## The Obama Timeline – Part II

The Doomed Presidency

January 2014

On January 1 the top income tax bracket goes from 35 to 39.6 percent. The capital gains tax increases from 15 percent to 28 percent. The dividends tax increases from 15 percent to 39.6 percent. The estate tax increases from zero to 55 percent.

As of January 1, 2014 more Americans are without health insurance than before the passage of ObamaCare. Nevertheless, Secretary of Health and Human Services Kathleen Sebelius tweets, "Today, lifetime limits are gone, those with pre-existing conditions have protection, and there are millions of newly insured Americans!" (Sebelius apparently considers 1.1 million alleged ObamaCare enrollments to be "millions." She does not mention that more than five million health insurance policies have been canceled because of ObamaCare. Nor does she state how many of the 1.1 million have actually sent in a payment to the insurance companies to complete the enrollment process. De Blasio's pledges to ban the city's horse-drawn carriage rides—which are popular with tourists. At Spectator.org, Robert Stacy McCain suggests the ban "is a corruption scandal masquerading as an animal-rights crusade. Defenders of the carriage industry point to a real-estate executive who is one of de Blasio's major campaign donors as the driving force behind the effort to abolish the carriages." The horse stables are housed on valuable property that the campaign donor, Steve Nislick, is possibly seeking to develop. McCain writes, "Mayor de Blasio's willingness to do the bidding of his anti-carriage backers has puzzled many observers, who can't fathom why he would make the issue such a focus. 'What makes him think this subject is important enough to occupy his first days in office?' asked New York Times editorial page editor Andy Rosenthal. Evidently, reporters at Rosenthal's newspaper can't be bothered to do the kind of 'follow the money' investigative journalism that might provide an answer to that question, although supporters of the Carriage Association have created a Web site... to expose what they're calling the 'CarriageGate' scandal." It can be assumed that Obama was thrilled by the election of de Blasio—and the focus on "income inequality" in virtually all of the event's speeches. De Blasio says, "Think about it. A five-year tax on the wealthiest among us-with every dollar dedicated to pre-K[indergarten] and after-school. Asking those at the top to help our kids get on the right path and stay there. That's our mission. And on that, we will not wait. We will do it now. Of course, I know that our progressive vision isn't universally shared. Some on the far right continue to preach the virtue of trickle-down economics. They believe that the way to move forward is to give more to the most fortunate, and that somehow the benefits will work their way down to everyone else. They sell their approach as the path of 'rugged individualism." (By "asking those at the top" de Blasio means, "Forcing those at the top to pay more via higher taxes." Additionally, those on the "far right" have never demanded that anyone "give more to the most fortunate." They believe that individuals should *earn* their wealth by providing goods and services others purchase voluntarily. De Blasio's class warfare remark follows the Obama/Elizabeth Warren/Karl Marx argument that if person X has more than person Y, he must have somehow gotten it by illegal or fraudulent means. It does not occur to them that individuals, not the government, create wealth, and that those with less can also work hard to create their own wealth. But "work hard and prosper" is not as easy a sell as, "Vote for me and I'll give you some of theirs," and that theme is likely to be heard quite a bit during the 2014 campaign season.)

NationalReview.com's Jonah Goldberg comments on de Blasio's address: "Over and over again, de Blasio invokes and appeals to the cult of unity to justify his policies. In One City we're all in it together and therefore what is yours is ours and what is ours is yours. It's lifeboat logic applied to the democratic polis. In a lifeboat, if you have ten candy bars and someone else has none, you must share. Property rights go out the window. The problem with lifeboat logic—which is just another version of the moral equivalent of war—is that it only applies in lifeboat situations. It doesn't apply when you can jump out of the lifeboat and swim to shore. It certainly doesn't fly when the boat is tied to the dock. That's why the moral equivalent of war argument is evil when

misapplied. By invoking an existential crisis when there is none, you are saying that the rule of law and individual rights must be suspended for the greater good. If I yank you out of your car and drive off to defuse a nuclear bomb, I am a badass hero who did what was necessary. If I yank you out of your car and drive off because you can afford to get another one, I'm a thief with a penchant for romantic rationalizations of my crimes."

The ban on standard 60-watt and 40-watt incandescent light bulbs goes into effect. (Across the country, approximately 40,000 new laws, regulations, and resolutions will take effect during 2014. The Heritage Foundation warns about "overcriminalization" and the fact that it has become impossible to even know what is against the law. "Last year police charged 46-year-old Ocean Beach, Calif., resident Juvencio Adame with 'defacement, damage and destruction' of public property in excess of \$400-charges that could have resulted in significant prison time. His crime? Trimming shrubbery next to his home. Then there's 17-year-old Cody Chitwood of Cobb County, Ga. Police charged him with a felony for bringing weapons into a school zone. The 'weapons' were fishing knives, and they were in a tackle box in Cody's truck. Georgia law states that any knife 'having a blade of two or more inches' is a weapon, and that anyone who carries a weapon onto school property is by that very act guilty of a crime." The Heritage Foundation notes, "Overcriminalization strikes at the heart of our constitutional order. In Bouie v. City of Columbia the U.S. Supreme Court explained the constitutional doctrine of 'fair notice,' which holds that a criminal law 'must give warning of the conduct it makes a crime.' Traditionally, this requirement was satisfied if (1) the prohibited act was inherently wrongful—such as murder, arson, theft, robbery, or rape—or (2) an individual did something that he or she knew was illegal, even if it was not inherently wrongful.") New taxes also take effect in 2014, among them 18 in the Affordable Care Act alone. Uninsured individuals are subject to ObamaCare's "individual mandate" tax of \$95 or, if greater, one percent of annual income. (The tax increases to \$695 or 2.5 percent in 2016.) Health insurance companies face a new tax that will likely be passed on to customers in the form of higher premiums (estimated to be between 1.9 and 2.3 percent in 2014). A "reinsurance fee" of \$63 per covered individual is charged to insurance companies. (That also will likely be passed on to businesses and consumers.) In addition to new taxes, ObamaCare cuts Medicare spending by \$41 billion in 2014. [53086, 53089, 53091]

Dunn writes, "There's some irony in the fact that ObamaCare is hitting the wall at the precise moment that the incandescent bulb is being yanked off the market by government fiat—but not as much as you might think. Their origins were quite distinct in time—the bulb ban, buried within the 'Energy Independence and Security Act,' was passed in 2007, ObamaCare three years later. Both were subject to phased implementation, so as to not alarm the peasants. Bulbs have been phased out over a two-year period, 75 to 100 watt last year and the lesser wattages now. ObamaCare was delayed for three years to allow for... development, I guess they called it. But it's no real coincidence that these should be interwoven. There are so many such efforts in progress that it was inevitable that they would begin to cross each other's tracks. Even as those two were ripening, the destruction of the American coal industry is moving right along, a product of Obama executive decrees and EPA regulations. And if we were to look deeper we'd find plenty of others. The attempted transformation of the economy that we are witnessing is by no means limited to a handful of isolated and unrelated programs. What does this transformation look like overall? It involves drastically cut energy sources, seriously limited forms of transportation, 19th-century (or even more primitive) health care, less food, expensive light sources, seriously truncated job opportunities, and higher education too expensive for any but the elite. In other words, Americans are to become poor, cold, hungry, and stupid, while sitting in the dark. That's the progressive plan for the wealthiest nation in the long human record." Attorney Orly Taitz sends a Freedom of Information Act request to the government's Health Benefit Exchange Authority asking for a copy of any court order by any court that directed the removal of any information related to Obama from the ObamaCare databases. She further requests "any and all documents, directives, rules and regulations showing that there are safeguards in place... that prevent individuals with stolen and fabricated Social Security numbers and other fraudulent IDs to be enrolled ... " and "...any documentary evidence showing that there are requirements for employees of the Washington DC exchange to report... evidence of identity theft, fabricated IDs, Social Security fraud that is obtained by... exchange employees..." According to Examiner.com, the response received by Taitz states the agency "does not have any order by any judge directing them to remove Obama's identification information from their database" and "there is no mechanism to protect US tax payers from fraud and use of ACA (Obamacare) by illegal aliens or people using stolen Social Security numbers." Additionally, "there is no reporting requirement for employees of the Exchange to report identity fraud, identity theft and use of stolen IDs by individuals signing up for [ObamaCare]." According to a solicitation posted on the Federal Business Opportunities website, the DHHS asks contractors to supply, 'potassium iodide tablet, 65mg, unit dose package of 20s; 700,000 packages (of 20s),' a total of 14 million tablets. The packages must be delivered on or before February 1, 2014. Potassium iodide helps block radioactive iodine from being absorbed by the thyroid gland and is used by victims of severe nuclear accidents or emergencies. Under current regulations, states with populations living within 10 miles of a nuclear plant are encouraged, but not required, to maintain a supply of potassium iodide. ... The ongoing crisis at the Fukushima nuclear power plant has prompted concerns that the purchase is connected to the threat posed by radioactive debris washing up on the shores of the west coast or the potential for another natural disaster occurring in Japan which could impact the U.S." Meanwhile, DCClothesline.com lists "36 Signs The Media Is Lying To You About How Radiation From Fukushima Is Affecting The West Coast." Among the signs: "71 U.S. sailors who assisted with the initial Fukushima relief efforts have developed serious diseases such as testicular cancer, thyroid cancer, Leukemia, 'unremitting gynecological bleeding' and

brain tumors since that time as a result of exposure to radiation coming from Fukushima." At StoryLeak.com Anthony Gucciardi writes, "The reality is that even getting a hold of low quality potassium iodide, which I would not ever personally take over a higher quality form of pure iodine, is becoming difficult as the population becomes aware of Fukushima's expansive dangers. Many manufacturers are now stockpiling raw iodine and holding on to the element as a form of investment with the knowledge that Fukushima may very well meltdown [sic; melt down]in the coming months." Scientist David Suzuki has stated, "I have seen a paper which says that if in fact the fourth plant goes under in an earthquake and those rods are exposed, it's bye bye Japan and everybody on the west coast of North America should evacuate." Meanwhile, *The National Enquirer* claims O. J. Simpson may have brain cancer and reportedly wants Obama to grant him a pardon so he can die at home. [53126]

The White House issues a statement in response to Supreme Court Justice Sonya Sotomayor's temporary blocking of the ObamaCare regulation requiring that The Little Sisters of the Poor Home for the Aged provide birth control, abortifacients, and sterilization coverage for their employees. The statement reads, "We defer to the Department of Justice on litigation matters, but remain confident that our final rules strike the balance of providing women with free contraceptive coverage while preventing nonprofit religious employers with religious objections to contraceptive coverage from having to contract, arrange, pay, or refer for such coverage." NYPost.com writes, "The Obama argument is astounding. The gist is that the nuns really aren't religious enough to qualify for the church exemption. The administration backs up that position with hefty fines for the Little Sisters if they don't cave. For example, just for their home in Denver, where there are 67 employees, it could run to \$6,700 a day. That's money the Little Sisters simply don't have." The Obama administration absurdly argues that if the nuns do not want to be in any way involved with insurance that provides contraceptives, they should simply not cover their employees at all. (That means they would have to pay a \$2,000 per employee fine for not providing insurance. Of course, the concept of having insurance cover birth control pills is as absurd as having car insurance cover oil changes or having homeowners insurance cover burned out light bulbs. The point of insurance is to "spread the risk" of uncommon expenses over a large population. If the expenses are common there is no point in having insurance cover them.) At Townhall.com Sarah Jean Seman notes, "The 2013 scorecard for abortion pill mandate cases made on religious freedom claims is 53–7, and the Obama Administration is losing. The mandate requires employers to provide abortion-inducing drugs and contraceptives to their employees. Nuns, private Christian colleges and religiously-run companies such as Hobby Lobby have filed court cases against the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services." According to the Alliance Defending Freedom, "To date, there have been 60 [court] rulings touching on the merits religious freedom claims against Obamacare's abortion pill mandate. 41 involve family—or religious—run businesses, and 19 involve non-profit religious organizations. Overall, the score is 53–7 in favor of religious liberty, involving 53 injunctions against the abortion pill mandate. Within these cases, the score in favor of families doing business is 35–6. Miller and former IRS Official Lois Lerner, former DHS Secretary Janet Napolitano, Obama, Senator Harry Reid (D-NV), and Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius. (Dishonorable Mentions for 2013 include: former New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg, outgoing Virginia Gov. Bob McDonnell (R) and incoming Virginia Gov. Terry McAuliffe (D), former Congressman Rick Renzi (R-AZ), and National Security Adviser Susan Rice.) Of Obama, Judicial Watch writes that he "actually tops this 'Top Ten Most Wanted Corrupt Politicians' list for 2013 as the driving force behind so many of the misdeeds. This is Obama's seventh straight year on the list, dating back all the way to 2007 (in 2006, he earned a 'Dishonorable Mention'). He is a master at catch-me-if-you-can, corrupt politics. This year, he has again acted as a oneman Congress, rewriting entire sections of federal law on his own. Not only is his administration secretive and dishonest; its callous disregard for the rule of law undermines our constitutional republic." (McAuliffe quickly proves he deserves a spot on the list. This runs counter to some health-care law supporters' hope that Medicaid coverage would decrease this type of costly medical care, by making it easier for low income adults to see primary care providers." Jonathan Gruber, one of the architects of ObamaCare, says, "I would view it as part of a broader set of evidence that covering people with health insurance doesn't save money. That was sometimes a misleading motivator for the Affordable Care Act. The law isn't designed to save money. It's designed to improve health, and that's going to cost money." (Gruber's statement conflicts with Obama's promises, of course, that the Affordable Care Act would save the typical family \$2,500 per year on insurance premiums and reduce the federal deficit. The Affordable Care Act is proving not to be affordable. TheBlaze.com reports, "...Obama's half-brother told an Israeli newspaper that when he first met Barack, he was struck by his sibling's rejection of Western culture. 'I remember that my impression at the first meeting was that Barack thought that I was too white, and I thought that he was too black,' Mark Okoth Obama Ndesandjo told Maariv. 'He was an American citizen on a journey in search of his African roots, while I was a resident of Kenya seeking to find his white roots. I remember that when I spoke with him about the heroes of Western culture he rolled his eyes impatiently. My feeling was that, here is an American who in many ways is trying to be a local Kenyan youth. This is something I tried to flee my entire life,' Ndesandjo said of the brothers' first meeting in Kenya, which Obama described in his 1995 best-selling memoir, 'Dreams From My Father.' ... The siblings share the same Kenyan father, Barack Obama Sr., but had different white American mothers. ... Ndesandjo today is a businessman and musician who lives in China. He also runs the Mark Obama Ndesandjo Foundation which promotes cultural exchanges between Asia, Africa and the U.S. and provides instruments and music teachers to needy children in China. When his parents divorced, Ndesandjo moved to the U.S. where he studied physics at Brown University and Stanford and earned an MBA from Emory University. Ndesandjo's mother, Ruth Nidesand, Obama Sr.'s third wife, was born in the U.S. to Lithuanian Jewish immigrants. Ndesandjo told Maariv he

considers himself a member of the Jewish people: 'I am a Jew not only because I have a Jewish mother but first and foremost because there exists in me great pride to be a part of the Jewish people. At Newsmax.com Fred Fleitz, who served for 25 years with the CIA, the State Department, and the House Intelligence Committee staff, writes, "[A] stunning new revelation that the [New York] Times had a reporter on the scene during the 2012 [Benghazi] attack on the U.S. Benghazi consulate is turning this into a scandal for the Times—one that raises questions about its journalistic ethics. ...Obama, former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, and other Obama officials have been accused of lying about the Benghazi terrorist attack to prevent it from hurting [Obama's 2012] re-election chances by claiming the attack was the result of a spontaneous demonstration in response to the anti-Islam video. Fleitz continues, "Are there ethical guidelines for Times reporters that would bar them from being embedded with terrorists in the act of conducting a terrorist attack? How could a reporter stand by and watch a U.S. Embassy be attacked and burned? Didn't this reporter and the Times have a moral obligation to immediately contact U.S. officials about the attack? Did the reporter have a cell or satellite phone that he could have used to alert U.S authorities or his New York Times editor in New York? What does this reporter know about the death of Ambassador [Christopher] Stephens? Has he told Congress what he knows? Kirkpatrick concedes in his article that the attack on the embassy was not spontaneous although he says it was not 'meticulously planned.' If the Times had a source in Benghazi during the consulate attack, it knew this in September [2012] and also knew Obama officials were lying about this issue to the American people in the final stretch of the 2012 presidential campaign. This means it's conceivable The New York Times withheld crucial information about the Benghazi consulate attack that could have prevented Barack Obama from being re-elected. At Politico, Foreign Policy columnist Michael Weiss writes, "It's hard to pinpoint just when, exactly, Barack Obama's Syria policy fell apart. Was it in December, when Islamists humiliated U.S.-backed rebels by seizing what limited supplies America had given them? Was it back in September, when Obama telegraphed his reluctance to enforce his own 'red line' after the Syrian regime used chemical weapons on its own people? Was it in the months beforehand, when the administration quietly and mysteriously failed to make good on its pledge to directly arm the rebels? Or did it collapse in August 2011, when Obama called on Syrian dictator Bashar Assad to go, only to do almost nothing to make it happen? But collapse it has, and more than 130,000 deaths later, the White House is now pinning its hopes on a peace conference in Switzerland later this month that is being billed as the last, best hope for a negotiated solution to a conflict that has displaced a staggering 40 percent of Syria's total population, some 23 million people, in what the United Nations says is fast becoming the worst and most expensive humanitarian catastrophe in modern history. Thirty countries, the United Nations, the European Union and the Arab League are all sending representatives to the Jan. 22 conference, where they are expecting to broker a peace accord between Syria's two warring sides. As it now stands, however, the meeting, known as Geneva II, is already a fiasco. None of Washington's affiliated rebels has any significance on the ground in Syria any longer, and the rebels who do matter on the battlefield want absolutely nothing to do with the conference; they will not talk with Assad or his state sponsors Russia and Iran, the arms dealers and militia builders who are after all underwriting Assad's war machine. In the months since Obama's decision to cancel military retribution for the regime's Aug. 21 chemical weapons attack in

Damascus, we have witnessed the near-total collapse of the U.S.-backed Free Syrian Army (FSA), and with it the last shred of U.S. influence on the trajectory of the conflict." [53132]

She was leaving the building without getting a needed chest x-ray. 'The people in there told me that since I didn't have an insurance card, I would be billed for the whole cost of the x-ray,' Galvez said, her young daughter in tow. 'It's not fair-you know, I signed up last week like I was supposed to.' The x-ray's cost, she was told, would likely be more than \$500." (Galvez may have "signed up" for ObamaCare, but she has no coverage if she has not yet made her first premium payment. In fact, she states, "No one sent me a bill." A fair number of Americans likely mistakenly believe they do not have to pay anything and are covered simply because they enrolled at Healthcare.gov.) [53124, 53125, 53154, 53191]

Kerry and ...Obama are both desperate to make the forging of some peace plan a legacy issue, and Kerry quickly jumped into the task after Secretary of State Hillary Clinton—who was reportedly critical of Obama's stance toward Israel—left the post. The trouble connecting with MNsure was particularly annoying for consumers who still aren't clear whether they have coverage. Meanwhile, the average wait time for people calling MNsure for help Thursday was 62 minutes. The call center had received more than 2,500 calls as of 5 p.m." [53155]

MLIve.com reports on the problems faced by a couple in Michigan who have repeatedly and unsuccessfully attempted to enroll in ObamaCare because their prior policy—with which they were satisfied—was cancelled because it did not comply with the Affordable Care Act. Shannon Wendt has spent "roughly 25 hours on the phone with dozens of health insurance navigators and supervisors" but "she still has been unable to sign up for insurance. The reason: her five children are deemed ineligible." (She and her husband are U.S. citizens, as are their five children. There is no reason for them to be considered ineligible.) "Working with navigators by phone, she filed and deleted an application 12 times. She had her husband set up a separate application, but that ran into problems. At one point, a navigator said she may have to submit proof of citizenship for the children. All five children were born in the U.S., and all have social security numbers, she said. 'Nobody's said anything about it since then,' she said. 'That's kind of my working assumption—that somehow our kids are not considered citizens and that's why they were rejected.'" [53156]

An administration spokesman said the federal government continues to have trouble transferring the electronic files of more than 25,000 applications to the state's Department of Public Welfare." The Associated Press reports, "Obama administration officials estimate that 2.1 million consumers have enrolled so far through the federal and state-run health insurance exchanges that are a central feature of the federal law. But even before coverage began, health insurance companies complained they were receiving thousands of faulty applications from the government, and some people who thought they had enrolled for coverage have not received confirmation. Tens of thousands of potential Medicaid recipients in the 36 states relying on the federal exchange also are in limbo after the federal website that was supposed to send their applications to the states failed to do so. Reports of other complications were scattered around the country. In Burlington, Vt., the state's largest hospital had almost two dozen patients seek treatment with new health insurance policies, but more than half of those did not have insurance cards. Minnesota's health care exchange said 53,000 people had enrolled for coverage through its marketplace, but it was unable to confirm the insurance status of an additional 19,000 people who created accounts but did not appear to have purchased plans." "In Connecticut, officials were pleading for patience as call centers fielded calls from people who are concerned because they had yet to receive a bill for premiums or an insurance identification card. ...Julie Cadorette, 63, of Maynard, Mass., said she has spent dozens of hours on the phone trying to find out the status of her application through Massachusetts Health Connect, which she said she sent by certified mail three months ago. Her current plan ends Jan. 31. 'It's very hard to deal with them, they're so behind,' she said Thursday. 'When you call them, they ask you specific questions. [But] You can't ask them any questions.' ...In California, employees of the state health exchange were still going through some 19,000 paper applications sent in the early days after Covered California launched on Oct. 1, spokesman Dana Howard said. He could not say how many were outstanding. The entire tracking system was 'in a sort of chaos' Thursday as consumers tried to use or confirm their new insurance, said Kelly Fristoe, an insurance

agent in Wichita Falls, Texas. 'I've got pharmacies that are calling in to verify benefits on these new plans that are getting incorrect information,' he said. 'I have people that are calling to make their initial premium payment, and they've been on hold for maybe three or four hours at a time and then they get hung up on.'" [53159]

Despite Obama's assurances that families would see their premiums go down by \$2,500 per year, state insurance officials in Hawaii approve rate increases of 9.2 percent for 11,000 individual health plans and 5 percent for 26,300 small business plans administered by Kaiser Permanente, according to the *Honolulu Star-Advertiser*. Hawaii Medical Service Association premiums for 14,300 individual policies will increase by 7.5 percent. [53161]

Rocky King, head of Oregon's problem-plagued ObamaCare exchange, resigns effective March 5. OPB.org notes, "King is the second official connected to the exchange to resign. NewsBusters.org reports, "A group of climate change scientists were rescued by helicopter Jan. 2, after being stranded in the ice since Christmas morning. But the majority of the broadcast networks' reports about the ice-locked climate researchers never mentioned climate change. The Russian ship, Akademic Shokalskiy, was stranded in the ice while on a climate change research expedition, yet nearly 98 percent of network news reports about the stranded researchers failed to mention their mission at all. Forty out of 41 stories (97.5 percent) on the network morning and evening news shows since Dec. 25 failed to mention climate change had anything to do with the expedition. In fact, rather than point out the mission was to find evidence of climate change, the networks often referred to the stranded people as 'passengers,' 'trackers' and even 'tourists,' without a word about climate change or global warming. Chris Turney, the expedition's leader, is a professor of climate change at the University of New South Wales. According to Turney's personal website, the purpose of the expedition is to 'discover and communicate the environmental changes taking place in the south.'" [53168, 53174]

*The Telegraph* then reports, "A ship which was used to rescue by helicopter 52 people from a trapped Antarctic ship has now found itself in need of rescue—after it got stuck in heavy ice. Having not moved for several days while preparing to airlift the passengers, the Chinese-owned Snow Dragon is now wedged in ice. The ship was used as a launch pad to pick up the passengers on Thursday, after they had spent nine days stranded. Their ship, the Akademik Shokalskiy, became wedged in ice on Christmas Eve as it was heading towards Antarctica." (The article makes no mention of the purpose of the trip and refers to the climate change scientists "passengers." According to NewsBusters.org, "Forty out of 41 stories (97.5 percent) on the network morning and evening news shows since Dec. 25 failed to mention climate change had anything to do with the expedition." According to NASA, "In late September 2013, the ice surrounding Antarctica reached its annual winter maximum and set a new record. Sea ice extended over 19.47 million square kilometers (7.51 million square miles) of the Southern Ocean. The previous record of

Fiat Spa said it could complete its acquisition of Chrysler without having to raise new capital through a rights issue. ...Fiat said it had reached an agreement with the United Auto Workers union-controlled trust fund holding 41.5 per cent of Chrysler's shares. Fiat already held all the other shares. ...Fiat will pay \$1.75 billion (about 1.35 billion euros) in cash. Another \$1.9 billion (almost 1.5 billion euros) will be paid as extraordinary dividends. Yahoo News reports, "Secretary of State John Kerry is proposing to offer up US troops to help secure the borders of the new state of Palestine, according to some unconfirmed news reports coming out of Israel. How plausible is the possibility? And would it be a good idea, or, as some military analysts argue, would the White House... be 'nuts' to consider it? The US troops would be tasked with helping to prevent anti-Israel forces from coming out of Jordan and reaching Israel, according to Debkafile, an Israeli intelligence and security news service. Palestinian officials are demanding that Israel move its forces from the Jordan Valley, where the US troops would be stationed. Senators John McCain (R-AZ) and Lindsey Graham (R-SC) issue a joint statement: "While many Iraqis are responsible for this strategic disaster, the administration cannot escape its share of the blame. When ...Obama withdrew all U.S. forces ...over the objections of our military leaders and commanders on the ground, many of us predicted that the vacuum would be filled by America's enemies and would emerge as a threat to U.S. national security interests. Obama and his daughters return to Washington, D.C., while his wife remains behind in Hawaii. It is a birthday present whose costs, in separate travel and security expenses, are likely to be borne, in part, by taxpayers. On a previous occasion, when Mrs. Obama left for a Hawaii vacation in advance of her husband, the additional cost to the Treasury was estimated to be at least \$63,000, and potentially upwards of \$100,000." An example is a computerized sorter in use at Hall Winery in Napa Valley which, according to head winemaker Steve Leveque, can sort two tons of grapes in 12 minutes-as opposed to the two hours formerly needed by 15 workers. The more the minimum wage is increased, the more businesses will look to machines to replace them. Future high-paying jobs will be in designing and building those machines, while those workers whose only skills are "grape triage" or bragging about degrees in "LGBT studies" or "climate change" will be begging for jobs. Kristin Rose, owner of the Napoleon Cafe in Jackson, Michigan, tells MLive.com a \$10.10 minimum wage "could kill me as an employer." Hard Knock Grill chef and kitchen manager Daniel Pratt says, "If you're paying a dishwasher \$10 an hour, then cooks and other staff, who might have a higher skill set, are going to expect a similar increase. Obama and his fellow Democrats often push an increase in the minimum wage by using emotional terms, saying workers need a "living wage." Of course, the minimum wage is *not* meant to support a family. It is intended to be nothing more than a wage floor, with

the assumption that most people earn that low wage for only a brief period of time before working their way up, learning new skills, and increasing their value to employers. According to a Pew Research study, 50.6 percent of minimum wage earners are ages 16–24, and 24 percent are teenagers (16–19). Few would argue that a teenager who lives at home with his middle class family and works part-time at a fast-food restaurant should be paid a "living wage"—enough to maintain a family of four. Granted, a man in his forties with a wife and two children at home would have a difficult time providing for that family if he is paid only the minimum wage. The important question to be asked, however, is not, "Why is that man not paid more than \$7.25 per hour?" but "Why has a man in his forties not yet developed enough skills to make him worth more than \$7.25 per hour?" Newsmax.com reports, "Millions more Americans are expected to seek medical treatment under Obamacare, but many are likely to have difficulty finding easy access to a doctor. ...The Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) predicts that there could be a shortage of 45,000 primary care doctors in the United States by 2020, and a shortfall of 46,000 specialists. To make matters worse, many primary care doctors do not accept Medicaid patients due to low reimbursement rates, and many of those who are newly insured under Obamacare will be covered through Medicaid. The new rules follow a bill introduced by Senators John Hoeven and Mark Pryor, a Republican from North Dakota and a Democrat from Arkansas, to permanently loosen requirements instituted in 2012 as part of the administration's focus on the growing problem of childhood obesity and related diseases." (TheBlackSphere.net comments, "I'm surprised that Michelle Lunch Program Obama hadn't issued a proclamation, 'If you like your nutrition plan, you can keep your nutrition plan.' Because one of her first acts as First Lady was to serve America's school children crap. That's why schools had to go BACK to 'junk meals.' Even if it costs \$18,000 an hour to fly that airplane, she will pay the cost of a single first class seat for herself and whoever else from the family. That's how it's technically drawn up on paper. At FrontPageMag.com Matthew Vadum writes, "Like Attorney General Eric Holder, [Debo] Adegbile is a staunch affirmative action supporter and doesn't appear to believe that white Americans are entitled to civil rights protection. Currently he serves as senior counsel to the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee, which is chaired by Sen. Pat Leahy (D-VT). It's yet another nomination to high federal office in which Obama isn't even trying to conceal his anti-American radicalism. I want to go at this for a second. I... you know, I... that really sells the American people short. I meet a lot of ... I... I meet a lot of people. And I can't... I can't name a time where I met an American who would rather have an unemployment check than the pride of having a job." (Obama is, of course, incorrect. Studies have shown that many unemployed people wait until their benefits are ready to run out before they earnestly look for a job. In fact, recessions tend to end when unemployment benefits are exhausted. Additionally, Democrats have frequently claimed that "for every available job there are three people looking for work." There are about 12 million unemployed Americans, so that three-to-one ratio suggests there are about four million available jobs. In fact, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, there were 3.925 million job openings in October, 2013. Obama, after months of contentious discussion with Gates and other top advisers, deployed 30,000 more troops in a final push to stabilize Afghanistan before a phased withdrawal beginning in mid-2011.' ... In other passages, Gates seethes over 'breaches of faith' by [Obama], including getting sandbagged on 'Don't Ask Don't Tell' and budgetary matters. For a monthly premium as low as roughly \$40, an individual who is a Walmart HRA plan enrollee can obtain full-service coverage through a Blue Cross Blue Shield preferred provider organization. A family can get coverage for about \$160 per month. Unlike Obamacare, there are no income eligibility requirements. Age and gender do not alter premium rates. The company plan is the same for all of Walmart's 1.1 million enrolled employees and their dependents, from its cashiers to its CEO. A Journal of the American Medical Association analysis from September showed that unsubsidized Obamacare enrollees will face monthly premiums that are five to nine times higher than Walmart premiums. JAMA found the unsubsidized premium for a nonsmoking couple age 60 can cost \$1,365 per month versus the Walmart cost of about \$134 for the same couple. ... Walmart also gives cash to its employees for any health care expense. The annual payments run from \$250 to \$1,000 and are given at the beginning of the enrollment year in an account that can only be used for health care expenses." [53292, 53294, 53310]

'Whatever measure you use, solar peaks are coming down,' Richard Harrison of the Rutherford Appleton Laboratory in Oxfordshire told the BBC. 'I've been a solar physicist for 30 years, and I've never seen anything like this.' He says the phenomenon could lead to colder winters similar to those during the Maunder Minimum. 'There were cold winters, almost a mini ice age. You had a period when the River Thames froze.' Mike Lockwood University of Reading says that the lower temperatures could affect the global jet stream, causing weather systems to collapse. 'We estimate within 40 years there a 10-20% probability we will be back in Maunder Minimum territory,' he said.") [53700, 53701, 53778, 54124]

On CNN's *The Situation Room*, Republican National Committee Chairman Reince Priebus tells Wolf Blitzer, "I think there's going to be an avalanche of information on Hillary Clinton and the things that she's done over the years dating back to [Bill Clinton's] governorship in Arkansas and her role in many of the things that happened back then." Preibus notes the Benghazi attack that resulted in the deaths of four Americans, and adds, "This is a very political person who makes decisions based on how the wind blows. On *Special Report*, Fox News senior political analyst Brit Hume comments, "The administration's appeal for a further extension of unemployment benefits may succeed in putting Congressional Republicans in a tight spot if they resist. In that sense it may be a shrewd political move. Yet embedded in it is an extraordinary acknowledgment of failure by [Obama] and his party. We are now four and a half years into an economic recovery that Democrats keep telling us is getting better all the time. Yet the job market remains so weak, the jobless rate so high, that [Obama] considers it an emergency [to extend benefits]." (The White House calls the situation an emergency—because it is in Obama's best interests to deflect attention from the ObamaCare fiasco and to put pressure on Republicans to dare to refuse to spend money that does not exist.) In Virginia, relatively unknown Republican candidate Wayne Coleman trails Democrat Lynwood Lewis by a mere 10 votes in a special election for state senate seat in a district Obama won by 15 points in 2012. Larry Sabato, of the University of Virginia's Center for Politics, tells WeeklyStandard.com, "I'm amazed that Lewis didn't win by more in that district. Lewis is a member of House of Delegates. Coleman's barely known." Sabato suggests a "substantial motivation gap" between Democrat and Republican voters—with the latter so incensed by ObamaCare and Obama's other action that not bothering to vote becomes out of the question for many of them. (If Lynwood is certified the winner of the election, Coleman may request a recount.) [53345]

On January 8 Hugh Hewitt writes at Townhall.com, "*Duty* by Robert Gates has been read in full by only a handful of the tens of thousands who will eventually pour over it, but already two or three judgments it renders won't ever be forgotten. From Greg Jaffe's review in the *Washington Post*: 'He recounts his thoughts during a tense 2011 meeting with Obama and Gen. David H. Petraeus, then in charge of U.S. and NATO forces in Afghanistan, in the White House Situation Room: 'As I sat there I thought: [Obama] doesn't trust his commander, can't stand [Afghan President Hamid] Karzai, doesn't believe in his own strategy and doesn't consider the war to be his. For him, it's all about getting out.'' From Chris Cillizza's articles on the book analysis in the same paper, two takeaways, the first noting that Gates said about Vice President Joe Biden that he has [been] 'wrong on nearly every major foreign policy and national security issue over the past four decades.' The second Cillizza piece, zeroing on the far more important revelation, relays Gates portrait of Hillary Clinton—softened by some kind words along the way: 'Hillary told [Obama] that her opposition to the [2007] surge in Iraq had been political because she was facing him in the Iowa primary. ...[Obama] conceded vaguely that [his] opposition to the Iraq surge had been political. To hear the two of them making these admissions, and in front of me, was as surprising as it was dismaying.' These are hammer blows, each of them, and there will be more as the general public and not the White House-protecting MSM [mainstream media] gain access to the book." [53309, 53317]

"Take a look at Bob Woodward's expanded assessment this morning, which evolves as he finds new and even more searing slices at Team Obama: 'Gates says his instructions to the Pentagon were: 'Don't give the White House staff and [national security staff] too much information on the military options. They don't understand it, and 'experts' like Samantha Power will decide when we should move militarily.' Power, then on the national security staff and now U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, has been a strong advocate for humanitarian intervention.' ...Like early reports from a remote region hit by a 7.0 trembler, the early assessments of *Duty* almost certainly fail to capture its full impact. Only after the whole book is available for a few weeks to all interested parties including the military from its senior ranks to its greenest private to its rolls of retired, wounded and widowed—will the full impact of the important memoir be known." Gates also writes in Duty, "I felt that agreements with the Obama White House were good only for as long as they were politically convenient." (Of course, most Obama observers do not need to read Gates' book to know that. The Heritage Foundation's James Carafano comments, "You don't need a book from the former secretary to know that many of the decisions Obama made during Gates' watch were a disaster." Carafano spares no criticism of Gates: "It's hard not to see the former secretary as an enabler for some of [Obama's] worse decisions. We'll have to read his account and measure it against what else we know to really trace the roots of military decline under Obama and how the nation wound up less safe than when he took office.") Another quote from Gates' book: "I worked for Obama longer than Bush and I never saw his eyes well up. The only military matter, apart from leaks, about which I ever sensed deep passion on his part was 'Don't Ask, Don't Tell."" (The deaths of soldiers did not affect Obama emotionally, but allowing gays to serve openly did.) Of a meeting in which it was learned that Obama might keep troops in Iraq longer than was first anticipated, Gates writes, "I was sitting across from [then-] House Speaker Nancy Pelosi and thought she alternately looked like she had swallowed an entire lemon or was simply going to explode. She drummed her fingers on the table and had a white-knuckled grip on her pencil." [53334, 53340, 53441]

Obama shares lunch and makes five appearances with Vice President Joe Biden in an effort to show his support after the release of the Gates book quote that Biden was, "wrong on nearly every major foreign policy and national security issue over the past

four decades." The White House calls Biden, "one of the leading statesmen of his time." (DailyCalller.com notes, "The public embrace is very unusual. Biden is rarely given much billing in the White House's schedules, and he is hardly ever photographed with Obama outside a major bill signing or ceremonial event. ...But Obama's embrace of Biden has a political purpose. Biden and former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton are competing for the Democratic Party's 2016 nomination. Clinton is believed to be far ahead of Biden, but either politician would help Obama by cementing his regulatory policies if they [sic] were elected by the voters.") [53312, 53324, 53327]

Iraq's ambassador to Washington, Lukman Faily, tells The Washington Times, "The [Obama] administration has to have a better understanding of any adverse impact of any delay in provision of support to Iraq. It cannot afford a whole town or province of Iraq falling to al Qaeda and becoming a safe haven. It's against the U.S. strategic interest. It's against the U.S. national security to do that." Asked whether the White House could do more to improve its relationship with Iraq, Faily says, "To a certain extent they can. But we are no longer in a period in which we had President Bush, who took ownership of that relationship. ... You have a reflection of, 'Should we have left or should we have not left at the end of 2011?' To me, in our analysis of that, the abruptness of the U.S. forces leaving, versus our own Iraqi desire to have sovereignty, what we are seeing now is the immediate aftermath of those two things-in which there was no clarity to the day-after scenario. It's not a matter of blame. It's a matter of short-termism arriving over the national strategic interests of the countries. For example, the U.S. forces left, but by the time they left, we had no air force. And then we were blamed [by Washington], why the Syrian overflights took place. We had no air force, we can't force a plane down. And now we're asking for F-16s, and the U.S. says, why do you need F-16s?" [53329]

At NationalReview.com Patrick Brennan reports, "U.S. officials have told the Washington Post that they believe that former Guantanamo Bay detainee and al-Qaedalinked militant Abu Sufian bin Qumu was involved in the September 11 terrorist attack that killed four Americans in Benghazi, Libya-a claim specifically denied in the New York Times' report last week about the tragedy. Rumors have flown about bin Qumu's involvement in the attack for a long time: Fox News reported the connection just a week after the attack in 2012, and 60 Minutes' ridiculously thinly sourced report this winter about the attacks repeated the claim, though without any evidence of further sourcing. ...Bin Qumu's group is about to be listed as a terrorist organization by the United States for their role in the Benghazi attack. ... Why is bin Qumu's involvement important? Well, superficially, his links go straight to the heart of al-Qaeda-'core al-Qaeda,' the Arabs based in Afghanistan and Pakistan who perpetrated 9/11 and whose organization the Obama administration has repeatedly claimed to have effectively eliminated. Bin Qumu traveled to Afghanistan in the 1990s to train with bin Laden, fought the U.S. there in the 2000s, and then was captured and sent to Guantanamo Bay. WCVB reports that Macy's is closing some stores and laying off 2,500 workers. The stores are located in Mesa, Arizona; Overland Park, Kansas; Florissant, Missouri; Irondequoit, New York; and Murray, Utah. [53318, 53447]

About 175 unionized employees of a casino restaurant in New York lose their jobs, months after a labor arbitrator ordered pay increases that doubled their average pay—but caused the restaurant to lose even more money than it had been losing. Casino spokesperson Kerry Lyon tells *The New York Times*, "If we allowed it to remain open, it would have ultimately had a negative impact. If that's consistently losing money then it becomes a drain on other parts of the business, and then it becomes harder to sustain a business that you certainly want and the community wants to survive." Union spokesman John Turchiano says, "I'm very upset about this. We are doing everything possible to assist these workers right now." (Some might argue that the labor union should have considered the impact of demanding wage increases from a money-losing venture. It can be assumed Obama will still demand an increase in the minimum wage in his January 28 State of the Union Address, despite evidence that paying workers more than the market justifies is a recipe for increased unemployment.) Obama's approval/disapproval rating stands at 41/53 in a national Quinnipiac poll. Among women, Obama is 44/49; among men he is 36/58. On the economy, Obama is 39/58; on the federal budget, 34/60; on foreign policy, 41/51. In addition, "Voters want Republicans to take the U.S. Senate 46–42 percent, with independent voters going for the GOP 45–40 percent. Looking at the House of Representatives, 46 percent want Republicans to keep control and 44 percent want Democratic control. …Raising the minimum wage will lead businesses to cut jobs, voters say 50–45 percent, with Republicans seeing job cuts 68–29 percent and Democrats saying no 65–29 percent. Breitbart.com reports, "The attorney heading the internal investigation into potential unfair targeting of conservative groups by the IRS is a frequent and significant donor to both the Democratic National Committee and ...Obama, [Congressman] Darrell Issa [R-CA] revealed today, in what he calls a 'startling conflict of interest' that jeopardizes the investigation." Issa calls the selection of Barbara Bosserman, a trial attorney within the IRS's Civil Rights Commission, "unbelievable" and "highly inappropriate." (Obama and

New Jersey Governor Chris Christie fires key aide Bridget Anne Kelly immediately after learning form leaked emails that she intentionally used a "traffic study" to tie up traffic in the town of Fort Lee because its mayor did not endorse her boss for reelection. Christie claims he knew nothing of the action and the media—which did not demand that Obama fire anyone over Operation Fast and Furious or the Benghazi, IRS, or NSA scandalsimmediately smells blood and suggests his White House hopes are over. Townhall.com political editor Guy Benson writes, "Simple. If Christie cleans house and is telling the truth about his own knowledge, he's fine. If he's not being fully honest, he's in trouble." (The mainstream media, worried that Christie could both capture the GOP nomination and defeat Hillary Clinton, hopes he is lying.) "If Christie is being fully truthful, this kerfuffle will blow over. Indeed, it could end up benefiting Christie, whose decisive response to a burgeoning political emergency over the last 24 hours has been impressive. Whouley is now working on getting Hillary Clinton elected in 2016. If Christie learns little from the fiasco, he will at least learn that the media long knives will be out to get him every step of the way if he runs for president in 2016-and especially if he wins the GOP nomination.) The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) moves forward with regulations requiring that coal-fired power plants limit carbon dioxide emissions to 1,100 pounds per megawatt hour or electricity produced. At PJMedia.com Bridget Johnson notes, "To meet those standards, plants will have to install carbon capture and sequestration [CCS] technology, which stores the carbon dioxide in geologic formations. A 2010 GAO study found that the technology might be ready in 10 or 15 years, dependent on overcoming economic, legal and technical hurdles—but those barriers remain unconquered today." (The EPA is therefore imposing a rule that coal-fired power plants have no way to comply with.) The GAO study also concluded that "...CCS would increase electricity costs, and some reports estimate that current CCS technologies." Senator John Barrasso (R-WY) comments, "It's absolutely unbelievable that on the 50th anniversary of the war on poverty, the EPA has just announced another regulation that will increase poverty in coal

country. Less than one day after ...Obama pledged to help unemployed Americans, his administration is rolling out red tape that will destroy more jobs and increase energy costs. In addition to contradicting current law, this new regulation will put more Americans out of work and make it even harder for people to provide for their families. It's now more important than ever for Congress to pass the National Energy Tax Repeal Act and protect American jobs across coal country." Senator David Vitter (R-LA) states, "In typical EPA fashion, they're putting the cart before the horse to advance their environmental policy agenda. They're moving forward with a controversial rule to regulate carbon based on technology that isn't commercially available. Not only is this wrongheaded, it's beyond the scope of their legal authority."

Meanwhile, DailyCaller.com reports, "Senate Democrats are planning on setting up a global warming task force to revive the issue in Congress and help ...Obama achieve the goals set out in his climate agenda," and Senators Barbara Boxer (D-CA) and socialist Bernie Sanders (I-VT) "introduced a bill... to tax carbon dioxide emissions..." DailyCaller.com reports, "Wisconsin insurance department officials are warning customers that HealthCare.gov is displaying incorrect prices for some exchange plans. Summaries for several Wisconsin insurance plans on HealthCare.gov indicate that the plan has no deductible, when customers will actually be on the hook for out-of-pocket costs. Other plans' detailed summaries of costs and services provided have been switched around, preventing Wisconsin customers from actually knowing what product they're purchasing at what price. The federal government is aware of the problem and working on a solution, according to Wisconsin insurance department spokesman J.P. Wieske, but 'at least several thousand people' in Wisconsin have been affected by the errors. Another signature glitch was uncovered in Maryland this week. HealthCare.gov's search feature to find in-person assistance for picking out a coverage plan is sending consumers with a state-run exchange across state lines to HealthCare.gov for personal help." Despite Obama's claim that he has al-Qaeda "on the run," CNN.com reports, "From around Aleppo in western Syria to small areas of Falluja in central Iraq, al Qaeda now controls territory that stretches more than 400 miles across the heart of the Middle East, according to English and Arab language news accounts as well as accounts on jihadist websites. Indeed, al Qaeda appears to control more territory in the Arab world than it has done at any time in its history." Morning Jolt's Jim Geraghty writes, "Remember, 'Bin Laden is dead and Detroit is alive?' Detroit is bankrupt and al-Qaeda now controls more territory than ever." Pamela Geller writes, "Al Qaeda is thriving in the Middle East and Africa. The spread of evil is the symptom of a vacuum. Whenever evil wins, it is only by default: by the moral failure of those who evade the fact that there can be no compromise on basic principles (Ayn Rand). We will win. Join us, or perish.' That is the meaning of Fallujah. And everyone in the Middle East knows it. These Americans can win some battles, but they do not have the stomach to win the war." "...That's what happens when you deny reality and insist that you can achieve peace by making nice to your enemies; you get more war, with even fewer good options than before. George W. Bush bequeathed Obama a greatly weakened al-Qaeda, a lot of discouraged Islamists, and a cautious Iran. Five years later, Obama faces rampant Islamic forces, new al-Qaeda armies, and an Iranian regime that believes he will bend to their wishes. Home Depot co-founder Bernie Marcus tells the Fox News Channel's Neil Cavuto, "[I]t's just the beginning [of the ObamaCare crisis]. So, this is a guy who on the left has been a hero and to get within 100 feet of this cop killer, to defend him by choice, disqualified you from a position at the Justice Department in my view. On January 9 Gallup reports, "The U.S. Payroll to Population employment rate (P2P)...fell to 42.9% in December, from 43.7% in November. (That is, \$2.213 trillion of the federal government's debt is being held by the Federal Reserve—even more than the \$1.317 trillion held by China.) According to CNSNews.com, "The Fed also owns \$1,490,167,000,000 in mortgage-backed securities guaranteed by Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac, and Ginnie Mae. At the end of January 2009, the month President Barack Obama was first inaugurated, mainland China owned \$744.2 billion in U.S. government debt and the Fed owned \$475.129 billion." (It is worth noting that the Federal Reserve does not "buy" U.S. bonds or notes with "real money." It merely makes accounting entries and miraculously "creates money out of thin air." These efforts, which the officials say are in the early stages, are the latest challenge that the conflict in Syria has created, not just for Europe but for the United States, as the civil war has become a magnet for Westerners seeking to fight with the rebels against the government of President Bashar al-Assad. At least 70 Americans have either traveled to Syria, or tried to, since the civil war started three years ago, according to the intelligence and counterterrorism officials a figure that has not previously been disclosed. ... Fearing that the handful of Americans who have returned to the United States pose a threat because they may have received extensive training and jihadist indoctrination, the F.B.I. is conducting costly round-theclock surveillance on a small number of these individuals, according to the officials. ... Most of the Americans who have traveled to Syria are still there, the officials said, though a few have died on the battlefield. Nicole Lynn Mansfield, 33, of Flint, Mich., a convert to Islam, was killed last May while with Syrian rebels in Idlib Province. Another American, Eric G. Harroun, a former Army soldier from Phoenix, was indicted in Virginia by a federal grand jury last year on charges related to allegations that he fought alongside the Nusra Front, one of the Syrian opposition groups linked to Al Qaeda. In September, he pleaded guilty to a lesser charge involving conspiracy to transfer defense articles and services, and was released from custody. Mr. Harroun's involvement was hardly a secret. Last February, he bragged about his role, posting a photo on his Facebook page saying, 'Downed a Syrian Helicopter then Looted all Intel and Weapons!'" [53449, 53450, 53451]

Iranian Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei states, "If the Americans are not acting in a [particular] issue, the reason for this is lack of capability, not lack of hostility. They [the Americans] have said, 'If we could, we would dismantle Iran's nuclear industry'—but they cannot... The recent talks showed both America's hostility and its impotence." [54334]

CompleteColorado.com reports, "At the height of controversy surrounding ...Obama's promises on the federal health care overhaul, U.S. Senator Mark Udall's [D-CO] office worked assiduously to revise press accounts that 249,000 Coloradans received health care cancellation notices. Because the 249,000 figure was produced inside the Colorado Division of Insurance, Udall's office lobbied that agency to revise the figure, or revise their definition of what qualified as a cancellation." According to former Congressman Bob Beauprez, writing at Townhall.com, "When Jo Donlin, the director of external affairs for the [Colorado] Division of Insurance informed the Senator's office that the Division stood by the report, Udall turned up the heat. Donlin got what she described as a 'very hostile call' from the Senator's deputy chief of staff." (In other words, Udall—who voted for the Affordable Care Act in 2010—unsuccessfully pressured the state to "cook the books" so the ObamaCare fiasco would not look as bad as it was in reality. Udall is up for reelection in 2014.) Colorado officials later increase the 249,000 figure to 335,000. [53347, 53348, 53366, 53367, 53383, 53434, 53663]

CNSNews.com reports, "The Obama administration, concerned that 'zero tolerance' policies are sending too many students to court instead of the principal's office, on Wednesday urged schools to back off—particularly in the case of minority students and other federally protected groups. 'Racial discrimination in school discipline is a real problem today,' said Education Secretary Arne Duncan, who joined Attorney General Eric Holder in speaking about the new guidance. Holder said 'students of color and those with disabilities' often receive 'different and more severe punishment than their peers.' While the nation's schools are under local control, they must follow federal civil rights

and disability laws. And the new guidance for the nation's schools could subject more of those schools to federal discrimination lawsuits. ...While the guidance is 'voluntary,' it encourages schools to set up a 'recordkeeping system' that tracks demographic information on misbehaving students, including their 'race, sex, disability, age and English-learner status' along with the infraction, the discipline imposed, who imposed it, etc. 'Schools should establish procedures for regular and frequent review and analysis of the data to detect patterns that bear further investigation,' the guidance says." (It is not enough to discipline a student who is disruptive, breaks a window, or is caught with marijuana. The Obama administration also demands that the school keep track of the race and gender of the offenders.) "The guidance says schools should also analyze the demographic data to assess the impact their discipline policies and practices are having on students—'especially students of color, students with disabilities, and students at risk for dropping out of school, trauma, social exclusion, or behavior incidents, to identify any unintended disparities and consequences.''' DailyCaller.com later reports, "Education experts decried [the] memo from the Departments of Justice and Education that instructs public schools throughout the country to cease punishing disruptive students if they fall into certain racial categories, such as black or Hispanic. The letter... states that it is a violation of federal law for schools to punish certain races more than others, even if those punishments stem from completely neutral rules. For example, equal numbers of black students and white students should be punished for tardiness, even if black students are more often tardy than white students. ...Joy Pullmann, managing editor of School Reform News, told TheDC that any notion of equal racial discipline is obviously flawed. 'It's ridiculous to assign quotas for discipline based on race,' she said. 'If we did that, for one thing, we'd have to believe that Asian students are severely under-disciplined.' Andrew Coulson, director of the Center for Educational Freedom at the Cato Institute, said the letter's policies, if implemented, would actually harm black children, by making the classrooms they inhabit 'more chaotic.' 'The kinds [of kids] who just want to be free to learn in peace, who are not disruptive, have their education injured by the disruptive kids who remain in the classroom,' Coulson told TheDC. 'And since African American kids are more often assigned to schools like that, they'll be the ones most hurt.' ... Frederick Hess, director of education policy at the American Enterprise Institute, described the letter as 'troubling,' and an attempt to intimidate schools into initiating bad policy. 'As best I can tell, they are telling schools that even if you have policies that are clearly neutral, that are clearly evenhanded, that are clearly designed to create safe environments for students and educators, DOJ still might come down on you like a ton of bricks,' Hess told TheDC. ...Pullmann also worried about the effect on classrooms. She said she has spoken to teachers who experienced a breakdown in the classroom learning environment when policies like this were implemented. 'Kids of the favored race know they can get away with more, so they misbehave more, and the well-behaved kids lose out on instruction because the teacher is busy trying to manage unruly students she can't send to the principal's office,' said Pullmann." The Associated Press reports, "Record-keeping snags could complicate the start of insurance coverage this month as people begin using policies they purchased under

...Obama's health care overhaul. Insurance companies are still trying to sort out cases of so-called health insurance orphans, customers for whom the government has a record that they enrolled, but the insurer does not. Government officials say the problem is real but under control, with orphan records being among the roughly 13,000 problem cases they are trying to resolve with insurers. But insurance companies are worried the process will grow more cumbersome as they deal with the flood of new customers who signed up in December as enrollment deadlines neared. More than 1 million people have signed up through the federal insurance market that serves 36 states. Officials contend the error rate for new signups is close to zero. Insurers, however, are less enthusiastic about the pace of the fixes. The companies also are seeing cases in which the government has assigned the same identification number to more than one person, as well as so-called 'ghost' files in which the insurer has an enrollment record but the government does not. But orphaned files—when the insurer has no record of enrollment—are particularly concerning because the companies have no automated way to identify the presumed policyholder. They say they have to manually compare the lists of enrollees the government sends them with their own records because the government never built an automated system that would do the work much faster." At the White House, Obama brings back a version of the late Congressman Jack Kemp's concept of "enterprise zones" to boost the economy in poor areas, but renaming them "promise zones." CBSNews.com reports, "The five zones will be located in San Antonio, Philadelphia, Los Angeles, Southeastern Kentucky and the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma. The administration aims to ultimately assist 20 such regions. ... The 'promise zone' plan... aims to cut red tape and streamline federal funding from multiple government agencies to these specific zones. The Department of Education, the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Commerce Department, the Health and Human Services Department, the Justice Department, and the Department for Agriculture will all participate. The administration is designating 'promise zones' by looking for areas where local officials can make strategic, targeted investments. For instance, a 'promise zone' may be interested in reducing violent crime with increased Justice Department funding for local law enforcement. Alternatively, a region may want to leverage Housing and Urban Development grants to attract private real estate investors to high-poverty neighborhoods. [Obama's] plan also includes tax credits for hiring workers and tax write-offs for capital investments within the 'promise zones.'" (Interestingly, Obama's plan does not include economically devastated areas of Chicago or Detroit. It also seems to rely more on federal grants to local communities, where Kemp's plan focused on targeted tax cuts to encourage businesses to locate in poor areas and hire local residents. Having more police officers in Los Angeles might make residents safer, but it would not provide them with jobs. Obama wants the government to spend more money in selected areas; Kemp wanted private businesses to spend money in those areas. The latter is preferable because it makes people dependent on themselves, not on the government. It is worth noting that southeastern Kentucky would be in less need of attention had Obama not caused the loss of jobs there with his war on coal.) [53357, 53363]

In an interview with *The Washington Post*, Robert Laszewski, president of Health Policy and Strategy Associates, comments on the status of ObamaCare: "HealthCare.gov on the front-end is in pretty good shape. It's where it should've been at launch. The back-end is still highly problematic. Clearly the administration put its emphasis on the consumer side. Insurers are still seeing errors in probably five percent of the files coming through. That's compounded by the issue of all the people enrolling in the last few weeks. That's a huge surge that would create customer-service problems in the best of circumstances, So I think it'll take until about the end of January till everyone is straightened out and where they should be. ... The other challenge now is getting people to pay for coverage. I was surprised today calling around to people to find only about 50 percent have paid. ... There's a big misconception that this [making ObamaCare work] is about young people. That's baloney. It's about healthy people. A healthy 20-year-old might only pay a \$100 premium. You want healthy 40 and 50-year-olds [who pay higher premiums]. The big problem right now is really total enrollment. We only have about 10 percent of the uninsured in here. Insurers think you need more like 70 percent of a pool of people to sign up. ... I think we're going to ultimately need about 20 million people for a sustainable pool. It doesn't need to be this year. That's what the transitional risk corridors are all about. But it needs to happen in the first few years. So when I hear people talk about the goal being seven million, I think, 'time out.' This needs to be 20 million people within three years. The problem with the enrollments today is that they're so small, it's less than 10 percent of the uninsured coming in, it really can't be anything but sick people. So if it's going to be sustainable you need loads of people coming in the door. So when I judge where Obamacare is on December 31st or March 31st, I want to have confidence that this thing is ramping up to 20 million. I want to see momentum." [53415]

Laszewski continues, "I think the [individual] mandate is almost worthless because the word is getting around that they can't really collect it. And by year three, it's really a lot of money. I think there'll be real pressure to just get rid of it. I don't think you can force people to buy this insurance. If they don't want it there'll be a political groundswell to get rid of it. So in my mind the individual mandate is kind of irrelevant to this. ... The mandate will be effective for free riders. No one has a problem penalizing people who don't pay their fair share. But if ObamaCare hasn't been sold to the American people as something they should want then the mandate will just be rubbing salt in the wound and there'll be enormous political pressure to get rid of it. So I think this gets back to whether the American people end up accepting ObamaCare or not. ... I do have a concern that people are looking at these plans and not finding value. Some people are looking at paying 10 percent of their income for plans with huge deductibles, and then you have politics of ObamaCare and the bad press of the launch and if you put all those things in a bag and mix them up, I am really concerned that the uninsured who are healthy are not finding ObamaCare the value they hoped it will be. That's the real risk for ObamaCare. ... If an entrepreneur had crafted ObamaCare he would've gone to a middle class family. A family of four make \$54,000 a year has to pay \$400 in premiums net of subsidy and for that the standard silver plan has an average deductible around \$2,500 and a narrow network. They're going to pay almost \$5,000 for that? So the entrepreneur would say I've got \$5,000 in premium and all this deductible, what do they want for that? And they probably would've said we want office visits and lab tests because the kids need to go in

occasionally and then we want catastrophic care. The problem with ObamaCare is it's product driven and not market driven. They didn't ask the customer what they wanted. And I think that's the fundamental problem with ObamaCare. It meets the needs of very poor people because you're giving them health insurance for free. But it doesn't really meet the needs of healthy people and middle-class people." [53415]

With Laszewski noting, "I think the [individual] mandate is almost worthless because the word is getting around that they can't really collect it," it is worth mentioning this text in the Affordable Care Act: "§18115. Freedom not to participate in Federal health insurance programs. No individual, company, business, nonprofit entity, or health insurance issuer offering group or individual health insurance coverage shall be required to participate in any Federal health insurance program created under this Act (or any amendments made by this Act), or in any Federal health insurance program expanded by this Act (or any such amendments), and there shall be no penalty or fine imposed upon any such issuer for choosing not to participate in such programs." (Pub. L. 111–148, title I, §1555, Mar. 23, 2010, 124 Stat. 260.) That is, ObamaCare itself states that no one can be forced to participate in the scheme. Additionally, the IRS has no way of collecting the penalty/tax that is imposed for not having insurance—beyond subtracting it from any refund due the taxpayer. As a result, if a worker simply adjusts his or her employer tax withholding via a W-4 form to ensure he or she does not overpay taxes, there will no refund for the IRS to reduce. [53416]

At WashingtonTimes.com Wesley Pruden writes, "Every night's going to be Halloween night for Hillary [Clinton]. The skeletons in her closet are signing up now for the conga line. The 'Nuclear Weapon Free Iran Act' is now supported by at least 54 senators in the 100member chamber, according to a congressional record, with six senators joining on Wednesday. A Senate aide said two more joined on Thursday, bringing the total to 56. It is uncertain whether the bill will be introduced in the Senate and whether backers can win the two-thirds majority to overcome a veto by ...Obama. A senior Senate Democratic aide said there were no plans yet for advancing the bill to the Senate floor, despite the growing list of co-sponsors." [53390]

News.Xinhuanet.com reports, "Jordanian officials said this week that the country is closely following up the situation on borders with Iraq and Syria after radical groups took control of some of these areas. In a Lower House session on Tuesday, Jordan's Prime Minister Abdullah Ensour said his country is concerned about terrorism and is closely following up the developments in Iraq's Anbar province, where al-Qaida-linked groups took control of some areas bordering Jordan. ... The Islamic State of Iraq and Levant (ISIL), which is an al- Qaida-linked faction, currently has control over Fallujah and parts of Ramadi in Iraq's western Anbar province, which borders Jordan." On *Special Report*, Charles Krauthammer comments on former Secretary of Defense Robert Gates' claim in his book, *Duty*, "Hillary [Clinton] told [Obama] that her opposition to the 2007 surge in Iraq had been political because she was facing him in the Iowa primary. The government reports that a mere 74,000 jobs were created in December-typically one of the highest employment months of the year-even though some economists predicted the number would be 196,000. (74,000 people would not even fill the Denver Broncos football stadium to capacity.) FoxBusiness.com reports, "The headline unemployment rate fell to 6.7%, the lowest level in five years. But the rate fell primarily because hundreds of thousands of people [535,000] left the workforce unable to find jobs, according to figures released Friday by the U.S. Department of Labor. ... [T]he labor force participation rate, which measures people actively looking for work, fell to 62.8%, a four-decade low." (In other words, the unemployment rate would be 37.2 percent if all working age Americans who are not working-including people on welfare-were counted in the statistics. Roughly 91.8 million Americans of working age are not working. Some accounts place the number at 102.2 million.) In December 2008 there were 134,425 American workers; in December 2013 there were 136,877, for an increase of only 2,452 over five years—a period during which the population increased by far more than that number. In the Senate, Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) continues to block efforts by Republicans to add amendments to proposed legislation to extend unemployment benefits. At HotAir.com Ed Morrissey writes, "Make no mistake about it: Harry Reid blew up any momentum that had developed on this bill. The act of blocking amendments is the main reason that Republicans have to resort to cloture fights, in order to get Reid to stop blocking minority input on legislation. It's the flip side of the filibuster fight, one that the media doesn't cover nearly as much as it does with the supposed abuse of the filibuster itself. ...[T]his move is nothing but crassly political. Any amendments filed would still have to pass on a floor vote, so if they are too radical for Democrats, they won't fly anyway. Why block them at all, then? In this case, Reid doesn't want this issue to get resolved, because Democrats want to use it all year long in the run-up to the midterm elections. They are scared to death of what ObamaCare means for Senate control, and the surprise vote [60–37] that allowed debate on the UI [unemployment insurance] bill must have stunned Reid into thinking one of his alternate issues might end up defused long before they needed it to cast the GOP as uncaring about the chronically unemployed. The question Republicans should ask is this: what is Harry Reid afraid of in potential Republican amendments? That they might actually carry some Democrats, and demonstrate that Reid is an extremist?" According to Conn Carroll at Townhall.com, one of the amendments Reid will not allow is sponsored by Senator Kelly Ayotte (R-NH), it would reverse cuts to military pensions and "simply require anyone who wanted to participate in the Additional Child Tax Credit program to supply a Social Security number before they were allowed to collect any checks from the government. According to the Treasury Department, illegal immigrants [illegally] collected \$4.2 billion ACTC funds in 2011 alone. According to Ayotte's office, her amendment would save taxpayers more than \$20 billion over ten years. By a vote of 291–122, the House of Representatives passes the Health Exchange Security and Transparency Act, H.R. 3811. Defying the Obama administration, 67 Democrats vote for the bill, which requires that the government notify individuals if an ObamaCare security breaches involving their information. According to TheHill.com, "The onesentence bill says that no later than two business days after any security breach on an ObamaCare [web] site is discovered, 'the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall provide notice of such breach to each individual.' Republicans said that under current law, the government is not required to notify people if their information is put at risk. ...Democrats said the GOP was trying to stir up fears about HealthCare.gov and the other enrollment sites by raising the idea that people's personal information could be stolen. ...The White House, meanwhile, claimed the legislation would create costly new reporting requirements." CTMirror.org reports, "The head of Connecticut's health insurance exchange said Friday that officials at Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield have acknowledged 'administrative

challenges' in setting up coverage for people who signed up for plans that were supposed to begin Jan. 1. As of last Friday [presumably January 3], only 8 percent of customers slated to have coverage effective Jan. 1 had been recorded in Anthem's system as having paid their premiums, said Kevin Counihan, CEO of Access Health CT, the state's health exchange. That figure includes people who bought plans through the exchange and those who purchased them outside the exchange." (*The Obama Timeline* believes a problem is that many people who enrolled in ObamaCare mistakenly believe the coverage is free—and don't realize they have to write check for the coverage. Others possibly do not even have checking accounts and a way to pay the premiums.) [53464]

TheGatewayPundit.com reports on connections between the leftist activist group Code Pink, its co-founder, Jodie Evans, and a "human right" group sympathetic to terrorists called al Karama. "Mohammad Al Ahmady, the Yemen director for... Al Karama... also serves as a top official in an al Qaeda-linked Yemeni political party... Several Al Karama officials have faced terrorism allegations. Al Karama's founder and current president Abdul Rahman Naimi was designated as a terrorist and al Qaeda supporter by the U.S. Treasury Department in December, along with the group's Yemen representative Abdulwahab Al-Humayqani. As noted previously in this *Timeline*, Jodie Evans is an Obama fundraiser and personally donated \$2,300 to his campaign in 2008. In a June 2008 interview, Evans said Osama bin Laden had a "valid argument" for the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. Evans and Code Pink co-founder Medea Benjamin met with Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad in New York City in 2008. His appearance was coordinated by long-time Obama friend Rashid Khalidi, and possibly encouraged by Zbigniew Brzezinski, an anti-Semite and Obama foreign policy advisor who taught international relations at Columbia University. Evans, a friend of Viet Cong sympathizer Jane Fonda, has traveled to Afghanistan to meet with the Taliban. At a fundraiser, Evans personally presented Obama with a package containing photos, quotes, and thousands of signatures on a petition against more troops for Afghanistan. The State Department also labeled as terrorists Sufian bin Qumu, head of the Darnah branch and a former Guantanamo Bay detainee, and Ahmed Abu Khattalah, head of the Benghazi branch. And despite State Department claims that Al Qaeda leadership was not involved and a recent news report echoing that assessment, Fox News has learned that bin Qumu has Al Qaeda ties." NYTimes.com reports on some of the problems ObamaCare enrollees are having as they attempt to use the insurance they thought they had: "Paul D. Donahue and his wife, Angela, are among more than a million Americans who have signed up for health coverage through the federal insurance exchange. Mr. Donahue has a card in his wallet from his insurer to prove it. But when he tried to use it to get a flu shot and fill prescriptions this week, local pharmacies could not confirm his coverage, so he left without his medications. Similar problems are occurring daily in doctors' offices and drugstores around the country as consumers try to use insurance coverage that took effect on Jan. 1 under the Affordable Care Act. In addition to the difficulties many face in proving they have coverage, patients are also having a hard time figuring out whether particular doctors are affiliated with their health insurance plan. Doctors themselves often do not know if they are in the network of providers for plans sold on the exchange." (According to the *Times*, "The monthly premium for [Donahue] and his wife is \$1,062, but the federal government pays a subsidy of \$903. The couple pay the remainder, \$159 a month." That is, the taxpayers will be paying 85 percent of the family's premiums.) [53498]

"...But interviews with doctors, hospital executives, pharmacists and newly insured people around the country suggest that the biggest challenge so far has been verifying coverage. A surge of enrollments in late December, just before the deadline for coverage to take effect, created backlogs at many state and federal exchanges and insurance companies in processing applications. As a result, many of those who enrolled have yet to receive an insurance card, policy number or bill. Many are also having trouble reaching exchanges and insurance companies to confirm their enrollment or pay their first month's premium. Doctors' offices and pharmacies, too, are spending hours on the phone trying to verify patients' coverage, sometimes to no avail. ... In Los Angeles, Hilary Danailova, who is almost eight months pregnant, said she had to pay \$630 for an ultrasound on Thursday after failing to get an ID card or any confirmation of coverage from her new insurer, Anthem Blue Cross. Ms. Danailova, 38, said she signed up just before Christmas and sent her first month's premium of \$410 by overnight mail on Jan. 3. She has repeatedly tried to reach Anthem to see whether the company has processed her payment. ...In Langley, Wash., north of Seattle, Erin Waterman was able to see a primary care doctor on Jan. 3 with a temporary identification card printed from the website of her new insurer, LifeWise Health Plan of Washington. But when Ms. Waterman, 47, tried to fill a prescription for a new asthma inhaler, the pharmacy could not verify her coverage even though she had paid her first month's premium on Dec. 23. Ms. Waterman was given the option of paying full price-\$187, instead of the \$50 co-payment required under her new plan—and eventually being reimbursed. But she decided to wait, and hope that she does not have an asthma attack in the meantime. ... In some cases, the government has a record of a person's enrollment but the insurer does not. Insurers said they had received inaccurate or incomplete information—or no information at all—for some people who signed up through the federal exchange." [53498]

IJReview.com reports, "Louisiana Governor Bobby Jindal is furious that the Department of Justice [DOJ] wants control of Louisiana's private school voucher program, and he's not afraid to let them know it. Why would the DOJ be critical of a program that helps poor and minority students get a better education? The [DOJ] argues that by giving minority students scholarships to attend private schools, the state is messing up the racial makeup of public schools and impeding the desegregation process. Now, in addition to calling for a 45-day review period of the program, the DOJ wants information on the racial makeup of the state's private schools and wants the option to veto each individual scholarship award. Jindal didn't hold anything back in his response to the move: "...Obama's Department of Justice has admitted it cannot prove that Louisiana school choice is violating desegregation efforts, yet it continues to seek the ability to tell a parent their child cannot escape a failing school because their child is not the 'right' race. As Israel says goodbye to Prime Minister Sharon, we join with the Israeli people in honoring his commitment to his country." While Obama issues his obligatory statement, Muslims cheer the death of Sharon (who dared to defeat the Arabs in the 1967 war), hand out sweets to children, and fire rockets into Israel from Gaza land that had been given to them by Sharon in the pursuit of peace. (Obama will not attend Sharon's funeral; he will send Vice President Joe Biden, possibly because he is perhaps the least anti-Semitic person in the White House.) The slew of new regulations put in place in Washington since 2008 makes it virtually impossible for more than half of all adult Americans to qualify for a home mortgage. The fact of a weak jobs market and a net exodus of adults from the workforce also implies a smaller market for homes-even with the continued growth in the overall population. ... The neo-Keynesian, demand-side mindset of [Federal Reserve Board] Chairman [Janet] Yellen and the rest of the FOMC [Federal Open Market Committee] does not allow them to see or accept that low rates are actually hurting employment, credit, and capital formation. Investors must be paid to take risk. The declining leverage within the US banking system... is a red flag that Congress ought to be discussing with Chairman Yellen on a weekly basis. Meanwhile moral hazard grows under QE, and Fed-induced bubbles proliferate in the equity and debt markets." [53524]

The... article is from the notoriously left-wing Daily Beast, so it has a healthy dose of anti-Americanism, of course. But if the Beast is actually reporting it and blasting it ...then you know it's worse than that.") [53600, 53601]

On Iranian television, the country's top nuclear negotiator, Abbas Araghchi, states, "We can return again to 20 percent enrichment in less than one day and we can convert the [nuclear] material again. Therefore the structure of our nuclear program is preserved. Whenever we feel the other side [the United States] is not following through with its commitments, whenever we feel there are other motives involved, whenever—now, say, under pressure from Congress or something else—they take action against their commitments, say put in place new sanctions, we will immediately revert to the current status quo. And we will again continue our nuclear program in the form that it is today. I can say definitively that the structure of our nuclear program will be exactly preserved. On January 13 the U.S. Supreme Court hears oral arguments in *Noel Canning v. National* Labor Relations Board, a case involving Obama's "recess" appointments when the Senate was not, in fact, in recess. Senator Lamar Alexander (R-TN) comments, "Three federal circuit courts of appeals have already ruled that the president violated the Constitution when he made so-called recess appointments while the Senate was in session, and now the U.S. Supreme Court has an opportunity to guard against the dangers of an imperial presidency." At WashingtonTimes.com Stephen Dinan writes, "The court has a few questions to answer: First, what vacancies can be filled by recess appointments? Second, what constitutes a recess for the purposes of using that power? And third, is it Congress or the president who determines when the Senate is meeting and when it is in recess? When the founders wrote the Constitution, they gave the president the power to nominate top officials but granted the Senate the duty to approve them. Accounting for long travel and expecting Congress to be in session only a few weeks or months of the year, the founders created a special exception-the recess appointment power-to let the president fill jobs, temporarily, when Congress wasn't in town. Now, with advancements in travel making it easy to return to Washington from anywhere in the country within a day, and with Congress almost always in session, the recess appointment power has become more of a way to bypass a reluctant Congress and fill key posts over the objections of senators." "...A federal court of appeals sided with Noel Canning and issued a stunningly broad ruling that said Mr. Obama and presidents for nearly the past two centuries have misread the Constitution. Under the appeals court's ruling, the president can use his recess powers only after Congress has adjourned for the year, and then can use them to make appointments only to positions that become vacant during that break. If the ruling is upheld, it would invalidate nearly all appointments that have been made." (*The Obama Timeline* believes it is wrong for Congress to rely on the courts to block Obama's abuses of the Constitution and should rely on its own ultimate power to stop them: the power of impeachment. That Congress does not have the courage to act should not be a reason to force the courts to act in their stead. In addition to impeachment, Congress also controls spending. If it does not support an Obama appointee, it can withdraw authorization for that person's salary.) During the court session, Obama's Solicitor General, Donald Verrilli, brazenly and incorrectly argues that the U.S. Constitution is ambiguous on the issue of recess appointment. Justice Antonin Scalia responds, "It's been assumed to be ambiguous by self-interested presidents." (*The Obama Timeline* doubts that the Supreme Court would grant the executive branch the power to determine whether the legislative branch is in session. That is a "separation of powers" line the Court is unlikely to cross. The Court may therefore rule against Obama and affirm the lower court's decision. At WeeklyStandard.com, Jeffrey H. Anderson reports that under ObamaCare, "...insurance companies won't bear the cost of their own losses—at least not more than about a quarter of them. The other three-quarters will be borne by American taxpayers. For some reason, ... Obama hasn't talked about this particular feature of his signature legislation. Indeed, it's bad enough that Obamacare is projected by the Congressional Budget Office to funnel \$1,071,000,000,000.00 (that's \$1.071 trillion) over the next decade (2014 to 2023) from American taxpayers, through Washington, to health insurance companies. It's even worse that Obamacare is trying to coerce Americans into buying those same insurers' product (although there are escape routes). Private insurance companies pay for costs below \$45,000, then taxpayers generously pick up the tab—a tab that their president hasn't ever bothered to tell them he has opened up on their behalf-for four-fifths of the next \$200,000-plus worth of costs. In this way, and so many others, Obamacare takes a major step toward the government monopoly over American medicine ('single payer') that liberals drool about in their sleep." [53463]

The Obama administration releases some ObamaCare demographic information—and it is not good. *The New York Times* reports, "Of those who signed up in the first three months, 55 percent are age 45 to 64, officials said. Only 24 percent of those choosing a health insurance plan are 18 to 34, a group that is usually healthier and needs fewer costly medical services." (It has been estimated that ObamaCare needs about 40 percent of its enrollees to be young and healthy for the scheme to be financially viable.) "People 55 to 64—just below the age at which people qualify for Medicare—represented the largest

group, at 33 percent. ...Of those who signed up, about 54 percent are women and 46 percent are men. Nearly 80 percent of those who selected a plan qualified for federal subsidies to reduce their premiums, officials said." (In other words, the taxpayers will be subsidizing the premiums of four out of five Americans who have enrolled in ObamaCare.) It is worth noting that when the media inquired about low ObamaCare enrollment numbers, the administration argued that the numbers were not as important, it was the demographics that were important. It will now be interesting to see how the administration reduces its target for young enrollees from 38 to 30 percent, saying the higher number had been "overblown" and telling reporters, "From now on, the ultimate goal is to get as many people insured as possible." Of course, if they are mostly older, sicker, and poorer than the general population, enrolling "as many people as possible" could prove to be a demographic disaster for ObamaCare.) The Associated Press reports on the ObamaCare demographics: "But even if the age mix remains tilted toward older adults, 'it's nothing of the sort that would trigger instability in the system,' said Larry Levitt, an insurance expert with the nonpartisan Kaiser Family Foundation. Premiums would go up next year for the overhaul, along with taxpayer costs per enrollee, but not enough to push the system into a 'death spiral' in which rising premiums discourage healthy people from signing up." (Why rising premiums and increasing taxpayer costs would *not* discourage healthy people from signing up is not explained.) Economist John Goodman, president and CEO of the National Center for Policy Analysis, later tells CNSNews.com, "I think there is a significant problem here. I think the insurers are worried. I think the administration is worried. Remember, everybody is facing the wrong price. And sick people are facing a price that's well below the cost of their care. Young healthy people are being overcharged. And so they need lots of young healthy people to join so they can get the money to pay the bills for the sick people. And the younger people just aren't buying it. ... Over half of all the people who enrolled are above the age of 45, and older people are more expensive [to insure]. We're also seeing 20 percent of the people who are enrolling are going for the gold or platinum plans. Those people tend to be sick. They're buying the more comprehensive plans because they plan to use a lot of health care. ...[T]here won't be any neon signs that say 'Death Spiral Underway,' but what you'll see is premiums keep rising, and if premiums keep rising, then fewer healthy people will buy in and we may get to a point where you need government subsidies to prop the whole thing up. By that I mean government subsidies to the insurance companies. ...[I]t turns out that 80 percent of all the people who signed up so far are getting subsidies. Well, they need lots of people who have higher incomes and who aren't going to get subsidies. And if those people are unwilling to pay the high premiums that are being charged, then they're in trouble. ... Everybody is worried, and no one's keeping the fact that they're worried a secret." Goodman adds, "Over the next three months, the federal government will end its risk pool and all the state governments will end theirs, and then all those people who are highcost enrollees, they will go into the exchanges. And then there are cities and towns like Detroit, that have made promises of post-retirement care and they're not funded, and so Detroit's planning on sending all of its retirees to the exchange, and lots of other cities will do the same thing... And then the Obama administration's apparently going to allow hospitals and AIDS clinics to enroll people on the spot. So if a hospital had a patient who's having heart surgery, for example, that hospital is going to be able to get him enrolled in a private plan in the exchange to shift the cost over to that insurer. Apparently the hospital can actually pay the premium for the individual. You see, the premium is small compared to that hospital bill. So if we're talking about a \$50,000 hospital bill, they can afford to pay a \$10,000 premium and come out ahead. So insurers are sort of quite vulnerable at the moment. ...We have destroyed the individual market, and it's going to be very, very hard to move from where we are now to a real market, where people face real prices, which is what I think we have to do. Republicans who say we're just going to abolish Obamacare need to be aware of the fact that they can't just go back to the individual market, because it's being destroyed. We need to think carefully about how we can get out of the mess we're in, [because] just repealing the legislation isn't going to be enough." [53801]

Townhall.com political editor Guy Benson comments on the low percentage of young people who have enrolled in ObamaCare: "Twenty-four percent is below the 'worst case scenario' outside analysts had previously envisioned. If insufficient numbers of young Americans enroll in Obamacare's exchanges, insurers will be stuck with sicker, costlier risk pools. They'll compensate for projected losses by jacking up rates on other customers, which could send additional comparatively healthy consumers heading for the exits. To forestall this crumble, the administration may tee up taxpayer-funded bailouts for insurance companies. The testimony, given under 'Top Secret' clearance and only declassified this month, presents a rare glimpse into how information during a crisis travels at the top echelons of America's national security apparatus, all the way up to [Obama]." While the case is still being investigated and could remain open for months, officials familiar with its progress said it is increasingly unlikely any criminal charges will result. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) blocks a vote in legislation introduced by Senators Robert Menendez (D-NJ) and Mark Kirk (R-IL) that would re-impose sanctions on Iran if it violates the recent nuclear agreement. State Department spokeswoman Marie Harf tells reporters "no one should do anything that could possibly derail" the progress made so far. "This is the best chance we've had for a diplomatic resolution, uh, forever, to the Iranian nuclear program, and who knows when we'll get this chance again? So we would tell Congress that they shouldn't take any steps that could derail that process, uh, for any reason, uh, because it is a very delicate diplomatic situation and we need to give our experts the space to get this done." Obama urges Congress not to pass the Menendez/Kirk Iran sanctions legislation, saying, "It's going to be difficult, it's going to be challenging, but ultimately this is how diplomacy should work. ...My preference is for peace and diplomacy, and this is one of the reasons why I've sent the message to Congress that now is not the time for us to impose new sanctions, now is the time for us to allow the diplomats and technical experts to do their work. What we want to do is give diplomacy a chance, and give peace a chance. ...Beginning January 20th, Iran will for the first time start eliminating its stockpile of higher levels of enriched uranium and dismantling some of the infrastructure that makes such enrichment possible. ... In return, over the next six months the United States and our P5+1 partners-the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Russia, and China, as well as the European Union-will begin to implement modest relief so long as Iran fulfills its obligations and as we pursue a comprehensive solution to Iran's nuclear program. Unprecedented sanctions and tough diplomacy helped to bring Iran to the negotiating table, and I'm grateful to our partners in Congress who share our goal of preventing Iran from acquiring a nuclear weapon. Imposing additional sanctions now will only risk derailing our efforts to resolve this issue peacefully, and I will veto any legislation enacting new sanctions during the negotiation." (The proposed legislation does not call for immediate sanctions on Iran. It calls for their imposition if Iran violates the terms of the recent nuclear agreement. The legislation stands a good chance of passage. At PJMedia.com Bridget Johnson notes, "Since [Secretary of State John] Kerry forged the agreement with Iran in November, [Senator Bob] Menendez [D-NJ] stressed, Iran has continued construction at the Arak heavy water reactor, has built additional centrifuges and admitted it has more than originally disclosed, and fired a rocket into space and showcased long-range ballistic missile capability. The Iranian parliament is also weighing a bill to increase uranium up to 60 percent, and the Iranian walkout from negotiations when the Treasury Department blacklisted 19 companies for evading sanctions last month demonstrated the regime's 'customary bluff-and-bluster techniques.""

Menendez states, "Opponents of prospective sanctions against Iran argue that sanctions are like a spigot—easy to turn on and easy to turn off. But the story of sanctions, while effective, is more complicated. Passing anything in Congress takes time. Writing regulations and implementing sanctions takes even longer, and enforcement of sanctions is an ongoing process. The American public supports diplomacy. So do I. The American public doesn't trust the Iranian regime. Neither do I. During this pivotal time, we have a responsibility to work together across parties and branches of government in the interest of achieving U.S. national security objectives." Senator Mark Kirk (R-IL) states, "Beginning January 20th, the administration will give the world's leading state sponsor of terrorism billions of dollars while allowing the mullahs to keep their illicit nuclear infrastructure in place. I am worried the administration's policies will either lead to Iranian nuclear weapons or Israeli air strikes. The bipartisan proposal would ensure that any existing sanctions suspended under the interim step agreement would be immediately re-imposed should Iran cheat on its commitments, plan or conduct a terrorist attack against the United States, or launch a long-range ballistic missile during negotiations. It would also give Congress the ability to reject a final agreement that does not preclude Iran from being able to produce nuclear weapons in the future." [53519]

FreeBeacon.com reports, "Iran will be permitted to continue advanced research and development work on its nuclear program under the interim nuclear deal reached over the weekend, according to senior Obama administration officials. Nuclear talks were reported to have broken down late last year over the issue of whether Iran would be permitted to continue critical research and development in the nuclear arena. The White House confirmed on Monday that Iran would be permitted to continue developing advanced nuclear centrifuges that will enable it to more quickly enrich uranium, the key component

in a nuclear weapon. Asked by a reporter on a conference call if the deal stops 'Iran from designing new types of centrifuges,' a senior administration official admitted that the deal does not prohibit this activity." (In other words, Senators Menendez and Kirk have good reason to be worried about the ineffectiveness of the Iran agreement. Pamela Geller comments, "Benghazi, now this. Another bold-faced lie exposed. Is this how far Obama had to go just to get Iran's President to pick up the phone and talk to him? To what end? The whole point of the talks was to stop Iran from building its nuclear weapons program. Obama is playing for the other team. Now we wait for the worst. The landscape, occasionally 'barren,' is rich in 'undulating hills' whose 'grazing lands' are dotted with the occasional 'watering hole.' The 'mud and dung' houses feature 'thatched roofs' 'verandas,' and 'vegetable gardens.' People seem to be carrying 'straw mats' everywhere. The stars 'glint' and people 'waltz' underneath them. Eyes 'glimmer' in the light of 'campfires.' Children sing in 'high-pitched' rhythms, and girls endure 'barbaric' circumcisions. Obama, like Gallmannn, travels to the Great Rift Valley and stands at its edge. Both visit the small trading town of Narok." (After more than 10,000 hours of Obama-related research, The Obama Timeline can state without hesitation that there is simply no way Obama would have come up with the phrase "mesmerizing monkeys" or "monkeys that mesmerize." The story reports that DEA agents met with high-level Sinaloa officials more than 50 times since 2000. The DEA has not commented on the story. ingrates."] Secretary Kerry and his team have been working nonstop in their efforts to promote a secure peace for Israel because of the deep concern the United States has and the deep commitment the United States has for and to Israel's future and the Israeli people. To question Secretary Kerry's motives and distort his proposals is not something we would expect from the defense minister of a close ally." (Yaalon's statements were arguably accurate, and the Obama administration has done more to harm Israel than defend it. Kerry, in fact, desperately does want a Nobel Peace Prize, and neither he nor Obama care about the future of Israel. They just want a Palestinian state—at any cost.) Yaalon later responds, "The United States are our most important friends and allies. When there are disagreements between us, we discuss them in private. I will continue to be responsible and firmly maintain the security of the Israeli people." (Pamela Geller comments, "How can any of our allies do business with the United States? Would you trust the US as an ally? The Obama years mark the end of the American era. One only hopes that we can salvage something in 2016. If Hillary gets in—all is lost. You cannot have a 'peace process' when those waging war are committed to your destruction. Giving away precious land and security concessions will not win the peace. It will fuel the war. While Carney defends Kerry's naïveté, the terrorist group Hamas celebrates the graduation of 13,000 children from paramilitary "pioneers of liberation" training camps in Gaza. Many people and experts viewed the decline in manufacturing in this country that we had experienced over a number of years to be something that was irreversible, but this nation has proved and the American people have proved otherwise. And the fact is we've created more than 500,000 new manufacturing jobs. And the more of them that are created in the advanced manufacturing space, the more high-paying those

jobs are, the more those jobs bring economic security and stability to middle-class families across the country. So that's what [Obama] wants to highlight tomorrow." [53635]

NYTimes.com reports, "The National Security Agency has implanted software in nearly 100,000 computers around the world that allows the United States to conduct surveillance on those machines and can also create a digital highway for launching cyberattacks. While most of the software is inserted by gaining access to computer networks, the N.S.A. has increasingly made use of a secret technology that enables it to enter and alter data in computers even if they are not connected to the Internet, according to N.S.A. documents, computer experts and American officials. The technology, which the agency has used since at least 2008, relies on a covert channel of radio waves that can be transmitted from tiny circuit boards and USB cards inserted surreptitiously into the computers. In some cases, they are sent to a briefcase-size relay station that intelligence agencies can set up miles away from the target." [53542, 53564]

Former Congressman Allen West comments on the Obama administration's "new federal guidance from the departments of Justice and Education encouraging (i.e. threatening) schools to adopt disciplinary policies" to reverse the statistics that show minority students are disciplined in greater percentages than their populations. The ACLU offered research showing that black students make up 36 percent of those expelled, though they represent only 15 percent of students. ... Obama has tried every year since taking office to set a 28 percent cap. ...Liberal antipathy toward private giving in favor of increased taxing and spending seems to apply as well at the level of personal behavior. Analyses of tax data have consistently shown both that religious conservatives give higher percentages of their income to charity than secular liberals and that residents of Republican-leaning states are more charitable than residents of Democratic-leaning states. The United Way said Obama's cap would reduce charitable giving and negatively impact poor families who benefit from it." (Ostensibly, Obama's proposal is intended to increase tax revenue. The committee's report released today, 'A Less Secure Future for Rural Schools: An Investigation into the Obama Administration's Questionable Application of the Sequester to the Secure Rural Schools Program,' detailed how last February the USDA had determined 2013 sequestration wouldn't apply to 2012 funds that had already been distributed in the program. The White House stepped in and overruled the USDA..." (That is, the Obama administration pushed to make sequestration spending cuts "as painful as possible" for rural schools.) [53577, 53621]

"The journalists at *CBS This Morning* on Tuesday hyperventilated over the latest 'fashion milestone' for Michelle Obama, donating four minutes to the First Lady's second inaugural dress appearing at the Smithsonian. According to HawaiiReporter.com, "The number of small businesses that have signed up for health care through Hawaii's [ObamaCare] exchange network is decidedly miniscule. Of Hawaii's 30,000 small businesses, 296 registered for insurance through the Hawaii Health Connector by the Dec. 25 deadline, according to the exchange. ...Betty Fackler, a physical therapist who owns South Kona Physical Therapy, said she was thrilled when the Obamacare exchange was launched. She thought she could get more affordable insurance for her employees, as well as federal tax credits and subsidies. She was wrong. ...'I told my old insurance company we had to leave them for lower rates that were to be available in a larger risk pool and the federal tax credit, only available if I purchased through the connector,' Fackler said. Instead, she said she was 'shocked' by what happened next. Website glitches and bureaucratic red tape kept her from obtaining insurance and tax credits, and Fackler's business lost its health insurance coverage altogether. ... 'You can imagine how surprised I was to find each staff member premium was priced substantially higher than they would have been on the individual charts, especially my 62-year-old male employee. I was sure there was an error and perhaps discounts hadn't been applied. Maybe it was because they thought my employees were smokers and they had penalty-added pricing,' Fackler said, noting her employees also were wrongly listed on the bill as responsible for their own dental coverage. ...'I called my old insurance company and begged them to take back our little pool of three [employees]. They renewed our previous plan that is, incidentally or ironically, \$7 per month less than the comparable HMSA plan on the connector,' Fackler said." [53568]

At WSJ.com James Taranto warns of "...a little-noted ObamaCare statistic that is also a sign of adverse selection: the sex ratio. One of the selling points of ObamaCare was that it was a feminist triumph. ...Just as no one can be denied insurance or charged more

because of a pre-existing condition, a woman and a man of the same age must be charged the same premium, and their policies must cover the same conditions—including maternity care for unmarried men (and women past childbearing age). What it also means, however, is that women, like persons with pre-existing conditions, are more expensive to insure. The ban on what is called 'gender rating' drives men's premiums up as well as women's down. (That doesn't mean, by the way, that women pay less under ObamaCare than before. A 54% to 46% enrollment difference means that only 85.2 males are enrolled in ObamaCare for every 100 females. ... At any rate, our main reason for bringing this up is not to complain that ObamaCare is in part a scheme for redistributing wealth from men to women, although it is that...Rather, our point is that this is another way in which the incentive structure created by ObamaCare's price controls runs counter to the proclaimed goal of achieving universal or near-universal coverage." CNSNews.com reports, "Planned Parenthood's net revenue increased 5% to [a] total of \$1.21 billion in its organizational fiscal year ending on June 30, 2013, according to its new Annual Report 2012-2013, and about 45% of that revenue—\$540.6 million—was provided by taxpayer-funded government health services grants. In the same report, Planned Parenthood said that in the year that ended on Sept. 30, 2012 it did 327,166 abortions." (Planned Parenthood, the nation's number one abortion mill, therefore essentially received \$1,652 per abortion from the federal government.) [53575]

Meanwhile, ChristianPost.com reports, "A study across the Texas Panhandle, using government statistics from 16 counties, found that the teen pregnancy rates among 13-17-year olds from 1994 through 2010 showed dramatic declines even as Planned Parenthood Federation of America facilities in the region shut down—dwindling from 19 family planning facilities to zero. ...The study analyzed data obtained from the Texas Department of State Health Services, Vital Statistics Annual Report, Table 14B, for the years 1994 through 2010: 'In 1996, the year before opposition to Planned Parenthood began, the average teen pregnancy rate in the 16 counties where Planned Parenthood operated facilities was 43.6 per 1,000 girls aged 13 to 17. By 2002, the rate had dropped to 28.6. In 2008, the year the last two Planned Parenthood facilities disaffiliated from PPFA, the teen pregnancy rate was 27.2. And in 2010, two years after the Texas Panhandle became Planned Parenthood-free, the teen pregnancy rate had fallen to 24.1."" (Some might draw the conclusion that teen-agers perhaps act more responsibly when they do not have a federally-funded "way out" from their immoral actions.) [54052, 54053]

The White House announces that Obama will meet Pope Francis, but does not provide a date for an Obama trip to the Vatican. (At Townhall.com Daniel Doherty observes, "Evidently, [Obama] is 'hugely impressed' with Pope Francis as a religious leader; it's

seemingly only the Church—and its moral teachings—that he disdains. No matter. Pope Francis is one of the few world leaders that is genuinely popular across the board, so this historic meeting—wherever it's held—is bound to bring him some favorable press. And he could use some right about now. Perhaps that's why he waited so long to finally meet him.") [53589]

WashingtonExaminer.com reports, "Brookings Institution scholars, inspired by baseball statistics, conducted an analysis of the 113th Congress that points rather directly at the Democrat-controlled Senate as a the locus of congressional gridlock. The analysis opens with the observation that the House, contrary to expectation, passed twice as many bills as the Senate in 2013. Why? Because of the Senate committee process. 'When we look at this category, then, we begin to understand where the problem lies: even in the traditionally collegial Senate, 87 percent of bills die in committee,' Molly Jackman and Saul Jackman, of Brookings, and Brian Boessenecker write in Politico. 'While the filibuster may grab all the headlines, committees are a far deadlier weapon.' That observation undermines the conventional wisdom about Republican opposition to President Obama causing gridlock. ... Filibusters are the weapon of last resort for a Senate minority, in terms of procedural maneuvers they can use to block a bill's passage. Committees, on the other hand, are run by the majority party. The chairman's gavel is a hammer that Democrats can use to kill Republican proposals. One countervailing point against the idea that the committees account for the gridlock: Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, D-NV, has the authority to bypass the committee process and bring legislation to the Senate floor for a vote—which he does on controversial issues, such as the unemployment insurance extension. That may sound more efficient, but it's also likely to inspire more filibusters from a minority that didn't get the opportunity to shape the bill at the committee level. The drafting process is replaced by floor amendments, which may be substantive or may just be partisan messaging votes. (And, given the likelihood of messaging amendments, Reid routinely refuses to allow most amendments to receive a vote.)" (In other words, the minority is sometimes forced to engage in filibusters because Reid and the Senate committees often do not allow Republicans any input as the legislation proceeds.) [53599]

On *Special Report* George Will comments, "ObamaCare always has counted on the mass irrationality of young people. Now, normally that's a good bet. But in this case [relying on young people to enroll in ObamaCare in huge numbers], it's not so. For two reasons. ...First, the youth today... are the principle sufferers from the Obama economy. John Cooper, a retired AT&T employee, wouldn't strike most seasoned political observers as the kind of guy you'd want to run for office in what was thought of as a Democrat district. His campaign focused on his opposition to tax hikes... and his opposition to Obamacare-specifically the bipartisan, Republican leadershipbacked Arkansas Private Option (Medicaid expansion). In short, Cooper ran as the conservative's conservative. Cooper's opponent was Sam Rockwell. Rockwell was a local small-business owner and attempted to paint himself as a Democrat centrist—much like Arkansas's U.S. Senator Mark Pryor and gubernatorial candidate—and former-Congressman-Mike Ross. The 'centrist with community roots' shtick didn't work out too well for Rockwell, and that should strike fear into the hearts of both Pryor and Ross in their 2014 contests. Moreover, it should sound alarm bells for a retreating Arkansas Democratic Party and Democratic Senate candidates across the nation. ... On a national level, the election of John Cooper serves as a dire warning for Mark Pryor." (Largely because he voted for ObamaCare, U.S. Senator Mark Pryor (D-AR) faces a tough reelection contest against Congressman Tom Cotton (R-AR). In November 2010 Pryor's former Senate colleague, Blanche Lincoln (D-AR), was beaten by more than 20 pointsprincipally because of her vote for ObamaCare.) [53614, 53713, 54013]

Late night television comedian ridicules ObamaCare and the low level of enrollments by young Americans: "They expect young people to buy insurance at the same time the Playstation 4 comes out? You know, if you want young people to sign up maybe you shouldn't have made the law so you can stay on your parents' plan until you turn 26. Obscuring the reality of winners and losers was the whole reason for the 'if you like your plan' lie and a big part of the reason why Obama tends to decorate his redistribution arguments with references to Warren Buffett and other extreme cases. The success of the liberal agenda depends upon convincing people that someone else will pay for it. The Kimmel skit... strikes at the heart of that.") [53627, 54022]

On January 15 Congressmen Jim Moran (D-VA), George Miller (D-CA), and Buck McKeon (R-CA) announce they will not seek reelection. (Moran will almost certainly be replaced by another liberal Democrat—but perhaps one whose wife has not had to make domestic violence calls to the police.) Delusional House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) says the Democrat retirements "do not relate in any way to our prospects for winning [back the House]." [53585, 53626, 53697]

The Albertsons supermarket chain announces it will close 26 stores by February 20. (In August, the Stater Brothers chain announced it had earned a mere "\$10 million net profit on \$968 million in sales in its most recent quarterly report," according to Bill Sardi at LewRockwell.com. "That is a 1% profit margin or only about \$60,000 per store per quarter, (\$240,000/year). That is profit of only about \$657/day. That means just this store chain in teetering and is just 1% away from insolvency or having to borrow to have a future. ...Safeway, owner of the Chicago-based Dominick's store chain, couldn't find a buyer for this chain of 72 stores and closed them, resulting in 6000 lost jobs." [54039, 54040, 54041]

According to *The New York Times*, the Department of Justice "will significantly expand its definition of racial profiling to prohibit federal agents from considering religion, national origin, gender and sexual orientation in their investigations, a government official said Wednesday. The move addresses a decade of criticism from civil rights groups that say federal authorities have in particular singled out Muslims in counterterrorism investigations and Latinos for immigration investigations. ...Since taking office, Attorney General Eric H. Holder Jr. has been under pressure from

Democrats in Congress to eliminate those provisions. 'These exceptions are a license to profile American Muslims and Hispanic-Americans,' Senator Richard J. Durbin, Democrat of Illinois, said in 2012." At PJMedia.com Timothy Furnish writes, "Obama and Holder are transforming the U.S. into a dhimmi nation: one that cowers before Islamic law and demands that its non-Muslim citizens—especially its 240 million Christians—meekly accept their second-class status and never broach the glaringly obvious fact of Islamic violence, even if this means making all non-Muslims less safe. The question for those of us in the majority, then: just how long will we put up with such a dangerous policy?" (It remains to be seen how the government will be able to safeguard the nation from terrorist attacks launched by foreign Muslim men if agents are prohibited from paying attention to national origin, gender, or religion. DailyCaller.com reports, "The Obama administration's proposal to raise the minimum wage to \$10.10 an hour could result in as many 1,084,000 jobs eliminated from the work force, according to a new study conducted by the Employment Policies Institute (EPI) 'No amount of denial by [Obama] and his political allies—and no number of 'studies' published by biased researchers—can change the fact that minimum wage hikes eliminate jobs for low-skill and entry-level employees. Non-partisan economists have agreed on this consensus for decades, and the laws of economics haven't changed,' Michael Saltsman, research director at EPI, said in a statement. …The number of job losses would be the most dramatic in large states, such as California and Texas. The Senate Intelligence Committee releases a "Review of the Terrorist Attacks on U.S. Facilities in Benghazi, Libya, September 11-12, 2012." The bipartisan report concludes that al- Qaeda-related groups were, in fact, involved in the attack, criticizes the Obama administration for failing to bring the attackers to justice, and criticizes the State Department for not beefing up security at the Benghazi facility even after receiving requests to do so. According to FoxNews.com, "[T]he report said the intelligence community provided 'ample strategic warning' that security in eastern Libya was

deteriorating and U.S. personnel 'were at risk.' The report said multiple 'tripwires' were crossed signaling security problems, and the State Department should have increased its security posture in response." (It is still not clear who concocted the phony "It was a YouTube video" narrative.) According to USA Today, the report "also says 15 people in Libya who have tried to help the FBI investigate the murders have been killed. ... 'The attacks were preventable, based on extensive intelligence reporting on the terrorist activity in Libya-to include prior threats and attacks against Western targets-and given the known security shortfalls at the U.S. Mission,' the committee said in a statement." Congressman Jason Chaffetz (R-UT) states, "The bottom line is Hillary Clinton wanted the appearance of normalization. Security was not driving these decisions. Politics was." The IC took too long to correct these erroneous reports, which caused confusion and influenced the public statements of policymakers." Senator Susan Collins (R-ME) comments, "A broken system overseen by senior leadership contributed to the vulnerability of U.S. diplomats... in one of the most dangerous cities in the world, and yet the secretary of state has not held anyone responsible for the system's failings." (Clinton probably could not hold anyone responsible without that person charging that they were only doing what she told them to do, or that they relayed warnings to her that resulted in no action. maintain clean voter registration lists as required by Section 8 of the National Voter Registration Act,' Judicial Watch President Tom Fitton wrote in a press release." Under the terms of the settlement, the state of Ohio agrees to take nine actions to help insure the integrity of voter registration lists, such as removing the names of dead people and people who have moved out of state, based on interstate information sharing systems. BizPacReview.com adds, "In an email, Fitton said the Obama Justice Department 'has zero interest in enforcing laws to ensure clean elections,' which is why groups like Judicial Watch and True the Vote have made election fraud a top priority. Fitton said the groups continue to watch election officials, particularly in battleground states, and are working to ensure clean voter rolls across the country." [53732]

Fitton states, "Judicial Watch notified a dozen states that they must clean up their voter registration lists or face lawsuits. According to independent research published by Pew Charitable Trusts in February 2012, approximately 24 million active voter registrations throughout the United States—or one out of every eight registrations—are either no longer valid or are significantly inaccurate. Three DOJ [Department of Justice] attorneys contacted Erin Mersino, his attorney at the Thomas More Law Center (TMLC), which is handling the case, a day after the suit was filed and indicated Leonard could resume all religious duties and the chapel would be reopened for Catholic services. A week later, on Oct. 21, he was told his DOD contract would no longer be considered valid. The government has withheld the priest's pay ever since and it is also asking Leonard to sign another contract with additional pages that include 'onerous terms,' according to the TMLC. His original contract serving as Navy chaplain is valid from October 2013 through September 2014, and it was signed and agreed upon by both parties. ... Leonard serves approximately 300 Catholics on the base who were also shut out from practicing their faith. Services of other Christian denominations on the base were allowed to continue during the shutdown. ...Leonard offered to work without pay during the shutdown on a volunteer basis but was told he would face arrest if he attempted to enter the chapel. 'For Father Leonard, the lawsuit is very much about religious liberty,' Mersino said. Mersino said that due to the timing of the government's actions, 'all signs point to Father Leonard being singled out and subjected to unlawful retaliation for bringing the government's practices to light. All of a sudden, the government is now saying his contract is not valid. All of a sudden the government is withholding his pay,' she said. 'He wanted to volunteer during the shutdown,' she said. 'It seems very much a punishment for bringing the lawsuit.' The DOJ did not respond to a request for comment." [53764, 53765]

The State Department said Friday it was outraged at the cancellation of the exhibit. ... Notwithstanding this professed outrage, however, the State Department had just last week itself declined to co-sponsor the exhibit — in part because of the very reason that Bokova cited for its cancellation: the peace process. Kelly Siekman, the State Department's director of UNESCO affairs, wrote to the Wiesenthal Center to this effect on January 9: 'At this sensitive juncture in the ongoing Middle East peace process, and after thoughtful consideration with review at the highest levels, we have made the decision that the United States will not be able to co-sponsor the current exhibit during its display at UNESCO headquarters. As a rule, the United States does not co-sponsor exhibits at UNESCO without oversight of content development from conception to final production.'" (In other words, the Obama administration refused to support the exhibit because it did not want to offend Muslims, and then expressed faux outrage over its cancellation in order to avoid offending Jews. Pamela Geller comments, "Yesterday UNESCO canceled an exhibit detailing the Jewish people's historic 3,500-year relationship to the land of Israel because of pressure from Muslim countries. Arizona, Kansas and Georgia all asked that those forms request proof of citizenship, but the federal Election Assistance Commission [EAC] rejected that in a 46page ruling. The EAC said states can check driver's license databases or ask federal immigration authorities for information, but they cannot tell the federal government what to include on federal forms. 'The EAC finds that granting the States' requests would likely hinder eligible citizens from registering to vote in federal elections, undermining a core purpose of the NVRA,' the commission said in its ruling, referring to the National Voter Registration Act, or motor-voter law." (Asking for proof of citizenship may hinder a few eligible citizens from registering to vote, but it helps prevent illegal immigrants from illegally registering go vote.) "Arizona, Georgia and Kansas all have... state requirements that those trying to register prove at some point in the process that they are in the country legally, and are citizens. The commission also said that because Congress specifically considered then rejected requiring proof of citizenship when it debated the motor-voter law, the states can't now go and impose that requirement. But Kris Kobach, secretary of state in Kansas, said the commission doesn't have the power to second-guess the states, and it doesn't matter what Congress thought of proof-of-citizenship requests during its debate. 'Congress does not have the authority to prevent a state from requiring proof of citizenship, according to Article I of the Constitution. And Congress cannot create an agency to exercise a power that Congress itself is constitutionally prevented from exercising. ... Every time an alien votes in an election, that vote effectively disenfranchises a United States citizen. But this administration evidently doesn't see that as a problem worth addressing,' he said." (The issue will likely make its way to the Supreme Court.) [53751]

NYTimes.com reports, "The Obama administration is delaying enforcement of another provision of the new health care law, one that prohibits employers from providing better health benefits to top executives than to other employees. Tax officials said they would not enforce the provision this year because they had yet to issue regulations for employers to follow. The Affordable Care Act, adopted nearly four years ago, says employer-sponsored health plans must not discriminate 'in favor of highly compensated individuals' with respect to either eligibility or benefits. The government provides a substantial tax break for employer-sponsored insurance, and, as a matter of equity and fairness, lawmakers said employees." DailyCaller.com adds, "IRS officials appear to be stymied by the 'regulatory detail' of the provision. For the IRS to mandate non-discrimination in health plans for employer-provided health benefits, how to define 'highly compensated officials' and issue a final determination on what constitutes discrimination. …Obamacare's prescription for violating the ban is a \$100 daily excise

tax for each individual that was 'discriminated' against." (It is, of course, absurd to argue that company presidents and CEOs should be prohibited from receiving better benefits than lower-level employees. One might as well argue that if a major movie star is provided with a glamorous trailer for use at location shootings, every employee of the movie studio should receive the same benefit. Some lower-level employees no doubt might expect that ObamaCare will result in them being granted those same expensive and more comprehensive insurance benefits that the "big bosses" get. The actual result may simply be that CEOs will be given salary increases that are sufficient to allow them to buy those policies in the private market. 'This indicates that these munitions could not possibly have been fired at East Ghouta from the 'heart,' or from the eastern edge, of the Syrian government-controlled area shown in the intelligence map published by the White House on August 30, 2013,' the report said. 'This mistaken intelligence could have led to an unjustified U.S. military action based on false intelligence,' the report said. 'A proper vetting of the fact that the munition was of such short range would have led to a completely different assessment of the situation from the gathered data."" (In other words, the Syrian government may not have "crossed the red line" drawn-and redrawn—by Obama.) [53752, 53851]

The *Journal* reports that 'insurers, brokers, and consultants estimate at least two-thirds' of the 2.2 million people who have so far signed up in the new exchanges are coming from those who already had coverage. That's even worse than I thought it would be even considering the January 1 individual policy cancellations and small group renewals that are driving employers to reconsider offering coverage—and that is saying something. This also tells us why the first three months of the Obamacare enrollment had a relatively high average age-they came from the same market that tended to skew older [than] the health plans already covered. When McKinsey asked why subsidy eligible people weren't buying, 52% cited affordability as the reason. ... I'm not shocked to hear that given what I have been writing about the high after-tax premiums, net of the subsidies, people are finding, as well as the high deductibles and narrow provider networks the subsidized Silver and lowest cost Bronze exchange plans are offering people. ... I will suggest that the significant number of the new enrollees coming over from discontinued employer coverage should be troubling to Democrats. 'The February Brigade members refused, saying they preferred to negotiate with the attackers instead.' 'Eventually,' states the report, 'the security team initiated their plan of assault on the Mission compound. Some members of the 17th of February Brigade 'jump[ed] into the vehicle' and 'a few 17 Feb members follow[ed] behind on foot to support the team' according to the informal CIA notes provided to the Committee."" (The report does not state who was ultimately responsible for the lack of security at the compound, or why it had no armed Marines

guards—even though they are present at the U.S. embassy in Paris. That then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton could have thought Paris was more dangerous than Benghazi is absurd—yet that is what her actions suggest.) [53844]

waiting period prior to having an abortion; 76 percent oppose allowing abortions to be performed by non-doctors; 62 percent want to change laws to allow for some restrictions on abortion; 58 percent support showing a woman an ultrasound image of her baby at least a day before an abortion; 57 percent believe abortion does a woman more harm than good in the long run; 55 percent—including 6 in 10 Millennials (adults 18 to 32)—want continued debate on the abortion issue." Pope Francis Tweets: "I join the March for Life in Washington with my prayers. May God help us respect all life, especially the most vulnerable." (The media largely ignores the event. Kissner continues, "Now to [Stanley] Ann Soetoro. She was linked to Subud by her biographer (and New York Times reporter) Janny Scott (Harvard '77) in the book A Singular Woman: The Untold Story of Barack Obama's Mother... [N]ote in passing that of all the persons-Christian, Jew, Muslim, Buddhist, Atheist, Hindu, or you-name-itthat [sic; who] could have been installed as Director of the State Department of Health in Hawaii, Hawaii alighted on Fuddy-a leader of a small cult with roots in Indonesia and connections to [Stanley] Ann Soetoro—Obama's mother. Second, observe that Fuddy assumed the Director position in Hawaii in January 2011, just a few months before the release of Obama's long form birth certificate." (As noted previously in this *Timeline*, Fuddy, a social worker, was given her position by Governor Neil Abercrombie-a friend of Barack Hussein Obama, Sr.—after he unexpectedly removed Dr. Neal A. Palafox from the position. Abercrombie had made Palafox the director on December 18, 2010. On December 27, 2010 Abercrombie announced he would resolve the "birther" issue. On January 20, 2011 Abercrombie announced that he could not find the birth certificate but that information "actually exists in the archives, written down." On January 26, 2011 Abercrombie replaced Palafox with Fuddy. On April 25, 2011 Fuddy miraculously "finds" the document Abercrombie could not locate and releases it to attorney Judith L. Corley of Perkins Coie-the high-profile law firm that has, at substantial cost, been defending Obama eligibility lawsuits in court.) Shin Bet said Wednesday it arrested three Palestinians it accuses of plotting to carry out bombings, shootings, kidnappings and other attacks. It said the men, two from Jerusalem and one from the West Bank, were recruited by an operative based in the Gaza Strip who worked for Al Qaeda leader Ayman al-Zawahiri. Shin Bet alleges the Palestinians planned on attacking a Jerusalem conference center with firearms and then killing rescue workers

Fox also reports, "Newly disclosed emails suggest senior policy officials at the Environmental Protection Agency and environmental groups are working closely to kill the Keystone XL pipeline, critics say. 'These damning emails make it clear that the Obama administration has been actively trying to stop this important project for years,' Senator John Barrasso (R-WY), who has long advocated for the Canada-to-Texas pipeline's construction, said in a statement to Fox News. The emails were obtained under a Freedom of Information Act request by the Energy and Environment Legal Institute. In one communication, Lena Moffit of the Sierra Club wrote to three senior policy staffers at the EPA, including Michael Goo, who was then the associate administrator for policy." An email from the Sierra Club's Lena Moffit to the EPA reads, "Thanks so much for taking the time to meet with us on Keystone XL vesterday. Let me know if I can be helpful in any way—particularly in further identifying those opportunities for EPA to engage that don't involve 'throwing your body across the tracks,' as Michael put it." Energy and Environment Legal Institute senior fellow Chris Horner tells Fox News, "On its face, it smacks of classic secret dealing and an uncomfortably close working relationship and one that is known to these parties, but quite plainly not advertised to the public." The betrayed-sounding Sierra Club responds, "Today's announcement is a painful example of ... *The Dallas Morning News* reports that conservative radio and television talk show host Sean Hannity has been invited by Congressman Louie Gohmert (R-TX) to attend Obama's January 28 State of the Union address. According to DailyCaller.com Charles Woods, the father of Navy SEAL Ty Woods (one of the four Benghazi victims) has been invited by Congressman Jim Bridenstine (R-OK). White House press secretary Jay Carney dodges a question from ABC's Jonathan Karl about the cost of Michelle Obama's 50th birthday party and who paid for it. (By "East Wing" Carney means Michelle Obama's office—which is also unlikely to provide Karl with an answer.) [54005]

NBCNews.com reports, "The Pentagon on Wednesday is expected to announce widespread changes to rules governing religious items and religion-based physical attributes that service members can maintain while in uniform—including beards, some religious tattoos, and turbans." [53948, 53949]

Although Obama and Secretary of State John Kerry may believe they achieved a deal with Iran that will slow down its nuclear program, Iran certainly does not think so. Iranian Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif tells CNN's Jim Sciutto, "We did not agree to dismantle anything. ... The White House version both underplays the concessions and overplays Iranian commitments... The White House tries to portray it as basically a dismantling of Iran's nuclear program. That is the word they use time and again. If you find a single, a single word, that even closely resembles dismantling or could be defined as dismantling in the entire text [of the agreement], then I would take back my comment. ... We are not dismantling any centrifuges, we're not dismantling any equipment, we're simply not producing, not enriching over five percent." (According to Erika Johnsen at HotAir.com, the agreement calls for, "Halting production of near-20% enriched uranium and disabling the configuration of the centrifuge cascades Iran has been using to produce it." Whether "disabling the configuration" means to Iran the same thing that it means to Obama and Kerry is debatable.) Pamela Geller comments, "More O-baloney sliced and diced. What contempt [Obama] has for us. He has no regard for the American people, for the Constitution he swore to protect and defend, or for freedom; but most of all, he has no regard for the truth. On January 23 the Obama administration rejects the findings of an independent review board—the Privacy and Civil Liberties Oversight Board (PCLOB)—that states the National Security Agency's mass data collection program is illegal and should be ended. White House press secretary Jay Carney, who is apparently unfamiliar with the First and Fourth Amendments to the U.S. Constitution, tells reporters, "We simply disagree with the board's analysis on the legality of the program. ...The administration believes that the program is lawful." According to FoxNews.com, "Along with its call for ending bulk phone surveillance, the oversight board report outlined 11 other recommendations on surveillance policy, calling for more government transparency and other reforms aimed at bolstering civil liberties and privacy protections. The board called for special attorneys to provide independent views in some proceedings before the secret spy court—as opposed to Obama's plan for a panel of experts that would participate at times. The board also urged the administration to provide the public with clear explanations of the legal authority behind any surveillance affecting Americans." [53944, 53952]

Vogue.com reports on the romantic relationship between MSNBC's Alex Wagner and White House chef Sam Kass— the "It couple of the year." (Wagner's agent is Ari Emanuel, the brother of former White House chief of staff Rahm Emanuel and one of ObamaCare's "architects," Dr. Ezekiel Emanuel. Kass is a long-time friend of the Obamas, and was their private chef at their Chicago mansion. Some might argue that the "middle class" Obamas' infamous "school loans" might have been paid off sooner had they not maintained a private chef.) [12931, 12932, 19048, 32065, 53965]

BearingArms.com reports that the state of Connecticut has "tallied the number of citizens who have registered their 'assault weapons' and 'high capacity magazines' required by the state's unconstitutional gun laws, compared that to the estimated number of applicable weapons and magazines in the state, and realize[d] they've been ignored. Historically speaking, 90-percent or more of those required to comply with gun registration laws in the U.S. refuse to do so, and there is no reason to suspect that this registration attempt in Connecticut is any different. I've seen estimates of 1,000,000 firearm magazines that should have been registered under the law, but the state reports registering only 40,000... just 4 percent." Governor Daniel Malloy and state legislators are now considering an "amnesty period" in an attempt to persuade more gun owners to register weapons and turn in high capacity magazines. Meanwhile, membership in the National Rifle Association increased from 22,000 to 41,000 in New York since Governor Cuomo signed strict gun control legislation. New York State Rifle & Pistol Association president Tom King tells the *Buffalo News*, "I think it sends a message to all the anti-gun politicians, all the politicians sitting on the fence, that yes, if they thought that we were quiet and this was going to go away without anyone paying any more attention to it, they were just flat-out wrong." Senator John McCain (R-AZ) is less than impressed by Obama's nominee for the post of U.S. ambassador to Norway, attorney George Tsunis. Grilled by McCain and others at a Senate Foreign Relations Committee hearing, Tsunis demonstrates a remarkable lack of knowledge about the Scandinavian nation to which he is headed. Tsunis says Norway has a president (it does not; it is a constitutional monarchy), and slams the country's Progress Party as consisting of "fringe elements" who "spew their hatred" and have been denounced by the government. McCain (in a performance reminiscent of the John McCain of old) responds, "The government has denounced them? The coalition government—they're part of the coalition of the government! ... I have no more questions for this incredibly highly qualified group of nominees." In a speech to the far left Center for American Progress, Senator Charles Schumer (D-NY) calls for the IRS to go after Tea Party groups: "They've won elections, stymied Democratic priorities and taken a sledgehammer to programs that are important to tens of millions of Americans. ...We have to look at electoral reform. ...Our very electoral structure has been rigged to favor tea party candidates in Republican primaries, even when the district or the state may not be that red. ...It is clear that we will not pass anything legislatively as long as the House of Representatives is in Republican control, but there are many things that can be done administratively by the IRS and other government agencies—we must redouble those efforts immediately. One of the great advantages the Tea Party has is the huge holes in our campaign finance laws created [by] the ill advised decision [*Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission*]. Obviously the Tea Party elites gained extraordinary influence by being able to funnel millions of dollars into campaigns with ads that distort the truth and attack government." FreeBeacon.com, noting Schumer's remarks, writes, "The Obama administration proposed new IRS restrictions on campaign related activity by tax-exempt groups last November. The rules would crack down on 'candidate-related political activity,' which includes advocacy 'for a clearly identified political candidate or candidates of a political party' and communications that are 'made within 60 days of a general election (or within 30 days of a primary election) and clearly identify a candidate or political party.' Last May, the IRS admitted to singling out Tea Party groups for increased scrutiny when they applied for tax-exempt status. The scandal forced the resignations of IRS Commissioner Steven Miller and director of Tax Exempt Organizations Lois Lerner. Schumer was one of several Democratic senators who sent a letter in 2012 calling on the IRS to investigate tax-exempt groups for allegedly engaging in political campaign activity. He was also the architect of the 2010 DISCLOSE Act, legislation targeting the Citizens United ruling that failed to pass Congress. Senate Democrats introduced a similar bill in 2012." (Obama's proposed IRS restrictions on campaign activities are most certainly unconstitutional and an abridgement of the First Amendment right to free speech. A Tea Party activist's right to free speech does not end 60 days before an election. Further, because primary elections occur throughout the campaign year, any restriction within 30 days of a primary election effectively prohibits all campaign-related activity by Tea Party groups. While Schumer and Obama go after Tea Party groups, NYTimes.com reports that the IRS is giving grief to Friends of Abe, a conservative group in Los Angeles "that bucks the prevailing political winds" of leftist Hollywood. "Friends of Abe keeps a low profile and fiercely protects its membership list, to avoid what it presumes would result in a sort of 21st-century blacklist, albeit on the other side of the partisan spectrum. Now the Internal Revenue Service is reviewing the group's activities in connection with its application for tax-exempt status. Last week, federal tax authorities presented the group with a 10-point request for detailed information about its meetings with politicians like Paul D. Ryan, Thaddeus McCotter and Herman Cain, among other matters, according to people briefed on the inquiry. ...[T]he application had been under review for roughly two years, and had

at one point included a demand—which was not met—for enhanced access to the group's security-protected website, which would have revealed member names." (Regardless of a group's ideology and purpose, it should not take two years for the IRS to grant or deny tax-exempt status. Such a delay is nothing more than harassment.) "Tax experts said that an organization's membership list is information that would not typically be required. The I.R.S. already had access to the site's basic levels, a request it considers routine for applications for 501(c)(3) nonprofit status. Friends of Abe—the name refers to Abraham Lincoln—has strongly discouraged the naming of its members. That policy even prohibits the use of cameras at group events, to avoid the unwilling identification of all but a few associates-the actors Gary Sinise, Jon Voight and Kelsey Grammer, or the writerproducer Lionel Chetwynd, for instance-who have spoken openly about their conservative political views." (Leftist Hollywood advocacy groups, such as Norman Lear's People for the American Way enjoy tax-exempt status, but Obama and the IRS seem determined to deny that privilege to conservative groups. Pamela Geller asks, "Why hasn't the IRS gone after, say, OFA (Obama's fundraising arm, Organizing For America)? \*Headslap\* because they have no political affiliation.") [53995, 53996, 54007, 54016, 54037]

CNSNews.com reports that apprehensions of illegal immigrants at the border, which had been declining each year between 2005 and 2011, increased in both 2012 and 2013. "The increase in total border apprehensions in FY 2013 and FY 2012 comes after six years of decline (see below); and it coincides with the relaxing of immigration policy by the Obama administration. ... On June 17, 2011, ... Obama's director of Immigration and Customs Enforcement, John Morton, ordered federal immigration officials to use 'prosecutorial discretion' in deciding which illegal aliens to remove from the country. Under that policy, federal agents were instructed to remove only those illegal aliens who pose a threat to public safety while releasing many others, particularly victims of domestic violence and other crimes; witnesses to crimes; or people who are charged with minor traffic violations. One year later, on June 15, 2012, ... Obama announced that despite congressional inaction on the DREAM Act, his administration would stop deporting young illegal aliens who were brought to the U.S. as children and 'are Americans in their heart.' Those young people, he said, 'will be able to request temporary relief from deportation proceedings and apply for work authorization." (Not surprisingly, the relaxing of border security and deportation rules was interpreted by foreigners as an invitation to enter the United States. The administration's repeated demand for "comprehensive immigration reform"—also known as "amnesty"—only increases the incentive to break the law and illegally cross the border.) [53966]

FoxNews.com reports, "Though many may not realize it, states are allowed to recover the cost of health care after someone's death by seizing their assets. It applies to Medicaid recipients who are between the ages of 55 and 64. The law has been in place since 1993, when Congress realized states were going broke over rising Medicaid expenses. But under ObamaCare, Medicaid eligibility has expanded dramatically along with the promise that the federal government will pick up the cost of the higher tab—at least for the first few years, after which states will be on the hook for a portion of the increase. Millions more are entering the system, perhaps without knowing that their assets could be

at risk. ...Critics see a money grab. 'I think that people are maybe in for a shock when they find out their heirs are going to be paying for their care, because they got into a system under false pretenses,' said Dr. Jane Orient of the Association of American Physicians and Surgeons, a group opposed to the Affordable Care Act. The estate recovery law is so under the radar right now that interest groups like the AARP are still studying how it will play out under ObamaCare for seniors." (Oddly, this means that a person who is *very* poor is treated more harshly than someone who is low-income but *not* as poor. For example, a poor person has to relinquish part or all of his estate to repay the government for the Medicaid benefits he received, yet a person who has a somewhat higher income and receives a taxpayer-funded subsidy for his ObamaCare coverage does not have to pay those funds back.) TheNationalRealEstatePost.com reports, "There are 19 lenders sitting on top of \$325 billion dollars of Heloc's [Home Equity Line of Credit] that are ready to reset. When they do, lenders are somewhat fearful that it may result in new defaults. Back in 2005 there were a lot of HELOC's [sic; HELOCs] that were made. Well believe it or not, many of them are still alive and kicking and are close to resetting. When they reset, [they will] either come due as a balloon payment or they will become amortized. Either way this can be a problem for many homeowners. The question is, will people be able to deal with it, or will they throw in the towel and default." [54042]

WashingtonExaminer.com reports, "According to new records obtained by the taxpayer watchdog group Judicial Watch, three separate jaunts taken by ...Obama, first lady Michelle Obama, and Vice President Joe Biden during last year's Presidents Day weekend cost at least \$295,437. And that's mostly just for security, not Air Force One or other official costs. The records were obtained from the U.S. Secret Service and details some of the 'security and/or other services' of Obama's mid-February 2013 golf trip to West Palm Beach, Fla., the annual Aspen, Colo. ski trip taken by the first lady and her daughters, and the Biden family trip, also to Aspen. According to Judicial Watch, [Obama's] trip cost the Secret Service \$98,135.79, including \$32,406.50 for the flights, \$16,466.25 for rental cars, and \$48,490 for hotel rooms. [Michelle Obama's] trip totaled \$81,523.64, including \$13,221.30 in flights, \$3,925 in rental cars, and \$64,377.34 in lodging. And the Biden ski weekend cost \$115,777.61, including \$5,315 in flights, \$92,596 in accommodations, and \$17,866.61 in rental cars." Judicial Watch president Tom Fitton says, "The Obamas and Vice President Biden are oblivious to the costs to taxpayers for their vacation travel." [53969, 54056]

According to a Fox News poll, 60 percent of voters blame former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton for what happened in Benghazi on September 11, 2012; 28 percent blame her "a great deal" and 32 percent say she deserves "some blame." The respective percentages for Obama are 59, 26, and 33. Opposition to ObamaCare jumps to 59 percent, up from 55 percent in June 2013. [53981, 53982, 53983]

CNN.com's web site briefly shows an article titled, "BREAKING: China dumps all bonds, declares South China Sea closed zone," with the text, "China has just announced, in response to what it calls US aggression, that it has placed all its US treasury bonds on the open market and simultaneously has declared the South China Sea a closed zone. This is a developing story, please check for updates." (The item turns out to be a fake story planted by a hacker.) [53985, 53986, 53987, 53988]

In The Wall Street Journal Peggy Noonan (barely) anticipates Obama's State of the Union address, writing, "[W]hen I imagine Barack Obama's State of the Union, I see a handsome, dignified man standing at the podium [sic; lectern] and behind him Joe Biden, sleeping. And next to him John Boehner, snoring. And arrayed before [Obama] the members, napping. No one's really listening to [Obama] now. He has been for five years a nonstop wind-up talk machine. Most of it has been facile, bland, the same rounded words and rounded sentiments, the same soft accusations and excuses. ... The bigger problem is that [Obama] stands up there Tuesday night with ObamaCare not a hazy promise but a fact. People now know it was badly thought, badly written and disastrously executed. It was supposed to make life better by expanding coverage. It has made it worse, by throwing people off coverage. And-as we all know now but did not last year-the program was passed only with the aid of a giant lie. Now everyone knows if you liked your plan, your doctor, your deductible, you can't keep them. When the central domestic fact of your [administration] was a fraud, people won't listen to you anymore. ...You know when we will know America is starting to come back? When some day the sergeant at arms bellows: 'Mr. Speaker, the President of the United States' and the camera shows a bubble of suits and one person emerges from the pack and walks into the chamber and you're watching at home and you find yourself-against everything you know, against all the accumulated knowledge of the past—interested. It'll take you aback when you realize you're interested in what he'll say! And the members [of Congress] won't just be enacting, they'll be leaning forward to hear. And the president will speak, and what he says will be pertinent to the problems of the United States of America. And thoughtful. And he'll offer ideas, and you'll think: 'Hey, that sounds right.' That is when you'll know America just might come back. Until then, as John Dickerson just put it: Barack Obama, Inaction Figure. Zzzzzzz." (Regrettably, the microphones in the chamber will amplify Obama's words, cheers, and applause... but not everything else. Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas said in 2010, "There's a lot that you don't hear on TVthe catcalls, the whooping and hollering and under-the-breath comments.") [53989, 54058]

Meanwhile, a Quinnipiac poll shows that most Americans don't care one whit about several of the "important issues" Obama is likely to focus on during his address. According to the poll, although the economy, jobs, and healthcare top the list of items of importance to most Americans, only one or two percent rank the minimum wage, income inequality, class inequality, gun control, immigration, budget, taxes, education, and the environment as deserving "top priority" for Obama and Congress in 2014. The practice is incredibly common, despite being improper, but almost never results in prosecution—especially in elections that are nowhere near close. A 2004 John Edwards donor was charged with a mere misdemeanor for the same crime.) Law professor Alan Dershowitz tells Newsmax.com, "This is clearly a case of selective prosecution for one of the most common things done during elections, which is to get people to raise money for you. If they went after everyone who did this, there would be no room in jails for murderers. ... This is an outrageous prosecution and is certainly a misuse of resources. It raises the question of why he is being selected for prosecution among the many, many people who commit similar crimes. This sounds to me like it is coming from higher places. It is hard for me to believe this did not come out of Washington or at least get the approval of those in Washington." The video was recorded by the Islamic Jihad Union, an al Qaeda ally based near the Afghan-Pakistani border. It serves as an umbrella group for fighters from the Caucasus, Turkey and beyond, and has been involved in plots in Uzbekistan and Germany." Meanwhile, the State Department urges members of the U.S. Olympics team to not wear "conspicuous Team USA clothing" outside the official areas of the games. (Pamela Geller observes, "This is the very slogan of the Obama administration... hide your red, white, and blue. ... The study found the prevalence of single parents to be a much larger factor in determining social mobility than income inequality—something …Obama and Democrats speak of ad nauseum. (Some claim there are plans to create a union of Sunni Muslim states to include Egypt, Syria, Iraq, Libya, and Saudi Arabia, to maintain a united front against the Shi'ite Muslim nations. Some further suggest that Obama is in on the scheme—which is why he worked to topple Libya's Moammar Gaddafi and Egypt's Hosni Mubarak. Mr Kerry, in the eyes of the true fighters, the U.S., with all its military force, is miniscule and shabby. Your military option will remain only on the table. On *Meet the Press*, Senator Rand Paul (R-KY) responds to Democrat claims that Republicans are engaged in a "war on women." Paul says, "This whole sort of war on women thing, I'm scratching my head because if there was a war on women, I think they won. You know, I don't see so much that women are downtrodden; I see women rising up and doing great things. And in fact, I worry about our young men sometimes because I think that women really are out-competing the men in our world. ...So I don't really see this, that there is some sort of war that's, you know, keeping women down. And that is predatory behavior. ...We shouldn't want to associate with people who would take advantage of a young girl in his office. This isn't having an affair. ...Someone who takes advantage of a young girl in their office? ...And then they have the gall to stand up and say Republicans are having a war on women? Also on *Meet the Press*, Senator Dick "Eddie Haskell" Durbin (D-IL) lectures, "For goodness sakes, let's judge Hillary Clinton based on her talents and her vision of America should she choose to run for president." Durbin states that Paul should not "dwell on these chapters in the past," but it is *precisely* the past that will persuade many voters to support Hillary Clinton in 2016. They will certainly not vote for her because of the recent Benghazi cover-up, but because they somehow think she can miraculously recreate the positive aspects of the late 1990s economy, when her husband was in the Oval Office. On *State of the Union* Paul says Obama's repeated statements that he will issue more executive orders to get around Congress "sounds vaguely like a threat. And I think it also has a certain amount of arrogance." [54087]

Appearing on *Fox News Sunday* to push Obama's State of the Union address, White House senior adviser Dan Pfeiffer says, "The Republican Congress is not going to rubber-stamp [Obama's] agenda, and [Obama] is not going to sign the Republican Congress' agenda." Obama will instead attempt to drive his agenda with executive orders and more rules and regulations from federal agencies. Pfeiffer says, "If Congress doesn't act, [Obama] will." Pfeiffer tries to defend Obama's economic policies by repeating a five-year-old excuse: "I think it's important to remember [that Obama] inherited the worst economic situation through the Great Depression, a financial crisis. ... We are making progress. There is more to do. That's what you hear [Obama] talk about. I think it's important to remember that what we're trying to do here is restore opportunity for all Americans. Grow the economy and create jobs." After Pfeiffer attempts to paint a rosy picture of a recovering economy, host Chris Wallace asks, "If things are so great, how come they are so lousy?" Pfeiffer responds, "I think we made tremendous progress. But there is much more work to do. [Obama] always said that," and calls for an increase in the minimum wage (which will destroy some jobs) and more "infrastructure" spending (that did not work in 2009, but added almost \$1 trillion to the national debt). Pfeiffer says Obama again demands a debt ceiling increase with no strings attached and will "not pay ransom" over the issue, [54087, 54088, 54089, 54091, 54092, 54096, 54106, 54109]

Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) also appears on the program and says, "Some of the most significant legislation passed in the last 50 years has been in conjunction with the debt ceiling. ...I think for [Obama] to ask for a 'clean' debt ceiling when we have a debt the size of our economy is irresponsible. So, we ought to discuss adding something to his request to raise the debt ceiling that does something about the debt or at least does something positive for our country. ...I think [Obama] is taking an unreasonable position to suggest that we ought to treat his request to raise the debt ceiling like some kind of motherhood resolution [to which] everybody just says 'aye' and we don't do anything when we have this stagnant economy and this massive debt created under his administration." Pfeiffer also appears on *State of the Union*, where Candy Crowley notes Obama's terrible poll numbers and asks, "With numbers like that, how can [Obama] have any more success this year than he had last year? I want to show you some of the proposals that were in [Obama's] 2013 [State of the Union] speech last year that have gone nowhere: increasing the minimum wage, expanding access to preschool, immigration reform, guncontrol legislation. None of that has happened because the year took control of the agenda." Pfeiffer replies, "You're going to hear new things, but [what] you're also going to hear from [Obama], is this is supposed to be a year of action. So, he is going to look in every way he can with his pen and his phone to try to move the ball forward." [54101]

On This Week, White House press secretary Jay Carney also promotes Obama's January 28 speech, calling 2014 an "action year" for Obama and claiming ObamaCare is a success that is "expanding access to quality and affordable health insurance to millions of Americans and reducing the growth in health care costs." ABC's Jonathan Karl asks Carney, "How can [Obama] lead when [polls show that] barely a third [of American voters] trusts his ability to make the right decisions?" Carney blames Congress: "Jon, I think what we saw last year in 2013 was a Washington that did not deliver for the American people. And [Obama] sees this as a year of action, to work with Congress where he can and to bypass Congress where necessary to lift folks who want to come up into the middle class. ...[Obama] is very disappointed that the Senate failed to heed the will of the vast majority of the American people when it came to expanding background checks [for gun purchases] On immigration reform, we're actually optimistic that 2014 will be the year that Congress delivers to [Obama's] desk a bipartisan, comprehensive immigration reform bill that meets the principles he laid out and that he can sign into law." On the issue of ObamaCare, Carney says, "I just disagree that Republicans are going to have a winning issue on this, if they decide to run on it, because they got to explain what repeal means. ...[I]t [ObamaCare] is absolutely worth it, no matter what happens politically." (Carney is essentially saying, "Obama doesn't care if ObamaCare causes Democrats to lose control of the Senate, as long as his "legacy" remains intact.) [54087, 54112]

Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) appears on *Face the Nation*, but CBS intentionally removes from the prerecorded interview Cruz's more damning criticisms of Obama. In the telecast version, host Bob Schieffer asks Cruz, "Will you run for president?" Cruz responds, "Well, look, my focus is on the challenges facing this country right now, it's on the

Senate. My focus, for example, is on the abuse of power from the [Obama administration]. Let's take something like the IRS scandal—" Schieffer interrupts, "So I'll take that as a yes or a no... or still thinking about it." Cruz: "Well, what you can take that as, is that my focus is standing and fighting right now in the senate to bring back jobs and economic growth. Economic growth is my number one priority—" The image of Cruz is then abruptly cut, and Schieffer says, "Thank you, so much, for joining us and we'll talk to you again." [54093, 54110, 53131]

Newsbusters.org posts video of what was not aired. Cruz: "Well, what you can take that as, is that my focus is standing and fighting right now in the Senate to bring back jobs and economic growth. Economic growth is my number one priority—and let me tell you something that deeply concerns me. It's the abuse of power from this administration. We've seen multiple filmmakers prosecuted and the government's gone after them. Whether it was the poor fellow that did the film that [Obama] blamed Benghazi and the terrorist attacks on-turns out that wasn't the reason for the attack but the Administration went and put that poor fellow in jail on unrelated charges. Or just this week it was broken that Dinesh D'Souza, who did a very big movie criticizing [Obama], is now being prosecuted by this Administration—" Schieffer interrupts, "Senator..." Cruz: "Bob, can you image the reaction if the Bush Administration had went, gone and prosecuted Michael Moore and Alec Baldwin and Sean Penn?" Schieffer: "Senator..." Cruz: "It should trouble everyone that this administration uses government power and the IRS in particular to target their enemies and you're talking in a new minutes to [Senator] Chuck Schumer [D-NY]-he's calling on the administration-" Schieffer: "We are going to leave this for another day, senator. Thank you for joining us and we'll talk to you again." [54093, 54110, 54131]

Schieffer *does* allow Cruz to say, "If ...Obama wants to give an honest, candid State of the Union Address this week, he'll address the fact that his economic policies are not working and that they're exacerbating income inequality. They're hurting the people that are struggling the most. ...For the State of the Union [address], one of the things ...Obama really ought to do is look in the TV camera and say to the over five million Americans all across this country who have had their health insurance cancelled because of ObamaCare—to look in the camera and say, 'I'm sorry. I told you if you like your health insurance plan you can keep it. I told you if you like your doctor you can keep your doctor. And that wasn't true. I'm sorry.' But then, Bob, here is the real kicker. If you are really sorry you just don't say you're sorry, you actually do something to fix the problem. The pattern we've seen over and over again with [Obama] is he says he's sorry—he expresses outrage—but then he doesn't fix the problem. He keeps doing it over and over again." [54099, 54110, 54131]

In France, thousands of demonstrators take to the streets, chanting, "Jew, France is not for you!" (Obama has no comment.) [54134, 54135]

On January 27 CBS analyst Mellody Hobson appears on *This Morning* and supports Obama's "income inequality" message, saying, "If you look today, the typical CEO makes 354 times more than the typical worker in his or her company, mostly this is

because there are so few women running companies. If you look back to 1980, that difference was just 42 times. So it's been that kind of income inequality that has started a lot of backlash and chatter and I think put CEOs in the hot seat." (Hobson is married to picture producer George Lucas, who the Media Research Center notes is worth \$7.3 billion—which is easily far more than 354 times what most of his employees are worth. Hobson is also 25 years younger than Lucas, and may have discovered that marrying a CEO is the easiest way to bridge that "354-times-more" gap.) Hobson-along with Obama and many others-are annoyed that CEOs make far more than the average worker at their companies, yet those same "income inequality" critics are quite selective in their targets. Obama, who once famously said in a speech, "I do think at a certain point you've made enough money," has almost certainly never said that to Oprah Winfrey, Bill Gates, Warren Buffett, George Soros, or any of the multimillionaire basketball players he admires. NBA player Kobe Bryant earns far more than the CEOs of Walmart and Wells Fargo, but Obama hasn't picked on Bryant—despite criticizing Walmart and big banks. Walter Williams explains why: "The strategy for want-to-be tyrants is to demonize people whose power they want to usurp. That's the typical way tyrants gain power. They give the masses someone to hate. ... [P]romoting jealousy, fear and hate is an effective strategy for leftist politicians and their followers to control and micromanage businesses. It's not about the amount of money top executives earn. The White House announces that one of Michelle Obama's guests at the State of the Union address will be openly gay former basketball player Jason Collins.

Michelle Obama sends a fundraising email begging for cash to "protect ObamaCare." Her message reads, "Friend — Earlier this month, because of what you did, it became illegal for insurance companies to discriminate against the up to 129 million Americans living with pre-existing conditions. Young Americans are able to stay on their parents' health care plans as they get on their feet, and we can now know that our insurance companies won't put lifetime caps on our coverage. You should be so proud of that. That happened because you organized, you talked to your friends and neighbors, and you chipped in what you could, when you could, to elect Barack and a Congress who [sic; that] supported his agenda. Today, I'm asking you to do it again. So before Barack gives his State of the Union address tomorrow, chip in \$10 or more and help protect Obamacare: https://my.democrats.org/State-of-the-Union Thank you so much, Michelle." The Fox News Channel's Ed Henry asks White House press secretary Jay Carney, "On executive action, if [Obama] wants to move quickly to create jobs why not take that pen today and approve the Keystone pipeline?" Carney replies, "Ed, as you know, as has been the practice for many years now of administrations of both parties, the reviews involved in an international pipeline like this, a pipeline that crosses an international boundary, are done or run by the State Department and that process continues at the State Department." Henry: "But [the White House] would be involved in the decision. The State Department handles it, but they've had it on their desk, for what, two years?" Carney: "Well, what

[Obama] is doing is what his predecessors did, presidents of both parties, which is allowing the State Department to oversee a process where this pipeline is evaluated and when that process is done I'm sure we'll be made aware of it. But what [Obama] believes is that it's important to maintain a process that was devised, again, and utilized by White Houses of both parties in order to assure that the right decision is made." "If I didn't kick his ass every day, he wouldn't be worth anything." "I'm not going to have some reporters pawing through our papers. We are the president." "I knew nothing about my brother's involvement in these pardons... I had no knowledge whatsoever." "That'll teach them to fuck with us." "I just don't have any memory of that." "We are going to take things away from you on behalf of the common good." (In the interest of civility, The Obama Timeline has omitted some of Clinton's anti-Jew rants.) [54119, 54216]

U.S. authorities said many had directly participated in attacks that wounded or killed scores of U.S. military personnel and Afghan citizens, yet were freed by the Afghan Review Board. 'The ARB is releasing back to society dangerous insurgents who have Afghan blood on their hands,' the United States Forces-Afghanistan said in a statement. 'This extra-judicial release of detainees is a major step backward in further developing the rule of law in Afghanistan.' Many of those freed were Taliban fighters who were connected by forensic evidence to specific IED attacks. Several were captured in possession of bomb materials and some even admitted taking part in attacks on coalition forces. At least two had been captured, freed and recaptured. 'These guys have all been caught, clearly engaged in activities designed to kill people,' said retired U.S.

Army Lt. Col Tony Shaffer, a senior fellow at the Washington-based Center for Advanced Defense Studies. 'There is zero justification for releasing them.'" [54129]

The White House threatens an Obama veto of proposed legislation that would permanently ban federal funding of abortions. [54176]

Addressing the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce in San Antonio, Texas, Congressman Paul Ryan (R-WI) says, "The challenge with all of this [immigration reform process] is we have a hard time trusting [Obama] in enforcing the laws. Look what he's doing on health care and all these extra-legal things he's doing with executive orders and executive actions that we don't believe he has the authority to do. ... (The implication is that if Congress does pass "comprehensive immigration reform" legislation, Republicans will include language and rules that makes it difficult for Obama to go around the new law or selectively enforce it.) Senators Orrin Hatch (R-UT), Tom Coburn (R-OK), and Richard Burr (R-NC) announce an alternative to ObamaCare called the "Patient Choice, Affordability, Responsibility and Empowerment Act." According to FoxNews.com, it would repeal the Affordable Care Act "while instituting new reforms the senators say would give states and individuals more flexibility and purchasing power. ... Under the plan, insurances companies would not be able to impose lifetime limits on patients and would be required to allow dependent coverage up to the age of 26, as ObamaCare currently does. The Republican proposal would address the issue of pre-existing conditions by creating a new 'continuous coverage' standard that would prevent any individual moving from one insurance plan to another from being denied on the basis of a pre-existing condition so long as that individual was continuously enrolled in a health plan. The requirements on individuals to buy insurance, and on mid-sized and large businesses to provide it, would be repealed. ... Their proposal calls for the targeted use of tax credits to help individuals buy health care. Employees who work for a small business with 100 or fewer employees would be able to receive a credit while those whose annual income is 300 percent of the federal poverty level could receive an age-adjusted refundable tax credit to buy health coverage. Small businesses would also be allowed to band together and purchase insurance, even across state lines. To help offset the costs of the plan, the senators would maintain ObamaCare's cuts to Medicare and also eliminate the unlimited tax exclusion of employer-provided health coverage, instead capping the employer's tax exclusion at 65 percent of an average plan's cost." Burr states, "The American people have found out what is in ObamaCare-broken promises in the form of increased health care costs, costly mandates and government bureaucracy. We can lower costs and expand access to quality coverage and care by empowering individuals and their families to make their own health care decisions, rather than empowering the government to make those decisions for them." On *The Five*, Greg Gutfeld offers a way to get through Obama's State of the Union address: "Every time he says, 'Folks,' drink. Every time he says, 'Fair share,' drink.

Every time he says, 'Extraordinary,' drink. Every time he brags about working tirelessly, drink. ...The only shovel-ready job Obama has created is White House speechwriter. ...These speeches are rhetorical Ambien." [54138]

On On the Record, columnist Charles Krauthammer makes light of Obama's "I've got a pen and a phone" threat: "That's how they do it in Venezuela, Cuba, and other places, the [dictator] waves a pen, he shows it on Twitter, and says, 'I will rule from the pen.' What makes it sort of pathetic, is that it sounds like a tough threat and it is unconstitutional... but in the end, there's very little he can do. What's interesting is that he said the same thing in 2011. This was a speech he gave in Nevada. It was announced by the White House as the 'We Can't Wait' tour. And it was one statement after another: 'I'm not gonna wait for Congress to act, I will do X, Y and Z.' In the end it didn't work, because in the end, the only things [Obama] can do with a pen and executive orders are fairly limited. With one exception: that's EPA and using the EPA to shut down entire industries. That's power. ... And the reason he gave up is because he failed. He was unable to do what he thought he would do, and he couldn't even do what other presidents have done... He can't even do what normal presidents have done, what a Clinton did, what a Reagan did—which is to work with the other side. ... You get the impression he chose the wrong field. ... He doesn't like what the presidency requires, which is... some understanding and some respect for the other side..." [54141, 54207]

On *Crossfire*, Senator John Hoeven (R-ND) says that Obama needs to deal with Congress if he wants something done, rather than talk about pens and phones: "That's why you get involved and you figure out how to compromise. But he's got to understand that you don't come and dictate an agenda. You offer compromise... and you can't say, 'Oh, it's tough, so I'm going to go off by myself.'" [54164]

On January 28 the White House announces that Obama will issue an executive order (EO) boosting to \$10.10 per hour the minimum wage for employees who work for federal contractors. HotAir.com observes, "The large increase will mean higher costs for taxpayers in a couple of ways. The way the White House crafted the EO (or at least their statement), federal contractors will have to pay \$10.10 as the minimum wage for all workers if they agree to any new contracts for the federal government. That means that their labor costs will escalate rather dramatically, especially since that new minimum will have to get scaled into workers earning above the current minimum. Raising the floor in a workplace means raising a few levels above it, too. Increased labor costs will force companies to bid higher rates on federal contracts. We will be paying more for the same services and products we currently buy as taxpayers—a lot more. ... Can Obama do this? On new contracts, sure. But it's going to end up being a disaster, the way most of his unilateral moves have been. Taxpayers will pay a high price for Obama's mostlyimpotent muscle-flexing." Congressman Jason Chaffetz (R-UT) says Obama "just unilaterally, without Congress, which I think is fundamentally wrong—has just made government that much more expensive. We all have to pay for it. And yet, he hasn't made the case on the justification of this; he hasn't made the case on why we should go out and spend all this. I have no idea what the total cost is going to be to the federal government, nor where he's going to get the dollars." (Obama's action would be

unconstitutional, based on the Supreme Court's ruling in *Youngstown Sheet and Tube Co. v. Sawyer* [1952]. The Court wrote, 'the President's power, if any, to issue the [executive] order must stem either from an act of Congress or from the Constitution itself.") Mark Steyn comments on the upcoming State of the Union address: "[Obama] gives a performance, extremely animatedly, head swiveling from left-side prompter to right-side prompter, continually urging action now: 'Let's start right away. We can get this done... We can fix this... Now is the time to do it. Now is the time to get it done.' And at the end of the speech, nothing gets done, and nothing gets fixed, and, after a few days' shadowboxing between admirers and detractors willing to pretend it's some sort of serious legislative agenda, every single word of it is forgotten until the next one. In that sense, like Beyonce lip-synching the National Anthem at the inauguration, the State of the Union embodies the decay of America's political institutions into a simulacrum of responsible government rather than the real thing, and a simulacrum ever more divorced from the real issues facing the country. If all that sounds familiar, it's because I wrote it this time last year. I could file my SOTU column a month early and go to the Bahamas, as all self-respecting commentators should do. I do not expect this year to depart from the script." [54144]

In another sign of a weak economy, the Census Bureau reports, "New orders for manufactured durable goods in December decreased \$10.3 billion or 4.3 percent to \$229.3 billion. ...Excluding transportation, new orders decreased 1.6 percent. Excluding defense, new orders decreased 3.7 percent. Transportation equipment, also down two of the last three months, led the decrease, \$7.7 billion or 9.5 percent to \$73.1 billion. This was led by nondefense aircraft and parts, which decreased \$3.8 billion." [54145, 54146]

On *Morning Joe*, former White House press secretary Robert Gibbs says, "Thank God" he is no longer in that job. Asked what happened to Obama's 2008 promise to change how Washington works, Gibbs responds, "Well, I think, uh, you know, the, the, the ability to change Washington, uh, I think, is something, that, uh, that long ago, uh, the White House sort of stopped trying to do and whether or not that's a good thing, we'll will look back on history..." (At HotAir.com Ed Morrissey writes, "Obama never actually bothered to change Washington, except perhaps to think that it would change *for* him by the sheer dint of his personality. ...Obama got elected in 2008 on the promise that he would rise above partisanship and heal a broken political process. Instead, he's so disinterested in working across the aisle that he'd rather mope at not controlling Congress and fall back to using EOs [executive orders]. Gibbs senses the irony and hypocrisy of this, and offers the 'let history judge' dodge, when the utter failure to engage in the White House is apparent right now.") [54148]

Obama advisor Valerie Jarrett also appears on *Morning Joe*, and says, "People around our country are hungry for action, and what you'll hear from [Obama] tonight is going to be all about action, creating opportunity, and it's going to be a very optimistic speech." Obama will "set forth very specific, concrete proposals that he thinks will move our country forward [and] create opportunity for hard-working Americans who want to succeed. ...We're going to do what we can, within [Obama's] own executive power, and working throughout the country with those who want to move our country forward. And it is a lot of potential there. And I think the optimism that [Obama] has comes from the grit and determination of the American people, our businesses, many of who [sic] are bringing jobs back to America, so we have some momentum going, and we just need to call on everybody to work together, and that's what [Obama] will do this evening." (Whether the American people are "hungry" for more executive orders from Obama remains to be seen.) [54165, 54205]

On NBC's *Today*, Savannah Guthrie asks Obama's chief of staff Denis McDonough, "I looked at last year's State of the Union [address]. He [Obama] called for a hike in the minimum wage, for immigration reform, for gun laws to be revamped. By the way, he also said the government shouldn't shut down. None of that happened. So when he calls for those things tonight, how can the American people believe that they really will come to pass?" On CBS' *This Morning*, Norah O'Donnell asks McDonough the same thing: "I went back and looked at [Obama's] State of the Union address from 2013; then he called for an increase in the minimum wage, nothing. Last year, he called for immigration reform, nothing. Last year, he called for new gun control measures, nothing. Is tonight's address more of a wish list than a to-do list?" [54293]

Senator Tom Coburn (R-OK), who is being treated for prostate cancer and has had colon cancer, states that his oncologist is not in the insurance network he was forced into because of ObamaCare. (*The New York Times'* Keynesian propagandist, Paul Krugman, essentially calls Coburn a liar, telling CNN, "It's a totally misleading story, by the way. ...It's, you know—nobody has ever found that their private insurer has told them the doctor they were using is no longer in the network. ...It's a garbage story. It really is." Krugman's claim is, of course, absurd, and there is no possibility that he cannot know he is lying.) [54169, 54170, 54239, 54338]

Iranian Army Chief of Staff Hassan Firouzabadi says, "The military option that is today on the table in the U.S. has become a joke among the nations. On MSNBC, House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) repeats the "year of action" mantra in pushing Obama's State of the Union address, and tells interviewer Chuck Todd, "[U]nder ...Obama's administration, we have eight million jobs created... We have an opportunity gap that [Obama] will be addressing, but let's remember where we were and how far we have come from the Bush economic policies to where we are now. ...The point is, what is happening here now, and let's, since you're trying to analyze it, is we have a large segment of the Republican party that is anti-government. We don't want any more government than we need, but they're anti-government, anti-science, and anti-Obama. They have a trifecta that is going. Now, I say to the Republicans... take back your party. ...But to obstruct every initiative that [Obama] has put forth on jobs and say,

'Why don't we have more jobs?' Well, we do have more jobs, but no thanks to the Congress of the United States." Todd does not laugh when Pelosi says, "...We did not treat President Bush this way. ...This obstruction to [sic; of] ...Obama is something quite stunning, and something quite different." Also on MSNBC, Andrea Mitchell absurdly states that before President George W. Bush said in his 2002 State of the Union address that Iran was part of the "axis of evil" in the world, "Iran was cooperating with the United States on the border of Afghanistan. Post-9/11 Iran was more or less an American ally but being included in the Axis of Evil, it turned the Iranian government in a completely different direction and it was a turning point in American politics and foreign policy." *The Washington Post's* just-as-delusional Chris Cillizza says, "I would agree with you." (PatDollard.com astutely observes, "This is beyond offensive. And she's doing it not so much to make Bush look bad, but to make Iran look warm and fuzzy so Obama doesn't look like an idiot, psycho or traitor by giving our top enemy a nuclear energy/weapons program.") According to a Rasmussen poll, "Just 28% of voters think State of the Union speeches are important for setting the nation's agenda for the next year. CNSNews.com reports, "'Mental disorder' is the leading 'diagnostic group' for disabled people receiving federal disability insurance benefits, with 35.5 percent of all disabled beneficiaries having such a disorder, according to the latest Annual Statistical Report on the Social Security Disability Insurance Program. The report provides a statistical profile of the 10,088,739 disabled beneficiaries who were receiving federal disability benefits as of December 2012. ... Within the 'mental disorders diagnostic group,' the most common specific diagnosis for disabled beneficiaries was a 'mood disorder.' According to the report, as of December 2012, 14.1 percent of all disabled beneficiaries in the United States had such a disorder." According to the Social Security Administration, "Individuals are considered to be disabled only if their physical or mental impairment(s) are of such severity that they are not only unable to do their previous work but cannot because of their age, education, or work experience-engage in any other kind of substantial gainful activity (SGA) that exists in the national economy." (U.S. taxpayers are expected to believe that 3.5 million individuals are receiving disability benefits because of a mental disability. How many of those "disabilities" are nothing more than "depression because I can't find a job" is not known.) [54228]

BusinessInsider.com reports, "At this point, it looks extremely unlikely that long-term emergency unemployment benefits will be extended. This has caused a huge debate about whether this is wise, and what will happen to the long-term unemployed and the unemployment rate. North Carolina has been without long-term unemployment benefits since last Summer, and so they might offer a glimpse of what happens when the unemployment insurance is not extended. The answer? A gigantic drop in the unemployment rate." (Historically, recessions have tended to end when unemployment benefits ran out. The reason is that the unemployed are less particular about the jobs they are willing to accept when they face the reality of their benefits ending.) [54240, 54323]

Nineteen Senate Democrats sign a "friend of the court" brief in support of the Obama administration and in opposition to Hobby Lobby's lawsuit against ObamaCare's forced abortifacient, contraceptive, and sterilization requirement. [54152, 54153]

Asked by radio talk show host Hug Hewitt to summarize what Hilary Clinton accomplished as Secretary of State, longtime Clinton confidante and advisor Lanny Davis responds, "Well the biggest thing of all is goodwill around the world, which is what Secretaries of State do. [She's] the most popular woman in the world." Hewitt: "All right Lanny, we're out of time. But your 'achievement' is one that's been swept away by [Obama]." [54236]

The Shoebat Foundation's Walid Shoebat posts a photograph of Obama's half-brother Malik Obama "wearing a Hamas scarf (keffiyeh) that bears a well-known Palestinian slogan—'Jerusalem is ours—WE ARE COMING!' It also includes a map of Palestine that says, 'From the River to the Sea!' In other words, Malik is saying, THERE IS NO ISRAEL." Malik Obama has attended events of the terrorist group Hamas, and "Malik reads and speaks fluent Arabic as do many in his family, like cousin Musa Ismail Obama and uncle Sayyid, who've been to at least one prominent Wahhabist university in Saudi Arabia. Barack recited the opening lines of the Arabic call to prayer with a 'first-rate accent' according to the New York Times' Nicholas Kristof. ... Those who see this as a matter of guilt by association run into some major problems. ... Barack Obama and Malik are much closer than is being admitted publicly." (Malik Obama was best man at Barack Obama's wedding, and Barack Obama served as best man at one of Malik's weddings.) "Another Obama brother—Mark Ndesanjo Obama—accused [Barack Obama] of lying about their relationship as well, after Barack said the two had only met one time, presumably during [Barack Obama's] visit to China in late 2009. Ndesanjo insists they met several times, dating back to the 1980s..." Shoebat, who posts a photo of Mark Obama with his half-brother at the White House that was taken before the China visit, notes, "The point here is that Barack cannot be trusted to issue a full disclosure when it comes to the relationships he has with his family members. Once again, this leads us to his relationship with Malik. How is it that Malik received 501(c)(3) status for his Barack H. Obama Foundation in less than 30 days and had it illegally backdated 38 months by [IRS official] Lois Lerner? If Barack had anything to do with it, history says he might be lying if he denies it. Senator Charles Schumer (D-NY) tells *The Wall Street Journal* that Obama will not put forth "a grandiose agenda" in his speech. "It's going to be a very practical agenda aimed at middle-class people." [54183]

At NationalReview.com Kevin D. Williamson writes, "The annual State of the Union pageant is a hideous, dispiriting, ugly, monotonous, un-American, un-republican, antidemocratic, dreary, backward, monarchical, retch-inducing, depressing, shameful, cryptoimperial display of official self-aggrandizement and piteous toadying, a black Mass during which every unholy order of teacup totalitarian and cringing courtier gathers under the towering dome of a faux-Roman temple to listen to a speech with no content given by a man with no content, to rise and to be seated as is called for by the order of worship it is a wonder they have not started genuflecting-with one wretched representative of their number squirreled away in some well-upholstered Washington hidey-hole in order to preserve the illusion that those gathered constitute a special class of humanity without whom we could not live. It's the most nauseating display in American public life-and I write that as someone who has just returned from a pornographers' convention. It's worse than the Oscars. ...But they will listen, rapt, and the media mandarins afterward will evaluate each promise with great sobriety, ignoring entirely that the central promise made during the same charlatan's first State of the Union address was subsequently labeled 'Lie of the Year' by the great man's own frustrated admirers. That an entire class of people should be so enthusiastic about being lied to, serially, is perplexing. ... On ABC, *Good Morning America* host George Stephanopoulos complains, "[O]ne of the real puzzles [Obama] has to solve tonight, the economy, doing about as well as it's ever

done in his [five years], as he comes into the chamber tonight, but most people don't believe it and don't give him credit for it." On NBC, David Gregory repeats the complaint, saying, "Look, the economy's getting better. That's what [Obama] had to do, he had to make the economy better. And, yet he's not getting a lot of credit for it." On CBS, Bob Schieffer proves that he received the same White House talking points, stating, "I thought *The New York Times* had a good headline today on one of their things, it said the economy has rarely been better, but the approval ratings have rarely been worse. People seem to favor many of the programs that [Obama] wants to pass, but they are worried and concerned about whether he can actually... actually get it [sic] done." (The Media Research Center notes, "The latest NBC News/Wall Street Journal poll showed 60% of Americans believe the nation is heading in the wrong direction, 68% think the country is in the same place or worse than when Obama took office, and 70% are dissatisfied with the economy.") While waiting for Obama's speech to begin, Congressman Randy Weber (R-TX) tweets, "On floor of house waitin on 'Kommandant-In-Chef'...the Socialistic dictator who's been feeding US a line or is it 'A-Lying?" [54281]

On MSNBC, Obama toady Chris Matthews expresses outrage that any Republicans would dare criticize Obama before he even delivered his address: "The very idea that they would do this, in what is a historic occasion, just tells you that there are no rules. ...[This] right wing, sort of, revolutionary thinking... We're throwing stones at the window of the American republic. [But] That's fine, because somehow, we're so angry that anything goes." (Whether Matthews believes there was no criticism of George W. Bush, George H.W. Bush, or Ronald Reagan before or after their State of the Union addresses is a question best left to his psychiatrist.) [54291]

Obama delivers an underwhelming and plodding State of the Union address, facing lame duck status a full year earlier than most of his predecessors. (Only five of the nation's nine Supreme Court Justices attend; missing are Antonin Scalia, Clarence Thomas, Samuel Alito, and Sonya Sotomayor.) The speech is largely a boring rehash of the prior year's speech and is largely devoid of new ideas. (It also includes at least one cringeworthy line from a sophomoric speechwriter: "A man took the bus home from the graveyard shift, bone tired...") Obama proposes a "MyRA" ("my IRA") to help people save for retirement with government bonds—which is nothing more than a U.S. Savings Bond sales scheme and sounds suspiciously like a way to get Americans to finance the federal debt that China is no longer covering. Obama notes the agreement with Iran with a lie: "Iran has begun to eliminate its stockpile of higher levels of enriched uranium." (Iran has not. Its enriched uranium is simply temporarily being turned into uranium oxide, which can readily be turned back into its former state. Iran is destroying nothing.) Obama says, "Unprecedented inspections help the world verify, every day, that Iran is not building a bomb. And with our allies and partners, we're engaged in negotiations to see if we can peacefully achieve a goal we all share: preventing Iran from obtaining a nuclear weapon." According to LATimes.com, "The interim nuclear deal between Iran and world powers will allow Tehran to continue far more research and development on centrifuges to enrich uranium than has been publicly recognized..." A report by the nonpartisan

Institute for Science and International Security states that the agreement is "not expected to seriously affect Iran's centrifuge research and development program." In other words, Iran is developing nuclear weapons.) He states, "If John F. Kennedy and Ronald Reagan could negotiate with the Soviet Union, then surely a strong and confident America can negotiate with less powerful adversaries today." (Obama ignores two important facts: He is neither Kennedy nor Reagan, and the Soviet Union already *had* a huge stockpile of nuclear weapons.) On the subject of energy, Obama says, "Now, one of the biggest factors in bringing more jobs back is our commitment to American energy. The all-of-the-above energy strategy I announced a few years ago is working, and today, America is closer to energy independence than we've been in decades." (Obama's "strategy" is not working. The nation's energy output has increased in spite of Obama's policies, not because of them.) "One of the reasons why is natural gas—if extracted safely, it's the bridge fuel that can power our economy with less of the carbon pollution that causes climate change. Businesses plan to invest almost \$100 billion in new factories that use natural gas." (Obama does not dare credit the "shale revolution" or fracturing process that have led to the increased production of oil and gas-because he had nothing to do with either, and because his environmentalist supporters have resisted both.) "I'll cut red tape to help states get those factories built, and this Congress can help by putting people to work building fueling stations that shift more cars and trucks from foreign oil to American natural gas." (Ignoring the fact that Obama has never demonstrated either the willingness or the ability ro "cut red tape," he has apparently lurched from electric vehicles to vehicles powered by natural gas. American investors should be happy they did not invest billions of dollars on the electric charging stations that Obama previously wanted.) "My administration will keep working with the industry to sustain production and job growth while strengthening protection of our air, our water, and our communities. And while we're at it, I'll use my authority to protect more of our pristine federal lands for future generations." Obama declares that the global warning issue "is settled" and is "fact." (It is not, but he sneakily uses the term "climate change," knowing no one can dispute that the climate changes. It has, of course, done so since the earth was created and will continue to change—regardless of the number of SUVs on American roads.) He calls for the elimination of business tax loopholes in exchange for a reduction in the corporate tax rate—for companies that move jobs from overseas to the United States. (The result would be a net tax *increase* for companies that have no overseas employees, of course. That is hardly a recipe for economic growth.) Obama, who does not mention Benghazi or North Korea even once in his speech, notes that he will bring home all the troops from Afghanistan—and then says he will leave some there for two "narrow missions," "training and assisting Afghan forces, and counterterrorism operations to pursue any remnants of al-Qaida." (Plans probably call for about 10,000 Americans to remain in

Afghanistan, but Obama has a convenient "out." Afghan President Hamid Karzai does not support the agreement to leave U.S. troops in his country. Obama could use that as an excuse to withdraw all troops, or he could simply wait to negotiate an agreement with Karzai's successor in the upcoming election.) The speech is largely devoid of "red meat"—beyond Obama saying that if Congress doesn't give him what he wants he will sign executive orders to get around obstinate Republicans on issues like gun control-and many leftists may be disappointed. According to a 2007 study, women make, on average, about 91 cents for every dollar a man earns. Even that figure is misleading, as it represents nothing more than the average male wage versus the average female wagenot taking into account what people do for a living. That a female kindergarten teacher earns less than the male CEO of IBM does not mean she was the subject of discrimination any more than Oprah Winfrey earning more than a male truck driver is "proof" of gender discrimination. Sometimes we stumble; we make mistakes; we get frustrated or discouraged. But for more than two hundred years, we have put those things aside and placed our collective shoulder to the wheel of progress—to create and build and expand the possibilities of individual achievement; to free other nations from tyranny and fear; to promote justice, and fairness, and equality under the law, so that the words set to paper by our founders are made real for every citizen. The America we want for our kids-a rising America where honest work is plentiful and communities are strong; where prosperity is widely shared and opportunity for all lets us go as far as our dreams and toil will take us-none of it is easy. But if we work together; if we summon what is best in us, with our feet planted firmly in today but our eyes cast towards tomorrow—I know it's within our reach. Believe it. God bless you, and God bless the United States of America." (At Morning Jolt, Jim Geraghty later comments, "As a political lesson, 'nothing ever comes easy...' well, no shinola, Sherlock. Welcome to the [White House]. Welcome to life. If you expected any of this stuff to be easy, you were woefully unprepared for the office. If you're a supporter of Obama and surprised at how hard everything seems, it's probably because you elevated him to the status of Munificent Sun-God in 2007 and 2008 and figured he would step down into the [Oval Office] from his celestial golden throne and calm the waters and lower the oceans with the power of his words. When Remsburg says it in his context, it's inspiring; when it's applied to [Obama]... it's trite and obvious.") Obama's speech most definitely does not live up to its billing. After two days of White House and media promises that Obama would be announcing a "year of action," the address includes no major ideas. In fact, it arguably includes only a few small ideas—some of them carryovers from 2013.

Although Obama makes "pen and phone" threats about acting without the consent of Congress on issues like gun control, it is worth noting that George Washington said in his first State of the Union address, "A free people ought not only to be armed but disciplined; to which end a Uniform and well digested plan is requisite: And their safety and interest require that they should promote such manufactories, as tend to render them independent on others, for essential, particularly for military supplies." Congressman Steve Stockman (R-TX) walks out of the House chamber before Obama even got warmed up—but after he said he would get around Congress through executive orders. Stockman states, "I could not bear to watch as he continued to cross the clearlydefined boundaries of the Constitutional separation of powers. Needless to say, I am deeply disappointed in the tone and content of tonight's address," with Obama pledging to "break his oath of office and begin enacting his own brand of law through executive decree. This is a wholesale violation of his oath of office and a disqualifying [that is, impeachable] offense." Congressman Raul Labrador (R-ID) states, "Unfortunately, what I heard from …Obama tonight was hostility toward our foundational principles, condescension toward a co-equal branch of government, and a general aversion to common sense and bipartisanship." Congressman Gregg Harper (R-MS) states, "[Obama's] attempt to intimidate Congress by abusing executive power demonstrates a serious unwillingness to work with the coequal legislative branch of government." At WashingtonTimes.com Ben Wolfgang writes, "[O]ne of the most notable parts of Tuesday night's address was Mr. Obama's plan to raise the minimum wage for federal contracts to \$10.10 from \$7.25, a substantial change but one that only underscores how this administration has been unable to muscle through Congress a broader minimum wage increase. 'Over the past five years, his number of requests have increased, but the requests have gotten smaller. Additionally, of course, although a Republican Congressman invited Robertson, he certainly did not order the media to focus cameras on the duck hunter. Todd is therefore making a fuss about a fuss his own network created. Television viewers would not even know Robertson was in attendance were it not for the media. in contrast, during 2013's address

Obama specifically mentioned Giffords' name to call attention to gun control legislation.) [54289, 54290]

ABC's Jim Avila gushes, "This was ...Obama, the go-it-alone Terminator, mindful he has only three years left. This was a stare down, chest pumping [Obama], angry and resentful about a Congress determined to log jam his ideas." [54361]

Columnist Charles Krauthammer comments, "Well, there wasn't a lot in the speech—of course, he's playing a very weak hand. I was impressed by the fact that he delivered it with conviction because, again, there wasn't a lot in it. I would call it the 'chestnut speech,' where there's [sic] so many old chestnuts that were shown it was almost embarrassing. You know, he brought out stuff he tried last year and that went nowhere... So when he repeated Guantanamo, which is a cause he gave up on himself, years ago, you knew that he'd sort of run out of ideas. What I was surprised he didn't do, was to do sort of an overall arching theme... I think the most important element of the speech, with regard to foreign affairs, was his insistence on the Iran negotiations in saying he would veto a sanctions bill, and... that [resulted in] the most tepid applause of the evening." A respectable Republican response to Obama's address is delivered by Congresswoman Cathy McMorris Rodgers (R-WA). MSNBC's Alex Wagner tweets, "Living room. Lady on a settee. Where's the needlepoint?" Leftist, feminist "comedian" Laura Levites tweets, "I want to rip out the uterus of that pro life Cunt Cathy McMorris Rodgers and eat it, so I can see the surprised look on her frigid face." She follows with another tweet: "I'm pretty sure I'm going to lose a lot of followers tonight. If you don't get it, it's ok I'll pray for you." (If a conservative made comments like that about a Democrat woman politician, the leftist media would be justifiably outraged. What annoys leftists most about McMorris Rodgers is perhaps that, like Sarah Palin, she has a Down Syndrome child she chose not to abort; six-year-old Cole now reads above grade level.) Senator Mike Lee (R-UT) delivers a Tea Party response to Obama's speech. He says, "In the few minutes I have tonight—I'd like to speak especially to those Americans who may feel they have been forgotten by both political parties. Those individuals and families who work hard, play by the rules, balance their budgets, honor the Golden Rule ...and don't understand why their government in Washington can't do the same. ...To be fair, ...Obama and his party did not create all of these problems. The Republican Establishment in Washington can be just as out-of-touch as the Democratic Establishment. ...I believe we need to do what Americans have always done—come together and press for positive change. Protesting against dysfunctional government is a great American tradition, going back to the *original* tea party in Boston, about 240 years ago. Americans have a natural instinct to stand up and speak out when they know something is wrong. ...[The] inequality crisis presents itself in three principal forms: immobility among the poor, who are being trapped in poverty by big-government programs; insecurity in the middle class, where families are struggling just to get by and can't seem to get ahead; and cronyist privilege at the top, where political and economic

insiders twist the immense power of the federal government to profit at the expense of everyone else. ...Inequality—*real inequality*—is trapping poor children in failing schools to benefit bureaucrats and union bosses." Lee calls ObamaCare an "inequality Godzilla." [54196, 54221]

Libertarian-like Senator Rand Paul (R-KY) also delivers a less-government-is-better response to Obama's address. [54200]

In an interview with MSNBC, Congressman Tim Huelskamp (R-KS) calls leftist host Rachel Maddow a "cheerleader for the [Obama] administration." When she objects, Huelskamp continues, "You're not being a journalist when you're not willing to look at the facts [about Benghazi]. If it was Bush you would be jumping and screaming—" Maddow: "You're amazing." Huelskamp: "—but because it's Hillary Clinton, you don't want the answers, Rachel. Face the facts! We don't know the answers there." Maddow then disagrees with Huelskamp's charge that Obama using executive orders to bypass Congress constitutes "lawlessness." [54275, 54282]

Congresswoman Michele Bachmann (R-MN) tells reporters Obama is "not a king. He may think he's a king, he may declare himself king, but that's not what he is under our Constitution. ...He said it over and over and over again and throughout the speech. In fact, I think there's a line that I wrote down that he said: 'Let's make this a year of action,' and then he declared himself King Obama shortly thereafter. So he said, 'Do it, but if you don't do it—if you don't do what I say—I'm going to do it anyway.' ...So, the American people know that the legacy of [Obama] will be the establishment of lawlessness in the United States. He really doesn't see himself restricted in any way by Article 2 under the Constitution—that's his limitations in powers. He refuses to faithfully execute the laws as they are written, and he decides to write the laws the way he wants them written. So he's ...complete[ly] lawless..." [54280, 54298]

Comedian Jay Leno says, "Obama gave his State of the Union address, or as Fox News called it, *Lame Duck Dynasty*... I understand the speech tonight was kind of a mixed message. The bad news is, these days a lot of Americans are getting screwed; but the good news is [that] while you're getting screwed ObamaCare will pay for the birth control. ...This was a very important speech for [Obama] tonight, and he gave it at a time when he's losing support from his own party. In fact, Congressional Democrats were warned tonight [that] if they didn't applaud [Obama's] speech, he would go out and campaign for them." [54314]

On January 29, the day after Obama calls for quick Congressional approval of "fast track" foreign trade legislation, Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) announces it will go nowhere. Television ratings for Obama's speech show a definite lack of enthusiasm. On NBC, more people watched *The Biggest Loser* (6.6 million viewers) than the State of the Union address (5.99 million) an hour later. On CBS, an *NCIS* rerun drew 11.4 million viewers, while Obama drew 7.8 million. On ABC, only 4.8 million watched the speech, and 2.5 million watched it in Fox. At Morning Jolt, NationalReview.com's Jim Geraghty writes, "The... speech was interminable, meandering, shifting in tone, unfocused, and at least twice as long as it needed to be. In a development that surprises no one, his fans liked it, his critics largely hated it, and millions upon millions of Americans wondered what happened to their favorite shows that usually air at 9 p.m. Eastern. ...We're stuck with this guy until January 2017. We don't know exactly what the future holds, but the outlook on the horizon isn't good. The economy sputtering along, unemployment still high by historical standards, low workforce participation rate, a complicated mess in health care, annual deficits that are merely ludicrously high instead of incredibly ludicrously high, chaos overseas, hoping our numb-skull big campaign-donor ambassadors manage to avoid exacerbating a crisis."

At Townhall.com Katie Pavlich notes that Obama invited six illegal immigrants to attend his State of the Union address, but remains "more serious about emboldening illegal immigrants than helping law enforcement agents dealing with the problem. According to Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agent and President of the National ICE Council Chris Crane, ... Obama is still refusing to meet with them to discuss the issue." Crane says that Obama "will provide those illegally in the U.S. with the seat of honor at one of the most important events of the year, but ICE officers who serve under him are unwelcome in the White House. This is symptomatic of [Obama's] continued demonstration of contempt for immigration officers and his blatant disregard for Congressionally-enacted law. ICE officers are forced every day to release violent offenders back into the streets; we are prohibited from enforcing immigration violations and document fraud and from cracking down on illegal employment; we are prohibited from enforcing public charge law to protect taxpayers; and we are forced to catch-andrelease illegal aliens who are not 'priorities' even when officers believe there is a threat to public safety. ... We are pleading with House Republicans to stand up to the Obama Administration's abuses and to support ICE officers. I am therefore alarmed to read that House Republicans are working with prominent amnesty proponents instead of reaching out and working with ICE officers. Any immigration principles crafted by House Republicans should be crafted in consultation with the ICE personnel who know firsthand what is wrong with our immigration system and how to fix it." Meanwhile, TheHill.com reports that Senator Marco Rubio (R-FL) "said he is open to an immigration reform bill that does not include a path to citizenship for the nation's estimated 11 million illegal immigrants. Rubio, an architect of a Senate bill that provided a pathway to citizenship, was commenting on expected House GOP principles for immigration reform. The House GOP is expected to provide a pathway for legal status,

but not citizenship. Rubio said he is waiting to see the details of the House framework, but is willing to discuss the idea. ...Rubio said that the 'fundamental' problem to passing immigration reform right now is skepticism on the right that the administration would enforce beefed up border security measures. ... 'I don't know if it can happen under this administration given its lack of willingness to enforce the law. It's a real impediment,' he said. 'I think that is the fundamental challenge right now ...how do we gain people's confidence that the enforcement will happen." HotAir.com asks, "When did it dawn on him, precisely, that [Obama] can't be trusted to be a hard-ass on the border even if Congress has authorized him to be one? I'll up the ante by asking another question: When did Obama's lawlessness become an 'impediment' to passing immigration reform, as Rubio says here, rather than the whole reason for passing the bill in the first place? ... If you can't trust O to carry out the law then logically it doesn't much matter what Congress does. O's going to do what he wants to do. In fact, if you're worried about a backlash among conservatives against the GOP leadership if they pass a legalization bill, you're arguably better off letting Obama do that himself via EO so that he takes all the political heat. The GOP can focus on border security instead and then, if Obama refuses to enforce the bill they pass, they can run on that in the midterms. It'd be superb motivation to get grassroots righties to turn out to beat the Democrats." (The Obama Timeline asks why anything has to be done other than to better patrol the border and enforce existing immigration laws. It is *not* a false choice of granting citizenship or deporting 10–20 million illegal immigrants. They can simply be left "in the shadows"—which they entered of their own free will.) [54303, 54304]

At Time.com, *Reason* magazine's Nick Gillespie writes, "The most emotionally powerful moment in Barack Obama's State of the Union address was also its most morally dubious. The nation's commander in chief drew attention to a wounded warrior while eliding any responsibility for placing the young man in harm's way. ... After a typical laundry list of empty boasts (unemployment is down largely because labor force participation is tanking), fantasy policy prescriptions ('a new savings bond that encourages people to build a nest egg?'), and outright falsehoods (economic mobility has not declined), ... Obama introduced America to Cory Remsburg, 'a proud Army Ranger,' who 'on his tenth deployment ... was nearly killed by a massive roadside bomb in Afghanistan.' Remsburg's sacrifice is plain to see: He has a long, visible scar on his head and, [Obama] explained, he 'is still blind in one eye' and 'still struggles on his left side.' Regardless of political affiliation and ideological positioning, all Americans can appreciate Remsburg's willingness to serve while questioning whether ... Obama is right to use such a soldier as an applause line in a political speech. ... What exactly was Remsburg—or any of his fellow soldiers—fighting for in Afghanistan? [Obama] didn't offer any explanation in his State of the Union address and you'd search his past speeches in vain for a clear and compelling reason, too. ... 'Patriotism is the last refuge to which a scoundrel clings,' Bob Dylan once sang, updating Samuel Johnson's dark maxim. NBC senior political editor Mark Murray tweets, "Obama's ending on [disabled veteran Cory] Remsburg wasn't just a story about America—it was also a story about Obama. Nothing has ever come easy [for him].")The message is immediately met with revulsion and anger from people who are disgusted that anyone would compare the hardship of an Army Ranger who served 10 combat tours and was almost killed with the easy life of Obama—who was sent to incredibly expensive private schools, had the advantage of affirmative action programs, and never seemed to have a "real" job in his life. That someone as callous or delusional as Murray could be a *senior political editor* at NBC is stunning—but may help explain the network's fawning coverage of Obama. for the record, Murray's wife Sasha works in the Obama administration.) MSNBC's Ronan Farrow (son of Mia Farrow and Frank Sinatra) mocks Cory Remsburg's disability with a Twitter message: "Cory 'struggles on the left side.' Congress relates." [54249, 54250, 54251]

At his "Stockman for Senate" web site, Congressman Steve Stockman (R-TX) writes, "I'm considering filing Articles of Impeachment against Barack Obama. You see, I walked out of Obama's State of the Union address last night. Obama defiantly vowed not only to radically expand the reach of government from cradle to grave, but to smash the Constitution's restrictions on government power while doing it. His goal is to eliminate our constitutional republic. Last year I said I would consider impeachment as a last resort to stop Obama's abuse of power. And, quite frankly, we're running out of options. But I can't do it alone. This will only succeed if I have hundreds of thousands standing with me. That's why I need to hear from you immediately. Do you want Barack Obama impeached? ...You have the power to determine the future of our constitutional republic. I need hundreds of thousands like you standing with me." [54271]

At a Senate Judiciary Committee hearing, Senator Mike Lee (R-UT) asks Attorney General Eric Holder to explain where Obama gets the constitutional authority basis for issuing executive orders, such as in the case of delaying ObamaCare's employer mandate. Holder answers in part, "I'll be honest with you, I have not seen-I don't remember looking at or having seen the analysis in, in some time, so I'm not sure where along the spectrum that would come. ... I've not had a chance to look at, you know, for some time, exactly what the analysis was there, so I'm not sure that I would be able to put it in what category. ... I would think that given that we're talking about a statute passed by Congress that delegates or devolves to the executive branch certain authorities, I would think that you're probably in category one there as well but, again, I have not looked at the analysis in some time." (WashingtonExaminer.com explains : "Lee had based his question on a standard legal test, first described by Supreme Court Justice Robert Jackson, who said [a] president's authority to issue executive orders is strongest when he does so with the backing of Congress (category one), more dubious when he issues an order pertaining to a topic on which Congress has not passed a law (category two), and weakest when the executive order is 'incompatible with a congressional command'

(category three), to use Lee's paraphrase." Holder is incorrect in stating that Obama's employer mandate change falls into category one. Obama did not have the explicit backing of Congress to delay the mandate, and Obama's action specifically contradicts the language of the Affordable Care Act—which does not provide any leeway for the effective date of the mandate.) In addition to Lee, Senators Ted Cruz (R-TX) and John Cornyn (R-TX) press Holder on the issue of IRS discrimination against and harassment of Tea Party groups. Holder tells the committee, "And on the subject of the use of [Obama's] authority, my hope is—and I would argue that he take whatever action is possible, as he has done in a number of steps already and as you have done in trying to clarify the mental health issues that have to be reported to the NIC [National Instant Criminal background check] system, my hope is that additional measures, executive actions are contemplated [by Obama] under that authority. Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) asks Holder, "Is it your position that out of the 117,000 employees at the Department of Justice the only lawyer available to head this investigation was a major Obama donor?" At the committee executive meeting, Senator Charles Grassley (R-IA) states, "I'd just like to mention one point regarding the nominee [Debo Adegbile] to head the Civil Rights Division. There are a number of controversial aspects of this nominee's record, and I won't take the Committee's time to discuss those issues today. But, I'd note Maureen Faulkner has written to the Committee in opposition to the nominee. Ms. Faulkner's husband [Daniel] was the Philadelphia Police Officer who was brutally murdered in 1981. The nominee later got involved in the case in order to get the defendant's death sentence lifted. She has requested that she be given the opportunity to be heard before the Committee. I think that's a reasonable request and I support it." (Katie Pavlich notes at Townhall.com, "In January 2011, under Adegbile's leadership as President of the NAACP Legal Defense Fund, attorneys voluntarily sought out and took over the case of convicted cop killer Mumia Abu-Jamal and assumed the cause of Abu-Jamal inside and outside the courtroom. The case was chosen by Adegbile and the NAACP LDF on the basis of race. Abu-Jamal was unanimously convicted in 1982 of murdering Faulkner and was given the death penalty. Adegbile was successful in getting that penalty overturned. If confirmed, Adegbile will be in charge of bringing charges against law enforcement offers and agencies as the head of the DOJ Civil Rights Department.") [54348, 54380, 54824]

James Clapper, director of National Intelligence, tells the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence that "Syria has become a huge magnet for extremists. First those groups who are engaged in Syria itself, some 1600 different groups. We estimate somewhere in the neighborhood of between 75,000 and 110,000 of which about 26,000 we grade as extremists. We estimate at this point in excess of 7,000 foreign fighters have been attracted from some 50 countries, many of them in Europe and the Mideast. There is tremendous concern here for those extremists who are attracted to Syria, engage in combat, get training, and we're seeing now the appearance of training complexes in Syria to train people to go back to their countries, and, of course, conduct more terrorist acts. So this is a huge concern to all of us." (Some may wonder why, if it is a "huge concern," that the Obama administration is supporting the anti-Assad forces.) [54332, 54333]

Iranian Defense Minister Hossein Dehghan says, "Iran... is ready to confront any hostile measure from any aggressor... and will cause any belligerent enemy to regret his actions. [Secretary of State John] Kerry's statements [that a "military option" is "available" should Iran not comply with the Geneva agreement] are nothing but a political bluff... The Americans know themselves that they are unable [to] take any insolent step against Iran, and are well aware of Iran's defense capabilities... The continued uttering of ill-considered statements such as these increases the hatred of the Iranian nation and the nations of the region and the world against the U.S., and poisons the atmosphere ahead of future [nuclear] talks... It is puzzling that those who ostensibly [champion]... democracy and diplomacy still talk of using methods from the Middle Ages, and think they can safeguard their interests by means of force, oppression and aggression, disregarding the fact that the [medieval] era has ended. The use of this ill-considered rhetoric accelerates the U.S.'s decline." [54334]

Iran's Ayatollah Makarem Shirazi states that Secretary of State John Kerry has "become a despicable slave of Israel" and "the West's ridiculous threats distance the Iranian nation from it and increase [this nation's] hatred for it. ...The hatemongering and ugly statement of the U.S. State Secretary, which was full of threats against Iran, displeased many, due to his insolent rhetoric. People are wondering how a man who does not know how to speak was appointed Secretary of State." [54334]

Several House Democrats form a "Full Employment Caucus." Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee (D-TX) says the new group will focus on drafting executive orders for Obama to sign. Jackson Lee—reportedly one of the worst members of Congress to work for because her foul mouth, hot temper, and abuse of staffers—states, "We will be answering the call of all of America because people need work and we're not doing right by them by creating work [sic]. I believe this caucus will put us on the right path and we'll give …Obama a number of executive orders that he can sign with pride and strength. In fact, I think that should be our number one agenda. Let's write up these executive orders… and ask [Obama] to stand with us on full employment." (Jackson Lee and many of her fellow House Democrats are apparently happy that Obama's unilateral and illegal actions are making them irrelevant.) [54556, 54558, 54560, 54619]

On *The Five*, Greg Gutfeld calls Obama's State of the Union address "the speech version of an air guitar."

Fact-checkers point out the errors in several of Obama's State of the Union claims. Although he stated, "Upward mobility has stalled," the Associated Press reports, "The most recent evidence suggests that mobility hasn't worsened. A team of economists led by Harvard's Raj Chetty released a study last week that found the United States isn't any less socially mobile than it was in the 1970s. Looking at children born between 1971 and 1993, the economists found that the odds of a child born in the poorest 20 percent of families making it into the top 20 percent hasn't changed." (That does not mean the economy is in great shape. It means only that the ability to move out of poverty still exists for those willing to persevere.) [54212, 54222, 54246]

Obama's claim that since October 1, 2013 "More than 9 million Americans have signed up for private health insurance or Medicaid coverage" is immediately criticized. Although he did not say the enrollments were "because of ObamaCare," he certainly *implied* that they were—and that is a falsehood. Obama's figure includes Medicaid enrollments, most of which have nothing to do with ObamaCare. (In any given three month periods there will be millions of recurring Medicaid enrollments.) Obama also noted, "A manufacturing sector that's adding jobs for the first time since the 1990s." *The Washington Post* responds, "The low point for manufacturing jobs was reached in January 2010, and there has been a gain of 570,000 jobs since then. But BLS [Bureau of Labor Statistics] data show that the number of manufacturing jobs is still 500,000 fewer than when Obama took office in the depths of the recession—and 1.7 million fewer than when the recession began in December 2007. The gain in manufacturing actually has begun to stall a bit in the past year. The only reason Obama can tout a gain in manufacturing jobs 'for the first time since the 1990s' is because, before the recession, manufacturing had been on a slow decline for many years." (Manufacturing job gains have been in spite of Obama's actions, not because of them.) [54212, 54222, 54246]

Obama's claim, "The more than eight million new jobs our businesses have created over the past four years," is also a bit disingenuous. The economy has created millions of new jobs, but it has also shed millions of other jobs. There are still about 1.7 million fewer jobs than in December 2007. [54212, 54222, 54246]

Obama also misled with this statement: "Because of this [health care] law, no American can ever again be dropped or denied coverage for a preexisting condition like asthma, back pain or cancer. No woman can ever be charged more just because she's a woman. And we did all this while adding years to Medicare's finances, keeping Medicare premiums flat, and lowering prescription costs for millions of seniors." (Medicare premiums have, in fact, increased—from \$99.90 in 2012 to \$104.90 in 2013. Additionally, ObamaCare is not "adding years to Medicare's finances." Medicare spending has been reduced in order to use those funds to help pay for ObamaCare. Medicare remains in dire fiscal straits. With regard to pre-existing conditions, knowing one cannot be turned down for coverage may mean little to someone whose policy has been canceled because of ObamaCare and who now faces the reality of much higher

premiums to replace that policy. Lastly, there is a good reason why insurers, on average, charge women higher rates than men: women incur maternity costs. That is no less unreasonable than charging smokers more than non-smokers. To "solve" the problem, insurers are not lowering the premiums of women; they are simply raising the premiums of men to make them "equal.") [54222]

On CNN Congressman Steve King (R-IA) says, "This threat that [Obama's] going to run the government with an ink pen and executive orders, we've never had [someone] with that level of audacity and that level of contempt for his own oath of office. We have a minimum wage. Congress has set it. For [Obama] to simply declare, 'I'm going to change this law that Congress has passed' is unconstitutional. He's outside the bounds of his Article Two limitations. ...This Congress should lay out the violations that [Obama's] had, and they are many. It goes through the immigration piece, No Child Left Behind, Welfare to Work. Many of those components—ObamaCare itself is probably the clearest one. When [Obama] extended the employer mandate for a year, clearly, it's unconstitutional because the law says that the employer mandate shall commence in each month after December of 2013. So we need to lay that all out. I think we should bring a resolution to the floor and say so and restrain [Obama] from his extra-constitutional behavior." [54229]

CNSNews.com asks Senator John McCain (R-AZ), "Does ... Obama have the constitutional authority to act on climate change, for example, without congressional approval?" McCain replies, "I don't believe so, certainly not [in] the spirit of the Constitution and I think [he] violated the letters [of the law] we're finding out in the NLRB [National Labor Relations Board] case. The problem is, the challenging of these actions takes a very, very long time wending its way through the courts. So I guess that's what he relies on." (Grammar aside, McCain is correct. Obama knows that legal challenges to his Constitutional abuses will drag through the courts for years. He also knows that Congress does not have the courage to impeach him. That leaves him to say, "I dare you to try and stop me.") Congressman Louis Gohmert (R-TX) responds to the same question: "It depends on what he does. If he sends a nice letter saying climate change is real, which I believe, climate change is real. Absolutely, it's a fact. It's a fact of life. Four times a year we have climate change, it's a real thing. So if [Obama] sends letters saying, I believe in climate change, that's fine, but if he intends to legislate from the executive mansion, it is wrong, it's unconstitutional." Congressman John Fleming (R-LA) answers, "Well, no I don't [think Obama has that authority]. Again, I find it amazing that [Obama], representing one branch of government, would go to Congress, the other branch of government, and inform them that he is going to usurp their powers and he's going to do an end-run. And I do believe he will attempt to do that, and he may have some success. Why? Because the attorney general, Eric Holder, does his bidding for him, and so does [Senate Majority Leader] Harry Reid, and the Congress cannot stop what [Obama] does, it's illegal, without both chambers being involved. So the leader of the Senate is failing in his responsibility to jealously guard the power of the Congress in the checks and balances of government. So he, as well as [Obama], as well as Eric Holder, are all acting unconstitutionally and unlawfully to do that. ... You know, my life goes back to Eisenhower, and I think that much of what [Obama] has done in terms of

targeting people, in terms of lawlessness, would certainly make Richard Nixon blush if he were still alive." [54231, 54231, 54232, 54244]

The Dow Jones Industrial Average closes down 190 points after the Federal Reserve announces it will reduce its federal bond buying by another \$10 billion, from \$75 billion to \$65 billion per month. (The decline demonstrates the reality that many are unwilling to accept: the stock market has been kept afloat through the Federal Reserve's inflation of the money supply, rather than any real economic recovery.) By a vote of 251–166 the House of Representatives passes a pork-filled farm bill that will cost the taxpayers more than \$950 billion over 10 years. It reduces food stamp spending by a mere one percent, but roughly 80 percent of the bill's cost covers the food stamp program. (Congress chose not to eliminate the loophole that allows millionaires to receive food stamps. Under the law, eligibility is based on income and does *not* take assets into consideration. If a Hollywood star is in between movies and without an income stream, he or she can still receive food stamps—despite owning a Beverly Hills mansion. The legislation also calls for the imposition of a tax on Christmas trees.) Leftists immediately excoriate the cuts. Congresswoman Rosa DeLauro (D-CT) says "Congress has lost its way" and calls the bills "reverse Robin Hood legislation that steals food from the poor." By criticizing such a minor cut in the food stamp budget, of course, the Democrats are essentially arguing that the Obama economy is not going to improve over the coming few years—not even enough to lift a few thousand Americans out of poverty. House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) comments on Obama's call to raise the minimum wage: "When you look at African Americans and Hispanics, they're the people who never have the chance to get on the economic ladder. It's bad policy and it will hurt the very people [Obama] purports to want to help." [54238]

On *Hannity*, Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) says that if Obama wants to create jobs he doesn't need "a pen and a phone... he needs an eraser" to remove regulations that keep businesses from starting and expanding and creating jobs.

Breitbart.com reports, "Though former Alaska Gov. Sarah Palin was not included in a Public Policy Polling survey of potential 2016 Republican presidential contenders, she was still overwhelmingly the most liked person among Republican primary voters. According to Public Policy Polling: 'The best liked person we tested on this poll with Republican primary voters is actually Sarah Palin who has a 70/20 favorability rating. She's followed by [Mike] Huckabee at 64/18, [Paul] Ryan at 58/18, [Rand] Paul at 58/21, [Jeb] Bush at 56/18, [Ted] Cruz at 45/20, and [Chris] Christie at 40/38. Most of those numbers are similar to what they were a month ago but Christie's seen a substantial drop from +18 at 47/29 a month ago to his new +2 net favorability.'" Although it is too early for the poll results to be very meaningful, Huckabee leads the 2016 presidential candidacy race with 16 percent, followed by Bush (14), Christie (13), Paul (11), Cruz (8), Rubio (8), Ryan (8), Scott Walker (6), and Bobby Jindal (5). On the Democrat side, Hillary Clinton leads with 67 percent, followed by Joe Biden (7), Elizabeth Warren (7), and Cory Booker (2), Andrew Cuomo (2) Kirsten Gillibrand (1), Martin O'Malley (1), Brian Schweitzer (1), and Mark Warner (1). The *Daily Mail* reports it has gained access to 1991 court documents related to the 1986 murder of Raymond "Gay Ray" Boyer, Obama's high school "Choom Gang" pot dealer. Boyer's lover, male prostitute Andrew Devere, "killed Boyer on New Year's Day 1986 because: Boyer was killing a friend of his by supplying that friend with drugs; Boyer embarrassed Devere and put him down in front of other people; Boyer had developed a habit of farting in Devere's face; Boyer once attacked Devere with a knife, slicing Devere's finger; Boyer made Devere beg for drugs." (Whether Boyer also farted in Obama's face is not revealed. Devere, despite being sentenced to life in prison, "is now free and living on the mainland.") [54233]

At NationalJournal.com James Oliphant notes that Obama "stuff[ed] his administration with like-minded denizens of the Ivy League," but claims Obama "got there [Harvard] the hard way." (There is no evidence whatsoever that Obama got into Harvard "the hard way." In fact, as *Timeline* readers know, it appears that the skids were greased for his entry. Obama received a letter of recommendation to attend Harvard Law School from Percy Sutton, who had been Malcolm X's attorney. It was Khalid Abdullah Tariq al-Mansour (aka William Ayers' pal Donald Warden), a radical Muslim and vitriolic anti-Semite, mentor of Black Panther Party founders Huey Newton and Bobby Seale, close associate of Nation of Islam leader Louis Farrakhan, and friend of Obama, who asked Sutton to write the letter. A Harvard letter of recommendation for Obama was also written by John McKnight, who served on the Gamaliel Foundation's Board of Directors as well as the board of National People's Action, yet another Alinskyinspired activist group. It is unclear how, academically, Obama got into Harvard Law School. HLS has exceptionally high admissions standards, with applicant LSAT scores expected in the 98 to 99 range, and a grade point average of 3.8 or higher. It is assumed that if Obama had such scores and grades his campaign would have bragged about them. It did not, and Obama still refuses to release any of his school records. Obama denies knowing al-Mansour, but al-Mansour, in an interview with *Newsmax* reporter Kenneth Timmerman, admits he had spoken with Obama and told him he would keep a "low profile" during the campaign in order to avoid embarrassing the candidate.) Until [MSNBC president Phil Griffin] takes internal corrective action and personally apologizes—not just to the RNC but to all right-of-center Americans—I'm banning all RNC staff from appearing on, associating with, or booking any RNC surrogates on MSNBC. As an elected official, strategist, or surrogate, I'm asking for you to agree to the same. We can have our political disagreements with MSNBC, but using biracial families to launch petty and ridiculous political attacks is low, even by MSNBC's standards. It

only coarsens our political discourse. ...MSNBC hosts—including Alec Baldwin, Martin Bashir, Melissa Harris-Perry, Alex Wagner, and Ronan Farrow just to name a few—have had a troubling streak in the last several weeks of making comments that belittle and demean Americans without furthering any thoughtful dialogue. Perhaps it's time for the executives at MSNBC to consider whether their network is upholding a meaningful journalistic mission. This is more than just a tweet or an offhand comment. This is part of a pattern of behavior that has gotten markedly worse, and until Phil Griffin personally apologizes and takes corrective action, we cannot be part of this network's toxic programming." (MSNBC's ratings have plummeted, and the more its hosts bash conservatives and promote Obama, the more they fall. The network—which later issues an apology, its 19th in two years—is trying to attract viewers with outrageousness, and failing.) That's nothing compared to Brian, Kristi, and Judy who have kids. they are going to pay twice that, four grand." TheHill.com notes, "Waxman is a longtime ally of Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA), and his decision to retire-following fellow Pelosi lieutenant Rep. George Miller's (D-CA) announcement earlier this year—will be taken as a sign Democrats are not confident about taking back the House this fall. The twin retirements also raise new questions about Pelosi's future, and about who might succeed Waxman as the senior Democrat on the House Energy and Commerce Committee." One report suggests that infamous "social justice advocate" Sandra "I demand free birth control" Fluke is "strongly considering" running for Waxman's vacant seat. Inasmuch as an actual Republican will run in 2014 and the district is now less liberal, perhaps her opponent could give her a run for (someone else's) money. 'We want to encourage more of them,' he said. Then, he began to speak—apparently extemporaneously—about the benefits of working in America's everdiminishing manufacturing sector. 'A lot of parents, unfortunately, maybe when they saw

Then, however, Obama went on the offensive against America's most useless major that doesn't have the word 'studies' or 'gender' in it. 'But I promise you, folks can make a lot more, potentially, with skilled manufacturing or the trades than they might with an art history degree,' Obama declared. (Interestingly, Obama finds it necessary to apologize to an art history teacher for suggesting—correctly—that teaching art is not exactly a lucrative career, yet he refuses to apologize to Americans for his many ObamaCare lies. It seems to have been written chiefly in fear of losing extreme leftist votes to Henry Wallace. The basic philosophy it embodies is unmistakable. It is the philosophy of the welfare state, the doctrine of salvation through bureaucracy. Free enterprise, free markets, and free prices are no longer to be trusted to stimulate and guide production and consumption. Everything is to be in charge of omniscient and omnipotent bureaucrats. Everyone is promised economic security, regardless of what he contributes to production. We are to have bigger job insurance, bigger old-age benefits, bigger survivors' benefits, bigger education. The government is to subsidize our medical care and our housing. It is also to reclaim land, replant forests, build more TVA's. On top of this, it is to spend in fifteen months on European aid alone as much as it used to spend in the same period before the war for all its purposes combined. Mr. Truman, by some miracle, is at the same time for 'economy.' 'Government expenditures have been and must continue to be held to the lowest safe levels.' But the proposals he makes would immeasurably increase even present expenditures. And the Federal government is already spending in one year as much as it took it five years to spend just before the war. Of course all this money is to be taken in taxes only from 'the rich.' What Mr. Truman forgets is that the entire wealth and welfare of the country depends upon production." [54317]

"The total amount of the [gross] national product is far more important to the average family than any possible redistribution of it. Yet Mr. Truman's schemes and taxes would undermine, discourage, and disrupt production. It would destroy incentives. 'This is not fair, and it harms our criminal justice system.' Congress is considering a bill that would make the new sentencing guidelines retroactive, which could make up to 12,000 prisoners eligible for reduced sentences. ... Prison officials will also spread the word among inmates that lowlevel, nonviolent drug offenders might be eligible to apply for clemency. About 30,000 inmates-roughly 15 percent of the prison population-were serving crack sentences at the end of 2011, according to federal data." [54320, 54357]

But the Democrats will have no problem working with "establishment" Republicans on the issue, because in the long run they know they will get what they want: millions more registered Democrat voters.) It saddens me to think of the decreased access to care from actual physicians and the shockingly increased costs Aetna patients will now experience because of your choice to collude with big government rather than collaborate with patients and physicians." That's largely because 57% of Democrats give it their least trusted designation, with only Comedy Central at 18% also hitting double digits with them. MSNBC leads the way among Republicans at 38%, but CNN at 17% and Comedy Central at 13% both hit double digits as well." [54345]

Louie Gohmert (R-TX), and then met with leaders of the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom. Wednesday's lineup included Sen. Lindsay Graham (R-SC), Sen. John McCain (R-AZ), Sen. Joe Manchin (D-WV), State Department officials including Lawrence Silverman, Near East Affairs deputy acting secretary, and Uzra Zeya, acting assistant secretary for the Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor, and then a final stop at the U.S. Institute for Peace." On *Special Report*, syndicated columnist Charles Krauthammer comments, "You can have executive orders that implement already existing laws. The Obama administration acknowledged on Thursday that the regime has shipped out less than 5 percent of its chemical arms. The country is weeks behind schedule, and may miss next week's deadline to ship all its chemical agents out of the country. This, despite ...Obama declaring in his State of the Union address that Syria's chemical weapons 'are being eliminated' thanks to American diplomacy. The administration still hopes diplomacy will prevail. It also may have few other options, with little appetite in Congress for military intervention. White House Press Secretary Jay Carney said Friday that officials are working with partners to 'keep up the pressure' on the regime." (Syria will likely withstand the pressure, because Bashar al-Assad knows the odds of Obama using military force are close to zero.) [54390]

Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu has stated, "I do not intend to remove a single settlement; I do not intend to displace a single Israeli.") [54439]

During a Google sponsored Internet "town hall meeting," Obama is asked by Covington, Kentucky resident Rebecca Stewart, "My question regards Obamacare, which I think probably has a general consensus right now that the rollout perhaps was premature. I'm probably not the only one whose had really a panicked experience lately trying to figure out if my 10-year-old son can continue with his specialist or not. And I know that I cannot keep my plan, which I liked, but as I'm trying to decide what to do going forward, I spent weeks with days on the phone, getting confidently delivered wrong answers, conflicting answers and it's becoming quite obvious to me that a lot of agencies, almost everyone I've talked to, is having a lot of trouble figuring out the new rules. So I'm afraid that perhaps average Americans who haven't had the time or ability to do the legwork that I've been able to do are perhaps going to be blind-sided by this. And I'm wondering, my question for you is what are you doing to fix this or simplify what seems to be such a complicated process?" Obama replies, "Well, Rebecca, first of all, it sounds like you were in the individual market, so you already had some sort of insurance plan and the—so, your concern is, in terms of this transition, how does it affect you and your kids? What I'll do first right away is make sure that somebody out of here, this White House calls you directly. And I promise you, not only will they be confident, but it will be the right answer." "But," continues Obama. "more generally, what we've been able to do, and you don't have to pussyfoot around, the rollout was a problem because the website wasn't working properly. I will say that in all these big programs, whether it was the prescription drug plan, or Medicare, every time this happens—this is a big country with a lot of complications and millions of people involved—there are going to be some glitches involved. What we have done is—first of all, the website's working: Healthcare.gov. The first place for folks to look to see whether they qualify for a tax credit, whether they can get cheaper insurance through these exchanges, is to go to healthcare.gov, where you do not have to wait anymore. And generally speaking, for the majority of people, certainly if you don't have health insurance, this will be a good deal for you. If you already have health insurance—for the majority of folks like you who do, Rebecca, typically your prices will be lower or comparable. And you have better health insurance because the insurance companies won't be able to drop you when you need it most. There aren't going to be lifetime limits, so that suddenly you find yourself with a huge bill at the end. And you may qualify for tax credits." [54417]

"If, though, after you look at that, it appears that you still are going to have a tough time, or if you have a particular specialist, you haven't found that specialist in the network, of the exchange that's offered in Kentucky, then we are looking at rules to make sure that somebody who is actively being treated, for example, can remain with their specialist for the duration of their treatment. [Obama does not explain why that situation was not considered *before* the legislation was written.] That's what I'll try to provide more information about. For people who are generally watching, who have very specific questions like this, Rebecca, we have set up help lines, and what I would suggest is that everybody who's listening, if you have a particular question on this that is not answerable over the internet through healthcare.gov, call up one of the call centers, and in the case of the state of Kentucky, they've got a pretty good operation there. Call up them and find out what exactly your problem is and hopefully get a good answer. But you, Rebecca, since you're talking to [me] directly, will get, I guarantee you, a firm answer by the end of the day." Stewart begins to respond to Obama's reference to the help lines, "Yes, and I *have* called..." and is cut off by the moderator. [54417]

Senator Jeanne Shaheen (D-NH), in an interview with WKXL Concord News Radio, arrogantly addresses the problem of people who have lost their doctors and hospitals because of ObamaCare: "At least for people who are willing to pay more, that they have that option of going to their doctor and hospital no matter what their insurer does." (In other words, "You may have lost the insurance coverage you liked and your doctor may not be in the ObamaCare network, but you can always pay cash to see your old doctor.") Asked if she would have voted for ObamaCare knowing what she knows now, she responds, "I would've designed it differently had I been designing it. I wasn't the person who was writing the law. Hindsight is 20/20." (In other words, "I didn't read the bill; I only voted for it.") [54505, 54506, 54526]

At ChicagoMag.com Carol Felsenthal writes about Obama's closest advisor and friend, Valerie Jarrett. Felsenthal notes, "In a recent book on the 2012 campaign, Jonathan Alter writes that Rahm Emanuel, on agreeing to become Obama's chief of staff, recognized that Jarrett would wield such outsized power that he tried unsuccessfully to finesse her into Obama's senate seat. (Alter also speculates that Valerie Jarrett was one reason why Rahm hightailed it out of DC in late 2010 into the relative ease of the Fifth Floor [Chicago mayor's office].) ... Others in media and Washington circles portray Jarrett, who held top positions in Chicago government and business, as a brilliant strategist and thinker who practically runs both wings of the White House and who did as much or more than anyone to put the Obamas there. ... The reality is that [Jarrett's] power stems from friendship with the first couple, forged by after-hour access, total trust that her only motive is to protect the first couple's images and advance their interests. Valerie Jarrett is not powerful because she creates and implements policy, but because she's the last person [Obama] and/or [his wife] talk to, sometimes over dinner in their private dining room. ... There's always the historical analysis to come, but so far she is considered to have a spotty record, especially on the key portfolio item-serving as the administration's liaison to business. ... [A]s the Washington Post's Dana Milbank has written, 'current and former White House officials ...raised questions about Jarrett's effectiveness and judgment.' Politico's Mike Allen and Jim VandeHei write that Obama's '...relations with business leaders could hardly be worse.' ...Jason Horowitz, then writing about Jarrett for the Washington Post, described 'disgruntled Obama donors in the financial industry...[who] have cast Jarrett as insufficiently sophisticated on economic issues and incapable of brooking any dissent about Obama. 'I have always thought she was a liability,' said one prominent investor and donor... 'I've talked to people in the White House about it, and they have agreed with me, but they are scared to say anything." [54665]

Felsenthal continues, "In his latest book, Jonathan Alter writes that the oft-told story of Obama insisting on interviewing Jarrett before allowing his girlfriend to take a job in Daley's administration did not 'amuse' [then Chicago Mayor] Rich Daley. According to Alter, Daley was no fan of Jarrett, finding her 'indecisive as city planning commissioner' and refusing to promote her to chief of staff. Alter also writes that a CEO who visited the White House remarked, 'When we go to the White House we talk to people we wouldn't hire.' In their book on the 2012 campaign, Mark Halperin and John Heilemann write that

Wall Streeters 'disparaged Obama's team for lacking anyone with a meaningful background in the private sector. When Jarrett would huff, 'Well I have one,' they rolled their eyes; they considered her a political hack, ineffectual and entitled.'...Jonathan Alter's reporting revealed... 'Staffers feared her, but didn't like or trust her. At meetings she said little or nothing, instead lingering afterwards to express her views directly to [Obama], creating anxiety for her underlings and insulting them by saying, 'I don't talk just to hear myself talking.' Derogatory nicknames abound for Jarrett: 'Keeper of the Essence,' 'Night Stalker' (because of her access after hours to the Obamas in their private quarters), 'personal custodian of [Obama's] lofty motives and gifts.' ... Jarrett will continue to harness her future to the Obamas'. Just as she helped with their transition to the White House, she'll help with their transition out of it. She'll be a key player in every aspect of the Obama Library and Museum, from pushing for it to be located at the University of Chicago, where she has deep ties, to helping to choose an architect, to raising money, to articulating and polishing the details of Barack Obama's legacy. As Jodie Kantor told me, 'I don't think Valerie's ever leaving [the Obamas]. ... She has thrown her entire life into their cause, and she's made it very clear that she would happily run in front of a speeding truck for them... She has taken [Obama's] and [Michelle Obama's] success as the defining mission of her being." [54665]
