The Complete Obama Timeline

On December 1, at the climate conference in Paris, Obama pushes a tax on carbon emissions, saying, "I have long believed that the most elegant way to drive innovation and to reduce carbon emissions is to put a price on it. ... I think that, as the science around climate change is more accepted, as people start realizing that even today, you can put a price on the damage that climate change is doing. You go down to Miami, and when it's flooding at high tide on a sunny day and fish are swimming through the middle of the streets, you know, there's a cost to that. And insurance companies are beginning to realize that in terms of how they price risk. And the more the market on its own starts putting a price on it, because of risk—it may be that the politics around setting up a cap and trade system, for example, shifts as well." (Obama is, of course, lying. Fish do not swim in the middle of the street in Miami, and high tide does not flood the city's streets. Obama is, however, correct that if such flooding were to routinely happen insurance companies would factor in that risk. In facts, people would stop buying real estate in Miami if the streets routinely flooded. But those are arguments for government not getting involved in "climate change." The private economy will respond to events like flooding *if it happens*. No one needs government to force people to respond rationally to any changes in the climate. They will respond on their own.) Obama says his successor will honor any climate change agreement because "99.5 percent of scientists and 99 percent of world leaders" believe climate change "is really important." The false number routinely quoted by leftists has been 97 percent. Obama has now upped that to 99.5 percent—with no facts to back him up. CNSNews.com reports, "The origin of the '97 percent' statistic has been traced back to a 2009 study by University of Illinois/Chicago graduate student Kendall Zimmerman, who sent a survey to 10,257 earth scientists [most who were *not* climate experts] asking them two questions: 'When compared with pre-1800s levels, do you think that mean global temperatures have generally risen, fallen, or remained relatively constant?' and 'Do you think human activity is a significant contributing factor in changing mean global temperatures?' Eighty-two percent of the 3,146 scientists who completed the survey (a 30.7% response rate) answered 'yes' to question 2. That figure included 75 of the 79 individuals (97.4%) who self-identified themselves as climate scientists." [84501, 85672]

In addition, "In a 2013 paper published by the Institute of Physics' IOPScience and cited by NASA, University of Queensland climate communication fellow John Cook also stated that 97 percent of scientists who took a position on global warming agreed that humans were the primary cause. ...However, a peer review of Cook's paper by David Legates, a former state climatologist and professor at the University of Delaware, that was published in the April 2015 issue of Science and Education debunked the 97 percent consensus figure. Legates pointed out that only 41 of the 11,944 academic papers Cook examined in his meta-analysis (0.3%) explicitly stated that most of the global warming since 1950 was caused by human activity. 'It is astonishing that any journal could have published a paper claiming a 97% climate consensus when in the authors' own analysis [of] the true consensus was well below 1%,' Legates wrote. Cook's paper was also criticized by other scientists for what they said was a number of methodological errors." [84501, 85672]

Meanwhile, Congressman Hank Johnson (D-GA) knocks the 97 percent claim down to a still false 95 percent, saying, "Some of us really don't care, some of us don't care to consider that 95 percent of scientists recognize that it's man's activities that are contributing to the astronomical rate of climate change that is occurring that has the potential to render our planet uninhabitable by human beings. You can laugh, you can smile, you can joke, but 95 percent of the scientists agree that if we continue along the same path that we are continuing along that it's the demise of humankind itself—that's the end result." (This is the same Hank Johnson who once claimed that Guam would "tip over and capsize" because too many people live on the island.) [84502, 84503]

Obama also comments on the recent shooting at a Colorado Springs Planned Parenthood facility. He says, "With respect to Planned Parenthood, uh, obviously, uh, uh, my heart goes out ta [sic; to] the families of those impacted, um, I mean, ...I, I, I say this every time we've got a, one of these mass shootings. This just doesn't happen in other countries." (The man is delusional. Only two weeks before the Colorado incident 129 people were shot to death in Paris. Obama does not mention that the number of mass shootings in the United States have increased since he entered the White House in 2009. During the Reagan presidency, there were 11 mass shootings resulting in four or more deaths; under George H. W. Bush, 12; under Bill Clinton, 23; under George W. Bush, 20; under Obama (so far), 162.) General Joseph Dunford, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, tells the House Armed Services Committee, "We have not contained ISIL [ISIS]." Defense Secretary Ashton Carter tells the committee, "Tens of thousands of U.S. personnel are operating in the broader Middle East region. And more are on the way. We have some of our most advanced air and naval forces attacking ISIL. U.S. troops are advising and assisting ground operations in Syria and Iraq. I'll briefly describe some of these efforts and how we're accelerating them. ...In full coordination with the government of Iraq, we're deploying a specialized expeditionary targeting force to assist Iraqi and Peshmerga forces put even more pressure on ISIL. These special operators will, over time, be able to conduct raids, free hostages, gather intelligence, and capture ISIL leaders. Remarkably, Dunford states that regular top-level planning meetings between the Pentagon and the State Department about ISIS and Syria did not begin until only two months ago. Dunford says, "[A]bout two months ago, we began to meet on a periodic basis to attack specific issues. So far, the oil issue is actually an outcome of the first meeting that we had, and the most recent meeting was on foreign fighters because that clearly requires the whole government. Am I satisfied with the level of integration? No. We're working on that." [84399]

Congressman Stephen Lynch (D-MA) tells Boston public radio WGBH, "Back in August, we did an investigation—the Inspector General did—of the Department of Homeland Security, and they had 72 individuals that [sic; who] were on the terrorist watch list that [sic; who] were actually working at the Department of Homeland Security.

...Then we went further and did and eight-airport investigation. We had staffers go into eight different airports to test the department of homeland security screening process at major airports. They had a 95 percent failure rate. Included among the programs with useless financial accounting records is nearly \$20 billion at the Government National Mortgage Association." (The Secretary of HUD is Julian Castro, the vastly overrated former mayor of San Antonio who some Democrats would like to be Hillary Clinton's 2016 "ethnic quota" running mate. Although he is Hispanic, Castro does not speak Spanish. His mother detests the Battle of the Alamo and everything it stands for, and has called the mission's defenders "a bunch of drunks and crooks and slaveholding imperialists who conquered land that didn't belong to them." As mayor, Castro pushed through a \$596 million bond program in 2012 to finance various projects. They will have to file if they rent bank lockers and if yes, also the name of the bank and the branch, even if abroad. ...The new assets declaration form has a total of 56 pages." The author asks, "How can a bride know the value of the jewelry her parents-in-law gave as a wedding gift? If the retail price of X valuable item was 10,000 euro in 2005, what is the value today? And what will happen if one will not declare his assets? The tax authorities will raid the home and search under the mattress to find grandma's ring? ...ARE YOU KIDDING ME?" [84435, 84436]

Although this action is taking place in Greece—which is so desperately in debt that the government may be considering taxing or even confiscating assets—it must be remembered that shortly after Franklin D. Roosevelt entered the White House in 1933 he ordered the confiscation of gold. FDR's clearly unconstitutional Executive Order 6102 ordered *all* U.S. citizens to sell their "excess gold" to the federal government—with "excess" meaning anything over \$100 in value. They were paid \$20.67 per ounce. *After* the gold was confiscated, the government set the price of gold at \$35 per ounce—thereby robbing Americans of \$14.33 per ounce. The \$35 per ounce price was only for bankers and governments, because Americans were prohibited from owning gold until late 1974.

WashingtonTimes.com reports, "Senate Republicans put themselves on track to pass a long-sought bill this week to dismantle Obamacare and strip funding from Planned Parenthood for one year, finalizing a measure Tuesday that will put a major repeal of the Affordable Care Act on ...Obama's desk for the first time. Mr. Obama is sure to veto the bill, but just getting it to his desk will be a victory for Republicans, who have repeatedly run into Democratic filibusters in the Senate." [84357, 84468]

Bloomberg.com notes, "UnitedHealth said on Nov. 19 that it may quit selling coverage in the Affordable Care Act's individual markets in 2017. ...Losses from the plans this year and next will total more than half a billion dollars, the company has said, and UnitedHealth will scale back efforts to market coverage to millions of people shopping for 2016 insurance on the Affordable Care Act's new marketplaces. ...The company said it expects operating earnings of \$13.1 billion to \$13.5 billion next year, on revenue of \$180 billion to \$181 billion." Earnings of \$13.5 billion from \$181 billion in revenue is a profit of 7.5 percent profit. Those who argue that insurance companies are ripping off the public are mistaken. The average American mistakenly believes the average company earns about 36 percent profit. In fact, it is about 7.5 percent. Walmart makes a profit of about 3.1 percent; local communities receive more in sales taxes than Walmart receives in profit. The oil companies average about 5.1 percent; beverage companies, 13; broadcasting, 12; building materials, 4; cable television, 9; computer services, 6; drug companies, 16; entertainment, 13; food processing, 7; home furnishings, 4; healthcare products, 9; hospitals, 5; mining, 2; newspapers and publishing, 14; recreation, 9; restaurants, 9; retail groceries, 3; semiconductors, 14; software, 16; tobacco, 22; trucking, 4; general utilities, 9; water utilities, 15. FreeBeacon.com reports, "Car service, hotels, and accommodations for the president and other administration officials to attend climate change talks in Paris are costing taxpayers nearly \$2 million, according to government contracts. The COP21 meeting of global leaders, which ...Obama said is a 'powerful rebuke' to terrorists, began on Monday [November 30]. Representatives from 195 countries traveled to Paris, burning 300,000 tons of carbon dioxide for the United Nations conference that is seeking to reduce global emissions. The tab for Obama's motorcade alone totals \$784,825. The State Department issued a \$407,868 contract to Biribin Limousines, an international chauffeur service, for vehicles for [Obama's] security detail. Numerous other contracts for passenger vehicle rentals, including \$9,042 for accompanying press, totaled \$376,957. Taxpayers were also billed \$100,216 to book hotel accommodations for [Obama's] stay. Hotel rooms and cell phones for the U.S. Secret Service... cost \$16,642 and \$4,034, respectively." [84358]

"A number of cabinet secretaries are also in Paris for the United Nations conference, including IRS Commissioner John Koskinen, whose car service tab is \$5,400. Secretary of State John Kerry's car service totaled \$76,435, with three separate contracts worth \$38,684, \$15,789, and \$21,962. Car service for Energy Secretary Ernest Moniz is costing \$19,080, and two contracts worth \$10,153 and \$10,737 were issued for Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack's chauffeur service. Interior Secretary Sally Jewell is also attending the conference, with hotel accommodations at the Tuileries Finances in Paris costing \$36,091, and her car service totaling \$13,903. In all, costs associated with the climate change summit totaled \$1,805,282." (Why the IRS commissioner is at the conference is not explained.) [84358]

The House approves two resolutions (already approved by the Senate) to block Environmental Protection Agency greenhouse gas rules for power plants. (Obama will veto the resolutions.) [84367]

The International Monetary Fund announces that the Chinese currency, the yuan (also called the renminbi), will be included as a world reserve currency—along with the U.S. dollar, British pound, the European euro, and the Japanese yen. *The New York Times* writes, "The move will help pave the way for broader use of the renminbi in trade and finance, securing China's standing as a global economic power. ...The I.M.F. designation, an accounting unit known as the special drawing rights, bestows global importance. ...By adding the renminbi to this group, the I.M.F. effectively says that it considers the currency to be safe, reliable and freely usable." (The action may be bad news for the U.S. dollar, especially since China has been stockpiling gold in an effort to make its currency more respected. Meanwhile, the U.S. government and the Federal Reserve continue to make the dollar less respected and valuable, with massive operating deficits and the continued expansion of the money supply. If world traders change from demanding dollars to demanding gold or the yuan, the result will be bad for the U.S. economy.) [84380, 84381]

On December 2 Donald Trump says on *Fox & Friends*, "We have a president who doesn't know what he is doing... all he's worried about is climate change. ...I would knock the hell out of ISIS. I would hit them, I would hit them so hard... like they've never been hit." Asked about civilian casualties, Trump responds, "I would do my best, absolute best—I mean, one of the problems that we have and one of the reasons we're so ineffective is, you know, they're trying to, they're [ISIS is] using them [civilians] as shields, it's a horrible thing. They're using them as shields. But we're fighting a very politically correct war. And the other thing is, with the terrorists, you have to take out their families. The French government closes three mosques. The Associated Press reports, "One of the mosques, 35 kilometers (22 miles) east of Paris in Lagny-sur-Marne, was targeted by raids early Wednesday, with police seizing a 9mm revolver, a computer hard disc and jihadist propaganda. ...The two other mosques, in Lyon and Gennevilliers in the Paris region, were shut down last week amid a state of emergency." Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton announces "he has filed suit on behalf of the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) against the federal government to halt the relocation of refugees from Syria in the state, citing the Refugee Act of 1980, which requires that the federal government consult with state authorities in advance of such relocations. The federal government is directing the nonprofit entity tasked with placing the refugees in Texas from disclosing even basic information that would help resolve Texas's security concerns. ...Texas takes in roughly 10 percent of the refugees transition to the State and pay associated costs. In this case, authorities have left Texas uninformed about refugees that could well pose a security risk to Texans and gives them no say in the process." [84571, 84572]

FreeBeacon.com reports, "More than 179,000 illegal immigrants convicted of committing crimes, including violent ones, continue to roam free across the United States, with reports indicating that these illegal immigrants commit new crimes 'every day,' according to lawmakers and the director of the Immigration and Customs Enforcement agency, also known as ICE." Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel (Obama's former chief of staff) is angered by a Politico.com report that he will be vacationing in Cuba over Christmas. (Emanuel once took a trip to Kenya.) [84395, 84411, 84454]

U.S. District Court Judge Jon DeGuilio, an Obama appointee, issues an injunction against Elkhart, Indiana's Concord Community Schools, preventing Concord High School from including a nativity scene in their Christmas program. DeGiulio claims it "conveys an endorsement of religion and thus runs afoul of the Establishment Clause." FoxNews.com's Todd Starnes reports, "The Freedom From Religion Foundation and the ACLU of Indiana had filed a lawsuit on behalf of a family whose child is in the production. …The kids in Elkhart have been staging a Christmas Spectacular since 1970. The show is modeled after the Radio City Music Hall Christmas Spectacular. And until last August—there were absolutely no problems." (DeGiulio may not be aware of what the first six letters of Christmas represent. A school Christmas program does not force anyone to convert to Christianity, just as a school production of *Grease* does not force audience members to go out and purchase tight pants.) Emanuel insists he will not resign, despite the furor over the police shooting of Laquan McDonald—and the failure to release dashcam video of the incident or charge the officer until 13 months later, long after Emanuel's reelection victory. A testy Emanuel says, "We have a process called the election. The voters spoke. I'll be held accountable for the decisions and actions that I make." USAToday.com reports, "More Americans had their backgrounds checked purchasing guns on Black Friday than any day on record, according to data released by the FBI this week. The National Instant Criminal Background Check System processed 185,345 requests on Nov. 27, one of the largest retail sales days in the country. 'This was an approximate 5% increase over the 175,754 received on Black Friday 2014,' wrote Stephen Fischer, the FBI's chief of multimedia productions. 'The previous high for receipts were the 177,170 received on 12/21/2012.''' At Townhall.com Christine Rousselle writes, "People are likely buying guns in increased numbers due to recent comments by the president that suggest new gun control measures are coming. The previous record for background checks came shortly after the Sandy Hook School shooting in December 2012.'' The Associated Press reports, "US health care spending in 2014 grew at fastest pace [5.3 percent] of Obama's presidency." [84459, 84460]

Obama threatens to veto the latest spending bill proposal, with a message from the Office of Management and Budget: "This legislation is being considered by the Senate just days ahead of the December 15 deadline for [ObamaCare] Marketplace coverage that starts on January 1, 2016. Rather than refighting old political battles by once again voting to repeal basic protections that provide security for the middle class, members of Congress should be working together to grow the economy, strengthen middle-class families, and create new jobs. If [Obama] were presented with H.R. 3762, as amended by the Senate amendment, he would veto the bill." According to TheBlaze.com, "The bill would reverse much of Obamacare, including cutting the employer mandate, eliminating the 'Cadillac tax' and redirecting federal funding of Planned Parenthood. …The bill would also prohibit federal funds for one year for Planned Parenthood, which includes its affiliates, subsidiaries, successors, and clinics, while hiking funding to community health centers by \$235 million in each of fiscal years 2016 and 2017." In San Bernardino, California two gunmen attack a social services facility, killing 14 and injuring 21. The gunmen escape the scene. According to FoxNews.com the shooters, "who witnesses said were wearing body armor and masks, entered the Inland Regional Center just after 11 a.m. with grim precision, according to San Bernardino Police Chief

Jarrod Burguan. Once inside, they opened fire with rifles, shooting people in a conference room where a holiday party was taking place, authorities said. Hundreds of people were seen streaming out of the building moments later, some described by witnesses as holding their hands above their heads and even diving for cover behind cars in a parking lot. 'Up to three people entered the building and opened fire on people inside the building,' Burguan said at a news conference some three hours after the first call went out. 'The suspects have fled, potentially in a dark-colored SUV. They came prepared to do what they did as if on a mission,' he added. The incident lasted less then [sic; than] five minutes, police said." "...The Inland Regional Center is one of 21 facilities serving people with developmental disabilities run by the state, said Nancy Lungren, spokeswoman for the California Department of Developmental Services. The social services agency administers, authorizes and pays for assistance to people with disabilities such as autism and mental retardation. On an average day, doctors at the regional centers would be evaluating toddlers whose parents have concerns and case workers meeting with developmentally disabled adults. The San Bernardino facility consists of three buildings, and employs approximately 600 workers. Inland Regional Center Executive Director Lavinia Johnson told Reuters the shooting happened at a conference center her group rented out for a county personnel holiday department." [84409, 84414]

CNN's Harry Houck says the shooters "could be some right-wing group, for all I know." [84504]

Also on CNN, criminologist Casey Jordan says, "Disgruntled employee. They can have Arabic or Middle Eastern names as well, but the key is that from the beginning everything that was reported about him, going into this conference room where there was a holiday party which may have been offensive to him. But the bottom line is the motivation always appeared to be intrinsic not, extrinsic... [I]t was almost like he was looking for an excuse to go get the guns, get the female getaway driver—you know, put on his fatigues and let it look like terrorism." (In Jordan's ludicrous opinion, the shooting has nothing to do with jihad. Instead, the killers were merely offended by Christmas parties and to "cover their tracks" they made their killings look like terrorism—because everyone has military gear, 12 pipe bombs, and thousands of rounds of ammunition lying around their homes just in case they encounter something that offends them.) [84505, 84515, 84538]

A more rationale CNN guest says, "I think one thing that's clear though is, uh, none of this, uh, these things that are occurring have anything to do with, um, climate change." [84497, 84564]

Both CNN and MSNBC go out of their way to reassure viewers that the shooting incident is nowhere near the area's Planned Parenthood facility. [84473, 84482]

MSNBC gives time to the far left ThinkProgress.org's Igor Volsky, who ridicules people who offer thoughts and prayers after tragedies: "The responses are so predictable. I mean, they've been thinking and praying about this since [the 2014 school shootings in] Newtown... [T]hese folks only want to think and pray and the NRA pays them to only think and pray about gun violence and not to do anything else about it. ...[W]hen it comes to gun violence, time and time again, all we hear from these people is thoughts and prayers and people keep on dying and dying, and all they can say is, thoughts and prayers..." [84506]

With the killer still at large, Obama tells CBS' Norah O'Donnell, "You know, obviously our hearts go out ta [sic; to] the victims and, and, and the families." (It is time for politicians to come up with a new phrase. "Our hearts go out" is as tiresome as "blood, sweat, and tears" and the definition of insanity often-probably falsely-attributed to Einstein or Benjamin Franklin: "Doing the same things over and over again and expecting different results.") "The one thing we do know is that, uh, that we have a pattern now of, of mass shootings in this country that, uh, has no parallel anywhere else in the world, and there's [sic] some steps we can take not ta [sic] eliminate every one of these mass shootings, uh, but, uh ta [sic] improve the odds that, uh, they don't happen as frequently, uh, common sense gun safety laws, uh, stronger background checks, and, you know, for those who are concerned about terrorism, uh, you know, some may be aware of the fact that we have, uh, a no fly list where people can't get on planes, but those same people who we don't allow to fly could go into a store right now in the United States and buy a firearm and there's nothin' that we can do to stop 'em. Uh, that's a law that needs to be changed." (The problem with Obama's demand is that the no-fly and terrorism watch lists are riddled with errors because it is ridiculously easy to get a name added to the lists-which contain hundreds of thousands of names. As an example, the late Senator Edward Kennedy, The Weekly Standard's Stephen Hayes, and Nelson Mandela were on the watch list. "...We don't yet know what the motives, uh, of, of the shooters are, uh, but we do know is is [sic] that there's [sic] steps we can take to make, uh, Americans safer, uh, and that we should come together in [sic; on] a bipartisan basis at every level of government ta [sic], uh, ta [sic], you know, make these rare, uh, as opposed to normal. We should never think that, uh, this is, uh, something that just happens in the ordinary course of events 'cause [sic] it doesn't happen, uh, with the same frequency in other countries." (After his absurd claim in Paris that shootings don't happen in other countries, Obama is careful here to add "with the same frequency." He is still mistaken. There are nations in Africa where mass shootings occur far more often than in the United States. In addition, just looking at gun deaths—not mass shootings—the most violent nations are Honduras, Venezuela, El Salvador, Jamaica, Swaziland, Guatemala, Columbia, South Africa, Brazil, and Panama. As events unfold, Hillary Clinton tweets, "I refuse to accept this as normal. We must take action to stop gun violence now." Democrat candidates Martin O'Malley and Bernie Sanders tweet messages. [84425, 84426, 84457]

Police later encounter the alleged getaway vehicle, a black SUV, and two occupants are reportedly shot and killed by police: one man and one woman. They are identified as Syed Rizwan Farook, 28, and his wife, Tashfeen Malik, 27. Farook, a Sunni Muslim, was born in Illinois. A son of Pakistani immigrants, he had recently returned from Saudi Arabia with Malik, who entered the United States on a K-1 fiancé visa with a Pakistani passport. They were reportedly married in Mecca, Saudi Arabia. According to WashingtonTimes.com, "Farook worked for San Bernardino County as an environmental health specialist, and recent government records indicate that he oversaw water quality testing at several pools. A third man was arrested at the scene of the fatal gunbattle [sic; gun battle], but it wasn't immediately clear whether he was involved in the massacre at the morning party or just an innocent bystander fleeing in panic." (Obama wants the nation to believe 200,000 Syrian refugees can be properly vetted—yet Malik has already proven the process is a sham.) Interestingly, Malik is a male name. Walid Shoebat notes, "The name is very unusual for a woman and there is no record of any *Tashfeen Malik* in the U.S. or even abroad in Arabic. Tashfeen Malik (King) is a nom de guerre for a Muslim Jihadist from the annals of Muslim history." The assumption is that Tashfeen Malik was not the terrorist's birth name, but a name she later chose. (Some wonder whether Obama's daughter, Malia Ann, was named in honor of one of the daughters of Malcolm "X" Little, Malika Shabazz, or after Malcolm X himself, whose tombstone is inscribed with "Hajj Malik." Malik means "king" in Arabic, while Malikah means "queen." Malcolm X became a Sunni Muslim and, after a pilgrimage to Mecca, he called himself El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz; his children use the surname Shabazz, rather than Little.) [527, 2421, 84784]

One Redlands, California, neighbor tells authorities Farook and Malik frequently had packages delivered to their rented house and they were often up late doing something in their garage. When police search the property they find what is essentially a bomb factory. (The neighbor could perhaps have saved 14 lives—but was afraid to report the suspicious activity out of fear of being called an Islamophobe.) Farook's father states, "He was very religious. He would go to work, come back, go to pray, come back. He's Muslim." (A third person—perhaps Farook's brother, Syed *Raheel* Farook—may have been involved in the shootings.) JihadWatch.org's Robert Spencer writes, "The same thing happened several years ago in the Fort Dix jihad plot: the young man who inadvertently discovered the plot initially hesitated to contact police, fearing that to do so might be racist. This is what 14 years of pounding in the media from Hamas-linked CAIR and the Left has done: make people think that defending themselves and their country is somehow wrong." [84545]

Members of the Los Angeles office of the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR) quickly hold a tightly-controlled press conference. (This would be the same CAIR that encourages Muslims not to cooperate with the FBI.) CAIR-LA Executive Director Hussam Ayloush tells reporters, "We condemn this horrific and revolting attack and offer our heartfelt condolences to the families and loved ones of all those killed or injured. The Muslim community stands shoulder to shoulder with our fellow Americans in repudiating any twisted mindset that would claim to justify such sickening acts of violence." Farhan Khan, the husband of Farook's sister, says, "I have no idea why he would do that, why he would do something like this." A defensive Ayloush stops reporters from asking Khan questions, telling them, "He truly doesn't feel he's informed enough to comment." [84432, 84477, 84484, 84546, 84551, 85286]

Pamela Geller later writes, "Complicating matters is that the family is not forthcoming or trustworthy. The fact that the family of shooters went to CAIR on the day of the slaughter speaks volumes about them. Would YOU go to a terror group? CAIR is an un-indicted co-conspirator in the largest terrorist-funding trial in our nation's history. And the UAE [United Arab Emirates] has designated CAIR a terrorist group. The CAIR press conference was a preemptive shot—to shut down discussion of the true motive behind the Islamic attack in San Bernardino: jihad." [84542]

The FBI states, "This may or may not have been a terrorist attack." (It is obvious that it is terrorism, but "higher ups" are just as obviously calling for the word not to be used until there is no way to avoid it. Obama will not be happy that the FBI used the word terrorism.) [84433]

At WND.com Cheryl Chumley writes, "Reuters reported the couple started their day by dropping their baby girl off at the Redlands home of Farook's mother, telling her they needed to go to a medical appointment. Farook actually attended the Christmas party, sat for a while but left and returned later with Malik. The two stormed the party, decked out in armored gear and masks, and carting assault weapons, and began shooting up the scene. Fox News reported they didn't say anything, but simply walked into the facility, opened fire, emptied their magazines, then reloaded and opened fire again. They fled from the scene in a black SUV and by sunset, were killed by police in a shootout. Police also found several pipe bombs and makeshift explosive devices at the site of the massacre." The husband and wife terrorist team's arsenal included 15 pipe bombs and thousands of rounds of ammunition. [84433, 84495]

Not only did a neighbor wonder about suspicious activity at the Farook home and not report it, Chumley reports, "Another man whose work had brought him into the neighborhood in recent days said he had noticed several Middle Easterners in the area in the last few weeks. But he [told KCBS-TV] he didn't want to report their presence because he worried about being labeled a racial profiler. 'We sat around lunch thinking, 'What were they doing around the neighborhood?' We'd see them leave where they're raiding the apartment." [84433, 84458, 84462, 84463, 84490, 84498]

At a rally in Manassas, Virginia, several black pastors endorse Donald Trump for president. Pastor Steve Parson says, "[P]eople ask me, 'Why are you endorsing Donald Trump?' Well, [in] my opinion, he's the best and the only one who can beat Hillary Clinton. I mean, listen, we gotta [sic] win. And one thing about Donald Trump is he's a winner. Amen? And here's another thing too, he knows how to create wealth. Can I get an amen? And as a black minister, I'll just tell you this: we're right in the inner-city, and I'll tell you we need jobs, we need employment, we need businesses. And I'll tell you, who better can help us help [us] than Donald Trump? ...I personally believe that this is a movement. It's a movement. And I believe that we're in a situation now that this country called America is going to come back and be made great again. Ain't that right? In fact, I believe it's a wealth transfer—a wealth movement—okay? I'll tell you one thing, Mr. Trump is going to make this military strong again, too. Why is that? Why is this? I'm not going to take too much time, I'll just tell you this: Donald Trump doesn't take anybody's mess." [84485, 84779, 84785]

Whether Trump can win a large portion of the black vote remains to be seen, but if he is the GOP nominee and if he can manage 10-15 percent of the black vote, Hillary Clinton could lose by a wide margin. In 2012 Obama won 45 percent of the male vote, 55 percent of the female vote, 39 percent of the white vote, 93 percent of the black vote, and 71 percent of the Hispanic vote—but only 51 percent of the total vote. In 2016, Clinton will not do well among male, white voters. But black voters will not support her as enthusiastically as they supported Obama. Obama received the majority of the votes of Americans earning less than \$50,000, a category in which Trump may do well. Trump's anti-China rhetoric may also help him among union workers, a group Obama won handily in 2012. While many assume Trump will do poorly among Hispanic voters, the reality is that many legal Hispanic immigrants resent illegal immigrants competing with them for jobs. Trump may capture more Hispanic votes than many might anticipate. [84785]

On *Hannity*, Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) says, "It is abundantly clear that Barack Obama and Hillary Clinton can't defeat ISIS, because they have no intention of even trying. They won't even acknowledge the enemy. I mean, Hillary Clinton at the last Democratic debate went out of her way to refuse to say the words, 'radical Islamic terrorism.' What we need, Sean—yes, we can defeat ISIS with a strong commander-in-chief. If I am elected president, I will make unequivocally clear to the world we will destroy ISIS. Now how can we do so? We should do so, number one, with overwhelming air power. In the first Persian Gulf War, we launched roughly 1,100 air attacks a day, for 37 days, pulverized the Iraqi Army. It then took 36 hours for our troops to mop up what was left of it. Right now, today Obama is launching 15 to 30 air attacks a day. It's a pinprick, it's a photo op foreign policy. And the second thing we ought to be doing is arming the Kurds. The Kurds are fighting ISIS. They are our allies. They are effective fighters. The Kurds, are, in a very real sense, our boots on the ground. And yet, the Obama administration and Hillary Clinton is sadly in this mix. They refuse to arm the Kurds for political reasons because it would upset Baghdad. That doesn't make any sense." [84488]

On December 3 Barack "Uhbama" again addresses the shootings in San Bernardino, telling reporters, "At this stage, we do not yet know, uh, why this terrible event occurred. Uh, we do know that, uh, the two, uh, individuals who were killed, uh, were equipped with, uh, weapons and appeared to have access to, uh, additional weaponry at their homes, but we don't know why they did it. Uh, we don't know, uh, at this point, the extent of their plans, uh, we do not know, uh, their motivations, and I just received a briefing from, uh, FBI director [James] Comey as well as Attorney General [Loretta] Lynch, uh, indicating, uh, the course of their investigation. At this point this is now a [sic; an] FBI investigation, uh, that's been done in cooperation, uh, and consultation with local law enforcement, uh, it is *possible* that this was terrorist-related, but we don't know." (Obama most certainly knows it is terrorism.) [84446]

"Uh, it's also possible that this was workplace-related, uh, and until, uh, the FBI has been able to conduct, uh, what are gonna [sic] be a large number of interviews, uh, until we understand, uh, the nature of, uh, the workplace relationship, uh, between, uh, the individual and, uh, his superiors, because he worked, uh, with the organization where, uh, this terrible shooting took place, until all the social media and electronic information has been exploited we're just not gonna [sic] be able to answer, uh, those questions, uh, but, uh, what I can assure the American people is we're gonna [sic] get to the bottom of this and that we are gonna [sic] be, uh, vigilant as we always are in getting the facts, uh, before we issue, uh, any, uh, decisive judgments in terms of how this occurred. Uh, more broadly, uh, as I sad yesterday, you know, we see the prevalence of these kinds of mass shootings in this country, uh, and I think so many Americans sometimes feel as if there's nothing we can do about it." "Uh, we are fortunate to have an extraordinary, uh, combination of law enforcement, intelligence, uh, and military that work every single day to keep us safe. Uh, but, uh we can't just leave it to our professionals ta [sic], uh, ta [sic] deal with, uh, the problem of these kinds of horrible killings, uh, we all have a part to play, and I do think as the investigation moves forward, it's gonna [sic] be important for all of us, including, uh, our legislatures, uh, to see what we can do, uh, to make sure that when individuals decide that they want to do somebody harm, uh, we're making it a little harder for them to do it, uh, because right now, it's just too easy, uh, and, uh, uh, you know, we're, we're gonna [sic] have ta [sic], I think, search ourselves as a society to, to make sure that we can, uh, take basic steps that, uh, would make it harder, uh, not impossible, uh, for individuals, uh, to get access to weapons." [84446, 84539, 84540]

While leftists express outrage over a *New York Post* cover that declares, "Muslim Killers," other Americans are outraged by leftists mocking those (especially Republican presidential candidates) who are praying for the victims' families and a *New York Daily News* headline that proclaims, "God Isn't Fixing This." (The newspaper's editor in chief Jim Rich later laughably claims its front page "is not, in any way, shape or form, condemning prayer or religion..." The next day the newspaper's cover blames the NRA for the terrorist shootings. In the space of two days the leftist rag mocks those who "cling" to both "guns and religion.") Disgraced former CBS anchor Dan Rather calls for more gun control legislation, stating, "it is not enough to say our prayers are with the victims." (Those who argue that "prayers are not enough" seem to be incapable of comprehending that people are capable of both praying and acting. As far as gun control, there are already more than 23,000 gun-related laws on the books in the United States—most of which are routinely violated by criminals. Rather apparently believes that having 23,001 laws would make a difference.) [84508, 85399]

The Washington Post's Gene Weingarten tweets, "Dear 'thoughts and prayers' people: Please shut up and slink away. You are the problem, and everyone knows it." (Weingarten had no such response when Hillary Clinton tweeted, "Our prayers are with the people of France tonight" after the terrorist attacks in Paris on November 13.) [84514]

According to WashingtonPost.com, "Rabia Chaudry kept her 7-year-old daughter home from her private Islamic school in Maryland on Thursday, fearing anti-Muslim backlash from Wednesday's massacre nearly 3,000 miles away in San Bernardino, Calif." (The *Post* does not explain why Chaudry feared anti-Muslim backlash *at a private Islamic school*, where all the students are Muslims.) Chaudry, a lawyer at the leftist New America Foundation, says, "I think we are all feeling exhausted and very vulnerable. I'm angry at those people who did this attack. And I'm angry at how this is being politicized. Everything boils down to, 'We should fear Muslims. And they shouldn't be here.'" The *Post* whines, "Muslims said they are bracing for an even more toxic climate in which Americans are increasingly suspicious of Muslims." (That, of course, is the natural result of more than 20,000 Islamist terrorist attacks worldwide since September 11, 2001. If those attacks were perpetrated by Buddhist monks people would necessarily be suspicious of Buddhist monks.) [84642]

Deranged House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) protests moments of silence in the House of Representatives, telling reporters, "Gun violence is a crisis of epidemic proportion in our nation. We've had far too many moments of silence on the floor of the House. And while it is right to respectfully acknowledge the losses, we can no longer remain silent. What gives us the right to hold moments of silence when we do nothing to act upon the cause of the grief?" (Whether Pelosi will hold her breath until the Second Amendment is repealed is not known.) [84613] Newsmax.com writes, "San Bernardino gunman Syed Rizwan Farook had become increasingly radicalized, CNN reports, and had been in touch by phone and via social media with more than one international terrorism subject under investigation by the FBI. Authorities did not dismiss other issues—including that Farook had a workplace grievance—as additional motives. ... 'They came prepared to do what they did, as if they were on a mission,' San Bernardino Police Chief Jarrod Burguan said. At a press conference today, the chief said there is no doubt the shooting had 'some degree' of planning. 'Nobody gets up and does this,' he said, adding there were too many weapons, ammunition and other materials amassed for the mass shooting to be spontaneous." [84472]

ABC's Brian Ross, desperate to downplay radical Islam as the motive for the terrorists, says, "Well, it appears to be a kind of hybrid, uh, workplace jihad. He [Syed Farook] had issues, he targeted his co-workers... He appears to be an all-American boy. He enjoyed snowboarding, working on cars, and guns—he was very comfortable with the gun culture." (The "boy" was 28 years old, and while he may have enjoyed snowboarding, he also enjoyed memorizing the Qur'an—which hardly made him "all-American." Ross' reference to "gun culture" is clearly intended as a criticism of *American* gun culture. Ross' shameless implication is that Farook was a "nice guy" who was angered by co-workers and turned violent by the NRA.) [84547, 84573]

CNN's Erin Burnett, looking for an excuse for the shootings, addresses former FBI profiler Jim Clemente: "...I just have to ask you, could there be something else, anything else, that could have explained her [Tashfeen Malik's] involvement? Something like a postpartum psychosis?" Clemente somehow refrains from laughing, and responds, "Well, postpartum psychosis, in the cases that I've seen of it, really is typically internal. I mean, the violence goes internally or within the family. The kids are most likely going to be the targets of that or the person suffering from it. So, I don't see this as a common case of postpartum psychosis. This is something much more related to extremism." [84609]

Also on CNN, Fareed Zakarias says, "Look, for some of this, for this particular case, there is a terrorism angle that you've been exploring, but in general the stories of gun violence really do startle, alarm, um, the rest of the world in a way that's difficult to completely explain. It's more than anything else—the rest of the world looks at this as the one element of America that they find truly baffling because, you know, there are other elements, the religious, the other industrialized countries, but that they understand because they used to be more religious themselves, there are other countries that are more religious [sic]. With guns, the United States is essentially alone in the world. There is no other country that has anything approaching the violence we do. The only country that comes close is Yemen, which is essentially a war zone. So, they look at this and they really can't understand it, um, and they don't understand how we put up with it." [84622, 84623]

Zakaria is lying, or is incredibly ignorant. The United States is hardly the most violent nation in the world. He apparently knows nothing of Honduras, Venezuela, El Salvador, Jamaica, Swaziland, Guatemala, Columbia, South Africa, Brazil, and Panama—the 10

nations which, previously noted, have the highest firearm-related death rates. Zakaria also falsely claims that "European countries, roughly speaking, have 1/20th to 1/25th the amount of violence that we have." At RedState.com Leon H. Wolf writes, "There's of course a major problem with this claim—it's absolute BS. I mean, it's not even close to being correct. There is literally no country in Europe for which Zakaria's claim is correct, much less is it true of 'most European countries' as he claims. ...[W]hen viewed in terms of crime *rate*, which is to say, crime per 1,000 persons, then generally speaking the following two truths bear out: 1. The United States has between 3-5 times more homicides than most European countries; and 2. Overall, most European countries have between 2-5 times more overall crime than the United States. ...France, mentioned specifically by Zakaria, has almost twice as much crime per 1,000 but about 1/4th the murders per 1,000." WeaselZippers.com posts the names of some of the Twitter accounts Syed Farook had been following: The Syrian Revolution Network; Palestine; The Islamic Ummah; Islam; WhyIslam; MuslimAmericanSociety; CAIR-SFBA; CAIR National; and an individual named Safeen. [84509]

Newsmax.com reports, "Federal agents have discovered preliminary evidence that San Bernardino gunman Syed Rizwan Farook was in contact by phone and social media with people who had been the subject of a terrorism probe by the FBI, according to multiple law enforcement sources." [84510]

On Facebook, CV Claverie writes, "The islamic terrorist who took the Life of my friend & bro in Christ, Nicholas Thalasinos, on yesterday in San Bernadino [sic; Bernardino], CA, had been threatening him, telling him that islam will rule the world, Christians and Jews deserve to die; and that he (Nicholas) was going to die. But, they aren't reporting that in the 'news'... I wonder why..." Jihad Watch's Robert Spencer asks, "Did Thalasinos report these threats to police? If so, what did they do—ascribe Thalasinos' concerns to 'Islamophobia'? Or did he not report them, and if not, did he fear charges of 'racism'? Farook told a Jewish coworker: 'You will never see Israel.'" [84682, 84683, 84684, 84699]

Attorney General Loretta Lynch says of the San Bernardino shootings, "Violence like this has no place in this country and in this nation. [For the record, this country and this nation are the same.] This is not what we stand for, this is not what we do, this is not what we work for. It's not what we live for, it antithetical to our values. [Why Lynch finds it necessary to point out that mass murder is not what the nation stands for is not clear.] ...[W]e're at a point where these issues have come together, really like never before in law enforcement thought, and in our nation's history and it gives us a wonderful opportunity and a wonderful moment to really make significant change." (Some might have thought that Rahm Emanuel's infamous remark, "Never let a crisis go to waste," could not be outdone, but Lynch calling a mass killing "a wonderful moment to really make significant change" moves him to second place.) [84513] On MSNBC Congresswoman Loretta Sanchez (D-CA) claims, "[M]ulti-automatic round weapons [sic] are easily available, even though not in California, but they can cross the state line, as you know." (There is no such thing as a "multi-automatic round weapon." Sanchez is typical of many gun-ignorant people on the political left. As an example, they often use the term "assault weapon," which is essentially a meaningless term. Any weapon can be used in an "assault." Many on the left believe it means an "automatic" weapon, like a machine gun, but those have been outlawed since the 1930s, except for museums and exotic gun collectors who have to follow incredibly strict rules and regulations to obtain them.) Not surprisingly, program host Tamron Hall does not challenge Sanchez's statement—probably because she is as ignorant of weapons as is the Congresswoman. [84520, 84521, 84651]

At NYPost.com Harry Litman reveals that the Associated Press filmed Palestinians in the West Bank celebrating the 9/11 terrorist attacks, but "the actual footage has never been seen, because [the AP] has kept it under wraps for the last 14 years. ... On the afternoon of Sept. 11, 2001, thousands of jubilant Palestinians took to the streets, chanting 'God is great,' firing automatic weapons and handing out sweets to passers-by. The largest demonstration took place in Nablus in the West Bank, where some 3,000 marchers danced and cheered as guerrillas fired assault rifles and grenades into the air. Many journalists were on the scene, but they were forcibly detained in a hotel by armed Palestinian security forces to prevent coverage of the rally. One cameraman—a freelance AP reporter—nevertheless managed to film some of the celebration. The next day, members of Tanzim, the military arm of Fatah, physically threatened the cameraman and warned AP not to air the material. ... The threat worked. After initially declining to confirm the incident, the AP bureau chief in Jerusalem acknowledged the intimidation and the news organization's capitulation to it. ...Fourteen years later, the historic footage from 9/11 remains inaccessible to public view. ... These searing images belong in the public record, not in the closed video vault of a cowed news agency." [84598, 84599]

Defense Secretary Ashton Carter announces that the military will open combat positions to women. He says, "There will be no exemptions. To succeed in our mission of national defense, we cannot afford to cut ourselves off from half the country's talents and skills. We have to take full advantage of every individual who can meet our standards." If Lynch wants to prosecute "violent talk," she should send federal agents to radical mosques. Those who believed Lynch would not be as atrocious as her predecessor, Eric Holder, were mistaken.) While Lynch is worried about criticism of Muslims, it is worth noting that, according to the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program, there were 6,727 victims of hate crimes in 2014. "Of the 1,140 victims of anti-religious hate crimes: 56.8 percent were victims of crimes motivated by their offenders' anti-Jewish bias. 16.1 percent were victims of anti-Islamic (Muslim) bias." Meanwhile, FBI statistics show that anti-Semitic attacks are far more common than attacks against innocent Muslims. Yet you never see articles about that." [84643, 84644]

Former Congressman Joe Walsh (R-IL) responds to Attorney General Loretta Lynch's threat to prosecute those who engage in "anti-Muslim rhetoric" that "edges toward violence." Walsh states, "What the hell does that mean? I have a 1st Amendment right, Ms. Lynch, to say whatever I want about Muslims. You want to try and prosecute me for what I say? I dare you. Here goes: Most Muslims around the world are terrorists, support terrorism, and/or support Sharia Law. They are our enemy. I don't want them in America. Any Muslim that [who] won't assimilate should get the hell out of America. Any Muslim [who] is a terrorist or supports terrorism should be killed. If 'Moderate' Muslims don't speak out against terrorism, they are our enemy and we should call them out and kick them out of this country. I hope there is a backlash against Muslims because Islam, as practiced by most Muslims, is not a religion of peace, and all of us who do live in peace should do whatever we can to defeat Islam. There Ms. Lynch. As an American, I have a right to say everything I just did. And I will continue to speak the truth about Islam in the hopes that others will wake up to this truth and do what we can to defeat this evil in our midst. Is that 'anti-Muslim rhetoric' that 'edges toward violence.' Go ahead and prosecute me. I dare you." [84625, 84673, 84698, 84709]

Former New York governor George Pataki tweets, "We must declare war on radical Islam. Loretta Lynch, I'm not edging toward violent speech, I'm declaring we kill them. Go ahead, arrest me." [84696, 84697]

While Loretta Lynch worries about anti-Muslim backlash that will probably never come, Muslims do not hesitate to send threatening messages over the Internet. Among them: "That awkward moment you're a kaffir [non-Muslim] and you're celebrating a shirk [blasphemous] holiday/drinking/singing and you're dead." "Obama said he contained IS. Yet he alerts US citizens from Worldwide travel! But, they don't need to travel to die!" "Pure happiness is seeing this [a photo of U.S. flag-draped coffins]." "California, we have already arrived with our soldiers... decide how to be your end, with knife or bomb." "We announce the martyrdom of Mujahid Sayed Farouk and his wife Tashfeen Malik after completing mission." "Which one kafir leader do you want to be executed first..." [84681] CAIR-LA's Hussam Ayloush blames the United States for the terrorism in San Bernardino, telling CNN, "Let's not forget that some of our own foreign policy, as Americans, as the west, have fueled that extremism." U.S. support for repressive regimes, says Ayloush, "push people over to the edge. Then they become extremists. We are partly responsible. Terrorism is a global problem, not a Muslim problem. And the solution has to be global. Everyone has a role in it." [84637, 84668]

Journalists gain access to the rented townhouse of the two San Bernardino terrorists. Dozens of reporters and their cameramen enter and issue live reports. The unconscionable act will give lawyers a justification for getting evidence thrown out of court if it is determined that any other individuals aided the terrorists. (The landlord initially says he didn't give anyone permission to enter his property, but later admits that he had. Such an action is unprecedented, and will lead many to wonder if there is motive for giving the media access to the property.) [84556, 84601, 84606, 84614, 84616, 84640, 84708]

David Bowdich, assistant director of the FBI's Los Angeles office, states, "As of today, based on the information and the facts as we know them, we are investigating this horrific crime as an act of terrorism." (That, of course, should have been obvious from the beginning considering the weapons used, the stockpile of ammunition, and the pipe bombs in the vehicle and home of the attackers. In addition, the killers smashed their cellphones and hard drives and deleted email accounts.) [84595, 84638, 84639]

Fox News' Peter Doocy asks White House press secretary Josh Earnest, "Does the President really think that common sense gun laws would deter terrorists?" Earnest replies, "Yes. [Obama] believes that passing common sense gun laws that makes [sic] it harder for people with bad intentions to get guns makes the country safer." Doocy follows up: "[Obama] thinks that when there are potentially two terrorists sitting around planning a mass murder they may call it off because ...Obama has put in place common sense gun laws?" Earnest: "Well Peter, we're still learning of the precise motives of the individuals who carried out this heinous act of violence yesterday. One thing we do know is the four firearms they were wielding were legally purchased under the laws in place now. That's a fact. So, that might lead some to conclude that we should have made it a little harder for them." (Earnest is mistaken. The weapons are illegal in California. In addition, the terrorists illegally modified the weapons. Further, they assembled pipe bombs—which are obviously not legal. Murder is also against the law, a fact which seems not to have bothered the terrorists or occurred to Earnest.) [84666]

At Townhall.com Christine Rousselle reports, "Bennetta Betbadal, one of the 14 people killed in the San Bernardino shooting, fled Islamic radicalism and Christian persecution in her home country of Iran. ...Betbadal and her husband, who are Roman Catholics, were married in 1997 and had three children." Also at Townhall.com, Katie Pavlich reports that "leaders of the ISIS terror attacks in Paris last month engaged in recruitment for their cause at a Hungarian refugee camp." Meanwhile, "The Obama administration has made it clear they have no plans to reconsider policies allowing 10,000 Syrian refugees into the United States over the next two years, despite FBI and Homeland Security officials saying the vetting process is incomplete. ISIS has publicly declared they will use the refugee crisis to smuggle fighters into western nations to carry out attacks." [84603, 84604, 84605]

Several House Democrats attend mosque prayer services to show solidarity with Muslims. [84611, 84612]

At NewsWithViews.com J. B. Williams argues that Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) is not only not a natural born citizen and therefore could not legally serve as president, he may not even be eligible to serve in the Senate. Williams writes, "In investigating Cruz eligibility for the Oval Office, his eligibility for the US Senate came into question... The Constitutional requirements for the US Senate are as follows: 'No Person shall be a Senator who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty Years, and been nine Years a Citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State for which he shall be chosen.' At 42 years old [when elected] in 2012, Ted Cruz obviously met the age requirement of 30 years. However, he also needed to meet the requirement of at least 'nine Years a Citizen of the United States.' As the Constitution states, one cannot be just an 'Inhabitant of that State for which he shall be chosen.' ... Ted Cruz issued his Canadian Birth Certificate as evidence of being 'born a citizen of Canada.' ... The next piece of authenticated evidence released by Ted Cruz is a Canadian document proving that he remained a legal citizen of Canada until renouncing that citizenship in May of 2014, which means, he was still a legal citizen of Canada in 2012 when he ran for, was elected and took the oath of office for the US Senate." "...[T]here is no evidence to suggest that the parent or parents of Ted Cruz ever filed a CRBA [Consular Report of Birth Abroad of a Citizen of the United States of America] form with the U.S. Government in or around 1970, which is why Ted Cruz released a copy of his Canadian citizenship records and not any U.S. citizenship records. At present, all FOIA (Freedom of Information Act) requests filed in search of any U.S. citizenship documents to confirm the true official U.S. citizenship status of Ted Cruz have been denied access. All citizenship records for Ted Cruz are sealed unless and until Ted Cruz agrees to allow any such records to be released by either U.S. or Canadian agencies." (Cruz was born in Alberta, Canada to a Cuban-citizen father and a U.S.-citizen mother. Even if one argues that Cruz was born with dual citizenship (Canadian and U.S.) or even triple citizenship (Cuban, Canadian, and U.S.) and can legally serve as a U.S. Senator, he most certainly is *not* a natural born citizen parents. As mentioned often in this *Timeline*, Obama, Cruz, Marco Rubio, Bobby Jindal, and Rick Santorum are *not* natural born citizens because they do not meet those requirements.) [84559, 84567, 86061]

According to the Department of Labor, the economy added 211,000 (mostly part-time) jobs in November, down from 298,000 in October. The unemployment rate remains at 5.0 percent. Americans not in the labor force is 94,446,000; the labor force participation rate is 62.5 percent. Politico.com observes, "The 211,000 jobs... are more than enough for the Federal Reserve to raise interest rates later this month—a move that could imperil Hillary Clinton's hopes of winning the White House if the Fed inadvertently triggers an economic slowdown." PJMedia.com reports that the guns used by terrorists Syed Farook and Tashfeen Malik may have been "purchased legally [not necessarily by Farook and Malik], but they were not used legally and in fact, they were modified in violation of the California firearms laws, says the ATF." According to WSJ.com, "While they were originally sold legally, with magazine locking devices commonly known as bullet buttons, the rifles were subsequently altered in different ways to make them more powerful, according to Meredith Davis, a special agent with the ATF. The Smith & Wesson rifle was changed [modified] in an attempt to enable it [to] fire in fully automatic mode, while the DPMS weapon was modified to use a large-capacity magazine, she said. Those alterations made the weapons unlawful under California's ban on assault weapons, which bans guns with magazines that can detach for quick reloading. The state legally allows the sale and ownership of assault weapons that have fixed magazines." (Farook reportedly purchased the handguns, but he obtained the rifles—perhaps illegally—from a friend.) David S. Chesley and Muhammad Abuershaid, attorneys for the family of Syed Farook, claim Tashfeen Malik "was never involved in the shooting. ...She's probably about 90 pounds, so it's unlikely she could even carry a weapon or wear some type of a vest or do any of this. ...It just doesn't make sense for these two to be able to act like some kind of Bonnie and Clyde or something. It's just ridiculous. It doesn't add up. It doesn't add up, the military skills to carry out something like this, really. I'm just telling you straight out—it doesn't make sense. ...There was nothing to show that [Malik] was extreme at all, and [Farook] was a normal guy, in every sense of the word ...I don't know what can come in, but there's more information we haven't received yet." [84617, 84690]

Chesley discredits Malik's allegiance to ISIS on Facebook, telling reporters, "All there is thus far is some nebulous thing that somebody looked at something on Facebook. I mean, any one of us may have looked at something on Facebook. It doesn't mean we believe in it. I've checked out a Britney Spears post and I hate Britney Spears music." [84675]

The *Daily Mail* reports, "The woman who took part in the ISIS-inspired San Bernardino massacre is linked to her native country's most notorious radical mosque, American officials believe. Sources have told Daily Mail Online that US officials handed over information to their Pakistani counterparts about links between Tashfeen Malik and the Red Mosque in Islamabad. The mosque is infamous for its links to violence and authorities in Pakistan are now considering taking action against its preacher, Maulana Abdul Aziz, after the disclosures by US officials." [84691, 84692, 84695]

Al Jazeera America complains to ABC News after it posts a photograph of terrorist Tashfeen Malik without a burqa, claiming it is "disrespectful to her culture." (Al Jazeera should be reminded that murdering 14 people because they do not follow Islam is disrespectful of American cultural. If Islam is a peaceful religion, and if Malik defied Islam by committing mass murder, then Muslims should not be outraged that her image was shown in the media. That she remains worthy of their respect is telling.) MSNBC's lisping leftist, Melissa Harris Perry, whines that the photo of Malik sends the signal that "this is what terrorism looks like." (No, it merely shows the face of that particular murder, just as the news reports about the 1995 Oklahoma City bombing showed the face of Timothy McVeigh.) [84619, 84710, 84738, 84819, 84820]

JudicialWatch.org reports, "Five young Middle Eastern men were apprehended by the U.S. Border Patrol this week in an Arizona town situated about 30 miles from the Mexican border, law enforcement and other sources told Judicial Watch [JW]. Border Patrol agents spotted the men crossing a ranch property in the vicinity of Amado, which is located about 35 miles south of Tucson and has a population of 275. Two of the Middle Eastern men were carrying stainless steel cylinders in backpacks, JW's sources say, alarming Border Patrol officials enough to call the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) for backup. A multitude of federal agents descended on the property and the two men carrying the cylinders were believed to be taken into custody by the FBI." [84621, 84671, 84734]

"Only three of the men's names were entered in the Border Patrol's E3 reporting system, which is used by the agency to track apprehensions, detention hearings and removals of illegal immigrants. E3 also collects and transmits biographic and biometric data including fingerprints for identification and verification of individuals encountered at the border. The other two men were listed as 'unknown subjects,' which is unheard of, according to a JW federal law enforcement source. 'In all my years I've never seen that before,' a veteran federal law enforcement agent told JW. ...Special Agent Remus told JW that there is no record of this week's incident in Amado and that he knew nothing about it. JW also put in a call to DHS headquarters, but received no response. In the last year JW has broken a number of stories involving serious terrorist threats on the southern border that were disputed on the record by various Obama administration official." (In other words, Judicial Watch believes the Obama administration is keeping some border incidents secret.) [84621]

Despite the best efforts of the GOP establishment and the mainstream media to stop him, Donald Trump's lead in a CNN/ROC poll surges to 36 percent. He is followed by Ted Cruz (16 percent), Ben Carson (14), and Marco Rubio (12). All other candidates have less than 5 percent. Jeb "establishment choice" Bush has a mere 3 percent. [84584, 84587]

TheGatewayPundit.com reports, "A wounded veteran whom Donald Trump pledged to help has seen quick results since the first update announced by the Trump campaign in October. Within two weeks of meeting Trump, the VA resolved back pay and medical records issues for the veteran. U.S. Army First Sgt. Todd Landen (Ret.) spoke to Trump, the leading Republican presidential candidate, on October 27 at a Sioux City, Iowa campaign rally about problems he was having with the Veterans Administration. Trump pledged to help Landen saying, ... 'As president I can guarantee it. As Trump I can say, 'I'll probably be able to pull it off anyway.' Because they know it won't stop…' The Trump campaign announced the next day that phone calls had already been made on behalf of Landen." [84591]

In Chicago's northwest suburbs, Township High School District 211 caves in to federal demands (in order to not lose federal funding) and will allow a "transgender" student to use the girls' locker room and shower facilities even though he is male. According to DailyCaller.com, "The student will use a separate, semi-private area in the girls' locker room of his public high school. The settlement between the U.S. Department of Education and the school district—the largest in Illinois—provides that the male student can use girls' locker rooms as long as he changes in changing stations described as private…The feds have also deigned to allow the district to install curtains in the girls' locker room for use by any actual, biological girls who want privacy. The district must also arrange for the male student to have access to female bathroom and changing facilities at all district-sponsored activities off-campus activities and must create a 'support team' for this one student to ensure he is happy." One parent comments, "I'm not intolerant, and I'm not a bigot. People have the right in this country to live their lives the way they see fit, and I respect that. [But] When it starts infringing on other people's rights, that's when it becomes a problem." [84615]

Breitbart.com reports, "A resolution that would put Texas secession on the ballot for Republican primary voters has cleared its first hurdle by passing the Republican Party of Texas' Resolution Committee. The committee met during a regular meeting of the State Republican Executive Committee (SREC). ...Six people spoke for the resolution and no one spoke against it. The resolution passed by a vote of 7 to 4. As passed, the wording of the resolution is as follows: 'If the federal government continues to disregard the Constitution and the sovereignty of the State of Texas, the State of Texas and its people should reassert its prior status as an independent nation.' ... The committeewoman who presented the resolution, Tanya Robertson, SD11, said Texas independence should be put before the voters because Texans are dissatisfied with Washington D.C. representatives and excessive federal government spending." [84618, 84620]

In attendance at the White House Holiday Reception is Black Lives Matter agitator/activist DeRay McKesson. (Earlier in the day Attorney General Loretta Lynch tweeted to him, "Great meeting with you today. Thank you for your work on this." By "this" she means the Black Lives Matter movement.) [84661, 84662]

On The Kelly File, Charles Krauthammer observes, "I think one of the reasons for the true widespread and deep anxiety in the country, insecurity—reflected for example in the increase in purchase of firearms—is that people feel that the authorities, particularly [Obama], the White House, the ultimate authorities, simply are clueless about what's happening. Either they had no idea what to do about it [radical Islam] and thus deny its existence or its importance or its severity, or that [Obama] truly doesn't believe that this is a major threat to the security of his own people. A similar incident reportedly also occurred in Columbia, Missouri the previous evening. In addition, dozens of propane tanks have been stolen from the area. (Setting aside innocent reasons for buying 60 cell phones, there are three other possible reasons: 1. Using pre-paid devices to communicate with other terrorists without being easily traced. 2. Using the phones to detonate bombs. 3. Trying to get questioned and arrested, after which an "Islamophobic discrimination" lawsuit is filed—as was done by "clock boy," Ahmed Mohamed. Of course, potential terrorists may also be "prodding": engaging in "dry run" suspicious activities to see what authorities might do or not do.) [85112, 85123, 85232, 85305, 85461]

The New York Times runs an anti-gun editorial on page one. (The newspaper had not had a page one editorial since 1920.) The *Times* writes, "It is a moral outrage and a national disgrace that civilians can legally purchase weapons designed specifically to kill people with brutal speed and efficiency. [Perhaps the *Times* knows of weapons that shoot bullets slooooowly.] These are weapons of war, barely modified and deliberately marketed as tools of macho vigilantism and even insurrection. America's elected leaders offer prayers for gun victims and then, callously and without fear of consequence, reject the most basic restrictions on weapons of mass killing, as they did on Thursday. [Senate Republicans voted against prohibiting gun sales to people on the terrorist watch list—*because the list is full of names of people who should not be on the list.*] They distract us with arguments about the word terrorism. The *Times* writes, "No right is unlimited and immune from reasonable regulation. [Perhaps the editorial board would feel differently if restrictions on the *First* Amendment were being proposed.] Certain kinds of weapons, like the slightly modified combat rifles used in California, and certain kinds of ammunition, must be outlawed for civilian ownership. [The San Bernardino terrorists *illegally* modified their weapons. The *Times* is demanding that something *already illegal* should be made illegal.] It is possible to define those guns in a clear and effective way and, yes, it would require Americans who own those kinds of weapons to give them up for the good of their fellow citizens. [The *Times* does not bother to define those guns—because it knows it is a next-to-impossible task. The term 'assault weapon' is meaningless. Automatic weapons are already illegal. That one rifle has a wooden stock and another 'looks scary' because it is black has nothing to do with how they perform.] What better time than during a presidential election to show, at long last, that our nation has retained its sense of decency?" Pamela Geller reports, "Two brothers who attended the same Southern California mosque, The Dar Al Uloom Al Islamiyah of America mosque, as the Muslim gunman who killed 14 people say that Syed Rizwan Farook was a devout Muslim who showed up to pray *every day*. Nizaam Ali and Rahemaan Ali said Thursday that Syed Rizwan Farook had been a constant presence at the mosque for two years and had recently memorized the Quran. One who memorizes the Quran is [called] a hafiz. ... There have been over 26,000 deadly Islamic attacks since 9/11—each one with a mosque behind it and the imprimatur of a Muslim cleric. What are we doing to monitor these hotbeds of jihad activity? Every mosque with links to terror must be thoroughly investigated and monitored. Several surveys have shown that 80% of mosques in the U.S. teach hatred of infidels and the necessity to replace the Constitution with sharia. In 1998, Sheikh Muhammad Hisham Kabbani, a Sufi leader, visited 114 mosques in the United States. Then he gave testimony before a State Department Open Forum in January 1999, and asserted that 80% of American mosques taught the 'extremist ideology.'" [84689]

DailyCaller.com reports, "Rafia Farook, the mother of San Bernardino terrorist Syed Rizwan Farook, is an active member of the Islamic Circle of North America (ICNA), a Muslim organization that promotes the establishment of a caliphate and has ties to a radical Pakistani political group called Jamaat-e-Islami. Farook's affiliation with ICNA was revealed on Friday when MSNBC and other new outlets scoured the Farooks' apartment in Redlands, Cal. An MSNBC reporter found a certificate of appreciation presented to Rafia Farook last summer by ICNA's sisters' wing." RedState.com notes, "According to Wikipedia, the headliners at ICNA's 2007 convention were Anwar al-Awlaki (since deceased by a Predator) and Umar Farouk Abdulmutallab, the guy who tried to blow up an airliner on Christmas Day, 2009, with explosives in his drawers. Two members of the New York chapter were found guilty of war crimes in Bangladesh and sentenced to death in absentia. The Pakistani Islamist group, Jamaat-e-Islami, has claimed that ICNA is its North American face." [84721, 84722, 84633, 84775, 84848]

The White House announces that Obama will deliver an address to the nation (on Sunday night, December 6, at 8 p.m. Washington, D.C. time) to "provide an update on the

ongoing investigation ...in San Bernardino" and discuss "the steps our government is taking to fulfill his highest priority: keeping the American people safe." Obama "will also discuss the broader threat of terrorism, including the nature of the threat, how it has evolved, and how we will defeat it." (Obama is apparently taking the issue seriously, as he cancels his Saturday golf game to meet with his national security advisors—although he did attend the White House holiday party Friday evening. One Twitter user predicts Obama's speech will be "5% terrorism, 50% gun control, 45% Pro-Muslim.") [84654, 84657, 84658, 84700, 84711, 84712]

In a London subway station, a man with a knife shouts, "This is for Syria, my Muslim brothers!" and attacks several commuters. According to the BBC, Muhaydin Mire was "arrested after being Tasered by police. One victim suffered serious knife injuries while two others received minor injuries." [84654, 84655, 84685, 84822]

Obama issues a statement on Planned Parenthood's "Day of Solidarity." He states, in part, "No woman, no American, should fear violence or intimidation when seeking health care, or assisting others in obtaining treatment. We are a people who stand up for the rights of women to make their own decisions about their health. We are a people who stand up for the rights of every single person, no matter who they are, no matter what they look like, or where they come from to choose their own path and make of their what they will [sic], free from fear or intimidation. That is who we are as Americans—and it's something we will never allow anyone to take away from us. May God bless those we've lost, and may he continue to bless the United States of America." (By "those we've lost" Obama means the three people killed at a Planned Parenthood facility in Colorado Springs on November 27—not the tens of millions of babies Planned Parenthood has aborted.) The despicable *New York Daily News* sinks even lower, with the vile Linda Stasi writing that there were only 13 innocent people killed in the San Bernardino terrorist attack. She decides that one of the 14, Nicholas Thalasinos, deserved to die because he "was a radical Born Again Christian/Messianic Jew" and "an anti-government, anti-Islam, pro-NRA, rabidly anti-Planned Parenthood kinda guy." [has] never been like this before" "its [sic] going to come he will ban guns.. a civil uproar will happen and he will invoke marshal law and stay in power.." [84713]

On *Justice With Judge Jeanine*, Judge Jeanine Pirro says, "The single deadliest terror attack on U.S. soil since 9/11 has happened. *They're here*. And it's time... to stop pussyfooting around, time to stop this politically incorrect nonsense worrying about other people's feelings, pull out all the stops, and start fighting for the survival of this country and our way of life. *You need to make a plan*, how you're going to protect yourself, your family, and your kids. And this is *not about politics*. It's about being safe. It's about *surviving*. The plan? Number one: *Get a gun*. Buy one legally, learn how to shoot it, and be primed to use it. And I don't care if you get a long gun, a handgun, a revolver, a semi-automatic—get whatever gun you can handle. And don't let *anyone* talk you out of it. But officials said the other two firearms, which are modified 'assault-style' weapons, had been purchased by an unidentified third party, which they believe to be Marquez, according to ABC News. The guns were purchased three years ago, according to the Los Angeles Times. In the early hours of Saturday morning, Marquez's Riverside home was raided by the FBI, who allegedly arrived in search of explosives." [84701, 84702, 84715, 84781, 85234]

TimesofIsrael.com reports, "Syed Farook, father of San Bernardino terrorist Syed Rizwan Farook, has described his son as negatively 'obsessed' with Israel. In an interview with Italian daily La Stampa, Farook said that he once tried to console his son by promising him that Israel would not exist in another two years because 'China, Russia and America will bring the Jews back to Ukraine.' In Sunday's La Stampa report, Farook said, 'My son said that he shared [ISIS leader Abu Bakr] Al Baghdadi's ideology and supported the creation of the Islamic State. He was also obsessed with Israel.'" (The elder Farook does not explain why he did not report his son to the authorities once he learned he supported ISIS.) [84703, 84704, 84705, 84750, 84814]

At WND.com Leo Hohmann reports, "A young man who came to Minnesota as a 'refugee' from Somalia has been linked to Syed Farook, the shooter who, along with his jihadist wife, killed 14 Americans in San Bernardino less than a week ago. Fox News contributor Rod Wheeler provided a key piece of information about the case, linking the San Bernardino shooters to Mohamed Hassan [or Hasan], a known terrorist recruiter who has been on the FBI radar screen for at least seven years. What Fox did not report, however, is how Hassan ended up in the United States. His family came into the U.S. as refugees from Somalia. The Somali refugee program has been going on for decades and has produced some of America's most feared terrorists, even as the Syrian refugee program grabs most of the headlines. ... Hassan also helped radicalize Elton Simpson, one of the two jihadists who tried to storm into a Prophet Muhammad drawing contest in Garland, Texas, on May 4. Their plans to kill the participants and behead free-speech activist Pamela Geller were foiled by an off-duty cop who engaged them in a gun battle before they could enter the auditorium where Geller was holding the art contest. ...Law enforcement conducting the raid at Syed Farook's apartment in Redlands, California, found evidence tying Syed Farook to Hassan, according to Wheeler's report for Fox." Mohamed Hasan is a known ISIS recruiter from Minneapolis, Minnesota who calls himself "Miski" online. He is probably no longer in the United States, and is believed to have been connected to the failed terrorist attack in Garland, Texas. [84739, 84740]

France holds regional elections. The National Front (FN) party may win more than 30 percent of the national vote, with former President Nicolas Sarkozy's centre-right Republicans in second place, and current President Francois Hollande's Socialist Party in third place. A second round of voting will be held on 13 December. According to the BBC, "FN leader Marine Le Pen, who stood in the northern region of Nord-Pas-de-Calais-Picardie, and her niece Marion Marechal-Le Pen, who stood in Provence-Alpes-Cote d'Azur in the south, both looked to have won more than 40% of the vote, polls predicted, breaking previous records for the party. Marine Le Pen told supporters it was a 'magnificent result' which proved the FN was 'without contest the first party of France.''' On *This Week*, Clinton says she does not use the term "radical Islam" because it "sounds like we are declaring war against a religion. She adds, "Number two, it helps to create this clash of civilizations that is actually a recruiting tool for ISIS and other radical jihadists who use this as a way of saying, 'We are in a war against the West—you must join us.'" At FamilySecurityMatters.org Lawrence Sellin writes, "Barack Hussein Obama is fond of telling Americans, 'that's not who we are,' when admonishing us about not agreeing with his policies. It is Obama and his fellow travelers, who are, in fact, 'not who we are.' The report stands in stark contrast to earlier White House assurances that ISIS had been 'contained' in Iraq and Syria. And it is already spurring changes in how the U.S. grapples with ISIS, these officials said. It's also a tacit admission that coalition efforts so far dropping thousands of bombs and deploying 3,500 U.S. troops as well as other coalition trainers—have been outpaced by ISIS's ability to expand and attract new followers, even as the yearlong coalition air campaign has helped local forces drive ISIS out of parts of Iraq and Syria." "The White House commissioned the intelligence report prior to last month's deadly strikes in Paris, and long before last week's terror attacks in San Bernardino, California, three senior U.S. officials said, speaking on condition of anonymity in order to describe a confidential document and policy changes. It was also commissioned before ...Obama declared ISIS 'contained' in Iraq and Syria—just a day before the Paris attacks—but it was delivered to the White House in the weeks afterward. After reviewing its grim conclusions, Obama asked Secretary of Defense Ash Carter and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Marine Gen. Joseph Dunford to come up with new options to beat the group back." [84762]

From the Oval Office, Obama delivers a brief speech—allegedly to calm fears about the threat of ISIS. (He fails at the task.) Nothing Obama says is new; everything he says is

predictable. ("The threat from terrorism is real, but we will overcome it.") Obama essentially says, "We don't want another war like George W. Bush got us into; I killed Osama bin Laden and decimated al-Qaeda's leadership; we're not at war with Islam; we will continue weak air strikes against ISIS; be nice to Muslims, because most of them are not terrorists; it should not be easy to buy guns." Obama claims he has a four-part program:

"First, our military will continue to hunt down terrorist plotters in any country where it is necessary. In Iraq and Syria, airstrikes are taking out ISIL [ISIS] leaders, heavy weapons, oil tankers, infrastructure. And since the attacks in Paris, our closest allies—including France, Germany, and the United Kingdom—have ramped up their contributions to our military campaign, which will help us accelerate our effort to destroy ISIL." (Those efforts are totally inadequate.) [84729]

"Second, we will continue to provide training and equipment to tens of thousands of Iraqi and Syrian forces fighting ISIL on the ground so that we take away their safe havens. In both countries, we're deploying Special Operations Forces who can accelerate that offensive. We've stepped up this effort since the attacks in Paris, and we'll continue to invest more in approaches that are working on the ground." (The training has been minimal—if not pathetic—and there are few Special Operations Forces in place. There is no indication that any of Obama's "approaches... are working on the ground.") [84729]

"Third, we're working with friends and allies to stop ISIL's operations—to disrupt plots, cut off their financing, and prevent them from recruiting more fighters. Since the attacks in Paris, we've surged intelligence sharing with our European allies. We're working with Turkey to seal its border with Syria. And we are cooperating with Muslim-majority countries—and with our Muslim communities here at home—to counter the vicious ideology that ISIL promotes online." (Turkey is cooperating with ISIS; and border security is a farce. There is no evidence that Muslim communities in the United States are doing anything to counter the jihadist ideology. In fact, it is within those communities that the ideology is spreading.) [84729, 84778]

"Fourth, with American leadership, the international community has begun to establish a process—and timeline—to pursue cease-fires and a political resolution to the Syrian war. Doing so will allow the Syrian people and every country, including our allies, but also countries like Russia, to focus on the common goal of destroying ISIL—a group that threatens us all." (This claim is total nonsense. First, there is no "American leadership" with Obama in the White House. Syrian President Bashar al-Assad is going nowhere, especially since he is now being propped up more strongly by Russia.) [84729]

"This," says Obama, "is our strategy to destroy ISIL." (It is nothing of the sort. It is window dressing designed merely to give the appearance that Obama is doing something when he is not. Let's not forget that freedom is more powerful than fear; that we have always met challenges—whether war or depression, natural disasters or terrorist attacks—by coming together around our common ideals as one nation, as one people. So long as we stay true to that tradition, I have no doubt America will prevail. Thank you. God bless you, and may God bless the United States of America." (America will prevail—but not until after Obama leaves office.) [84729]

After his useless address, Obama dons a tuxedo to attend a Kennedy Center Honors awards event. (Honorees are motion picture producer George Lucas, singer and composer Carol King, actress Rita Moreno, actress Cicely Tyson, and musical conductor Seiji Ozawa. The event will be taped and broadcast on CBS on December 29.) [84725]

On Fox News, leftist Juan Williams applauds Obama for calling the San Bernardino terrorist attack a terrorist attack. (Pamela Geller writes, "He said... nothing. He did finally call San Bernardino call a terrorist attack. That's how low our bar is. We have to applaud this elemental declaration.") [84729]

Geller also observes, "He spoke, of course, about gun control. California has some of the strictest gun control laws in the country. These two jihadists were not on any terror watch lists, so nothing Obama proposes would have stopped [Syed] Farook and [Tashfeen] Malik from getting their bloody hands on weapons. He insisted that he would not send in ground troops. Good. I would not want one American sent to his death because of Obama's crippling and homicidal rules of engagement. We need a wartime president. He spent a lot of time talking about not 'discriminating against Muslims.' A lie. There is no discrimination against Muslims. His tongue flapped on about how 'only a fraction of the billions of Muslims around the world' are not peaceful and don't oppose jihad, when in fact Pew and Gallup and numerous other surveys state otherwise." Jonathan Karl comments, "But I must say, the most interesting line at the end, when he said Muslim-Americans are our friends, they are our neighbors. They are our sports heroes, and yes, the men and women that serve in our military. That a direct message to those that [sic; who] have been vilifying Muslims." [84792]

On PBS, Judy Woodruff gushes, "I was struck when [Obama] said we will destroy the Islamic State. He said we will prevail by being strong and smart." [84792]

At WashingtonTimes.com Charles Hurt notes the beginning of Obama's speech: "On Wednesday, 14 Americans were killed as they came together to celebrate the holidays. They were taken from family and friends who loved them deeply. They were white and black; Latino and Asian; immigrants and American-born." Hurt writes, "Seriously? The worst terrorist attack on American soil since 9/11 and ... Obama is still wearing his racehustler glasses? This is just another opportunity to divvy up his people by the color of their skin? What an embarrassment. No, Mr. President. These were not whites, blacks, Latinos or Asians. That is not why they were killed and has no business being discussed in the present crisis. These were Americans. And they were enjoying their freedom peaceably at a holiday party in the most powerful country on earth that stands as this world's greatest hope for religious freedom. That, Mr. President, is why those 14 Americans were killed. You are the ONLY person who looked at them and saw race. It is truly amazing the lack of seriousness and cynical political gamesmanship President Obama brings to every facet of being commander in chief. ... And people wonder why real estate developer Donald Trump has risen to such stunning levels of statesmanship in this country. Well, this is why. Because Donald Trump is, literally, Winston Churchill or Franklin D. Roosevelt compared with this aimless nincompoop." [84804]

In a campaign ad, Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) says, "Under ...Obama and [former Secretary of State Hillary] Clinton the world is more dangerous and America is less safe. If I'm elected to serve as commander-in-chief, we won't cower in the face of evil. America will lead. We'll rebuild our military; we'll kill the terrorists; and every Islamic militant will know, 'If you wage jihad against us, you're signing your death warrant.' And under no circumstances will I ever apologize for America.'' [84742, 84743]

In elections in Venezuela, socialist president Nicolas Maduro's party loses control of the National Assembly, with the opposition coalition—the Democratic Unity Roundtable—winning at least 99 of 167 legislative seats. (The opposition wins despite vote fraud, intimidation, and the murder of at least one candidate.) [84838, 84839]

On December 7 criticism of Obama's address is widespread, especially among GOP presidential candidates. Carly Fiorina tweets, "Vintage Obama: No strategy, no leadership. Politics as usual." Donald Trump: "Is that all there is? We need a new President – FAST!" Senator Rand Paul (R-KY): "The Obama speech was an attempt to turn a necessary discussion on terrorism and national security into an ineffective gun control debate." "Let's be clear: disarming more law abiding citizens will not stop mass murderers and terrorists." Former New York governor George Pataki: "Obama speech was as believable as a hostage video. Pathetic response to the worst attack on US since 9/11." Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC): "...Obama is intentionally misleading the nation about the threat we face from ISIL." "...Obama is also overselling the successes we are having on the battlefield. His strategy will not destroy ISIL and he knows it." Former senator Rick Santorum: "[Obama] solution - 'Congress authorize what I am already doing and restrict law abiding people's right to defend themselves." Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX): "If I am elected President, I will direct the Department of Defense to destroy ISIS." "And I will shut down the broken immigration system that is letting jihadists into our country." "Nothing ... Obama said tonight will assist in either case." [84752, 84753, 84773]

CNN leftist Fareed Zakaria also calls the speech "vintage Obama," but not in the negative way intended by Fiorina. Zakaria says, "Well, I think it was in some ways, it was vintage Obama. He is—I think the way he views it, people like Donald Trump are playing with fire and he is the fireman. He is the guy who's going to douse those flames. He is going be cool, measured, he's going to have an adult conversation about, you know, the steps that are being taken to deal with ISIS, what we should do and what we shouldn't do. It may be too cool for some people." [84851]

Congressman Peter King (R-NY) calls Obama's speech "pitiful" and "a total failure of leadership. ...Nothing [Obama] proposed or spoke about had any relevance or connection to the San Bernardino massacre. Once again he failed to say that our enemy is Islamist terrorism. Nor did he call for increased surveillance of the Muslim community. Instead he tried to raise the phony specter of Islamophobia. The truth is that the Obama policy against ISIS has failed totally and his speech totally failed to address or correct that failure! Nothing he said will calm the fears of the American people." [84774]

Former CBS reporter Bernard Goldberg writes, "I can't imagine that there are many Americans who listened to ...Obama's Oval Office speech on terrorism and when it was over took a deep breath and said, 'Now I feel better.' ...[W]hen it comes to fighting the war on terror, ...Obama doesn't exactly instill confidence. He hasn't even used the term since January 23, 2009—*his fourth day in office*. ...No one will confuse Barack Obama with Harry Truman. Or Franklin Roosevelt. Or Winston Churchill... None of this liberal squeamishness is resonating even with those who once supported Barack Obama. At ConstitutionRising.com Rick Wells writes, "There was nothing contained in [Obama's] speech that we haven't already heard in the four days that have passed since the attack in San Bernardino; the speech was a propaganda tool and nothing more. We could easily have done without it but Obama would have been seen as being missing in action due to the nature of the strike and his complicity in the creation of the situation. It's better politically to serve up the standard helping of tripe, his untrue reaffirmations that what he's doing is working, and to deliver his pronouncements of the wisdom of staying the current dangerous and feckless course." "... The lighting and optics made Obama look unmistakably like a worn-out, watery-eyed, washed-up alcoholic or drug-addict, with a pasty texture to his skin. The liberal American Civil Liberties Union states, "The No Fly List is in the news this week, just in time for the ACLU's argument in federal court on Wednesday in its fiveyear-long challenge to the list's redress process. ... There is no constitutional bar to reasonable regulation of guns, and the No Fly List could serve as one tool for it, but only with major reform. As we will argue to a federal district court in Oregon this Wednesday, the standards for inclusion on the No Fly List are unconstitutionally vague, and innocent people are blacklisted without a fair process to correct government error. Our lawsuit seeks a meaningful opportunity for our clients to challenge their placement on the No Fly List because it is so error-prone and the consequences for their lives have been devastating. ... We filed the suit in June 2010 on behalf of 10 U.S. citizens and permanent residents who the government banned from flying to or from the U.S. or over American airspace. (Three more people later joined the suit.) Our clients, among them four U.S. military veterans, were never told why they were on the list or given a reasonable opportunity to get off it. Some were stranded abroad, unable to come home. As one response to our lawsuit, the government began to allow Americans to fly home on a 'onetime waiver,' with stringent security precautions." [84881]

"Separately, the government made two basic arguments in its defense of the No Fly List, both of which the court rejected. First, it argued that U.S. persons had no constitutionally protected right to fly. ...Second, the government asserted that national security concerns meant the government couldn't confirm or deny whether people were on the No Fly List, and it couldn't give them reasons or a hearing before a neutral decision-maker. This is absurd as a practical matter and violates due process as a constitutional matter. Practically speaking, people know they are on the No Fly List when they are banned from flying and surrounded—and stigmatized—by security officials publicly at airports. ...Unfortunately, the government's new redress process still falls far short of constitutional requirements. In our case, it refuses to provide meaningful notice of the reasons our clients are blacklisted, the basis for those reasons, and a hearing before a neutral decision-maker. Much as before, our clients are left to guess at the government's case and can't clear their names. That's unconstitutional." [84881]

According to a CNN poll conducted before the terrorist attack in San Bernardino, 64 percent disapprove of Obama's handling of ISIS; 60 percent disapprove on terrorism in general; 61 percent disagree with his refugee policy; 68 percent say the U.S. response to ISIS has not been aggressive enough—including majorities of Democrats, independents, and Republicans. Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson (whose job "experience" consists not of work in the security industry but raising campaign funds for Obama) visits the All Dulles Area Muslim Society mosque in Sterling, Virginia. "...It is also the tradition of this great nation that, ultimately, those who once existed on the margins of society become part of the fabric of our society." Johnson notes that in 1949 his grandfather "was called upon to testify before the House Un-American Activities Committee, to deny he was a member of the Communist Party and defend the patriotism of African Americans. Today his grandson is responsible for the homeland security of this entire nation." (Johnson's grandfather, Charles Johnson, was president of Fisk University, a black college that was infiltrated by communists. One of Obama's favorite authors, communist W. E. B. Du Bois, attended Fisk University. Du Bois, vice chairman of the subversive Council on African Affairs, was a member of the Community Party. In 1959 he received the Soviet Lenin Prize. Obama advisor Valerie Jarrett's father, maternal grandfather, and father-in-law were also hardcore communists, under FBI investigation.) [84840, 84841, 84842, 84843, 84844, 85536]

In Victorville, California, a man named Mohamed Elrawi chases a neighbor with a sword, yelling, "I would die and kill for Allah!" The neighbor is uninjured; Elrawi is arrested; and a search of his house yields "a Koran along with several other items leading investigators to believe Elrawi may be a radicalized Muslim." [84864, 84865, 84876]

At a train station in Osnabrücker, Germany, police are forced to pepper spray a Muslim "refugee" after he kicks and bites them while screaming "Allahu akbar" and the Arabic name for ISIS. (The 23-year-old Moroccan man apparently did not like being asked to show his ticket. Why he is considered a refugee is not clear, as there is no war in Morocco. Of course, welfare benefits in Germany are greater than those provided by Morocco.) [84877, 84878]

Vermont resident H. Brook Paige files a lawsuit against the state, calling for the names of Senators Ted Cruz (R-TX) and Marco Rubio (R-FL) and Louisiana Governor Bobby Jindal not to be allowed on ballots because they are ineligible to serve as president because they are not natural born citizens. (As noted frequently in this *Timeline*, the term natural born citizen has historically meant born on U.S. soil to U.S. citizen parents. Cruz was born in Canada and his father was at that time a citizen of Cuba. Rubio was born in Florida, but both his parents were at that time still citizens of Cuba. Jindal was born in the United States to citizens of India. A mountain of evidence supports the historical meaning of the term, but the courts have refused to rule on the definition of the term. The U.S. Supreme Court refused to even hear *Kerchner v. Obama* because it was afraid to rule against Obama. Simply stated, the Republican establishment allowed the Democrat establishment to nominate Obama because they believed he could be defeated and because they wanted the Democrats to ignore the fact that their rising stars, Rubio, Cruz, and Jindal, were also ineligible to serve as president.) [85926, 85927, 85948] On the floor of the House of Representatives in 1866 Congressman John Bingham (the "Father of the Fourteenth Amendment") stated, "Every human being born within the jurisdiction of the United States of parents not owing allegiance to any foreign sovereignty is, in the language of your Constitution itself, a natural born citizen." (Born "of parents not owing allegiance to any foreign sovereignty" means, of course, born "of two U.S. citizen parents.") The point of the natural born citizen requirement is to reduce the possibility that the president may have divided loyalties or be swayed by any feelings of allegiance to the home country of one or both parents. If the president is born in the United States *and* his parents are U.S. citizens on the day of his birth, the likelihood is greater that the president's loyalties will lie with the United States. If one or both parents are foreigners, the likelihood increases that the president could be influenced by their links to their home country. The Founding Fathers wanted to reduce the likelihood of such influence, and did so by requiring that the president must be more than a *born citizen* (born on U.S. soil); he must be a *natural born citizen* (born on U.S. soil to two U.S. citizen parents).

As an example of the issue of divided loyalties, one could ask whether a President Jindal be able to be fully objective in the event of a conflict between Pakistan and India—when his parents were from India and he may even have relatives living there. Would a President Rubio or a President Cruz be totally objective with regard to a conflict arising between the United States and Cuba? If Syrian refugees enter the United States in 2015 and have a child in Dearborn, Michigan in 2016, what if that child chooses to run for president in 2051 upon reaching age 35? If he were elected without regard to his parents' citizenship, how would he view a conflict between Syria and Israel? Would he choose a policy position based solely on what is best for the United States, or would his policy be swayed by his links to Syria and Islam? Would Americans be comfortable with the child of Syed Farook and Tashfeen Malik running for president of the United States?

The Congressional Budget Office releases a report that estimates that ObamaCare will cost the equivalent to about two million jobs over the next decade. "Some people would choose to work fewer hours; others would leave the labor force entirely or remain unemployed for longer than they otherwise would." [84882, 84883, 84884]

Secretary of State John Kerry states that Obama "has put in place one of the most ambitious national climate action plans in the world. We've doubled our car efficiency and truck—We're requiring our coal-fired power plants have to begin to phase out [sic]." (Kerry is mistaken. The nation has certainly not doubled car and truck efficiency, or miles-per-gallon, since Obama entered the White House—if that is what Kerry means. The federal government has increased the miles-per-gallon *mandate*, but that does not mean the automobile industry will be able to comply. The government can mandate a 500-miles-per-gallon standard, but that does not mean it can be accomplished. Kerry is correct that the Obama administration is essentially forcing coal-fired power plants out of business—but that does not mean their electricity generating capacity can be readily or economically replaced.) [84999] Kerry says, "It's the private sector—the next Elon Musk or Steve Jobs is going to find a way to do battery storage for alternative and renewable energy, or we're going to find a way to burn energy, or maybe this dream of fusion is going to be accelerated and actually have a commercial viability. I don't know the answer, but I have absolute confidence in the ability of capital to move where the signal of the marketplace says 'go'..." (In other words, "Obama and I haven't the faintest idea where more efficient cars or electricity is going to come from. Just trust that when your local power plant is shuttered you will still be able to get electricity from somewhere.") [84999]

DailyCaller.com notes that the web site JebBush.com directs users to the home page of Donald Trump's campaign web site. (The Bush campaign's site is Jeb2016.com—but his staffers were too stupid to also register JebBush.com.) In addition, "Two other domain names that incorporate Bush's name and president already exist, but aren't operated by his campaign. JebBushforPresident.com is a blog about a gay couple who own the website and JebBushforPresident.net is used to oppose Bush's record." [84735]

In a Monmouth University poll of registered voters *who have voted in primary elections in the past*, Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) moves into first place in Iowa, with 24 percent. He is followed by Donald Trump (19), Senator Marco Rubio (17), Ben Carson (13), and Jeb Bush (6). All other candidates have less than 5 percent. [84756, 84757, 84789]

In a CNN/ORC poll of registered voters, Trump leads in Iowa with 33 percent, followed by Cruz (20), Carson (16), Rubio (11), and Bush (4). (The CNN/ORC poll may be more meaningful because Trump may be getting the support of many people who ordinarily do not vote in primary elections—or at all. That is, the "party faithful" may not prefer Trump, but he is attracting the support of many who may not be in that category.) [84796, 84985]

The U.S. Supreme Court refuses to hear an appeal of a case challenging a Highland Park, Illinois ban on various semi-automatic weapons and magazines that hold more than 10 rounds of ammunition. [84794, 84821]

Speaking at the National Defense University, Congressman Mike McCaul (R-TX) says, "I don't want to get into specifics to protect my sources" but "ISIS members in Syria have attempted to exploit it to get into the United States. The U.S. government has information to indicate that individuals tied to terrorist groups in Syria have already attempted to gain access to our country through the U.S. refugee program. To me that's very disturbing." [84801]

Fox News contributors Lieutenant Colonel Ralph Peters and Stacey Dash are suspended for two weeks for on-air remarks. (Peters called Obama a "total pussy." Dash called Obama's speech "an epic fail" and says, "It was like when you have to go to a dinner with your parents but you have a party to go to afterwards; that's what it felt like. He was just trying to get through it because he wanted to go to this event afterwards. You know, I did not feel better, I didn't feel any passion from him... I felt like he could give a shit excuse me. He could [not] care less; he could [not] care less.") Peters says, "I do apologize for giving in to my anger, but... I feel like you know the American people understand where I'm coming from on this. My choice of words was incorrect, but my sentiment, I think, is shared by many." Dash states, "Consequences. Some of us have to pay them. Gladly." *Media Buzz*' Howard Kurtz calls it "Flippin' embarrassing"— something the truth often is.) [84768, 84769, 84770, 84791, 84799, 84800, 84829, 84830, 84837, 85103]

The Federalist.com's Sean Davis writes, "If the performance of these gun maker stocks is any indication, ... Obama might be the greatest gun salesman in American history. Since Obama took office in January of 2009, stock prices for publicly traded American gun manufacturers are booming. There are two publicly traded gun manufacturers based in the U.S., and their stock prices have gone through the roof since Obama became president. Smith & Wesson's stock price has increased nearly 700 percent since January 20, 2009, according to a list of historical daily prices provided by Yahoo! Finance. Over that same period of time, the overall stock market, as measured by the S&P 500, increased by approximately 150 percent. When Obama took office, the price of one share of Smith & Wesson stock was \$2.57. As of Monday morning, that same share was worth nearly \$20. The stock price for Ruger, which is based in Southport, Connecticut, increased even more than the price of Smith & Wesson shares. Since January 20, 2009, Ruger's share price has increased by an eye-popping 800 percent. Monday's share price of nearly \$57 is more than nine times higher than Ruger's opening share price of \$6.25 on the day of Obama's 2009 inauguration. ...Both gun manufacturers are now valued at roughly one billion dollars. The Massachusetts-based Smith & Wesson has more than 1,700 full-time employees. Ruger employs nearly 1,900 people, according to Forbes." [84771]

Gun sales are also increasing in Europe, largely because of concerns about the increased crime resulting from the influx of Muslim refugees. Gatestone Institute writes that Sweden is now "a night-watchman state—each man is on his own. ...Mr. and Mrs. Swede have every reason to be worried, with the influx of 190,000 unskilled and unemployed migrants expected this year—equivalent to 2% of Sweden's current population. The number is as if 6.4 million penniless migrants who did not speak English arrived in U.S. in one year, or 1.3 million in Britain. And the Swedes are preparing: demand for firearms licenses is increasing; more and more Swedes are joining shooting clubs and starting vigilante groups. After a slight dip in 2014, the number of new gun permits has gone up significantly again this year. According to police statistics, there are 1,901,325 licensed guns, owned by 567,733 people, in Sweden. [Sweden's population is about 9.5 million.] Add to this an unknown number of illegal weapons. To get a gun permit in Sweden, you need to be at least 18 years old; law-abiding; well-behaved, and have a hunting license or be a member of an approved shooting club." [85327, 85328, 85401, 85586, 85587]

"There is also a high demand for alarm systems right now,' says a salesman at one of the security companies in an interview with Gatestone. ...At another security company, a salesman said that every time the Immigration Service buys or rents a new housing facility [for refugees], his firm is swamped with calls. 'The next day,' he said, 'half the

village calls and wants to buy alarm systems.' ... Even before the massive influx of migrants in the fall of 2015, Swedes felt a need to protect themselves—and with good reason. Since the Parliament decided in 1975 that Sweden should be multicultural and not Swedish, crime has exploded. Violent crime has increased by more than 300%, and rapes have increased by an unbelievable 1,472%. The politicians, however, ignore the people's fear completely. It is never discussed. Instead, the people who express concern about what kind of country Sweden has become are accused of xenophobia and racism. Most likely, that is the reason more and more people are taking matters into their own hands, and protecting themselves and their families to the best of their ability." [85327, 85586]

Attorney General Loretta Lynch announces that the Department of Justice is opening a "pattern or practice" civil rights investigation into whether the Chicago Police Department's use of force, including racial, ethnic and other disparities, and accountability systems amount to a violation of federal law. Lynch says, "Building trust between law enforcement officers and the communities they serve is one of my highest priorities as Attorney General. The Department of Justice intends to do everything we can to foster those bonds and create safer and fairer communities across the country. And regardless of the findings in this investigation, we will seek to work with local officials, residents, and law enforcement officers alike to ensure that the people of Chicago have the world-class police department that they deserve." (The investigation was prompted by the release of a video showing a Chicago Police officer repeatedly shooting 17-year-old Laquan McDonald.)

At TakiMag.com Jim Goad writes, "This past summer when Dylann Roof killed nine black churchgoers in Charleston, SC, US Attorney General Loretta Lynch—a black woman—expressed zero concern about protecting neo-Confederates against a looming public backlash. But last week, a mere day after two radical Muslims slaughtered 14 people in San Bernardino, she told a group of Muslim advocates that her 'greatest fear' is that the shooting would lead to anti-Muslim 'rhetoric.' The day after she said that, she announced publicly that the feds were opening an investigation to determine whether a Muslim teen in Texas had his civil rights violated after being arrested for bringing a homemade clock to school that officials had mistaken for a bomb. "But serious flaws in the list have been identified. According to the American Civil Liberties Union, which is suing the government over the no-fly list, the two lists include thousands of names that have been added in error, as well as the names of family members of suspected terrorists. The no-fly list has also been used to deny boarding passes to people who only share a name with a suspected terrorist. Former Sen. Ted Kennedy (D-MA) was famously questioned at airports in 2004 because a terror suspect had used the alias 'T. Kennedy.' It took the senator's office three weeks to get his name cleared." [84825]

Donald Trump calls for a moratorium on allowing Muslims to enter the United States "until our country's representatives can figure out what is going on. ...Until we are able to determine and understand this problem and the dangerous threat it poses, our country cannot be the victims of horrendous attacks by people that [sic; who] believe only in jihad, and have no sense of reason or respect for human life." In addition, a ban on immigrants from particular countries or regions is not unconstitutional and they have been imposed in the past. Eric Posner, a professor at the University of Chicago Law School, tells WND.com that the Supreme Court "has held consistently, for more than a century, that constitutional protections that normally benefit Americans and people on American territory do not apply when Congress decides who to admit and who to exclude as immigrants or other entrants. This is called the plenary power doctrine. The court has repeatedly turned away challenges to immigration statutes and executive actions on grounds that they discriminate on the basis of race, national origin, and political belief, and that they deprive foreign nationals of due process protections." Eugene Volokh, a First Amendment specialist at the UCLA School of Law, comments, "As a policy matter, I think that banning entry by Muslims would be a very bad idea, for many reasons. But, like many very bad ideas, it might not be unconstitutional." (It is worth noting that the Immigration Act of 1924 banned the immigration of all Asians and Arabs into the United States. The legislation remained largely in effect until the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1965.) In May 2009, five of the key leaders of the HLF were sentenced after having been convicted in November, 2008, of providing material support to the terrorist organization. Two days later he withdrew \$10,000 in cash. Of the \$28,500, \$15,000 was transferred to Farook's mother—in three \$5,000 installments. (The night before Obama said, "So far, we have no evidence that the killers were directed by a terrorist organization overseas, or that they were part of a broader conspiracy here at home." FoxNews.com reports that although "[n]one of the pipe bombs left at the Inland Regional Center in San Bernardino by Syed Farook and Tashfeen Malik in Wednesday's attack detonated, ...the technique has investigators very concerned... 'This was meant to kill more, but also scare other future responders to attacks,' a source with inside knowledge of the investigation said. 'This was meant to get into the minds of medics and officers who are arriving first on scene.'" [84806]

Pamela Geller writes, "Further proof of what I said numerous times: this was a massive intel failure. At WeeklyStandard.com Stephen Hayes reports, "Scanner traffic indicates law enforcement may have investigated San Bernardino shooter Syed Farook a week before the attack. Law enforcement officials in San Bernardino and Los Angeles may have investigated Syed Farook one week before the shooting on the community development center on December 2, 2015, that left 14 dead and 17 injured, according to a review of police communications immediately following the attacks. ... Farook is first identified by name at approximately 11:40am local time, just a half hour after the shooting began. The information came from a county worker, who noted that Farook had been acting nervous and left the holiday party twenty minutes before the shooting began. In a subsequent exchange at approximately 12:08pm the dispatcher addresses an officer nicknamed 'Trav' upon hearing 'Syed Farook.' She says: 'Reference that name, I believe one of the [garbled] was working that name up for something last week. I'll have to check.' In a second exchange shortly after 12:20, another officer says of Farook: 'I just got some info from that LAPD that they have information on one of your suspects. I heard that somebody was trying to INV that guy. Can you find out who I can give this information to?" [84808, 84809]

On *The O'Reilly Factor*, Bernard Goldberg observes, "There are people in the media who have a lot invested in Barack Obama and they're not gonna [sic]... throw him under the bus. But when Barack Obama makes you look foolish by defending him, that's another story." Bill O'Reilly: "Do you think that we've reached that point? Do you think it's the eye-roll point?" Goldberg: "I think we're... at a tipping point. The American people know that ISIS isn't the JV team, and so do journalists, including liberal journalists. 12. There is a difference between the government welcoming refugees and the government resettling refugees.

13. There is a difference between private relief efforts and government relief efforts.

14. There is a difference between suspicion and hatred.

15. There is a difference between profiling and persecuting.

16. There is a difference between building a fence to keep people out and building a fence to keep people in.

17. There is a difference between inviting immigrants and recruiting immigrants.

18. There is a difference between being a guest and being a trespasser.

19. There is a difference between discrimination and xenophobia.

20. There is a difference between assimilated immigrants and alienated immigrants.

21. There is a difference between privately-funded immigration and taxpayer-funded immigration.

22. There is a difference between the United States giving sanctuary to refugees and the United States opening facilities overseas to process refugees.

23. There is a difference between the U.S. government limiting the number of refugees its accepts and the U.S. government refusing to grant asylum to Jewish refugees on the St. Louis in 1939.

24. There is a difference between the private, voluntary acceptance of refugees and the taxpayer-funded Office of Refugee Resettlement.

25. There is a difference between free immigration and forced immigration."

White House press secretary Josh Earnest tells reporters, "I think what [Obama] would say based on his comments from Sunday night is that we are seeing extremist organizations, including ISIL [ISIS], trying to radicalize people in the United States to essentially mimic the tactics of other mass shooters in this country. So, there certainly is a national security benefit to closing the gun show loophole or reinstating the assault weapons ban. There is such profound frustration on the part of [Obama] that Congress hasn't taken common sense steps that would make it harder for those who shouldn't get guns from getting their hands on them. The suggestion is not that we can stop every incident of violence in this country but if there are some common sense things that we can do that will at least make some of them less likely, then why wouldn't we do it." "The intensity of [Obama's] view about the importance of us implementing some policies that make it harder for those who shouldn't be able to get their hands on guns from getting them, has not waned in it's [sic; its] intensity. I'm talking about common sense measures like making sure you can't avoid a background check just by purchasing the gun over the internet or even reinstituting the assault weapons ban that would prevent or at least reduce the likelihood that weapons of war end up on our streets." First, there is no "gun show loophole." Whether a customer buys a gun from a store or from a gun dealer at a gun show, he or she still has to go through a background check. A licensed gun dealer follows the same procedures at gun shows as he follows at his store. Second, if a firearm is purchased over the Internet, the customer must also go through a background check. The gun is then shipped to a local licensed dealer for pickup. (No seller can legally ship a gun to a home address.) Third, if a gun is purchased across state lines, the seller has to ship that gun to a local, licensed dealer—where the buyer must fill out paperwork and go through a background check. One *can* buy a gun from a private party, such as a relative who is not a licensed gun dealer, but it is a felony for any such private party to sell a gun to someone he suspects might not be able to pass a background check. (Second Amendment supporter Pat Nicklaus observes, "Calling a rifle an assault rifle based merely on cosmetic features is kind of like calling Michelle [Obama] a princess if only you put a gown and a tiara on her.") [84834, 84835]

Fourth, Earnest does not define "assault weapon." Many on the left mistakenly believe Americans can easily purchase fully automatic weapons (machine guns). Since the 1930s it has been illegal to buy an automatic weapon, except for collectors who have to go through an incredibly strict review process. (Virtually no Americans own automatic weapons, partly because they are almost impossible to purchase, and partly because they are *very* expensive.) By "assault weapon" many on the left simply mean "rifles that look scary." That a weapon has a black plastic stock rather than a wooden stock does not influence the speed of the bullet leaving the barrel. Lastly, the fact that a particular weapon may be illegal would not stop someone who is determined to commit murder (mass or otherwise). Someone who is willing and eager to violate laws against murder certainly does not care if an illegal weapons charge is added to his list of felonies.

Judicial Watch releases "a new Benghazi email from then-Department of Defense Chief of Staff Jeremy Bash to State Department leadership immediately offering 'forces that could move to Benghazi' during the terrorist attack on the U.S. Special Mission Compound in Benghazi, Libya on September 11, 2012. In an email sent to top Department of State officials, at 7:19 p.m. ET, only hours after the attack had begun, Bash says, 'we have identified the forces that could move to Benghazi. They are spinning up as we speak.' The Obama administration redacted the details of the military forces available, oddly citing a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) exemption that allows the withholding of 'deliberative process' information. Bash's email seems to directly contradict testimony given by then-Secretary of Defense Leon Panetta before the Senate Armed Services Committee in February 2013. Defending the Obama administration's lack of military response to the nearly six-hour-long attack on the U.S. Consulate in Benghazi, Panetta claimed that 'time, distance, the lack of an adequate warning, events that moved very quickly on the ground prevented a more immediate response.'" Breitbart.com reports that Hillary Clinton "is seizing on Donald Trump's proposal to ban all Muslim entry into the U.S. with a fundraising email featuring long-time aide Huma Abedin, who is Muslim. The email reads, in part: 'I'm a proud Muslim—but you don't have to share my faith to share my disgust.' The email is noteworthy for two reasons: first, that it acknowledges Abedin's faith at all; and second, that it features Abedin, who is not only under ethical criticism but also suspected of radical ties. ...Democrats have come a long way, from trying to appease anti-Muslim sentiment in their own party to using Muslims to fundraise from their supporters. However, Huma Abedin is an odd choice. A 'proud Muslim' would not marry a Jew–much less scandal-plagued former Rep. Anthony Weiner—given that Islamic law prevents women from marrying non-Muslims. Stranger still, Huma Abedin's mother Saleha is reported to be part of the Muslim Brotherhood, which is not only 'proud' but radical, and violent. In addition, Huma Abedin was recently investigated for embezzlement, and has been accused of failing to provide complete financial disclosure to the State Department, as well as working for a private contractor on the side. Not exactly a proud record—except in Clintonland." [84845]

Although no one should be surprised that Obama's December 6 speech did not satisfy Republicans—and probably more than a few Democrats—it also did not sit too well with some Muslims. On National Public Radio (NPR), Palestinian-American activist Linda Sarsour complains, "We would never ask any other faith community to stand up and condemn acts of violence committed by people within their groups. To expect us to be on the front lines without having the capacity or the support would not be [productive]. It wouldn't be productive with any community." (The Council on American-Islamic Relations has encouraged American Muslims not to cooperate with the FBI.) [84992]

DailyCaller.com points out that "Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump's proposal to temporarily bar alien Muslims from entering the country is legal under the Immigration and Nationality Act, which gives the president authority to suspend the entry of any and all aliens deemed 'detrimental' to U.S. interests." The 1952 legislation (US Code 1182) states, "Whenever the President finds that the entry of any aliens or of any class of aliens into the United States would be detrimental to the interests of the United States, he may by proclamation, and for such period as he shall deem necessary, suspend the entry of all aliens or any class of aliens as immigrants or nonimmigrants, or impose on the entry of aliens any restrictions he may deem to be appropriate." (Whether it would be popular, practical or politically correct for a president to keep Muslims from entering the United States is another issue, *but it would be legal*. President Jimmy Carter once blocked all immigration from Iran—and he certainly did not get the criticism Trump is

At NationalReview.com former prosecutor Andrew C. McCarthy has noted, "Under federal law, the executive branch is *expressly required to take religion into account* in determining who is granted asylum. Under the provision governing asylum (section 1158 of Title 8, U.S. Code), an alien applying for admission 'must establish that ...religion [among other things] ...was or will be at least one central reason for persecuting the applicant.' Moreover, to qualify for asylum in the United States, the applicant must be a 'refugee' as defined by federal law. That definition (set forth in Section 1101(a)(42)(A) of Title 8, U.S. Code) also requires the executive branch to take account of the alien's religion: 'The term 'refugee' means (A) any person who is outside any country of such person's nationality ...and who is unable or unwilling to return to ...that country because of persecution or a well-founded fear of persecution on account of ...*religion* [among other things]...' The law requires a 'religious test.' And the reason for that is obvious. Asylum law is not a reflection of the incumbent president's personal (and rather eccentric) sense of compassion. Asylum is a discretionary national act of compassion that is directed, by law not whim, to address *persecution*." [85039]

White House press secretary Josh Earnest says Donald Trump is "disqualified" from being president because of his proposal to restrict Muslim immigration. [84856]

BuzzFeed.com editor-in-chief Ben Smith tells his editorial staff it is acceptable to call Trump a "mendacious racist" in their columns. [84996]

At WND.com Douglas Ernst writes, "Secret Service agents assigned to protect Trump since Nov. 11 may be working overtime in the wake of his comments on halting Muslim immigration into the U.S. A slew of death threats against the billionaire were tweeted after a campaign stop in South Carolina on Monday." (Writing "Someone needs to kill trump ASAP" or "kill trump immediately" on Twitter is not a good idea—but people are writing things like that.) [84847]

Media magnate Rupert Murdoch tweets, "Has Trump gone too far? Regardless, public is obsessed on radical Muslim dangers, Complete refugee pause to fix vetting makes sense." [84857]

Donald Trump hits 41 percent in a December 3-7 New Morning Consult Poll of registered voters, with Ben Carson at a mere 12 percent, Marco Rubio at 10, Ted Cruz at 7, and all other GOP candidates with less than 5 percent. Among Democrats, Clinton leads Bernie Sanders 52-23. According to the poll, Trump would defeat Hillary Clinton 45-40 percent. Carson would defeat her by the same margin. Rubio would win 41-10, while Clinton would defeat Cruz 42-40 and tie Jeb Bush (41-41) and Chris Christie (40-40). Clinton's unfavorable rating is 54 percent; Obama's is at 59 percent, and 74 percent say the nation is on the wrong track. [85065, 85071, 85084, 85085]

The *Daily Mail* reports, "FBI agents found an empty GoPro [camera] package, shooting targets and tools inside a car belonging to the mother of San Bernardino mass shooter Syed Farook... Authorities have repeatedly denied rumors that Farook, 28, and his wife Tashfeen Malik, 27, strapped recording devices to their body armor as they stormed the Inland Regional Center, slaughtering 14 people and wounding 21. However Daily Mail Online has a discovered that an empty GoPro box was one of dozens of items seized from a black Lexus IS300 in the wake of last Wednesday's massacre. Documents confirm the car was insured by Farook's 62-year-old mother Rafia, who lived in the same home in Redlands, California, where he and Malik built pipe bombs and stored thousands of rounds of ammunition. ...An [FBI] inventory left behind on the front seat read: 'Apple iPhone, multi-tool, key, business card, miscellaneous indicia, bank receipt, shooting targets, hammer, vice grips, U-Haul receipt, tire receipt, notebook, garment, GoPro packaging, vacuumings, legal documents.'" (Rafia Farook should be arrested. If there are no charges against her, it will be because of pressure from Obama and his lackeys in the Department of Justice.) [84848, 84849, 84875]

TheHill.com writes, "Democrats are increasingly fearful that ...Obama's handling of the threat from the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria (ISIS) is becoming a liability for their party. In a CNN/WMUR poll in New Hampshire, Trump leads with 32 percent, followed by Rubio (14), Christie (9), Bush (8), Kasich (7), Cruz (6), Fiorina (50, and Carson (5). [84860]

Trump announces, "A new [*USA Today*] poll indicates that 68% of my supporters would vote for me if I departed the GOP & ran as an independent." [84986, 84987, 84988]

DCWhispers.com reports, "Ignoring repeated concerns voiced by the Obama administration, Russia's Vladimir Putin further escalated his war against ISIS and Islamic militant forces throughout Syria today via a series of high-powered missile attacks launched via a submarine located in the Mediterranean Sea. Following ISIS-related terrorist attacks against a Russian fighter plane and earlier in Egypt, a Russian passenger airliner, Putin is said to be more determined than ever to '…wipe ISIS from the face of the earth.' NBCNews.com reports, "San Bernardino terror couple Syed Rizwan Farook and Tashfeen Malik spent at least a year preparing for their terror attack, NBC News has learned, practicing at a local gun range and making financial plans for their family after their deaths. And the husband may have discussed an attack as many as three years ago, law enforcement sources said Tuesday. ... Reuters reported that the loan to Farook was made by the online lender Prosper. ...[A] senior law enforcement official told NBC News Tuesday that FBI investigators have been told that Farook discussed staging an attack in California as early as 2012. ...[F]ederal investigators are interviewing a neighbor of Farook and Malik who bought two of the four guns that were used in the massacre. That man, Enrique Marquez—who NBC News has learned is an in-law of Farook—had converted to Islam about three or four years ago, according to the son of the imam at the Islamic Center of Riverside. Marquez, along with Farook and Malik, attended the mosque, officials have said. In 2014, records show, Marquez married a woman named Mariya Chernykh—the sister of Tatiana Farook, who is married to Syed Rizwan Farook's brother, Syed Raheel Farook." Meanwhile, several people who survived the attack at the Inland Regional Center in San Bernardino insist there were three shooters. WND.com writes, "Sally Abdelmageed, who worked inside the center where the attack occurred, claimed in an interview broadcast on CBS News that there were three assailants. ... '[Are] You are certain you saw three men?' the reporter asked her again. 'Yes,' she stressed. 'It looked like their skin color was white. They look like they were athletic build and they appeared to be tall.' A second witness, Juan Fernandez, confirmed Abdelmageed's description of events, telling reporters he also saw 'three white men in military fatigues' who 'took off' in a 'black Impala or SUV.'" A third witness, Chris Nwadike, insists that Farook and Malik were not the shooters he saw. According to InfoWars.com, Nwadike "recently told reporters he received a phone call from an unknown person around 7 p.m., on the evening of the shooting, who told him that he must say that Syed Farook was the shooter. ...Nwadike told reporters: 'No it's not him. I told them about it. He's quiet. He doesn't make any trouble. He was just spraying bullets everywhere," Nwadike said. But the gunman was not Syed, or his wife." [85073, 85074]

At Breitbart.com Pamela Geller writes, "The similarities between the jihad attack on our American Freedom Defense Initiative (AFDI) free speech event last May in Garland, Texas and the San Bernardino jihad slaughter are both striking and unnerving. Both events—our Muhammad Cartoon Contest and the San Bernardino Christmas party offended Muslims. Both events violated the sharia: one was an art exhibit with depictions of Muhammad in art and literature over the past 1400 years, and the other celebrated a Christian holiday. In Afghanistan, Taliban fighters kill 37 in an attack on the Kandahar airport. [85036, 85037]

The Associated Press reports, "An Ohio man who prosecutors say was sympathetic to the Islamic State posted the names and addresses of 100 members of the military on social media, calling for them to be killed, according to a federal indictment issued on Tuesday. A grand jury charged 25-year-old Terrence J. McNeil of Akron with three counts each of solicitation of a crime of violence and threatening military personnel." [85038, 85041]

By a vote of 85-12 the Senate passes revisions to the "No Child Left Behind Act." Although annual reading and math for students in grades 3-8 will continue to be required, the law leaves the federal government with less power over education. CNSNews.com reports, "The federal government taxed more, spent more, and ran a bigger deficit in the first two months of fiscal 2016 than it did in the first two months of fiscal 2015, according estimates the CBO published yesterday. The federal fiscal year begins on Oct. 1 and ends on Sept. 30." During those two months, the government collected \$416 billion in taxes and spent \$616 billion. (If that ratio continues, the annual deficit for 2016 will be \$2.4 trillion.) As of December 4, the national debt is \$18,786,830,545,682.60. That represents about \$160,000 for each household in the United States. [84998]

In Paris, Secretary of State John Kerry addresses the climate change conference. He says, "The fact is that even if every single American citizen biked to work, carpooled to school, used only solar panels to power their homes, if we each planted a dozen trees, if we somehow eliminated all our domestic greenhouse gas emissions, guess what? That still wouldn't be enough to offset the carbon pollution [carbon dioxide is not a pollutant] from the rest of the world. If all the industrialized nations went down to zero emissions, remember what I said all the industrialized nations went down to zero emissions, it wouldn't be enough, not when more than 65 percent of the world's carbon pollution comes from the developing world." Christopher C. Horner, a senior fellow at the Competitive Enterprise Institute, responds, "What he's doing is inadvertently pointing out that this is all pain, no gain. He won't admit to the pain. The Paris proposals are nonsensical. Our freedom is bound up with the freedom of others, regardless of what they look like or where they come from or what their last name is or what faith they practice." What tremendous advantage is there to the United States by hurrying to bring one or two or three million more folks in, especially from a part of the world where Islamists are fighting one another? ...I don't care who wins the nomination, but the Bush Republicans, if you will, and the Cruz Republicans and the Trump Republicans and all of them need to be up on that stage together supporting and endorsing that nominee. According to Breitbart.com, "An illegal immigrant from the United Arab Emirates is facing charges in Florida for illegally possessing ammunition, the U.S. United States

Attorney for the Middle District of Florida A. Lee Bentley, III revealed Thursday. According to a complaint, 25-year-old Hamid Mohamed Ahmed Ali Rehaif had been living at a hotel in Melbourne for 53 days, checking out each morning and checking back into the hotel each evening. He further had paid over \$11,000 in cash for room fees. ...The complaint notes that Rehaif was admitted to the U.S. on a student visa in 2013. He was enrolled at the Florida Institute of Technology in Melbourne, Florida but was dismissed in the fall of last year. He failed to leave the country within 30 days of the end of his student status. By failing to leave Rehaif became an illegal immigrant. He has been charged with possession of ammunition by an unlawful or illegal alien, a penalty that carried up to 10 years in federal prison.' [85083]

TheHill.com reports, "A yearlong investigation by the House Armed Services Committee has concluded that the Obama administration broke the law in swapping five Taliban members for Army Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl—and went out of its way to hide the negotiations as they were happening. The report said the administration broke a law requiring it to give members of Congress 30 days' advance notice of any detainee transfers from the Guantánamo Bay detention facility, where the senior Taliban leaders were held. It also found that it misled reporters and lawmakers about a potential prisoner exchange. Congress was instead notified just hours before the May 2014 transfer took place. ...The report also found that the administration kept some defense officials who would normally work on transfers out of the loop. ... In Texas, Dr. Nidal Alsayyed tells KFDM News he was forced to resign as religious director of the Islamic Society of the Triplex after saying he agrees with Donald Trump's statements that the U.S. should temporarily stop accepting any new Muslim immigrants into the country. Alsayyed had stated, "I certainly see it to be wise that the US government should stop temporarily accepting any new Muslim immigrants (refugees and non-refugees) into the United States. Saudi Arabia's billionaire Prince Alwaleed Bin Talal tweets back, "You are a disgrace not only to the GOP but to all America. Withdraw from the U.S presidential race as you will never win." This would be the same Saudi prince who has for decades been funding radical mosques in the United States, and who gave \$20 million to Harvard Law School to fund an Islamic studies program—which is likely how Obama got into the school despite his low grades at Occidental College. Also greasing the skids for Obama was a letter of recommendation from Percy Sutton, who was Malcolm "X" Little's attorney. 'Disposing of aborted fetuses from an abortion by sending them to a landfill is callous and completely inhumane,' DeWine said. RNC Chairman Reince Priebus held a dinner in Washington on Monday, and, according to five people who spoke with the Post, the possibility of Trump heading into the Cleveland convention with a substantial number of delegates was a topic of discussion. Some attendees suggested the establishment lay the groundwork for a floor fight that could lead the party's mainstream wing to unite behind an alternative. Carson rejected this approach. 'If the leaders of the Republican Party want to destroy the party, they should continue to hold meetings like the one described in the Washington Post this morning,' Carson said in a statement released by his campaign." The department also told the committee the FBI has taken possession of Pagliano's government computer system, where traces of the messages are most likely to be found, according to the letter. Grassley... has been considering whether to grant Pagliano immunity in exchange for testimony on who approved Clinton's private email setup and whether anyone raised any objections to the system." (Kaiser is worth about \$10 billion, but he cost the taxpayers \$535 million with his Solyndra scheme. A Carly Fiorina event in Iowa draws a mere 14 attendees; a Jeb Bush event attracts only 54; and Donald Trump fills a stadium. [85281]

On *Breitbart News Saturday*, Jan Ting, professor of Law at Temple University Beasley School of Law, says, "I think the reaction to candidate Trump's proposal [to temporarily ban Muslim immigrants] has really been what I call hysterical. I think the failed establishment is panicked that Trump is making a case for himself. There's clear statutory authority in the laws [outlined by] Congress ... delegating to the president" the power to impose such a ban "whenever the president finds that such admission would be detrimental to the United States. Carol Marsh said not only was the call to prayer too loud, she insisted that the organizers of the center never said it would serve as a mosque. 'We were lied to,' she said. 'We were told it would never be turned into a mosque.' But Sakrul Islam of the center said no one ever said it would not be a mosque, saying an Islamic center 'covers everything.' He warned Marsh that if she continued claiming she was lied to he would file a defamation lawsuit." [85251, 85252]

"That's the message I hope every Muslim American hears—that we're all part of the same American family. And it's a message all of us can deliver—parents to our children, teachers to their students, leaders in politics and business and entertainment. Back in San Bernardino, people from across the community have joined in prayer vigils—Christians, Jews, Muslims and others. They've sent a powerful message—we're all in this together. That's the spirit we have to uphold. That's what we can do—as Americans—united in defense of the country that we love." [85264]

Jihad Watch's Robert Spencer writes, "But don't be concerned. U.S. officials are going to vet the heck out of those Syrian refugees. They're going to vet them til the cows come home. That's right: U.S. officials who are bound as a matter of policy to deny that there is any connection between jihad terror and the Islamic faith are going to discern the level of commitment of Muslims to the jihadi tenets of the Islamic faith that they deny exist. Most Americans would probably argue that statements from either category should be enough to justify the denial of a visa. "We're not sure if the visa applicant loves oppressive Shari'ah law or hates the United States" is a statement raising a distinction that makes no difference.) [85309]

On December 13 Secretary of State John Kerry confirms, in an appearance on *Fox News Sunday*, that the Paris climate agreement "doesn't have mandatory targets for reduction and it doesn't have an enforcement, compliance mechanism." WashingtonExaminer.com notes, "Binding legal requirements would have made the Paris agreement a treaty, requiring approval from two-thirds of the Senate. Because no climate change measure could [come] close to the high bar in the chamber, the Paris deal was written to avoid it." (In other words, the entire process was a sham.) [85277]

On *This Week*, Kerry says, "I think, frankly, a lot of members of Congress are on the wrong side of history, and I don't believe you can be elected president of the United States if you don't understand climate change and you're not committed to this kind of a plan." [85299]

On *Meet the Press*, Kerry insists, "We have plenty of ways to vet people. We already do it. We have a huge process of examining people for visas. We know who's coming into our country for the most part. ...But clearly the [use of] social media has placed a whole new burden and a whole new set of questions, but not impossible ones to resolve; and I think we need to look at this very, very carefully, which is what we're doing, before we jump to a wholesale prohibition without understanding what the implications may be." According to WashingtonTimes.com, Democrat National Committee (DNC) Chairwoman Debbie Wasserman (D-FL) has drafted legislation that would require taxpayers to contribute \$20 million toward the costs of each political convention. "The DNC is facing tough financial circumstances. The latest report shows it had just \$4.7 million in cash on hand as of Oct. 31, less than the \$6.9 million in debts the committee reported. By contrast, the Republican National Committee reported \$20.4 million in cash, offset by \$1.9 million in debts. ...Republican National Committee spokeswoman Allison Moore said the party doesn't need the help." Planned Parenthood tweets, "Imagine 'life in a magical land where abortions and birth control are free and plentiful' This place exists." The message provides a link to an article praising Great Britain's National Health Service, through which one get—in exchange for high taxes—"free" birth control and abortions. Congresswoman Diane Black (R-TN) reacts: "With a single tweet, Planned Parenthood accidentally told us the truth. They effectively admitted that the abortion lobby's mantra of 'safe, legal, and rare' abortion is a lie and that the organization's real mission is to encourage more elective abortions funded off the backs of taxpayers. These statements are painful to hear and offensive to all Americans of conscience, but what else would we expect from an organization that calls the destruction of an unborn life 'healthcare' and that allows aborted babies to be disposed of in landfills? We must not stand for this barbarity. With the Senate just having passed a reconciliation bill to reallocate Planned Parenthood's funding, every Senator who voted against this measure should be forced to square their vote with this appalling statement." At Breitbart.com Julia Hahn writes, "In January of 2015, a handful of Senators quietly introduced new legislation in Congress that would allow for virtually unlimited Muslim immigration into the United States—lifting caps entirely on several categories of visas favored by immigrants from Muslim countries. The [Facebook CEO] Mark Zuckerbergbacked legislation, S.153, is called the Immigration Innovation Act (or I-Squared), and it has taken on new significance following the terrorist attacks in San Bernardino. ...The I-Squared bill is significant for a second reason. One of the Senators who introduced the bill is also running for President: Sen. Marco Rubio (R-FL). And several of Rubio's most prominent financial backers are among the bill's boosters. (It is worth noting that 9,000 airstrikes over a period of more than one year is not particularly aggressive. Politico.com writes, "The timing [of Obama's Pentagon visit] ...seemed aimed at blunting the criticisms that are expected Tuesday [December 15] from the GOP presidential candidates during a prime-time debate. ...And in the latest sign of the public's uneasiness, an NBC News/Wall Street Journal poll released Monday found Obama's approval rating at 43 percent, his lowest in more than a year, with only 34 percent of Americans supporting his handling of ISIL. Obama's 'ability to resort to speeches and rhetoric has not succeeded,' said James Mann, a scholar in residence at the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies... 'The reason he is doing this this week is that the nationwide speech he made just over a week ago did not have the results he hoped for,' Mann added. 'He is [trying to show] himself as a hands-on commander in chief. I think that's a response to the criticisms that he seems too detached.'" [85325, 85443]

ABC reports, "Fearing a civil liberties backlash and 'bad public relations' for the Obama administration, Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson refused in early 2014 to end a secret U.S. policy that prohibited immigration officials from reviewing the social media messages of all foreign citizens applying for U.S. visas, a former senior department official said. 'During that time period immigration officials were not allowed to use or review social media as part of the screening process,' John Cohen, a former acting undersecretary at DHS for intelligence and analysis. Cohen is now a national security consultant for ABC News. One current and one former senior counter-terrorism official

confirmed Cohen's account about the refusal of DHS to change its policy about the public social media posts of all foreign applicants. ...Cohen said officials from United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIC) and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) both pressed for a change in policy. ...Cohen said the issue reached a head at a heated 2014 meeting chaired by Homeland Security Deputy Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas, other top deputies and representatives of the DHS Office of Civil Liberties and the Office of Privacy. 'The primary concern was that it would be viewed negatively if it was disclosed publicly and there were concerns that it would be embarrassing,' Cohen said... 'They felt looking at public postings [of foreign U.S. visa applicants] was an invasion of their privacy,' [an] the official told ABC News. 'The arguments being made were, and are still, in bad faith.'" (Not only have immigration officers not been reviewing social media of foreigners seeking entry into the United States, the Obama administration has ordered them not to do so.) Pamela Geller writes, "After jihadis tried to slaughter hundreds at a free speech event in Garland, Texas, Obama's DHS chief extended a policy preventing scrutiny of visa applicants' social media activities. Obama feared bad PR [public relations]. Like San Bernardino, Obama's concern is optics. As the mangled broken bodies of Americans at a Christmas party lay in a river of blood, Obama convened a meeting with the National Security Council and the heads of other federal enforcement agencies to discuss a public relations strategy. Despite the glaring similarities between Garland and San Bernardino, the Obama administration continued to provide cover for jihadis in America and abroad. That is treason." [85326]

In federal court, Edgewood, Maryland resident Mohamed Yousef ElShinawy is arraigned on charges of communicating with overseas terrorists, providing support to ISIS, and lying to the FBI. According to IBTimes.com, he was being sent money "to possibly carry out an attack or to travel to Syria." (Luckily for ElShinawy's potential victims, his brother reported him to the FBI after he expressed a desire to be a martyr for ISIS.) [85330, 85331, 85342]

Hasan Edmonds, a former member of the Illinois National Guard, pleads guilty to conspiring to provide material support to ISIS. (His cousin, Jonas Edmond, pleaded guilty to similar charges one week earlier.) ABC reports, "Prosecutors say the cousins devised a plan for Hasan Edmonds to travel to the Middle East and join Islamic State fighters overseas. After dropping his cousin off at Midway International Airport last March, Jonas Edmonds went to Hasan Edmonds' home and collected several National Guard uniforms that he planned to wear as a disguise during a planned attack at the Joliet armory, the plea agreement said. ...Charges alleged the armory attack was planned to kill as many as 150 people." [85336, 85337, 85840]

In several cities in Sweden, dozens of citizens receive letters threatening them with beheading if they do not convert to Islam within three days. The letters read, "In the name of Allah, the merciful, full of grace. You who are not believers will be decapitated in three days in your own house; we will bomb your rotten corpses afterwards. You must choose between these three choices: 1. Convert to Islam. 2. Pay the jizya [religious tax] for protection 3. Or else, you will be decapitated. The police will not prevent or save you from you being murdered. (Death comes to all of you)." [85332, 85333, 85560, 85561]

Also in Sweden, Reuters reports, "Two Swedish men were sentenced to life in prison on Monday for 'terrorist crimes' in Syria in 2013, a Swedish district court said in a statement. The two men, aged 32 and 30, were convicted of assisting in executions in Syria. During a search of one of the men's homes, police had found a USB stick containing films showing the killings, the court was told. In a video shown in court by the prosecutor, masked men stood around three men on their knees with their hands tied behind their backs." (Reuters does not provide the names of the two men, who very likely did not consider themselves to be Swedish.) [85339]

According to the *Daily Mail*, "Hundreds of asylum-seekers entering Norway were discovered to have images of 'executions' and 'severed heads' on their mobile phones. The revelation comes amid heightened fears that ISIS is exploiting the migrant crisis to smuggle fighters into Europe, following last month's attacks in Paris. Police admitted that the 'explosion' of refugees crossing into the country over the summer and in recent months meant that security checks were less thorough than required, and weren't checking the background of those entering the country." (Norway has found it necessary to include in its asylum center education programs a notice to refugees that "To force someone into sex is not permitted in Norway, even when you are married to that person.") [85334, 85715, 85716]

WashingtonTimes.com reports, "In a secret project tied to the overall U.S. campaign against the Islamic State, intelligence officials have spent months mapping out known physical locations of media safe houses where the extremist group's operatives are compiling, editing and curating raw video and print materials into finished digital propaganda products for dissemination across the Internet. Most of the locations are embedded in heavily residential areas in Syria, Iraq and Libya and are not being targeted by U.S. airstrikes because of Obama administration concerns about civilian casualties, according to sources who spoke to The Washington Times only on the condition of anonymity." (In other words, the U.S. military has identified the targets but Obama won't let them be taken out. ISIS cannot be "degraded" with such a "strategy," let alone be destroyed.) [85358, 85375, 85402]

Secretary of Transportation Anthony Foxx announces that all drones that weight one-half pound or more must now be registered with the federal government. WashingtonTimes.com reports, "The government will issue registration numbers for each drone, which must be clearly marked so the government can trace who is responsible for any significantly sized aircraft in the sky, the Federal Aviation Administration [FAA] said. Registration can be done online, and everyone flying a drone will be required to keep proof that they've complied with them whenever they're using it... Toy balloons, Frisbees and paper airplanes are exempt..." Failure to register can result in up to three years in jail, \$27,500 in civil penalties, and \$250,000 in criminal fines. (Not surprisingly, the FAA's web site is unable to keep up with the more than 45,000 registration requests in its first few days of operations.) [85294, 85300, 85476, 85691, 85936]

The Pentagon releases three documents to the *Miami Herald's* Carol Rosenberg in response to a Freedom of Information Act request—that she submitted on February 3, 2005. The letter to the journalist states, "I am sorry that this response was not provided in a more timely manner." [85959]

BizJournals.com reports on Toyota's decision to move its North American headquarters from Torrance, California to Plano, Texas: "The main driver of Toyota's move... was housing costs, according to Albert Niemi Jr., dean of the Cox School of Business at Southern Methodist University, who has inside knowledge about the move. Niemi shared the anecdote at an SMU Cox Economic Outlook Panel on Friday morning. 'It wasn't so much that we don't tax income [Texas has no state income tax],' he said. 'It was really about affordable housing. That's what started the conversation. They had focus groups with their employees. Their people said, 'We're willing to move. We just want to live the American Dream.' Toyota did the math and found that housing costs in Los Angeles County, where Torrance is located, are three times per square foot the cost of a house in Dallas-Fort Worth. 'They're paying the same salary,' Niemi said. 'So in real terms, they're going to triple the affordability of housing they can buy if they move to Texas.'" (California will lose about 3,000 good-paying jobs.) [85359, 85360, 85361]

Those on the political left consistently fail to understand that increasing taxes generates additional tax revenue only until the individual or company being taxed "cries uncle" and relocates. Pharmaceutical company Pfizer recently announced a deal to buy Allerganand relocate to Ireland. Donald Trump states, "The fact that Pfizer is leaving our country with a tremendous loss of jobs is disgusting." It is also predictable, considering the fact that the United States has the highest corporate tax rate in the developed world. At NationalReview.com Kevin D. Williamson writes, "Politicians create economic incentives for firms to do certain things, such as park their foreign earnings abroad, and then howl when companies respond rationally to the incentives the politicians created. This is usually followed by denunciation, which is the mode the Democrats and some Republicans are in, lambasting as 'unpatriotic,' 'deserters,' 'traitors,' and guilty of economic 'treason' the companies in question. ... Hillary Clinton has suggested simply seizing the assets of companies that relocate abroad. (She calls this an 'exit tax,' but it is, in fact, ransom.) Jeb Bush and quondam [former] Democrat Donald Trump both have put forward punitive measures to discourage tax inversions. The problem is plunder by politicians, and the answer politicians are giving is: more plunder. ... Capital just wants to be loved. It will go where it is most welcome. At DailySignal.com Mike Needham writes, "As Obamacare's implosion continues to unfold, Democrat lawmakers have been desperate to postpone some of the law's most adverse impacts on Americans. Now it appears K Street lobbyists have convinced some Republican lawmakers to join their Democrat colleagues by attempting to delay the socalled 'Cadillac tax,' which is an excise tax on all plans offered by employers above a specified amount. In an Associated Press/GfK poll, only 28 percent of adults surveyed said Obama had "clearly explained the United States' goals in fighting the Islamic State, while 68 percent said he had not." [85370]

In a December 10-13, "post-Muslim-ban" Monmouth University poll, Donald Trump reaches 41 percent. Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) is in second place with 14 percent, followed by Senator Marco Rubio (R-FL) at 10 percent, and Ben Carson at 9. All other candidates have 3 percent support or less. Trump's favorable/unfavorable percentages are 61/29. [85295, 85367]

In an NBC/Wall Street Journal poll, Hillary Clinton would defeat Trump 50-40 and Ted Cruz 48-45, while she would lose to Marco Rubio 45-48 and Ben Carson 46-47. [85346, 85347, 85348]

Donald Trump releases a report from his long-term physician, Dr. Harold N. Bornstein, indicating that the candidate is in excellent health. Bornstein states, "Mr. Trump has had a recent complete medical examination that showed only positive results. Actually, his blood pressure, 110/65, and laboratory test results were astonishingly excellent." (Hillary Clinton will at some point be pressured to release a medical report of some form. It will almost certainly be vague.) [85313, 85314, 85315]

Rush Limbaugh criticizes Donald Trump, saying, "One thing here, I'm questioning the way Trump went after [Senator Ted] Cruz here, calling him a maniac, refusing to work with people in the Senate, the reason I am focusing on that folks is because it's so unlike Trump. I mean, that's a huge mistake, but, on paper it's a huge mistake. Trump gets away with his mistakes, such is the bond of loyalty his support base has for him that he gets away with them and I don't think he's made that many, don't misunderstand. But for any of you that [sic; who] are holding out hope that Trump is a genuine conservative, even in the Republican field, would not go after Cruz this way [sic]. That just raised a red flag for me." [85319, 85320, 85321, 85341]

Mark Levin also has a word for Trump: "It was a bad few days for my friend, our friend Donald Trump, in my view. I hope he learns from it. If he doesn't and stands firm and he keeps sticking it to conservatives and keeps promoting the establishment and promoting big government programs, it'll have an effect on him and you. This has to be the dumbest strategy yet, defending the establishment. Trashing Cruz? Look, there are things you can question Cruz about, his past position on immigration, his past position on trade, substantive, positions you can question him about. This is not that! You and I rally around him and have because of the way he's taken on the establishment, because of the establishment that Trump's taking on. So why raise a stupid issue?" [85345]

General Robert B. Abrams, head of Army Forces Command at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, announces that Sergeant Bowe Bergdahl will, in fact, face a court-martial on charges of desertion and endangering troops. (National Security Advisor Susan Rice has stated that Bergdahl "served with honor and distinction.") If convicted, Bergdahl faces a possible life sentence (or even a death sentence). (Abrams overrules Lieutenant General Kenneth Dahl, who had recommended lesser charges and called any jail sentence for Bergdahl "inappropriate." Obama will not be pleased.) Bergdahl's arraignment will be December 22, on charges of "desertion with intent to shirk important or hazardous duty" and "endangering the safety of a command, unit, or place." Asked about the Bergdahl issue, White House press secretary Josh Earnest tells reporters, "Unfortunately in this instance, I'm very, very limited in what I can say about this ongoing mater. This is a case that is currently working its way through the military justice process, and as the spokesperson for the commander in chief, there's a lot of sensitivity about the potential for influencing the outcome of that military justice proceeding. So, I'm really not able to react even in the most general terms to the latest twists and turns in the case." [85373]

FoxNews.com reports, "The FBI played a central role in making a botched 'payment' meant to help secure Army Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl's release last year, according to the office of a House Republican now seeking answers on why the bureau was involved at all in the apparent rescue attempt." Congressman Duncan Hunter (R-CA), "who has long questioned whether a ransom of some kind was offered for Bergdahl's release... claimed in a recent letter to the Justice Department inspector general that he has learned 'non-DoD [non-Department of Defense] organizations, led by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), undertook the recovery mission." The FBI allegedly paid an illegal ransom for Bergdahl's release, but the Afghan intermediary "then ran off with the money." Bergdahl was eventually released in a trade for five Taliban leaders Obama released from Guantanamo. [85323]

Investigative reporter Sharyl Attkisson reports that YouTube.com has suspended her account and blocked her from posting videos of her *Full Measure* television reports. YouTube provides no explanation. Twitchy.com notes that Attkisson, "formerly an investigative reporter with CBS, recently launched Full Measure News. Those who have followed Attkisson on Twitter know that she has been relentless in her pursuit of stories that have been abandoned by the mainstream news, such as the Fast and Furious scandal and Benghazi." (Attkisson's YouTube channel is later restored, also with no explanation.)

It is worth noting that Google owns YouTube, and former Google CEO Eric Schmidt is a strong supporter of Obama.) [85353, 85354, 85379]

In an interview with Yahoo News' Olivier Knox, Obama says, "I am absolutely persuaded, as are my top intelligence and military advisers, that Guantanamo is used as a recruitment tool for organizations like ISIS, and if we want to fight 'em, then we can't give 'em these kinds of excuses." (The argument is ludicrous. Even if the terrorist detainees were moved from Guantanamo to prison in the United States, there is no reason to believe that action would lead ISIS and other groups to put down their weapons and stop recruiting.) Obama also says he expected that only "a handful" of Guantanamo detainees released since 2002 would go back to fighting. *The Weekly Standard's* Stephen Hayes points out that the "handful' of Guantanamo recidivists ...is nearly 200." Donald Trump on the other hand had a 'small intimate gathering' for 5000 to 7000 fans! ...I became the opening act for the man I believe is the next President of the United States. It was like opening for Mick Jagger and the Rolling Stones. This wasn't a political rally... it was a rock concert! ...I used this opportunity to spend quality time and talk to the Trump supporters. I got to really *know* them. And what I found is the reason Donald will win the GOP nomination and eventually...the Presidency of the United States. The reason is Donald is the hero of working class Americans. Donald's fan base is plumbers, electricians, construction workers, taxi drivers, secretaries, hairdressers, cops, firemen and yes, in Las Vegas—casino workers. Donald is a man of the people." "I know it's ironic. It took a business mogul worth \$10 billion to bring working class Americans to the GOP, but Donald did it. These people—almost to a man and woman have either never voted before, or voted only Democrat in the past, or voted once for a Republican in their lives—Ronald Reagan. These are Reagan Democrats and blue dog Democrats and independents. This is great news for the GOP. The media keeps saying the GOP needs to expand their tent. On December 15, 2015 all public schools in Los Angeles are closed because of an alleged "credible" terrorist threat via an email message to a member of the school board. LATimes.com reports, "The Los Angeles email threat was traced to an IP address in Frankfurt, Germany, according to law enforcement sources. ...The email was very specific to LA Unified campuses and included all of them, LAPD Chief Charlie Beck said. The implied threat included mention of explosive devices, 'assault rifles and machine pistols. These are obviously things we take very seriously,' Beck said." (No bombs are found. In fact, the New York City school system received the same threat and left its schools open. The email may have been a hoax, or it may have been a probe by terrorists to learn how the school systems would react to a threat.) [85349, 85352, 85372, 85393, 85405]

The school system informs parents to show proper photo ID when picking up their children from the schools. (Spicy Elf tweets, "Please also bring that same ID when you intend to cast a vote in America. Thank You.") [85351]

Katie Pavlich writes at Townhall.com, "Five years ago today, Marine and Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry was killed in a firefight by Mexican bandits. The firearms used by the criminals who killed him were part of the Obama Justice Department's Operation Fast and Furious. As a reminder, ATF agents allowed more than 2,500 AK-47s and other firearms to be purchased and trafficked by known Mexican cartel members through Fast and Furious. Hundreds of people have been killed as a result of the program, which was secret until ATF whistleblower John Dodson exposed it after Terry's death in 2010. ...Today, not a single ATF agent has been fired as a result of the operation. Terry's killers have been sentenced to life in prison after being found guilty on a variety of different charges, including first degree murder. ...May he rest in peace and may his family one day see complete justice." (The scheme was designed to boost gun violence and prompt Americans to demand new gun control legislation. No one has ever been held accountable for the operation. Obama and Eric Holder should have been impeached, indicted, convicted, and jailed.) [85344]

Congressman Phil Roe (R-TN) drafts legislation to remove from public housing families that are ineligible to receive the subsidized benefit because they earn too much money. According to WJHL.com, a federal audit "uncovered 25,000 over-income families living

in public housing nationwide making up to a million dollars." The proposed legislation "would require overincome families to move out of public housing if they've made 125% over the median area income for at least a year." [85871, 85872]

Pat Buchanan writes, "With the two-thirds rule dead, the only way to have a convention without a nominee on the first ballot is a three- or four-way split in delegates. But assume at the GOP convention in Cleveland that Trump runs first, Ted Cruz second, Marco Rubio third and Ben Carson fourth. Rather than wait for Karl Rove & Co. to tell us whom the party shall nominate, Trump would phone Cruz, offer him second spot on the ticket in return for his delegates, and if Cruz declined, ask for Rubio's phone number. French police arrest two men and one women in connection with the November 13 terrorist attacks in Paris. [85389, 85390]

Ansa.it reports, "In Rome, A Palestinian and a Tunisian national were arrested after they tried to disarm soldiers stationed outside Santa Maria Maggiore cathedral while yelling 'Allah (God) is great,' Rome police said Tuesday. When police intervened, the two men aged 40 and 30 called other foreigners in the area to their aid, and assaulted and threatened the arresting officers. After they were taken to the police station, they continued to speak out against law enforcement and Europe in both Arabic and Italian. They were charged with resisting and threatening an officer and instigation to commit a crime with intent to commit terrorist acts, slapped with an expulsion order, and taken to a migrant reception center in the southern city of Bari prior to repatriation." JihadWatch.org reports, "The Danish police claim that they are 'more pressed than ever,' mainly because of the terror threat and the migrant crisis. The rule of law is already undermined, as the police—as a result of being overburdened with handling Muslims—will no longer investigate thefts of less than 15,000 euros [about \$16,456, in mid-December 2015]. Even if you call the police while the burglars are still to be seen inside your neighbour's house, they will not come. The police are now requesting that the National Guard prepare to help, possibly even armed, in a situation of terrorism." [85400]

At WND.com Douglas Ernst reports, "A detained German terrorist told authorities that Chancellor Angela Merkel can expect an Islamic blitzkrieg from returning fighters. Lawyers for a disillusioned member of the Islamic State group say the man, known only as Harry S, wants to 'come clean.' The 27-year-old from Bremen told Der Spiegel that he 'saw it all' and wants to talk. …Harry S said he was twice approached by ISIS members in the spring to conduct terror attacks inside Germany, but told them he was not ready. He fled Syria in the middle of the night after months of witnessing executions." [85569, 85595]

Politico.com reports, "Two senior Democratic lawmakers are asking their colleagues to bring a Muslim-American guest to the State of the Union in protest of Donald Trump's recent proposal to ban Muslims from entering the U.S. In a letter sent to House Democrats and Republicans on Tuesday, Rep. Debbie Wasserman Schultz [D-FL], the chairwoman of the Democratic National Committee, and Rep. Keith Ellison [D-MN], the first Muslim elected to Congress, said lawmakers should bring Muslim-Americans to the Jan. 12 speech as a way to rebut anti-Muslim rhetoric." [85444]

Ben Carson releases a statement: "Our country faces grave national security threats. We must act boldly and decisively to protect American citizens from terrorists at home and abroad. We can no longer dawdle while ISIS continues to persecute Christians, enslave young girls, oppress civil societies and perpetrate terrorist attacks against the free world. We must destroy their caliphate and prevent their terrorists from infiltrating our homeland. We must also secure our borders, identify radical Islamic extremism by name and root out its agents and collaborators in our own country. My 'Seven Steps for a Safer America' offers a path forward for confronting these threats and protecting this great country. …The Department of State should designate the Muslim Brotherhood and other organizations that propagate or support Islamic terrorism as terrorist organizations, and fully investigate the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR) as an offshoot of the Muslim Brotherhood and a supporter of terrorism." In an ABC/Washington Post poll, Donald Trump leads GOP rivals with 38 percent, followed by Ted Cruz (15), Ben Carson (12), Marco Rubio (12), and Jeb Bush (5). Rated on the issues of "strongest leader," "would bring needed change," and "best chance of winning presidency" Trump is far in front with 54, 51, and 47 percent. [85369]

In a Public Policy Polling survey, Trump leads in Iowa with 28 percent; Cruz has 25; Rubio, 14; Carson, 10; Bush, 7. [85378]

According to a Pew Research Center poll, "[S]ince the start of this year, the share of Americans who say the government is doing well in reducing the threat of terrorism has fallen by 26 percentage points—from 72% to 46%—and now stands at its lowest point in the post-9/11 era. Approval of the way Barack Obama is handling the threat of terrorism also has declined, even as his overall job rating (currently 46%)—and his ratings on immigration, the economy and other issues—is little changed. Just 37% approve of the way Obama is handling terrorism while 57% disapprove, the lowest rating of his presidency for this issue." [85467, 85468, 85480]

According to an Economist/YouGov poll, 53 percent of adults view Hillary Clinton "as dishonest and untrustworthy compared to 31 percent who view her as trustworthy and honest." [85533]

At a swearing-in ceremony for 31 new U.S. citizens, Obama says, "You may come from teeming cities or rural villages. You don't look alike. You don't worship the same way. But here... you've raised your hand and sworn a sacred oath. I'm proud to be among the first to greet you as my fellow Americans." Obama criticizes those who fear Muslim immigrants, saying, "In the Syrian seeking refuge today, we should see the Jewish refugee of World War II." (Obama ignores the fact that there were no ISIS terrorists hiding amongst the Jewish refugees of World War II.) "...We succumbed to fear. We betrayed these [founding] documents. It's happened before. And the biggest irony is that those who betrayed these values were themselves the children of immigrants. How quickly we forget. One generation passes, two generations, and suddenly we don't remember where we came from." (How quickly Obama forgot about September 11, 2001, the Boston Marathon bombing, the San Bernardino terrorist attack, Fort Hood, the "shoe bomber," the "underwear bomber," et al.) NYTimes.com reports, "Defense Secretary Ashton B. Mr. Carter continued the practice, which violated Defense Department rules, for at least two months after it was publicly revealed in March that Hillary Clinton had exclusively used a personal email account as secretary of state, the officials said." (The White House reportedly learned of the policy violation in May.) [85469, 85470, 85499]

Estimates for this year's upcoming Obama vacation in Hawaii come in at about \$3.7 million. Judicial Watch president Tom Fitton comments, "The Obamas' travel is out of control. They are treating the Air Force One like an Uber ride, and [Barack] Obama seems oblivious to the burden he is placing on Americans with his continuous vacations, getaways, and political junkets at taxpayer expense." The Republican presidential candidates debate in Las Vegas, Nevada. For viewers seeking attacks, rather than substance, Marco Rubio and Ted Cruz go after each other, and Jeb Bush says, "[Donald] Trump is great at one-liners, but he's a chaos candidate. And he'd be a chaos president. He would not be the commander-in-chief we need to keep our country safe." (To many observers, there are probably no clear winners in the debate. None likely picked up or lost more than a percentage point or two of support. The biggest loser may be Bush, whose aggressiveness likely turned some people off, and who fumbled his way through a closing statement that he should have memorized better.) During the debate, Trump reaffirms that he will not desert the Republican party and run as an independent. [85386, 85423]

Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) says, "It is not a lack of competence that is preventing the Obama administration from stopping these attacks, it is political correctness." [85412]

Carly Fiorina, who has criticized Hillary Clinton for "playing the gender card," plays it herself, saying, "Margaret Thatcher once said, 'If you want something talked about, ask a man. If you want something done, ask a woman." (Having appeared on *The View* several times, Fiorina should know that statement does not apply to all women.) [85412]

Senator Rand Paul (R-KY): "Charity is about giving your own money. Charity isn't giving someone else's money." [85412]

New Jersey Governor Chris Christie: "The American people are not whispering to us. They are screaming to us that it's our job to make this government work. It's so dysfunctional. It's so ineffective." Christie also calls Obama "a feckless weakling." [85412, 85428]

John Kasich: "And for the Russians, frankly, it's time that we punched the Russians in the nose. They've gotten away with too much in this world, and we need to stand up against them, not just there, but also in Eastern Europe where they threaten some of our most precious allies." (To whom this statement will appeal is not clear.) [85439]

Christie declares he would shoot down Russian planes violating no-fly zones: "Not only would I be prepared to do it; I would do it. A no-fly zone means a no-fly zone, Wolf [Blitzer]. That's what it means. See, maybe, maybe because I'm from New Jersey, I just have this kind of plain language hang-up. But I would make very clear—I would... talk

to Vladimir Putin a lot. But I'd say to him, 'Listen, Mr. President, there's a no-fly zone in Syria; you fly in, it applies to you.'" [85439]

Rand Paul: "Well, I think if you're in favor of World War III, you have your candidate [Christie]. My goodness, what we want in a leader is someone with judgment, not someone who is so reckless as to stand on the stage and say, 'Yes, I'm jumping up and down; I'm going to shoot down Russian planes.' Russia already flies in that airspace. It may not be something we're in love with, the fact that they're there, but they were invited by Iraq and by Syria to fly in that airspace. And so if we announce we're going to have a no-fly zone—and others have said this. Hillary Clinton is also for it. It is a recipe for disaster. It's a recipe for World War III. We need to confront Russia from a position of strength, but we don't need to confront Russia from a point of recklessness that would lead to war." [85439]

In his closing statement, Paul says, "The greatest threat to our national security is our debt. We borrow a million dollars a minute. And whose fault is it? Well, frankly, it's both parties' fault. You have those on the right who clamor and say, oh, we will spend anything on the military, and those on the left who say the same for domestic welfare. But what most Americans don't realize is there is an unholy alliance. They come together. There's a secret handshake. We spend more money on everything. And we are not stronger nation if we go further into debt. We are not projecting power from bankruptcy court. To me, there is no greater threat than our debt. I'm the only fiscal conservative on the stage because I'm willing to hold the line on all spending." [85441]

At Breitbart.com Milo Yiannopoulos explains, "Trump is right not only that limiting or knocking out the internet is the best way of hampering Islamic State, but also because there is at least one solution that is eminently feasible. It's just that sneering commentators aren't educated enough to know about it. ...Any traffic intended for Islamic State, on about 95 per cent of the internet, could be redirected to the United States and then 'nullrouted'—essentially, dumped into a black hole, perhaps after being analyzed by the NSA or the military. According to DailySignal.com, Republicans "are able to brag about at least some policy provisions included in the spending bill, most significantly measures ending a 40year-old ban on oil exports and stopping what Republicans refer to as a 'bailout' of Obamacare's risk corridor program for health insurers." But Democrats won on other issues: "The bill does not contain measures restricting the Syrian refugee program, ending funding for Obama's executive actions on immigration, or defunding Planned Parenthood." The bill—which also includes \$3 billion for Obama's "Green Climate Fund"—will pass, despite conservative objections (and despite no one actually reading it), because of Democrat support. Breitbart.com argues that the \$1.1 trillion bill fund's Obama's "fundamental transformation of America" because it fully funds Obama's DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) program; continues to fund sanctuary cities; continues to fund all refugee programs; continues to fund the Mideast immigration programs; funds illegal immigrant resettlement; funds the release of criminal aliens; quadruples the number of H-2B foreign worker visas; continues to fund tax credits for illegal aliens; locks in huge spending increases; fails to compete the border fence Congress ordered in 2006. (In other words, Obama could have written the legislation.) House Democrats introduce the "Assault Weapons Ban of 2015." According to TheHill.com, the legislation "would target semi-automatic and other military-style guns.

It would ensure that no such weapons are manufactured for consumer use, while placing new restrictions on the sale of already existing assault weapons. The legislation is backed by about 90 Democratic co-sponsors, but has no hope of passing through Congress, given opposition from Republicans. The gun lobby argues that the bill would affect many lawabiding hunters who use assault weapons." [85473]

Insurance company HealthSpan announces it will stop selling individual and small-group health plans on the ObamaCare exchanges. About 166,000 customers will be affected. [85534]

For the first time in almost 10 years, the Federal Reserve raises its main interest rate. The 0.25 percent hike was widely anticipated. The federal Reserve states, "The stance of monetary policy remains accommodative after this increase, thereby supporting further improvement in the labor market conditions and a return to 2 percent inflation." (That is, the agency is seeking to boost the official inflation rate to two percent.) The action is intended to signal that the government believes the economy is improving. In fact, the rate hike is necessary so that the rate can be lowered when the economy next stumbles. [85396, 85422]

Economist Marc Faber comments, "[I]t's precisely the wrong time [to raise interest rates]. The global economy has decelerated very badly, and many countries are already in recession, or going into recession." [85438, 85516]

At PJMedia.com Roger L. Simon writes, "No more bets, ladies and gentlemen. The game is over. Donald Trump has won the nomination." [85481]

The Associated Press (apparently afraid to write "terrorist attack") tweets that Obama will "meet with families of the victims of this month's mass shooting in San Bernardino." [85416, 85417]

FBI Director James Comey classifies the July 16 terrorist attack in Chattanooga, Tennessee as a terrorist attack. He states, "The Chattanooga killer was inspired by a foreign terror organization. It's hard to entangle which particular source ...there are lots of competing poisons out there." [85515, 85594]

The Independent reports, "Two suspected ISIS militants believed to have links to the Paris attacks have been found posing as refugees in Austria. The two men were found in a transit camp for asylum seekers in Salzburg at the weekend, reportedly carrying fake Syrian passports after travelling from territory held by the so-called Islamic State. Austria's *Kronen Zeitung* reported that the suspects are French, with Algerian or Pakistani heritage, and were awaiting orders for further terror attacks. They are believed to have entered Europe via Greece and travelled along the Western Balkan route used by hundreds of thousands of refugees fleeing conflict in the Middle East and Africa." A judge declares a mistrial after jurors become deadlocked in the trial of William Porter, one of the Baltimore police officer charged in the death of Freddie Gray. Outside the courthouse, protesters chant, "No justice, no peace!" State's Attorney Marilyn Mosby "looked visibly upset," according to CNN. (That may be because Mosby over-charged Porter—with misconduct in office, involuntary manslaughter, second-degree assault, and reckless endangerment—which collectively may have been a bridge too far for the jurors—who, it is later reported, voted 11-to-1 to acquit Porter.) According to figures obtained by FoxNews.com, "Some 102,313 Syrians were granted admission to the U.S. as legal permanent residents or through programs including work, study and tourist visas from 2012 through August of this year, a period which roughly coincides with the devastating civil war that still engulfs the Middle Eastern country. public squares? Why has the "moderate" largest Islamic university in the world, Al Azhar, never issued a fatwa of death against ISIS fighters and anyone who joins ISIS? They issue fatwas of death on apostates and women who have sex outside of marriage all the time, so how come none against those jihadists who supposedly ruined Islam's reputation and caused the world to fear Muslims? How come ...Obama did not demand just that from Al Azhar or from Saudi Arabia, to prove to the anxious American people that the 99.9% of Muslims are on our side?" [85456]

"...If jihadists and terrorists were only 0.1%, we would not have the worldwide Islamic terrorism of today. The number of the criminal population in most societies, Western and non-Western, is certainly more than 0.1%, and most societies, especially in the West, are perfectly capable of controlling their criminal population, and are capable in creating law and order and safety and security for their own citizens. How come the 0.1% of radical Muslims is capable of causing millions of Muslim refugees, and how come rich Arab countries are not taking care of them? Survey after survey keeps confirming our fears that the majority of Muslims are for killing apostates. ... I have yet to see fatwas of death against jihadists in the Arab media or from Muslim political and religious leaders. It is clear where the heart of those who call themselves moderate Muslims is. "Moderate Muslims are confused people, and have been violently and harshly trained over centuries to never think for themselves. Moderate Muslims are suffering from a pathology that allows them to believe in two opposite ideas at the same time and feel perfectly comfortable with them. In their minds, there is no contradiction at all when they say: 'Islam is a religion of peace,' and they have no problem with commandments in the Quran to kill and terrorize the infidels. The confusion in the West about moderate vs. radical Islam is not by accident, but by design, because no one wants to do anything about it; not Western leaders, and not even the 99.9% of nice Muslims." JihadWatch.org reports, "A Middle Eastern woman was caught surveilling a U.S. port of entry on the Mexican border holding a sketchbook with Arabic writing and drawings of the facility and its security system, federal law enforcement sources tell Judicial Watch. The woman has been identified as 23-year-old Leila Abdelrazaq, according to a Customs and Border Patrol (CPB) report obtained by JW this week. Abdelrazaq appeared to have two accomplices, a 31-year-old man named Gabriel Schivone and a 28-year-old woman named Leslie Mcafee. CBP agents noticed the trio 'observing the facilities' at the Port of Mariposa in Nogales, Arizona on December 2. Schivone was first noticed inside the entrance of the pedestrian area while the two women stood outside by the entry door, the CPB document states." [85458, 85459, 85479]

NYTimes.com reports, "The authorities in Belgium said on Wednesday that one of the Paris attackers may have been holed up in a house in Brussels two nights after 130 people were killed and hundreds more injured—but that he could have escaped because of a law banning police raids on private homes from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., according to the country's justice minister." [85471]

The *Times* also reports that Defense Secretary Ashton Carter "has notified Congress in recent days that he has approved 17 proposed transfers of lower-level detainees [from Guantanamo]. ...Obama wants to close the Guantánamo prison in Cuba before he leaves office in a little over a year. His administration has stepped up efforts to find countries to take 48 detainees on a transfer list and moved to speed up the work of a parole-like board that might approve the release of others who are currently recommended for indefinite detention." (Because Obama cannot persuade Congress to permit the transfer of detainees to the United States, it appears he is simply going to release them, one at a time, until the facility is empty.) Obama's most significant Guantanamo problem is likely Khalid Sheikh Mohammed (KSM), the mastermind of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks (and other attacks). It is beyond the realm of possibility that Obama would release him, even if another nation promised to take him and keep him under lock and key for the remainder of his lifetime. But the likelihood that Obama could successfully transfer KSM to a U.S. prison is close to zero. The political uproar of the release or transfer of the terrorist would be monumental. At WND.com Cheryl Chumley reports that Obama "went behind closed doors, and off official White House schedule, to meet with former New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg—the nanny of city governance who's helped finance a massive campaign to challenge with National Rifle Association—and discuss gun control." [85485]

The Augusta County, Virginia school board announces that schools will be closed on December 18 and all weekend extra-curricular activities will be canceled—out of an "abundance of caution." The action is in response to parent outrage over geography teacher Cheryl LaPorte's calligraphy assignment in which students were told to write the Muslim statement of faith. (The "shahada" reads, "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is the messenger of Allah.") [85502, 85503, 85504, 85505, 85596]

While many schools across the country prohibit religious songs in Christmas programs in order to not offend Muslims or atheists, some parents in Blaine, Minnesota are angry over a choir teacher's decision to include a song about Ramadan in a holiday concert. The song's lyrics include, "Allahu akbar." (Although the media typically suggests that Allahu Akbar means "Allah is great" or "God is great," Jihad Watch's Robert Spencer notes that it actually means "Allah is greater," or "*Allah Is Greater Than Your God or Government.* It is the aggressive declaration that Allah and Islam are dominant over every other form

of government, religion, law or ethic, which is why Islamic jihadists in the midst of killing infidels so often shout it. One primary purpose of shouting is to 'strike terror in the hearts of the enemies of Allah.'") [85517, 85518, 85522, 85565, 85572, 85801]

In Camden County, Missouri, authorities are notified after "Middle Eastern men" ask about renting a boat so that they could tour Bagnell Dam. [85519, 85520]

Breitbart.com reports, "As many as 1000 migrants have been involved in a plan to storm the Calais entrance to the Channel Tunnel in a bid to reach England, some armed with iron bars and hammers. The A16 road into Calais had to be shut for an hour as police fired tear gas at the crowd to drive them back. Vigilant locals have taken to the Facebook group 'Les Calaisians en Colère' (Calaisians are Angry) to warn that gangs of around 50-60 migrants at a time were working to bring traffic to a standstill as their accomplices attacked the tunnel." [85506, 85507]

A bomb is discovered at the Fishergate Shopping Center in Preston, England. The device is detonated safely. [85510, 85511]

In Paris, 14 people are mildly injured after being poisoned by a toxic substance left on an electronic keypad at a synagogue. [85512]

A Jewish cemetery in Poland is desecrated with spray-painted messages: "Fuck Jews!" "Islam will dominate" "Islamic State was here" and Allah bless Hitler." [85513]

Jalil Ibn Ameer Aziz, 19, is charged in a criminal complaint unsealed by the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania. The Harrisburg, Pennsylvania resident is charged with providing material support to ISIS, using at least 57 Twitter accounts to encourage jihad against the United States and help others travel for the cause. Aziz posted the names and addresses of about 100 U.S. military members and called for violence against them. In addition, authorities found "a tactical-style backpack in his closet, which contained high-capacity weapons magazines, ammunition, a knife, and other survival items." (In one of his messages Aziz discussed "buying one girl" once he arrives in the Islamic State. "I just want one girl 17 years old.") [85563, 85564, 85577, 85602, 85615, 85619]

Newly-elected Brooklyn Civil Court Judge Carolyn Walker-Diallo is sworn in on a Qur'an. NYDailyNews.com reports, "The swearing-in session went off without a hitch, but after attendees posted video of the ceremony to social media, the backlash became so severe that some of Walker-Diallo's supporters became concerned for her safety. 'Sickening,' one Facebook user posted in response to the video. 'Is this America or the Middle East.' 'Another piece of s--- Muslim,' another user wrote, 'trying to take over this country.'" (Pamela Geller comments, "The Koran forbids allegiance to non-Muslim authority, so isn't this Muslima's vow worthless? How can she serve two masters at once? In Islam, sharia supersedes all manmade laws. It is the law of Allah. The Koran dictates that Islam is in a perpetual war against all infidels until a sharia-dominant world is established. Which master will she serve in this conflict? I find the circus that followed her swearing in [Arabic singing and dancing in the chamber] to be outrageous and contemptuous of American legal traditions.") [85834, 85835, 85836]

At a House Oversight and Government Reform Committee hearing, chairman Jason Chaffetz (R-UT) asks Assistant Secretary of State Michele Bond, "The [State] Department has revoked approximately 122,000 visas for a variety of reasons including nearly 9500 with links to terrorism. Of the 122,000 revoked visas, how many of those people are still in the United States?" Bond replies, "I don't know." Chaffetz asks Alan Bersin, Assistant Secretary for International Affairs at the Department of Homeland Security, "Homeland Security, how many revoked visas are still in the United States of America." Bersin responds, "I don't have that." (Translation: The State Department has revoked 9,500 visas and the Obama administration has no clue where in the United States any of those people may be.) Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich reports, "The attorney defending Juan Francisco Lopez-Sanchez, the five-time deported illegal alien accused of murdering 32-year-old Kate Steinle in San Francisco earlier this year, is asking for murder charges to be dropped in the case and argues the entire incident was simply an accident. Last month Kate's Law, which would require a maximum five-year prison term for criminal illegal aliens who are caught reentering the country, was blocked by Senate Democrats." [85466]

Enrique Marquez, pal of San Bernardino terrorist Syed Farook, is finally arrested. He will likely be charged with conspiring to provide material support to terrorism, making a false statement in connection with the acquisition of firearms, and immigration fraud. KTLA.com reports, "The immigration fraud charge is connected to Marquez's 'sham marriage' to Farook's sister-in-law's sister—Mariya Chernykh. He is believed by authorities to have bought two assault rifles used by Farook and Farook's wife, Tashfeen Malik, in the December 2 mass shooting and terror attack that left 14 people dead in the Southern California city." Russian President Vladimir Putin says Donald Trump is "a very colorful character and talented. ...He's the absolute leader in the presidential race. He's said that he wants to move to a new level of ties, closer and deeper ties with Russia. How couldn't we welcome that? Of course we welcome it." [85486, 85489, 85538]

Rush Limbaugh tells his radio listeners, "The country was just sold down the river again by your very Republican Party. I have a headline here from the Washington Times: 'White House Declares Total Victory Over GOP in Budget Battle.' That headline's a misnomer. There was never a battle. None of this was opposed. The Republican Party didn't stand up to any of it, and the die has been cast for a long time on this. I know many of you are dispirited, depressed, angry, [a] combination of all of that. But, folks, there was no other way this could go. Because two years ago when the Republican Party declared they would never do anything that would shut down the government and they would not impeach Obama, there were no obstacles in Obama's way and there were no obstacles in the way of the Democrat Party. When you surrender the power of the purse—and that's the primary power the House of Representatives has. Not a penny of money can be spent in this country by this government without the House of Representatives authorizing it. Obama can spend all he wants, but if the House doesn't give him the mechanism, he can't spend any of it. But the Republicans squandered that. They gave up the power of the purse. The reason they did that is because for some inexplicable reason, they are literally paranoid and scared to death of even being accused of doing something that would shut down the government." Betrayal is pretty bad, but it's worse than that. This was out-and-out, in-our-face lying, from the campaigns to individual statements made about the philosophical approach Republicans had to all this spending. ...If Donald Trump didn't exist and if the Republican Party actually does want to win someday, they'd have to invent him. It's just mind-boggling when you figure out everything that has been granted Obama. All the money, the tax increases, the Cadillac plans in Obamacare. Of the \$1.1 trillion spending bill Donald Trump says, "The only special interest not being served by our government is the American people. To avoid a government shutdown, a cowardly threat from an incompetent President, the elected Republicans in Congress threw in the towel and showed absolutely no budget discipline. ... The American people will have to absorb higher deficits, greater debt, less economic liberty and more corporate welfare. Congress cannot seem to help itself in bending to every whim of special interests. How can they face their constituents when they continue to burden our children and grandchildren with debts they will never be able to repay? Geller also writes, "Jihadis have vowed murderous terror attacks against American and European civilians. It will get much worse, while our leaders work hard to assure us that it has nothing to do with Islam. The Islamic State boasted that it would soon flood Europe with as many as 500,000 refugees. And the Lebanese Education Minister recently said that there were 20,000 jihadis among the refugees in camps in his country. He explained their purpose: 'It's our dream that there should be a caliphate not only in Syria but in all the world, and we will have it soon, inshallah.' These Muslims were going to Europe in the service of that caliphate: 'They are going like refugees,' he said, but they were going with the plan of sowing blood and mayhem on European streets. As he told this to journalists, he smiled and said, 'Just wait.''' [85568]

Breitbart.com reports, "A group of seven men sang a war-chant favoured by the Islamic State and tried to recruit fellow passengers while riding on the Berlin U-Bahn railway. Berlin police are investigating after a large group of suspected radical Islamists rode the underground train while prostelysing [sic; proselytizing] for the Islamic State late on Thursday night. Eye witnesses said they sang an Islamic song, spoke in Arabic and handed out leaflets about the Islamic State. Engaging other passengers in Arabic between stops in the historic centre of the city, one witness said the men were obviously 'advertising' for the Islamic State… Police are now reviewing security footage. A police spokesman said the force has determined the show was in support of a terrorist organisation." [85590, 85591]

TheBlaze.com reports that Obama "indicated during a private meeting with columnists that he 'did not see enough cable television to fully appreciate the anxiety after the attacks in Paris and San Bernardino,' the New York Times reported on Thursday. He also reportedly said he plans to 'step up his public arguments.' The comments, first reported by New York Times chief White House correspondent Peter Baker and reporter Gardiner Harris, were later seemingly scrubbed by the newspaper without an explanation in the story." (In other words, Obama thinks Americans watch too much Fox News and should not be so upset by terrorist attacks—which make him look bad. Once the *Times* realized its report made Obama look even worse, it removed the reference to Obama's remark. With his 24x7 Secret Service protection Obama, of course, has no reason to fear for his own personal safety. But he apparently believes unprotected Americans are foolish for

being concerned about their own safety—and want to hear him talk even more. Obama is clearly inside a bubble, surrounded by "yes men," and oblivious to what average Americans are going through and thinking.) The *Times* later claims the change was made for space reasons—but the revised story is longer than the one it replaced. [85523, 85525, 85530, 85550, 85558, 85573, 85575]

Obama grants clemency to 95 federal prisoners, most of whom were incarcerated for nonviolent drug offenses. According to DailySignal.com, "Inmates given clemency do not leave the prison system right away. They are sent to lower-security prisons and then halfway houses to ease their transition, before they are released from the custody of the Federal Bureau of Prisons... Most ex-inmates then have to undergo five years of probation." [85629, 85811]

Gutless House Republicans side with Democrats to approve the \$1.15 trillion spending bill. The vote is 316-113; 166 Democrats are joined by 150 Republicans. [85531, 85557]

House Speaker Paul Ryan (R-WI) says Obama called to thank him for "making government work." (That is, "Thanks for caving in and giving me what I wanted in the spending bill.") [85528]

The Senate then passes the legislation, 65-33, and sends it to Obama for his signature so that he and Congress can go on vacation—while the taxpayers get stuck with the \$1.1 trillion bill. (Campaigning in Iowa, Senator Marco Rubio (R-FL) misses the vote.) [85549, 85552]

At CrowsNestPoliticis.com, Ken Crow, former leader of Tea Party of America, writes, "All patriots should contact your group's leaders and begin organizing nationwide to put down this RINO [House Speaker Paul Ryan] in order that he is not re-elected to his seat in Wisconsin. The Badger State patriots need to begin soliciting your State Senators, high-profile business leaders or the State Legislators who reside within the 1st District of Wisconsin." [85733, 85734, 85843]

Senator Dick Durbin (D-IL) succeeds in blocking a ban on an Internet access tax. (According to Stephen Moore at Townhall.com, "Grinch Durbin has promised to hold this bill hostage unless he gets paid a ransom. He says he will only allow a permanent ban on Internet access taxes, if Congress votes to allow state and local sales taxes on Internet purchases. It's a game of pick your poison.") [85675]

Obama holds an end-of-year press conference before leaving for his holiday vacation in Hawaii. He says, "I said at the beginning of this year that interesting stuff happens in the fourth quarter and we are only halfway through. I plan on doing everything I can with every minute or every day I have left as president to deliver on behalf of the American people. Since taking office, I've never been more optimistic about a year ahead than I am right now." Obama claims, "Five years later, I was right about Syria." He ridicules Republicans for not believing in global warming and repeats his absurd claim that keeping terrorists at Guantanamo is a recruiting tool for ISIS. [85527, 85532, 85546, 85548, 85673]

Obama says, "We're going to defeat ISIS, and we're going to do so by systemically squeezing them, cutting off their supply lines, cutting off their financing, taking out their leadership, taking out their forces, taking out their infrastructure. We're going to do so in partnership with forces on the ground that sometimes are spotty, sometimes need capacity building, need our assistance, need our training, but we're seeing steady progress in many of these areas. And so they're going to be on the run." (The American people have not seen any evidence of that alleged progress.) "Now, in order for us to stamp them out thoroughly, we have to eliminate lawless areas in which they cannot still roam. There are still operatives who are interested in carrying out terrorist attacks because they still operate in areas between Pakistan and Afghanistan or more prominently right now in Yemen that are hard to reach." [85673]

"Our long-term goal has to be able to stabilize these areas so that they don't have any safe haven, and in order for us to do that in Syria, there has to be an end to the civil war. There has to be an actual government that has a police capacity and a structure in these areas that currently aren't governed." (Obama is delusional. Bashar al-Assad will be president of Syria long after Obama leaves the White House. Obama should be focusing on destroying ISIS, not eliminating Assad to please his Turkish buddy, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan.) [85673]

Obama lies when he tells reporters, "It's important to distinguish between [social media] posts that are public—social media on a Facebook page—versus private communications through carious social media or apps. In Riviera Beach, Florida, Old Dixie Highway is renamed President Barack Obama Highway. [85529, 85817]

According to a Heritage Foundation analysis, 95.5 million people in the United States are dependent on the government (via food stamps, disability benefits, food stamps, Pell Grants, the Earned Income Tax Credit, etc.). [85674]

In a Public Policy Polling survey, Donald Trump moves up 8 points from the prior poll and leads with 34 percent. Ted Cruz follows with 18 percent; Marco Rubio has 13; Jeb Bush, 7; Ben Carson, 6; Chris Christie, 5; Carly Fiorina, 4; Mike Huckabee, 4. Hillary Clinton leads Bernie Sanders 56-28. [85556] Trump leads a Fox News poll with 39 percent, followed by Cruz (18), Rubio (11), Carson (9), Jeb Bush (3), Carly Fiorina (3), Rand Paul (3), Chris Christie (3), and John Kasich (2). [85580, 85583]

In an interview with ForeignPolicy.com, former Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel says that Obama's refusal to act after Syrian President Bashar al-Assad crossed the chemical weapons "red line" was a mistake: "There's no question in my mind that it hurt the credibility of [Obama's] word when this occurred. A president's word is a big thing, and when the president says things, that's a big deal." Of the ISIS threat, Hagel says that in 2014, "I got accused of trying to hype something, overstate something, and make something more than it was. I didn't know all of it, but I knew we were up against something here that we had never seen before. And in many ways, we were not prepared for it." Hagel states that national security policy meetings "were not productive. I don't think many times we ever actually got to where we needed to be. We kept kind of deferring the tough decisions. And there were always too many people in the room. ... We seemed to veer away from the big issues. ... I eventually got to the point where I told Susan Rice that I wasn't going to spend more than two hours in these meetings. Some of them would go four hours." Hagel states, "There were times that I had called over and asked to have a private meeting with [Obama], and when I showed up, there were others in the room.' (Hagel does not say who those others were, but Valerie Jarrett-"Obama's brain"—was probably present.) [85547, 85553, 85559, 85581, 85582]

TheHill.com writes, "Tension between Hagel and other officials in …Obama's inner circle surfaced publicly last year, as the then-Defense chief and the White House disagreed over a number of policy initiatives. Hagel and White House national security adviser Susan Rice 'frequently butted heads' over Syria policy and the Guantánamo Bay detention facility, according to the Foreign Policy report. Hagel, who did not mention Rice by name, told the magazine that even after he agreed to leave the administration, some White House officials continued to anonymously knock him in the press. White House aides criticized him in a November 2014 New York Times report, claiming he was mostly silent in meetings in the Situation Room and made a decision on Guantanamo that annoyed Rice. 'They already had my resignation, so what was the point of just continuing to try to destroy me?' Hagel told Foreign Policy. 'I don't know what the purpose was,' he said of what he views as backstabbing by White House aides. 'To this day, I'm still mystified by that. But I move forward. I'm proud of my service.'" It is not surprising that Hagel would have problems dealing with Rice. She has been roundly criticized by many in the State Department and the military. In the 1990s, Rice worked with Richard Clark to persuade Bill Clinton *not* to accept Sudan's offer to hand over Osama bin Laden to the United States. Former Clinton staffer Mansoor Ijaz stated that efforts to capture or kill Osama bin Laden were "overruled every single time by the State Department, by Susan Rice and her cronies, who were Hell-bent on destroying the Sudan." The anti-Semite Rice, wife of ABC news producer Ian Cameron, also encouraged Clinton to do nothing to stop the Rwanda genocide. Rice has been considered

"wildly incompetent" by some Washington insiders, and one critic who has worked with her once stated, "She doesn't know what she doesn't know. And she doesn't tolerate dissenters. To have her head the U.S. mission to the U.N. is a mind-boggling decision. It is frightening." (Susan Rice and Valerie Jarrett may be the two most dangerous people in the Obama administration.) On December 19 Obama and his family arrive in Hawaii for their holiday vacation. The *Daily Mail* writes, "Obama's eighth consecutive Christmas vacation to Hawaii begins just as a new report published Thursday showed the total cost of Obama's vacations since taking office in January 2009 has now hit \$70.5 million. The costs are being savaged by a critical conservative group, which said Obama is treating Air Force One, which costs \$206,000/hour to run, 'like an Uber ride' ahead of his next jaunt to his home state, Tom Fitton, president of the Judicial Watch pressure group said. ...Obama has taken 23 vacations spanning all or part of 177 days, according to Mark Knoller, a CBS News White House correspondent who tracks presidential vacations." (For the record, George W. Bush never left for Christmas vacations until the day *after* Christmas—so that hundreds of Secret Service agents, staffers, and reporters could remain with their families in the Washington, D.C. area for the holiday.) The *Daily Mail* also reports that Abdelhamid Abaaoud, the mastermind behind the terrorist attacks in Paris, "had a photograph of one of Britain's busiest shopping centres on his mobile phone... West Midlands Police investigators revealed that Abaaoud's photograph [of Birmingham's Bullring] was among others of 'key and sensitive sites' in the city, said well-placed sources. The photos have led police to the 'frightening conclusion' that the terrorist ringleader was planning to bring carnage to England's second city similar to the events he unleashed in Paris on November 13. The Bullring is the most visited site in Birmingham, and receives almost 40 million shoppers a year. The claim that the shopping centre—with its futuristic-looking Selfridges store—may have been a key target for the cell behind the Paris attacks comes as hundreds of thousands of shoppers this week flock to its 160 shops to do their last-minute Christmas shopping." TheHill.com reports that Obama "has vetoed a pair of measures by congressional Republicans that would have overturned the main pillars of his landmark climate change rules for power plants. The decision was widely expected; Obama and his staff had repeatedly threatened the action as a way to protect a top priority and major part of his legacy. The White House announced... that he is formally not taking action on the congressional measures, which counts as a 'pocket veto' under the law." (With the veto of legislation to overturn Obama's Clean Power Plan, some coal-fired power plants will be forced to shut down.) [85637]

Breitbart.com reports, "The Hillary Clinton campaign is quietly making cash transfers to the Democratic National Committee (DNC) to fund state party efforts in the South. Breitbart News has obtained an email sent by Hillary Clinton deputy national political director Brynne Craig, 30, to a state party chairman. Craig assures the chairman that the Clinton campaign will be making another 'transfer' to the DNC. Then Craig said she would 'follow up to let you know the amount that is transferred.'" [85584, 85605]

Democrats candidates Hillary Clinton, Senator Bernie Sanders (I-VT), and former Maryland governor Martin O'Malley debate in Goffstown, New Hampshire. (Because it is Saturday night, only days before Christmas, and the competition is a new *Star Wars* movie, the debate has few viewers—about 6.7 million—which is precisely what Clinton and the Democrat National Committee want. The next Democrat debate is scheduled for Sunday, January 17, 2017—the same day as two NFL playoff games. The next GOP debate is Thursday, January 14.) [85579, 85575, 85599, 85603, 85705]

Sanders says he is running for president to address "the planetary crisis" caused by global warming. [86645]

Clinton says Americans "need to make sure that the really discriminatory messages that Trump is sending around the world don't fall on receptive ears. He is becoming ISIS's best recruiter. They are going to people, showing videos of Donald Trump insulting Islam and Muslims in order to recruit more radical jihadists. ...I want to explain why this is not in America's interest to react with this kind of fear and respond to this kind of bigotry. ...We have to reach out to Muslims and say, 'You are not our adversary. You are our partner.' Mr. Trump has a great capacity to use bluster and bigotry to inflame people." (There is no evidence that Trump's statements are prompting ISIS recruitment. In fact, it is Clinton and Obama who may be encouraging ISIS recruitment with their insistence that they will never put "boots on the ground" to defeat the terrorists. When radical Muslims see ISIS growing in size and are told they will never have to face U.S. troops in combat, they are naturally enticed by the option of joining a "winning team." "The U.S. is our enemy and it is afraid to fight back!" is probably far more appealing than "ISIS Wants You!") [85597, 85599, 85604, 85608, 85656, 85714]

Politifact later states, "We were unable to find any evidence to support this. The Clinton campaign did not provide any evidence that this is already happening—only that it could be happening, or that it may in the future. If ISIS was using Trump for recruitment videos, we would expect a frenzy of media coverage over it. We rate this claim False." (Actually, there is an ISIS propaganda/recruitment video called "No Respite" that features images of Obama, Vice President Joe Biden, Secretary of State John Kerry, "liar" George W. Bush, and "fornicator" Bill Clinton. Trump later calls Clinton a liar and demands an apology for calling him an ISIS recruiter; Clinton responds, "Hell no!" when asked if she will apologize; and Clinton then calls Trump a bully. Clinton thus makes two mistakes: fully elevating Trump to her presumed candidate level, and opening her up to charges of bullying her husband's molestation and rape accusers.) Clinton says, "I don't think a halt [of refugee admissions to the United States] is necessary." (She does not offer to house them at her mansion in Chappaqua, New York.) On the issue of fighting ISIS, Clinton calls for a coalition and a no-fly zone in Syria. Both Clinton and Sanders call for higher taxes on the top income earners (although their promises of "free stuff" for the voters will cost far more than could ever be collected through tax increases). Laughably, Sanders says he will pay for his goodies with higher taxes and lowering interest rate on the federal debt. (Sanders apparently believes he can get more nations and individuals to buy U.S. debt by offering them lower interest rates.) Clinton claims she will "build on the successes" of ObamaCare, while Sanders calls for full-blown socialized health care. On the issue of the disaster she created in Libya with the ouster of Muammar Gaddafi in 2011, Clinton offers an answer that will sound good to the uninformed but evasive to those who know better. Clinton says, "I worry greatly that the rhetoric coming from the Republicans, particularly Donald Trump, is sending a message to Muslims here... and... around the world, that there is a 'clash of civilizations." (Of course, there is such a clash—and ignoring it does no one any favors.) Clinton does herself no favors with a claim that the administration is "where we need to be" in the fight against ISIS. After the debate's first commercial break, Clinton fails to immediately return to the stage and Sanders is in the middle of answering a question when she shows up and says, "Sorry." (The Clinton campaign later correctly explains that the women's bathroom is much farther from the stage than the men's bathroom. Clinton also reportedly chose to wait for someone else to leave the restroom because she did not want to share the facility with a Martin O'Malley staffer. Clinton moans, "We don't have enough oversight of what the insurance companies are charging everybody right now." (The government should have no oversight or control over any prices. If a customer believes a price is too high, he can find another seller. Insurance is expensive because of government interference in the marketplace.) [85623]

Clinton also says, "I am not giving up on Libya and no one should." (Libyans should be frightened to death.) [885623]

Clinton claims, "I think it's important to point out that about three percent of my donations come from people in the finance and investment world. You can go to OpenSecrets.org and check that. [I receive] more donations from students and teachers than I do from people associated with Wall Street." (DailyCaller.com later points out, "But the website, which is maintained by the Center for Responsive Politics, does not break down campaign contributions by job occupation, as Clinton suggested. Thus there's no way to compare how much money she's received from students and teachers or from people associated with Wall Street banks. That leaves fact-checkers having to compare donations by industry. And such a review reveals that the biggest donors to Clinton's 2016 campaign committee, Hillary for America, come from the legal, business services, and securities and investment industries. The education industry is the fifth largest source of contributions to the Democratic front-runner's effort.") [85635]

One of the "hard-hitting" questions Clinton is asked comes from ABC's Martha Raddatz: "First Ladies, as you well know, have used their position to work on important causes like literacy and drug abuse, but they also supervise the menus, the flowers, the holiday ornaments and White House decor. I know you think you know where I'm going here. You have said that Bill Clinton is a great host and loves giving tours, but may opt out of picking flower arrangements if you're elected. Bill Clinton aside, is it time to change the role of a president's spouse?" (Raddatz was once married to Julius Genachowski, who Obama appointed chairman of the Federal Communications Commission. Obama attended their wedding.) [85643]

Writer and debate watcher Walter Olson tweets, "'Every election is a sort of advance auction sale of stolen goods.' - H. L. Mencken." 85622]

On December 20 *The Washington Post*, which is normally in Obama's pocket, writes, "Iran is following through on the nuclear deal it struck with a U.S.-led coalition in an utterly predictable way: It is racing to fulfill those parts of the accord that will allow it to collect \$100 billion in frozen funds and end sanctions on its oil exports and banking system, while expanding its belligerent and illegal activities in other areas—and daring the West to respond. Unfortunately, the Obama administration's response to these provocations has also been familiar. It is doing its best to downplay them—and thereby encouraging Tehran to press for still-greater advantage. [Iran] …has unjustly sentenced Post correspondent Jason Rezaian to prison and arrested two businessmen with U.S. citizenship or residence since signing the nuclear accord. There have been no penalties for those outrageous violations of human rights. Now a United Nations panel has determined that Iran test-fired a nuclear-capable missile on Oct. 10 with a range of at least 600 miles, in violation of a U.N. resolution that prohibits such launches. Moreover, it appears likely that a second missile launch occurred on Nov. 21, also in violation of Security Council Resolution 1929…" [85680, 85681]

"It's not hard to guess the reasons for this fecklessness. ...Obama is reluctant to do anything that might derail the nuclear deal before Iran carries out its commitments, including uninstalling thousands of centrifuges and diluting or removing tons of enriched uranium. The same logic prompted him to tolerate Iran's malign interventions in Syria, Yemen and elsewhere, along with the arrest of Mr. Rezaian, while the pact was under negotiation. U.S. officials argue that Iran's nonnuclear violations make it all the more important that the nuclear deal be implemented. But that ignores the clear connections between the missile launches and Tehran's ambitions to become a nuclear power. The only practical military purpose of the missiles the regime is testing is to carry atomic warheads. And while missile launches are not prohibited by the nuclear pact itself, the separate resolution banning them remains in effect until the deal is implemented, after which a new resolution takes effect that calls on Iran not to develop such missiles for eight years. By flouting the U.N. resolutions, Iran is clearly testing the will of the United States and its allies to enforce the overall regime limiting its nuclear ambitions. If there is no serious response, it will press the boundaries in other areas—such as the inspection regime." [85680, 85681]

On MSNBC's *Politics Nation*, Al Sharpton interviews Maricopa County, Arizona Sheriff Joe Arpaio. Sharpton asks, "Are you and Trump still on this 'birther' thing? I mean, do you really believe [Obama] was not born in Hawaii?" Arpaio replies, "I don't care where he was born; I said that from day one. I said that it's [Obama's birth certificate is] a fraudulent document... If you had a fake document, you'd be in jail tomorrow. Sharpton asks, "Why hasn't anybody been able to establish that it's a fake document?" Arpaio responds, "We established it, but nobody wants to look at it. They avoid it. And I've had two major press conferences two, three years ago. Nobody will look at it; they don't even want to hear about it. The only reason I mentioned [Donald] Trump is the fact he brought this out a long time ago; he was the only one that [sic; who] talked about it. Nobody wants to talk about it, Al." [85611]

On This Week, Clinton toady George Stephanopoulos asks Donald Trump if he will "take back" his calling Hillary Clinton a liar for saying Trump is being used in an ISIS recruitment video. Trump replies, "Of course I'm standing by it. It was vetted. They went to [the fact checkers at] The Washington Post. Fox News went out in great detail and looked for it and there's no such video. They may make one up knowing the Clintons and knowing Hillary." Stephanopoulos again hounds Trump on his claim that Muslims in the United States celebrated the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. Trump pushes back: "George, I know you're having a lot of fun this morning and so am I if you want to know the truth. The fact is, that we have a problem, George. You don't have to admit it, because I know you want to be so politically correct all the time, you don't have to admit it. But we have a problem and the problem is a very serious problem. ... With [politically correct] attitudes like your attitude people won't turn them in [radical Muslims]. People are just going to go along. We have to solve a very serious problem, and if you don't want to talk about it, or if you think it's politically incorrect, that's your problem not mine." (Of course, an ISIS recruiting video featuring Trump will eventually surfaceeven if the Clinton campaign team has to create it.) [85630, 85649, 86011]

Jay Syrmopoulos reports at DCClotheseline.com that snuck into the \$1.1 trillion spending bill was the Cyber Information Sharing Act (CISA). Congressman Justin Amash calls CISA "the worst anti-privacy legislation since the USA PATRIOT Act." Syrmopoulos writes, "Advocates of the CISA provisions say their aim is to help prevent cyber threats, but critics say that the legislation essentially gives corporations legal immunity when sharing consumers' private data about hacks and digital breaches with the Department of Homeland Security. ...Originally, the CISA anti-privacy legislation was shelved after a public outcry against the bill, but corporations soon realized the bill would provide them with legal immunity for sharing customers' private data with the government and began a renewed effort to pass CISA. And miraculously, even in defeat, a bad bill became worse, and a crisis became an opportunity. ...It's a shameful testament to the power of corporations and the intelligence community, to craft legislation that the American people clearly don't support and then hide it within a budget bill to gain passage of the legislation, due to the fact that the public would never support it otherwise. What's more is that the Praetorian guard, also known as the mainstream media is choosing to keep it out of the public's eye." [85609]

According to a December 12-15 poll conducted by the Palestinian Center for Policy and Survey Research (PSR) in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, "67 percent of Palestinians are in favor of stabbing attacks against Israelis and almost the same amount [is] in favor of 'an armed intifada." Conservative icon Phyllis Schlafly endorses Donald Trump. She tells WND.com, "It sounds like Donald Trump is the only one who has any fight in him. He will fight for the issues that we really care about and are very hot at the present time, such as the immigration issue. I don't see anyone else who's eager to fight." Of the \$1.1 trillion spending deal, Schlafly says, "It's the worst kind of a betrayal because we thought we elected a bunch of good guys who would shape up the party. We had a lot of fancy promises that the Republicans were going to shape up and change course. And they disappointed us. Betrayal is an appropriate word to describe it. ...[Trump] does look like he's the last hope [for America]. We don't hear anybody saying what he's saying. In fact, most of the people who ought to be lining up with him are attacking him. They're probably jealous of the amount of press coverage he gets. But the reason he gets so much press coverage is the grassroots are fed up with people who are running things, and they do want a change. They do want people to stand up for America. It really resonates when he says he wants to 'Make America Great Again.'" [85648]

At TheIntercept.com Zaid Jilani writes, "When a CBS News segment featuring a focus group of American Muslims aired Friday [December 18], it highlighted their relationship to terrorism, with a particular fixation on how much responsibility they felt to condemn terrorist attacks. But in interviews with *The Intercept*, two Muslim Americans who took part in the group complained that CBS edited out parts of the discussion where they raised their own concerns—including critiques of U.S. militarism, surveillance, and entrapment. They also said that Frank Luntz, the right-wing pollster who led the focus group, silenced members of the group when they criticized discriminatory U.S. government policies. ...Sarah Harvard, a New York City journalist who was in the group, wrote a lengthy Facebook post after the airing of the CBS segment where she noted that the total time spent filming was around an hour—and that the most telling exchanges were cut out. For example, Harvard wrote that after Luntz asked the group whether they were Americans or Muslims first, she chose to demonstrate the offensive nature of the question by asking, 'Well, are you an American or Jewish first?' That didn't make it on the air either." [85659, 85660]

U.S. aid worker and Army veteran Lisa Akbari is shot to death in Kabul, Afghanistan—reportedly by a mullah (of the "religion of peace") who "has links to terrorist groups." [85669, 85670, 85671]

In Las Vegas, a woman drives her car onto the sidewalk, intentionally ramming a crowd of pedestrians. One person is killed and dozens are injured. (There are unconfirmed reports that the driver shouted "Allahu Akbar" during the incident. The mainstream media suggests the woman was under the influence of drugs.) [85687, 85688, 85703]

On December 21 a Taliban suicide bomber kills six American soldiers in Afghanistan just a few weeks after Pentagon spokesman Navy Captain Jeff Davis stated, "What we're not doing (is) counter-terrorism operations against the Taliban. We actually view the Taliban as being an important partner in a peaceful Afghan-led reconciliation process. We are not actively targeting the Taliban." Obama, golfing in Hawaii, has no comment. (The Associated Press breathlessly reports, "Obama attempted a chip shot of about 40 feet and made it into the hole. He reacted by dropping his wedge and raising his hat and arms into the air. He then pointed his finger at the media and tipped his hat and waved toward the gallery watching him from the road.") [85624, 85695, 85696, 85707, 85708, 85725, 85736, 85737]

Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) withdraws from the presidential race. [85638, 85639]

On *Morning Joe*, MSNBC's Mika Brzezinski comments, "First of all, I don't have a problem when Donald Trump calls in [to talk show] the day after a debate, but I do have a problem when Donald Trump calls in, and then you've got Chris Christie and all these other guys getting up at, like, whatever time it is, Carly Fiorina, on, you now, West Coast time or wherever the debate is, and showing up on TV, and then watching all the Sunday morning shows, ...he's [Trump']s on the phone, all the other candidates are schlepping in, *but*, we've got the opposite problem with Hillary [Clinton], who shows up when she wants to, who shows up when she feels like it, and only when a red carpet has been rolled out, and everything has been negotiated and pre-planned. And everyone can say, they don't do that—[but] they do." [85728]

Superior City, Wisconsin Mayor Bruce Hagen prompts calls for his resignation for writing on Facebook that Michelle Obama "and her Muslim partner have destroyed the fabric of democracy that was so very hard fought for!" Hagen responds to the criticism: "I have huge respect for the Office of the President, but no respect for the current administration." [85726, 85727]

The Obama administration warns Congress not to restrict visas for travelers from Iran because it would violate the Obama/Kerry nuclear agreement. According to FreeBeacon.com, "a portion of the Iran nuclear deal mandates that the United States not take any action that could harm Iran's economic relationships with other countries. Iranian officials maintain that the new [visa] restrictions violate this passage of the deal." The Israel Project's Omri Ceren comments, "According to the Obama administration's latest interpretation, the nuclear deal allows Iran to test ballistic missiles in violation of international law, but does not allow Congress to prevent terrorists from coming into the United States." [85621, 85646, 85731]

Meanwhile, Secretary of State John Kerry writes Iran's Minister of Foreign Affairs, Mohammad Javad Zarif, essentially telling him "not to worry." Kerry writes, "I am also confident that the recent changes in visa requirements passed in Congress, which the Administration has the authority to waive, will not in any way prevent us from meeting our [nuclear deal] commitments, and that we will implement them so as not to interfere with legitimate business interests of Iran. ...To this end, we have a number of potential tools available to us, including multiple entry ten-year business visas, programs for expediting business visas, and the waiver authority provided under the new legislation." (Translation: "My boss and I will place the safety of Americans at risk in order to protect our nuclear deal with Iran." Obama should be impeached over the issue.) House Majority Leader Kevin McCarthy (R-CA) responds, "Contrary to what the Secretary of State seems to be saying to Iranian Foreign Minister Javad Zarif, it was not and has never been Congress's intent to allow the Administration to grant a blanket waiver to travellers [sic; travelers] from Iran in order to facilitate the implementation of the Iran deal. ...Instead of undermining Congressional intent regarding the visa waiver program, the White House should instead focus on Iran's repeated violations of the U.N. Security Council's bans on missile tests. Iran's unwillingness to follow these international agreements should be a red flag that the Iran nuclear deal isn't worth the paper it is written on." [85652, 85653, 85660, 85731]

Obama is widely criticized—and ridiculed—for comments made in an interview with National Public Radio's Steve Inskeep. Obama says, "This [ISIS] is not an organization that can destroy the United States. This is not a huge industrial power that can pose great risks to us institutionally or in a systematic way." (That ISIS cannot totally destroy the United States is irrelevant. Neither could Japan or Germany in the 1940s. Obama is essentially arguing that the United States and the world can absorb occasional terrorists because they are only *sporadically* killing *some* people. He may as well argue that we should not act against bank robbers as long as they limit their targets to small banks.) Obama does, however, pay minor lip service to the fears of Americans: "They can hurt us, and they can hurt our people and our families. And so I understand why people are worried." [85625, 85694, 85740, 85833]

Obama claims, "We are pounding ISIL's core structure in Syria and Iraq. [That is not true.] We have put together a coalition that is increasingly effective. [That is also not true.] We have seen ISIL lose about 40 percent of its populated territory in the region. [Another falsehood.] The most damage they can do, though, is if they start changing how we live and what our values are. [If we] remember who we are and make sure that our resilience, our values, and our unity are maintained, ISIL will be defeated." (No, the most damage ISIS can do is attack the United States with a nuclear, biological, or chemical weapon. Going to see a Star Wars movie "in defiance of the terrorists" will not stop them from poisoning an American city's water supply. Radical jihadists will not be defeated merely by maintaining resilience, values, and unity; they will be defeated with overwhelming military superiority.) [85625]

Obama then blames the media, saying, "If you've been watching television for the last month, all you have been seeing, all you have been hearing about is these guys with masks or black flags who are potentially coming to getcha [sic; get you]." (Translation: "Don't worry about those 14 deaths in San Bernardino; worry about the media hyping the story just to make me look bad.") "Look, uh, the, the media, uh, is pursuing ratings, this is a legitimate news story. Uh, I think that, uh, you know it's up to the media to make a determination about how they want to cover this. There is no doubt the actions of ISIL are designed to amplify, uh, their power and the threat that they pose." (In the last two weeks Obama has addressed ISIS and terrorism in three prominent addresses. Obama cannot have it both ways. If ISIS and terrorism are not a major threat, he did not need to emphasize that they are with a rare Oval Office address. Did he not want the media to cover his speeches?) Obama then says, "There is a legitimate criticism of what I've been doing and our administration has been doing in the sense that we haven't, you know, on a regular basis, I think, described all the work that we've been doing for more than a year now to defeat ISIL." (Translation: "I have been doing an extraordinarily good job, but I have failed at communicating my wonderfulness to the American people.") [85626]

Meanwhile, according to a Pew Research Center poll, confidence in the government's handling of terrorism falls to an all-time low of 46 percent—down from 72 percent at the beginning of the year. [85627]

Once again Obama plays the "race card," addressing voter anxieties by saying, "If you are referring to specific strains in the Republican Party that suggest that somehow I'm different, I'm Muslim, I'm disloyal to the country, etcetera—which unfortunately is pretty far out there, and gets some traction in certain pockets of the Republican Party, and that have been articulated by some of their elected officials—what I'd say there is that that's probably pretty specific to me, and who I am and my background. In some ways, I may represent change that worries them." [85633]

Obama even provides an excuse for the Democrats losing the House in the 2010 elections: [T]he truth of the matter is is [sic] that where Democrats have had problems is we had the misfortune of doing poorly in 2010 when there was redistricting, and in many of the successive elections Democrats have actually voted at higher rates. This was true in 2012, for example. There were more Democratic ballots cast for Democratic candidates than there were Republicans, but because of where Democrats live and where Republicans live, and because of the nature of the Senate, we ended up having problems." (The Democrats were annihilated in the 2010 mid-term elections, but that had almost nothing to do with redistricting. Democrats lost only a handful of Congressional districts because of the 2010 census and redistricting. They lost because of widespread disappointment with Obama and his policies. That there may have been more total Democrat votes than Republican votes is irrelevant. Obama should be reminded that the nation is a republic, not a democracy. That states like California, Illinois, and New York have overwhelming numbers of Democrats does not mean they should be able to force their will on states with smaller populations. It does not matter that California has more Democrats than does Utah. Utah has two Republican Senators because Utah has more conservative voters than leftist voters.) [85641]

Obama says, "I do think that when you combine that demographic change with all the economic stresses that people have been going through because of the financial crisis, because of technology, because of globalization, the fact that wages and incomes have been flat-lining for some time, and that particularly blue-collar men have had a lot of trouble in this new economy, where they are no longer getting the same bargain that they got when they were going to a factory and able to support their families on a single paycheck, you combine those things and it means that there is going to be potential anger, frustration, fear. Some of it justified but just misdirected. I think somebody like Mr. Trump is taking advantage of that. That's what he's exploiting during the course of his campaign." (Morning Jolt's Jim Geraghty writes, "Obama's largely correct, but what's fascinating is that Obama seems to see this as more random 'misfortune'—i.e., he doesn't seem to see anything he could or should have done about it, or do about it now. Mr. [Obama], you've been in the Oval Office for seven years now! Doesn't it bother you that after all this time on your watch, Americans are so full of anger, frustration, and fear? Doesn't the fact that people are so receptive to Trump suggest that after all this time, your policies haven't alleviated their problems and may in fact have exacerbated them?") [85641, 85642]

USAToday.com reports, "Former Utah governor Jon Huntsman, who unsuccessfully sought the GOP presidential nomination in 2012, says he's getting 'a lot' of encouragement to launch another White House bid from Republicans concerned about the prospect of Donald Trump as the 2016 GOP nominee. This time, to run as an independent. 'I always want to help my country where I can, but you don't want to embark on a suicide mission,' he told Capital Download. In the *London Review of Books* Seymour Hersh writes that Obama's "repeated insistence that Bashar al-Assad must leave office—and that there are 'moderate' rebel groups in Syria capable of defeating him—has in recent years provoked quiet dissent, and even overt opposition, among some of the most senior officers on the Pentagon's Joint Staff. Their criticism has focused on what they see as the administration's fixation on Assad's primary ally, Vladimir Putin. In their view, Obama is captive to Cold War thinking about Russia and China, and hasn't adjusted his stance on Syria to the fact both countries share Washington's anxiety about the spread of terrorism in and beyond Syria; like Washington, they believe that Islamic State must be stopped. potentially, to Syria's takeover by jihadi extremists, much as was then happening in Libya. A former senior adviser to the Joint Chiefs told me that the document was an 'all-source' appraisal, drawing on information from signals, satellite and human intelligence, and took a dim view of the Obama administration's insistence on continuing to finance and arm the so-called moderate rebel groups." Clinton's imaginative attack dog at Media Matters, David Brock, says, "The idea of a black rapist [Obama] using the schlong to defeat Hillary, I mean, I think that's what that really was about.") Trump tells thousands of supporters in the arena, ""Nobody gets audiences like I get. We broke the record. And I don't have a guitar, no guitar. Elton John said, 'You get the biggest crowds in the world for a guy without a guitar." [85827]

On December 22 a national Quinnipiac poll shows Donald Trump leading all GOP candidates with 28 percent, followed by Ted Cruz (24), Marc Rubio (12), Ben Carson (10), Chris Christie (6), Jeb Bush (4), Carly Fiorina (2), and Ron Paul (2). In match-ups with Hillary Clinton, Trump trails by 7, and ties both Cruz and Rubio. [85677, 85690]

"...Asked if Farook was radicalized at the mosque, Abbassi snapped, 'Never.' He said the mosque teaches only peace, insisting no one has even an 'extremist idea.' 'In Islam,' he said, 'we are against innocent killing.'" (Reporters neglect to ask, "What is your definition of 'innocent?'" In Islam, non-followers are automatically considered not to be innocent.) "...Another person of interest is Abbassi's brother, Mohammad Sabir Abbassi, a Muslim activist who serves as a trustee and English teacher at the San Diego mosque once headed by the late al Qaeda cleric Anwar al-Awlaki. FBI Agent Joel Anderson said in court filings that Farook indicated he was a big fan of Awlaki and listened to a series of sermons about jihad and martyrdom called 'The Hereafter.'" On *Fox News Sunday*, Congressman Peter King (R-NY) observes that "after 16 months of air attacks by the U.S. it's had really minimal impact on ISIS considering how long those attacks have been going on. ...ISIS is stronger, I believe, than it was 16 months ago. They certainly have a larger land mass under their control." [85875]

CNN.com reports, "During a National Security Council meeting held at the Pentagon on Dec. 14, ...Obama told top military officials and other officials he wanted to see a better job of having the so-called 'narrative' of the war on ISIS communicated to the American people, a senior defense official told CNN." (Translation: "Even if we're not winning, I want the public to think we're winning.") [85885, 85886]

On December 28 Carly Fiorina appears on *Fox & Friends* and says, "Of course Bill Clinton's fair game. He's a former president. And as I recall, Donald Trump threw George W. Bush under the bus way back in September. But you're not going to beat Hillary Clinton by attacking Bill Clinton. You're going to beat Hillary Clinton—I'm going to beat Hillary Clinton—by attacking her track record and her lack of trustworthiness. Of course she is going to play the woman card. That's what she does. And the way to deal with the woman card is to attack her track record." [85889]

On *Good Morning America*, reporter Mary Bruce comments, "Based on his latest mudslinging, [it] seems like Donald Trump is already looking ahead to a battle with Hillary Clinton. ...Trump [is] intensifying his war of words with the Democratic front-runner, targeting her husband's history of alleged sexual misconduct." (Bruce may be unaware of the meaning of the word "alleged.") [85930, 86154]

The Media Research Center awards its annual "Obamagasm Award" to former CBS News producer Dick Meyer, now Washington Bureau Chief for Scripps, who wrote on July 16, "Americans are lucky to have Barack Obama as President and we should wake up and appreciate it while we can. ...Obama will go down in history as an extraordinary President, probably a great one... It would be a morale booster and a sign of civic maturity if more Americans appreciated what an exceptional President they have right now. It could be a long wait for the next one." [85888]

MSNBC's Chris Matthews is a runner-up, having said on July 22, "Instead of going and grubbing the money on Wall Street, he [Obama] went out to people and helped his community... He's done everything right. He's been immaculate in the presidency. Nobody has accused him of any corruption. His kids are perfect. His wife is perfect. He's done everything that these right-wing, white conservatives say we're supposed to be in this country. He's done everything right. And this sleazy comment, that he has no class... He has plenty of class." (No comment is necessary here.) [85888]

Another runner-up is MSNBC's Lawrence O'Donnell, who said on February 3, "Long before he was running for President, [Obama] had written the answer [to questions about past drug use] in a book called *Dreams from My Father*. It stands today as the finest literary work ever authored by a President of the United States. The book doesn't contain the whole truth of Barack Obama's life. Books can't do that, but it is, by far, the most honest and open book, and artful book, ever written by a President." (O'Donnell, who pretends to be a journalist, declares that books cannot report the truth. He is perhaps subconsciously accepting that *Dreams From My Father* is more a work of fiction by William Ayers than an autobiography by Obama.) [85888]

Also on the runner-up list is MSNBC's Rachel Maddow, who said on July 14, "We don't know if the Iran deal is going to work. If it does, it will be the major foreign policy achievement, not only of this presidency, but of this American generation. At which point, people in the not-too-distant future will look back at this presidency, they'll look back at [Obama] and they'll say, 'Oh, of course they gave him the Nobel Peace Prize. Of

course they did." (Maddow did no speculate on what people in the future will say if Iran drops a nuclear bomb on Tel Aviv.) [85888]

A December 17-21 CNN/ORC poll shows that "Americans are more likely to say that terrorists are winning the war against the United States than they have been at any point since the September 11 attacks... While less than half of Americans say the terrorists are winning, the current 40% who do believe that is 17 points above the previous high of 23% reached in August 2005. Another 40% say neither side has an advantage, and just 18% say today that the U.S. and its allies have the upper hand—10 points off the previous low for that measure, reached in January 2007." Todenhöfer spent 10 days with ISIS in Iraq and Syria, accompanied by his son Frederic. He returned with frightening insights. ISIS is 'preparing the largest religious cleansing in history,' he said, adding that he has a 'pessimistic' view on what can be done to combat it. 'The only country ISIS fears is Israel. They told me they know the Israeli army is too strong for them,' he said. ...ISIS believes it can defeat allied troops on the ground. 'They think they can defeat US and UK ground troops, who they say they have no experience in city guerrilla or terrorist strategies,' Todenhöfer explained, 'but they know the Israelis are very tough as far as fighting against guerrillas and terrorists.' 'They are not scared of the British and the Americans, they are scared of the Israelis, and told me the Israeli army is the real danger. We can't defeat them with our current strategy. These people [the Israeli Defense Forces] can fight a guerrilla war,' he said.'' [85924]

In a national Rasmussen poll, "If the 2016 presidential election was held today, 37% of Likely U.S. Voters would vote for [Hillary] Clinton, while 36% would vote for [Donald] Trump. ...[A] sizable 22% would choose some other candidate, while five percent (5%) are undecided. ...Seventy-five percent (75%) of Democrats back Clinton, up five points from October. "The Chicago Police Department is in a lot of trouble. They were running essentially off-the-record jails, incarcerating Chicagoans and nobody knew where they were. They wouldn't tell their lawyers. The fatal police shootings on Saturday were the first in America's third most populous city since it released a video in late November showing an October 2014 police shooting of a black teen that belied the official account he had lunged at police with a knife." Kia Absalom, the 21-year-old daughter of Attorney General Loretta Lynch, is arrested after she failed to pay Uber driver Hassan Almaweri the fare he was due. According to BizPacReview.com, "Absalom was placed in a holding cell but had her arrest voided" after her boyfriend arrives—along with her father, Stephen Hargrove, and FBI agent John Robison—to pay the driver. (Apparently an arrest can be "voided" if your mother is the Attorney General.) [86179]

The Washington Post's Ruth Marcus writes, "Donald Trump is crude and vulgar. He's every -ist in the book: racist, sexist, narcissist, for starters. His dis about Hillary Clinton getting 'schlonged' in the 2008 campaign and the accompanying tirade about her 'disgusting' bathroom break were weird and juvenile. But he has a point about Clinton playing the 'woman's card,' and about the male behavior that's more concerning: her husband's. ...Clinton's attempt at outsourced outrage has the air of a basketball player flopping on the floor for the benefit of the ref. ...[I]n the larger scheme of things, Bill Clinton's conduct toward women is far worse than any of the multiple offensive things Trump has said. Are you saying an extramarital affair by Bill Clinton is fair game, is something that you think should be in the campaign?" Trump: "If she's [Hillary Clinton is] going to play the women card, because I'll do more for women than Hillary Clinton is going to do for women, including the safety of our country, which is good for everybody, and if she's going to play that game, and if he's going to be out there campaigning, then he's certainly fair game. National Review's Katherine Timpf blasts Hillary Clinton in a series of Twitter messages: "If u want to say what BILL did is irrelevant to Hillary, fine. If the boy's mother wanted a more lucrative career she should have chosen something other than teaching. Of course, engineers do not get summers off and spring and Christmas vacations.) Enrique Marquez, who sold to Syed Farook the rifles he and his wife Tashfeen Malik used in the San Bernardino massacre, is indicted on terrorism-related charges—along with one count of marriage fraud and one count of making a false statement on immigration paperwork. [85956, 85957]

The FBI offers a \$5,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of a man who put bacon on the door handles of a mosque in Las Vegas. (No reward has been offered for information related to the identification of anyone who may have assisted the San Bernardino terrorists.) [86012, 86013, 86063]

On December 31 25-year-old Emanuel Lutchman, who converted to Islam while in prison for robbery, is arrested for supporting ISIS and planning a New Year's Eve attack in Rochester, New York. [85960, 85991, 85999, 86018]

One of the emails reveals that billionaire George Soros expressed regret over supporting Obama over Hillary Clinton in 2008. According to TheHill.com, "Center for American Progress President Neera Tanden said in a May 2012 email to Clinton that Soros made the admission to her during a dinner. 'I told him I worked for you in the primaries and he said he's been impressed that he can always call/meet with you on an issue of policy and said he hasn't met with [Obama] ever (though I thought he had),' Tanden wrote. 'He then said he regretted his decision in the primary—he likes to admit mistakes when he makes them and that was one of them,' she added. 'He then extolled his work with you from your time as First Lady on. You probably have heard this all before but on the off chance you haven't, I thought I should let you know. Thanks again for doing the video!' she wrote." [85992]

Also according to TheHill.com, "Sydney Blumenthal sent Clinton a memo on Sept. 30, 2009 with background information on John Kornblum, who was at the time taking over as Germany's foreign minister. 'Kornblum strongly suggests you try to develop your personal relationship with [German Chancellor Angela] Merkel as you can,' Blumenthal writes. 'He says she dislikes the atmospherics surrounding the Obama phenomenon, that it's contrary to her whole idea of politics and how to conduct oneself in general. She would welcome a more conversational relationship with you.'" (It has been clear from the

start of Obama's tenure in the White House that Merkel dislikes Obama, as do former French president Nicolas Sarkozy and Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu.) [85993]

TheHornNews.com writes, "[R]eporters seem to be giving a free pass to major health issues surrounding Hillary Clinton's presidential campaign. Clinton has a history of potentially serious blood clots—and is currently taking one of the most unpredictable prescription drugs on the market today. Health questions have swirled around Clinton since a December 2012 fall that caused a concussion and led to a subsequent diagnosis of a blood clot near her brain. For the 55th time in 2015, Obama plays golf. According to CBS' Mark Knoller, Obama has played 269 rounds of golf since entering the White House. [85987, 85988]

A massive fire causes significant damage to a 63-story hotel in Dubai. [86006]

FoxNews.com reports, "Two Munich train stations were evacuated Thursday due to an 'imminent threat' of a terror attack just minutes before New Years celebrations were set to hit the German city. But even after midnight in Munich passed without an attack, German police still urged the nation to be vigilant. 'We have serious information and different tips about an imminent attack,' police spokesman Werner Kraus said. 'After evaluating the situation, we started evacuating the train stations and also asked partygoers to stay away from big crowds outside.' Munich police said earlier on Facebook that according to 'serious information, there will be an attack tonight' and later revealed that authorities were working off of two different 'concrete' tips. At PamelaGeller.com Nonie Darwish comments on Obama's legacy.
