into office and will continue to be my obsession until I leave office and afterwards, is the broader trend of an increasingly bifurcated economy where those at the top are getting a larger and larger share of GDP, increased productivity, corporate profits, and middle-class and working-class families are stuck. I am concerned about making sure that we have a system in which the ordinary person who is working hard and is being responsible can get ahead and are seeing modest improvements in their life prospects, if not for themselves, then certainly for the next generation. And I believe that that's the big challenge, not just for the United States, but that's the big challenge for everybody." Barack "I will not rest until..." Obama plays his 181st round of golf since entering the White House (or his 183rd, depending on who is counting). Among those joining Obama are Marvin Nicholson, Reggie Love (Obama's former "body man"), and childhood friends from Hawaii's Punahou School, Mike Ramos, Greg Orme, and Bobby Titcomb. (Titcomb's arrest record includes soliciting sex from an undercover male officer in Honolulu in April 2011. There has been speculation that Titcomb is gay; the prostitutes he frequents are male; and he is exceptionally "close" to Obama. Some speculate that Titcomb supplies Obama with "fish and poi" ("weed and coke," aka marijuana and cocaine) during his annual Hawaiian vacation in Hawaii. Yes, you're giving aid and comfort to the Hamassholes ['Hamas assholes']. In part, her influence stems from the fact that Jarrett is [Obama's] trusted watchdog. She protects the vainglorious and thin-skinned Obama from critics and complainers who might deflate his ego. No one gets past Jarrett and sees [Obama] if they have a grievance, or a chip on their shoulder, or even an incompatible point of view. That goes for such high-profile supporters as Oprah Winfrey and Caroline Kennedy, who have been largely frozen out of the White House because Jarrett believes they would use the opportunity of a meeting with Obama to push their own competing agenda. ... Throughout her career, Jarrett has failed upward. Today she is at the pinnacle of power as Michelle Obama's closest confidant and Barack Obama's political soul mate. Though she is the White House official responsible for 'public engagement,' she has conspicuously failed to engage. I heard this complaint about Jarrett from practically everyone I interviewed—Republicans and Democrats, African Americans and Jews. They all blamed Jarrett for keeping [Obama] isolated even from those whose good opinion he needed the most. Despite her lack of international experience and background in economics and fiscal policy, she is in many ways the de facto president. Against the advice of more seasoned advisers, Jarrett steers [Obama] toward decisions that make our economy less robust and our nation less safe. And that includes that I-word that we don't want to say, and I only say that now on this program because I want to encourage [Obama]. 'Please don't put America into a constitutional crisis. Please don't do that. There's too much at stake in this country to be deciding that you can take over the Constitution and write it at will.'" Host Chris Wallace asks, "But you're saying that if he were to do that, then impeachment would be on the table?" King replies, "Where would we draw the line otherwise? If that's not enough to bring that about, then I don't know what would be. We've never seen anything in this country like [Obama who] says 'I'm going to make up all immigration law that I choose, and I'm gonna drive this thing regardless of the resistance from Congress.'" TheBlaze.com reports, "A correspondent covering the Gaza conflict for a Finnish media outlet reported seeing a rocket being launched from Gaza City's main hospital, Shifa, but later lashed out at the pro-Israel media for its 'disgusting' use of her report as a 'propaganda weapon.' The report filed by Aishi Zidan of Finland's Helsingin Sanomat noted that the rocket was fired from the backyard of the hospital. Israel has widely derided Hamas for what it calls a human shields policy, hiding its military assets and firing from behind civilian sites including mosques, schools and hospitals. ...Following

the posting of her report on pro-Israel blogs, Zidan took to Facebook this weekend, writing, 'Don't use me as your propaganda weapon.'" [62397, 64739]

In an interview with TheDailyBell.com, investor and economist Marc Faber states, "Economically, there is not much that pleases me because I think we are in an economy that is on steroids—in other words, the money printing—and the money printing goes essentially to wealthy people. Of course, they spend and as a result of the asset bubbles, temporarily the economy improves worldwide but it's not sustainable growth. ...So economically, I'm actually more pessimistic today than I have been in a long time. The rich people are ripping you off.' The rich people aren't ripping off anyone. They just took advantage of a situation that was given to them by the Federal Reserve. ... And in Europe and everywhere I hear more and more talk about taxing the rich and that is going to happen. It's not going to help. "...My inclination is to believe that the central banks eventually will have to make a choice. They have created asset bubbles. At the same time, the economy has hardly recovered. What will happen when the asset bubbles burst again, say the stock market goes down 20 percent, the property market goes down and so forth? What will be in the mind of the Federal Reserve and other central banks? What will be in their minds is more money printing will do less damage than no money printing. And so the asset purchases, the QE I, II, III, IV will go on to what I predicted in 2009: It will go to QE 99. And as a result of that, not only the US dollar but all currencies will lose in value against some assets, irregularly at times. Real estate will go up at times. At times commodities will go up at times. Stocks and bonds will go up at times. inflation. I think this view will be very badly discredited. Now, we have to understand it will take some time for this to happen because you have the neo-Keynesians, these are the people like Martin Wolf at the *Financial Times* and Mr. Paul Krugman at the *New York Times* and Mr. Rosengren at the Boston Fed and Larry Summers, who, if there is a failure in the asset markets or in the economy and so forth, will say the reason the policies didn't work is because we didn't do enough. That may go on for quite some time but I can tell you that I see more and more people, young people, who no longer consider the Austrian economic theory to be heresy. And it isn't heresy. It's essentially common sense, a historical approach to economics. I think that eventually, future economic history books will condemn Mr. Greenspan, Mr. Bernanke and Ms. Yellen very badly." [62442]

"... My opinion is that the more unemployment benefits and disability benefits you give to people, the more people will make a choice between working and actually collecting benefits. And say a family, a husband and wife, two children—if one of the couple loses the job, he or she will become eligible for benefits and she or he can then take care of the children and the household and garden and this and that and get the benefits. So for him to actually go back into the workforce is only an option if the salary he will get is very high. Otherwise, by going back into the labor force he loses all the benefits, has to hire someone to look after the children or the house and so forth, so it may be actually a benefit for him not to work. You can imagine-the army doesn't have the highest standards, they're not the standards of Goldman Sachs. If 70 percent of the people there are rejected you can imagine how many useless people there are. I'm not singling out the US in this respect; this also happens in other countries." [62442]

No one in Gaza will see anything from five years of aid and the use of resources; the whole enclave has been set back at least five years, if not ten or twenty, because of a war that Hamas chose to provoke now rather than wait for the massive attack they had planned to conduct through those tunnels next month on Rosh Hashanah. (Over the next 75 years, Social Security deficits are expected to total at least \$40 trillion. Neither Republicans nor Democrats have any idea where that money will come from. (For the record, a 13.2 percent increase is inconsistent with Obama's promise that ObamaCare would result in the average premium falling by \$2,500 per year.) [62458, 62459]

TruthRevolt.org reports, "The account promoted by Hamas and repeated by the United States and the U.N. on Sunday was that an Israeli mortar hit a U.N. school, killing 10 people, including children. White House press secretary Josh Earnest called Israel's actions "disgraceful." The likelihood of Jarrett and Earnest retracting their words are close to zero. Pamela Geller writes, "Obama called it 'indefensible.' His administration was 'appalled' and 'horrifying.' What is more appalling, horrifying and indefensible than denouncing Israel on the world stage with the facts? At CommentaryMagazine.com Max Boot writes, "It has gotten pretty much zero press attention, but last week the congressionally mandated National Defense Panel issued what should have been seen as a bombshell review of American military readiness, or lack thereof. The bipartisan credentials of the board members cannot be doubted. The panel was co-chaired by Clinton-era Defense Secretary Bill Perry and retired General John Abizaid. Members included both Bush-era Defense Department appointees such as Eric Edelman and Obama-era successors such as Michele Flournoy. The only thing uniting the members of the panel was deep knowledge of, and interest in, defense policy. Such a group might be expected to endorse the status quo as the lowest-commondenominator option. But that's not what they did. Instead they issued a blistering denunciation of the impact that budget cuts-amounting to a trillion dollars over 10 yearsare having on the armed forces. These cuts, they warned, 'constitute a serious strategic misstep on the part of the United States. Not only have they caused significant investment shortfalls in U.S. military readiness and both present and future capabilities, they have prompted our current and potential allies and adversaries to question our commitment and resolve. Unless reversed, these shortfalls will lead to a high risk force in the near future. That in turn will lead to an America that is not only less secure but also far less prosperous." [62601]

The panel identified 'disturbing' and 'dangerous' gaps between the 'capabilities and capacities' called for under the 2014 Quadrennial Defense Review and the actual 'budget

resources made available to the [Defense] Department.' Specifically the panel determined that both the Navy and Air Force need to grow and the Army and Marine Corps should not shrink as much as currently envisioned. The Navy, the panel noted, should have between 323 and 346 ships yet it is currently 'on a budgetary path to 260 ships or less.' The Air Force, the panel found, 'now fields the smallest and oldest force of combat aircraft in its history' and that situation is going to get much worse because it is going to lose half of its current inventory of bombers, fighter aircraft, and surveillance aircraft by 2019. The panel called for an increase in 'the number of manned and unmanned aircraft capable of conducting both ISR [intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance] and long range strike in contested airspace.' The panel also found that currently contemplated reductions in Army end-strength go too far. 'We believe the Army and the Marine Corps should not be reduced below their pre-9/11 end strengths-490,000 active-duty soldiers in the Army and 182,000 active Marines,' the panel concluded. Yet on the current trajectory the army is likely to wind up with 420,000 soldiers and the Corps with 175,000 marines. The defense panel rightly warned that 'sustaining these significant cuts to our defense budgets will not solve our fiscal woes, but will increasingly jeopardize our international defense posture and ultimately damage our security, prospects for economic growth, and other interests." (In the late 1970s, Jimmy Carter slashed defense spending, leaving it to Ronald Reagan to restore the nation's military power. Obama has now followed in Carter's footsteps, slashing defense spending in order to pay for more people on food stamps. Whether another Reagan will follow Obama remains to be seen-but the odds are against it. Mediocrity is easier to repeat than competence.) [62601]

A France24 journalist reports on a Hama rocket installation in a heavily-populated area near a building in Gaza that is flying a United Nations flag. (Days earlier, the same journalist reported from a U.N. emergency shelter—and a Hamas rocket was fired just steps away from where he stood.) A journalist from India's NDTV reports that Hamas assembled a rocket launcher just outside his hotel—and video shows it being fired. (Both reports are clear evidence that Hamas uses "human shields" for its terror operations.) According to BusinessInsider.com, "NDTV reported that the video was published after the team had left the Gaza strip, so as to limit any retribution from Hamas towards the journalists." Despite the 72-hour cease fire between Israel and Hamas in Gaza, Hamas calls for Arabs in Judea and Samaria to riot during the three days. According to IsraelNationalNews.com, "In a message sent out by Hamas Monday [August 4] to 'the Palestinians of the Occupied West Bank,' Hamas called on Arabs to 'conduct mass riots' over the next three days as a 'sign of support' for Gaza, and of 'resistance' to 'violence' by Israel." At AmericanThinker.com Michael Curtis points out that "During July 2014, Hamas fired more than 800 rockets before Israel responded by Operation Protective Edge seeking to eliminate or reduce the aggression. ... Article 51 (2) of the [1949 Geneva] Conventions states that 'The civilian population as such, as well as individual citizens, shall not be the object of attack. Acts or threats of violence the primary purpose of which is to spread terror among the civilian population are prohibited.' The... rocket attacks against innocent civilians by Hamas have to be considered in this context. Article 58 (a) states. 'The parties to the conflict shall to maximum extent feasible endeavor to remove the civilian population, individual citizens and civilian objects under their control from the vicinity of military objects.' 58 (b) says, the parties shall 'avoid locating military objectives within or near densely populated areas.' The evidence is overwhelming from a number of videos, from journalist reports, and from public statements, that Hamas has been guilty of using the civilian population for military purposes." At The-American-Interest.com Richard Landes reviews "The media's role in Hamas' war strategy," noting that "Hamas' PR [public relations] strategy can only work if international news media follows the script, whether willingly or under coercion. ...It appears to some... that Hamas deliberately maximizes its own people's suffering for PR. To others, such a strategy would be so base and unthinkable, that they consider the very suggestion of it 'racist and reprehensible.' Hamas' Khaled Mashaal officially denies that Hamas engages in such a heinous policy, even as other Palestinian Jihadis brag about media-assured benefits derived from their own civilians' deaths. And now, the IDF [Israeli Defense Force] has possession of a Hamas training manual that advises its combatants to use civilian shields. According to its critics, Hamas' war strategy works like this: Episodically attack Israel's civilians in such as way as to provoke a counterattack. Hide behind Palestinian civilians (preferably in crowded neighborhoods, schools, and hospitals), while encouraging them, even forcing them, to stay, guaranteeing that the return fire wounds or kills civilians and damages civilian structures. Encourage the Western news media to play up the civilian suffering, play down Hamas' role in it, and accuse Israel. Conjure a firestorm of outrage around the world that eventually pressures Israel into desisting from counteroffensive measures. Survive to reap the propaganda victory and prepare the next round of hostilities. Repeat, with each exchange hurting Israel more, and each round of international news coverage further savaging the Jewish State's international reputation." [62579, 62580]

"No matter what the Israeli response," observes Landes, " the Hamas strategy is win-win. If the Israelis abort a strike to avoid civilian casualties (as they often do), then Hamas is spared the blow; if an Israeli strike causes civilian casualties, Hamas has dead babies to parade before the cameras. And eventually, the bloodletting will get so bad, the pictures so damning, that Israel will stop. Hamas' endgame goals, at least at this stage of its asymmetrical war, are actually threefold: tie Israel down with constraints on its use of power, delegitimize and demonize it in the eyes of the world, and stir an aggressive 'Muslim Street' in the West, where genocidal chants can lead to pogroms against the Jews worldwide. ... The importance of these [Hamas] rockets is not where they're aimed, but whence they're fired. They're a reverse target, designed to create the carnage that will rouse Western indignation. Hamas in response calls on people to make themselves human shields, and when they demur, Hamas orders and coerces them to stay. When refugees do flee to UN Schools and other shelters, Hamas follows them there, firing at Israel repeatedly from their midst, drawing Israeli fire toward the shelter. So, just as Israel had claimed, jihadis had killed their own women and children, cleaned the site, and then brought in journalists to blame Israel. It was indeed disgraceful on many counts, none of which concerned Israel. And yet we only know about this, if we do at all, because this one journalist felt himself beyond Hamas' reach. ... It should be one of the great agenda items of professional journalists to develop a special branch of research and ethical discussion on the problems of covering 21st-century asymmetrical wars in which the weak side systematically intimidates journalists and the strong side has democratic commitments to a free press. We can't ask journalists to seek out martyrdom in the cause of Truth (even if their code does call for courage), but we ought to be able to hope that they would let us know, subtly if necessary, just how deep the intimidation goes." At RenewAmerica.com Gina Miller writes, "We have seen that there is truly no outrageous lie Barack Obama (or whatever his name is) won't tell, and he lied yet again in a White House statement from July 27th in 'honor' of the end of Islam's Ramadan holiday. These poor educational attainment levels usually relegate both African-American men and illegal immigrant men to the same low-skilled labor market, where they must compete against each other for work. Your proposed executive order will also have a negative effect on young African-Americans at the outset of their working lives. Young, low-skilled workers are facing enormous difficulties in this economy....Granting legal status to millions of people who are in the United States illegally will continue to depress the wages and employment opportunities of African-American men and teenagers. It also will depress the wages and employment opportunities of African-Americans going forward." [62574]

"Since 1986," continues Kirsanow, "we have seen that granting legal status to illegal immigrants, or even mere rumors that legal status will be granted, increases illegal immigration. Likewise, the evidence indicates that the flood of illegal immigrants across our southern border is mostly attributable to your directive granting temporary legal status to people allegedly brought to the United States as children. This is unsurprising. When you incentivize bad behavior, you get more of it. ...Lastly, the proposed executive order is unfair to people who are attempting to immigrate legally. The legal immigration process is cumbersome, time-consuming, and expensive. ...Many of these people are professionals for whom remaining in the country illegally would constitute a black mark on their record that would harm their future career chances. Most of the illegal immigrants who would benefit from your executive order have no skills, so they lose nothing by coming here illegally. Yet your proposed executive order is unlikely to make the visa process less cumbersome for legal immigrants or alleviate visa backlogs. For all these reasons, I urge you to reconsider your proposed executive order." [62574]

The Willingboro, New Jersey town council votes to rename its John F. Kennedy (community) Center after Obama. (Roughly two-thirds of the towns' residents are black, but more than a few of them are unhappy with the name change. They may be fans of Obama, but many were also fans of President Kennedy. One remarks, "I love [Obama], I appreciate him, but why does [his name] need to be reflected on the center?") [62695, 62808]

CNSNews.com reports, "The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) plans to spend up to \$450,000 in taxpayer dollars to teach Native American tribes in the Great Basin region 'climate adaptation plans' for their hunting, fishing and gathering activities." [62516]

Obama addresses the U.S.-Africa Summit, held at the Mandarin Oriental Hotel in Washington, D.C. He says, "I... stand before you as the son of a man from Africa," and states, "Even as Africa continues to face enormous challenges, even as too many Africans still endure poverty and conflict, hunger and disease, even as we work together to meet those challenges, we cannot lose sight of the new Africa that's emerging. We all know what makes Africa such an extraordinary opportunity. Some of the fastest-growing economies in the world. A growing middle class. Expanding sectors like manufacturing and retail. One of the fastest-growing telecommunications markets in the world. More governments are reforming, attracting a record level of foreign investment. It is the youngest and fastest-growing continent, with young people that are full of dreams and ambition." (At the beginning the summit, the geography-challenged Vice President Joe Biden expresses hopes for "the nation of Africa." In a Twitter message, House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA)—who may or may not have attended geography classes with Biden-stated she was "honored to discuss the valuable relationship between our two countries." NewsBusted's Jodi Miller quips, "...Obama reminded attendees that America is a nation too, with 57 states," and "A spokesperson says Pelosi never passed geography, so she has no idea what's in it.") Although Zimbabwe dictator Robert Mugabe was not invited to the summit, Obama did host more than a few human rights violators. According to the *Daily Mail*, "The red carpet was rolled out for Equatorial Guinea's Teodoro Obiang Nguema Mbasogo, who shot or jailed virtually all his political opponents, Gambia's Yahya Jammeh, who "took power in a military coup in 1994. Although the coup itself was bloodless, in the 20 years since he has been accused of countless breaches of human rights. In 2008, he threatened to 'cut off the head' of any homosexuals in the country. The following year, it was reported up to 1,000 Gambians had been abducted by the government on charges of witchcraft—they were taken to prisons and forced to drink poison." Cameroon's Paul Biya "has the dubious honor of ranking 19th on author David Wallechinsky's 2006 list of the world's 20 worst living dictators." Also attending the summit is Burkina Faso's Blaise Compaore, "another African leader who seized power by bloody coup. The Burkina Faso president's 1987 uprising left his predecessor Thomas Sankara dead... Human rights groups claim Angolan president Jose Eduardo do Santos has murdered many and exploited the country's resources to his own gain. After Mariah Carey was paid \$1million for performing for him last year, Human Rights Foundation president Thor Halvorssen said: 'It is the sad spectacle of an international artist purchased by a ruthless police state to entertain and whitewash the father-daughter kleptocracy that has amassed billions in ill-gotten wealth while the majority of Angola lives on less than \$2 a day.'" "...When he came to power in 2000, Rwanda's president Paul Kagawe inherited a nation still raw from the brutal genocide of 1994 which claimed up to one million lives. But during his heavy-handed time in power, the country's ranks for press freedom have plummeted and a suspicious number of public and political opponents have been harassed or have died in increasingly suspicious circumstances. ...Goodluck Jonathan, president of Nigeria [where thousands of Christians have been killed by Muslims and hundreds of thousands have been forced to flee form their homes], signed harsh anti-gay laws this year. They criminalise gay relationships, being involved in gay societies and organizations and gay marriages. Violation of this law can result in up to 14 years in prison, with dozens of homosexuals already jailed." [62529, 62530, 62531]

Another of Obama's summit guests is Kenyan president Uhuru Kenyatta, who "has pleaded innocent to murder and other charges for an alleged role in organizing violence that left more than 1,000 people dead after Kenya's 2007 elections." (As noted previously in this *Timeline*, Obama visited Kenya in 2006 to give support to Raila Odinga, a Muslim socialist candidate for president who had ties to both al-Qaeda and Libya's Muammar Qaddafi, was educated in communist East Germany, and who hoped to establish Shari'ah law. Odinga is a cousin of Obama; Odinga's mother is the sister of Obama's father. (Odinga named his first son Fidel after Fidel Castro.) During his Kenya visit, Obama delivered a speech to university students in Nairobi. In the speech, Obama criticized the existing pro-American Kenyan government, rallied the students against it, and spoke of the need for change. By giving his speech, supporting Odinga, and standing beside Odinga at rallies, Obama violated the stated conditions of his Official Government Visa: "to nurture relations between the (African) Continent and the United States." The Kenyan government lodged an official protest of Obama's passport abuse and misconduct, and Obama's actions were denounced by the U.S. State Department as being in direct opposition to U. S. National Security. After Odinga lost the election, his Muslim followers burned Christian women and children alive in a church where they had sought refuge. More than 1,500 people were ultimately killed in riots, and Odinga was reluctantly given the position of prime minister to placate his radical supporters and stop further bloodshed. In support of Odinga, Obama raised approximately \$950,000. The cash for Odinga came from private meetings in 2006 arranged for Odinga by Mark Lippert, a foreign policy advisor on Obama's staff. Odinga visited Obama during three separate trips to Washington in 2004, 2005, and 2006. Odinga promises his supporters in Kenya that he would "re-write the Constitution of Kenya to recognize Shari'ah as the only true law sanctioned by the Holy Quran for Muslim declared religion." In early 2006, Lippert was sent by Obama to Kenya, at taxpayer expense, on a "fact-finding" mission, and to do advance work for Obama's later visit. The Obama-supported Odinga made the following pledges to his supporters: re-write the constitution of Kenya to recognize Muslim Shari'ah law for Muslim regions; facilitate the establishment of a Shari'ah court in every Kenyan divisional headquarters; order every primary school to conduct daily Madrassa classes; impose a total ban on open-air Christian gospel crusades; outlaw gospel programs on KBC radio; impose a total ban on the consumption of alcoholic beverages; and impose an immediate ban on women's public dressing styles that are considered immoral and offensive to the Muslim faith. According to a Fox News poll, 41 percent of Americans think Obama is disinterested and does not even want his Oval Office job anymore. (The results include 37 percent Democrats, 44 percent Republicans, and 47 percent independents.) [62482]

ObamaCare notwithstanding, according to a Gallup poll 13.4 percent of Americans remain without health insurance. [62560, 62561]

Obama's approval/disapproval ratings falls to 40/54 in an NBC/Wall Street Journal poll. On foreign policy, Obama's rankings are a dismal 36/60 percent. On its *Nightly News* broadcast, NBC fails to report on its own poll—despite the fact that Obama's approval rating reached its record low in that survey. On CNN, Politico's Manu Raju says, "I mean, very ominous sign for Democrats." Because Obama is "underwater like this, his party [will suffer in the] midterm elections. We're looking at that probably in the House, and the chance that Republicans take control of the Senate. ...[But] We may see a pretty low-turnout election here, which may mean there may not be that Republican wave that you'd expect them to have. Voters just are not motivated, because they hate Washington." [62504, 62509, 62512, 62521, 62544]

The Washington Post editorial board writes that Congress' inaction on immigration reform doesn't grant Obama "license to tear up the Constitution. As Mr. Obama himself said last fall: 'If, in fact, I could solve all these problems without passing laws in Congress, then I would do so. But we're also a nation of laws.' To act on his own, [Obama] said, would violate those laws. Mr. Obama now seems to be jettisoning that stance in the name of rallying his political base. He is considering extending temporary protection from deportation to millions of illegal immigrants, including the parents of U.S.-born children and others who have lived in the United States for years. Conceivably, this would give Democrats a political boost in 2016. Just as conceivably, it would trigger a constitutional showdown with congressional Republicans, who could make a cogent argument that Mr. Obama had overstepped his authority. [Obama] should think twice. Some of the same Democrats and pro-immigrant advocates urging him to protect millions of undocumented immigrants from deportation would be outraged if a Republican president took a similarly selective approach to enforcing the laws-say, those that guarantee voting rights or prohibit employment discrimination. Mr. Obama's instincts-'we're also a nation of laws'-were and remain correct. ... The right response to the

collapse of the U.S. immigration system is for Congress to fix the law. The House had a vehicle to do just that by taking up the legislation passed by the Senate last year. But it does not follow that Congress can be ignored based on its failure to act. The right response to lawmakers who won't solve the immigration mess is to replace them with ones who will." (The *Post* is correct that Obama should not act illegally to address the immigration issue, but it is incorrect in claiming that the Senate proposal solves the problems.) [62517]

In Texas, two illegal immigrants from Mexico shoot and kill an off-duty Border Patrol Agent in front of his family in a robbery attempt. According to Fox News, "One suspect has been arrested no fewer than four times for entering the U.S. illegally, according to federal court records. The other has been deported twice after entering the U.S. illegally, sources said. Gustavo Tijerina, 30, and Ismael Hernandez, 40, were arraigned Tuesday afternoon inside the Willacy County jail library. They were ordered held without bail after being charged with capital murder of a peace officer, attempted murder, and a variety of lesser charges. The pair, who have been living in Texas illegally, confessed after being interviewed multiple times Monday to killing Border Patrol agent Javier Vega Jr. in front of his wife and two kids and his parents Sunday night while they were fishing in Santa Monica, Sheriff Larry Spence told FoxNews.com. ... They finally confessed to the robbery and indicated they knew they had killed someone, but did not know it was an off-duty Border Patrol agent, Spence said in an interview in his office Tuesday morning. 'They do now,' he said." [62554]

JTA.org reports, "A West Bank man said to be the leader of the terrorist cell that kidnapped and killed three Israeli teenagers in June was arrested. A gag order on reporting the arrest, which took place more than three weeks ago, was lifted Tuesday evening, according to Israeli media. Hussam Kawasme of Hebron was apprehended while attempting to flee to Jordan under a false identity with the help of his family, Ynet reported. Kawasme reportedly admitted to serving as the leader of the cell that perpetrated the murders of Gilad Shaar, Naftali Fraenkel and Eyal Yifrach. Kawasme said that funding for the attack, which he used to buy weapons, came from Hamas in Gaza. In his interrogation, Kawasme said he helped bury the bodies on a plot of land he had purchased two months prior to the murders. He then helped the two men who drove the car and shot the teens hide. Security forces are still searching for the two men -Kawasme's brother, Marwan, and Omar Abu Aysha. Marwan Kawasme, who is active in Hamas, was freed in the Gilad Shalit prisoner exchange and deported to Gaza, The Times of Israel reported. Another suspected cell member, Hussan Dofesh, also was arrested a month ago in Hebron. The bodies of the three teens were discovered following a massive search on June 30 in a shallow grave in a field near Hebron, 18 days after they were kidnapped and murdered." [62486]

Also according to JTA.org, "The London Times refused to run an ad featuring Nobel Prize winner Elie Wiesel speaking out against what the ad says is Hamas' use of children as human shields. The ad sponsored by The Values Network, which was founded by Rabbi Shmuley Boteach, has run in The New York Times, Washington Post and The Wall Street Journal, among other U.S. newspapers. The rejection was first reported by the New York Observer. The London Times refused the ad because 'the opinion being expressed is too strong and too forcefully made and will cause concern amongst a significant number of Times readers,' according to a statement from a representative of the newspaper, the Observer reported." Wiesel writes, "What we are suffering through today is not a battle of Jew versus Arab or Israeli versus Palestinian. Rather, it is a battle between those who celebrate life and those who champion death. It is a battle of civilization versus barbarism." Boteach states, "Elie Wiesel is one of the most respected human beings alive, a Nobel Peace Laureate, and is the living face of the Holocaust. No greater expert on genocide exists in the whole world. His call for the end of child sacrifice by Hamas, who use children as human shields, and a stop to their genocidal charter, which calls for the murder of Jews everywhere, could only offend the sensibilities of the most die-hard anti-Israel haters and anti-Semites." Pamela Geller writes, "Welcome to my world. ...The ban against Robert Spencer and me is starting to make more sense, isn't it? The London Times is so afraid of Muslim riots that they refuse to run the truth." [62533]

In Iraq, between 10,000 and 40,000 people from the Yazidi sect (more properly "Ezidi," but the media writes Yazidi) face death on Mount Sinjar, where they sought refuge after being driven from their homes by ISIS terrorists. According to WashingtonPost.com, "[D]isplaced families said they have buried young and elderly victims of the harsh conditions in shallow graves, their bodies covered with stones. Iraqi government planes attempted to airdrop bottled water to the mountain on Monday night but reached few of those marooned. 'There are children dying on the mountain, on the roads,' said Marzio Babille, the Iraq representative for the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF). 'There is no water, there is no vegetation, they are completely cut off and surrounded by Islamic State. It's a disaster, a total disaster.' ... The Islamic State's takeover of Sinjar, the first major setback for Kurdish forces protecting the country's north, sent about 200,000 people fleeing, according to the United Nations. Some 147,000 have arrived in the semiautonomous Kurdish region, flooding refugee camps. Most of those stranded on Mount Sinjar had run out of battery life on their cellphones by Tuesday, but the few that still could communicate gave grim updates. ... The ancient and secretive Yazidi sect, whose members number no more than 600,000 across Iraq, has suffered persecution for centuries." [62510, 62514, 62515, 62518, 62534, 62555, 62559, 62615, 62641, 63016]

An emotional Vian Dakheel, who is from the Yazidi sect and is also a member of the Iraqi parliament, pleads before her government, "Mr. Speaker, we are being butchered under the banner of 'There is no God but Allah.' Until now 500 men and boys have been butchered... As we speak, there is a genocide taking place against the Yazidis. ...Please, Mr. Speaker allow me to finish. My family is being butchered! Just like all Iraqis are being killed. Shias, Sunnis, Christians, Turkmen, and Shabak. And today Yazidis. Please, brothers, let's put aside all political differences and stand with us as fellow human beings. I am speaking here in the name of humanity. Please save us! Save us! For 48 hours, thirty thousand families are stuck in the Sinjar mountains without water, without food. They are dying. Seventy children died from thirst. Fifty elderly people died from the bad circumstances. Our women are being used as concubines and sold in the markets. Mr. Speaker, we demand the immediate intervention of the Parliament to stop this genocide. There have been 72 attempts to wipe out the Yazidis, and it is being done again in the 21st century. We are being killed. We are being butchered. A whole religion is being wiped out from the earth. Brothers, I call upon you in the name of humanity, rescue us!" [62603, 62604]

Ed Morrissey comments at HotAir.com: 'This... is nothing more than brutal mass murder and ethnic cleansing. ISIS want to purge every potential threat to its authority from the territories they have captured. They already openly brag about mass executions and imposition of their version of shari'a. Penning up to 40,000 men, women, and children on a mountain to watch them die of thirst is a new low even for ISIS. ...We've spent a lot of time intervening in the Gaza war. What has the US done about ISIS, which poses much more of a threat to the US and the West, in a country where our presence might have made a difference? According to former Army Vice Chief of Staff Gen. Jack Keane, we're 'sitting on our hands' while 'the most significant threat to the Middle East' rampages across Iraq." [62511]

In a letter to Obama, Congressman Frank Wolf (R-VA) states, "Genocide is taking place today in northern Iraq, where the Christian and Yazidi populations are being exterminated by the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria. Singer Lionel Ritchie entertains guests at the U.S.-Africa summit. (Obama advisor Valerie Jarrett tweets, "The great Lionel Richie is bringing down the [white] house!" (Among the tweets in response: "At least Nero had the class to fiddle to himself while Rome burned. Jarrett rubs it in your face." "The world is on fire and this is what this administration is doing? Unreal." "So glad you're enjoying your Lionel Richie time on

the taxpayer dime. Personally, I can't afford concerts." "Jarrett is another Marie Antoinette... Let them eat cake... peasants!") [62552, 62553]

On August 6 Newsmax.com reports, "A report by the Senate Intelligence Committee detailing the CIA's rendition, detention, and interrogation program during the George W. Bush administration is being further delayed over a dispute involving how much of the report has been censored..." Senator Dianne Feinstein (D-CA), chairwoman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, "said that censorship by the Obama administration, which put the CIA in charge of clearing the report, was so heavy-handed that items which should have been left in were expunged. Among the items removed were successful methods that the CIA used to gather information that did not rely on torture, and the pseudonyms of CIA officers who engaged in the controversial interrogations." Feinstein states, "Until these redactions are addressed to the committee's satisfaction, the report will not be made public. …The bottom line is that the United States must never again make the mistakes documented in this report. I believe the best way to accomplish that is to make public our thorough documentary history of the CIA's program." [62520]

DailyCaller.com reports, "The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) quietly changed regulations to allow more undocumented immigrants to keep their taxpayer status through a program that is rife with fraud and abuse, and to delay deactivation of immigrant taxpayer status until 2016. The IRS now prevents peoples' Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) from automatically expiring after five years as previously mandated. Now immigrants can keep their ITIN so long as they pay taxes at least once in a five-year period. ...The ITIN program is primarily used by undocumented workers to follow the law and file income taxes in the United States. Reports came out during the IRS scandal linking ITIN fraud to billions in lost taxpayer dollars. The IRS was forced to reform the ITIN program at the start of 2013—but this new regulation undoes that reform." "Rife with fraud and abuse" is an understatement. Congressman Sam Johnson (R-TX) noted in June 2013 that "24,000 tax refunds totaling \$46.4 million were issued to the same address in Atlanta," and stated, "Bottom-line these ITINs are costing taxpayers dearly because they can be used to fraudulently get tax refunds. ...Over 1,000 ITINs were assigned to individuals using the same address in Atlanta." John Barge, Georgia's State School Superintendent, tells WSBTV.com, "We don't have enough teachers in our classrooms and now we are expected to hire some type of food police to monitor, whether we are having bake sales or not" because a new federal rule bans high-calorie snacks at fundraisers and bake sales. "That is just asinine." (A rumor that Michelle Obama has stated, "Let them eat kale" cannot be confirmed.) [62709, 62710]

It is worth noting that new Department of Agriculture regulations related to healthy snacks in school vending machines do *not* apply to machines in teachers' lounges. According to ActionForHealthyKids.org, "The nutrition guidelines cover all foods and beverages SOLD on the school campus in student areas. This includes vending machines, school stores, snack shops, coffee carts, and a la carte lines—basically anything sold outside of the school lunch and breakfast programs. Fundraisers that take place

throughout the school day are also part of the rule. Teachers' lounges are exempt from the regulations." [62955]

NBC's Chuck Todd comments on Obama's low poll numbers: "The numbers are daunting. This is a political landscape I don't know that we've seen before. You try to historically mark it, 71 percent [of Americans think the nation is on the] 'wrong track'— usually that's Watergate, that's Vietnam, that's Iraq. FoxNews.com reports, "The Obama administration failed to properly account for how it spent nearly \$619 billion, according to a watchdog audit of the main federal website meant to track where taxpayer money is going. The report from the Government Accountability Office picked apart the website USASpending.gov, and the agencies feeding information to it. The database of government spending and contracts was created out of a 2006 transparency law, but the GAO found it continues to have serious problems. The Department of Health and Human Services was the worst offender, during the 2012 period GAO examined. 'Although agencies generally reported information for contracts to USASpending.gov, they did not properly report information on assistance awards, totaling nearly \$619 billion,' the GAO reported. ...Further, the report found few contracts and grants were properly reported with all the required information. Also at FoxNews.com, Todd Starnes writes, "A member of the U.S. Army Band said he was forced out of the U.S. Army for having anti-Obama bumper stickers on his personal car, serving Chick-fil-A sandwiches at a party and reading books written by conservative authors like Sean Hannity, a federal lawsuit alleges. Master Sergeant Nathan Sommers, a 25-year veteran of the military and a decorated soloist in the U.S. Army Band Chorus, claims he was forcibly retired from the Army due to his religious and conservative political beliefs. ...John Wells, an attorney representing Sommers, called him a 'true hero' who lost his career while trying to stand up for his religious beliefs.' He alleges that he drew the ire of his superiors because of his belief in traditional marriage. ...Sommers, who was based at Fort Myer in Washington, D.C., is the recipient of an Army commendation medal and was a soloist at the funeral of former First Lady Betty Ford. ...The lawsuit calls for Sommers to be returned to active duty with full pay and benefits." Freedom advocate Gary North suggests the flood of teenaged illegal immigrants has a purpose beyond generating future votes for Democrats: full implementation of a national identification card. Phase one of the "REAL ID ACT" began on January 20, 2014. North writes, "Let me ask the obvious question: When did the publicity begin about this 'tidal wave of immigration?' When did the headlines begin? Hint: not in 2013. This is an orchestrated event. The DHS wants a lot of immigrants to cross. How many? Not enough to build public support to put the Army in charge of the border, but enough to build public support for acceptance of the REAL ID law. It's time to transfer the policing of the southern border to some agency other than the DHS. The DHS wants to police too far north of the border. We need to head this off at the border. ... The 'kids across the border' scenario is rigged. It is rigged from outside the country. It is rigged from inside the country. The kids are the cover. It's not about kids from Central America." Vice President Joe Biden says of the border crisis, "These are not somebody else's kids. These are our kids." [62563] At the close of the U.S-Africa summit, Obama holds a brief (four question) press conference. Asked about the buildup of Russian troops on the Ukraine border, he says, "[T]he best thing we can do for Ukraine is to try to get back on a political track." Asked if the United States would give Ukraine military aid, Obama responds, "Well, keep in mind that the Russian army is a lot bigger than the Ukrainian army, so the issue here is not whether the Ukrainian army has some additional weaponry. At least up until this point, they've been fighting a group of separatists who have engaged in some terrible violence, but who can't match the Ukrainian army." (In other words, "Ukraine is Russia's for the taking." NBC's Chris Jansing asks Obama, "Are sanctions [against Russia] not working?" (*National Review's* Jonah Goldberg writes, "This is like explaining that the pepper spray did everything it was supposed to do but the bear is eating your face anyway. It's also perfectly Obamaesque. *I did exactly what I set out to do. If it's not working, it's only because someone else isn't responding the way they're supposed to. I gave a speech telling the oceans to stop rising, damn it! I even said 'let me be clear.* 'The point of the sanctions isn't to prove that sanctions can cause 'economic pain.' The point is to deter Vladimir Putin. And on that score, they clearly aren't working at all. It's amazing to me how much Obama thinks and talks like a bureaucrat. I've checked my box! I did my job! I've fulfilled my responsibilities. If the bear is eating your face, it must be the fault of Jones in accounting. Hate that guy.") [62547, 62558, 62562, 62597]

Although Obama is not eager to help Ukraine, he appears eager to go after American companies that move their headquarters to escape the horrific corporate tax in the United States. He says, "We don't want to see this [relocation] trend grow. ...[T]hat kind of herd mentality is something we want to avoid, so we need to move quickly." (By "move quickly" Obama of course does not mean lowering the monumental 35 percent corporate tax rate (not counting state and local taxes) to keep companies in America and encourage foreign companies to relocate in the United States, he means coming up with severe IRS penalties to punish companies that dare to flee.) ABC's Jonathan Karl asks, "When you were running for president you said, quote, 'The biggest problems we're facing right now have to do with George Bush trying to bring more and more power into the executive branch and not go through Congress at all and that's what I intend to reverse.' So my question to you, has Congress's inability to do anything significant given you a green light to push the limits of executive power, even a duty to do so, or put another way, does it bother you more to be accused of being an imperial [leader], pushing those limits, or to be accused of being a do-nothing [leader] who couldn't get anything done because you faced a dysfunctional Congress?" Obama replies, "Well, I think that I never have a green light. I'm bound by the Constitution. I'm bound by separation of powers. There's some things we can't do. Congress has the power of the purse, for example. I would love to fund a large infrastructure proposal right now that would put millions of people to work and boost our GDP. We know we have roads and bridges and airports and electrical grids that need to be rebuilt, but without the cooperation of Congress, what I can do is speed up permitting process, for example. I can make sure we're working with the private sector to see if we can channel investment into much-need much-needed projects. But ultimately, Congress has to pass a budget and authorize spending. So I don't have a green light." [62605]

Obama continues, "What I am consistently going to do is wherever I have the legal authorities to make progress on behalf of middle-class Americans and folks working to get to the middle class, whether it's by making sure that federal contractors are paying a fair wage to workers, making sure that women had the opportunity to make sure that they are getting paid the same as men for doing the same job, where I have the capacity to expand some of the student loan programs that we have already put in place so repayments are a little more affordable for college graduates, I'm going to seize those opportunities and that's what I think the American people expect me to do. My preference in all these instances is to work with Congress because not only can Congress do more, but it's going to be longer lasting. And when you look at, for example, congressional inaction and, in particular, the inaction on the part of House Republicans, when it comes to immigration reform, here's an area, as I have said before, not only the American people want to see action, not only is there 80 percent overlap between what Republicans say they want and Democrats say they want, we actually passed a bill out of the Senate that was bipartisan. And in those circumstances, what the American people expect is that despite the differences between the parties, there should at least be the capacity to move forward on the things we agree on. And that's not what we're seeing right now." [62605]

"So in the face of that kind of dysfunction, what I can do is, you know, scour our authorities to try to make progress. And we're going to make sure that every time we take one of these steps that we are working within the confines of my executive power, but I promise you the American people don't want me just standing around twiddling my thumbs and waiting for congress to get something done. Even as we take these executive actions, I'm going to continue to reach out to Democrats and Republicans, to the Speaker [of the House], to the leadership on both sides and in both chambers to try to come up with formulas where we can make progress, even if it's incremental. ...What I certainly recognize with respect to immigration reform and I've said this in the past, is that we have a broken system. It's under resourced, and we have to make choices in terms of how we allocate personnel and resources. So if I'm going to, for example, send more immigration judges down to the border to process some of these unaccompanied children that have arrived at the border, then that's coming from some place else and we're going to have to prioritize. That's well within our authority authorities and discretion. My preference would be an actual comprehensive immigration law, and we already have a bipartisan law that would solve a whole bunch of these problems. Until that happens, I'm going to have to make choices. That's well I was elected to do." (Very few children are crossing the border unaccompanied, of course. Five-year-olds have not traveled almost 2,000 miles from Central America on their own. Most of the younger children are arriving with one or b0th parents, while some of the older teenagers who may be traveling alone are arguably not children.) [62605, 62691]

On Special Report Charles Krauthammer describes Obama as "lethargic and disinterested and detached. ... He said the placing of weapons among the civilians is 'irresponsible.' The likes of Sally Kohn, a former Fox News reporter who is now a contributor at CNN and who leans strongly in favor of Obama, worked the group to promote her appearances. She liberally promoted to her Progressive colleagues her work. She is but one of many plying their wares through the group." (The group apparently functions like "JournoList," a group of about 400 media leftists who planned and coordinated their stories so they would all be on the same pro-Obama, anti-GOP "wavelength.") The onslaught saw the Sunni extremist Islamic State of Iraq and Greater Syria (ISIS) extend its writ over northern Iraq and move within striking distance of autonomous Kurdistan, in one of the most dramatic developments of the two month-old conflict. ISIS militants moved into Qaraqosh and other towns overnight after the withdrawal of Kurdish peshmerga troops, who are stretched thin across several fronts, residents said. 'Qaraqosh, Tal Kayf, Bartella and Karamlesh have been emptied of their original population and are

now under the control of the militants,' Joseph Thomas, the Chaldean Catholic archbishop of Kirkuk and Sulaimaniyah, told AFP. Entirely Christian Qaraqosh... lies between Mosul, the jihadists' main hub in Iraq, and Arbil, the Kurdish region's capital. It usually has a population of around 50,000. Tal Kayf, the home of a significant Christian community as well as members of the Shabak Shiite minority, also emptied overnight. ...Pope Francis urged the international community to protect Iraq's Christians, who have emigrated en masse over the past decade as a result of successive waves of violence. Chaldean Patriarch Louis Sako, who heads Iraq's largest Christian denomination, said the overnight offensive had displaced 100,000 Christians. 'This is a humanitarian disaster. The churches are occupied, their crosses were taken down,' he told AFP, adding that 1,500 manuscripts had been burnt." [62583, 62584, 62592]

YNetNews.com reports on talks to end the Israeli-Hamas conflict, claiming "Egyptian officials stated that the Israeli delegation insisted during talks in Cairo on the terms of the demilitarization of Gaza, and expressed reservations about the issues of building an airport and seaport in Gaza. According to the sources, Egypt tried to persuade the delegation to drop the issue of disarming Palestinian groups and accept the rest of the demands. The sources further stated that Israel agreed to release the prisoners, lift the siege and expand the allotted fishing space." (Pamela Geller comments, "If this report is true, and I hope it isn't, then Israel is acting as if it lost the incursion in Gaza—when there is no reason whatsoever for it to think so. But after every defeat of the jihad force, Israel ends up being pushed into making disastrous concessions that allow the jihadis to regroup and fight again. 'He wants the Iraq problem not to exist. And that's exactly what the American people sent him to the White House to do.' But 'all these factors may kind of drag him kicking and screaming into some kind of decision.' ... To some, this is a crisis Mr. Obama brought on himself by not trying harder to leave a residual force behind at the end of 2011 and neglecting to recognize the growing threat as the civil war in Syria next door increasingly spilled over into Iraq. Some argued that a virtual state under ISIS

control posed more than the humanitarian threat Mr. Obama seemed to be focused on." [62610, 62611]

"'This is about America's national security,' said Ryan Crocker, who was ambassador to Iraq under Mr. Bush and to Afghanistan under Mr. Obama. John Kirby, a top Pentagon spokesman said in a statement. 'Two F/A-18 aircraft dropped 500-pound laser-guided bombs on a mobile artillery piece near Erbil,' Rear Adm. Kirby said. 'ISIL was using this artillery to shell Kurdish forces defending Erbil [sometimes spelled Irbil] where U.S. personnel are located.' A small clutch of U.S. advisers have been based in the city during recent weeks, assessing the capability of Kurdish forces to defend the region. No other details were immediately provided." (Many of the "U.S. personnel" in Erbil are CIA operatives. At LewRockwell.com, Pepe Escobar writes, "This is an electoral year. Obama is absolutely terrified of another Benghazi—which Republicans have been trying non-stop to blame on his administration's incompetence. The last thing Obama needs is the Caliph's goons killing '*diplomats*' in Erbil. That would certainly raise a tsunami of questions all over again about the shady CIA weapon-smuggling racket—as in arming Syrian 'rebels' with weapons from Libya—at the time Benghazi took place. As secretary of state, Hillary Clinton, of course, also knew about it all. But then, and especially now, no one should know that the CIA was weaponizing the bulk of the future Caliph's forces.") [62613, 62816]

Referring to Obama's statement, "If a JayVee [junior varsity] team puts on Lakers uniforms that doesn't make them Kobe Bryant, CNN's Jim Acosta asks White House press secretary Josh Earnest, "Is it safe to say that ISIS... they're no longer the JVs?" Earnest replies, "Well, I think what is, uh, appropriate to say, is that there is no question that the, uh, Laker [sic; Lakers] uniforms that were worn, uh, to use that analogy a little, to draw out that analogy a little bit, that were worn by the, uh, al-Qaeda leadership in Afghanistan, has been decimated and defeated in Afghanistan [sic]. There's no question about that... [Nor was that Acosta's question.] ...What is also true is that there are other organizations that subscribe to the violent extremist ideology that's espoused and promulgated by al-Qaeda. Many of those groups, uh, in nations across the globe, uh, are not particularly sophisticated, uh, are focused on local sectarian conflicts that don't pose a significant or immediate threat to U.S. interests or the U.S. homeland. [That wasn't Acosta's question either.] ...There are, of course, a couple of other organizations, uh, that do pose a more substantial threat to the United States and our interests..." [62636, 62650]

Earnest ultimately admits, "We do remain concerned about the military proficiency that has been demonstrated by ISIL [ISIS], and it's why you've seen [Obama] take steps... that would, uh, protect, uh, American citizens who might be harmed by, uh, ISIL." Earnest then states that ISIS is ultimately Iraq's problem, and "there will be American support that's provide, uh, but there will not be American troops returning to Iraq in a combat role. [Obama's] determined to ensure that the United States will not be dragged back into a prolonged military conflict there." (Earnest's response is a typical press secretary performance: He dodges the question, changes the subject, is unsure exactly what to say, speaks slowly and with a substantial number of "uhs" and "ums" included and then finally hits his stride with canned talking points, during which he picks up his pace and sounds relieved that he got through the episode.) It is worth noting that Obama and his administration typically us the acronym ISIL, rather than ISIS. In January, Christopher Woolf wrote at PRI.org, "The difference has to do with the historic name of the region. The group's members are primarily Arabic speakers. They call their group ad-Dawla al-Islāmiyya fi al-'Irāq wa-sh-Shām—the Islamic State of Iraq and Sham. So that's the letter 'S' in ISIS. Sham is the historic Arab name for what you might call Greater Syria. In English and French, the old name for that region is the Levant, which is where the letter 'L' comes from in ISIL. The term Levant first appeared in medieval French. It literally means 'the rising,' referring to the land where the sun rises. If you're in France, in the western Mediterranean, that would make sense as a way to describe the eastern Mediterranean. ...Scholars today largely agree on the bounds of the Levant, extending from the Antakya region of Turkey, through Syria, Lebanon, Israel/Palestine, Jordan, and round to the Sinai Peninsula in Egypt. Some include Cyprus, as well. This coincides exactly with the classical Arab region of Sham. The origin of the

term Sham is commonly misunderstood. Many in the Middle East believe it comes from 'shams,' the Arabic word for sun. That would fit nicely with the origin of the word Levant, as the land of the rising sun. But the true meaning is more interesting. It literally means 'the left hand.' If you stand in Mecca, facing east, then the land to your left is the 'Bilad as-Sham.' The land to your right is the 'Bilad al-Yamin,' from which the nation of Yemen gets its name. The use of Sham by the ISIS may indicate the scale of its ambitions, in terms of the boundaries of the Islamic state it is trying to set up. So it makes sense that the ISIS, or ISIL, is fighting simultaneously in Iraq and Syria." [62671, 62672, 63734]

At PatriotAction.net Laurie Sterling writes, "The question that begs to be answered is this. When Obama said, 'Islamic State of the Levant,' was he implying that Israel is an Islamic state, since Israel is considered part of the Levant? When one examines Obama's actions since he first took office, it is clear that he has consistently favored Islam over other groups and religions. Volumes could be written about Obama's loyalties to Islam Suffice it to say that, beginning with his speech in Cairo in 2009, to his appointing of Muslim Brotherhood members to the Department of Homeland Security, to his coldshoulder treatment of Israel, it is hardly a stretch to imagine his intention of dissing Israel once again by using the term....To the countless Christians and other ethnic minority groups being slaughtered in Iraq, it matters little what name the terrorists are called. They and everyone else in the world should call it one name and one name only: pure, unadulterated evil. Anti-Semitism is rising throughout the globe while millions chose to stand with Hamas against Israel under the red herring of the 'Free Gaza' movement. Obama has turned his back on Israel time and time again and has throne [sic; thrown] a token bone to the victims in Iraq not because he cares but only to gain political points. Obama turns a blind eye to the evil perpetrated by what he deems to be the Islamic State of the Levant while quietly giving a wink to ISIS/ISIL and Hamas. The world is on fire and Obama is on vacation. Is it a stretch to think that Obama would imply an 'Islamic State of Israel?' Sadly, the conclusion must be no." [62671, 62672, 63734]

Senator Dianne Feinstein (D-CA), head of the Senate Intelligence Committee, states, "It takes an army to defeat an army, and I believe that we either confront ISIL [ISIS] now or we will be forced to deal with an even stronger enemy in the future. ...Inaction is no longer an option." [62626, 62665]

At NewRepublic.com John B. Judis writes, "Last night, ...Obama announced that he was authorizing American airtstrikes [sic; airstrikes] in Iraq. He described his intervention as a 'humanitarian effort to help save thousands of Iraqi civilians who are trapped on a mountain' and as an effort 'to protect our American personnel.' One word that he didn't mention is 'oil,' but it lies near the center of American motives for intervention. The United States is conducting airdrops to aid the Yazidis who have fled the advance of Islamic State militants, but it is conducting airstrikes around Erbil, which is to the east. There are American consular personnel in Erbil, but they could be evacuated if necessary. What Obama left unsaid was that Erbil, a city of 1.5 million, is the capital of the Kurdish regional government and the administrative center of its oil industry, which accounts for about a quarter of Iraq's oil. ...If the Islamic State were to take over Erbil, they would endanger Iraq's oil production and, by extension, global access to oil. Prices would surge at a time when Europe, which buys oil from Iraq, has still not escaped the global recession. ...In portraying American intervention in Iraq as a purely humanitarian effort, Obama is following the script he read from in Libya, when he justified American intervention as an effort to prevent a massacre in Benghazi. ...The United States should worry about the global oil supply. It is important for global economic and political stability. And having a significant chunk of it fall into the hands of a group like the Islamic State should certainly be a concern. But if Obama is worried about the world's oil supply, then he should say so forthrightly and not leave himself in a position where he will be unable to justify or explain further intervention after the airdrops to the Yazidis are completed." BBC.com reports on the need to be skeptical when evaluating civilian casualty statistics in Gaza: "[I]f the Israeli attacks have been 'indiscriminate,' as the UN Human Rights Council says, it is hard to work out why they have killed so many more civilian men than women. ...An analysis by the New York Times looked at the names of 1,431 casualties and found that 'the population most likely to be militants, men ages 20 to 29, is also the most overrepresented in the death toll. They are 9% of Gaza's 1.7 million residents, but 34% of those killed whose ages were provided. At the same time, women and children under 15, the least likely to be legitimate targets, were the most underrepresented, making up 71% of the population and 33% of the known-age casualties.' The list of names and ages of the dead published by al-Jazeera also found men aged between 20 and 29 to be significantly overrepresented." (In other words, many dead Hamas combatants are probably being counted as civilians.) [62608, 62609, 62741]

On *The Five*, Greg Gutfeld says, "I'm a big fan of humanitarian aid, and by humanitarian aid, I mean bombs." [62617]

At Townhall.com S. E. Cupp writes that Obama "is in many ways the sad tale of a promising and, at one time, confident rising star who instead withered into an equivocating and uncertain Hamlet-like figure. He is haunted by a ghost named President Bush....Bush may as well still be in the White House, because Obama can't make a move without first thinking of him. ...[I]n June, upon announcing his decision to send 300 military advisers into Iraq, the over-compensation was palpable: 'Recent days have reminded us of the deep scars left by America's war in Iraq.' And: 'Here at home, Iraq sparked vigorous debates and intense emotions in the past, and we've seen some of those debates resurface. But what's clear from the last decade is the need for the United States to ask hard questions before we take action abroad, particularly military action.' And: 'I think we always have to guard against mission creep so let me repeat what I have said in the past. American combat troops are not going to be fighting in Iraq again.' So, after waiting two years to make the case for Syria and five months to acknowledge ISIS in Iraq, Obama's strategy for convincing the American people, Congress, and our allies around the world to back him on limited intervention in these conflicts wasn't to explain their urgency, our self-interests, or our responsibility, but to declare our last intervention's disasters. That's like getting your friends to take a blimp ride by reminding them of the Hindenburg. It's no wonder no one was sold on Syria and folks are still very

much confused and concerned by our presence again in Iraq." Obama's foreign policy is "not a product that he believes in. And not because of any ideological impulse or conviction. He doesn't know what he believes. 'Not being Bush' has been his only guide. And so he hums that mantra until it becomes totally untenable. And then he's surprised when, at the 11th hour, no one's with him. It's a shame. Maybe Obama once had some clear-eyed ideas about how the world should work. But we'll never know, because the only vision he's offered is by way of another man's. And merely doing the opposite of someone else is no way to lead a nation, let alone the world." [62621]

Retired four-star Army General Barry McCaffrey tells NBC's Chuck Todd, "These [Obama actions in Iraq] are political gestures using military power. When we dropped three aircraft loads of water and food to 50,000 people in the mountains, now we're striking ISIS artillery units, it looks to me as if a lot of this is internal U.S. politics to show we're doing something. I mean, if you're going to use military power, you have to write down your objective and then use decisive force to meet your objective. So I'm a little dismayed at what we're up to here. ...I think we have muddled thinking on what we're trying to achieve in Iraq, and so these pinprick strikes—I mean if you're going to protect refugees, 50,000 people without water and food, you don't do two FA-18 strikes on an artillery unit somewhere in the vicinity." (Pamela Geller observes, "This is all just cosmetic. Obama lost Iraq. Now he is just trying to save face.") [62622, 62628]

The Dow Jones Industrial Average closes up 185.66 points—almost certainly because investors believe the limited airstrikes in northern Iraq are meant to protect the Kurdish oil fields (even if protecting the Yazidis was the "official" basis for the strikes).

On *Special Report*, Charles Krauthammer notes, "The Kurds are allies of the U.S. They have a civil society, they're pro-American, and they fight really hard. But they're essentially using javelins and harpoons here, and we have not given them anything. And the reason... [White House press secretary] Josh Earnest... said, 'Everything has to go through the Iraqi government.' The Iraqi government—that's Maliki, that Shiite chieftain — has cut off all aid to the Kurdish area [of Iraq] since December of last year. Nothing. We have sent weapons to Baghdad; none of [them have] reached Kurdistan. Why in God's name we don't resupply or supply our allies who can hold back ISIS is beyond me." [62642]

On August 9, before leaving for his Martha's Vineyard vacation, Obama comments on the situation in Iraq. (He delivers his remarks outside the White House, with the Marine One helicopter directly behind him. His golf clubs are not visible.) In his brief comments Obama gives no timetable for military actions in Iraq and he does not define his goals—if he even has any beyond shifting the slaughter of innocent Yazidis off the front pages of a few newspapers for a few days. (If his goal is protecting the Kurds' oil fields, he does not say so—no doubt to avoid "No blood for oil!" protest signs outside the White House.) He calls on the Iraqis to do more to defend themselves: "What we've seen over the last several months indicates the weaknesses in the Iraqi government, but what we've also seen is a wake-up call for a lot of Iraqis." (Obama neglects to note that it is also a wakeup call for his own administration, which was warned about ISIS more than a year ago and chose to do nothing in the hopes that it would perhaps just go away.) Obama emphasizes that no U.S. combat troops will be deployed: "I've been very clear that we're not gonna [sic] have U.S. combat troops in Iraq again. And we are going to maintain that because we should have learned a lesson from our long and immensely costly incursion in Iraq." Yet he calls the Iraq situation a long term project: "I don't think we're going to solve this problem in weeks. I think this is going to take some time." (He does not indicate how the problem will be solved, only that it will be magically solved without any U.S. combat troops.) He falsely claims that all U.S. troops were pulled out because the Iragis demanded it, and claims the rise of ISIS was unanticipated: ISIS advances have "been more rapid than the intelligence estimates and I think the expectations of policymakers in and outside Iraq." (In other words, "Don't blame me, blame the U.S. intelligence agencies.") He fails to take *any* responsibility for the ISIS problem, saying it was wrong to blame a lack of U.S. troops: "That entire analysis is bogus and is wrong. But it gets frequently peddled around here by folks who often times are trying to defend previous policies that they themselves made." Obama states, "We feel confident we can prevent ISIL [ISIS] from going up the mountain and slaughtering people who are there." (The problem, of course, is greater than simply the thousands of Iragis stranded on a mountain. The problem is that tens of thousands of Iragis are threatened by ISIS—as well as the stability of the entire region and even the United States. When Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, the leader of ISIS, was released from U.S. custody at the Camp Bucca prisoner facility in 2009, he told the commanding officer, "I'll see you in New York." But even if ISIS is ultimately a threat to the United States, Obama will wash his hands of all the problems as soon as the people trapped on the mountain in Sinjar are rescued. Iraqis who are being persecuted and slaughtered by ISIS everywhere else in Iraq apparently have to fend for themselves.) [60279, 60280, 60281, 60301, 60335, 60336, 60352, 62637, 62644, 62655, 62659, 62685]

Remarkably, Obama says "I find interesting the degree to which this issue keeps coming up, *as if this was my decision* [emphasis added]. Under the previous administration, we had turned over the country to a sovereign, democratically elected Iraqi government. In order for us to maintain troops in Iraq, we needed the invitation of the Iraqi government and we needed assurances that our personnel would be immune from prosecution. ...Let's just be clear. The reason we did not have a follow-on force in Iraq was because a majority of Iraqis did not want U.S. troops there." [62637, 62644, 62655, 62659, 62685, 62764, 62826, 62833]

*Obama's statement is as shameless as it is astounding.* He spent much of his 2012 reelection campaign bragging that *he* ended the war in Iraq, but he *now* claims he had nothing to do with the troop withdrawal because George W. Bush had failed to negotiate a status of forces agreement and because Iraq did not want it to be continued. *Obama's claim is absurd.* Although Iraq made some demands for inclusion in a renewal agreement, they could easily have been overcome or negotiated by Obama. The Iraqi government was simply trying to negotiate the best deal it could get from Obama—no doubt believing his negotiating skills were weaker than Bush's. (On March 24, former

Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld told *On the Record's* Greta Van Susteren, "A trained ape can get a status of forces agreement. It does not take a genius.") Obama cannot claim that he ended the war *and* also mockingly say, "*as if this was my decision*." It was either his decision to withdraw all U.S. troops or it was not. If it was, it was a mistake. If it was not, then he did not end the war. There is no middle ground which would allow him to claim credit for the good and avoid blame for the bad. [56739, 56748, 56952, 62637, 62644, 62655, 62659, 62685]

Obama did not bother to renew the agreement; he simply used the Iraqi demands as an excuse not to leave any U.S. troops behind in Iraq. But he cannot have it both ways. Obama cannot take credit for ending the war and at the same time claim that his hands were tied and he could not have done anything to change the course of events. Obama either could have done something or he could not. If Obama could not have done anything, then he most certainly did not "end the war." It ended merely because the previous status of forces agreement of the Bush administration lapsed. If Obama could have done something, then he deserves some of the blame for the rise of ISIS and the current crisis in Iraq—which could have been avoided had U.S. troops been left behind to stop ISIS before it had a chance to grow into a massive terrorist army. In blaming the Iraqis for not agreeing to a renewed status of forces agreement, Obama is essentially saying that *they* ended the war in Iraq, not him. If Obama wanted to leave U.S. troops in Iraq but the Iraqi government would not let him do so, then the Iraqis "ended the war." If Obama did not want to extend the status of forces agreement, then George W. Bush arguably "ended the war" by having the agreement expire at the end of 2011. In either case, Obama was simply an observer. [62637, 62644, 62655, 62659, 62685]

Obama provides himself with yet another excuse: "The only difference would be [that] we'd have a bunch of troops on the ground that would be vulnerable. However many troops we had, we would have to now be reinforcing, I'd have to be protecting them, and we'd have a much bigger job. And probably we would end up having to go up again in terms of the number of ground troops to make sure that those forces were not vulnerable." In other words, if Obama had left any U.S. troops behind in Iraq, they would not have been enough to deal with ISIS and he would now have to reinforce them anyway. But had he left any troops behind, the number would have been determined by him. Obama is essentially arguing that he would have erred by leaving too few troops behind to deal with ISIS. His argument is therefore, "I would have erred by leaving too few troops behind had I left any, so I may as well have left none." Obama's logic is astoundingly pathetic. The number of U.S. troops the Iraqi government wanted left behind—and the number recommended by U.S. generals—would have been enough to stop ISIS had action been taken at the earliest stages, when it was requested by the Iraqi government. The U.S. troops on the ground would have been able to identify the main ISIS targets, and missile strikes would have decimated them—before ISIS grew to army size. [62637, 62644, 62655, 62659, 62685]

Obama's choice of words is worth noting: "*we'd* have a bunch of troops," "*we* would have to now be reinforcing," "*I'd* have to be protecting them," "*we'd* have a much bigger job," and "*we* would end up having to go up again." His use of "I'd" in only one part of

the statement is a clear indication that he *personally* resents having to "protect" U.S. troops in Iraq. He wanted then and wants now to have nothing to do with Iraq, and he is personally offended that he is being forced into a position where he has to even think about the situation. (*"How dare anyone force the challenges of leadership on me!"*) [62637, 62644, 62655, 62659, 62685]

Obama then says, "If you ["you," not "we"—meaning, "How dare *you* delay my vacation!"] want this thing to work, then whether it's different ethnicities, different religions, different regions, they've got to accommodate each other. Otherwise you start tipping back into the old patterns of violence, and it doesn't matter how many U.S. troops are there if that happens. You end up having a mess." (The statement is incredibly naive and assumes there is no evil in the world—just "differences" that can be "accommodated." But jihadists in ISIS, Hamas, Hezbollah, and al-Qaeda will not "accommodate" anyone. They demand that *they* be accommodated, and a violent death is rapidly dispensed to those who will not comply. [62637, 62644, 62655, 62659, 62685]

Obama's "*Can't we all just get along*?" would be naive coming from an average person who is busy earning a living and not following world events. *But it is coming from the commander-in-chief of the U.S. Armed Forces.* That outlook may cause little harm if it is that of the neighborhood bartender or philosophical taxi driver (or MSNBC pundit). But when that outlook is coming from the so-called leader of the free world, that free world may be in grave danger. [62637, 62644, 62655, 62659, 62685]

Soon after his Iraq remarks, Obama plays golf at the Farm Neck Golf Club with NBA player Ray Allen, Ahmed Rashad (the boyfriend of Obama advisor Valerie Jarrett), and Cyrus Walker (one of Jarrett's cousins). (At PJMedia.com, Jazz Shaw writes that PGA stands not for Professional Golfers' Association but "Presidential Golf Adventures.") [62643, 62660, 62668, 62834, 62850]

At the Iowa State Fair, Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) remarks, "I think [Obama] should actually stand up and do his job as commander in chief, should spend less time on the golf course and more time doing the job to which he was elected. I am glad [Obama] is finally demonstrating some leadership, taking the threat from ISIS seriously, but unfortunately, he's following the pattern that has characterized his foreign policy from the beginning of this tenure which he has laid out no clearly defined objective that we're trying to accomplish that is key to defending U.S. national security. What is missing right now is the commander in chief laying out a strategic vision, 'Here is what we're trying to accomplish so everyone will know when it's accomplished and here's why it furthers U.S. national security interests.' That only comes from [Obama], and unfortunately right now …Obama's not providing that leadership." [62644]

The "2014 Gay Games" event in Cleveland features a video appearance by Obama. He states, "Since 1982 the Gay Games have given lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender athletes and supporters around the world a chance to come together to compete, celebrate, and inspire others. ...We've... seen America change in that time, even since 2006, when the games were last held in the United States in my hometown of Chicago. We've come a

long way in our commitment to the equal rights of LGBT people here and around the world. ...I'm proud of my administration's record and of the citizens who've helped push for justice." [62712]

In North Miami Beach, Rabbi Joseph Raksin is shot and killed by two teenagers as he walked to his synagogue—which only days earlier was defaced with swastikas and the word "Hamas." At Raksin's funeral service, a swastika is scratched into the paint of one mourner's car. (Obama has no comment.) [62645, 62890, 62891]

An ISIS supporter tweets a photo of his cellphone with the White House in the background. On the cellphone is an image of the black flag of jihad. The message: "AMessagefromISIStoUS we are here America near our target:) soooooooooooo." According to TheGatewayPundit.com, the photo was posted again, with the messages, "We are everywhere" and "We are in your state We are in your cities We are in your streets You are our goals anywhere." [62680, 62681, 62715]

In The Australian, Brendan Nicholson writes, "Australia needs to prepare for an increasingly savage, 100-year war against radical Islam that will be fought on home soil as well as foreign lands, the former head of the army, Peter Leahy, has warned. Professor Leahy, a leading defence and strategic analyst, told The Weekend Australian the country was ill-prepared for the high cost of fighting a war that would be paid in 'blood and treasure' and would require pre-emptive as well as reactive action. 'Australia is involved in the early stages of a war which is likely to last for the rest of the century,' he said. 'We must be ready to protect ourselves and, where necessary, act pre-emptively to neutralise the evident threat. Get ready for a long war.' ... Professor Leahy-a former lieutenant general who ran the army for six years, from 2002-2008—said the threat of radical Islam would require action on several fronts, including a strengthening of controls against biological, chemical and nuclear attacks. ... The Western withdrawal from Afghanistan did not constitute the end of the so-called war on terror, 'nor, as was claimed by prime minister Julia Gillard, in January 2013, a transition from the 9/11 decade,' he said. Michael Krause, a former senior Australian Army officer responsible for planning the coalition campaign in Afghanistan, said he agreed 'absolutely' with Professor Leahy. 'I have seen these people,' the retired major general said. 'I know how they think. I know how they fight. There is no compromise possible.' ... Professor Leahy said politicians needed to 'develop an honest and frank dialogue' with the Australian public. 'They should advance a narrative that explains that radical Islamism and the terrorism it breeds at home and abroad will remain a significant threat for the long term, it will require considerable effort, the expenditure of blood and treasure and it will, of necessity, restrict our rights and liberties,' he said." Meanwhile, a 7-year-old boy who was raised in the suburbs of Sydney, Australia holds up a decapitated head in a video posted in the Internet. The boy's father, jihadist Khaled Sharrouf, tweeted the photo with the words, "That's my boy." (Sharrouf, a convicted terrorist, and his son are reportedly in Syria.) Secretary of State John Kerry says, "That child should be in school, that child should be out learning about a future, that child should be playing with other kids, not holding a severed head and out in the field of combat." (What Kerry does not realize is that many of the other children the boy may be spending time with are also the offspring of terrorists. He is not the only one who has seen severed heads.) At Algemeiner.com Deborah Danan reports, "A video of summer camps run by UNRWA, the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East, is making the rounds on pro-Israel social media networks again with footage that shows Palestinian children as young as 6 calling for 'Jihad against the Jews.' 'The resistance in Gaza is not enough,' says one camper in UNRWA's school in Balata. 'We need to unite and fight together.' An older teenager is filmed as saying, 'Attacking stage by stage is not the answer. We need to attack all at once.' He continues by saying 'There will never be peace between us and Israel." (Like the rest of the United Nations, a substantial portion of UNRWA's funding comes from U.S. taxpayers—most of whom have no idea they are funding jihadist propaganda. Meanwhile, Obama naively believes people of "different ethnicities, different religions, different regions" simply have to "accommodate each other" and all will be peaceful. The issues only get tougher in the international arena as the stakes get higher and the overall uncertainty increases. ... In many cases, the only effective way to deal with aggression is with a strong and decisive response. Our overly intellectual [leader] has failed to deliver one. He sees himself as a deep thinker who sees issues that lesser minds just miss. He would do a lot better in international affairs if he would stop his philosophical musings and start being the... leader of the free world." [62769]

News of the advance comes hours after U.S. warplanes launched two more rounds of airstrikes against Islamic militants in northern Iraq, taking out two mortar positions and a seven-vehicle convoy. ...Obama authorized the use of force to protect U.S. personnel and Iraqi religious minorities facing a possible 'genocide.' The chief spokesman for the Pentagon, Rear Adm. John Kirby, said the U.S. launched the latest airstrikes to help defend the city of Irbil, where U.S. personnel are 'assisting the government of Iraq.' The airstrikes were considered successful. Senior military officials said the planes in this round of strikes, like those in the first, were launched from the USS George HW Bush in the Persian Gulf. A drone took off from an undisclosed land base and used hellfire missiles to strike its targets." [62634]

Fox News also reports, "U.S. military forces conducted four more airstrikes on Islamic militants in Iraq Saturday, taking out armored carriers firing 'indiscriminately' on civilians, US military officials said. U.S. Central Command said the strikes on the Islamic State (IS), the militant group formerly known as ISIS, were spread out, with three before noon Eastern Time on Saturday and one at about 3 p.m. 'At approximately 11:20 a.m. EDT, a mix of U.S. fighters and remotely piloted aircraft struck one of two ISIL armored personnel carriers firing on Yazidi civilians near Sinjar, destroying the APC,' a statement released late Saturday by US Central Command said. The statement said that all indications suggested that all strikes were successful in destroying the armored vehicles, and that all aircraft left the area safely. This is the third round of airstrikes against Islamic State forces by the U.S. military since they were authorized by ...Obama to protect U.S. personnel and Iraqi religious minorities facing a possible 'genocide.'" (Taking out a few armored personnel carriers will do little to stop ISIS, which has thousands of fighters—perhaps more than 10,000.) [62638]

NBCNews.com reports, "The U.S. has removed some staff from its embassy in Baghdad and its consulate in Erbil, the capital of Iraq's Kurdish region threatened by militants, the State Department said Sunday. A travel warning posted Friday cautioning U.S. citizens from travelling to Iraq due to the 'high risk for kidnapping and terrorist violence' was updated to say that 'a limited number' of U.S. Consulate and U.S. Embassy staff members were relocated to Amman, the capital of Jordan, and Basrah, a southern Iraqi city." (Pamela Geller reminds readers that on June 15 *The New York Times* reported, "The American Embassy in Baghdad plans to evacuate a substantial number of its personnel this week in the face of a militant advance that rapidly swept from the north toward the capital, the State Department announced on Sunday. …Many staff members who are leaving will be flown to Amman, Jordan, where they will continue their work at the embassy there. Others will be shifted from Baghdad to consulates here in Erbil, in the northern Kurdish region, and in Basra, in the south, which are not now under threat by the militants." Geller writes, "They were supposed to be safe in Erbil. Now they're being shifted out of Erbil. Obama keeps cutting and running from the problem he created.") [62674, 62675, 62676, 62686]

Journalists discuss the Watergate break-in and cover-up on the 40th anniversary of President Richard M. Nixon's resignation. DailyCaller.com reports, "While many panelists on NBC's [sic; ABC's] 'This Week' explained the moment as a time when America learned to be skeptical of its leaders, the former CBS reporter [Sharyl Attkisson] took a different tack. Her comments on Syria are very provocative.' One Democratic operative who asked not to be identified said the clear takeaway from the interview was simply that Clinton advisers are 'good poll readers,' a reference to Obama's sinking public approval ratings. To defeat them ...and to push them back from current locations and to push them into Syria, we would need to support ground forces" like the Kurds, or the "remnants of the Iraqi army that still has the will to fight," or "Sunni tribes that are turning against ISIS." At PersonalLiberty.com Sam Rolley writes, "...Obama's strategy of using airstrikes against the Islamic State (ISIS) terrorists attempting to take control of Iraq isn't likely to weaken the overall capabilities of the sophisticated terror group, a top Pentagon official said Monday. U.S. airstrikes on ISIS positions have been ongoing since last Friday. Army Lt. Gen. William Mayville told reporters assembled for a Monday afternoon Pentagon briefing that the strikes had only temporarily disrupted ISIS advances toward the Kurdish city of Erbil. Mayville warned, however, that ISIS remains dedicated to its mission of gaining ground throughout Iraq and 'will sustain its attacks against Iraqi and Kurdish security forces and their positions, as well as target Yazidis, Christians and other minorities' despite the airstrikes. According to the Pentagon official, the U.S. currently has no plans to expand operations beyond ending the siege of Mt. Sinjar and protecting U.S. interests in Erbil." [62733]

Iraqi Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki resists efforts to oust him, after President Fuad Masum nominates a replacement, Haider al-Abadi. CNN.com reports, "The new Prime Minister-designate, Abadi, is the deputy speaker of the Iraqi Parliament and a former aide to al-Maliki. Masum nominated the prominent Shiite politician for the prime minister's job on Monday despite al-Maliki's pronouncement earlier in the day that he intends to stay in office for a third term. Abadi will have 30 days to form a new government before he can formally take office. ... Whether al-Maliki would use force to retain power remains unknown. He spoke out against the nomination Monday, describing the appointment as 'null and void.' ... On Sunday [August 10], Iraqi forces and tanks surged into some Baghdad neighborhoods as a wave of troops swarmed Baghdad's green zone, the secure area where many government buildings and the U.S. Embassy are located, two Iraqi police officials said." Obama offers his support for al-Abadi, saying, "The United States stands ready to support a government that addresses the needs and grievances of all Iraqi people... We are also ready to work with other countries in the region to deal with the humanitarian crisis and counterterrorism challenge in Iraq [and] mobilizing that support will be easier once this new government is in place. ... [With the nomination of Abadi,] Iraq took a promising step forward in this critical effort. This is an important step in forming a new government that can unite Iraq's different communities. ... The only lasting solution is for Iraqis to come together and form an inclusive government. This new leadership has a difficult task to regain the confidence of its citizens by governing inclusively and taking steps to demonstrate its resolve." At TheDailyBeast.com Josh Rogin reports that Obama "got angry at lawmakers" who criticized him in a recent foreign policy meeting: "According to one of the lawmakers, Sen. Bob Corker [R-TN] asked [Obama] a long question that included sharp criticisms of ...Obama's handling of a number of foreign policy issues—including Syria, ISIS, Russia, and Ukraine. Obama answered Corker at length. Then, [Obama] defended his administration's actions on Syria, saying that the notion that many have put forth regarding arming the rebels earlier would have led to better outcomes in Syria was 'horseshit.' White House officials confirmed the charged exchange between Obama and Corker but declined to confirm that Obama used the expletive. But O'Keefe told MailOnline that his stunt proves the federal government's policy is lax and needs a dramatic overhaul. '...Obama is trying to deny the obvious,' he said. 'We proved that border security is national security. The fence is not complete. The border is not secure. In fact, the video shows the border fence is a joke.' 'The primary responsibility of the commander-in-chief is to protect the homeland,' said O'Keefe. WashingtonTimes.com reports, "The State Department 'did nothing' to help the case of an American citizen who died in Liberia amid Ebola hysteria, unable either to get the treatment he needed or to leave the country, according to an aid worker on the ground. The aid worker said they made repeated entreaties asking U.S. embassies to try to clear the way for 24-year-old Nathaniel Dennis to be transported from Liberia to Ghana for treatment, but officials were of no help, leaving the man stranded in Liberia, where he died, according to Rep. Duncan Hunter, a California Republican who has been in contact with the aid worker. Dennis had repeatedly tested negative for Ebola, but Ghana had refused to allow him to be transported out of fear he might spread the infection within its borders. The incident is raising questions about the extent of Ebola fear and what treatment is available to Americans caught in the middle—even those, like Dennis, who don't have it. ... The State Department, however, says it was deeply involved in the case, and tried to get Dennis cleared to enter Ghana. 'The U.S. embassy in Ghana contacted a hospital in Ghana and urged it to admit Mr. Dennis for emergency medical treatment. The embassy was also in contact with Ghanaian authorities during Mr. Dennis' illness,' said Pooja Jhunjhunwala, a State Department spokeswoman." [62752]

Attorney General Eric Holder issues a statement: "The shooting incident in Ferguson, Missouri this weekend deserves a fulsome [sic] review. In addition to the local investigation already underway, FBI agents from the St. Louis field office, working together with attorneys from the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division and US Attorney's Office, have opened a concurrent, federal inquiry. The federal investigation will supplement, rather than supplant, the inquiry by local authorities. At every step, we will work with the local investigators, who should be prepared to complete a thorough, fair investigation in their own right. I will continue to receive regular updates on this matter in the coming days. Aggressively pursuing investigations such as this is critical for preserving trust between law enforcement and the communities they serve." ("Fulsome" means "offensively excessive or insincere." Holder likely meant "full," "complete," or "thorough"—although many may, in fact, ultimately find his review offensive and excessive, because it will focus on police abuse of citizens and pay little attention to the abuse of store owners by looters and rioters. Obama has also misused the word "fulsome." In 2009 William Safire noted that Obama also often says "enormity" ("extreme wickedness") when he means "enormousness" ("bigness" or "huge in scale"). BizPacReview.com calls the Holder/Obama misuse of "fulsome" "a problem with people who aren't nearly as smart as they think they are, which is as good a working definition of 'liberal' as you can ask for (particularly in the Obama White House.)") And he [Proctor] was saying that no matter how successful you are, there's a common cause that bonds the black United States attorney with the black criminal or the black doctor with the black homeless person.' Has anyone ever asked Holder what exactly is the 'common cause' that binds the black attorney general and the black criminal? More important, what should the black attorney general do about this common cause? Should the black criminal feel empathy for the black attorney general, or more likely, do the favors only flow in one direction? Holder's explanation of Proctor's quote offers some key insights into our attorney general's worldview. I know the events of the past few days have prompted strong passions, but as details unfold, I urge everyone in Ferguson, Missouri, and across the country, to remember this young man through reflection and understanding. We should comfort each other and talk with one another in a way that heals, not in a way that wounds. Along with our prayers, that's what Michael and his family, and our broader American community, deserve." (To Obama, rioting and looting are nothing more than "strong passions." This is not to suggest that residents of Ferguson are wrong to be alarmed by the apparent unjustified actions of a police officer, but robbing a Walmart and a liquor store is certainly not the proper way to voice that alarm. Obama should have made that clear in his statement-or not issued one. Obama's statement on the death of Michael Brown comes after criticism of the White House for issuing a statement on the death of actor/comedian Robin Williams. Conservatives were annoyed that Obama took the time to note Williams' death but did not condemn the rioting in Ferguson, Missouri, while leftists were annoyed that Obama noted Williams' passing but not Brown's death. At Politico.com David Nather and Philip Ewing write that Obama "isn't just grappling with what feels like an endless foreign policy nightmare around the world. Now he's got one hell of a messaging problem at home. The United States will not intervene in foreign crises directly—or indirectly by supplying weapons and assistance—except when it does. Obama needs explicit authorization and funding from Congress in order to escalate American involvement in ongoing conflicts around the world—except when he doesn't. ...The good news for Obama is that the apparent mixed messages don't seem to matter to many American voters. (HotAir.com comments, "When forced to choose between protecting their own legacy and making life easier for the next Democrat to lead the ticket, the Hopenchange boys have made their choice. If this ship is destined to sink, they're going to make sure that Hillary takes on some water too. Excellent. Now she has her own choice to make. Having seen how hard the White House is willing to tug on her leash as she tries to walk away, does she tone down her criticism of them on foreign policy or risk making enemies of them by keeping at it? ... Obama, but also about Republicans Marco Rubio, Rick Santorum, Ted Cruz, and others." (As Timeline readers know, the term "natural born citizen" has historically meant born on U.S. soil to two U.S. citizen parents. Because he did not have two U.S. citizen parents at the moment of birth, Obama is not a natural born citizen. Nor are Ted Cruz, Marco Rubio, Rick Santorum, Bobby Jindal, or Nikki Haley.) [62868]

Another cost saver, Marcotte added, is to increase premiums for spouses who have access to other plans. ... The 'Cadillac tax' was originally intended to take effect sooner, but unions and other groups convinced officials to delay it until 2018, reducing the anticipated income from \$137 billion to \$80 billion over ten years. But many analysts predict it will be far less than that. ...Robert Laszewski of Health Policy and Strategy Associates said he doubted many will end up paying the tax. 'What we're finding is almost no employers are going to be hit by this 'Cadillac tax.' You'd be stupid to get hit by this 'Cadillac tax,' he said. 'They're all cutting their benefits right now.' One analyst noted the tax had less to do with health care than it did with revenue. 'The 'Cadillac tax' is not about health care, it's about the money. It's about getting the money,' said Dan Mendelson of Avalere Health." (Although few or no employers may be hit with the tax, their employees will be paying more out-of-pocket for their health care.) With Obama planning a brief (August 17–19) interruption of his vacation to return to the White House for a few days, conjecture about the purpose of the return increases. According to TheHill.com, "officials won't say why Obama is taking the unusual, and costly, trip back to Washington. ...Speculation has circled around whether Obama might make an announcement of executive actions he's taking on immigration reform, or a surprise visit from a foreign leader. Of course, even if Democrats retain control of the Senate the GOP can still block his nominee with a filibuster—unless Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) shamelessly changes the rules again.) WorldTribune.com reports, "Russia has pledged to accelerate military deliveries to Egypt. Russian President Vladimir Putin said the Kremlin would ensure that Egypt would soon receive billions of dollars worth of Russian weapons. Putin, in a meeting with President Abdul Fatah Sisi, said the deliveries have already begun. 'We are delivering weapons to Egypt,' Putin said. 'We are ready to expand this cooperation.' On Aug. 12, Putin and Sisi held their first summit since the latter was elected Egypt's president in May 2014. In March, Cairo and Moscow signed a military protocol that envisioned the sale of \$3 billion worth of attack helicopters, fighter-jets, air defense batteries and other platforms to Egypt. 'We are actively developing our military and technological cooperation,' Putin said." (The Egypt-Russia alliance is a direct result of Obama's abandonment of former Egyptian President and ally Hosni Mubarak. No longer trusting the United States, Egypt is turning to Russia. Pamela Geller writes, "Another one of Obama's unmitigated disasters for America. Instead of embracing the Egyptian people's rational and right collective decision to oust the terror regime of the Morsi government, he punished them. He withdrew aid. He strong-armed Sisi and still does, to this day, to 'include the Muslim Brotherhood in the political process.' USAToday.com reports, "The military has sent 130 additional advisers to northern Iraq to plan for the evacuation of refugees under siege by Islamic militants, Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel announced Tuesday. 'This is not a combat boots on the ground kind of operation,' Hagel told Marines at Camp Pendleton in California. ...There were about 300 U.S. military advisers already in Iraq, as well as other troops there [about 475] to protect the U.S. Embassy in Baghdad." (ISIS jihadists are no doubt pleased to hear that they will be able to return to their terrorist activities shortly. One can only imagine how Adolph Hitler would have reacted had the U.S. Secretary of Defense announced on June 5, 1944, "No, there is no way we will be invading Europe via Normandy's beaches or anywhere else.") At Townhall.com Daniel Doherty reports, "According to the Wall Street Journal, the situation on the ground in northern Iraq is so perilous that ... 'We highlighted the competition between rebel groups on the ground, and we warned if we didn't help the moderates, the extremists would gain.' But the warnings, which also came from other senior officialsincluding then-CIA chief David Petraeus and Defense Secretary Leon Panetta-fell on deaf ears. Obama's small circle of White House foreign policy advisers resisted efforts to make connections with rebel fighters on the ground until 2013, when the administration began to train and equip a few select vetted brigades. For many who worked on Syria policy inside the administration, it was too little, too late." [62866]

According to a Fox News poll, "Thirty-one percent of voters approve of how Obama is handling the situation in Ukraine, while 50 percent disapprove. Approval among Democrats (52 percent) is far outweighed by disapproval among Republicans (70 percent). [Obama's] ratings are similar on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict: 30 percent approve, while 54 percent disapprove. Bowe Bergdahl, who was freed earlier this year after spending nearly five years as a Taliban captive in Afghanistan, six of his former platoon mates are shopping proposals for a book and movie that would render their own harsh verdicts. ...But the political furor over Bergdahl's release from Taliban captivity-the result of a U.S.-Taliban deal to swap five Guantanamo terrorism suspects in exchange for Bergdahl's freedom—is complicating the book's prospects. Agents for the soldiers say that some publishers have balked, in at least one case out of fear that the project would bolster conservative criticism of the Obama administration. 'I'm not sure we can publish this book without the [political] Right using it to their ends,' Sarah Durand, a senior editor at Atria Books, a division of Simon & Schuster, wrote in an email to one of the soldiers' agents.' '[T]he Conservatives are all over Bergdahl and using it against Obama,' Durand wrote, 'and my concern is that this book will have to become a kind of 'Swift Boat Veterans for Truth''-a reference to the group behind a controversial book that [legitimately] raised questions about John Kerry's Vietnam War record in the midst of his 2004 presidential campaign. ... Two of the would-be authors, who were recently questioned as part of the Army probe, insisted in interviews that they aren't advancing a political agenda but want to set the record straight, as they see it, about Bergdahl's conduct and ... Obama's praise for him at a Rose Garden ceremony in May. 'There was no way we were going to sit down and be quiet while Obama was calling him a war hero,' said Evan Buetow, Bergdahl's former team leader, in an interview with Yahoo News. 'We're just trying to tell the truth. It's not my fault this would make Obama look bad.' 'We didn't politicize this,' added Cody Full, Bergdahl's former roommate. 'They brought his parents out at a White House Rose Garden ceremony and presented him as a hero. ... Why wouldn't you just have a quiet press release? Why do you have to have a big parade? The shocking image of Bary emerged as ISIS militants seized a number of key towns and villages close to Syria's northern border with Turkey." Jim Pasco, executive director of the Fraternal Order of Police, criticizes Obama's remarks about the situation in Ferguson, Missouri, telling TheHill.com, "I would contend that discussing police tactics from Martha's Vineyard is not helpful to ultimately calming the situation. I think what he has to do… as a constitutional lawyer is remember that there is a process in the United States and the process is being followed, for good or for ill, by the police and by the county and by the city and by the prosecutors' office. …I'm not there [in Ferguson], and neither is [Obama]. 'But with pressure and alternatives [that might draw away its Sunni supporters], it could collapse over time.' 'There was spot that was occupied by the ISIS. The Peshmerga came and took over it. As soon as our people saw the Peshmerga had arrived, they began descending the mountain.' These people are running towards life, but hunger, thirst and searing heat is following them. These refugees have paid a high price to reach safety. They have been walking for three days and three nights to reach Zakho, but that is not their ultimate goal. They wonder what their fate would be in the midst of this war." [62894]

YnetNews.com writes, "The US administration has halted a shipment of Hellfire aerial anti-armor missiles to Israel, the Wall Street Journal reported on Wednesday, citing government sources. The sources noted that Israel had requested the transfer of ammunitions directly from the Pentagon, without receiving the approval of the White House or State Department officials. 'We were blindsided,' one US diplomat said, while a US defense official insisted that 'there was no intent to blindside anyone. The process for this transfer was followed precisely along the lines that it should have.' ... While the Israeli and American militaries worked well together, the [Journal] describes a long line of diplomatic battles between the Obama administration and the Israeli government led by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, noting relations between the two countries have reached another low point. An Israeli official told the newspaper that the rift between Israel and the US has now deepened: 'We've been there before with a lot of tension with us and Washington. What we have now, on top of that, is mistrust and a collision of different perspectives on the Middle East.' Obama and Netanyahu reportedly had a 'particularly combative' phone call on Wednesday. US officials are quoted by the Journal as saying the current Gaza conflict has 'persuaded them that Mr. Netanyahu and his national security team are both reckless and untrustworthy.' Meanwhile Israeli officials view the Obama administration as 'weak and naive' and are working to bypass the White House, working with allies in Congress and elsewhere in the US administration instead. The Israeli officials told the Journal Netanyahu isn't worried about the tensions with the Obama administration and that he believes he can simply 'wait out' Obama's term, while relying on the strong support for Israel in Congress until then." Corsi notes, "[T]he Community Relations Service intervened in the Trayvon Martin case in Florida, helping organize protests that pressed for the prosecution of George Zimmerman, who later was acquitted by a jury of murder. ... The DOJ says its Community Relations Service, created under the Civil Rights Act of 1964, tries to help communities resolve conflicts and tensions arising from racial differences. But Fitton said Judicial Watch has accumulated considerable evidence that Holder's DOJ 'does not operate in a race-neutral manner.' His group is 'carefully watching and keeping abreast' of the situation in Ferguson and wants information about the Community Relations Service's work there. 'How much money is being spent? How many employees are being used? What are their talking points?' Fitton asked. The DOJ Community Relations Service did not return WND phone calls requesting comment." [62856]

CNSNews.com reports, "In 2011, in current year dollars, total government spending in the United States was \$6,115,429,668,000. That included \$2,516,666,590,000 in net state and local government spending and \$3,598,763,078,000 in net federal government spending. Thousands of settlers from Anatolia were shipped in by the Turkish government to occupy former Greek villages and to change Cypriot demography—in the same manner the occupying Ottoman Empire once did in the 16th century. Not a single nation recognizes the legitimacy of the Turkish

Cypriot state. In contrast, Greek Cyprus is a member of the European Union. Why, then, is the world not outraged at an occupied Cyprus the way it is at, say, Israel? Nicosia is certainly more divided than is Jerusalem. Thousands of Greek refugees lost their homes more recently, in 1974, than did the Palestinians in 1947. ... The island remains conquered not because the Greeks have given up, but because their resistance is futile against a NATO power of some 70 million people. Greeks know that Turkey worries little about what the world thinks of its occupation. Greeks in Cyprus and mainland Greece together number less than 13 million people. That is far less than the roughly 300 million Arabic speakers, many from homelands that export oil, who support the Palestinians. No European journalist fears that Greek terrorists will track him down should he write something critical of the Greek Cypriot cause. Greek Cypriots would not bully a journalist in their midst for broadcasting a critical report, the way Hamas surely would do to any candid reporter in Gaza. In other words, there is not much practical advantage or interest in promoting the Greek Cypriot cause. ... Turkey is also less emblematic of the West than is Israel. In the racist habit of assuming low expectations for non-Westerners, European elites do not hold Turkey to the same standards that they do Israel. 'In an extraordinary step, U. S. District Court Judge Emmett Sullivan has launched an independent inquiry into the issue of the missing emails associated with former IRS official Lois Lerner,' President of Judicial Watch John Fitton said in a statement. 'Previously, Judge Sullivan ordered the IRS to produce sworn declarations about the IRS email issue by August 11. Today's order confirms Judicial Watch's read of this week's IRS' filings that treated as a joke Judge Sullivan's order.'" [62837, 62888, 62896]

Judge Sullivan's order reads, in part, "In light of... the Declarations filed by the IRS, the IRS is hereby ORDERED to file a sworn Declaration, by an official with the authority to speak under oath for the Agency, by no later than August 22, 2014. In this Declaration, the IRS must: (1) provide information about its efforts, if any, to recover missing Lois Lerner emails from alternate sources (i.e., Blackberry, iPhone, iPad); (2) provide additional information explaining the IRS's policy of tracking inventory through use of bar code property tags, including whether component parts, such as hard drives, receive a bar code tag when serviced. If individual components do not receive a bar code tag, provide information on how the IRS tracks component parts, such as hard drives, when being serviced; (3) provide information about the IRS's policy to degauss hard drives, including whether the IRS records whose hard drive is degaussed, either by tracking the employee's name or the particular machine with which the hard drive was associated; and (4) provide information about the outside vendor who can verify the IRS's destruction policies concerning hard drives." HotAir.com's Ed Morrissey writes, "'ORDERED.' 'Must.' 'Speak under oath.' These are not really requests, and the time frame isn't an expression of curiosity, either. Giving the IRS a single week to meet these demands after months of wrangling over Judicial Watch's challenge implies that (a) Sullivan's pretty convinced the IRS has these answers, which then suggests that (b) Sullivan's getting angry over the IRS' intransigence and opacity in dealing with the court. In a letter today, House Energy and Commerce leaders asked Tavenner to explain why she asked her colleague to delete the email, and the letter questions whether there are other instances in which she instructed HHS staff to delete emails. The letter also asks for more details regarding Congressional subpoenaed documents, including Tavenner emails, that CMS recently said might be permanently lost; and it requests an explanation as to why redactions are made in some documents provided to Congress so far. The meaning of the Tavenner email that she wanted deleted, and the reason why she issued the instruction, isn't clear. Those copied on the email exchange to be deleted include: Jeanne Lambrew, Obama's Director of the White House Office of Health Reform." [62860, 62861, 62887]

The fighters pushed the Islamic State back from strip of agricultural land linking the edge of the mountain to the territory under their control on the Syrian border. Bolstering the corridor with their defences, it became the only conduit through which people trapped on the mountain to escape from. Up to 70,000 people passed through Nawrouz camp in Syria, the first place for them to rest and receive aid after the hundreds of miles travelled to get off the mountain. Under mismatched tents or tarpaulin sheets they tried to catch some rest and rehydrate. Most then travelled on to return to Iraq via a crossing that brought them to a safer part of the country, north of Mount Sinjar. They make up an estimated 1.2 million people who have been internally displaced since the Islamic State took control of Mosul in June. The humanitarian crises in this area is now so critical that some have now returned to Nawrouz camp." (As bad as the refugee camp may be, the people have nowhere else to go. Meanwhile, ISIS fighters kill 80 or more Yazidis when they take over the town of Kojo. [62895, 62897]

Police in Ferguson, Missouri, criticized in previous days for being too tough on looters and rioters, choose to back off—with predictable results: increased looting and rioting. One person tweets: "Have been here for over an hour and there has been absolutely no police engagement at all." Other Twitter messages: "Sam's Meat Market owner tells FOX2now: he saw his store being looted on TV, 911 shrugged him off. No response." "Store owners showing up to find there stores damaged. They're not happy with police not stopping looters." "Owners of SAMs Meat Market defending their store because they say police won't." "We were just waiting for them to leave' [said a] Looter in Ferguson celebrating the police turning around." [62898, 62900, 62904]

Meanwhile, TheGatewayPundit.com posts a description of the events of the shooting, according to a friend of officer Darren Wilson who appeared on the Dana Loesch radio program: "He pulled up ahead of them. And then he [Wilson] got a call-in that there was a strong-arm robbery. And, they gave a description. And, he's looking at them and they got something in their hands and it looks like it could be what, you know those cigars or whatever. So he goes in reverse back to them. Tries to get out of his car. They slam his door shut violently. I think he said Michael [Brown] did. And, then he opened the car again. He tried to get out. He stands up. And then Michael just bum-rushes him and shoves him back into his car. Punches him in the face and then Darren grabs for his gun. Michael grabbed for the gun. At one point he got the gun entirely turned against his hip. And he shoves it away. And the gun goes off. Well, then Michael takes off and gets to be about 35 feet away. And, Darren's first protocol is to pursue. So, he stands up and yells, 'Freeze!' Michael and his friend turn around. And Michael taunts him... And then all the sudden he just started bum-rushing him. He just started coming at him full speed. And, so he just started shooting. And, he just kept coming. And, so he really thinks he was on something [drugs]." WashingtonPost.com reports that a "person familiar with the county's investigation" said that "Brown had marijuana in his system when he was shot and killed." (As he did with the Trayvon Martin shooting incident, Obama felt compelled to make a statement before all the facts were known.) [62902, 62912, 62924, 62997, 63228]

"I'll be counting money by myself / I'm a rich nigga so I got that wealth / I fuck three [???] hos by myself / While I'm smoking on this [!?!?] / When the sun goes down / You in trouble now" "Smoking on this dope, till I choke / Motherfuckers / Motherfucker, fuck you and your opinions / Do you do smoke weed, keep doing what you do best" "Every time I call your bitch I make her cum / And when she comes I'm cumming all over her tush / I beat that pussy up / I'm smoking purple / I roll fat blunts they look just like my thumb / While I bless him with a dick on his face" "With this Glock in your face / And you betta not make a sound / And I only like white men on my money [???] / Those who are last shall be first / Whites on the bottom / He musta walked up and unloaded because there was no stopping him / Somebody else layin' across the street, must be his partner / Damn." At NYTimes.com Peter Baker writes, "In this summer of global tumult, the debate in Washington essentially boils down to two opposite positions: It is all ... Obama's fault, according to his critics; no, it is not, according to his supporters, because these are events beyond his control. ... 'Apparently,' he said in frustration the other day, 'people have forgotten that America, as the most powerful country on earth, still does not control everything around the world.' While as a statement of fact Mr. Obama's assertion may be self-evident, it was seen by adversaries as a cop-out and even by more sympathetic analysts as a revealing moment for a [leader] whiplashed by international instability. ... Missouri Governor Jay Nixon declares a state of emergency in Ferguson because of continuing violence. (The curfew begins at midnight Saturday and runs until 5 a.m. on Sunday morning.) Nixon says, "This is a test of whether a community—this community, any community—can break the cycle of fear, distrust and violence and replace them with peace, strength and ultimately justice."

Takimag.com comments on the events in Ferguson: "Our post-racial nation has found its new Trayvon Martin—albeit one bigger, fatter, and possibly even dumber—in the form of 18-year-old Michael Brown of Ferguson, Missouri. And as with the whole sordid Rodney King affair-when an initial jury verdict found police innocent and LA then burned for days-the dilapidated and mostly black St. Louis suburb of Ferguson has seen rioting in various degrees of intensity since last Sunday night. On the rioters' and protesters' side there has been looting and chanting and assaulting and brickthrowing and shooting at police choppers and the tossing of Molotov cocktails. As if the locals weren't raising enough hell, they've been aided and abetted by white communists and New Black Panthers who've come down from Chicago to bark about 'revolution,' which is a word almost exclusively used by those who wouldn't have the first clue what to do after all the smoke clears and the embers go cold. But mostly the preachers and pundits are right: Not much, if anything, has changed. We've gone from Skittles to Swishers. And America is still divided, dumb, and doomed." [62905]

IJReview.com reports, "In a shocking revelation today, it was revealed that the Department of Justice had the videotape footage of Michael Brown robbing a liquor store in Ferguson, but actually told the police department NOT to release it to the public. ...And why would the Obama administration not want the video to come into the public view?" According to MSNBC contributor Goldie Taylor, "Robbery video was released over the objections of DOJ. Told Ferguson PD [police department] it was inflammatory..." The New York Times reported the results of a private autopsy conducted by Dr. Michael Baden, who was hired by the Brown family. Baden conducted the autopsy on Sunday, according to the Times. One bullet entered the top of Brown's skull. Four struck him in the right arm. All bullets hit Brown in the front of the body, according to the autopsy. ...Baden provided a diagram to the Times, which shows that the bullet that that struck Brown in the head entered while he was bent forward. 'It can be because he's giving up, or because he's charging forward at the officer,' Baden said." (Those who claimed Brown was shot in the back as he fled from the police office were mistaken.) Missouri officials conducted the first autopsy; Baden conducted the second; and Attorney General Eric Holder has ordered a third to be conducted by federal authorities. (How the federal government has any jurisdiction in the case is not clear. HotAir.com comments, "We try not to leap to conclusions, but it seems there is a rather obvious case to be made that the Obama Administration (unless Holder took this upon himself without approval, which seems unlikely in the extreme) has decided to latch on to this incident and it has political fingerprints all over it. The NYTimes.com writes that "Obama is seen as frustrating to his own party," and describes a meeting at which Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) sought Obama's support for GOP-delayed White House appointment but was told bluntly, "You and [Senate Minority Leader] Mitch [McConnell (R-KY] work it out." According to the *Times*, "Mr. Reid seethed quietly for the rest of the meeting, according to four separate accounts provided by people who spoke with him about it. The process of review, established in April of 2009 by a White House memo, stipulates that FOIA requests to federal agencies dealing with 'White House equities' need to be processed by the Obama administration first before being approved for release. ... [T] he undefined 'White House equities' phrase has been used to keep a close grip on information that is politically embarrassing. In total, Cause of Action listed 12 agencies in the suit, stating the agencies have failed to respond within the mandated time of 20 days, or even 30 days in unusual circumstances. The goal of Cause of Action's claim is to move the court to rule that agencies must make a final decision about the documents within 30 days." [62970]

According to the Media Research Center, "Texans for Public Justice, one of the groups behind [Texas Governor] Rick Perry's indictment charges, is part of a 'progressive' coalition that has received \$500,000 from liberal billionaire George Soros. *Tunisia Daily* reports that ISIS has been circumcising Assyrian men, without anesthesia and against their will in Mosul. ISIS has also reportedly sold 700 Yazidi women as slaves, for about \$150 each, at an auction in Mosul. [63016, 63018]

In a stunningly bland and emotionless statement from the White House, a tie-less Obama says, "With respect to Iraq, we continue to see important progress there. First, our military operations are effectively protecting our military personnel. We have urgently provided arms to [the Kurds] and Iraqi security forces fighting on the frontlines. ...Let's remember that ISIL proposes a threat to all Iraqis." On the Ferguson riots, Obama says, "It's clear that the vast majority of people are peaceful protesters. It's also clear that some people are not. ... Giving into that anger by looting, or carrying guns, and even attacking police... undermines rather than advances justice. As Americans we've got to use this moment to seek our common humanity. I've said this before: in too many communities around the country [too] many young men of color are left behind and only seen as objects of fear." Perhaps having learned a little from his past mistakes of issuing statements before all the facts were in (Cambridge Police Department, Trayvon Martin, "not a smidgen of evidence," et al.), Obama says, "I have to be very careful about not prejudging these events before investigations are completed, because, although these are, you know, issues of local jurisdiction-you know, the DOJ works for me. [No, the Department of Justice works for the American people-not for Obama.] And then when they're [sic; it is] conducting an investigation, I've got to make sure that I don't look like I'm putting my thumb on the scales one way or the other." [Ferguson is] nothing comparable to that, but what makes it somewhat similar is the enormous amount of media attention." [62929]

BizPacReview.com reports, "Raw video taken on the scene immediately following Michael Brown's shooting is being circulated as a possible validation of police officer Darren Wilson's account of the incident that has sparked a week of riots and unrest in Missouri and another race debate nationally. Conservative Treehouse blog found the video on You Tube late last week. It was posted by someone who was filming Brown's body on the street and talking with others about what had just happened. Although the main voice on the clip says he thinks the police shot Brown unjustifiably, an apparent witness to the shooting offered his account that some are saying gives credence to what the police said happened. The alleged witness said Brown was coming back at the officer who had his gun already drawn. There are two very different versions of this pivotal part of the incident. The widely reported version that sparked the riots and looting is that Brown turned around to surrender with his hands up before he was shot. The police version is that the shooting came after a struggle in which Brown tried to take the officer's gun." On the video, one person says, "Then the next thing I know he [Brown was] coming back toward him [the police officer] cus [sic; because] the police had his gun drawn already on him..." (Although the video is certainly not definitive, the description "coming back toward him" of conflicts with claims that Brown was surrendering. Brown was reportedly walking down the middle of the street, blocking traffic, and the altercation with the police officer commenced when Brown refused to move to the sidewalk as requested.) Curfew violations and continued rioting and looting prompt Governor Jay Nixon to call up National Guard troops to police Ferguson, Missouri. [62934, 62944]

Reuters reports, "Community Health Systems Inc, one of the biggest U.S. hospital groups, said on Monday it was the victim of a cyber attack from China, resulting in the theft of Social Security numbers and other personal data belonging to 4.5 million patients. Security experts said the hacking group, known as 'APT 18,' may have links to the Chinese government. ... The information stolen from Community Health included patient names, addresses, birth dates, telephone numbers and Social Security numbers of

people who were referred or received services from doctors affiliated with the hospital group in the last five years, the company said in a regulatory filing." [62946]

CNN, NBC, and other media outlets broadcast images of the home of Ferguson, Missouri police officer Darren Wilson—despite the fact that some racists have called for his murder. (Wilson has 24-hour protection.) [62958]

HotAir.com points out that the Associated Press has repeatedly violated its own Stylebook, referring to Michael Brown as a "teen" or "teenager." According to the AP Stylebook, reports should "use man or woman for individuals 18 and older." "[O]bviously," observes Hot Air, "if they're breaking their own rule, they're doing it to put a thumb on the moral scale of how tragic Brown's death is. Listing his age as 18 and then following normal style doesn't quite go far enough in leading the reader to the conclusion they want... to draw. ...Brown's 'teenager' status per the AP Stylebook is a relatively benign illustration of that but some examples are more malignant. Everyone understands why the [New York] Times cooked up the unorthodox term 'white Hispanic' to describe George Zimmerman: They were pushing a 'white man values black life cheaply' narrative but got tripped up by the inconvenient fact that Zimmerman himself was a minority by virtue of his Latino ancestry, and so rather than jettison the narrative, they concocted 'white Hispanic' to keep it intact." On The Five, Greg Gutfeld asks, "What do you call six dead and 25 wounded? A weekend in Chicago. Such crime is so mundane, it's become background music for bad neighborhoods. With mundane death, you can't raise money off it, you can't raise your profile off it and you can't raise any hell. But with Ferguson you could do all that, facts be damned." [62983]

At Breitbart.com Tony Lee reports, "After White House officials reportedly met with bigbusiness groups, ...Obama is considering executive actions that will give them more guest-worker visas in the high-tech and low-skilled sectors. This may come on top of Obama's potential grants of amnesty and work permits to millions of illegal immigrants in the country. While outside groups are urging Obama to 'go big,' Senate Democrats have expressed some concerns of late, as poll numbers have shown that executive amnesty may cost them control of the Senate. out to big-business groups on guest-worker visas so they can give Obama air cover on his potential executive amnesty. ...[A]ccording to Politico, 'the ideas under discussion for executive action include allowing spouses of workers with high-tech visas to work, recapturing green cards that go unused, and making technical changes for dual-purpose visa applications.' In addition, 'agriculture industry representatives' have also pushed the Obama administration for an expansion of the 'existing agriculture worker program.' The Obama administration, according to Politico, 'is also considering provisions for lowskilled workers for industries, like construction, that would allow individuals with temporary work authorization to gain work permits.' One looter tells *The Washington Post*, "I'm proud of us. We deserve this, and this is what's supposed to happen when there's injustice in your community. St. Louis—not going to take this anymore." One police officer, referring to thugs who came from out of town to loot stores in Ferguson, uses the term, "looting tourism." [62980]

While protesters, the media, and the Department of Justice focus on Ferguson, Missouri, RebelPundit.com reports that 31 people were shot and seven are killed in Chicago over the weekend, and notes, "HeyJackass.com, a website that maintains a running tally of the shooting and murder mayhem in Chicago also reports the homicide total for 2014 is 259 so far, with a total of 1360 shot and wounded." The shooting took place outside the Six Stars Market, according to KMOV, four miles from the unrest in Ferguson over last week's cop shooting of a black teenager. ...Fox [News] reported that the man, described as behaving 'erratically,' was trying to rob the store and got into a dispute with the owner who called 911. When police arrived, the man reportedly shouted: 'Shoot me, kill me now.' The 23-year-old was holding the knife in an overhand grip, the police chief said today. The officers left their patrol car without their weapons drawn but when the man charged at them with the knife raised and was within three or four feet, they opened fire and killed him." Meanwhile, DailyCaller.com reports, "According to a preliminary report from a St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter, police say that more than a dozen witnesses back Ferguson police officer Darren Wilson's version of the events that led to the fatal shooting of Michael Brown." [62968, 62984]

A Chinese J-11B fighter jet 'buzzes' a U.S. P-8A surveillance aircraft (a modified Boeing 737) over the South China Sea. According to DefenseNews.com, "The interception was 'very close, very dangerous ... pretty aggressive and very unprofessional,' Pentagon spokesman Rear Adm. John Kirby told reporters." The Pentagon states, "On three different occasions, the Chinese J-11 crossed directly under the US aircraft with one pass having only 50-100 feet separation between the two aircraft. The Chinese jet also passed the nose of the P-8 at 90 degrees with its belly toward the P-8 to show its weapons load out. In doing so, the [Chinese] pilot was unable to see the P-8, further increasing the potential for a collision. The Chinese pilot then flew directly under and alongside the P-8 bringing their wingtips within 20 feet and then, before he stabilized his fighter he conducted a roll over the P-8 passing within 45 feet." (One U.S. official suggests the incident may be the result of a "rogue pilot." HotAir.com's Noah Rothman writes, "Rogue pilots or no, a catastrophic midair collision between American and Chinese aircraft would spark a potentially disastrous international incident. This episode is certain to heighten tensions between the two powers. Moreover, the implication from unnamed American officials that Beijing cannot control its own pilots is sure to produce even more goodwill towards the United States.") [63316, 63317]

A life-sized statue of a seated Obama is stolen from the front porch bench of a home in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania. WNEP.com reports that the theft "upset the owner so much, she ended up in a hospital. It took Tiffany Bruce months to save up for a decorative piece to spruce up her new home in Wilkes-Barre. 'That statue was actually \$1,249,' Bruce said." (The statue is later found seated on a nearby park bench, with a lit cigarette in its mouth and a six-pack of empty bottles of Twisted Tea.) Hamas violates the latest ceasefire, firing at least 50 rockets into Israel. Israel responds with strikes on terror targets in Gaza. [62961, 62978, 62998, 63007, 63008, 63034]

Mark Regev, chief spokesman for Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu, says, "What we're hoping to have is a situation where Hamas is demilitarized and we have allies, the American administration, the American Congress, the Europeans, the Egyptians and even the official Palestinian government in the West Bank [in agreement]. But is Hamas going to voluntarily going to turn in their weapons? It's tough. Ronald Reagan once said about the old Soviet Union, and I'm old enough to remember, he said, 'Trust but verify.' When dealing with Hamas in contrast you have to verify and you have to verify again and Hamas has broken ceasefires as recently as last week. ...First we took out a lot of it [Hamas rockets and ammunition], secondly they shot a lot of it at us and what's left is a residual capacity still there that's much less than what they had two months ago. ISIS releases [arguably suspicious] video of American photojournalist James Wright Foley, who was abducted in Syria in 2012, being beheaded as a warning against U.S. intervention in Iraq. (The hooded executioner in the video speaks with a British accent. Great Britain has been a recruitment target of ISIS.) Obama has no immediate comment, but shameless "journalists" quickly descend on the Foley home in Rochester, New Hampshire. (Pamela Geller writes, "But no worries, because the commandant in chief tells us they are 'on the run' and just a bunch of 'Junior Varsity' players.") At FrontPageMag.com Daniel Greenfield writes, "James Foley was one of a new breed of activists calling themselves journalists. He didn't travel to report on a story, but to promote an agenda. And the agenda was obvious from his Twitter feed. Any human life lost is tragic, but a moral individual would have much more empathy for the Syrian Christians who suffered at the hands of Foley's favorite Jihadists than one of their pet propagandists. The persecuted Yazidis may no longer be dominating Western headlines, but their condition does not seem to have appreciably improved since America intervened in Iraq on their behalf. Even while suffering casualties and setbacks on the battlefield, ISIS does not relent in its campaign of inhumanity. Whether by self-imposed exile or execution, without further Western intervention, it seems likely that Iraq's ancient Yazidi minority will soon disappear from that country." [62977]

Reuters reports, "[The] Islamic State [ISIS], the Sunni militant group which seeks to establish a caliphate in parts of Iraq and Syria, released a video on Tuesday that gave the strongest indication yet it might attempt to strike American targets. The video with the theme 'breaking of the American cross' boasts [that the] Islamic State will emerge victorious over 'crusader' America. It follows a video posted on Monday warning of attacks on American targets if Washington struck against its fighters in Iraq and Syria. The latest footage speaks of a holy war between the al-Qaeda offshoot and the United States, which occupied Iraq for nearly a decade and faced stiff resistance from al Qaeda. Islamic State's sweep through northern Iraq, bringing it close to Baghdad and in control of the second city, Mosul, drew U.S. airstrikes on the country for the first time since the end of the American occupation in 2011." [63010] According to Aljazeera.com, "The Islamic State group [ISIS] has an army of more than 50,000 fighters in Syria, and recruited 6,000 people in the last month, a monitoring group has said. Rami Abdel Rahman, the director of the UK-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, said on Tuesday that the group's recruitment push was gathering pace every month. 'July saw the largest recruitment since the group appeared in Syria in 2013, with more than 6,000 new fighters,' he said. 'The number of IS fighters has passed 50,000 in Syria, including 20,000 non-Syrians,' he said. Al Jazeera cannot verify the observatory's figures. However, an Islamic State source backed the statement and told Al Jazeera that the group also had 30,000 fighters in Iraq. Abdel Rahman said the new recruits in Syria included more than 1,000 foreign fighters from Chechnya, China, Europe and Arab countries. He said most had entered Syria from Turkey." [63078, 63079]

WorldTribune.com reports, "The U.S. intelligence community has determined that Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant was building an infrastructure in the West. Officials said ISIL was establishing sleeper cells in the European Union in what could mark a prelude to mass-casualty attacks. They said ISIL was recruiting Europeans and Americans with easy access to both continents. ...In a briefing on Aug. 14, representatives of the intelligence community portrayed ISIL as a confident Islamist movement determined to use its base in Iraq and Syria for attacks in the West. The intelligence community determined that ISIL recruited thousands of Westerners, many of whom were fighting in the Levant and gaining skills in intelligence, organization and combat. 'What they have is momentum,' another official said." [63081, 63082]

CNSNews.com reports, "The average price for all types of ground beef per pound hit its all-time high—\$3.884 per pound—in the United States in July, according to data released today by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). ...A year ago, in July 2013, the average price for a pound of ground beef was \$3.459 per pound. Since then, the average price for a pound of ground beef has gone up 42.1 cents—or about 12 percent. Five years ago, in July 2009, the average price for a pound of ground of ground beef was \$2.147, according to the BLS. In those five years, the average price has climbed by \$1.737 per pound—or almost 81 percent." [62992]

NYTimes.com reports, "The Afghan attorney general's office called in a New York Times correspondent [Matthew Rosenberg] for questioning Tuesday, and later barred him from leaving the country, after The Times published an article about discussions among some officials of imposing an interim government. ...The State Department criticized the Afghanistan government's actions. 'We are deeply disturbed by the actions of the Afghan attorney general and by this travel ban that has allegedly been put into place, and urge the Afghan government to respect fundamental freedoms of expression and expression of the press, and we'll continue to monitor it,' Marie Harf, a deputy State Department spokeswoman, told reporters in Washington." According to Examiner.com, "The Norwegian news portal VG Nett is reporting that a Muslim terrorist group, Ansar al-Sunna', is threatening that if a section of the nation's capitol isn't transformed into a sharia-complaint Muslim nation, an attack rivaling 9/11

DailyCaller.com reports, "[A] solar thermal power plant co-owned by [Google] and two energy companies is incinerating more than 1,000 birds every year. Google co-owns the Ivanpah solar plant with Brightsource Energy and NRG Energy. The project uses more than 300,000 huge mirrors, called heliostats, which reflect sunlight to water boilers atop 459-foot towers to generate enough electricity to power 140,000 homes. The Associated Press reports that environmentalists estimate that 'about a thousand... to 28,000' birds are incinerated by heliostats every year." (There are at least 125 million homes in the United States. It would therefore take about 892 similarly-sized solar power plants to provide power for all U.S. homes. If each power plant were to kill between 1,000 and 28,000 birds per year, the total loss would be 892,000 to 24,976,000 birds killed per year.) The (unconfirmed) suggestion is that people are being paid to protest, hold signs, and throw objects at the police. [63119]

He was brave and bold, and no masked coward can ever steal the legacy of this courageous American who lived out the meaning of the word journalism. ... There is evil in this world, and we all have come face to face with it once again. Ugly, savage, inexplicable, nihilistic, and valueless evil. ISIL is the face of that evil, a threat to people who want to live in peace, and an ugly insult to the peaceful religion they violate every

day with their barbarity. We grieve for James Foley. We mourn for his family and his loved ones. We honor the courage and pray for the safety of all those who risk their lives to discover the truth where it is needed most. And make no mistake: We will continue to confront ISIL wherever it tries to spread its despicable hatred. The world must know that the United States of America will never back down in the face of such evil. ISIL and the wickedness it represents must be destroyed, and those responsible for this heinous, vicious atrocity will be held accountable." (At JihadWatch.org Robert Spencer writes, "The imam Kerry did not explain how the Islamic State is violating the Religion of Peace. He is just sure that they must be doing so. The possibility that they might be acting in accord with the Qur'an never enters his mind, even to be rejected. Even to consider such a possibility would be 'Islamophobic.' But what do you expect? This is a man who learned about Islam from a Board member of a lobbying group for the Islamic Republic of Iran, Reza Aslan.") [63167, 63169]

The Daily Mail reports, "A Frenchman who was held captive with murdered American journalist James Foley for months said today he has a 'rough' idea who his executioner is. Didier Francois said a video of the suspected British jihadist stirred painful memories of being chained up in the dark with Mr Foley and other ISIS hostages in Syria. It came as a former MI6 chief said the British jihadist will be identified and the SAS will be sent to Syria to 'bring him to justice.' The suspect accused of murdering the reporter has been named as 'John'-one of a gang of British jihadis known as 'The Beatles' who are guarding western hostages for ISIS. ... For two-and-a-half months, Mr Francois was chained to fellow French hostages, Nicolas Henin, Edouard Elias, and Pierre Torres. They were released in April after France paid a ransom. Mr Henin said today that Mr Foley was beaten more than any other hostage because he was an American and ISIS knew his brother was in the U.S. Air Force, and in one incident he was 'crucified against a wall,' it has emerged. The killer spoke in a distinctive English accent and his eyes and build are clearly visible in a propaganda video in which he cuts Mr Foley's head off. Mr Francois spent eight months with Mr Foley as a captive in Syria, enduring most of that time in underground cells with no natural light." [63095]

Daniel Hannan, a member of the European Union's parliament, suggests, "We should legislate so that British nationals who fight for Islamic State lose their citizenship. Let them stay there." [63064]

On *Outnumbered*, Harris Faulkner reminds viewers that radical jihadists "do this [brutal killings and beheadings] to people every day. They did to the Yazidis as they were moving up on that mountaintop, before we got their with our firepower." Fox contributor Pete Hegseth adds, "They're doing this to Christians, they're doing this to Yazidis. Yazidi women [are] in prison today, being forcibly married and raped. This is ongoing. [But] This [James Foley's beheading] is an American journalist so it gets attention. Men and women and children, Muslims, Christians and others, are beheaded on a daily basis by this group [ISIS]." The French had to tip us off. I mean, these are the days of Thomas Jefferson. This isn't a surprise. You can't solve it with a dialogue. You can't solve it with

a summit. You solve it with a bullet to the head. That's the only thing these people understand. ...All we've heard from [Obama] is the case to heap praise on this religion, as if to appease them. His Cairo speech, his remarks from last Memorial Day saying that we have a shared history of tolerance. Instead of making the case against this threat that is never going to stop. He has been wrong about this threat. He hasn't just ignored it. He has been fundamentally wrong. He misled the nation about it." Others will argue that it was not anger that he displayed, but annoyance—annoyance that his golf vacation was interrupted by ISIS and that its actions are something he will have a difficult time ignoring. NYTimes.com does not help Obama. It posts the monumentally stupid headline: "*Obama, Outraged Over Beheading, Vows to Stay on Course.*" (The online headline is later changed to: "Obama, Appalled by Beheading, Will Continue Airstrikes.") Another *New York Times* headline: "Rockets From Gaza and Israeli Response Break Cease-Fire." (That can be translated to: "Hamas violated the cease fire, but we want to blame Israel too.") This image of [Obama] is disheartening, and sends the wrong signals to our enemies. ISIS needs to be stopped, and fist bumps between [Obama] and his [golf] buddies won't stop them." ABC News political director Rick Klein observes that the White House is apparently "well past the point of caring about the so-called 'optics' of things like this. And [Obama] himself clearly doesn't... care about the way it looks." Even the far left Vox.com's Ezra Klein, a fervent Obama supporter, tweets, "Golfing today is in bad taste." Investor's Business Daily wonders, "Murdered ambassador. Beheaded American. Just what exactly would it take to keep Obama from a fundraiser or off the golf course?" Congressman Mike Pompeo (R-KS), a member of the House Select Committee on Intelligence and former Army officer, states, "[Obama] is correct that terrorist groups like ISIS don't belong in the 21st Century and that we must be relentless to see that justice is done. But there is another, even greater reason the United States must take action: To prevent more Americans from being killed. According to ABC's Jonathan Karl, the White House knew in advance of ISIS threats to kill James Foley. (Obama went on his golf vacation anyway.) [63031]

ABCNews.com reports, "U.S. special operations forces early this summer launched a secret, major rescue operation in Syria [reportedly on July 4] to save James Foley and a number of Americans held by the extremist group ISIS, but the mission failed because the hostages weren't there, senior administration officials told ABC News today. ...Obama authorized the 'substantial and complex' rescue operation after the officials said a 'broad collection of intelligence' led the U.S. to believe the hostages were being held in a specific location in the embattled Middle Eastern nation. When 'several dozen' U.S. special operation members landed in Syria, however, they were met with gunfire and 'while on site, it became apparent the hostages were not there,' one of the officials said. The special operators engaged in a firefight in which ISIS suffered 'a good number' casualties, the official said, while the American forces suffered only a single minor injury. The American forces were able to get back on helicopters and escape." (That this information was released is stunning. The Department of Defense would not be telling the media about covert operations; that it did so can only mean that Obama specifically authorized—or even ordered—the leak. Foley was held captive with other hostages, who were European journalists and Balboni told the Boston Globe that they were released when their ransoms were paid. State Department spokeswoman Marie Harf tells reporters, "I think ISIL wants to make this about the United States and our actions. And I think what [Obama] was trying to say

That brings us to whether this report can be trusted, however. Fatah has every reason to pin failure on Qatar in order to keep them out of the peace talks. Qatar will favor Hamas over Fatah in any settlement in which they participate, so it's in Fatah's interest as well as Egypt's to keep them locked out of the talks. ... Egypt, meanwhile, is not about to invite the Qataris or anyone else backing Hamas to these talks. They are fighting their own insurgency in the Sinai, for which they blame the Muslim Brotherhood, which is the parent organization of Hamas. Today they found four beheaded corpses near a village in the

peninsula, and Reuters reports that this is part of a stepped-up terror campaign by MBlinked groups protesting the al-Sisi military government." [63045]

Hamas takes credit for the kidnapping and murder of three Israeli teenagers—the action that started the renewed conflict between the terrorist group and the Jewish state. (Hamas apologists had claimed the group had nothing to do with the killings.) [63076, 63077, 63089]

(The unarmed Carey was shot and killed by Secret Service officers on October 3, 2013 after she mistakenly tried to drive onto the White House grounds. Miriam Carey's sister, Valerie, has wondered if Miriam was quickly disposed of because her daughter is Obama's "love child.") Holder tells a group of community leaders in Ferguson he understands why many blacks do not trust the police. "I understand that mistrust. I am the attorney general of the United States. But I am also a black man." (Holder's statement is totally inappropriate and only fans the flames of racism. Had the same shooting occurred while George W. Bush was president, the media outrage would have been monumental had Bush's white attorney general said, "I understand why police officer Darren Wilson feared for his life when confronted by a big, burly, angry black man.") FoxNews.com reports that Darren Wilson, the Ferguson, Missouri police officer who shot Michael Brown, "suffered severe facial injuries, including an orbital (eye socket) fracture, and was nearly beaten unconscious by Brown moments before firing his gun, a source close to the [police] department's top brass told FoxNews.com. ... According to the well-placed source, Wilson was coming off another case in the neighborhood on Aug. 9 when he ordered Michael Brown and his friend Dorain [sic; Darian] Johnson to stop walking in the middle of the road because they were obstructing traffic. However, the confrontation quickly escalated into physical violence, the source said. 'They ignored him and the officer started to get out of the car to tell them to move,' the source said. 'They shoved him right back in, that's when Michael Brown leans in and starts beating Officer Wilson in the head and the face.' The source claims that there is 'solid proof' that there was a struggle between Brown and Wilson for the policeman's firearm, resulting in the gun going off—although it still remains unclear at this stage who pulled the trigger. Brown started to walk away according to the account, prompting Wilson to draw his gun and order him to freeze. Brown, the source said, raised his hands in the air, and turned around saying, 'What, you're going to shoot me?' At that point, the source told FoxNews.com, the 6-foot-4, 292-pound Brown charged Wilson, prompting the officer to fire at least six shots at him, including the fatal bullet that penetrated the top of Brown's skull... Wilson suffered a fractured eye socket in the fracas, and was left dazed by the initial confrontation, the source said. He is now 'traumatized, scared for his life and his family, injured and terrified' that a grand jury, which began hearing evidence on Wednesday, will 'make some kind of example out of him,' the source said. The source also said the dashboard and body cameras, which might have recorded crucial evidence, had been ordered by Ferguson Police Chief Thomas Jackson, but had only recently arrived and had not yet been deployed." (Johnson was with Brown during the store robbery. Johnson also has an outstanding arrest warrant for providing false information to the police in a previous robbery.) [63067]

Meanwhile, police in Salt Lake City, Utah investigate what appears to be an unjustified shooting of a white teenager by a black police officer. (Obama, Al Shaprton, Jesse Jackson, and Eric Holder have not commented on the case.) [63068, 63268]

At Shoebat.com Ben Barrack reports, "For the second day in a row, State Department spokesman Marie Harf was pressed on Turkey's support for Hamas launching a coup in the West Bank so that it can better fight Israel. Now, Turkey is on the side of ISIS, and the U.S.—whether it wants to acknowledge it or not—is on the side of Assad by default (the U.S. is fighting ISIS in Iraq). Then, of course, we have the situation with Israel. As is the case in Egypt right now, Russia is aligning with anti-Muslim Brotherhood forces by siding with Gen. el-Sisi. The Obama administration has been siding with the Brotherhood there (siding with Turkey). By aligning with Turkey, the U.S. is siding *against* Israel, increasingly so." [63069, 63261]

At Examiner.com Jim Kouri reports, "After ... In St. Louis, Missouri, Attorney General Eric Holder meets with the parents of Michael Brown. (He does not meet with police officer Darren Wilson or his family.) [63126, 63127]

Senator James Inhofe (R-OK) tells Oklahoma City's Fox 25, "We're in the most dangerous position we've ever been in as a nation. ISIS, they are really bad terrorists, they're so bad even Al Qaida is afraid of them. ...They're crazy out there and they're rapidly developing a method of blowing up a major U.S. city and people just can't believe that's happening. ...[Obama is] going to have to come up with something that we're going to do because they're holding another hostage in place and the problem is, [Obama] says all these things and he never does them." And certainly an operation like this [the attempt to rescue James Foley] is no reason to disclose it. At deference to Mr. Foley's family, I probably would have told that family what we had attempted to do at least and give them some comfort that we may did try to rescue him. But, you know, even going back to the [Osama] bin Laden raid which was obviously successful, the amount of information that was released after that infuriated the Secretary of Defense. I know if our special operators were here, [they would say] they don't want these things talked about. They don't want them out in the media. What will happen now because we disclosed the event, journalists will pursue with sources to get more information about the details of that event. And that is what the special operators don't want out there. ... You know, first of all, they need accurate intelligence. And obviously in this case they didn't have it. Secondly, they need the element of surprise because we plop them downright usually in the middle of the enemy. And after that they certainly have to rely on their extraordinary skill and also on their daring and courage. All those elements contribute to success. And certainly surprise is something they absolutely need to have or else they lose the advantage. And so, they don't want people on their guard about these kind of operations. We've got about eight hostages in seven different countries. You can know for a fact that every one of those people who are holding them captive are looking at where are they, should we move them, what's [sic; what are] the circumstances, do we have enough... prevention here in the event that somebody was coming after them." Kelly asks, "And the question is, you know, why did they do it, general? Was this a CYA, was this a, you know, the critics had been saying, you know, why did—why didn't we do more to get these Americans and so did the administration have to defend itself?" Keane: "Well, I think, the obvious conclusion you come to it, they want to take some credit for something they tried although it, you know, it obviously didn't work. And I don't think that's enough reason for this kind of a disclosure, because we want to do this again. The fact of the matter is when we have somebody hostage, Megyn, that is a very high-intelligent collection priority. And we are focused on that. And we seized the moment to try to get them. On Hannity, former Vice President Dick Cheney tells Sean Hannity, "there's no question" that ISIS is "very much a threat to the United States, to our friends and allies, not only in the Middle East but in Europe. And when you see them behead an American reporter... that's obviously a terrible development, but magnify that a million times over because that's what's in store for the rest of the world if we don't deal effectively with this crisis. ... The intelligence is there for all to see. There's no question about what's happening. But [Obama] and the people around him refuse to recognize it and certainly refuse to deal with it. The damage that is being done as we talk tonight, Sean, to the American military, is enormous. They're taking our Army down below levels we haven't seen since Pearl Harbor. ## On August 21 Obama again plays golf—his eighth round in 11 days. [63091]

Former British boxer Anthony Small, who now calls himself Abdul Haqq, posts a video on the Internet claiming that the United States "fabricated" stories of ISIS massacring Yazidis in Iraq in order to justify attacks on the Islamist group. He then essentially admits that the Yazidis were murdered because they chose unwisely when told they had several options: convert to Islam, live under Shari'ah law, leave the area, or fight and die. The options offered, states Haqq, prove "that the Islamic State has shown a certain degree of leniency." Haqq warns, "If [Great] Britain ups their own ante, ups their own attacks, against the Islamic State, me myself [sic; I] am not going anywhere near any trains, buses, or tubes [subways]. As a matter of fact, I would even consider moving out of the city I live in, London, to some remote farm somewhere. ... If Britain follows the United States of America in their attack against the Islamic State, the U.K. will become a very unsafe place because, by their own standards, they have no idea how many [terrorist] sleeper cells they have." (Small/Haqq cannot be deported because he is a British citizen, born and raised in the United Kingdom. That is the problem faced by western Europe and the United States: terrorists and terrorist sympathizers who live among everyone else, and who are protected by the laws of their countries even as they advocate overthrowing their governments and imposing Islamic Shari'ah law. Of course, a terrorist who cannot be deported can perhaps be prosecuted for treason or sedition. Pamela Geller asks, "How is the British government going to 'de-radicalize' these Muslims?") [63742]

AirForceTimes.com reports, "The former top lawyer for the Army will be chief counsel for Republicans on the House committee investigating the 2012 terrorist attacks in Benghazi, Libya. Retired Lt. Gen. Dana Chipman was judge advocate general for the Army from 2009-2013. The special committee, led by [Congressman] Trey Gowdy [R-SC], is preparing for its first public hearing in September. Chipman 'is a person of great character and integrity, with outstanding legal credentials, who dedicated his professional life to the apolitical service to our country and reached the highest levels of his profession,' Gowdy said Thursday through a spokeswoman. 'If you are serious about conducting a fair, thorough, fact-centric investigation devoid of gratuitous partisanship, it stands to reason you would select someone with those same characteristics to lead the investigation,' he said." Students in Elyria, Ohio will no longer be allowed to enjoy the pink butter cookies that the city's schools cafeterias have sold for almost 40 years—because they do not meet the Obama administration's new food guidelines. At WashingtonTimes.com Judson Phillips writes, "[James] Foley was allegedly a journalist. To call him a journalist is to stretch that word beyond all meaning. Mr. Foley was an activist and a propagandist. He did not go to report the truth. He was not 'fair and balanced.' He wasn't even accurate. That did not matter. His cause was the Sunni Islamists fighting the Syrian government. He tweeted repeatedly about this, ignoring the

Muslim cleric Hussein bin Mahmoud writes, "I don't know what to say. My mind is perplexed by words I have read and heard from people whom I do not know how to describe!! AmericanOverloko.com posts Gaza news video of a mass Islamic funeral—in which more than a few of the corpses were moving under the sheet placed on top of them. [63241]

The center-left *New York Daily News* headline reads: "BAM'S GOLF WAR. Prez tees off as Foley's parents grieve." The lead editorial lambastes Obama for heading to the golf course immediately after his brief comments about the beheading of journalist James Foley. A sample: "...Obama put his own spin on the oft-quoted advice of predecessor Teddy Roosevelt: speak strongly and carry a nine iron." [63084, 63085, 63125, 63182]

Pamela Geller writes, "Obama released an embarrassing report of a failed mission to provide cover and excuse for the expected beheadings of additional journalists. There are 20 more journalists kidnapped by jihadists in addition to Steve Sokoloff. [Most are not Americans.] Obama released this [information about his] pathetic failure (giving the enemy another boost) in anticipation of additional beheadings. Mind you, Obama was informed of journalist James Foley's scheduled execution a week ago—but preferred to play golf. Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel tells reporters the failed mission to rescue James Foley and other hostages on July 4 was not a failure of intelligence: "Intelligence doesn't come wrapped in a package with a bow. ... This operation was a flawless operation, but the hostages were not there." Hagel also says ISIS is "an imminent threat to every interest we have, whether it's in Iraq or anywhere else. ... They are beyond just a terrorist group. They marry ideology, a sophistication of strategic and tactical military prowess. They are tremendously well-funded. This is beyond anything we've seen. So we must prepare for everything." Asked if the United States would strike ISIS/ISIL in Syria, Hagel responds, "We continue to explore all options regarding ISIL and how best we can assist our partners in that area—the Middle East, particularly in Iraq—against ISIL. ... So that's what we're looking at, that's what we're doing and we'll continue to stay focused as I said on-on what we're doing now, and exploring all options as we go forward. ...[W]e're looking at all options." General Martin Dempsey, chairman of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff, warns that ISIS is "an immediate threat... because of open borders and immigration issues. ... This is an organization that has an apocalyptic, end-of- days strategic vision and which will eventually have to be defeated. [Can ISIS] be defeated without addressing that part of their organization which resides in Syria? The answer is no. That will have to be addressed on both sides of what is essentially at this point a nonexistent border." The press conference by Hagel and Dempsey may be an indication that the Department of Defense has decided that if it cannot convince Obama privately that ISIS is a serious threat, it will take its case to the public. The intelligence community has been warning the White House of the ISIS threat for months and has essentially been ignored. At some

point the generals may simply tell Obama, "Stay on the golf course" and tell Valerie Jarrett, "Stay out of our way," and do what is necessary to protect the United States of America. Obama will then occasionally be handed a speech and told, "Here, go read this in front of the cameras and take credit for what we did to save the nation." If Obama continues to be afraid to make decisions, at some point others will start making them for him.

State Department spokeswoman Marie Harf continues to insists the United States is not at war with ISIS. A reporter says, "I mean, even they are announcing, ISIL people in their message, whatever, the recorded message, other messages, that now we [ISIS] are in a war with America." Harf responds, "This is not about ISIL versus the United States. I think I made that clear yesterday. They are killing anyone who gets in their way: Sunnis, Shia Muslims, Christians, Yazidis, Iraqis, Syrians, anyone who gets in their way — and now an American. So this is not about what the United States is or isn't doing," Harf continued. "This is about ISIL [having] stated a commitment to murder, rape, enslave people who don't agree with their ideology and who get in their way. And I think, you know, the more we can say that, because it's true, it's important for people to remember that as they look at the overall picture." Reporter: "...But they are announcing that it's a war against America. Right or wrong, that's what they are saying." Harf: "Well, they can say whatever they'd like, but what I am making clear is that's not what ISIL represents. And they don't represent any religion. Uh, they are at war with everybody they come into contact with. And that's why we are very focused, uh, when we, uh, outline goals, on, on, uh, attacking their targets when they threaten those goals, on helping the Iraqis gain in capability to fight this one on their own, and, and, to be very clear, uh, holding people accountable when they hurt our people. That's something we're very focused on, uh, and that's certainly what will be a guiding principle of our action going forward." (In other words, "The United States is not at war with ISIS, even though ISIS is at war with the whole civilized world, and we're going to let the Iraqis do the fighting for the whole world." Once again, the Obama administration says ISIS has nothing to do with religion—a claim which is absurd on its face, inasmuch as ISIS has declared an Islamic State. Pope Francis telephones the family of James Foley to offer his condolences. (It is assumed that after the call the Pope did not play golf.) [63098]

You have no motivation to deal with the Muslims except with the language of force, a language you were given in 'Arabic translation' when you attempted to occupy the land of Iraq! Now you return to bomb the Muslims of Iraq once again, this time resorting to Arial attacks and 'proxy armies', all the while cowardly shying away from a face-to-face confrontation! Today our swords are unsheathed towards you, GOVERNMENT AND CITIZENS ALIKE! AND WE WILL NOT STOP UNTILL WE QUENCH OUR THIRST FOR YOUR BLOOD. With the help of her boyfriend she covered up the crime. Garcia-Cisneros was nabbed by police the day after she killed the children, while her boyfriend was imprisoned for hindering prosecution. After her trial, the jury delivered guilty verdicts for two counts of felony hit-and-run and she was placed on probation. Because she was an illegal alien she was taken to an immigration detention center in Tacoma, Washington, in order to be face removal proceedings. Garcia-Cisneros this week saw her deportation case vanish thanks to an immigration judge who dismissed her case. 'The judge gave no reason for dismissing the deportation and Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) has declined to say why the case was dropped,' according to Judicial Watch." [63136]

According to *The Denver Post*, "The Colorado Division of Insurance has reported that there were about 2,100 health-plan cancellations in the state over the past two months, bringing this year's total to more than 6,150. ...Since 2013, there have been about 340,000 policy cancelations in Colorado. He has been accused in the past of fabricating his job title and of conducting autopsies without a license. Parcells, along with Dr. Michael Baden, was hired last week by the Brown family to conduct an independent private autopsy. They did so, they said, because they did not trust local authorities to conduct a thorough investigation into Brown's police shooting death. The team released its results on Monday and determined that Brown was shot at least six times. ... Mary Case, along with a number of other medical examiners and pathologists have been heavily critical of Parcells. 'He is doing forensic autopsies which may send someone to prison, and he is not a physician, much less a forensic pathologist,' she told TheDC, adding that forensic pathologists and medical examines throughout the U.S. 'are shocked by this man and how bold he is to do what he does.' 'No one stops him,' she said. Case said that Baden, 80, 'is an excellent forensic pathologist.' At a press conference Monday, Baden said the same thing about her. But Case claims that Baden was unaware of what she called Parcells' 'baggage.' 'Dr. Baden did not know about Parcells' baggage or he would not have become associated with him,' Case told TheDC. 'His association with Parcells is very unfortunate.' ... Forensic pathologist Dr. Erik Mitchell complained to a Kansas City news station earlier this week that Parcells is working without a license." On Wednesday [August 20], Iraq's Oil Ministry warned buyers of crude oil that unauthorized purchases made in the country could be used to fund terror activities by Islamic State. Buyers were urged to 'exercise caution' and were reminded that any purchases without authorization from Iraqi officials could result in sanctions for financial terror activities." Former CIA officer Bob Baer tells CNN, "I have been told with no uncertainty there are ISIS sleeper cells in this country." [63178]

Meanwhile, former CIA director General Michael Hayden tells *Newsmax*, "I would imagine that both of them [ISIS and al-Qaeda] are trying to prove their credentials as Islamic Fundamentalist Organization number one by conducting a successful attack in the West, if not in the United States. ...We try to identify people who may have gone there [to the Middle East] and are coming back to Europe or the United States, but getting ready is offense. Rather than letting them sit there and plan to threaten my survival, we need to make them start spending an awful lot of time thinking about their own survival. ...I would use air power to go after the capacity of ISIS to do harm. That means the equipment that they've stolen from the Iraqi army. It means their leadership. It means degrading them in a powerful and very meaningful way. If you can put Special Operations Forces on the ground to attempt a rescue, you can put Special Forces on the ground for other purposes, too. Not necessarily just for rescue." [63179]

On *The Kelly File*, syndicated columnist and best-selling author Charles Krauthammer comments, "It is ridiculous to go back to the pre-911 paradigm of treating acts of terror as criminal acts.. As we've made previously clear, the administration determined that it was lawful to proceed with a transfer in order to protect the life of a U.S. service member held captive and in danger for almost five years, notwithstanding that Congress did not receive the 30 days' notice." (In other words, "Bergdahl served in the U.S. Army and Foley didn't.") [63170, 63171]

Schultz defends Obama's golf outing after he made brief comments about James Foley's beheading, saying it "absolutely captured [Obama's] attention." [63216]

A convoy of Russian trucks carrying food, water, generators, and sleeping bags crosses the border into eastern Ukraine. The Pentagon condemns the move and demands that the Russians withdraw. (Based on U.N. Ambassador Samantha Power's August 8 statement, the move is "an invasion of Ukraine." In other words, Russia crossed another Obama "red line." What, if anything, Obama will do remains to be seen.) [63212, 63522, 63523]

Breitbart.com posts a photograph of a giant ISIS flag held by fans at a soccer match in Tunisia. "The provenance of the picture is unclear, although other sources on the Internet confirm that it was indeed taken at a Tunisian League football game, possibly some time last year. The image as it appeared on Twitter has been cropped slightly; other sources show a slightly extended image in which words in Arabic script can clearly be seen superimposed. *Breitbart London* understands that they read 'The Caliphate to come, God willing.'" In The Washington Post, Vice President Joe Biden writes that ISIS (ISIL) can be defeated without U.S. combat forces on the ground. "For Iraq," Biden writes, "success will require genuine compromise from all sides and a new government in Baghdad capable of responding to the needs of all of Iraq's communities. We cannot want that more than Iraqis do. Unless Iraq can do this, no amount of outside intervention will matter—nor will it continue indefinitely. ... We are also encouraging Iraq's neighbors to refrain from fueling sectarian divisions, which only plays into ISIL's hands, and instead to treat this shared challenge as an opportunity to begin a new chapter in their relations with Iraq and with each other. ... ISIL is far from invincible. Its ideology is rejected by most Iraqis. It establishes order not through consent but through fear. It has destroyed ancient religious sites, enslaved women and girls and brutally executed many of the very Sunnis it claims to speak for. ISIL has no legitimate cause or grievance to espouse. And as we saw at the Mosul dam, when its fighting strength is eroded, it can be routed by local forces without U.S. boots on the ground. This is a fight that Iraq, with help from America and the world, can and must win. We all have a stake in empowering moderates in Iraq to prevent a terrorist state from taking root in the heart of the Middle East. The threat, of course, is not confined to Iraq. Addressing it will also require continued support for our partners in Jordan, Lebanon, the Syrian opposition and others to counter ISIL and address the flow of foreign fighters to and from the battlefield." (Biden is late in wanting to "prevent a terrorist state from talking root." It has already taken root. Despite his editorial appearing in the leftist *Washington Post*, numerous readers leave negative comments on the online version. One writes, "Watch out Captain Obvious. Joe Biden is after your job. ISIL must be defeated. They are bad. Iragis must set aside their differences and unite. Can't wait for this foreign policy expert to weigh in on Palestine v Israel. All he has to do is change the names in the column above.") [63230]

The Department of Homeland Security and the FBI issue a joint statement to the nation's law enforcement agencies warning them to be on the alert for possible terrorist actions even though they are "unaware of any specific, credible threats." According to WJLA.com, "The bulletin... noted that ISIS' English-language messaging online 'has primarily been focused on calls' for Muslims to join the group in Iraq and Syria. The group and its supporters, meanwhile, 'have employed-and will almost certainly continue—Twitter 'hashtag' campaigns that have... been able to quickly reach a global audience of potential violent extremists,' the bulletin said. In the joint bulletin, DHS and FBI mentioned the propaganda video released this week showing Foley's beheading, and it cited a photo posted online showing the ISIS (ISIL) flag in front of the White House. 'ISIL members and supporters will almost certainly continue to use social media platforms to disseminate their English-language violent extremist messages,' the bulletin concluded. 'Although we remind first responders that content not explicitly calling for violence may be constitutionally protected, we encourage awareness of media advocating violent extremist acts in particular locations or naming particular targets, to increase our ability to identify and disrupt potential Homeland threats. We urge state and local authorities to promptly report suspicious activities related to homeland plotting and individuals interested in traveling to overseas conflict zones, such as Syria or Iraq, to fight with foreign terrorist organizations." At DailyCaller.com a "a ranking Department of Defense official with a background in U.S. special operations and combat experience in Iraq and Afghanistan [who] has worked in strategic planning" writes, "On Wednesday [August 20], the White House leaked a classified special forces operation to rescue American hostages in Syria. The reason: political cover. The cost: so far, unknown. But this much, we know: The politicized leak of this operation cut through the fog of war to let our enemies know exactly what happened that day in the desert, and because of that, future attempts to free American hostages will be more difficult to plan, farther between, and more dangerous to carry out. ... The leak was designed to provide political cover for President Barack Obama, who has been taking fire from the press for failing to take more decisive action against the Islamic State in either Iraq or Syria. ... China has suffered some of the worst Islamic terror attacks in recent months. Mass machete attacks, bombings in Tiananmen Square, etc. The Chinese government knows what they are up against and this crude exercise is their way of the educating their people to this grave threat... On the one hand, [Obama] is so nonplussed by the unspeakably gruesome beheading... that he merely takes a break from his golf game... and tosses off some empty rhetoric about being heartbroken and such and then returns to his basketball buds on the green. China, on the other hand, is running edits from the Foley beheading in the public square on an endless loop. Gruesome? Absolutely. Effective? Most definitely. It may be crude, but it sends a message. Obama, on the other hand, rushes to protect Islam in the wake of jihadi attacks. China is arming its people. Obama is disarming us. Is the American flag flying at the end of the video a shot at America? Most certainly. But look, we elected that evil clown twice, we have to take the punishment we so richly deserve.") [63221]

On *America's Newsroom*, Mary Katharine Ham comments on Obama's trip to the golf course after his comments on the brutal killing of James Foley: "I think you could leave a space of more than eight minutes... When his aides say, 'the game of golf did not accurately reflect his grief' it's because the game of golf is not renowned for reflecting grief. ...On the question of whether [Obama is] engaged, let me just offer from last week when he was in Martha's Vineyard, at a party, when the situation in Ferguson—there was upheaval going on, it was really starting to heat up there. His communications staff was tweeting form that party that 'a good time was had by all,' when a cursory look at the Internet would have shown them that this was not the time for that [comment]. So I'm not sure how engaged that staff is when they don't know that." [63213]

DailyCaller.com reports that according to a CBS/New York Times poll, "Only 60 percent of African Americans are pleased with ...Obama's handling of the Ferguson shooting and riots... The new poll also showed that only 61 percent of Democrats rate his performance positively. Twenty percent of African-Americans, and 16 percent of Democrats, give a negative rating to his handling of the Ferguson drama, much of which has taken place during his vacation in Martha's Vineyard." The CBS affiliate in Chicago reports, "Over the past six years, Chicago has become a top potential target for international terrorists, a top security expert said Friday, making the posting of a veiled threat by Islamic radicals on Twitter a higher cause for concern. 'Many terror organizations refer to Chicago as Obama Town,' said CBS 2 security expert Ross Rice, a former FBI agent in Chicago. ...In the meantime, the U.S. government on Friday issued a security bulletin to all U.S. law enforcement in light of the overall threat

posed by Islamic State, commonly known as ISIS or ISIL. The ominous post on Twitter, purportedly from somebody connected with Islamic State, shows a photo of the Old Republic Building, 307 N. Michigan Ave., in Chicago and the White House. The text reads:

\*#AmessagefromISIStoUSWe are in your stateWe are in your citiesWe are in your streets

You are our goals anywhere...'

The handwritten note is dated June 20. ... The Twitter message seems to imply that Islamic State operatives are in Chicago and other U.S. cities." [63218, 63219, 63256]

In an interview with Breitbart.com, retired U.S. Army Lieutenant Colonel Ralph Peters says, "[C]ertainly [Obama and his advisors and staffers] came to office with zero interest in international affairs except for a few pet projects and with the naiveté to believe that ...[Obama], through sheer charm and force of personality, could change the world. The Cairo Speech is classic evidence. The new political elite came with a very negative view of the United States, very much formed by the likes of Bill Ayers, Reverend [Jeremiah] Wright, that entire milieu. So as you heard in speech after speech from [Obama], America wasn't the solution. The United States of America was the problem, or at least part of the problem. Because if the United States is doing it one way and Europe is doing it another way, then by definition, it won't work. ...We are sitting on prisoners here in Guantanamo; it doesn't have to be financial." (In other words, Michael Foley believes it is appropriate for European nations to pay ransoms for hostages, and believes Obama should have traded one or more GITMO prisoners for his brother.) On The Five, Greg Gutfeld observes, "When someone has a problem and it's someone you care about, you should confront him. You've got to sit him down and say, this is serious. It's legal, and relaxing. But for God's sake, man, it's time to lead. Plot a course instead of walking one. Show some drive, instead of making one. After an American is beheaded, no president should be heading to the course." [63222]

On *Special Report*, Charles Krauthammer says of Obama's reaction to the rapid growth of ISIS and warnings from the Pentagon and Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel, "I don't think the issue is [that Obama] was unaware or taken by surprise. I think this was willful blindness to the nature of the threat. For the five and a half years he's been in office, he's tried to minimize the whole idea of the 'war on terror.' He abolished the term. He gave a speech six months ago saying the war on terror must end, it's damaging our country—as if he can unilaterally declare an end to a war when the other guy hasn't declared an end on his side. He has said the tide of war is receding. But he did that by defining the threat and the enemy as 'al-Qaida central,' as if the enemy is a club that lives in Pakistan or

This is a willful attempt to actually will away the war that we were looking at. Well, now with ISIS, the pretense and the will to pretend otherwise can no longer exist. He knows that the threat is there, and what's happening is he isn't on board. This is his advisers and the military trying to prepare him for a decision he has not yet made, but is going to have to make." [63177]

On August 23 Congressman Peter King (R-NY) says in a CNN Interview, "I don't see how we can defeat ISIS without going into Syria. I believe in massive airstrikes. This is not about Syria. This is not about Iraq. It's about our national security. [Obama] has the obligation, if he is serious about going after ISIS, to go into Syria." There were times he read it without interruption. After being taken hostage twice, he said his career as a reporter was obviously jinxed.' However, Foley was not deterred and continued working for the Global Post and the Agence France-Presse. He was taken hostage in 2012 while on assignment in Syria, which was under attack from ISIS at the time. During his imprisonment, Foley was convicted and felt the need to try and do his part to encourage dialogue between Christians and Muslims. 'He was exasperated by widespread Islamophobia, and he was free, he would apply to the Committee to Protect Journalists, or commit himself to the dialogue between civilizations,' Henin added." [63356, 63357]

DailyCaller.com reports, "Liberal groups including the American Civil Liberties Union and the American Immigration Council filed a lawsuit against the government Friday, arguing that the Obama administration's recently adopted expedited deportation procedures are unconstitutional. The case centers on woman and children deported from a detention facility in Artesia, N.M., an isolated center housing over 500 people detained along the southwest United States border. The center has already been accused of keeping immigrants in unsanitary conditions, and earlier this summer had to halt all deportations because of a chicken pox outbreak. 'This loss of due process is a recurring theme in Artesia,' wrote Sarah Perez, an immigration attorney who visited the facility in July. Perez said that in addition to being hours away from any attorneys, the facility made it very difficult for lawyers to speak with detainees once there, and that phone calls are limited to five minutes." The lawsuit claims, "Families detained at Artesia are almost completely cut off from communications with the outside world, provided insufficient information and in some cases no information about their rights under the INA [Immigration and Nationality Act], affirmatively precluded from effectively contacting and receiving assistance from attorneys and ultimately forced to navigate pro se [on their own] a complex immigration process that is heavily weighted against them." (Of course, none of the families would have been "cut off from communications" had they stayed at home and not entered the United States illegally. The complaint is tantamount to a house burglar complaining that the homeowners did not leave him sufficient snacks to munch on while he ransacked the premises.) [63264]

According to the Associated Press, Obama "is sending three White House officials to the funeral service of [Michael Brown] the Missouri teenager whose death in a police shooting in Ferguson, Missouri, has sparked days of racial unrest. Leading the group for Monday's service will be the chairman of the My Brother's Keeper Task Force, Broderick Johnson. On MSNBC, network contributor Michael Eric Dyson is asked by host Melissa Harris Perry if Obama should have visited Ferguson, Missouri. To justify a federal investigation, the Justice Department must have a rational basis to believe it could prove these invidious and evil purposes *beyond a reasonable doubt*. That requires compelling evidence, not a farfetched social-justice narrative. ...Based on what is known about the unblemished six-year record of Officer Darren Wilson and the facts surrounding his shooting of 18-year-old Michael Brown, there is no reason to suspect racism, much less that any thought was given to Mr. Brown's federal rights during the sudden, violent exchange. There is no way this is a civil-rights case ...unless you are a backward-thinking dolt who spots racism based on nothing more than the fact that the police officer is white and the victim is black." "...Simply stated, it is impermissible for federal investigations to be commenced in the absence of colorable suspicion based on solid evidence. Yet, despite the absence of any suggestion that Darren Wilson is a racist, we know he has been made the subject of a civil-rights investigation. ... FoxNews.com reports, "Leslie Gordon of the U.S. Geological Survey says the tremor struck just before 3:30 a.m. Sunday local time, about 10 miles northwest of American Canyon, which is about 6 miles southwest of Napa." There are at least 100 injuries but no reported deaths. (How long it will be before envirosocialists blame "global warming" is not known.) [63234, 63272] Fox News also reports, "American and British intelligence officials are eyeing a Britishborn rapper as the militant who beheaded journalist James Foley. A senior Western intelligence official told Fox News that 23-year-old London rapper Abdel Majed Abdel Bary [who NYPost.com notes 'recently tweeted a photo of himself holding up a severed head'] is the suspect believed to be Foley's executioner. U.S. intelligence officials are not commenting publicly on the reports, but a well-placed source told Fox News that Bary's Egyptian-born father was extradited from London to the United States in 2012 for his alleged connection to Usama bin Laden and the 1998 U.S. Embassy bombings in Africa. Bary traveled to Syria last year to fight with ISIS, the source said. The Sunday Times and Sunday People identified Bary as a member of a group of at least three British-born ISIS fighters known among former hostages as 'The Beatles.' ... According to The Mail on Sunday, the 'Beatles' ... boasted that they had made millions of dollars from ransoms paid by European countries, enough to 'retire to Kuwait or Qatar,' as one [former] hostage told the paper. The U.S. and Britain have a policy of not paying ransom to terrorist groups in exchange for captured citizens. However, other Western countries have no such policy. The New York Times reported last month that Al Qaeda and its direct affiliates have received at least \$125 million in ransom money since 2008, paid by European countries like France, Spain, Germany, Italy, Austria, and Switzerland." According to NYPost.com, Bary-known as "L Jinny"-"appeared in music videos posted on YouTube for songs titled 'Overdose,' 'Flying High' and 'Dreamer.' But he was reportedly radicalized by followers of firebrand-Islamic preacher Anjem Choudary and walked out of his family's plush home in the Maida Vale district of London last year, saying he was 'leaving everything for the sake of Allah.'" (Despite having left everything "for the sake of Allah," State Department spokeswoman Marie Harf has insisted, "ISIL does not operate in the name of any religion." On Martha's Vineyard, Secret Service agents block Vocativ.com journalists from photographing Michelle Obama as she "power walks" with several friends. [63402, 63484]

*The Sunday Times* reports that Obama waited nearly 30 days to decide whether to authorize a mission to rescue journalist James Foley. "Pentagon sources said Foley and the others might well have been rescued but Obama, concerned about the ramifications of US troops being killed or captured in Syria, took too long to authorise the mission. ...Anthony Shaffer, a former lieutenant-colonel in US military intelligence who worked on covert operations, said: 'I'm told it was almost a 30-day delay from when they said they wanted to go to when he finally gave the green light. They were ready to go in June to grab the guy [Foley] and they weren't permitted.'" Breitbart.com writes, "However, it also seems worth noting that the eventual timing of the mission may have made for a nice July 4th weekend announcement for Obama had the mission succeeded. Instead, Obama played golf on July 5th, as well as an additional six times in the month he is said to have spent agonizing over his decision, the delay of which may have cost journalist Foley his life." Another Defense Department source comments, "The White House constantly goes back and forth on these things. These people are a bunch of academics who endlessly

We should go to DEFCON 1, which is our highest state of [military] readiness, and be prepared as we lead up to 9/11. ... America should take notice. We are less safe today than we were six years ago." According to McInerney, "On the seventh of September" a book will be released that will be "earth-shattering" with its description of "what's happening and what happened." (McInerney provides no details, but his statement suggests the book will be about the missing Malaysian Airlines plane and terrorism. One book, Goodnight Malaysian 370: The Truth Behind the Loss of Flight 370, was released on August 10. That book claims the pilot intentionally starved the passengers of oxygen and then ditched the plane in the Indian Ocean. Another book, Flight MH370: The Mystery, claims the plane was shot down during a joint U.S.-Thai military exercise.) At RedState.com Aaron Gardner writes, "Well, this has never happened. We should, in my view, look at ISIL as a direct threat to the United States, a threat to the region that cannot be accommodated. The strategy has to meet the threat." Former CIA head Michael Hayden tells CNN, "This [the threat of an ISIS attack] is a question of timing, not inevitability, not of intent. And right now I think it's fair to say that ISIS is a very powerful *local* terrorist organization and probably a reasonably powerful *regional* terrorist organization, but it's one that has global ambitions. And it has the tools... American passport holders, European passport holders. It's expressed the intent [to attack the United States], and so, if it's is not Tuesday [for example], it's at a

time and place of their choosing. And it will come probably sooner rather than later." [63502, 63503]

On *Meet the Press*, Al Sharpton is asked about his status as a White House surrogate on race relations issues. He responds, "First of all, I'm not a surrogate. I have access to the White House in every era going back to Lincoln with Frederick Douglass. Presidents talk to those that [sic; who] were leading at that time." (Inasmuch as Sharpton was born in 1954, it is difficult to comprehend how he had access to the White House in the 1860s.) On ABC's *This Week*, host George Stephanopoulos asks *Weekly Standard* editor Bill Kristol, "It struck me how quickly this has all moved. From ISIS being a minor threat, [Obama] talking about it several months ago as the 'junior varsity,' to now 'an imminent threat,' the words of [Secretary of Defense] Chuck Hagel, to the United States. And I guess I wonder, is there a danger here of overreacting?" Kristol responds, "The fundamental danger remains under-reaction. ...I would like a little overreaction by [Obama] now. The comments of General [Martin] Dempsey saying, essentially the same thing. Something big and bad is happening here. It's part of the reason [Obama] was so criticized for not

saying what, in fact, I think Hagel and Dempsey said. Do you know what I mean? *They* were making presidential-type statements." [63306]

Congressman Michael McCaul (R-TX), tells Stephanopoulos, "I do think they [ISIS terrorists] present the greatest threat we've seen since 9/11. This has been festering for the last year, and now it's culminating with the killing and the beheading of an American journalist....The American people-it has sort of opened their eyes to what ISIS really is, the true character of ISIS, how savage they really are and ... their intent to harm Americans. ... Their focus right now is establishing the caliphate. But don't kid yourself for a second, they are intent on hitting the west. And there are external operations, I believe, under way. We have tens of thousands of foreign fighters from all over the world pouring into this safe haven that's now been established, including hundreds of Americans with Western passports and legal travel documents, which would enable them not only to travel to Western Europe, but to the United States. ... I believe that America, the United States, shouldn't bear this burden alone. We have regional allies, both Muslim allies and European allies, that can bring a lot of pressure on ISIS. And I don't think you're going to... win this with a containment policy alone. This administration thus far has only dealt with containment. We need to expand these air strikes so that we can ultimately defeat and eliminate ISIS, because I would far prefer to eliminate them over there than have to deal with them in the United States." Retired General John Allen adds, "It's going to take more than what we're doing right now, George. There's just no question of this. We need to give the American public more clarity in terms of our commitment solely using the terms boots on the ground. I think we've been very clear that we don't want to put American maneuver forces necessarily, conventional maneuver forces back on the ground, but we have really significant capabilities to provide special operators into these formations, both at the tribal level, some of the more recently emerging Sunni conventional forces that are appearing in northwest Iraq, the Free Syrian Army, and Sunni tribes in Syria." On *Fox News Sunday*, veteran *Washington Post* journalist Bob Woodward says, "I think you've got to look at what's the threat. About one thousand Iraqi-American Christians rally in downtown Detroit. According to *Detroit Free Press*, "The rally was one of several that have been held in recent weeks by metro Detroit's sizable Iraqi-American Christian population, one of the biggest in the U.S. Protests have been held in Southfield, Sterling Heights, Birmingham and Troy to call attention to the growing violent attacks on Iraqi Christians and other minorities such as Yazidis. The sudden development with show of arms in the main roads, and the fighters even began to stop government convoys amid a barrage of bullets and shouts of Allahu Akbar, which raised the ire of observers to the absence of the state and security agencies to prosecute, monitor and follow up on these moves for the supporters of ISIS. The three videos were traded through social networking sites and YouTube, which show Jordanians carrying machine guns, one of which was in front of a police car and a security patrol which did not move to stop them while ISIS supporters showered the sky with shots to celebrate the departure of an ISIS supporter... from prison." After seizing control of the airport in Tripoli, Libya, radical Islamists proclaim their own government. According to GulfNews.com, "Fajr Libya (Operation Dawn), a coalition of Islamist and Misrata forces, captured the airport on Saturday in fierce fighting against pro-government militias after a five-week siege that has battered parts of the capital. Television images from the scene showed jubilant bearded militias dancing on wrecked airliners, firing machine guns in the air and chanting 'Allah O Akbar' ('God is great'). On Sunday, they set the airport buildings ablaze, apparently intending to destroy rather than hold it. The victory, which secures Islamist control over Tripoli, was a culmination of weeks of fighting triggered by elections in July which Islamist parties lost. Rather than accept the result, Islamist leaders accused the new parliament of being dominated by supporters of former dictator Muammar Gaddafi, and have sought to restore the old national congress." (Pamela Geller asks, "Isn't it astonishing how the media never queries Obama on his devastating failures in Libya and North Africa?" The civil war in Libya is a direct result of Obama's efforts to help rebels oust Gaddafi. It could also set off an arms race on both sides. ...The strikes have also, so far, proved counterproductive. Islamist-aligned militias fighting for control of Tripoli successfully seized its main airport just hours after they were hit with the second round of strikes." WND.com reports, "Abdul Maulana Aziz, a follower of Taliban supreme leader Mullah Mohammad Omar who led the infamous Red Mosque rebellion in Pakistan, has declared his support for the newly formed Islamic State, led by Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi. ...Aziz's backing of Baghdadi is seen as ominous by Western intelligence, since he is close to such groups as Sipa-e-Sahaba and the Tehnik-i-Taliban Pakistan, or TTP, which seek the overthrow—even by violent means—of the Pakistani government, which possesses nuclear weapons. Aziz has vowed that Islam will 'spread all over Pakistan, then all over the world." [63281] WashingtonTimes.com reports, "Since Illinois started granting concealed carry permits this year, the number of robberies that have led to arrests in Chicago has declined 20 percent from last year, according to police department statistics. Reports of burglary and motor vehicle theft are down 20 percent and 26 percent, respectively. In the first quarter, the city's homicide rate was at a 56-year low. ...As of July 29 the state had 83,183 applications for concealed carry and had issued 68,549 licenses. ...Illinois became the 50th state in the nation to issue concealed weapons permits. An individual permit costs about \$600 and requires at least 16 hours of classes." Richard Pearson, executive director of the Illinois State Rifle Association, observes, "It isn't any coincidence crime rates started to go down when concealed carry was permitted. Just the idea that the criminals don't know who's armed and who isn't has a deterrence effect. 'We don't expect our tax rate to change materially,' Burger King Chief Executive Daniel Schwartz said in a conference call today. 'This transaction is not really about taxes. It's about growth.' It's easier to understand Burger King's motivation if you know something about 3G [3G Capital Management], the Brazilian private equity firm that bought Burger King in 2010 and owns 70 percent of its shares. The people at 3G are bankers; they acquire companies and grow them through acquisitions. ... This deal makes sense for several reasons. Burger King doesn't have much of a breakfast business. Tim Hortons is a coffee-and-doughnuts joint; even if Schwartz maintains the chains as two separate brands, as he says he intends to, breakfast dollars accrue to Burger King. Schwartz can probably also convince the company's deep-pocketed overseas franchisees to add Tim Hortons to their mix of restaurant offerings, although it remains to be seen whether a Canadian coffee chain will have the same appeal as the company's flagship. Best of all, there are undoubtedly cost-cutting opportunities at Tim Hortons. Bloomberg News reports that Tim Hortons' profit margin was 25 percent last year, compared with 50 percent at Dunkin' Brands." (Not surprisingly, politicians like Brown and Van Hollen are distorting the reality of the issue in order to score points with uninformed voters. On August 25 Deutsche Welle reports, "Islamic State fighters have captured a major military air base in northeastern Syria. The airfield—home to several warplane [MIG-21B] squadrons, helicopters, tanks, artillery, and ammunition bunkers—is located some 45 kilometers (25 miles) from the extremists' stronghold in the city of Raqqa along the Euphrates River." (There were reportedly 1,600 Syrian troops at the base, yet they were still defeated.) Whether ISIS has anyone capable of flying the captured aircraft is not known, but later reports claim ISIS is forcing captured Syrian pilots to teach its jihadists how to fly. The Obama administration criticizes the airstrikes in Libya by Egypt and the United Arab Emirates, with State Department spokeswoman Jennifer Psaki telling reporters, "We believe outside interference in Libya exacerbates current divisions and undermines Libya's democratic transition." HotAir.com's Ed Morrissey later comments, "How did this possibility of a proxy war arise in the first place? The Obama administration led a

(Pamela Geller writes, "Lebanon bears watching. Hezb'Allah [had] better be careful—they are in the Islamic State's sights as well (Hezb'Allah is Shia and the Islamic State is Sunni). White House press secretary Josh Earnest tries to provide cover for the "jayvee team" comment made by Obama, telling reporters, "It's important to understand the context. The report concluded that the video has to be a fake as there was no incision made on Foley's neck." Second, the video itself is edited: "The video fades to black the moment the beheading starts and ends with the bloody image of the decapitated head lying over the body." Additionally, no one speaks in Arabic or chants "Allahu Akbar." "The video is too polished for an Islamic State. Most beheading and other videos made by militants, which circulate online, are generally amateurish with poor video and audio quality. The Foley execution video was shot on an HD camera, and with more than one camera. Also, the audio is extremely clean and the video was edited by a professional." "A conspiracy theory suggests that the entire execution was shot using a green screen. Though the masked militant dressed in black is seen standing in a desertlike land, neither his dress nor his shoes look dusty. There is no sign of even wind

activity, which is highly unlikely for a desert terrain." "Another conspiracy suggests that Foley's parents are crisis actors. The theory notes that it is highly abnormal for parents, who just witnessed the beheading of their son on video, to appear before the media in less than 24-hours, 'full of smiles and nice sunny memories." Even the *Times of London* writes, "The video of a British jihadist beheading an American hostage was probably staged, with the actual murder taking place off-camera, according to forensic analysis." *Timeline* readers can certainly be excused if they are confused. To some, Foley was a dedicated journalist telling "truth to power." To others, he was anti-American and sympathetic to the cause of the jihadists. To still others he is part of a sinister plot to gin up support in Great Britain and the United States for committing money and lives toward a military action to defeat ISIS. If, however, ISIS has been brutally butchering thousands of innocent people across Syria and Iraq, it would seem the proper thing to do would be to stop them-regardless of whether James Foley was beheaded. 'We would oppose sex change operations all together,' said Peter Sprigg, senior fellow at the Family Research Council in Washington, D.C. With NBC's *Meet the Press* failing in the ratings and program moderator David Gregory being replaced by Chuck Todd, NBC President Deborah Turness tells *The New York Times*, "The show needs more edge. It needs to be consequential. I think the show had become a talking shop that raked over the cold embers of what had gone on the previous week. The one-on-one conversation belongs to a decade ago. We need more of a coffeehouse conversation." At WashingtonMonthly.com Ed Kilgore writes, "If Turness is serious about this, we need to organize a grassroots campaign to ask that certain journalists be permanently banned from the panel of *Meet the Press*, or we'll boycott the damn thing ab initio. I'd start with Peggy Noonan, Bill Kristol, David Gergen, David Brooks and George Will. Even at their best, they've all gotten more airtime than their shaky talents merit. But I'm sure you have dozens more who deserve the *Meet* Ban. Fire away in the comment thread." (*Meet the Press* has lost viewers primarily because David Gregory is a leftist who continually defends Obama... and Kilgore's "solution" to disastrous ratings is to ban anyone who might criticize Obama.) FreeBeacon.com reports, "The federal government is spending nearly \$1 million to create an online database that will track 'misinformation' and hate speech on Twitter. DeFoggi even suggested meeting one member in person to fulfill their mutual fantasies to violently rape and murder children." [63369, 63426]

At BloombergView.com Megan McArdle describes some of the realities about the Burger King acquisition of Tim Hortons: "The U.S., unlike most developed-world governments, insists on taxing the global income of its citizens and corporations that have U.S. headquarters. And because the U.S. has some of the highest tax rates in the world, especially on corporate income, this amounts to demanding that everyone who got their start here owes us taxes, forever, on anything they earn abroad. This is a great deal for the U.S. government, which gets to collect income tax even though it's not providing the companies sewers or roads or courts or no-knock raids on their abodes. On the other hand, it's not a very good deal for said citizens and corporations... As my colleague Matt [Levine] points out, most Americans—including a lot of journalists who write about this—seem to be under the misimpression that companies that invert, or people who renounce their citizenship, are doing so to get a lower tax rate on income they earn here. ...In most cases, however, including Burger King, they're doing it because the U.S. inexplicably insists on taking a big chunk off the top of all their foreign income, and making their lives miserable in the process. If we're worried about inversion, then the U.S. government should follow the lead of other developed countries, and move to territorial taxation. Otherwise, we should stop complaining when people and corporations decide that they'd rather be a citizen of some more sane system somewhere else." [63628]

Matt Levine explains, "The purpose of an inversion has never been, and never could be, and never will be, 'ooh, Canada has a 15 percent tax rate, and the U.S. has a 35 percent tax rate, so we can save 20 points of taxes on all our income by moving.' Instead the main purpose is always: 'If we're incorporated in the U.S., we'll pay 35 percent taxes on our income in the U.S. and Canada and Mexico and Ireland and Bermuda and the Cayman Islands, but if we're incorporated in Canada, we'll pay 35 percent on our income in the U.S. but 15 percent in Canada and 30 percent in Mexico and 12.5 percent in Ireland and zero percent in Bermuda and zero percent in the Cayman Islands." That is, companies based in the United States are double-taxed for income earned in another country. They must pay the corporate tax of the country where the income is earned, *plus* the 35 percent corporate rate in the United States. But companies based in other countries generally pay only the U.S. corporate tax for income earned in America, and no tax in the country of the corporate headquarters. [63628, 63629]

If a company based in the United States makes widgets in both New York and in Ireland, the U.S. government absurdly demands taxes on *all* widget income-*even* the income earned in Ireland that has *already* been taxed by the Irish government. But if a company based in Ireland makes widgets in both New York and in Ireland, it reasonably is required to pay U.S. taxes only for its U.S income, and pay Irish taxes only for its Irish income. Burger King's acquisition of Canadian coffee-and-donut chain Tim Hortons would mean, if the corporation were U.S.-based, that Burger King would have to pay U.S. taxes on coffee and donut income earned solely in Canada. That is absurd. By forming a Canadian corporation, Burger King will continue to pay U.S. taxes on U.S. hamburger sales, and Canadian taxes on its Canadian sales of coffee and donuts. Burger King is not trying to avoid paying U.S. taxes. It is trying to avoid double-taxation. It is trying to keep the IRS from double-dipping (pun intended). The U.S.-based corporation does not have to pay U.S. taxes on the foreign-earned income until it transfers that income to the corporate coffers in the United States. Not surprisingly, therefore, many U.S. corporations are sitting on that money in their foreign accounts—where it will likely remain unless Congress and Obama have the sense to lower the corporate tax rate. That money-about \$2 trillion—would then come to the United States and be taxed, and the enormous sum left would be used to create American jobs (or to fund more government waste). [63628, 63629]

Obama will act against ISIS, but only if he is pressured by Congress and U.S. citizens, and he will act only to degrade or slow down ISIS—he will not act to destroy it. [63692]

Both IHH and Qatar are close to Hamas, and Yildirim reportedly also has ties to al-Qaeda. ...Qatar has faced harsh criticism from Israel in recent weeks over its funding for terror group Hamas which has been engaged in an ongoing battle with the Jewish state." At RealClearPolitics.com *The Washington Post's* Michael Gerson, a former speechwriter for George W. Bush, writes, "The problem for …Obama has come in managing the symbolic aspect of his office. Senator Rand Paul (R-KY) tells Breitbart.com, "I would say the objective evidence shows that Libya is a less safe place and less secure place, a more chaotic place with more jihadist groups—and really, we've had two really bad things happen because of Hillary's push for this war. One is that our ambassador was killed as a consequence of not having adequate security and really as a consequence of having a really unstable situation there because of the Libyan war, and then most recently our embassy having to flee by land because they couldn't leave via the airport because of such a disaster in Libya. So I think it's hard to argue that the Libyan war was a success in any way. From my perspective, the first mistake they made was not asking the American people and Congress for authority to go to war. ... So we are very lucky that the American people are much wiser than Hillary Clinton, and much wiser than [Obama]. We got [Obama] and Hillary Clinton to slow down, but Hillary Clinton was widely reported to be the chief person proposing that we get involved in Syria. But really the only person directly involved in bombing ISIS's bases right now is the Syrian government—so for all their wrongs, we're actually quite lucky we didn't have regime change, because I think it is a very realistic prediction that, had we had that happen, that ISIS would be in charge of Syria. These revelations increase the likelihood that Judge Sullivan would grant a motion requesting limited discovery, which Judicial Watch is permitted to file after September 10." Not only has Central Ohio been the home of the largest known al-Qaeda cell since 9/11-with several members currently in prison on terrorism charges and at least two deportedwe've had a number of cases of homegrown jihadists come through town, including al-Shabaab rapper Omar al-Hammami and Little Rock Army recruiting station killer Carlos Bledsoe. An al-Shabaab recruiter and fundraiser from the area was killed in a firefight in Mogadishu in 2010, and we know of several cases of young men who have left from Columbus to join the Somali terrorist group. One of the original online jihadist forum operators, Sarfaraz Jamal, grew up in the area and initially ran his operation from his Worthington home. ... [W]e just had a pro-Hamas rally at the statehouse a week and a half ago, a regular feature here in central Ohio whenever there is conflict in that part of the world. In fact, two of our local Hamas activists are currently in prison in Egypt. Now that the threat is targeting area school children, hopefully it will begin to wake people up to the scope of the problem." (The Obama Timeline believes the call was made so that the caller and his friends could observe the school's reaction-in the event they want to carry out an attack. Of course, the call could have been made by a student who simply wanted school to be canceled.) [63496, 63497]

*The Telegraph* reports, "British jihadists fighting abroad should be stripped of their citizenship and banned from returning home, the country's most senior police officer has said. Sir Bernard Hogan-Howe, the Metropolitan Police Commissioner, also vowed tougher action against preachers of hate and other extremists who take to the streets to air their air their rants. The senior officer became the latest senior figure to call for a change in the law to combat the threat of home grown Islamist fanatics. He also backed [London Mayor] Boris Johnson's demands for those returning from Syria or Iraq to be presumed as terrorists unless they can prove their innocence. And he called for a return of the control orders regime so suspects can be ordered where to live and placed under tougher curfew regimes." [63500, 63501]

The Congressional Budget Office forecasts 2014 GDP growth of only 1.5 percent. (The Obama administration has predicted 2.6 percent economic growth for the year.) [63476, 63477, 63521]

White House press secretary Josh Earnest, proudly illustrating that he has learned to repeat the words "broken immigration system," tells reporters, "We would hope that Republicans wouldn't do the same thing again, to shut down the government, over a common sense, bipartisan, uh, effort, to try to mitigate, uh, at least some of the worst problems that are caused by our broken immigration system. ...[Obama] is determined to take the kinds of common sense steps that are required, uh, to address, uh, the worst problems of our, of our broken immigration system. Nothing [Obama] does is a replacement for the kind of robust solution that passed with bipartisan support through the United States Senate, uh, but [Obama] is determined to act, uh, where House Republicans won't, and there is strong support for that all across the country, from the business community, the labor community, law enforcement, uh, even members of the, senior members of the faith community... [who] are supportive of trying to put in place policies that will address some of the, uh, worst inequities of our broken immigration system. So, uh, again, it would be a real shame, uh, if Republicans were to engage in an effort to, uh, shut down the government over a common sense solution like that..." (No Republicans are threatening to "shut down the government" if Obama signs an illegal and unconstitutional executive order granting some form of amnesty for illegal immigrants. The shutdown message is clearly a desperate effort to link to amnesty something most Americans object to in order to gin up support for Obama's action-whatever action that may be.) Brad Dayspring, a spokesman for the National Republican Senatorial Committee, responds, "Subverting the rule of law and the legislative process to declare millions of people [legal when they are illegal] would be an extremely unpopular action, and would be the equivalent of a nuclear bomb in some of the [2014 Senate] races. It defies all political logic that [Obama] seems to think [amnesty] would be something that the American people would accept. There is no data that suggests that. ... Executive amnesty would not only subvert the law, but depress wages, and hurt the poorest Americans most of all-including legal immigrants looking to rise into the middle class." Congressman Steve King (R-IA) states, "If [Obama] wields his pen and commits that unconstitutional act to legalize millions, I think that becomes something that is nearly political nuclear [war]. I think the public would be mobilized and galvanized and that changes the dynamic of any continuing resolution [for the 2015 budget] and how we might deal with that." (King is not threatening a government shutdown. He is merely suggesting that there may be some significant budget slashing of some programs if Obama defies Congress.") Senator Marco Rubio (R-FL) states, "I assume there will be some sort of a vote on this... I'm interested to see what kinds of ideas my colleagues have about using funding mechanisms to address this issue." (That is, if Obama issues an illegal executive order, Congress can simply not appropriate funds for Obama to implement his scheme. But that is not a government shutdown threat. It is merely blocking Obama from doing something the American people do not support. In any event, whatever Obama does will likely be challenged in court.) Although Obama has promised amnesty supporters he would act before the end of summer, it looks increasingly as though he will not do so—depending on whether one defines the arrival of Labor Day as the "end of summer." Democrat Senators facing tough reelection battles—and even some in arguably "safer" seats—have no doubt pleaded with the White House not to cost them votes with an amnesty action. (If the Democrats retain control of the Senate, Obama can take action without fear of his actions being overturned. If the Democrats lose control of the Senate, Obama can still sign an illegal executive order and defy Congress to stop him. Any legislation passed for that purpose could then be vetoed by Obama. CNSNews.com spots a blog on the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) that "has found an upside to all those 'healthy' school lunches that students refuse to eat: It says schools can use the plate waste as a 'learning opportunity' to turn young students into 'civic-minded, community-conscious adults.' ... [A]n elementary school in Northern Virginia is now donating untouched food to a local food pantry. 'The school's Eco Team, run by sixth graders, ensures their fellow students are putting waste into the correct bin,' the blog says. 'The team then collects, weighs, categorizes, and places the food to be donated into separate refrigerators, provided by the Food Bus, a non-profit organization that works with schools to donate food that would otherwise go to waste. At the end of the week, PTA members or community volunteers deliver the food to the local food pantry.' ... USDA says the 12 schools that worked with the Virginia-based Food Bus in the last school year provided 13,502 pounds of food to local pantries. The donations included packaged peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, bananas and apples, yogurt, string cheese, containers of apple sauce and sliced peaches, granola bars, and cartons of milk. According to USDA, 'Food waste and recovery is also incorporated into science lesson plans.' And Food Bus founder Kathleen Weil was quoted as saying that children 'are not only learning how to not throw away their food and add it to the national waste stream, but they're learning that it can be used by someone who is hungry. They are getting a little spark of community service now that may have an impact in their life and the lives of the many people around them when they are adults." (Some might argue that there may be some serious health code violations taking place in Virginia schools.) [63455]

With the Obama administration absurdly demanding that schools not verify ages of illegal immigrant children enrolling in classes, some schools are seeing adults trying to enroll. CNSNews.com reports, "The mayor of Lynn, Mass. says that some of the illegal aliens from Guatemala who are enrolled in her city's public schools are adults with graying hair and 'more wrinkles than I have.' 'They are not all children," Judith

Flanagan Kennedy told reporters at a press conference at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., on Wednesday. ...She added that the federal government will not allow school officials to verify their ages, even though one of the students turned out to be 35 years old. ...'We were told through a directive from the Department of Justice (DOJ) that we were not to question or verify—attempt to verify these ages,' Kennedy stated at the press conference, hosted by the Center for Immigration Studies (CIS)." The Associated Press writes, "The White House is crafting a blame-it-on-Congress legal justification to back up ...Obama's impending executive actions on immigration. Facing an expected onslaught of opposition, the administration plans to argue that Congress failed to provide enough resources to fully enforce U.S. laws, thereby ceding wide latitude to White House to prioritize deportations of the 11.5 million people who are in the country illegally, administration officials and legal experts said. But Republicans, too, are exploring their legal options for stopping Obama from what they've deemed egregious presidential overreaching. A self-imposed, end-of-summer deadline to act on immigration is rapidly approaching. While Obama has yet to receive the formal recommendations he's requested from Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson, administration officials said [Obama] is intimately familiar with the universe of options and won't spend much time deliberating once Johnson delivers his recommendations." In a discussion of media bias on Fox News, Brent Bozell, founder and president of the Media Research Center, notes as an example MSNBC's Chris Matthews statement that former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich has "got that crazy Mephistophelian grin of his. He looks like he likes torturing." Bozell adds, "How long do you think Sean Hannity's show would last if four times in one sentence, he made a comment about, say, [Obama], and said that he looked like a skinny, ghetto crack head? Which, by the way, you might want to say that Barack Obama does." [63486]

On *Hannity*, attorney, author, and talk show host Mark Levin tells Sean Hannity, "[T]hese cockroaches [in ISIS] organized, funded themselves, built a forceful military, started conquering geographic areas all around the world, under his [Obama's] nose. He ignored it, he did nothing about it, he didn't talk to the American people about it—as a matter of fact, he downplayed it. This is one of the worst military national security screwups in modern American history, and he's still screwing up. Has he rallied the American people? Has he spoken to Congress? Has he asked for a declaration of war or at least a joint resolution to fund an aggressive offensive against these cockroaches? No he hasn't. We're dealing with a very peculiar, petulant man, who operates with [only] a few advisors around him, a man who really needs as much counseling and expertise as he can get given his very thin résumé and experience record, and this is what's going on." On the issue of Obama's attempt to commit the United States to a "climate treaty" without the approval of the Senate, Levin says, "If [Obama] thinks that by changing the word treaty to accord, or treaty to deal, that he can violate Article II, Section 2, Clause 2 of the United States Constitution, which involves the essential rights of the Union [of States]... this treaty process involves essential rights of the Union, then this is number twelve

hundred example of a lawless, imperial president. ... There has never been a debate, ever, that the Senate has the right under our Constitution... to ratify treaties." [63513]

"I don't know how *these* Republicans should deal with this [problem of Obama's lawlessness]. I've been arguing for a long time that the leadership is impotent and that we need more conservatives with courage to stand up to [Obama]... He's eviscerating what's left of the Constitution. And let me be very clear about this: he is attacking American sovereignty with this U.N. [global warming] deal that they're talking about, with the open borders and the executive fiat that he's talking about—these are all efforts to destroy American sovereignty by Barack Obama." [63513]

Hannity notes Congress' "power of the purse," to which Levin responds, "It's a power if they use it. If they don't use it it's just words on a piece of parchment. And the fact of the matter is, within weeks of becoming Speaker of the House, John Boehner surrendered it. When he came to that continuing resolution, he said he's not going to shut down the government—great, don't shut it down, but do you have to announce it to your adversary on the other side of Pennsylvania Avenue? The government's been shut down 20 times. I don't see where it's done enormous damage. But, that said, you've had Paul Ryan coming on saying it's a disaster, a disaster. So what they've done is, they have surrendered their powers. Okay, impeachment we can't talk about. The power of the purse they're not going to exercise. What the Hell's left? I mean, if they're not going to act like Congress, then Congress is going to be destroyed. And let me be clear, Mr. Boehner, and Mr. McConnell, and the Republicans: He [Obama] is destroying Congress. And the Senate has been eviscerated. And none of you guys have the guts to stand up and tell the American people over and over again who he is and what he's doing." [63513]

On August 28 the BBC reports, "Pro-Russian separatists have entered the port town of Novoazovsk in eastern Ukraine, an area which could be strategically vital. The town sits on the Sea of Azov, along the coastal road which runs from the Russia-Ukraine border to Crimea, through Ukrainian territory." [63470]

Ukraine President Petro Poroshenko claims Russian forces have moved across the country's eastern border. According to NBC, "East Ukraine rebel leader Alexander Zakharchenko said Russians were fighting alongside separatist forces in the restive east of the country." According to the *Daily Mail*, "A top NATO official said Thursday that at

least 1,000 Russian troops had entered Ukraine and had made direct 'contact' with Ukrainian soldiers." [63472, 63473, 63488, 63516]

CNN reports, "A top Ukrainian army officer said a 'full-scale invasion' of his country was under way Thursday, as a U.S. official said up to 1,000 Russian troops had crossed Ukraine's southern border to fight alongside pro-Russian rebels. U.S. officials said Russian troops were directly involved in the latest fighting, despite Moscow's denials. 'This is a full-scale invasion,' Lysenko said, referring to the fighting in the south. Intelligence now indicates that up to 1,000 Russian troops have moved into southern Ukraine with heavy weapons and are fighting there, a U.S. official told CNN..." [63474]

FoxNews.com reports, "Ukrainian border guards retreated Thursday as two columns of Russian tanks streamed into the nation, prompting fears that Russia is creating a land link between its territory and Crimea. Ukrainian security council spokesman Col. Andriy Lysenko says Ukrainian forces were fired at using Grad missile systems from Russian territory at about 11 a.m. Lysenko said about an hour and a half later, two columns including tanks and other fighting vehicles—began an attack on a border post. They later entered Ukraine from Veselo-Voznesenka and Maximovo of the Rostov region in Russia. Ukrainian border guards retreated because they didn't have heavy equipment." [63510]

The Obama administration will likely do its best to not call the invasion and invasion, probably using terms like "illegal incursion." The United Nations will be useless, because Russia has veto power on the Security Council. NATO forces will not act because Ukraine is not a member of the organization. Russian President Vladimir Putin knows that the Obama administration will do little to stop his actions—which is why he was willing to authorize them. (On August Obama's ambassador to the United Nations, Samantha Power, stated that even humanitarian aid brought into Ukraine by Russia "would be viewed as an invasion of Ukraine.") [63522, 63523]

In remarks to the White House press corps, Obama admits, "We don't have a strategy yet" for dealing with ISIS in Syria. "We need to make sure that we've got clear plans. Clearly ISIL has come to represent the very worst elements in the region that we have to deal with effectively." (Pamela Geller writes, "Now that they have succeeded in conquering whole swaths of the Middle East, he is telling these Islamic savages he has no strategy. In other words, Muhammad, have your way with the world. Why doesn't Obama give them the coordinates to our most sensitive military and intel sites while he's at it. Obama says, "I think what I've seen in some of the news reports suggests that folks are getting a little further ahead of where we're at than we currently are. ... The options that I'm asking for from the Joint Chiefs [of Staff] focuses [sic; focus] primarily on making sure that ISIL is not overrunning Iraq. ... As commander in chief, I will always do what is necessary to protect the American people. Our military action in Iraq has to be part of a broader comprehensive strategy to protect our people and to support our partners who are taking the fight to ISIL....It also means that states in the region stop being ambivalent about these extremist groups. This should be a wake-up call to Sunni, to Shia, to everybody that a group like ISIS is beyond the pale; that they have no vision or ideology beyond violence and chaos and the slaughter of innocent people. ... The idea that the United States or any outside power would perpetually defeat ISIS, uh, I think is unrealistic. Uh, as I've said before, I think said it in the previous press conference, our military is the best in the world. We, we can rout ISIS on the ground and keep a lid on things temporarily, but then as soon as we leave, the same problems come back again. So we've gotta [sic; got to] ... We've gotta [sic] make sure that Iraqis understand, in the end they're gonna be responsible for their own security." [63488, 63532, 63537, 63546, 63584, 63614, 63620, 63621]

On the one hand, Obama says he "primarily" wants to prevent ISIS from "overrunning Iraq." That is, he does not seek to *eradicate* ISIS, he believes he can only *temporarily* contain them. Yet on the other hand, he says "they have no vision or ideology beyond violence and chaos and the slaughter of innocent people." Why then should they merely be contained and not eliminated? From Obama's perspective, continuing "violence and chaos and the slaughter of innocent people" are apparently acceptable as long as those atrocities are limited to a few million non-Sunni Muslim victims outside the United States. Obama says "our military is the best in the world," yet he believes it can do nothing more than "rout ISIS on the ground and keep a lid on things temporarily." Rush Limbaugh later comments, "Even if you think this, even if you're just... so corrupted that you even think this, why in the world go out and say it? In a worldwide press conference! Why go out and telegraph that we don't even expect to be able to stop you? I don't know. I just wonder about all these people who told us six years ago, 'We've never seen anything like this before! Of course, the U.S. military is certainly capable of defeating ISIS. Obama's statement, "but then as soon as we leave, the same problems come back again," is defeatism. What Obama *should* be saying is, "ISIS is evil—as are all radical Islamists whose goal is to kill anyone who does not submit to their ideology—but ISIS can be defeated. Yes, even if we kill every ISIS fighter, some other radical jihadist group may take its place. If necessary, we will annihilate them as well. We will do whatever it takes to protect the United States, Western civilization, and humanity." It is shameful that Obama could not say that and instead chose to shrug his shoulders and imply, "Well, that's life. If radical jihadists take over one-third of the world, so be it." Every American should be ashamed of his statements. If Obama's words reflect ignorance and naiveté, every American should be outraged. Carefully avoiding the word "invasion," Obama then tells reporters that "Russia is responsible for the violence in eastern Ukraine. ... Russia has deliberately and repeatedly violated the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Ukraine, and the new images of Russian forces inside Ukraine make that plain for the world to see. [The assailant did not break the victim's nose, he "violated the territorial integrity of his face."]...This is not a home-grown, indigenous uprising in Eastern Ukraine. The separatists are backed, trained, armed, financed by Russia. Throughout this process we've seen deep Russian involvement in everything that they've done." Obama claims, "Russia is already more isolated than at any time since the end of the Cold War," as if that alone would encourage President Vladimir Putin to decide not to take Ukraine. Obama stops short of calling the invasion an invasion, pretending that there are no Russian soldiers or agents in Ukraine. Senator John McCain (R-AZ) responds, "Russia's ongoing aggression in Ukraine can only be called one thing: a cross-border military invasion. To claim it is anything other than that is to inhabit President Putin's Orwellian universe. A sovereign nation in the heart of Europe is being invaded by its larger neighbor. This runs completely contrary to the civilized world that America and our partners have sought to build since World War II." (Some might wonder why Obama bothered to meet with the press at all. He provided no new information; said he had no plans to deal with ISIS, and responded to the Russian invasion of Ukraine as though it was nothing significant.) Meanwhile, according to the *Daily Mail*, State Department spokeswoman Jennifer Psaki says, "Our focus remains on nonlethal assistance [to Ukraine]. This will be a discussion with the international community. But it hasn't changed the fact that our preference in our priority and our focus is on nonlethal assistance and is on a diplomatic path forward." She calls sanctions "the most effective tool, the best tool" for resolving the conflict. (Some may wonder why, if sanctions are the "best tool" for dealing with international thugs, they were not used in place of military force when dealing with Germany and Japan during World War II.) CNN's Barbara Starr comments, "This is the [commander in chief] that [sic; who] doesn't beat the war drum, but you have to wonder exactly what message he was sending here today. Let's be very clear. *ISIS heard all of this*. So [Obama] says we have no strategy yet. This is a little surprising because of course the Pentagon has openly acknowledged they are working on military options. Military options to pursue what strategy? There must be something out there, or what are these options that the Pentagon's been scribbling away at for weeks now? Where are they really headed? [Obama] talked about 'degrading' ISIS. Remember it was Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel a couple of days ago that [sic; who] said ISIS was like 'no threat we've ever seen.' There has been concern about a homeland threat from ISIS down the road and yet, no strategy to deal with it. Very blunt, very honest, absolutely where [Obama] is on all of this, no question about that [sic]. But perhaps worth remembering [is] that ISIS fighters, ISIS leadership will hear this statement that the U.S. right now has no strategy to deal with them. I don't think anybody thought a military strategy was the whole answer, but *no* strategy? A little odd perhaps." [63602]

At PJMedia.com Richard Fernandez writes, "[Obama] has just held a press conference announcing he will do nothing much to counter the crises unfolding in the Ukraine and Syria. It will now take a frightening amount of either military or economic pressure to rein in the Bear. So what's [Obama] going to do? The only thing he can do: keep going down the road he started. At WashingtonPost.com Jennifer Rubin writes, "What was the Obama administration's initial reaction [to Russia's invasion of Ukraine]? investigation... that's both appropriate and necessary to find out what happened, to see that justice is done, to help this community begin healing itself. ... We cannot ignore the inequities that persist in our justice system, inequities that undermine our most deeply held values of fairness and equality. ... Watching the recent funeral for Michael Brown, as a mother and as a human being, my heart just broke for his family, because losing a child is every parent's greatest fear and an unimaginable loss. There is also a list of targets in Britain including a military academy and the Marks and Spencers chain of department stores. The State Department confirmed McCain's death earlier this week, but spokeswoman Jen Psaki said Wednesday that the U.S. has no independent confirmation of the second American's death. 'We're looking into it,' she said." Minneapolis has a sizeable population of Somalis and Muslims. (It is later reported that Muhumed had worked for Delta Global Services at the Minneapolis-St. Paul airport, fueling and cleaning planes-a job that gave him access to the tarmac and, of course, planes. The information on the laptop makes clear that its owner is a Tunisian national named Muhammed S. who joined ISIS in Syria and who studied chemistry and physics at two universities in Tunisia's northeast. Even more disturbing is how he planned to use that education: The ISIS laptop contains a 19-page document in Arabic on how to develop biological weapons and how to weaponize the bubonic plague from infected animals. ... The laptop also includes a 26-page fatwa, or Islamic ruling, on the usage of weapons of mass destruction. 'If Muslims cannot defeat the kafir [unbelievers] in a different way, it is permissible to use weapons of mass destruction,' states the fatwa by Saudi jihadi cleric Nasir al-Fahd, who is currently imprisoned in Saudi Arabia. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) lives almost full-time in a D.C. hotel, and Senator Pat Roberts (R-KS) rarely sets foot in Kansas. Wagner hosts the MSNBC weekday program 'Now with Alex Wagner.' Both Obama and first lady Michelle Obama will be in attendance at the wedding..." (Obama interrupted his

Martha's Vineyard golf vacation to briefly return to Washington, D.C. to attend Kass' bachelor party—proving that he considers attending parties more important than attending to national security issues.) [63060, 63061, 63062, 63063, 63111, 63112, 63232, 63233, 63529, 63572]

Obama also plans to attend weekend fundraisers, which NYPost.com notes "is grounding wealthy weekenders who planned to fly to the Hamptons or Nantucket for the Labor Day holiday. The FAA has issued a no-fly warning that extends for most of Friday and all day Saturday through Sunday, grounding seaplanes to East Hampton, Montauk, Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket. On Friday [August 29], Obama will be feted at the home of one of his top bundlers, 32 Advisors' Robert Wolf, in the aptly-named Purchase, NY, with 250 high-rollers paying up to \$32,000 each to bend Obama's ear. Obama will then fly to Newport, R.I. for an event to benefit House Democrats. Melissa Tomkiel, president of seaplane companies, Fly the Whale (which flies from NYC to the Hamptons and Nantucket) and Tailwind (NYC to Boston and DC), told us, 'A flight restriction was issued banning operations in the NYC area due to [Obama's] visit on Friday for practically the whole weekend, causing major business losses and inconvenience for our passengers on the busiest weekend of the year. It is frustrating. We have had to move at least 10 flights and cancel a number of private charters, costing us thousands of dollars. We count on this weekend to get us through the quieter months of the year. This will create a perfect storm on a holiday Friday, creating air space havoc between New York City and Boston." (The additional trips will save hotel expenses, but that will be more than offset by the added cost of flying back and forth to the nation's capitol. Newsmax.com reports that former president Jimmy Carter is scheduled to address the Islamic Society of North America (ISNA) on August 30. Congressman Frank Wolf (R-VA) proposes legislation that would significantly restrict travel to Syria and other "nations of concern," and imprison for up to 20 years Americans who travel to those countries to Syria to fight with ISIS. According to FreeBeacon.com, "Wolf petitioned other members of Congress on Thursday to finally 'do something to prevent Americans fighting with ISIS from freely returning to the U.S,' according to a copy of a letter sent across the Hill. 'Limited U.S. intelligence about their activities in the region effectively means our law enforcement can do nothing when they return home, despite concerns about their activities, contacts and training while in Syria,' Wolf writes. 'I think most would agree we need to do more to prevent these terrorists from returning freely to the U.S. …The U.S. is not taking any substantial steps to discourage Americans from going over to fight—and these would-be fighters can see there is little price to pay for doing so. This is an untenable situation that puts our country at greater risk of attack from a radicalized American who trains and fights with these groups and later returns home.'" [63587, 63588]

Former Senator Scott Brown, running for the U.S. Senate in New Hampshire, apparently agrees with Wolf. Brown states, "One of the greatest threats facing the homeland today is the mayhem that will happen when hundreds of American ISIS fighters return to the United States to spread their terror here. Their goal is to march down Pennsylvania Avenue and plant a flag at the White House, and mass killing is their means for achieving that goal. That's why Congress needs to pass legislation that would strip the citizenship of any American who joins a foreign terrorist organization. 'This money has been foreseeably [sic] used to buy rockets and construct tunnels to attack Israel and terrorize and kill American and dual American-Israeli citizens who reside or are located in Israel,' Klayman said in a statement. 'The nation and the world have increasingly come to see that Obama views himself primarily as a Muslim and acts accordingly in favoring Islamic interests over Judeo-Christian ones, and the complaint lays out Obama's history in documented detail,' he said. Klayman said Obama's actions 'were calculated to harm the nation of Israel.' ... The case, No. 14-1484, alleges the defendants conspired to send hundreds of millions of dollars to Hamas 'under the false pretext that this financial support will be used for humanitarian purposes." She also came to the conclusion Obama had essentially the same goals in the Mideast as the late Osama bin Laden: 'to remove American power and influence, including military forces, from Islamic lands.' Why would Obama order the killing of bin Laden? Because [Obama] 'couldn't delay any longer,' once the opportunity was presented, Lopez told WND. There were 'no more excuses' available to avoid it and he 'thought it might look good,' she mused." (Many in the Obama administration have bought into the false claim that the Muslim Brotherhood is "moderate." Whether they have convinced Obama or he never needed convincing is not entirely clear, but evidence suggests the latter. As an example, in his June 2009 Cairo address Obama insisted that several members of the Muslim Brotherhood be allowed to sit in the first row—even though the group was outlawed by the Mubarak regime.) On Special Report, Charles Krauthammer says, "Look, I thought [Obama] could no longer surprise me. I was wrong. He shocked me today. AFP reports, "The Islamic State has declared Denmark an 'enemy of Islam' and the country is on the militant organization's radar. This is according to a Danish-Turkish jihadist, who only gave his name as OA and previously fought for the organization in Syria. The 27 year-old, who was born and raised in Denmark says The Islamic State, …previously known as ISIS, 'has become very international and Denmark is high up on the list, believe me,' speaking to the Danish broadsheet newspaper, Politiken. 'Denmark is not my country. The Muslims' country is the caliphate and inshallah [Allah willing] there will soon be an attack here. Denmark should prepare itself,' the militant added as

cited by The Local. 'It is an open war now. ISIS has said that all infidels should be battled. They should be eliminated and soon it will be Denmark's turn,' OA continued." [63707]

At PJMedia.com Freedom Scholar chair at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies Michael Ledeen writes, "They [Obama administration officials] DO have a strategy, but they prefer to appear indecisive. That's because the strategy would likely provoke even greater criticism than the false confession of endless dithering. The actual strategy is detente first, and then a full alliance with Iran throughout the Middle East and North Africa. It has been on display since before the beginning of the Obama administration. '[It] Looks like the pilot threw the economy's engines into reverse at the start of the third quarter,' said Chris Rupkey, chief financial economist at Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ. USAToday.com reports, "The FBI's Minneapolis bureau is looking into reports that a second American citizen from the area was killed fighting with the Islamic State as it works to find out whether the group is actively recruiting Muslims in the Twin Cities region. 'That's something we are looking into,' Kyle Loven, division counsel for the FBI in Minneapolis, said when asked about Abdirahmaan Muhumed, 29, who Fox News reported was killed in the same battle as another American from the Twin Cities area. Earlier this week, the State Department confirmed that Douglas McAuthur McCain died fighting with the Islamic State. 'We're aware of media reporting and social-media activity that a second American citizen has been killed in Syria. We don't have any details to confirm,' State Department spokeswoman Jen Psaki said Thursday about Muhumed." Pamela Geller observes, "Minnesota Muslims have been flocking to jihad wars (i.e. Somalia, Kenya) for years and the FBI is only looking into it now? Pure Obama. He has been taking his marching orders from Muslim Brotherhood goons. And the FBI should not just be looking at Islamic State recruiting. Great Britain raises its terror threat level from "substantial" to "severe." Prime Minster David Cameron says ISIS poses "greater and deeper threat to our security than we've seen before" and goes where Obama fears to tread, adding that the cause is "the poisonous narrative of Islamist extremism." Cameron warns, "I believe we will be fighting for years, and perhaps decades." Fighting the Islamic State is "a generational struggle" against a "poisonous ideology," and Great Britain "must respond calmly and with purpose" to a "greater and deeper threat to our security than we've seen before." This argument with his own administration is alarming on three levels. The first has to do with simple competence. One can only imagine the whiplash that foreign leaders must be suffering. They heard U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Samantha Power denounce Russia as 'today ...they open a new front ...Russia's force along the border is the largest it has been ....the mask is coming off.' An hour later, Mr. Obama implicitly contradicted her: 'I consider the actions that we've seen in the last week a continuation of what's been taking place for months now ...it's not really a shift.' Similarly, his senior advisers uniformly have warned of the unprecedented threat to America and Americans represented by Islamic

extremists in Syria and Iraq. But Mr. Obama didn't seem to agree. 'Now, ISIL... poses an immediate threat to the people of Iraq and to people throughout the region,' he said. 'My priority at this point is to make sure that the gains that ISIL made in Iraq are rolled back.' Contrast that ambition with this vow from Secretary of State John F. Kerry: 'And make no mistake: We will continue to confront ISIL wherever it tries to spread its despicable hatred. The world must know that the United States of America will never back down in the face of such evil.'" [63622]

"The discrepancies raise the question of whether Mr. Obama controls his own administration, but that's not the most disturbing element. Various media outlets report that O. J. Simpson has expressed a desire to convert to Islam. The Pentagon announces that Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel will visit Turkey to help build a coalition against ISIS. According to Stripes.com, Pentagon Press Secretary Rear Admiral John Kirby tells reporters, "Turkey is a key NATO ally. And given its border with Syria and Iraq, they share our deep concerns with... the regional threat posed by ISIL [ISIS]." Kirby also says he is "not aware" of pledges by any other countries in the region to support possible U.S. air strikes on ISIS fighters in Syria. [63650, 63651]

Hagel's visit makes no sense at all. Of all the nations in the region, Turkey is possibly the most sympathetic to the creation of an Islamist state and a caliphate—or at least its prime minister, Recep Tayyip Erdogan is. Erdogan has also said that Muslims who emigrate to Europe should not assimilate, and for them to do so would be "a crime against humanity." Erdogan has also called democracy "a bus ride. Once I get to my stop, I'm getting off." In other words, Erdogan pretends to support democracy but will reject it as soon as he accumulates enough power not to bother fooling the voters. Pamela Geller comments, "Bush had close to 50 countries in his 'Coalition of the Willing.' Obama has so alienated and abandoned our allies, he has no one. He is sending Hagel to Turkey to build a coalition to fight the Islamic State. Note to Obama: Turkey is supporting the Islamic State. But he knows this, too. Obama says he has no strategy to defeat ISIS. He doesn't because he has provided tacit support for the Islamic State—especially in Syria." The good news is that American leadership has never been more necessary and there's really no competition out there for the ideas and the values that can create the sort of order that we need in this world." He says, "If you watch the nightly news, it feels like the world is falling apart," but "we will get through these challenging times just like we have in the past." Obama also argues that the threat from ISIS is "not something that is comparable to the challenges faced during the Cold War. This is not comparable to the challenges that we faced when we had an entire block of Communist countries that were trying to do us in. This is something we can handle, because we are Americans and that's what we do." Obama also claims, "things are much less dangerous now than they were 20 years ago, 25 years ago or 30 years ago." (While Obama spoke those words, British Prime Minister David Cameron was warning that the United Kingdom was facing "the greatest and deepest terror threat in its history." Obama's claim, and his history, are of course mistaken. No "block of communist countries" was trying to attack the United States. The Soviet Union was invading eastern European nations, converting them to communist countries, and including them in its evil empire. The threat was from the Kremlin and the missile silos it controlled, *not* countries like Hungary and Czechoslovakia, whose citizens were forced to submit to the brutal tyranny of communism. Obama says ISIS is "something we can handle, because we are Americans," yet on August 28 he said "what we're doing... is limited," "we don't have a strategy yet," and "the idea that the United States or any outside power would perpetually defeat ISIS I think is unrealistic.") host Brian Stelter asks about the incident: "Is this all some sort of joke to you? Choudary replies, "You know, if you had a sense of humor, you would have laughed at that. It was just a sound check. Choudary also claims, "There is no such thing as a radical or moderate form of Islam. You know, a woman is either pregnant or not pregnant. If you abide by Islam, and you follow what is in the Koran and the traditions of the prophet, then, quite frankly, you'd never find anything that I say which does not have Islamic basis. ...I've been propagating Islam, and I've met most of the leaders of the Muslim community, so I know what's out there. If you go to Muslims who are actually practicing Islam... you'll find that they say the exact same thing as me. Because I'm not calling for leadership for individuals, I'm calling for leadership for Islam." (Choudary's sound check references are, of course, to the September 11, 2001 terrorist attack on the United States, the London bombings of July 7, 2005, and the Madrid train bombings of March 11, 2004. It is worth noting that former London rapper Abdel Majed Abdel Bary, who is suspected of being the executioner in the video of the beheading of journalist James Foley, was reportedly radicalized by Choudary's followers.) He stated, "I do believe that the only way for [Obama] to save himself in this life and in the hereafter is to embrace Islam. The unemployed mother, who was once an aspiring rock musician, claims to have joined bloodthirsty jihadis roaming the lawless border between Syria and Iraq. She is believed to have abandoned her two young sons to marry one of the British suspects in the beheading of US journalist James Foley. Jones, who now calls herself Sakinah Hussain, wears traditional Islamic dress and has swapped her home in Chatham, Kent, for Raqqa, the Syrian stronghold of terror group IS. ... [H]er brother Patrick, 52, who runs his own paving company, said his family are deeply shocked by her conversion to radical Islam....Jones is thought to have sneaked into Syria at the end of last year after an online romance with Junaid Hussain, 20. She has posted a series of chilling threats on social networking sites and posed for photos with an AK-47, while dressed in black with her face veiled. Using the pseudonym Umm Hussain al-Britani, she has abused Jews and praised Osama bin Laden." [63696, 63697, 63698, 63713]

The *Los Angeles Times* coins a new term for illegal immigrant workers: "informal workers." [63727, 63728]

At PJMedia.com Patrick Poole reports, "A new claim was made on a Syrian rebel Twitter feed this morning saying that an additional three Americans have been killed fighting with ISIS near Ghouta. A video purporting to show the three dead Americans was posted on Youtube." [63737]

St. Bartholomew's Catholic Church in Columbus, Indiana is vandalized by Muslims, who write "infidels" and "Qu'ran 3:151" in spray paint. Several other churches in the area were also similarly vandalized. The Qu'ran verse reads, "We will cast terror into the hearts of those who disbelieve for what they have associated with Allah of which He had not sent down [any] authority. And their refuge will be the Fire, and wretched is the residence of the wrongdoers." Nassim Khaled, "a resident of Columbus who volunteers at the Islamic Center," tells Fox59.com the perpetrators "actually misquoted or misinterpreted the Qu'ran." (He does not say whether it would be appropriate to deface the churches with a different verse.) It can be assumed that the "hate crimes" team Attorney General Eric Holder dispatched to Ferguson, Missouri will not stop at Columbus, Indiana on its way home.) [63746, 63747, 63748]

The shame and blame tactic of calling out businesses who wish to relocate as 'unpatriotic' was undignified. (In other words, "the fix is in," and regardless of who the American people want in the White House, Wall Street will spend the money needed to make sure its next occupant is "acceptable" to them.)
