The Complete Obama Timeline

January 2015

Effective January 1 the minimum wage is increased in 19 states. The highest is in Washington—\$9.47 per hour. (The Heritage Foundation's James Sherk notes the law of unintended consequences: "Minimum-wage increases reduce the total earnings of low-wage workers—the higher pay for some workers gets completely offset by the nonexistent pay of those no longer employed.) Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi delivers an address in which he says, in part, "I am referring here to the religious clerics. We have to think hard about what we are facing—and I have, in fact, addressed this topic a couple of times before. It's inconceivable that the thinking that we hold most sacred should cause the entire umma [Islamic world] to be a source of anxiety, danger, killing and destruction for the rest of the world. Impossible! That thinking—I am not saying 'religion' but 'thinking'—that corpus of texts and ideas that we have sacralized over the centuries, to the point that departing from them has become almost impossible, is antagonizing the entire world. It's antagonizing the entire world! Is it possible that 1.6 billion people [Muslims] should want to kill the rest of the world's inhabitants-that is 7 billion-so that they themselves may live? Impossible! I am saying these words here at Al Azhar, before this assembly of scholars and ulema—Allah Almighty be witness to your truth on Judgment Day concerning that which I'm talking about now. All this that I am telling you, you cannot feel it if you remain trapped within this mindset. You need to step outside of yourselves to be able to observe it and reflect on it from a more enlightened perspective. I say and repeat again that we are in need of a religious revolution. You, imams, are responsible before Allah. The entire world, I say it again, the entire world is waiting for your next move... because this umma is being torn, it is being destroyed, it is being lost—and it is being lost by our own hands." (Raymond Ibrahim calls the remarks al-Sisi's "most forceful and impassioned plea to date on the subject"-which is why it does not take long for the Muslim Brotherhood to call for his assassination. Obama, of course, preferred the radical Muslim Brotherhood leader Mohammed Morsi to the level-headed-and possibly even "moderate Muslim"—man who replaced him, al-Sisi.) 'It's inconceivable,' he said, 'that the thinking that we hold most sacred should cause the entire umma [Islamic world] to be a source of anxiety, danger, killing and destruction for the rest of the world. Impossible!' What a refreshingly honest statement to come from not only a political leader but a Muslim political leader who has much to lose, not least his life! Contrast his very true words with the habitual reassurances of the Western

On a recent episode of the New Black Panthers Party's 'Black Power Radio' posted at Breitbart.com, Shabazz, current national president of Black Lawyers for Justice, said: 'Mister Malcolm X, he consistently teaches us self-defense. The most honorable Elijah Muhammad continuously teaches us self-defense. The honorable Marcus Mosiah Garvey teaches us self-defense, and we know, our leader and our teacher, the honorable Khalid Abdul Muhammad, teaches us self-defense. What am I saying? Right now it's time to build up that army. Right now it's time for us to build up those corps, those troops. It's time to get strong. It's time for lifting weights and working out and going to the gun range and all of that.'" (Obama appeared with Shabazz at a March 2007 event in Selma, Alabama.) [69774]

At NationalReview.com Victor Davis Hanson writes, "Americans should thank the U.S. oilman-from the drillers in the field to the engineers behind the scenes-who did the impossible. They vastly increased the supply of what was supposedly a permanently declining resource, and thereby helped to crash prices. Oilmen, not the government, returned hundreds of billions of dollars to American consumers. They, not Ivy League experts and Wall Street grandees, kick-started the economy where federal subsidies had failed to. They, not the policies of the Obama administration or the rhetoric of Secretary of State John Kerry, weakened our enemies. Almost everything Obama tried for six years in an effort to rev the economy-from near-zero interest rates and \$1 trillion annual budget deficits to Obamacare and vast increases in entitlements-has failed. His foreignpolicy stances of resets and leading from behind led to chaos and emboldened enemies. Yet the United States economy is slowly recovering with cheap energy. Consumers have more money. At Townhall.com Kevin Glass writes, "Before, a legal social security number was required for a license in California, but under the new law as many as 1.4 million illegal immigrants are expected to be granted licenses. ...[T]his wouldn't be the first state to provide drivers licenses to illegal immigrants, but it would be opening the largest illegal immigrant population in the country to a program that would grant drivers licenses." At 321Gold.com Adam Hamilton writes, "The seemingly-invincible US stock markets powered higher again last year, still directly fueled by the Fed's [Federal Reserve's] epic quantitative-easing money printing. But 2015 is shaping up to be radically different from the past couple years. The Fed effectively abandoned the stock markets when it terminated its bond buying late last year. So this year we will finally see if these lofty stock markets can remain afloat without the Fed. ...But extrapolating that incredible upside action of 2013 and 2014 into the future is supremely irrational, because its driver has vanished. The past couple years' mammoth stock-market rally was completely artificial, the product of central-bank market manipulation. The Federal Reserve not only created vast sums of new money out of thin air to monetize bonds, but it aggressively jawboned the stock markets higher. ... With the Fed printing money with reckless abandon, every minor stock-market dip was quickly bought. But with no significant selloffs to rebalance sentiment, greed flourished out of control. That eventually forced the stock markets to today's immensely overextended and overvalued levels, which stockmarket history shows are exceedingly dangerous. The Fed distortion in these markets is extreme beyond belief." [69822]

"...By aggressively inflating its balance sheet through money printing, the Fed *artificially suppressed* all the normal healthy stock-market selloffs that should have rebalanced sentiment. But back in late October, it ended its latest QE3 bond-monetizing campaign. And with this new year ushering in a new Congress dominated by anti-Fed Republicans, it is politically impossible for the Fed to launch any kind of QE4. ...Without QE or even the prospect of QE in 2015, the Fed's implied backstop for the US stock markets *no longer exists*. Sooner or later some selling catalyst will arrive, probably out of Europe like back in 2010 and 2011. And as investors and speculators start to exit stocks, that selling will cascade as there will be insufficient quick buy-the-dip capital inflows with the Fed no longer actively convincing traders to flood back in. ...With the Fed's balance sheet and zeroed interest rates finally starting to normalize in 2015, the lofty and overvalued Fed-levitated stock markets are in for some tough sledding. The implied backstop that enticed and forced so many traders to over-deploy in the stock markets in recent years has vanished. And the serious gravity of the Fed's absence will become readily apparent once the next selloff starts cascading." [69822]

Congresswoman Michele Bachmann (R-MN) posts a photograph of herself pointing to a service station sign advertising gasoline for \$1.989 per gallon. In August 2011, when gasoline was about \$3.50 per gallon, Bachmann was criticized by the mainstream media for arguing that a free market and increased U.S. oil production would lower prices. She was specifically ridiculed for stating, "Under President Bachmann, you will see gasoline come down below \$2 a gallon again. That will happen." Time magazine, for example, wrote, "Assuming OPEC simply reduced its own production to account for increased American drilling—which it would—prices at the pump might drop a whole 3 cents a gallon." Obama also ridiculed Republican thoughts of lower gas prices. In 2012 Obama said, "We can't just drill our way to lower gas prices. They're already dusting off their three-point plans for \$2 gas. I'll save you the suspense: Step one is drill, step two is drill, and step three is keep drilling." (Bachmann was right; Sarah Palin's "Drill, baby, drill" was right; Obama and the media were wrong.) Lower gasoline and home heating oil prices are good for consumers, of course, but there is a slight down side. If prices remain low the result will be oil industry workers losing their jobs because the per-barrel price of oil will not be enough to sustain marginal operations. (That is, some wells and fracking operations that can make a profit with \$100 per barrel oil will lose money if the price is only \$60 per barrel. Some argue that, despite falling prices, Saudi Arabia is refusing to cuts its production in an effort to shut down fracking operations in the United States. With the price of gasoline falling, more than a few politicians suggest raising gas taxes. Former Obama economic advisor Lawrence Summers states, "[T]here has always been the concern that a carbon tax would place an unfair burden on some middle- and lowincome consumers. Those who drive long distances to work, say, or who have homes that are expensive to heat would be disproportionately burdened. Now that these consumers have received a windfall from the fall in energy prices, it would be possible to impose substantial carbon taxes without them being burdened relative to where things stood six months ago." HotAir.com responds, "Did you notice what he did there? People were significantly changing their work schedules, opting for 'staycations' and making sacrifices so they could heat their homes until we finally found a way to drive the prices down. But under Larry's plan, we can make sure that life doesn't suck any more than it did before! Everyone should be really excited about that sort of plan." (California has a new "global warming tax" of 2.25 percent times the retail price of gasoline. Because the retail price includes taxes, the fee is also a tax on a tax. According to DailyCaller.com, "Californians pay a whopping 77 cents per gallon extra on gasoline due to fees and taxes.") [69792, 69882, 69905, 69915]

Obama signs an executive order authorizing financial sanctions on a number of North Korean officials and agencies. Treasury Secretary Jack Lew states, "Today's actions are driven by our commitment to hold North Korea accountable for its destructive and destabilizing conduct. Even as the FBI continues its investigation into the cyberattack against Sony Pictures Entertainment, these steps underscore that we will employ a broad set of tools to defend U.S. businesses and citizens, and to respond to attempts to undermine our values or threaten the national security of the United States." (Such

sanctions are generally meaningless. Individuals and companies subject to the sanctions simply use different names to avoid them.) [69788, 69797]

WashingtonTimes.com reports that Obama and his wife "spent a leisurely couple hours at Vintage Cave Honolulu, dropping an estimated \$1,000 on a meal with wine at an upscale restaurant that actually charges \$500,000 for those who want to buy a membership. Mr. Obama passed on the membership at the Vintage Cave Honolulu, but he did order the price-fix menu at \$295 per plate, Mediate reported. And, according to Honolulu Magazine, 'the total bill for two, with wine, will approach \$1,000.'" On *Special Report*, Charles Krauthammer calls the decline in gasoline prices "the biggest story of the year. It's damaged our enemies, the Russians, the Venezuelans, the Iranians, and, of course, it's propelling our economy. And when Obama says that... we've been increasing oil production, think of this: oil production on federal lands has *declined* by 16 percent since 2010. This [increased production and lower prices] has happened in spite of Obama and not because of Obama. It's occurred entirely on state owned and private lands." [69794]

On January 3 White House spokesman Eric Schultz announces that after returning from his vacation in Hawaii, Obama will travel to Michigan, Arizona, and Tennessee to announce "executive actions and legislative proposals." (He will not visit the scandalscarred Phoenix Veterans Administration hospital, even though he will be only one mile away.) Obama "will act next week to lay out specific new actions and preview new policy proposals that will be included in his [January 20] State of the Union address." According to Schultz, Obama "is eager to get to work and looks forward to working with the new Congress on policies that will make sure middle-class Americans are sharing in the economic recovery. But [Obama] is clear that he will not let this Congress undo important protections gained-particularly in areas of health care, Wall Street reform and the environment." (Obama's appearance in Wayne, Michigan, to brag about the revitalized auto industry, will be at a Ford plant that has been temporarily shut down due to slow sales of its hybrid vehicles. Why Obama will speak at a Ford facility is not clear; it was General Motors and Chrysler that accepted bailout money from the taxpayers, not Ford. Of course, it would look worse if Obama went to Italy to brag about how he "saved" Chrysler by giving it to Fiat.) [69798, 69826, 69848]

Former U.S. Senator Edward Brooke (R-MA) dies at the age of 95. Brooke was the nation's first elected black Senator. (Obama presented Brooke with the Congressional Gold Medal in October 2009. Strangely, the award was approved more than one year earlier. It is unclear why the ceremony was delayed.) FoxNews.com notes, "The first blacks served in the Senate in the 1870s, just after the Civil War, when senators were still selected by state legislatures rather than by popular election. Mississippi's postwar legislators sent two blacks to the Senate. Hiram R. Revels served about 14 months in 1870-71, and Blanche K. Bruce served a full six-year term from 1875 to 81." FreedomOutpost.com posts the response of a fallen Marine after the White House sent him a condolence letter. Steven R. Hogan, father of Lance Corporal Hunter D. Hogan, wrote back to Obama: "I wonder how many of these get returned to you! Mr. Barrack [sic] Hussein Obama, I am deeply saddened that you are the President of the United States. You sir are an embarrassment to the Oval Office. My [late] son, as well as most Marines I know, despise you and your lack of representation for our military. Your ridiculous rules of engagement have caused the massive amount of casualties on your watch in Afghanistan. While we watch your media pander to your administration and clearly sweep things under the rug for you, I fully understand Marines die. You have tied their hands & feet! Chill. At least Trig didn't eat the dog. Hey, by the way, remember your 'Woman of the Year,' Ellen DeGeneres? Did you get all wee-wee'd up when she posted this sweet picture [a photo of a little girl standing on her dog to reach the sink to brush her teeth]? Hypocritical, much? Did you go as crazy when your heroic Man-of-Your-Lifetime, Barack Obama, revealed he actually enjoyed eating dead dog meat [when he lived in Indonesia]?" [69814, 69815, 69849]

Former Arkansas governor Mike Huckabee appears on his final program, *Huckabee*. He announces to the audience that he will be exploring the possibility of running for president. [69810, 69812, 69835]

On January 4 attention-seeking journalist Geraldo River is turned away from the funeral of slain New York City police officer Wenjian Liu. Police officers again turn their backs on Mayor Bill de Blasio, despite having been told by the police commissioner not to do so. [69802, 69803, 69804, 69808]

On *This Week*, freshman Congresswoman Mia Love (R-UT) says, "I was elected by my district to make sure that we get the decision-making back in their hands, and I've said I was going to do everything I can to repeal and replace it [ObamaCare] with something that is functional... with broad health-care reforms, free-market health-care reforms. And that's exactly what I'm going to do." [69829]

On *Fox & Friends*, Congressman Louie Gohmert (R-TX) announces he is a candidate for Speaker of the House, challenging John Boehner (R-OH). Gohmert also releases a statement that reads, in part, "After the November elections gave Republicans control of the Senate, voters made clear they wanted change. There have been numerous examples of problematic Republican leadership, but we were hopeful our leaders got the voters' message. However, after our Speaker forced through the CRomnibus [spending bill] by passing it with Democratic votes and without time to read it, it seemed clear that we needed new leadership. There had been much discussion. But, until yesterday, no one had

stepped up. ...At this point, the Speaker's election is not about a particular candidate. It is about whether we keep the status quo or make the change the country demands. I am putting forward my name for consideration as Speaker and hope that with a new Speaker, be that me or someone else, we can fight for the ideals and principles that the voters wanted when they elected us in November." (Gohmert is not going to win the contest on the initial vote, but *if* enough House members vote against Boehner, Gohmert can force a second, third, or subsequent vote until a candidate gets the requisite 218 votes. Gohmert, and more than a few Americans, are hoping that if Boehner fails on the first vote, momentum will build to choose someone more conservative and less willing to cave in to Obama.) It is worth noting that the Speaker of the House does *not* have to be a member of Congress. House members could elect *anyone* speaker, as long as he or she is an adult U.S. citizen. According to Caddell Associates survey of 602 Republican voters, 34 percent say they would "definitely" prefer that House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) be replaced; 26 percent "probably" would prefer someone else; 64 percent call Boehner "ineffective" in standing up to Obama. [69833]

Obama feels obliged to comment on the death of an ESPN sportscaster named Stuart Scott. To no one's surprise, Obama makes the statement about himself: "I will miss Stuart Scott. For much of those twenty years, public service and campaigns have kept me from my family—but wherever I went, I could flip on the TV and Stu and his colleagues on SportsCenter were there. Over the years, he entertained us—with courage and love. Michelle and I offer our thoughts and prayers to his family, friends, and colleagues." (*The Weekly Standard's* Bill Kristol tweets, "Could politicians PLEASE not refer to their OWN careers as 'public service?'" WashingtonTimes.com reports, "More than a year before ...Obama nominated federal prosecutor Loretta Lynch to be attorney general, a former federal judge quietly called on Congress to investigate her U.S. attorney's office for trampling on victims' rights. Paul Cassell, a law professor at the University of Utah, said Ms. Lynch's office, the U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of New York, never told victims in a major stock fraud case that a culprit had been sentenced—denying them a chance to seek restitution of some \$40 million in losses. Mr. Cassell, in written remarks to a House Judiciary Committee panel in 2013, said if prosecutors were using secretive sentencing procedures to reward criminals for cooperating with them, it could violate the Crime Victims Restitution Act. ...Ms. Lynch's nomination to be attorney general will soon come before the Senate Judiciary Committee, now controlled by Republicans, and the case could surface as a topic of inquiry." The New York Times writes, "Because the House has been in Republican hands since 2011, the real test comes in the Senate, where the new majority leader, Senator Mitch McConnell of Kentucky, is armed with a 54-46 majority. He will still have to find a way

to make legislation passed by the House attractive to enough Democrats to assemble the 60 votes needed to overcome procedural obstacles and send them to [Obama's] desk." (By "procedural obstacles" the *Times* means "filibuster," which will likely become as acceptable to the mainstream media with Senate Democrats in the minority as it was considered unacceptable when the Republicans were in the minority. HotAir.com observes, "Well, this is the reward for all the work that went into winning historic gains in the midterms. There are now only two tools remaining in the obstructionist work shed. The New York Times reports that at Harvard, "Members of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences, the heart of the 378-year-old university, voted overwhelmingly in November to oppose changes that would require them and thousands of other Harvard employees to pay more for health care. [The poverty-stricken Harvard professors, whose annual salaries easily average more than \$100,000, are not happy that they will now have a \$250 deductible and a \$20 co-pay for a doctor visit.] The university says the increases are in part a result of the Obama administration's Affordable Care Act, which many Harvard professors championed. The faculty vote came too late to stop the cost increases from taking effect this month, and the anger on campus remains focused on questions that are agitating many workplaces: How should the burden of health costs be shared by employers and employees? If employees have to bear more of the cost, will they skimp on medically necessary care, curtail the use of less valuable services, or both?" (In other words, Harvard's elitists loved Obama and ObamaCare until they learned it would impact them negatively, and not just the peons in the rest of the country. France drops its 75 percent tax on its wealthiest citizens, after many of them responded by fleeing to Great Britain and elsewhere. To the surprise of no one except socialists and The New York Times' Paul Krugman, the tax generated nowhere near the revenue that was anticipated by the government. (Whether Obama and his fellow Democrats paid any attention to the disastrous scheme is not known.) It's true that dynamic analysis has to make assumptions about the impact of incentives and disincentives on market behavior, but static analysis makes the ridiculous assumption that neither have any impact at all." ("Static analysis" fails to take into account human behavior. Raising the capital gains tax by 10 percent, for example, will *not* increase revenue by 10 percent, because the higher tax rate will prompt some investors to *postpone* the sale of their assets in order to delay the payment of any tax.) Jerome Corsi reports at WND.com, "Since the passage of Obamacare, House Speaker John Boehner has been dogged by critics pointing out his investment portfolio has benefited from owning insurance and medical company stocks that have profited from the legislation. An analysis of Boehner's current investment holdings includes a number of stocks benefiting from Obamacare in a total portfolio estimated at between \$3.5 and \$5 million in current market value. ...Boehner's Obamacare-related investments trace back to 2009, when the Obama administration was pushing the Affordable Health Care Act through Congress. ...Boehner has continued to profit from health-industry investments tracing back to 2009: Wellpoint Inc, which he bought at \$56 a share, is now trading at \$124.37. Cardinal Health, which he bought when it was trading at approximately \$30 a share in 2011, is now trading at \$80.44; and Pfizer which was trading at under \$20 a share in 2010, is now at \$31.06." FoxNews.com reports, "Former CBS News correspondent Sharyl Attkisson has sued the Justice Department over the hacking of her computers, officially accusing the Obama administration of illegal surveillance while she was reporting on administration scandals. In a series of legal filings that seek \$35 million in damages, Attkisson alleges that three separate computer forensic exams showed that hackers used sophisticated methods to surreptitiously monitor her work between 2011 and 2013. 'I just think it's important to send a message that people shouldn't be victimized and throw up their hands and think there's nothing they can do and they're powerless,' Attkisson said in an interview. ...In the lawsuit and related claims against the Postal Service, filed in Washington, Attkisson says the intruders installed and periodically refreshed software to steal data and obtain passwords on her home and work computers. She also charges that the hackers monitored her audio using a Skype account. The award-winning reporter says she and her attorneys have 'pretty good evidence' that these efforts were 'connected' to the Justice Department. She said she was caught in a 'Catch-22,' forcing her to use the lawsuit and an administrative complaint to discover more about the surveillance through the discovery process and to learn the identities of the 'John Does' named in the complaints. ...Attkisson learned through a Freedom of Information request that the FBI opened an investigation of the hacking case in May 2013, but says the bureau never interviewed her or even notified her of the probe. Attkisson resigned from CBS last March after complaining that she was increasingly unable to get her investigative stories on the air. She has published a best-selling book, 'Stonewalled,' about her battles against the network and the administration as she investigated stories on such subjects as Benghazi, Fast and Furious and ObamaCare." White House press secretary Josh Earnest criticizes the selection of Congressman Steve Scalise (R-LA) as House Majority Whip. Earnest says, "Who they choose to serve in the leadership says a lot about who they are. There's no arguing that who Republicans decide to elevate to a leadership position says a lot about what the conference's priorities and values are." (Earnest does not comment on what Obama's reliance on race-baiter and extortionist Al Sharpton as his "racial tensions czar" says about Obama.) [69873]

The House will likely act to quickly approve the "Hire More Heroes Act" (which will benefit military veterans), the "Save American Workers Act" (which would change the ObamaCare work week from 30 to 40 hours so that employers are not forced to reduce working hours to fewer than 30 in order to avoid ObamaCare penalties), and legislation to approve construction of the Keystone XL pipeline. White House press secretary Josh Earnest tells reporters Barack "eager to work with the new Congress" Obama will not sign Keystone XL pipeline legislation. New Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) States, "[Obama] threatening to veto the first bipartisan infrastructure bill of the new Congress must come as a shock to the American people who spoke loudly in November in favor of bipartisan accomplishments." House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) says, "After years of manufacturing every possible excuse, today ...Obama was finally straight ...about where he truly stands. Charbonnier has stated, "I'd rather die standing than live on my knees." Regrettably, even a police bodyguard was unable to stop Muslims from killing him.) Author Frederick William Dame explains the satirical publication's name: "Charlie is an endearment form of Charles, which means strong and manly. The title Charlie Hebdo is a French play on words with the expression Charia Hebdo, which means Sharia Weekly." (Islam is the most violent religion in the world, but its apologists in the Obama

administration continue to refer to it as peaceful.) Asked by Chris Cuomo if the Paris killings are an act of terrorism (as if they are anything else), Earnest replies, "Uh, well, I, you know, I, I, based on what we know right now it does seem like that's what, uh, what we're confronting here, and, uh, this is an act of violence that we would, that we certainly do condemn and, and, uh, you know, if, if based on this investigation, it turns out to be, uh, an act of terrorism, we would condemn it with the strongest possible terms, too." Earnest tells MSNBC the White House is waiting to see what the "motivation" of the killers was—as if their screaming "allahu akbar" is not a clue—and repeats the administration line that Islam is "a peaceful religion." The White House remains unwilling to identify Islam as the problem, and continues to dance around the issue as though every act of terrorism has nothing to do with the radical ideology of that religion.) Obama issues a written statement that makes no mention of Islam: "I strongly condemn the horrific shooting at the offices of Charlie Hebdo magazine in Paris that has reportedly killed 12 people. Our thoughts and prayers are with the victims of this terrorist attack and the people of France at this difficult time. France is America's oldest ally, and has stood shoulder to shoulder with the United States in the fight against terrorists who threaten our shared security and the world. Time and again, the French people have stood up for the universal values that generations of our people have defended. France, and the great city of Paris where this outrageous attack took place, offer the world a timeless example that will endure well beyond the hateful vision of these killers. We are in touch with French officials and I have directed my Administration to provide any assistance needed to help bring these terrorists to justice." (Why it matters that France is "America's oldest ally" is not clear. One would hope that the U.S. government would offer words of support to any nation that suffers an attack by radical Islamists.) Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich reminds readers of Obama's 2012 statement at the United Nations: "The future must not belong to those who slander the prophet of Islam." In September 2012, then-White House press secretary Jay Carney criticized Charlie Hebdo for publishing cartoons featuring an image of the Islamic prophet Mohammed. He called the images "deeply offensive to many" and said they "have the potential to be inflammatory. ...[O]byiously, we have questions about the judgment of publishing something like this. In other words, we don't question the right of something like this to be published; we just question the judgment behind the decision to publish it." [69892, 69946, 69957, 69996, 70018, 70102]

In totally emotion-less spoken remarks, Obama says, "I've reached out to President Hollande of France and, uh, hope to have the opportunity to talk to him today, because I thought it was appropriate for me ta [sic; to] express my deepest sympathies, uh, to the people of Paris and the people of France for the terrible terrorist attack that took place, uh, earlier today. I think that all of us, uh, that France is one of our oldest allies, uh, our strongest allies; they have been, uh, with us at every moment, when we, uh, from 9/11 on, uh, in dealing with, uh, some of the terrorist organizations around the world that threaten us. For us to see the kind of cowardly, uh, evil attacks that took place today, uh, I think, uh, reinforces, uh, once again why it's important for us to stand in solidarity with them just as they stand in solidarity with us. Uh, the fact that his was an attack, uh, on journalists, an attack on our free press, also underscores the degree to which, uh, these terrorists fear freedom of speech, and freedom of the press, uh, but the one thing that I'm very confidant about is that, uh, the values that we share with the French people, uh, a belief, a universal belief in freedom of expression, uh, is something that, uh, can't be, uh, silenced because if the senseless violence, uh, of a few." (Pamela Geller posts a video in which Obama *does* show emotion and outrage—not at a terrorist action, but over his disgust at Americans who oppose his efforts to impose more gun controls.) [69914, 69946]

NYDailyNews.com posts a 2011 photograph of slain editor and cartoonist Stephane Charbonnier holding up a cartoon—but pixilates the image so as not to offend Muslims. (Pamela Geller points out that the *New York Daily News* "has long shilled for jihadists." Jihad Watch's Robert Spencer writes, "Do these fools at the Daily News think that they will be spared? Do they think that if they adopt Sharia blasphemy laws forbidding mockery or criticism of Muhammad, that they will avoid the jihad onslaught? And if they adopt Sharia restrictions on freedom of expression of their own accord, does it even matter if they are spared? The free press is dying of a self-inflicted wound. Now is the time for every newspaper in the world to republish Charlie Hebdo's cartoons of Muhammad, in solidarity with the jihad murder victims and as a show of defiance—a signal that we will protect free speech and free societies. But this will not happen. Instead, watch for more pusillanimity, more temporizing, more denial that this had anything to do with Islam, and more calls for 'respect' for 'religious sensibilities'—i.e., the placement of Islam in a protected category, above criticism.") In Muslim-intimidated Great Britain, *The Telegraph* warns, "France faces rising tide of Islamophobia." (Dead French journalists apparently do not bother *The Telegraph*; it worries that someone might give a Muslim customer a dirty look while buying croissants at the local boulangerie.) In what will likely be one of the greatest understatements of the year, Whitehall editor Holly Watt writes, "The attacks were seen as a symptom of serious problems in French society, which has a large immigrant population from former French colonies including Algeria." [69925, 69955, 69976, 69979]

The Telegraph also uses the headline, "Charlie Hebdo attacks: Anti-Islam [political] parties are now on the march across Europe." Robert Spencer writes at JihadWatch.org, "You might think that in the wake of an Islamic jihad attack that murdered twelve journalists and jihad attacks becoming ever more frequent in Europe, the Telegraph might find room for a piece headlined, 'Islamic jihadists on the march across Europe.' But no, instead the focus is on 'anti-Islam parties.' Did 'anti-Islam parties' shoot up the Charlie

Hebdo offices? Subjugated Britannia is an absurd place with a 'free press' so cowed and submissive to Islam that it puts Al Jazeera to shame. Britain is a clown circus; some enterprising entrepreneur (from, say, Dubai) should just put a fence around it and charge admission." [69976]

The New York Times writes, "The sophisticated, military-style strike Wednesday on a French newspaper known for satirizing Islam staggered a continent already seething with anti-immigrant sentiments in some quarters, feeding far-right nationalist parties like France's National Front." (The *Times*, like *The Telegraph*, is worried about a "backlash" against Muslims. It is the *Times* and the *Telegraph* that are the real "Islamophobes." They so fear Muslims that they will publish whatever nonsense is necessary to curry favor with them and avoid offending them. The *Times* fears the National Front party—as if its members are modern-day Nazis. They are not. They merely want France to be *France* not Algeria.) French Muslim Arnaud N'Goma complains, "Some people when they think terrorism, think Muslims." Samir Elatrassi adds, "Islamophobia is going to increase more and more. When some people see these kinds of terrorists, they conflate them with other Muslims, and it's the extreme right that's going to benefit from this." (It apparently has not occurred to N'Goma and Elatrassi that there are reasons why people equate terrorism with Muslims.) [69939, 70041]

The *Times* also writes, "What We Know: Twelve people were killed. Three gunmen were said to be involved. They escaped by car and remained at large. French officials raised the national terror alert to its highest level. What We Don't Know: The identities of the individuals or groups responsible for the attack. All of the victims' identities, said to include police officers, editors and cartoonists. The reason Charlie Hebdo was targeted, though its provocative fare has angered Islamic extremist groups in the past." (The *Times* may want to hire some new writers if their current ones cannot figure out why the magazine staff was targeted.) [69971, 69972]

National Front leader Marine Le Pen correctly blames the Paris killings on Islamic radicals, stating, "Time's up for denial and hypocrisy. The absolute rejection of Islamic fundamentalism must be proclaimed loudly and clearly." DailyCaller.com notes *Bloomberg Businessweek's* Islamophobic headline: "Le Pen plays Islamist card linking attacks to immigration." (Some might winder if, after the murder of actress Sharon Tate and several others by the crazed followers of Charles Manson, Bloomberg wrote, "Los Angeles police play cult card.") [69999, 70000]

The Associated Press states that it will not publish cartoons of "the Prophet Muhammad" because "It's been our policy for years that we refrain from moving deliberately provocative images." (This would be the same Associated Press that posted a photograph of Andres Serrano's "artwork" called "Piss Christ," which consisted of Christ on the cross in a bottle of urine. Examiner.com points out that in 1999 *The New York Times* published an image of Chris Ofili's "The Holy Virgin Mary," a painting of the Virgin Mary smeared with elephant dung and with images of genitalia prominently displayed in the background. The Associated Press and the *Times* did not mind offending Christians—because they know that offending *them* would not out their lives in danger. But they fear

negative reactions from Muslim readers and therefore treat them with kid gloves. It is the mainstream media that is Islamophobic.) [69936, 69945, 69969, 70060, 70061]

Meanwhile, Islamic organizations call for increased security at mosques and more "interfaith dialogue"—as if Muslims were the targets in the Paris attack. [69954, 69955]

Aiman A. Mazyek, speaker of the Central Committee of Muslims in Germany, claims the Parisian assassins have nothing to do with Islam, a friendly and tolerant religion. Another Muslim apologist appears on German television to claim that the killers may have shouted "The Prophet has been avenged!" and "Allahu akbar!" only to improperly direct attention toward Islam. Others claim the real danger are the nationalist groups in France (the National Front) and Germany (PEGIDA, or Patriotic Europeans Against the Islamization of the West), which (for good reason) oppose the Islamization of Europe. (The award for the "best defense" of Islamist jihad remains firmly in the hands of CNN apologist Marc Lamont Hill, who once said, "People behead for all sorts of reasons.") Germany's Interior Minister, Thomas de Maiziere, states, "We have no indication for similar attack plans in Germany or concrete evidence of terrorist motivated attacks in general in Germany. The situation is serious. There is reason for concern and as a precaution, but not to panic. ... The extremist Islamism, Islamist terrorism, is something quite different from the ['normal'] Islam. And this differentiation is urgently needed just on a day like today." (He stops short of suggesting that "moderate" Muslims wear a "scarlet M" on their clothing, while the Jihadists wear "J" armbands.) [69963]

Variety whines, "The Charlie Hebdo carnage will likely fuel the racism and anti-Islam sentiment which has been on the rise in France. It will also certainly boost the popularity of far-right (Front national) party leader Marine Le Pen, who is expected to run for President in 2017." (Yes, the carnage likely will fuel anti-Islam sentiment, just as the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1942 fueled anti-Hirohito sentiment and Germany's bombing of London fueled anti-Hitler sentiment.) The Catholic League's Bill Donahue condemns Charlie Hebdo for publishing articles and cartoons that offend Muslims: "Those who work at this newspaper have a long and disgusting record of going way beyond the mere lampooning of public figures, and this is especially true of their depictions of religious figures. For example, they have shown nuns masturbating and popes wearing condoms. They have also shown Muhammad in pornographic poses. While some Muslims today object to any depiction of the Prophet, others do not. Moreover, visual representations of him are not proscribed by the Koran. What unites Muslims in their anger against Charlie Hebdo is the vulgar manner in which Muhammad has been portrayed. What they object to is being intentionally insulted over the course of many years. On this aspect, I am in total agreement with them. Stephane Charbonnier, the paper's publisher, was killed today in the slaughter. It is too bad that he didn't understand the role he played in his tragic death. In 2012, when asked why he insults Muslims, he said, 'Muhammad isn't sacred to me, either, but it would

never occur to me to deliberately insult Muslims by trashing him." (Whether Donahue is ignorant or simply frightened to death of Muslims is not clear.) [70096, 70097]

Pamela Geller notes the monumental hypocrisy of *The Washington Post* in its criticism of Fox News for not showing any of the anti-Mohammed *Charlie Hebdo* cartoons and "attempt[ing] an explanation of what may have prompted these killings without showing what may have prompted these killings." The *Post* has also not shown any of the cartoons. Nor have CNN, MSNBC, ABC, or NBC. [69947, 69967, 70009]

On MSNBC, FirstLook.org's Eric Bates tells Alex Wagner, "This isn't just Islamic extremism. If you go back to the 80s, and if you're in the Reagan administration, when Jerry Farwell sued... Hustler magazine for portraying him having, uh, I believe it was drunken incest with his mother in an outhouse, uh, uh, again in a visual form, and won a \$150,000 court case against *Hustler* for that, there was [sic; that was] overturned by the Supreme Court, I think eight to zero, um, so, you know, religious fundamentalists of all stripes and of all nationalities have this penchant to say, 'We wanna [sic; want to] be able to tell you what you can and can't portray." The comparison is absurd-as is the dimwitted Alex Wagner's response: "And yet, Islam is, because of the age of terror in which we live, occupies, is a third rail, in a way, that you can show, sort of, blasphemous photos or drawings-not photos, but drawings of the Pope. Charlie Hebdo was an equalopportunity slanderer or satirist, whatever you want to call it, in terms of religion. And yet, we focus very specifically on Islam, because it is much more incendiary and much more controversial to talk about." (We focus on Islam because it is Muslims, not Christians or Jews or Buddhists or Sikhs, who persecute and savagely murder those who refuse to accept their ideology.) Robert Spencer writes, "This appallingly risible analysis [by Eric Bates] is the mainstream. If you point out that suing someone for libel is quite different from massacring someone, you're just a racist, bigoted Islamophobe." Falwell, of course, did not storm *Hustler* magazine and blow anyone's brains out. He merely filed a lawsuit charging slander—which failed because the court found that the contemptible *Hustler* article was of a nature that reasonable people would consider parody. Further, Mohammed has been dead for about 1,400 years; the likelihood of him showing up to file a slander lawsuit is minimal. The MSNBC guest's reference to the Reagan administration and fundamentalists is clearly intended to suggest that conservatives and Christians are intolerant.) [69937, 69938, 69968, 70021, 70022]

Also on MSNBC, NBC "terror analyst" Evan Kohlmann says, "I think we need to understand here, there, there has to be the ability for people to be critical of other religions, of other ideas and whatnot. There has to be that ability. At the same time, look, we have to also respect Islam and we should not deliberately go out and poke our fingers in other people's eyes, you know? It, there is—everyone should have the right to critique Islam, but at least we should do it with some sense of respect so that people don't get the idea that this is Islamophobia, that it's racism, that this is the exact same kind of critique or analysis that we would apply to Judaism, Christianity, Hinduism, any other philosophy out there, that, look, it's worthy of critique and debate." [69964, 69965] Former Vermont governor Howard Dean makes the ridiculous statement, "You know, this is a chronic problem, uh, I stopped calling these people Muslim terrorists. They're about as Muslim as I am. I mean, they have no respect for anybody else's life, that's not what the Quran says. And, you know, Europe has an enormous radical problem. I think ISIS is a cult. Not an Islamic cult. I think it's a cult..." (Dean is not asked what kind of cult it is.) [69970, 69980, 69986, 70014]

Kohlmann is incorrect. There is no law (at least not yet in the United States) that says one must "respect Islam." People are free to not respect that ideology, just as people are free to not respect Nazism or communism or socialism—or any other ideology. Free speech includes the right to not respect other people's beliefs, as long as one does not engage in illegal actions against those other people. (One is not only free to not respect abortionists; one is free to hate abortionists; but one is not free to murder an abortionist or burn down his abortion facility.) Further, disrespect of Islam cannot be "racism" any more than hatred of Catholics can be "racism." Islam is a religion and ideology; it is not a race. Following Kohlmann's guidelines, atheists would not be free to ridicule anyone who believe in a God. That would not be free speech; that would be an abrogation of free speech. Jihad Watch's Robert Spencer writes, "[I]n reality Leftists and Islamic supremacists such as the Hamas-linked Council on American-Islamic Relations condemn all criticism of Islam and opposition to jihad terror as 'Islamophobia,' and have never identified criticism of Islam they deemed legitimate. In reality, the charges of 'Islamophobia' and 'racism' are tools used to intimidate people into thinking it wrong to oppose jihad terror and Islamic supremacism." (Additionally, a phobia is generally defined as an irrational fear of something. Fear of radical Islam is arguably not irrational; there is a mountain of evidence to support those fears.) Reuters tweets, "Police searching for two brothers from Paris region, other man from Reims area linked to attack on satirical weekly: police source." [69912, 69913]

NBC incorrectly reports, "Paris Attack Suspect Dead, Two in Custody, U.S. Officials Say." (NBC later tells TheBlaze.com, "NBC News issued an earlier report based on intelligence from two consistently reliable U.S. counterterrorism officials in different government agencies. As soon as it became evident that our sources doubted their information, we immediately updated our reporting across all platforms and continue to do so as this fast-moving story unfolds.") [69948, 69966, 70002, 70010]

Around the world and across the Internet, Muslims celebrate the killings in Paris and praise the assassins. They write, "[This] is news that quenches the thirst for revenge. By Allah, beloved ones, let us not think lightly of prayers. By Allah, they [the attackers] are soldiers of Allah." "France was [once] part of the land of Islam and will return to be the land of Islam, in spite the worshippers of the Cross." "Congratulations to France and to its people for reaping what their hands sowed. Did these evil cartoonists think that we were a nation that would remain silent in face of those who insult our Prophet...? Did [French President Francois] Hollande and the governments that preceded him think that their interventions and despotism in the lands of the Muslims would not be met with

retribution? No, by Allah, from now on the youths of Islam will no longer remain silent, especially since we have a state [ISIS] to mobilize armies if anybody insults the nation of Islam." "Paris Is Burning. Oh Allah slaughter them, Allah attack them. This newspaper insulted the Messenger of Allah and Islam." "France turned the lands of the Muslims into battlefields, and now the Muslims have turned Paris into a battlefield. Allah akbar." "Oh Allah, the honor of your prophet has been cleansed." "They were lone wolves [smiley] haha. A go-pro 'camera' on their AK47s, walking to Charlie Hebdo, that would be nice." "This is the status and punishment in Islam for those who insult Allah and his messenger." "Die in your rage... Haha, the next one is the president, Inshallah ["Allah willing"]... Brothers, fire up the volcanoes of Jihad, go forth to paradise that is as wide as the heavens and the earth. Allah's victory is close! The hearts of the infidels are trembling, Allah be praised! As for the news about the brothers [who carried out the attack], may Allah grant them the highest of ranks! Pray for them!" [69949]

At Vox.com, leftist Ezra Klein joins the chorus of Islamist apologists, writing, "[T]his isn't about Charlie Hebdo's cartoons, any more than a rape is about what the victim is wearing, or a murder is about where the victim was walking. What happened today, according to current reports, is that two men went on a killing spree. Their killing spree, like most killing sprees, will have some thin rationale. Even the worst villains believe themselves to be heroes. But in truth, it was unprovoked slaughter. The fault lies with no one but them and their accomplices. Their crime isn't explained by cartoons or religion. Plenty of people read Charlie Hebdo's cartoons and managed to avoid responding with mass murder. Plenty of people follow all sorts of religions and somehow get through the day without racking up a body count. The answers to what happened today won't be found in Charlie Hebdo's pages. They can only be found in the murderers' sick minds. ...But we shouldn't buy into the bullshit narrative of a few madmen that their murders were a response to some cartoons. ...This is a tragedy. It is a crime. It is not a statement, or a controversy." [70015, 70016]

It is worth mentioning Pakistani-American Muzzammil Syed Hassan, the co-founder (with his wife Aasiya Zubair), owner, and CEO of Bridges TV, the first American Muslim television network broadcast in English. Hassan intended to report the "countless stories of Muslim tolerance, progress, diversity, service and excellence" in order to counteract what he and his wife believed were extreme stereotypical images of Muslims in the media. In 2009 Hassan was arrested and charged with stabbing and beheading his wife after she filed for divorce. [70087, 70088]

WashingtonTimes.com reports, "French police officials say they have identified three men as suspects in a deadly attack against newspaper offices that killed 12 people and shook the nation. Two officials named the suspects as Frenchmen Said Kouachi and Cherif Kouachi, in their early 30s, as well as 18-year-old Hamyd Mourad, whose nationality wasn't immediately clear. One of the officials said they were linked to a Yemeni terrorist network. The officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they weren't authorized to publicly discuss the sensitive and ongoing investigation. Cherif Kouachi was convicted in 2008 of terrorism charges for helping funnel fighters to Iraq's insurgency and sentenced to 18 months in prison. No arrests have been confirmed in the hunt for the attackers." [69941, 69942, 69943, 69944, 69948, 69953, 69973]

At the Place de République in Paris, tens of thousands of people gather to express their support for freedom of the press, chanting, "Nous sommes tous Charlie" ("We are all Charlie"). In Trafalgar Square, Londoners gather for a silent vigil for the murdered journalists and cartoonists. Crowds also gather in Brussels, Barcelona, and other European cities. [69934, 69935, 69940, 69950]

In Wayne, Michigan, Obama speaks at a temporarily closed Ford plant to tout the success of the auto industry bailout. Obama says, "The auto companies have now repaid taxpayers every dime and more of what my administration invested in you." (That is a lie. The taxpayers lost more than \$16 billion on the bailout scheme. WhiteHouseDossier.com explains Obama's deception: "First of all, you have to read the fine print. The clear impression Obama is seeking to convey is that the auto bailout was cost-free. But note he said 'what my administration invested.' He is purposely, and deceptively, not including the money [former President George W.] Bush handed the automakers. If you do that, there's [sic; there are] billions in losses. ...If Bush hadn't handed the auto companies the cash he did, Obama would not have been able to achieve his 'rescue.' Or, if the companies somehow survived without the Bush money until Obama was inaugurated, then Obama would have had to lend them the 'Bush money' that was lost.") [69897, 69920, 70007, 70071]

Federal Communications Commission chairman Tom Wheeler expresses support for Obama's "net neutrality" proposal that would permit the government to regulate the Internet as it does the telephone industry. According to NationalJournal.com, "Although Wheeler didn't explicitly commit to any details, he did speak favorably about Obama's position that the FCC should classify broadband Internet as a 'telecommunications service' under Title II of the Communications Act. He also argued that the rules should apply to Internet service on cell phones. ...Wheeler said he plans to put the regulations up for a vote by the five FCC commissioners on Feb. 26." [70006]

According to a study of employer-provided health benefits by the Commonwealth Fund, ObamaCare has not resulted in lower costs for workers and their families. The *Chicago Tribune* writes, "Nationwide, the average contribution an employee made to an insurance premium in 2013 and the average deductible together represented 9.6% of the median income of American households with members under age 65. That is up from 8.4% in 2010 and nearly double the 5.3% that households were paying for employer-provided health coverage in 2003." [70069]

The Environmental Protection Agency announces it will postpone until mid-summer a final "global warming" rule related to carbon dioxide emissions from coal-fired power plants. FuelFix.com notes that Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) has vowed to overturn the emissions rules. He tried in January 2014 when Democrats controlled the chamber. But Congress' investigative arm said he would have to wait for a final rule. That rule will lock in a transition to cleaner energy that's already underway.

The proposed rule was announced in September 2013, but not published until January 2014. Republicans charged the [post-election] delay was political." Senator James Inhofe (R-UT), who will now chair the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee, tells DailyCaller.com, "If you talk to people in the real world they'll tell you that EPA regulations are so onerous they can't be competitive. ...Obama is trying to do the things he couldn't do through legislation through regulation. ...We're gonna [sic] be able to use the CRA." (The Congressional Rules Act allows Congress to vote down some agency rules before they go into effect.) [69997, 69998]

Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) tells radio talk show host Hugh Hewitt, "I think [Obama] is undercutting the president of Egypt [Abdel Fattah al-Sisi, who called for reform of Islam]. We're in a religious war. These are not terrorists. They're radical Islamists who are trying to replace our way of life with their way of life. Their way of life is motivated by religious teachings that require me and you to be killed, or enslaved, or converted. [Obama] tip-toes around the threats we face, and he is trying to diminish the religious aspect of this war. Why? I don't know. And he is not engaging the enemy in an aggressive fashion, which makes it more likely we'll get attacked. What he's doing is pretending to want to destroy ISIL when in fact, he's trying to get out of office without having to commit American ground forces to do the job as part of a team in the region, because he made a campaign promise. His campaign promises, Hugh, are getting a lot of people killed." [70019]

On *On the Record*, former U.S. ambassador to the United Nations John Bolton says, "This was a military style attack on innocent civilians in the capital city of a major Western country. This is a big, big event. If it can happen in Paris, it can happen in Washington or New York, you can count on it. ...Unless [Obama] understands that Western civilization is under attack here and responds accordingly, we will simply see this tragedy repeated endlessly." [70005]

On *The Kelly File*, author Mark Steyn comments, "I see these candlelight vigils and everyone claiming suddenly to be for freedom of speech. I think one consequence of this is that a lot of people will retreat even further into self-censorship. The *New York Daily News* won't even show [the *Charlie Hebdo* cartoons], dishonors the dead in Paris by not even showing properly the cartoons. They pixilated Mohammed out of it so it looks like Mohammed has entered the witness protection program but they left the hooked-nose Jew in and that exactly gets to the double standard here. You can say anything you like about Christianity, you can say anything you like about Judaism. But these guys, everyone understands the message that if you say anything about Islam, these guys will kill you. We will be retreating into a lot more self-censorship if the pansified Western media doesn't man up and decide to disperse the risk so they can't kill one small, little French satirical magazine. Late in the evening, ABC reports that the youngest suspect in the Paris killings, 18-yearold Hamyd Mourad, has turned himself in to the police. Mourad allegedly drove the getaway car. (Mourad claims he has an iron-clad alibi. Some suggest there are enough inconsistencies in reports of the Paris killings to indicate a "false flag" operation.) [69981, 70307, 70434, 70437, 70438]

Appearing on Jimmy Kimmel's late-night television program, comedian Bill Maher says, "This [mass killing in Paris] was really big shit. ...And we have to not avoid who did this. ...No it's not a 'presume.' No, no, it's Muslim terrorists. ...This happens way too frequently. It's like Groundhog Day except if the groundhog kept getting his head cut off. ...These guys [the *Charlie Hebdo* writers and cartoonists] had the balls of the Eiffel Tower. ...I'm the liberal in this debate, okay. I'm for free speech. To be a liberal, you have to stand up for liberal principles. It's not my fault that the part of the world that is most against liberal principles is the Muslim part of the world. ...We have to stop saying, when something like this that happened in Paris today, we have to stop saying, 'Well, we cannot insult a great religion.' First of all, there are no great religions, they're all stupid and dangerous. And we should insult them. You should be able to insult whatever you want. That is what free speech is like. ...Hundreds of millions of [Muslims] support an attack like this, they applaud an attack like this. What they say is, 'We don't approve of violence, but you know what? When you make fun of the Prophet, all bets are off.''' [70011, 70037]

On January 8 David Rothkopf, CEO and editor of The FP Group, which publishes Foreign Policy magazine, appears on MSNBC's Morning Joe. The Media Research Center reports, Rothkopf "warned against European authorities being too aggressive in fighting Islamic terrorism following the brutal attack in Paris: 'I think we have to be just as worried about the reaction to the attack from nationalists, from right-wingers, from people who have sought to drive this wedge... between the Islamic communities and the mainstream communities in Europe... it's very important that we recognize the value of restraint in response to these things.' The majority of scholars and the faithful say Islam is no more inherently violent than other religions. But some Muslims—most notably the president of Egypt argue that the contemporary understanding of their religion is infected with justifications for violence, requiring the government and its official clerics to correct the teaching of Islam. ...Only a very small number of Muslims pin the blame directly on the religion itself." Kirkpatrick quotes M. Steven Fish, a political scientist at the University of California, Berkeley: "Is Islam violent? I would say absolutely not. There is very little empirical evidence that Islam is violent." (We are supposed to believe that Islam is not violent because "scholars," "the faithful," and a Berkeley professor say so. Kirkpatrick should perhaps have interviewed some victims of Islamist terrorists a few moments before they were beheaded. The statement that few Muslims blame their own religion is tantamount to saying, "Few of the people incarcerated in U.S. prisons think they did anything to warrant their being there.") [70258]

At NYTimes.com, Dr. Ezekiel Emanuel (one of the architects of ObamaCare and the brother of Obama's former chief of staff Rahm Emanuel) writes, "Not having my annual physical is one small way I can help reduce health care costs—and save myself time, worry and a worthless exam. ...From a health perspective, the annual physical exam is basically worthless." At Spectator.org David Catron later responds to Emanuel's *Times* article: "If annual physicals are worthless, why did Dr. Emanuel and his accomplices build them into [ObamaCare]? Townhall.com's Guy Benson writes, "One thing is assured: Boxer's formal announcement touches off a frenetic contest among ambitious California Democrats—including, perhaps, billionaire [global-warming leftist scaremonger] Tom Steyer, who is said to be eyeing the seat. Between ... Obama's long-delayed veto threat on the Keystone Pipeline (an outcome for which Steyer has invested heavily) and Boxer's decision, the deep-pocketed power player must be enjoying his week. Before the day is out, Politico.com mentions several possible successors for Boxer: former Los Angeles Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa, billionaire hedge-fund manager, environmental activist Tom Steyer, former San Francisco mayor and current Lieutenant Governor Gavin Newsom, and Attorney General Kamala Harris. (In 2004, former San Francisco Mayor Willie Brown hosted a fundraiser for Obama at the Waterfront restaurant. Obama told Brown he would appreciate it if he did not have to have his picture taken with then-mayor Newsom—presumably to avoid an association with Newsom's support of gay marriages. Newsom was outraged by the insult and Obama's cowardice. The far-left Harris has been called "the darling of the Obama activist base of the party." The Associated Press reports, "A small group of veterans were among an eclectic collection of Obama protesters and supporters across from Central High School. ... Vietnam-era veteran Jesus Miramon was wearing his old U.S. Army dress uniform and holding a sign saying 'do not hate vets today' as he waited for Obama to arrive. (Other media outlets repeat the *Times* version. Reasonable people, of course, would be inclined to trust the report by the French media that was on the scene and spoke with Ms. Vinson.) Writer Gavin McInnes writes, "I get why journalists are scared of offending Muslims. I just don't get why they're journalists." [69995]

AFP reports, "French investigators found a dozen Molotov cocktails and two jihadist flags in the getaway car used in the massacre at a Paris magazine, a source close to the case told AFP Thursday. ... The jihadist flags and gas bombs were found in the abandoned black Citroen used by the attackers to speed away from the offices of the Charlie Hebdo weekly after they carried out the assault. 'This shows their Islamist radicalization and that they had possibly planned other acts with the petrol bombs,' the source said." [70036]

DailyCaller.com comments on the story: "So, imagine yourself as an NYT editor for a moment, if you can withstand the nausea. At Morning Jolt, NationalReviews.com's Jim Geraghty asks, "Which of these represents incitement to violence?

A) Making a film depicting the violent death of the ruler of North Korea, Kim Jong-un.B) Telling an angry crowd the night of the Ferguson grand jury decision, 'Burn this b*tch down!'

C) Chanting, 'What do we want? Dead cops! When do we want it [sic]? Now!'

D) Making cartoons that offend Muslims.

As you no doubt have observed, some Americans on the left would pick (A) and (D), but not (B) and (C). I can see the case for B and C, but I would be pretty wary about prosecuting individuals in either case. If our society is going to bring the force of the law against a person, and either fine them or put them in jail, there has to be a pretty direct connection between their words and the violence that ensued. A certain segment of Muslims in France—and in just about every Western country—is attempting to implement blasphemy laws through vigilantism. Sure, there's no law on the books saying you can't do it, but if anybody catches you doing it, some young man—with seemingly nothing in this world he fears losing if he's caught or killed attempting to commit murder—will come and find you and attack you."

While Islamists kill innocent people in Paris, Islamist terrorism continues in Nigeria. NBCNews.com reports, "More than 2,000 people are unaccounted for after radical Islamist sect Boko Haram torched more than 10 towns and villages in Nigeria, a local lawmaker told NBC News. Ahmed Zanna, a senator for Borno state where the attack happened, said the militants razed the town of Baga as well as '10-to-20' other communities in the country's rural northeast over the past five days. 'These towns are just gone, burned down,' he told NBC News via telephone. 'The whole area is covered in bodies.' ...Nigeria will hold general elections on February 14, a ballot many expect Boko Haram will attempt to disrupt. The group, whose name roughly translates to 'Western education is sinful,' has slaughtered and kidnapped thousands and wants to establish a state in northern Nigeria based on strict Islamic law." At the Columbus, Ohio airport, 41-year-old Hashim Hanif Ibn Abdul-Rasheed parks illegally, attempts to buy a ticket using a woman's ID card, lunges at police officers with a knife and is then shot and killed by the officers. According to NYDailyNews.com, "When cops searched Abdul-Rasheed's body, they discovered 'additional knives.' Police called in a bomb squad to investigate the car and a search turned up 'suspicious items,' officials said." [70040]

In Montevideo, Uruguay, employees at the Israeli embassy are evacuated after a bomblike device is found in the area. According to JPost.com, "Security forces later said the suspicious apparatus did not have explosive capabilities and could not have detonated. Explosives Brigade chief Alfredo Larramendi told local paper *El País* that the device was apparently planted in order to 'measure' police response times." It is worth noting that in early December, six terrorists were released from the detainee center at Guantanamo and sent to... Uruguay. Uruguay's president, Jose Mujica, is himself a former terrorist with a prison record (as is Brazil's president, Dilma Rousseff). At NYTimes.com David Brooks writes, "The journalists at Charlie Hebdo are now rightly being celebrated as martyrs on behalf of freedom of expression, but let's face it: If they had tried to publish their satirical newspaper on any American university campus over the last two decades it wouldn't have lasted 30 seconds. Student and faculty groups would have accused them of hate speech. The administration would have cut financing and shut them down. Public reaction to the attack in Paris has revealed that there are a lot of people who are quick to lionize those who offend the views of Islamist terrorists in France but who are a lot less tolerant toward those who offend their own views at home. ...Americans may laud Charlie Hebdo for being brave enough to publish cartoons ridiculing the Prophet Muhammad, but, if Ayaan Hirsi Ali is invited to campus, there are often calls to deny her a podium. ...The massacre at Charlie Hebdo should be an occasion to end speech codes. And there were reports in the French press today that three mosques may have been targeted in some way, three mosques in France... it's really going to be incumbent upon French and world leaders and European leaders, where immigration and the Muslim population has been under fire." Mitchell then moans to Time magazine's Vivienne Walt, "What about anger and profiling? Because there's a report of three mosques that have been-have come under attack and some sort of retaliatory aspects of this and profiling against Muslims." She follows the same line with New York Times columnist Nicholas Kristof: "Let's talk about how Muslims in France and around western Europe have been under fire. There are reports of actions against mosques, three mosques around France today." (To Mitchell, an investigation of three mosques which are suspected of fomenting radicalism and terrorist attacks is placing them "under attack.") Democrats launch their first filibuster against the Republican-controlled Senate, objecting to a Keystone XL pipeline action. According to WashingtonTimes.com, "Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell [R-KY] tried to schedule action early next week on the bill, and promised an open process, including allowing both sides to offer amendments to the bill—an attempt to break with the previous few years, when Democrats controlled the floor and kept a tight lid on amendments. But Democrats objected to Mr. McConnell's request, forcing him to begin the procedure for breaking a filibuster. ...The proceedings represented a role-reversal from the last Congress, when Democrats tried to push bills to the floor only to face a GOP filibuster. In many of those cases, however, Republicans said they were filibustering because Democrats... blocked out all amendments. Not satisfied with having alienated the entire New York City Police Department, Mayor Bill de Blasio goes after restaurants and food vendors by announcing a ban on Styrofoam food containers, effective July 1. Plastic "peanuts" for use in packing will also be included in the ban. He states, "These products cause real environmental harm and have no place in New York City. We have better options, better alternatives, and if more cities across the country follow our lead and institute similar bans, those alternatives will soon become more plentiful and will cost less." NYPost.com reports, "Hillary Clinton is 'furious' at husband Bill Clinton, according to Washington insiders, after his name came up in the latest sex scandal involving his disgraced former pal Jeffrey Epstein. Sources at the funeral of Mario Cuomo also said they saw a peevish-looking Hillary angrily 'storm' past the former president after he dutifully waited for her by the door of St. Ignatius Loyola Church. 'Talk in Washington is that Hillary is furious with Bill about all this new information on Jeffrey Epstein,' said a DC insider familiar with both Epstein and the Clintons." [70079]

DailyCaller.com reports, "The National Education Association is heavily involved in supporting a militant group in Wisconsin that spends its time and energy organizing angry anti-police protests. ...Wisconsin Jobs Now has variously declared that the state's police officers are racists, killers and animals, according to EAGnews. The NEA is a major financial donors for Wisconsin Jobs Now. The teachers union—the largest in the United States—gave \$125,000 to Wisconsin Jobs Now in 2014 alone. The other major contributor to the radical group is the Service Employees International Union." [70084]

Several hundred people gather in Santa Barbara, California to protest the *Santa Barbara News-Press* headline, "Illegals line up for driver's licenses." Don Katich, *News-Press* director of news operations, tells Noozhawk.com, "it has been the practice for nearly 10 years at the Santa Barbara News-Press to describe people living in this country illegally as 'illegals' regardless of their country of origin." Noozhawk reports that the newspaper was targeted by vandals who spray-painted the words, "The border is illegal not the people who cross it," and "fight back." (For the record, defacing private property is also illegal.) [70163, 70354]

On January 9 Dr. Qanta Ahmed, author (*In the Land of Invisible Women*) and women 's rights activist, appears on *Fox & Friends*. She says, "Really, I think that we are very behind the ball game with our war against Islamism. It's time for the United States, western democracies, Britain, France to admit that we are under siege by an ideology called Islamism. All Islamists are Muslim... that's very important. All Islamists are Muslim, I'm a Muslim to tell you that, so this ideology is emerging from Muslims but is a hijacking of our beliefs into a totalitarian political ideology. They seek to flout secular democracy. The scenes of the photographs of *Charlie Hebdo*, the offices, look exactly like the scenes of classrooms in Peshawar. The war is on education, the war is on freedom of speech, and by not naming it in our country or in France as Islamism, we're enabling these kinds of actions. ...I wouldn't call them radicals. I would call them Muslim Islamists. They are absolutely Hell-bent on committing as much destruction as they can... motivated by Islamism and their distorted interpretation of the Quran." "...[I]f we don't name it, we are enabling Islamism, and that enabling is happening not just in dialogue, but right here in New York City where we have a powerful role in the United Nations. We have seen... criminalization of something called 'defamation of Islam' or 'Islamophobia.' That is a modern construct from 1970s' Iran; there are multiple resolutions now where criticizing something to do with Islam is criminalized. Charlie Hebdo's massacre occurred on that pretext. ...If we don't talk about it... this is becoming more powerful. ...Where is the [Winston] Churchill of our times? Churchill did not mince his words when confronting the darkest ideology that we know, in living memory, and we need that kind of speech and power coming from, not just from Western leaders, but also Muslim leaders. We need that desperately... Islamists thrive... if we're too careful to tread because we're afraid of Islamophobia. ...I do want to salute you as broadcasters for raising this issue. After *Charlie Hebdo* you realize you [at the Fox News Channel] are in the cross-hairs of Islamists. The bravest thing people can do at the moment is have networks and stations and dialogue like this. This is a very brave thing that you're all doing." [70053]

Terrorist brother Cherif Kouachi and Said Kouachi are killed at a printing plant northeast of Paris, where they were holding an employee hostage. The hostage is not injured, and the two assassins are shot and killed by police as they leave the building with guns blazing. Meanwhile, a Muslim in Paris takes hostages at a Kosher grocery store, demanding that the Kouachi brothers be set free. He kills at least four hostages, and is then killed by police. According to DailyCaller.com, "The attack at the grocery store, Hyper Cacher ('Super Kosher'), was linked to the fatal shooting of a policewoman Thursday morning. The store is in Porte de Vincennes, an east Paris suburb, while the Kouachi brothers fled to the town of Dammartin-en-Goële, about 20 miles from central Paris. ...The policewoman shooting and the grocery store siege are being gradually linked to one man, 32-year-old Ahmed [also reported as Amedy] Coulibaly, together with his 26-year-old girlfriend Hayat Boumedienne. (Boumedienne reportedly fled the site of the grocery store.) Coulibaly was friends with the Kouachi brothers, who have been described as lower-class 'slackers' before becoming radicalized, al-Qaida recruiters nearly a decade ago. The Kouachis' neighbors report having seen a 'cache of arms' in their apartment just months before they carried out the attack. U.S. officials confirmed late Thursday that Said Kouachi had not only sent al-Qaida fighters to Iraq, but trained with the group in Yemen. Unconfirmed reports from the bloodbath in which the attackers called themselves 'al-Qaida in Yemen,' then, are becoming increasingly credible." (Yemen is the nation Obama cited on September 10, 2012 as one of the places where he had "successfully" taken out "terrorists who threaten us." The *Daily Mail* reports, "As [grocery store] hostages broke free, an astonishing story emerged of how dozens had hidden in a walk-in freezer, cowering in minus three temperatures and praying they would not be found. ... Coulibay had warned he would kill all of his hostages if police launched an assault on the Kouachis. It is unclear if he had carried out his threat before police moved in. Both Cherif Kouachi and Coulibaly had spoken to journalists by phone earlier today. Kouachi knew he was talking to a journalist and the conversation was recorded. He said: 'I am a defender of the prophet. I was sent by Al Qaeda of Yemen. I'm financed by Imam Anwar al Awlaki...' ... In a separate phone call, Coulibaly confirmed that he was in contact with the Kouachis and that the attacks had been 'synchronised.' He said that he had swore allegiance to Islamic State in Iraq and had targeted the shop because 'it was Jewish.'" (Jews have been fleeing France for some time because of discrimination and attacks against them. French Journalist Stephen Pollard states, "Every single French Jew I know has either left or is actively working out how to leave. So, it's a fluke that the latest target is a kosher grocer, is it? What's going on in France—outrages that have been getting worse for years—put our antisemitism problems in perspective.") At the printing company, "A young graphic designer hid in a cardboard box as the Charlie Hebdo gunmen held a father-of-two hostage for eight hours, it has emerged. The Kouachi brothers were apparently unaware that Lilian Lepere, 27, was concealed in the print works in Dammartin-en-Goele texting the police vital information. ... He directly communicated with police for at least three hours and emerged unharmed after the dramatic end to the siege, according to police." [70031, 70035, 70130]

Pamela Geller reports, "During the reportage of jihad siege and slaughter in a Kosher supermarket, Muslim children can be seen cheering, giving the thumbs up and making machine gun-firing gestures behind an on scene reporter. On MSNBC, Washington Post columnist Eugene Robinson tells Andrea Mitchell, "Just to keep it in perspective, I don't think we should imagine that the conditions and the threat are exactly the same in the United States as they are in France. They are different. In fact, one thing that's different here is weapons are universally available and so, I mean, it is actually a very good thing that, that the tensions are not exactly the same because we would expect to have a lot more of that sort of carnage." (Robinson's comment is preposterous. If the Islamists in Paris had instead attempted an attack on an office in Dallas, Texas, they first would have encountered armed police officers in cars, not unarmed officers on bicycles. Had they somehow managed to get into a guarded newspaper office, they would very well have faced employees carrying guns-in their desks and purses if not in their pockets. The two terrorists might have killed one or two people, but they would not have killed a dozen. Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich reminds readers, "It was just a few months ago when Vaughan Foods CEO Mark Vaughan shot and killed Islamist Alton Nolen after he beheaded a female co-worker and was stabbing another in Oklahoma City." At Pellissippi State College in Tennessee, Obama proposes free attendance for two years at any community college if the student maintains a 2.5 grade-point average. Students are not amassing monumental amounts of debt because of community college; it is the four-year universities and colleges that have outrageously high tuition. Those tuition levels have increased dramatically precisely because the government has interfered in the system by lending students money they cannot afford to pay back, but which the schools eagerly accept. Additionally, students already have access to Pell Grants. (If the government wants better-educated students, it should demand that elementary schools and high schools do a better job. Obama is seeking to create a K-through-14 Marxist indoctrination system, funded by the taxpayers.) [70068]

Some of the motives behind Obama's community college scheme are relatively obvious: make Americans even more dependent on government, impose federal rules on

community colleges in order to increase the leftist indoctrination of students, attract the votes of those who want "something for nothing," give the federal government more control over the states, and create a campaign issue for use against "mean-spirited Republicans who would rather finance wars than education." But Obama may have another motive: reduce the number of military recruits. According to the Department of Labor, the economy created only 252,000 jobs in December, down from November's 321,000. The unemployment rate falls from 5.8 to 5.6 percent—once again because hundreds of thousands of Americans (about 273,000) dropped out of the workforce entirely and are no longer counted in the calculations. There are 8.7 million Americans who are "officially" unemployed. There are 92,898,000 working age Americans who are not working, which drops the labor participation rate to 62.7 percent, a 36-year low. (That is, only 62.7 percent of working age Americans are actually working.) A record 55,807,000 work age women are not in the labor force. [The 5.6 percent unemployment rate represents only those individuals.] If the active search for work was in the last year, but not in the last four weeks, the individual is considered a 'discouraged worker' by the BLS [and not counted in the U.3 measure]." The U.S. State Department issues a travel alert, warning about "the continuing threat of terrorist actions and violence against U.S. citizens and interests throughout the world. Recent terrorist attacks, whether by those affiliated with terrorist entities, copycats, or individual perpetrators, serve as a reminder that U.S. citizens need to maintain a high level of vigilance and take appropriate steps to increase their security awareness. ... In response to... airstrikes, ISIL called on supporters to attack foreigners wherever they are. Authorities believe there is an increased likelihood of reprisal attacks against U.S., Western and coalition partner interests throughout the world, especially in the Middle East, North Africa, Europe, and Asia. Kidnappings and hostage events involving U.S. citizens have become increasingly prevalent as ISIL, al Qa`ida and its affiliates have increased attempts to finance their operations through kidnapping for ransom operations. ... Extremists may elect to use conventional or non-conventional weapons, and target both official and private interests. Examples of such targets include high-profile sporting events, residential areas, business offices, hotels, clubs, restaurants, places of worship, schools, public areas, shopping malls, and other tourist destinations both in the United States and abroad where U.S. citizens gather in large numbers, including during holidays." Author Steven Brill (*America's Bitter Pill*), tells NPR's Terry Gross, "In every respect, this whole saga of ObamaCare, the politics of it, the bitter partisan[ship] of it, the lobbying and, in this case, the challenge of governance all are emblematic of what's

However, it is very likely that even though they don't believe that, they want you to-for then you will be ignorant and complacent in the face of the advancing jihad, instead of preparing defensive strategies. ...[I]n pushing the Obama Administration's rainbows-and-unicorns fantasy of a peaceful Islam, Earnest is protecting the religion from slander, which is just what the Kouachi brothers thought they were doing when they started killing people in the Charlie Hebdo offices." [70207]

Number two on Spencer's list is former Congressman Ron Paul (R-TX), who is "fanatically attached to the idea that Islamic jihad is all a reaction to the West's foreign policy—so much so that they have frequently turned a blind eye to the jihadis' stated agenda, and see the depredations of Western foreign policy where it actually played no part. ...Paul gives the jihadis what they want by blaming the West for the actions of the jihadis, thereby feeding the jihadist narrative of grievance, and making future concessions from the West all the more likely." Number three is Germany's Interior Minister Thomas de Maiziere, who also excuses the jihadis: "The extremist Islamism, Islamist terrorism, is something quite different from the Islam. And this differentiation is urgently needed just on a day like today." [70207]

Lastly, Spencer notes MSNBC "terror analyst" Evan Kohlmann, who stated, "I think we need to understand here, there... has to be the ability for people to be critical of other religions, of other ideas and whatnot. There has to be that ability. At the same time, look, we have to also respect Islam and we should not deliberately go out and poke our fingers in other people's eyes, you know? There is—everyone should have the right to critique Islam, but at least we should do it with some sense of respect so that people don't get the idea that this is Islamophobia, that it's racism, that this is exactly the same kind of

critique or analysis that we would apply to Judaism, Christianity, Hinduism, any other philosophy out there, that look, it's worthy of critique and debate." Spencer asks, "Why are there never any mainstream media calls to respect Christianity or Judaism or any other religion? No one is ever worried that "Piss Christ" or the dung-encrusted Virgin Mary painting is poking Christians in the eye. And does Kohlmann think that atheists should not be free to call all of them dangerous nonsense?" Spencer concludes, "This was, of course, exactly what the jihadis wanted: they wanted people to be too afraid to transgress against Islam's blasphemy laws. The future does indeed not belong to those who slander the prophet of Islam, and that future is now." [70207]

At Brooklyn's Oulel-Albab Mosque, Imam Tareq Yousef Al-Masri says, "Let us admit, without lying to ourselves, that we, the Muslims, are time bombs. When I say 'we, the Muslims,' I do not mean every single Muslim, but Muslims of the religious sector are time bombs. When a sinner repents, the first thing he does is make a bomb. He blows it up and kills people. We must admit this. We cannot become immune if we do not admit this. If you have cancer, it won't help you if I tell you that you have the flu. I must tell you that you clearly have cancer. When someone has cancer, they run a series of tests, in order to identify the cause of this cancer. They don't just say that this cancer is an act of God. Everything comes from Allah, but this should not prevent us from studying the underlying reasons for this cancer. Let us admit something else. The majority of us Muslims hate the Christians-true or false? Yes, that is the truth. ... Who instilled so much hatred in these generations? It is the ideology present in the books—the ideology of Ibn Taymiyyah, of Ibn Al-Qayyam, of Al-Nawawi. These are the pillars of this ideology. In modern times, we have Ibn Baz, Ibn Al-Uthaymeen, Al-Huweini, Muhammad Hassan... These people are responsible for instilling hatred in human beings. ... They have made the Muslims hate everyone-the Christians, the Jews, the atheists, and all human beings. ... I am ashamed of the rotten and despicable conduct of the Muslims." (Jihad Watch's Robert Spencer asks if Al-Masri will "now be denounced as an 'Islamophobe' and a tool of the Zionists?'") [70967, 70968, 70969]

On January 10 bomb threats result in the evacuation of movie theaters in Paris. [70099]

Sharyl Attkisson writes about a college student who was happy with her prescription for birth control pills, which helped control chronic headaches and her complexion. But she learned that under ObamaCare, her particular medication is not covered. The insurance company told the student she would "have to add a separate, new prescription for her headaches and another for her skin. In the end, that would expose her to potential side effects from three medicines instead of one. Three prescriptions would also presumably cost the insurance company to send word that it rejected [the] appeal. ...In the end, [the student] concluded that birth control is covered under Obamacare—just not the birth control her doctor prescribed. It really makes me laugh. …We vomit on all these people who suddenly say they are our friends. They've never seen *Charlie Hebdo*. …I never come to the editorial meetings because I don't like them. I guess that saved my life." [70106]

The Blazing Cat Fur blog reports that after the terrorist acts in Paris "Al Jazeera English editor and executive producer Salah-Aldeen Khadr sent out a staff-wide email" that included "a list of 'suggestions' for how anchors and correspondents at the Qatar-based news outlet should cover Wednesday's slaughter at the Charlie Hebdo office. ...Khadr urged his employees to ask if this was 'really an attack on 'free speech,' discuss whether 'I am Charlie' is an 'alienating slogan,' caution viewers against 'making this a free speech aka 'European Values' under attack binary [sic],' and portray the attack as 'a clash of extremist fringes.'" In Maiduguri, Nigeria, a bomb-wearing Muslim girl about 10 years old blows herself up in a busy market, killing 20 people and injuring 18. [70109, 70129]

The Telegraph reports, "It is now believed that [Hayat] Boumediene [common-law wife of Paris killer Ahmed Coulibaly] was never at the [Kosher supermarket] siege. According to France Info radio, the Turkish authorities informed France that she had travelled to Turkey on January 2 via Madrid. She is believed to have crossed over into Syria on January 8." [70110]

Pamela Geller writes, "The idea that America has better assimilated its Muslims than the UK and Europe is ridiculous on its face. It's a matter of numbers. The only difference between the US and France, the UK and the rest of that doomed continent is that they began importing Muslims decades earlier than the US. We are on the same path. The number of immigrants in the United States jumped 3 percent in three years—to a record 41.3 million in 2013—and... the nearly 300,000 who came from Muslim countries pose a major national security threat." According to the Associated Press, "The Al-Qaeda offshoot that claimed Friday to have masterminded the bloody rampage in France has been the most active of the terror network's branches in trying to strike in the West. Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula said it directed the attack against the French satirical magazine Charlie Hebdo in Paris 'as revenge for the honor' of Prophet Mohammad. The strike would be the Yemen-based branch's first [known] successful strike outside its home territory—and a triumph for its trademark double-strategy of waging jihad in Yemen to build its strength to strike abroad. At least one of the two brothers involved in the attack on the weekly traveled to Yemen in 2011 and either received training from or fought alongside the group, authorities say. A U.S. intelligence assessment described to the Associated Press shows that 34-year-old Said Kouachi was trained in preparation to return home and carry out an attack." [70122, 70123]

At CNN.com "religion editor" Daniel Burke asks, "Does Islam encourage violence?" and then defends it, writing, "... Muslims note that almost every faith, from Christianity to Judaism to Hinduism to Buddhism, has produced acts of terrorism. Think about it this way: If you were a Jew during the Inquisition in Spain, would you think that Christianity is inherently violent?" (That most Muslims are not violent is irrelevant to the question that Burke himself asked. Christians, Jews, Hindus, and Buddhists who might commit terrorist acts are *not* following the tenets of their religion, while Muslims who commit such atrocities are following Islam. Additionally, a long time has passed since the Spanish Inquisition begin in 1478. Following Burke's logic, every torturous and murderous deed ever committed by mankind can be excused based on past precedent. But Christians no longer follow practices of the 15th century, while far too many Muslims continue to follow the practices of the 7th century.) Burke continues, "Scholars say there is rarely a direct link between religious beliefs and violent behavior. Instead, terrorism is generally caused by a complex web of factors." (That is total nonsense. Jihad Watch's Robert Spencer notes, "Islamic jihadists regularly cite Qur'anic texts and Muhammad's example to justify violence and supremacism." Further, according to ReligionofPeace.com, "Islamic terrorists have carried out more than 24,831 deadly terror attacks since 9/11." While there may be a number of factors contributing to those attacks, they all have in common one thing: terrorists who follow Islam.) [70124, 70125, 70126]

Burke whines that many Muslims feel "frustrated," and quotes a message "from a longtime, Muslim-American source [who] sums up the sentiment: 'Muslims cannot get a break. (Perhaps if there were not a violent event every day the suggestion that Islam is their cause might be less likely to be believed. At least 24,8331 people have been denied those acts of "goodwill.") Burke ridicules Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi for his recent speech in which he "urged Muslim leaders to start a 'religious revolution.'" Burke argues that many Muslims "simply shrugged off" al-Sisi's address "Because of his brutal human rights record—rounding up dissidents, jailing journalists and cracking down on the Muslim Brotherhood, and the journalists who support them should be free to encourage terrorism. If members of the Ku Klux Klan terrorized blacks in the United States, would Burke *not* want the government "cracking down on them?") [70124, 70125, 70126]

10News.dk posts comments from psychiatrist Henrik Day Poulsen: "Our laws are not geared to understand or cope with the fundamentalist mind. Their perception of reality is completely undistorted, which is opposite the insane person, whose mind is completely chaotic and would therefore never be able to plan a professional attack such as the one we witnessed in Paris Wednesday this week. ...And here we find a very important point where you have to understand how a fanatic thinks. They break all the social norms and rules that we take for granted. Norms like respect, fairness, consideration and trustworthiness become secondary to the fight for that which the fanatic wants to achieve. The goal justifies the means. Untrustworthiness, falsehood, deceit and manipulation is fully acceptable when acting in the name of God. Even though the scripture says that one is not allowed to lie. Understanding such standards is important when trying to

understand a fanatic. And if you understand the fanatical mind, you will know why constructive dialogue is impossible. Obviously, a fanatic will show up and discuss with politicians, as we see in the media, but when the camera is turned off and everyone has gone home, they laugh into their beard and prepare the next fanatical deed. In the name of God, of course." [70127, 70128]

"It is well known that psychopaths lie, manipulate, steal and kill for personal gain. The thrill of committing crimes is often also a key motivation. Most people can understand the psychopathic mind, and we have great experience in handling them in a democratic society. We have laws, courts and police to lock them up. But if you think that the Muslims in Grimhøjmoskeen (Danish mosque famous for sending jihadis to Syria) or the terrorists in Paris are 'just' a bunch of psychopathic criminals, you make a serious mistake. The psychology of a fanatic is often quite different, although their tendency to speak with two tongues, lie and distort the truth may look like the usual psychopathic jailbird. A very good illustration of the difference between a psychopath and a fanatic is the fact that the two French brothers of North African descent ...almost in a provocative manner left their identity cards in the getaway car. A normal, experienced criminal would never be so stupid, since this obviously increases the risk of being discovered and caught. French Prime Minister Manuel Valls states, "We're at war, but not at war against a religion, not against a civilization, but at war to defend our values, which are universal. It is a war against terrorism and radical Islam, against everything aimed at breaking solidarity, liberty and fraternity. ...Our compatriots and citizens who are Muslim by confession and culture are also the victims of terrorism. This is perhaps the most important message: the refusal of this confusion. Jihadism tries to create that confusion. We are not a collection of communities, we are one nation, a Republic with values: generosity, solidarity, fraternity, secularism. We must also be lucid: antisemitism, racism, hatred of the other, these things are intolerable... Journalists were killed for drawing, police were killed for protecting us, and Jews were killed because they were Jewish. This is what is intolerable. The indignation must be total and permanent." On *Justice with Judge Jeanine*, Jeanine Pirro excoriates political correctness and the Obama administration for not recognizing the threat of radical Islam. "We need to kill them," says Pirro. "We need to *kill them*, the radical Muslims terrorists Hell-bent on killing *us*. On January 11 between one and three million Parisians peacefully march down Boulevard Voltaire in support of free speech and to protest the terrorist attacks of the preceding week. According to the Daily Mail, the dignitaries include: Greek Prime Minister Antonis Samaras, Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy, British Prime Minister David Cameron, Danish Prime Minister Helle Thorning-Schmidt, European Union foreign policy chief Federica Mogherini, Paris Mayor Anne Hidalgo, European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker, Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu, Malian President Ibrahim Boubacar Keita, French President Francois Hollande, German Chancellor Angela Merkel, European Union President Donald Tusk, Jordan's Queen Rania, Jordan's King Abdullah II, Italian Prime Minister Matteo Renzi, Ukrainian President Petro Poroshenko, Turkish Prime Minister Ahmet Davutoglu, and Palestinian Authority president Mahmoud Abbas. (The appearances by Davutoglu and Abbas are insulting; both Turkey and the Palestinian Authority support terrorism; in fact, the PA's cause is terrorism.) A march in support of the French also took place in Washington, just a few blocks from the White House; Obama skipped that as well, Victoria Nuland, assistant secretary at the Department of State, attended. TimesofIsrael.com reports, "French President Francois Hollande did not want [Israeli] Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to attend Sunday's historic march in Paris, believing the Israeli leader's presence at the rally would be 'divisive,' Israeli media reported Sunday. Netanyahu initially accepted Paris's wishes and on Saturday cited security concerns to explain why he would not attend the event... However, the Prime Minister changed his mind later Saturday after Foreign Minister Avigdor Liberman and Economy Minister Naftali Bennett announced they would join the march, Israel's Channel 2 news reported. When Netanyahu's office told the Elysee Palace that he would be coming after all, France responded by highlighting that it was extending an invitation to Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas, according to the report. The French government also announced a planned meeting between Hollande and Abbas Saturday night." (Hollande reportedly did not want Abbas at the event either—until he learned Netanyahu would attend.) [70148, 70152, 70246]

Pamela Geller writes, "The press is calling it a rally, a unity rally, which points to what I said yesterday about the media and political manipulation of post-terror anger. This is a

rally against jihad, a rally against sharia. That is what people are up in arms about. Rebranding it into some kumbaya nonsense is a deliberate attempt to defuse an organized movement to respond, finally, to the jihad threat. This is what always happens. The elites work furiously to make sure that nothing changes. They want people be sad, defeated. When the appropriate and rational response is anger and resolve. Although Obama could not find the time to travel to Paris, he does have a busy January 12 planned: he will host the 2014 NBA Champion San Antonio Spurs at the White House. [70137, 70138]

Attorney General Eric Holder announces that Obama will hold a "security summit" on February 18 to address violent extremism. He says, "We will bring together all of our allies to discuss ways in which we can counteract this violent extremism that exists around the world." (Holder does not say what *kind* of violent extremism will be discussed. Nor does he indicate whether Al Sharpton will be involved.) Holder also says he has no "credible evidence" suggesting which terrorist group was responsible for the attacks in Paris. (Apparently the fact that at least one of the terrorists spent time in Yemen with al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula, one claimed he was with al-Qaeda in Yemen, and the group itself said it directed the attack is insufficient for Holder to link the terrorism with al-Qaeda.) The *Daily Mail* reports, "Amedy Coulibaly began his terror rampage a day earlier than previously thought by shooting a jogger and planting a car bomb, it emerged yesterday. The killer, who was shot dead by police after murdering four hostages in a Jewish shop on Friday, was thought to have struck first when he killed an unarmed policewoman last Thursday. But now Paris prosecutors think he was responsible for seriously injuring a

jogger in a suburb of the capital on January 7, the same day gunmen killed 12 during the Charlie Hebdo massacre. A 'martyrdom video' of the fanatic, apparently filmed midway through the wave of terror attacks, appeared online yesterday. In it he urges Western Muslims to wage war against 'enemies of Islam.' The footage claims Coulibaly planted a bomb under a car on a Paris street, seemingly referring to an explosion on Wednesday night that authorities had not linked to the terror attacks. Prosecutors said that tests on shell cases from the jogger shooting linked them to the weapon used at the kosher supermarket two days later. French security forces also released details of a cache of weapons, including automatic rifles and explosives, found at Coulibaly's last address, an apartment in Gentilly, on the outskirts of Paris." [70151]

A Frenchman named Joseph, a close friend of one of the Hyper Cacher supermarket victims, Yohan Cohen, speaks with Pamela Geller. She writes, "Joseph was not just griefstricken; he was also angry, saying of the jihad attack: 'I got a lot of information. I spoke to people from the inside of what happened. It was a catastrophe. This could've been avoided.' Joseph explained this by pointing out that Mohammed Merah, who murdered four people, including three children, at a Jewish day school in France in March 2012, first killed three members of the French military. [Merah "proudly" filmed his savagery with a "GoPro" video camera, as did Ahmed Coulibaly.] Coulibaly, he said, worked the same way, first participating in the jihad massacre at the satirical newspaper Charlie Hebdo and then going to Hyper Cacher to kill Jews. 'I talked to the owner of the supermarket,' Joseph said, 'and apparently, from what he told me, Amedy Coulibaly was there a week ago. The owner's brother was inside the store during the siege and he recognized Coulibaly, because he saw him a week ago. The owner's brother was shot in the arm, and he is alive to tell the story.' The attack, Joseph said, was 'planned ahead of time. Because they knew it was Shabbat [the Sabbath]. They knew that people would come shopping for Shabbat. It wasn't like the media said, that he saw a kosher place, he stopped by and that was it. No. This was planned by Coulibaly, his wife and the Kouachi brothers. They all had a very specific plan. The Kouachi brothers were supposed to take care of Charlie Hebdo and Coulibaly had to take care of police officers and the Jews." [70152, 70153, 70197]

"...Inside [the supermarket], Coulibaly began conversing with the hostages. 'It was very weird,' said Joseph. 'He came in and he asked everyone, what's your name, what do you do for a living, what's your religion. He had disgust for Jews. He insulted everyone and then he hit them. Women, too. One source told me that he took a Jewish woman by the hair and started moving her around with the hair, calling her a dog. He threw her on the ground. The four dead bodies were right there on the floor. One person inside the store left me a message crying, he said, 'That poor, poor man dead on the floor with his challah [braided bread for the Sabbath]'' ...Coulibaly, according to Joseph, 'wanted to blow the place up. He was ready to die. That was clear from what everybody told me. They told me about the fear they had when they saw him and starting to pray, to pray as Muslims do before they blow themselves up.' He was heavily armed, with two 9 mm pistols, a grenade, dynamite sticks, and more. Says Joseph, 'So he was ready to blow the place up. He told them they were all going to die. They were getting to a point where he was becoming more insane and was starting to scream and insult them, saying, 'You dirty

Jews, you oppress us. I will go to heaven.' He was starting to scream and insult everyone, saying, 'We will take over France and we will put the flag of jihad over the Élysée Palace. And he was going more and more crazy.'" [70152, 70153]

"... In the aftermath of the massacre, Joseph pointed out that during a news report about the attack, Muslim children gathered behind the journalist, happily making the hand signal of firing a gun, making the V [victory] sign, and celebrating. 'This is in their blood,' Joseph said. 'It's not something that Americans understand. But I've been stabbed, I have had a lot problems with them. I know their hatred. These are people whom the Koran commands, very clearly, many times, to kill us. We are supposed to be murdered. Yet I see these people reports on TV saying, 'Oh well, Jews and Muslims lived side by side for many years in Muslim Spain.' But you can talk to my, to my grandparents. You can talk to those who lived under Muslim occupations. They were dhimmis, they had to pay more taxes, and the day that the Muslim king wasn't happy, he'd come in and kill everyone.' Now that the same kind of society is being created in France, Joseph said that he was doing everything he could to get Jews out of the country. 'One source I have,' he said, 'told me that apparently this was just the beginning. Something else is coming that'll be bigger. And all the synagogues were closed today'for the first time since World War II. This, Joseph said, was because when Coulibaly 'killed the cop Thursday, he wasn't shooting for the cop, he was shooting for the Jewish school. There was a Jewish school in Montrouge and he was looking to shoot there. It's very funny that he starts shooting and there's a Jewish school right close by.' ... Joseph concluded: 'America has to do something for the French Jews. America has to do something for the French Jews because Israel cannot take in all the French Jews. Everybody's trying to get to the U.S. You know how many people call me, asking, 'how can I get to the U.S., it's so difficult." [70152, 70153]

"Joseph noted that 'in the past two months there have been shots fired at synagogues and kosher restaurants. Many Jews have been killed in the past ten years in France. But no one is doing anything about it, and the French government cannot do anything about it. They are powerless and they know they're powerless. They're fighting, going to Yemen, going to Afghanistan, going to Pakistan, coming back to France, thousands, thousands. They're insane. They get back, the only thing they want is to kill Jews.' CNN.com reports, "French law enforcement officers have been told to erase their social media presence and to carry their weapons at all times because terror sleeper cells have been activated over the last 24 hours in the country, a French police source who attended a briefing Saturday told CNN terror analyst Samuel Laurent." CNN's Jake Tapper says, "The United States, which considers itself to be the most important nation in the world, was not represented in this march—arguably one of the most important public demonstrations in Europe in the last generation—except by U.S. Ambassador Jane Hartley, who may have been a few rows back. I didn't see her. Even Russia sent Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov. I say this as an American—not as a journalist, not as a representative of CNN—but as an American: I was ashamed." (The Paris unity rally will not stop jihad, but Obama nevertheless should have attended. People attend funerals even though their presence won't bring back the dead.) [70171]

The addition of efforts to restrict Obama's pending climate rule for power plants, for example, could cut into Keystone's Democratic support. A bipartisan amendment boosting energy efficiency, on the other hand, could help win more votes for the pipeline bill. Supporters of yanking Obama's authority over Keystone, emboldened Friday by a Nebraska Supreme Court ruling that upheld the validity of the pipeline's route, count about 63 votes as of now. Environmentalists and Democrats fighting the bill are confident that the four votes necessary to override [an Obama] veto will remain out of reach for the GOP, which is also well short of a veto-proof margin in the House." The tweets also threatened military personnel and their families. ... The information that was posted on the account has been verified by intelligence sources as real information hacked directly from CENTCOM, meaning this wasn't simply a hack of a Twitter account, but against CENTCOM itself. Since the breach, Twitter has suspended the CENTCOMM account. ... The CENTCOM YouTube page was also hacked and filled with ISIS propaganda videos." (Why CENTCOMM even maintains Twitter and YouTube accounts is not clear.) USAToday.com reports, "A Twitter account from a group identifying itself as Anonymous said Monday it had tracked the source of the hack to Maryland, but that was not confirmed by official sources." (On January 14 ForeignPolicy.com writes, "The main suspects: a group led by Junaid Hussain, a 20-year-old who moved from Britain to Syria—accompanied by his 45-year-old alt-rock girlfriend—to kick-start the Islamic State's hacking campaign.") The next issue of *Charlie Hebdo* features the headline, "Tout est pardonne" ("All is Forgiven") and the Islamic prophet Mohammed hold a sign that reads, "Je Suis Charlie" ("I am Charlie"). Radical Muslim cleric Anjem Choudary calls the new cover "an act of war" and says, "These things always have a history of coming back and biting them. People are not going to forget. Muslims will never forget what these people did. And I'm sure there's someone somewhere who will take the law into his own hands. It's inevitable. There will be repercussions. I think there will be someone somewhere who will retaliate." (Americans can subscribe to Charlie Hebdo via Amazon.com. Actor and former governor of California Arnold Schwarzenegger has done so.) Democrat Party hack Donna Brazile tweets, "And let me say thank you to US Ambassador to France Jane Hartley for being part of the massive march in Paris? Thank you for representing." (Why Brazile included the question mark is not clear, but the message is clearly intended to provide cover for Obama for not sending anyone to the event. Hartley, of course, was not "sent," as she already lives in Paris. She was given the ambassadorship post as payback for raising more than \$500,000 for Obama's 2012 campaign. Hartley is married to Evercore Partners CEO Ralph Schlossstein. In September 2012 they hosted a fundraiser for Obama at their Manhattan home on posh Park Avenue. The email invitation trolling for dollars read, "Hi there—fundraising this quarter has been a struggle (as you can imagine give all the negative stuff around [Obama])—they are offering a one off opportunity to attend this small dinner on Monday for \$25k instead of the full max out of \$38.5k, or a couple at \$38.5k instead of \$77k. Just wanted to offer that in case you're interested! ... Evercore Chairman and former Assistant Treasury Secretary Roger Altman is also a co-host. Many other senior Wall Street individuals will be attending. ... This will be an intimate dinner with the opportunity to spend quality time with [Obama] in a private home. Given the current Republican field, it is more imperative than ever that we re-elect ... Obama and I hope you can join us on September 19th.") [70175]

In Portland, Oregon, 19-year-old Abdalah Mohamed threatens the owner of a delicatessen, saying, "I will blow up your store!" "I'm going to send my guys to shoot up your store!" "You Israeli ...I'll blow up your store in the name of Allah!"" "We take care of people like you." According to OregonLive.com, Mohamed "lived in Northeast Portland for about six years and is originally from Kenya. ...Mohamed is also accused of cocaine possession in an unrelated case, according to court records." CBS News' Mark Knoller tweets, "WH issues veto threat today against DHS funding bill if House GOP 'mucks around' with ...Obama's immigration exec actions." (In other words, Obama is willing to threaten funding of the entire Department of Homeland Security and put more than 300 million Americans at risk if Congress blocks his unconstitutional illegal immigrant amnesty actions. Congress should call his bluff... and then impeach him for violating his oath of office.) [70176, 70177]

Congressman Paul Ryan (R-WI) announces he will not be running for president in 2016. [70178]

White House press secretary Josh Earnest tells reporters, "We should have sent someone with a higher profile" to the Paris unity march. (Obama did not even send someone with a low profile.) In the second panel, someone comments, "Wow, you pronounced that beautifully!" In the third panel, Kerry says, "Well, I used to say it a lot in Vietnam." (Kerry speaks French. "Charlie" was the name used by the U.S. military in Vietnam to refer to the Viet Cong soldiers.) [70181]

U.S. ambassador to the United Nations Samantha Power tweets, "Recent polls show isolationist sentiment at highest point in 50 yrs. But American leadership in the world critically important." (She does not suggest who might be a good leader to take over Oval Office duties.) [70183]

Asked about the failure of U.S. leaders to show up in Paris for the unity march, Secretary of State John Kerry says, "I really think that this is sort of quibbling a little bit in the sense that our Assistant Secretary of State Victoria Nuland was there and marched, our ambassador [to France Jane Hartley] was there and marched, many people from the embassy were there and marched." (According to BizPacReview.com, Nuland was *not* in Paris; she attended a similar event in Washington, D.C.) Kerry adds, "I want to emphasize that the relationship with France is not about one day or one particular moment, it is an ongoing longtime relationship that is deeply, deeply based in the shared values, and particularly the commitment that we share to freedom of expression." Melih Gokcek, mayor of Ankara, blames the Israeli intelligence service: "Mossad is definitely behind such incidents... it is boosting enmity towards Islam." [70417]

On *The Kelly File*, Martha MacCallum grills State Department spokesperson Marie Harf about the Obama administration's inability to use the term "radical Islamists." "Why is it so hard to say?" asks MacCallum. Harf replies, "It's not hard to say, but it's not the only kind of extremist we face." MacCallum: "What other forms of extremism are particularly troubling and compelling to you right now?" Harf: "[T]here are a number of people out there who want to kill other people in the name of a variety of causes." Noting several recent terrorist attacks by radical Islamists, MacCallum asks, "Don't you see a common thread?" Harf responds, "I think that's a little bit overly simplistic, to be honest with you, Martha." [70233]

On the *Daily Show*, anti-semitic former president Jimmy Carter says of the terrorist massacres in Paris, "Well, one of the origins for it is the Palestinian problem, and this aggravates people who are affiliated in any way with the Arab people who live in the West Bank and Gaza, what they are doing now... what's being done to them. So I think that's part of it." (In other words, Carter blames Israel. Obama no doubt believes the same thing, but Carter is foolish enough to say it in public.) [70203]

Earlier in the day, Carter defended Obama's absence at the Paris unity march, telling Katie Couric of Yahoo News, "I know that ...Obama's just come back from vacation, and I know how it is when you've been gone for a week or two. Your desk is piled up, and he had other pressing problems to address. So I don't think there's any reflection on our country or no criticism is worthy." (That is, "The poor baby was tired.") [70204]

On January 13 MSNBC's Andrea Mitchell asks a French guest, "Why is it permissible, uh, to be as provocative as these anti-Muslim cartoons were? This is a debate we're having journalistically here in the United States as well, you know." (Mitchell has apparently never heard of the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, and most Americans are probably not aware of any "debate" being held "journalistically" about free speech. In fact, Americans believe they have that right. If Mitchell and her fellow journalists are advocating the curtailment of free speech rights, it is they who are being "provocative.") [70210]

Patrice Walid, the owner of the Kosher supermarket who was wounded in the terrorist attack in Paris on January 9, announces he will move to Israel. (Jews in France are not safe, with more than five million Muslims in the city and the police unable to adequately protect them. On January 10 Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu offered an invitation: "To all the Jews of France and to all the Jews of Europe, I wish to say: the State of Israel is not only the place to which you pray, the State of Israel is also your home." French Prime Minister Manuel Valls states, "If 100,000 French people of Spanish origin were to leave, I would never say that France is not France anymore. But if 100,000 Jews leave, France will no longer be France. The French Republic will be judged a

failure." As many as 10,000 Jews may leave France in 2015; about 7,000 fled in 2014. Valls is apparently unaware of his own country's anti-Semitism.) [70212, 70213, 70352]

Robert Spencer later comments on Valls' statement: "It was an extraordinary breaking of ranks. For years now, since 9/11 and before, Western leaders from all points of the political spectrum have unanimously maintained that Islam was a Religion of Peace and that Islamic jihad terrorists were a tiny minority of extremists who were twisting and hijacking the peaceful teachings of their religion. French Prime Minister Manuel Valls hasn't exactly abandoned this roseate, inaccurate, and self-defeating view, but he has come closer than any other Western leader to telling the truth about the threat—with Eric Holder harrumphing in dissent on the sidelines." Former president Jimmy Carter tells Huff Post Live, "I think this is gonna [sic; going to] give, uh, a lot of people an incentive to look into Islam and see what is here about this religion that makes it great, that makes it appeal, really, to billions of people, and, and, to understand that the Islamic leaders condemn this kind of terrorism, uh, just like the rest of the world condemns it." Asked about Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu's invitation to French Jews to relocate in Israel, a grinning Carter replies, "My guess is that the Jews who live in France, uh, will maybe not take this as a positive step, saying the only way you can be safe is to come to Israel. And I would guess that you may be, on the average, safer in France than you are in some places in Israel." (Carter is viciously anti-Israel and always sides with Muslims over the Jews. He is not asked *why* he believes Jews are safer in France than in Israel—not that he would ever state that Hamas rockets can real Israel from Gaza but not France.) [70255, 70256, 70294]

A soldier at Fort Hood, Texas is found dead outside his apartment—after returning from his Ebola-related mission in West Africa. NBCWashington.com reports, "The 24-yearold soldier had been under mandatory Ebola monitoring, but preliminary tests for Ebola came back negative Tuesday. ... The soldier, whose name has not yet been released, returned with his unit last week from Liberia, where he helped construct an Ebola treatment camp but wasn't exposed to patients, Fort Hood spokesman Chris Haug said. Haug said the soldier was ordered to self-monitor his conditions twice per day and report the status to medical officials and was allowed off-post after his return." [70219, 70220]

The Associated Press reports, "Former Arkansas Gov. Mike Huckabee has accused ...Barack Obama and his wife, Michelle, of double standards in parenting, saying in an interview published Tuesday that the first family shelters its daughters from some things but allows them to listen to the music of Beyonce [Knowles]. ... While promoting his new book, the former Baptist pastor told People magazine, 'I don't understand how on one hand they can be such doting parents and so careful about the intake of everything-how much broccoli they eat and where they go to school-and yet they don't see anything that might not be suitable' in Beyonce's lyrics. He also said Beyonce's choreography is 'best left for the privacy of her bedroom.' In his book, Huckabee describes the Grammy Award-winning Beyonce's lyrics as 'obnoxious and toxic mental poison.' He also accuses Beyonce's husband, rapper Jay-Z, of 'exploiting his wife' like a 'pimp.'" (At a \$40,000-per-ticket fundraiser, Obama once said, "Beyonce could not be a better role model for my girls." Whether Obama or his wife let their daughters listen to Beyonce's Drunk in Love is not known. The song's lyrics include: "I'm Ike, Turner, turn up / Baby no I don't play / Now eat the cake, Anna Mae / I said eat the cake, Anna Mae." "Eat the cake" is urban slang for cunnilingus; singer Ike Turner was infamous for beating his wife, Tina Turner; Anna Mae Bullock was a young girl with whom the cocaine-addicted Ike Turner had a relationship. In another song, Beyonce repeatedly sings, "Bow down, bitches." Whether that is a favorite of the two Obama daughters is not known.) [70221, 70222, 70223, 70286, 70287]

The Washington Post writes, "Thousands of Israelis gathered Tuesday for the joint funeral of the four Jewish men killed in a shoot-out with Islamist gunmen at a kosher supermarket in Paris last week after the bodies arrived in Israel before dawn, accompanied by family." 'There may be a place in the world where you can be yourself, be honest with yourself and do not go and kill innocent journalists. And if you do not like it here because humorists you do not like make a newspaper, may I then say you can f**k off. This is stupid, this so incomprehensible. Politico.com reports that House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) "announced in a closed-door meeting Tuesday" that she would appoint Muslim Congressman Andre Carson (D-IN)] to the House's Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence. On June 12, 2012 TheBlaze.com reported that in an address to the Islamic Circle of North America/Muslim American Society, Carson "empathized with fellow followers of Islam over how difficult life was for them after the terrorist attacks on Sept. 11th, 2001. Pamela Geller notes, "Between January 2008 and June 2014, Carson received 55 separate political donations (totaling nearly \$34,000 altogether) from terror designated Muslim groups the Council on American-Islamic Relations, the Islamic Society of North America, the Muslim American Society, and the Muslim Public Affairs Council." Fritz-Joly Joachim, 29, was nabbed by Bulgarian authorities in the early morning on New Year's Day on a European arrest warrant for allegedly kidnapping his three-year-old son and trying to take him eventually into Syria, said Darina Slavova, a prosecutor in the southern Bulgarian city of Haskovo. But Slavova told ABC News today that Bulgarian authorities received another European arrest warrant Monday alleging Joachim was part of a 'terrorist criminal group' and that he had been in contact with Cherif Kouachi, one of the Charlie Hebdo shooters, prior to his attempted escape to Syria. According to the original arrest warrant, Joachim, who is of Haitian origin, converted to Islam 15 years ago, but became radicalized two years ago. He lives in the Bobigny suburb of Paris. Slavova said she expects Joachim to be extradited to France to face charges." [70257]

After stories circulate about a death threat from a psychotic Ohio bartender who wanted to poison and then shoot House Speaker John Boehner, the Boston Globe's Victor Paul

Alvarez writes, "The question is: Would anyone have noticed?" HotAir.com's Noah Rothman observes, "If John Boehner were a Democrat and this blurb had appeared in *The Wall Street Journal*, we don't need expend much energy in order to imagine what the reaction would have been." [70284, 70285]

Senate Republicans introduce legislation to block the release of additional terrorists from the detainee facility at Guantanamo. Senator Kelly Ayotte (R-NH) states, "Now is not the time to be emptying Guantanamo. ...It's clear that we need a time-out so we do not reconfront the terrorists we have captured and are currently in Guantanamo." He says Yemen's Al Qaeda branch 'chose the target, laid out the plan and financed the operation,' though he produced no evidence to support the claim. Orders he said, came from Al Qaeda's top leader Ayman al-Zawahri, Usama bin Laden's successor. ...In the video, al-Ansi describes the Kouachi brothers as 'heroes' and congratulates them for 'this revenge that has soothed our pain.'" Obama, White House officials and Lois Lerner herself repeatedly argued the IRS targeting scandal was a local, 'lowlevel,' Cincinnati issue, when in fact it was coming from headquarters in Washington D.C. 'These new documents, withheld for years contrary to law, suggest that a top IRS official may have obstructed investigations into the IRS scandal. Even Lois Lerner objected to her boss's travel to the infamous Cincinnati IRS office, falsely accused by Barack Obama as being solely responsible for the abuse of the First Amendment rights of his critics,' Judicial Watch President Tom Fitton said in a statement." (Lerner wanted no one interviewing the IRS employees in Cincinnati because she knew that would disprove claims that IRS persecution of conservative groups was solely the fault of "rogue" employees in that office.) Their argument this time: 'The vast majority of the US government is funded for months into the future, and we've passed legislation to raise homeland security spending by hundreds of millions of dollars. The Democrats are forcing this partial shutdown for the sole purpose of protecting *Obama's unlawful executive order granting a sweeping amnesty to millions of adults who* entered the country illegally." Christopher Cornell [aka Raheel Mahrus Ubaydah] had saved money, researched government buildings in Washington, laid plans to travel to the capital to carry out his attack and on Wednesday bought two M-15 semiautomatic rifles and 600 rounds of ammunition, prompting police to move in and arrest him." 'By comparison, the average wage of the nation's 107 million private-sector workers was \$55,424.' When benefits like health care and pensions are included, average annual compensation for federal workers jumped to \$115,524, 74 percent more than the \$66,357 private sector average.") [70292]

BirtherReport.com writes, "Last night veteran journalist Diana West appeared on Andrea Shea King's radio show and revealed some stunning details about her time as a syndicated columnist. Allahu akbar, Allahu akbar were the last words said before they died' says Nurcahyo Utomo, who has been an aviation investigator for almost two decades as he listened to the black box recording." (Flight QZ8501 crashed into the ocean on December 28, during bad weather.) [69664, 69790, 70202, 70299, 70326]

WND.com reports, "A federal appeals court has ordered an expedited schedule for a case brought by Maricopa County Sheriff Joe Arpaio against ...Obama over his amnesty program that is being implemented even as the case progresses. The order released Wednesday by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit said the brief for the appellants is due Jan. 29, and the government's brief in defense of amnesty will be due March 2. 'Due to the expedited nature of this case, the court will not entertain dispositive motions. The parties should therefore address in their briefs any arguments otherwise properly raised in such motions,' said the order. '[Obama] does not have the authority to rewrite immigration laws. WesternJournalism.com reports, "On behalf of former presidential candidates John Dummett [write-in candidate] and Ed Noonan [American Independent Party candidate], the U.S. Justice Foundation [USJF] recently submitted a petition for certiorari to the U.S. Supreme Court to determine what safeguards are constitutionally mandated in ensuring a candidate is qualified to run. The action is in response to two previous court rulings suggesting California's secretary of state does not have a responsibility to verify a presidential candidate's status as a natural born citizen. The USJF petition cites the U.S. Constitution, specifically Article II, Section 2, which says state legislatures are tasked with determining eligibility. Given the nation's current electoral process, the court document holds these lawmakers must provide voters with a choice between candidates who meet constitutional requirements for the position they seek. The petition chronicles the court history of the issue, including appeals court decisions the petitioners conclude were based on faulty logic. The appeal provides three reasons that, through the role of California's chief elections officer, the secretary of state should be tasked with verifying a presidential candidate's eligibility." On several occasions states have allowed on the ballot candidates for president who were ineligible because they were not natural born citizens or because they had not yet reached age 35. That sloppiness has usually been limited to "minor party" candidates who have no chance of winning, but Chester A. Arthur and Obama were both ineligible to serve as president because their fathers were not U.S. citizens. They were nevertheless allowed on the ballot. (The historical definition of "natural born citizen," *as understood by the Founding Fathers*, is birth on U.S. soil to two U.S. citizen parents.) The problem with legal challenges has been that legislators and the courts have all been afraid to address the issue of Obama's ineligibility to serve as president. The legislators essentially tell their constituents, "There is nothing we can do. The issue belongs in the courts," while the judges essentially declare, "This court has no jurisdiction over the issue and the matter must be resolved by Congress." Before the election, some courts ruled that the eligibility lawsuits should wait until after the election, while after the election other courts ruled that the challenges should have been brought before the election.

That the courts are so unwilling to address the question of the definition of the term "natural born citizen" clearly suggests they know the answer works against Obama. Why, after all, have the courts been unwilling to rule that Obama is a natural born citizen *if he truly is*? Why should the question be a "hot potato" if Obama *does* meet the eligibility requirements? That the U.S. Supreme Court was afraid to hear *Kerchner v. Obama* reveals the truth: Obama does *not* meet the requirement of birth on U.S. soil to *two* U.S. citizen parents. The sad truth is that clearly ineligible candidates can run for office if the

mainstream media and the voters accept them. Contrary to what many believe, there is *no* official process for vetting presidential candidates. If Vladimir Putin decides to run for U.S. president he can do so if the media and the voters are willing to accept a forged birth certificate claiming he was born in Louisville, rather than Leningrad, and if they do not care that he did not have two U.S. citizen parents.

Mike Schuetz, the owner of Hawkins Guns LLC, a firearms store that sells both guns and ammunition, has audio tapes to support his claims. The United States Consumer Coalition calls this just the latest example of the extralegal overreach of Operation Choke Point, the Obama administration's effort to put industries it doesn't like—especially gun dealers and pay day lenders—out of business." On one of the recordings, an official at Heritage Credit Union says, "Examiners from NCUA [National Credit Union Administration] came in and looked at our accounts... looked at our books. A 2011 list created by the FDIC identifies the "high risk" businesses targeted by Operation Choke Point: ammunition sales, cable box de-scramblers, coin dealers, credit card schemes, credit repair services, dating services, debt consolidation scams, drug paraphernalia, escort services, firearm sales, fireworks sales, get rich products, government grants (that is, businesses that help people take advantage of government grants), home-based charities, tobacco sales, lifetime guarantees, lifetime memberships, lottery sales, mailing lists/personal information, money transfer networks, on-line gambling, payday loans, pharmaceutical sales, Ponzi schemes (excluding Social Security), pornography, pyramid-type sales, racist materials, surveillance equipment, telemarketing, and travel clubs. Watchdog.org reports, "Costly building renovations at the U.S. Consumer Financial Protection Bureau are raising more congressional concerns that the agency is out of control. A government report pegs the price of the work at \$210 million—\$120 million more than initial estimates, with off-site leasing costs included. 'That's more per square foot than the Bellagio hotel-casino in Las Vegas,' said John Berlau, a senior fellow at the Competitive Enterprise Institute. And, critics add, CFPB doesn't even own the building. The Office of Inspector General for the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve Board found that 'approval of funding for the renovation was not in accordance with the CFPB's current policies for major investment.' …Lawmakers have mocked the project, which includes a glass staircase, concession kiosk and a 'water wall' ending in a splash pool. …The building battle is an ironic twist for the 4-year-old CFPB, whose website declares, 'We want to help consumers make smarter decisions.'" TheHill.com reports, "The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is proposing strict new dietary guidelines for day cares that would prohibit them from frying food that is served to children. Child care providers would also be formally required to provide children with water upon request, though they would face restrictions on how much apple juice and orange juice they serve. The proposed nutrition standards are intended to promote the 'health and wellness of children' at day cares that participate in governmentfunded meal programs, the USDA's Food and Nutrition Service said Wednesday. ...The USDA's meal standards also include other proposed changes, such as allowing tofu as a meat alternative." (Reasonable people would assume, of course, that day care centers would not deny water to a thirsty child—and that a regulation would not be necessary. Why "juice police" are needed is not known. Also not known is whether the prohibition of fried foods is intended to keep Muslim parents safe from bacon-tainted children.) [70388]

WashingtonTimes.com reports that many of the leftist groups that sponsored demonstrations in or about Ferguson, Missouri are funded in part by Obama's billionaire buddy, George Soros. "In all," writes the Times, "Mr. Soros gave at least \$33 million in one year to support already-established groups that emboldened the grass-roots, on-theground activists in Ferguson, according to the most recent tax filings of his nonprofit Open Society Foundations. ... Buses of activists from the Samuel Dewitt Proctor Conference in Chicago; from the Drug Policy Alliance, Make the Road New York and Equal Justice USA from New York; from Sojourners, the Advancement Project and Center for Community Change in Washington; and networks from the Gamaliel Foundation-all funded in part by Mr. Soros-descended on Ferguson starting in August and later organized protests and gatherings in the city until late last month." As noted previously in this *Timeline*, for three years Obama was the director of the Developing Communities Project (DCP), part of the Gamaliel Foundation, another Alinsky-like group that uses "in your face" tactics and threats against banks to obtain more loans to people in poor neighborhoods. It is worth noting that there is essentially nothing Congress can do to stop Obama from releasing terrorists from the facility at Guantanamo. As commander in chief of the armed forces, he has the authority to make such decisions—just as he could, if he so chose, issue a pardon to every single inmate in the U.S. prison system. The only way to stop Obama is for the House to vote to impeach him and the Senate to vote to convict. (Legislation to block funding for terrorist removals would be vetoed by Obama. Overriding a veto requires a two-thirds vote in both the House and the Senate—which would never happen unless the American people were so outraged by an Obama action that they frightened their legislators to death with hundreds of thousands of letters, emails, faxes, and telephone calls.)

Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) tells *On the Record's* Greta Van Susteren that Obama "has concluded that the war on terror has reached a point that we can safely release people from Gitmo. The best I can say about him is, he's unfocused. That's delusional thinking. The war on terror has reached a lethal phase, and it is insane to be letting these people out of Gitmo to go back to the fight. Thirty percent of the people released already have gone back to the fight. I believe the war has hit a point where we need to keep these guys in jail, at least for a couple years, until we can get a grip on what's going on throughout the world, particularly Iraq and Syria. Iraq and Syria are great platforms for radical Islamists to attack this county. And [Obama's] going to send them some reinforcements by letting people out of Gitmo. That makes no sense." [70332]

On January 15 anti-police and "black lives matter" protesters in Milton, Massachusetts block Interstate 93 by chaining themselves to barrels—forcing an ambulance carrying an 83-year-old car crash victim with life-threatening injuries to reroute to a different hospital. Six white protesters are arrested, released without bail charges, and ordered to appear in court on February 20. Anne Mostue, of WGBH News, reports that the six refuse to speak to reporters and ironically demand that the media "get away from our cars." (One protester, Nelli Ruotsalainen, is a city of Boston government employee—and is fired. Mayor Marty Walsh states, "This is not a difficult decision.") Race hustler and extortionist Al Sharpton complains that there are not enough blacks among Academy Award nominees. He calls for an "emergency" meeting to "assess action" and states, "The movie industry is like the Rocky Mountains, the higher you get, the whiter it gets." Sharpton apparently believes it is not enough for the (arguably undeserving) movie *Selma*, which is about a Martin Luther King, Jr. civil rights march, to have received only two Oscar nominations, and may have forgotten that *12 Years a Slave* won three Academy Awards at the 2014 ceremonies. (Obama has no comment. Whether Attorney General Eric Holder will send a team of Department of Labor attorneys to "monitor" the Oscar ceremony is not known.) [70323, 70324, 70396]

In Belgium, police conduct 10 separate raids on terror cells. At least two radical Islamists (who had recently returned from Syria) are killed and 13 suspects are detained. Federal prosecutors tell Reuters the group was ready to launch "terrorist attacks on a grand scale." Raids are also conducted in France (at least 12 arrests) and Germany. According to a January 7-11 Pew Research poll, "For the first time in five years, as many Americans cite defending the U.S. against terrorism (76%) as a top policy priority as say that about strengthening the nation's economy (75%). Following those top two concerns are jobs (67 percent), education (67), Social Security (66), budget deficit (64), health care costs (64), Medicare (61), reducing crime (57), poor and needy (55), military (52), immigration (52), environment (51), race relations (49), moral breakdown (48), tax reform (48), energy (46), influence of lobbyists (43), transportation (42), money in politics (42), scientific research (41), global warming (38), global trade (30). [70492]

While Republican leaders meet in Hershey, Pennsylvania, Obama meets behind closed doors with Senate Democrats for a strategy session at a Hilton hotel in Baltimore. The Associated Press writes, "Obama is vowing to work with both parties to try to make progress in his final two years in office. But so far, the Republican-controlled Congress has been taking up legislation he opposes. He's issued five veto threats just a week into the new session." (The claim that Obama is willing to work with the GOP is laughable, and the AP must not have noticed that for six years Obama and Congressional Democrats introduced legislation that Republicans opposed.) At the Democrat event, Obama reportedly says, "I'm not going to spend the next two years on defense; I'm going to play offense." (In other words, "I have no desire to engage in cooperation and compromise. I will issue veto after veto of Republican legislation, while issuing illegal executive orders to impose my statist agenda on the nation.") [70336, 70372, 70373, 70382, 70450]

The New York Times reports that Obama had a heated exchange at the event with Senator Robert Menendez (D-NJ). Obama "vowed to veto legislation being drafted by Mr. Menendez, Democrat of New Jersey, and Senator Mark Kirk, Republican of Illinois, that would impose the sanctions [on Iran] before the multiparty talks are set to end this summer. ...According to one of the senators and another person who was present, [Obama] urged lawmakers to stop pursuing sanctions, saying such a move would undermine his authority and could derail the talks. ...Obama also said that such a

provocative action could lead international observers to blame the Americans, rather than the Iranians, if the talks collapsed before the June 30 deadline. [Obama] said he understood the pressures that senators face from donors and others, but he urged the lawmakers to take the long view rather than make a move for short-term political gain, according to the senator. Mr. Menendez, who was seated at a table in front of the podium, stood up and said he took 'personal offense.' Mr. Menendez told [Obama] that he had worked for more than 20 years to curb Iran's nuclear ambitions and had always been focused on the long-term implications. Mr. Menendez also warned [Obama] that sanctions could not be imposed quickly if Congress waited to act and the talks failed, according to two people who were present. 'It was a forceful exchange between two strong personalities,' the senator, who spoke on the condition of anonymity to discuss private conversations, said. 'It was not an angry exchange. It was clear, forceful, vigorous." (Laughably, Obama believes that opposition to his Iran policies are driven by political donors. Obama is simply incapable of believing that anyone would oppose his policies because they are mistaken. In his mind, all opposition is driven by racism or some other contemptible reason; he can never be wrong.) [70393, 70611]

WashingtonTimes.com reports, "The White House confirmed Thursday that Canada has postponed the North American Leaders Summit scheduled for next month but would not say whether tension over the Keystone XL oil pipeline is the reason. Canada, this year's summit host, announced Thursday that the summit will be held later in 2015, though no exact date has been set. Some Canadian media outlets, such as the Toronto Sun, reported that the meeting was rescheduled because of ...Obama's continued indecision on Keystone, which the Canadian government strongly supports." [70338]

For the first time since entering the White House, Obama may have his budget proposal submitted by the February deadline. Bloomberg.com reports that Obama "will ask Congress for as much as \$68 billion more than current budget limits in fiscal 2016, according to two people familiar with the administration's proposal." [70341, 70355]

SperoForum.com writes, "Last summer, more than 1,000 pages were released from a FOIA lawsuit. While Hillary Clinton was the Secretary, the State Department approved more than 200 speeches given by Bill Clinton to several countries including China, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Taiwan and Turkey. Clinton's speaking fees were an astonishing 48 million dollars. When then-President-elect Barack Obama was negotiating with Hillary over the Secretary of State post Clinton promised there wouldn't be 'even the appearance of a conflict of interest.' 215 times ethics determinations were made on Bill Clinton speaking engagements that netted millions from countries while his wife was running foreign policy. Every single time the State Department found no potential conflict. Hillary's chief of staff was routinely copied on these determinations." [70342]

Although Obama has called Jonathan Gruber just "just some advisor who never worked on our staff," DailyCaller.com reports that Stephanie Cutter, his 2012 deputy campaign manager, "cited Jonathan Gruber as an 'architect' of Obamacare in a memo the campaign released ahead of a presidential debate with Mitt Romney." [70361] The Web site PamelaGeller.com (formerly AtlasShrugs.com) is hit with a "distributed denial of service" hack for more than 24 hours by her ideological enemies. (As *Timeline* readers know, Geller supports liberty, opposes radical Islam, and has been an outspoken opponent of Obama's foreign policy.) [70410, 70436]

Adam Kredo reports at FreeBeacon.com, "Iran is permitted to build new nuclear reactors under the existing conditions of an interim deal with the United States meant to curb Tehran's nuclear ambitions, a State Department official told the *Washington Free Beacon* less than a day after Iran announced the construction of two new nuclear plants. The construction of these new nuclear plants is not prohibited under existing United Nations restrictions or under the terms of the current interim nuclear agreement inked in 2013 with the United States, according to the State Department official. Iranian President Hassan Rouhani announced on Wednesday that Iran has begun construction on two new light water reactor nuclear plants in the southern Bushehr region. The announcement came as senior U.S. officials meet with their Iranian counterparts in Geneva for another round of talks." [70370]

HuffingtonPost.com reports, "Central Intelligence Agency Director John Brennan consulted the White House before directing agency personnel to sift through a walled-off computer drive being used by the Senate Intelligence Committee to construct its investigation of the agency's torture program, according to a recently released report by the CIA's Office of the Inspector General. The Inspector General's report, which was completed in July but only released by the agency on Wednesday, reveals that Brennan spoke with White House chief of staff Denis McDonough before CIA employees were ordered to 'use whatever means necessary' to determine how certain sensitive internal documents had wound up in Senate investigators' hands. The conversation with McDonough came after Brennan first issued the directive, but before he reiterated it to a CIA attorney leading the probe." (In other words, the White House knew and approved of the CIA's spying on the U.S. Senate and said nothing to Senators—including Dianne Feinstein (D-CA), who was incensed by the activities.) [70385, 70386]

On January 16 Obama advisor Valerie Jarrett appears on CNN and says, "...Certainly we would have liked to have participated in the parade [the Paris unity march]; I remind you that Attorney General [Eric] Holder was in Paris for a *very* important meeting, together with his colleagues from around Europe and around the world to take a look at, um, what we can do to make sure that we're cooperating fully, and so, I certainly think we got the substance right, but it would have been, it would have been great to participate in the parade and we're delighted that Secretary [of State John] Kerry is there [in Paris] now." (Of course, whether Holder was at a meeting is irrelevant to the fact that Obama was watching NFL playoff games in the White House rather than showing support for other nations in the fight against Islamist terrorism. Interestingly, Jarrett refers to the march as a "parade," as if there were clowns coming out of Volkswagen Beetles and beauty pageant winners waving from flower-covered floats. That is no doubt an intentional effort to ridicule the march as meaningless, and not important enough for Obama to have made any effort to join.) [70368]

In Paris, Kerry meets socialist French President Francois Hollande with a hug and kiss on the cheeks that many Americans will likely consider inappropriate. Kerry says, "I know you know that we share the pain and the horror of everything that you went through. Our hearts are with you." Also in Paris with Kerry is singer James Taylor, who performs *You've Got a Friend*. (Subtlety is apparently not one of the Obama administration's talents, but it may have mistaken Taylor for singer Cat Stevens, formerly Steven Demetre Georgiu, who converted to Islam and now calls himself Yusuf Islam.) At Spectator.org Aaron Goldstein writes, "It was far from Taylor's best rendition of the song and he knew it. By the end of it, he couldn't wait to get the hell out of there. But Kerry pulled him back to acknowledge the applause/humiliation. I feel sorry for James Taylor. I like his music and once saw him in concert. But neither he nor this song was right for this occasion. If Kerry wanted music for the occasion then bring along someone to sing 'La Marseillaise' [the French national anthem] or an Edith Piaf song." [70371, 70395, 70409, 70411, 70449, 70629]

WhiteHouseDossier.com's Keith Koffler writes, "Republicans should wait to enact new sanctions on Iran, both because ...Obama is correct that it's not worth rocking the boat at this point and because to do so would alleviate Obama of blame should his negotiations fail. It's very simple: Enact sanctions now and the minute talks collapse, Obama will blame Congress for what will mostly be his screw-up—he's on his third deadline—saying everything was going great and they were just about get a deal until Evil Republicans got in the way." [70493]

British Prime Minister David Cameron visits the White House, where he and Obama urge legislators not to vote to impose sanctions on Iran. Obama says, "Congress should be aware that if this diplomatic solution fails, then the risks and likelihood that this ends up being at some point a military confrontation is heightened, and Congress will have to own that as well. The likelihood of the entire negotiations collapsing is very high. And if that happens, there is no constraint on Iran, at that point, going back and doing exactly what it had been doing before they came to the table: developing a heavy-water reactor that, once built, is extraordinarily difficult to dismantle and very difficult to hit militarily." (The "diplomatic solution" has already failed. Iran has been dragging out the negotiations and forcing the extension of deadlines, while it continues its nuclear program unimpeded. Sanctions brought Iran to the table, at which point Obama weakened them and released billions of dollars in Iranian assets that had been frozen. Iran has been playing chess while Obama plays checkers. Obama will never persuade Iran to give up its nuclear program, just as he will never persuade it to accept the existence of Israel. [70632]

The Guardian writes, "In an unusual breach of diplomatic protocol, Cameron said he had spoken to two senators on Friday morning to warn them of the consequences of passing the bill. 'I may speak to one or two more this afternoon,' he added. 'Not in any way as British prime minister to tell the American Senate what it should or shouldn't do. That wouldn't be right. But simply to make the point as a country that stands alongside America in these vital negotiations that it's the opinion of the United Kingdom that further sanctions or further threat of sanctions at this point won't actually help to bring the talks to a successful conclusion, and they could fracture the international unity that there's been which has been so valuable in presenting a united front to Iran.'" (Cameron's statement is as ludicrous as Obama's. The point of his calling Senators is to persuade them not to impose further sanctions on Iran. Otherwise he would not be making the calls.) [70632]

At Townhall.com David Limbaugh writes, "[D]espite all the faux euphoria projected by the administration and the media, this economy is not bouncing back. According to Gallup CEO Jim Clifton, for the first time in 35 years, the United States is no longer first but 12th (12th!) among developed nations in business startup activity. More businesses are closing than opening. Four hundred thousand businesses are being born each year in America, but some 470,000 are closing. That's because America, under [Obama], is a business-hostile zone. What is ... Obama planning on doing about this disturbing problem? Two things. First, he will deny the problem even exists as he continues to fraudulently proclaim that America's businesses are smoking-hot. The Obama administration still refuses to say we're at war with radical Islam, despite extreme human rights abuses against the minorities they claim to stand up for." [70357]

Marilyn Tavenner, head of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, announces she will leave her position at the end of February. [70378, 70405]

White House press secretary Josh Earnest claims "only six percent or so" of the detainees released from Guantanamo have returned to active terrorism, refuting the estimates of about 30 percent. (Of course, no one can know with certainty how many have returned to the battlefield or jihadist plans because the released prisoners certainly are not keeping the U.S. military informed of their activities.) Asked by Fox News' Ed Henry whether even six percent is a problem, Earnest replies, "It is, and it's certainly why this administration continues to pursue a very aggressive counterterrorism strategy. At the same time... it would also be unwise to neglect the fact that our—the prison at Guantanamo Bay continues to inspire violent acts around the globe. So it's not as if we can avoid violence by just keeping the prison open and keeping them all locked up. We know that that continues to be an active source of inspiration and recruitment for terrorists." (Earnest's claim is absurd. Relocating every terrorist from Guantanamo to a prison within the continental United States will not eliminate radical Islamists from

engaging in terrorist attacks; nor would setting every remaining detainee free. The facility did not exist on September 11, 2001 and terrorists nevertheless attacked the United States. Earnest is following the leftist argument that "the chickens came home to roost" and that terrorism is nothing more than the logical response to U.S. "imperialism.") [70392, 70394]

During a White House news conference, Obama warns Congress against imposing new sanctions on Iran: "I've consistently said we leave all options on the table. But Congress should be aware that if this diplomatic solution fails, than the risks and likelihood this ends up at some point a military confrontation is heightened. And Congress will have to own that as well. And we may not be able to rebuild the kind of coalition we need in that context if the world believes we were not serious about negotiations. ... There is no good argument for us to try to undercut, undermine the negotiations until they've played themselves out. ... Congress needs to show patience. My main message to Congress is: 'Just hold your fire.'" (In other words, "My administration is going to keep playing the negotiations game while Iran continues its nuclear program, and anyone who stands in my way is in favor of war with Iran." Following Obama's appeasement policy is arguably the more dangerous path to take.) [70397, 70415, 70416]

The U.S. Supreme Court announces it will hear a gay marriage case in April. [70402, 70406]

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and NASA issue a report claiming that 2014 was the hottest year of the last 135 years. The discredited Pennsylvania State University professor Michael Mann states, "We are witnessing, before our eyes, the effect of human-caused climate change. It is exceptionally unlikely that we would be seeing a record year, during a record warming decade, during a multi-decadal period of warmth that appears to be unrivaled over at least the past millennium if it were not for the rising of planet-warming gases produced by fossil-fuel burning." (Mann is responsible for the infamous "hockey stick" graph, that intentionally distorted data in order to claim "man-caused global warming.") [70404, 70459, 70726, 70727]

WND.com reports, "A number of reputable scientists... immediately cast doubt on the federal government's declaration Friday. 'Using the normal rules of science, is 58.46 degrees then distinguishable from 58.45 degrees? In a word, 'No,' wrote Patrick J. Michaels on the Cato Institute website. His assessment was cited on Marc Morano's Climate Depot website, which routinely debunks claims of global warming. Climatologist Roy Spencer is quoted there: 'We are arguing over the significance of a hundredths of a degree.' And physicist Lubos Motl: 'Please laugh out loud when someone will be telling you that it was the warmest year.' ...Morano explained: 'There are dueling global datasets—surface temperature records and satellite records—and they disagree. The satellites show an 18 year plus global warming 'standstill' and the satellite was set up to be 'more accurate' than the surface records.' He argued any temperature claim of 'hottest year' based on surface data is based on hundredths of a degree hotter than previous 'hottest years.' 'This immeasurable difference is not even within the margin of error of temperature gauges. The claim of the 'hottest year' is simply a political statement not

based on temperature facts.' 'Hottest year' claims are based on minute fractions of a degree while ignoring satellite data showing earth is continuing the 18 plus year 'pause' or 'standstill,' he wrote." [70404, 70459, 70726, 70727, 70875, 71015]

CNSNews.com reports, "Even as gasoline prices plummeted and the overall energy price index calculated by the Bureau of Labor Statistics declined, electricity prices bucked the trend in the United States in 2014. Data released today by the BLS indicates that the electricity price indexes hit all-time highs for the month of December and for the year. 2014 was the most-expensive year ever for electricity in the United States." [70526]

On January 17 WashingtonTimes.com reports that Obama will call for a whopping \$320 billion in tax increases in his January 20 State of the Union address. Obama "will propose raising the top tax rate on capital gains to 28 percent, from the current 23.8 percent (20 percent, plus a 3.8 percent tax on unearned income to fund Obamacare) for individual taxpayers with an adjusted gross income of \$200,000 or more. ... Mr. Obama will propose using that new tax revenue to fund about \$235 billion in new spending initiatives and expanded tax credits for the middle-class, setting up a renewed battle with congressional Republicans, who largely oppose a hike in capital-gains taxes." (Increasing the capital gains tax is a good way to *prevent* job creation, because investors prefer to leave their assets untouched and unsold rather than liquidate them to get the cash necessary to invest in new businesses. Job creation was stifled when Obama and the Democrats increased the capital gains tax from 15 percent to 23.8 percent. Additionally, hikes in the capital gains tax almost never result in the increased tax revenue that the government anticipates. Apparently Obama is too stupid to comprehend that a 28 percent tax on nothing is not better than a 23.8 percent tax on something. That is, there are no gains to be taxed if investors choose not to not sell their assets. (The capital gains tax was 15 percent when Obama took office. He then jacked it up to 20 percent, and ObamaCare hiked it to 23.8 percent. Leaving it at 15 percent would have resulted in more job creation.) In a 2008 primary debate Obama told ABC's Charlie Gibson, "I would look at raising the capitalgains tax for purposes of fairness"-even though raising that tax would ultimately result in shrinking federal revenues. Gibson correctly pointed out that a higher capital gains tax typically means less tax revenue for the federal government, but Obama declared that he would raise it anyway (simply to punish people who make money through the capitalist system).) Obama also calls for a dramatic increase in the "death tax" by changing the manner in which it is calculated. Americans for Tax Reform (ATR) explains: "Under current law, when you inherit an asset your basis in the asset is the higher of the fair market value at the time of death or the decedent's original basis. Almost always, the fair market value is higher. Under the Obama proposal, when you inherit an asset your basis will simply be the decedent's original basis. Example: Dad buys a house for \$10,000. He dies and leaves it to you. The fair market value on the date of death is \$100,000. You sell it for \$120,000. Under current law, you have a capital gain of \$20,000 (sales price of \$120,000 less step up in basis of \$100,000). Under the Obama plan, you have a capital gain of \$110,000 (sales price of \$120,000 less original basis of \$10,000). There are exemptions for most households, but this misses the larger point: the whole reason we have step up in basis is

because we have a death tax. If you are going to hold an estate liable for tax, you can't then hold the estate liable for tax again when the inheritor sells it. This adds yet another redundant layer of tax on savings and investment. It's a huge tax hike on family farms and small businesses." [70451, 70452, 70658]

It is worth noting that if Obama's proposed estate tax increase were to be passed by Congress, it would result in lower real estate prices. If heirs cannot afford to pay outrageous estate taxes out of their own pockets, they will have to sell the houses, farms, and small businesses they inherited. More properties on the market results in lower real estate prices. As an example, if a young married couple bought a house in California decades ago for \$50,000 and it is worth \$1 million when they die, their children will have to pay taxes on the \$950,000 profit. If the surviving children cannot afford to pay the taxes, they will be forced to sell the house. If the number of such desperation sales is significant, real estate prices will naturally fall. To make matters worse, the parents may have taken out home equity loans on the property to put their children through college or for other purposes. In many cases, Obama's tax proposal would leave heirs with monumentally less than they would receive under current estate tax and capital gains tax rules—and the families harmed will *not* be limited to those that earn less than \$250,000 per year. According to ATR, Obama also wants a 0.07 percent "tax on the liabilities (not assets) of the 100 or so U.S. firms with assets over \$50 billion. This will obviously be passed along to these firms' customers and employees, since businesses don't pay taxes—people do." (At a time when the tax code should be simplified, Obama calls for even more complexity. Of course, he does not expect his proposals to pass. But he can spend two years criticizing the GOP for "protecting the rich" when his legislative proposals go nowhere.) [70452]

Absurdly, Obama wants to tax college savings plans ("Section 529 plans"), that are currently tax-free, by taxing earnings as ordinary income upon withdrawal. (The proposal violates Obama's 2008 pledge not to raise taxes on families earning less than \$250,000 per year.) On the one hand, Obama wants to make community college "free" so that more people can afford to attend. But on the other hand he wants to penalize the 12 million families with 529 plans that are saving for the college educations of their children. This would seem absolutely ridiculous to the average American-unless one sees the underlying motive: Obama wants no one independent: instead, he wants everyone dependent on government. (Penalizing college savings accounts will make families throw up their hands in despair and say, "I give up. I'll become a parasite, just like tens of millions of other Americans." The more people are dependent on government, the more people will vote to protect their hand-outs by reelecting socialists.) Obama's scheme would reportedly apply to future 529 college savings plans, but not those that have already been established. (That allows Obama to continue to accrue tax-free earnings on the \$240,000 account he set up in 2007 for his daughters' college educations.) [70452, 70457, 70523, 70688, 70738, 70781, 707981

White House press secretary Josh Earnest later tries to defend Obama's proposal to tax 529 plans, telling reporters, "The reforms [Obama] has proposed for the 529 program are reforms that he would consider only in the context of the other education reforms that he put forward. And there are a variety of proposals [Obama] put forward, some related to the tax code, but some also related to [his] proposal to make community college free for hard working students that [sic; who] are getting good grades. That would have the benefit of essentially cutting the cost of a four year education in half. If you can do the first two years at a community college and have them paid for then the next two years are something you can pay for and essentially your tuition costs have been cut in half." (In other words, "To hell with your plans to send your son or daughter to an excellent four-year college or university. Instead, we want to tax your college savings account and force your child to attend a community college for two years. After all, the government knows best, not you parents.") [70688, 70696]

Obama's budget proposal also includes a "second-earner tax credit" of \$500, applicable to many families where both the husband and wife work. (Obama apparently believes families that struggle because the mother has chosen to stay home to raise their children are second-class citizens.) According to Washington Examiner.com, Obama also wants to "expand the Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit. The child and dependent care credit is different from the more widely used child tax credit. The child care credit is a 50-percent tax credit for a parent's first \$2,000 in babysitting or daycare costs, but this credit is available only for parents who use the child care to do paid work. If you hire child care to take your car to the shop, get the kids safely out of range while you paint your living room or just get some peace and quiet while your husband is in Iowa for three days covering the presidential caucuses, no tax credit. Hire a babysitter in order to earn your own paycheck, and you get a tax credit." [70490, 70505, 70523, 70860, 70861, 70862]

Obama's proposal, of course, works against single-breadwinner families. (He apparently does not like mothers who stay home to raise children and would rather the government raise—and indoctrinate—them.) At NYTimes.com Josh Barro whines, "The tax code is already hugely distorted in favor of stay-at-home parenting: Labor outside the home is taxed; household work, such as stay-at-home parenting, is not." (Barro is parroting the leftist complaint that the government "loses" revenue because it does not tax work Americans do themselves. For example, if a homeowner hires a contractor to paint his house, that contractor pays tax on the house-painting fee he collects. But if a homeowner paints his own house, the government "loses" that tax revenue. Terry Jeffrey later provides an example at Townhall.com: "Compare two families, each with two children under three. They are happy to take it, dropping off their 1-year-old and 2-and-a-half-year-old at a for-profit daycare center where a relative stranger deals with them during the majority of their waking hours. In the second family, the mother—who has a college

degree and a solid work history prior to the arrival of her children—has decided she should nurture her own children rather than pay a daycare center to hold them. She has given up a \$60,000 per year job, and she and her husband now sacrifice and get by on his \$58,000 per year salary. What this mother gives her children for free is far more valuable than what the daycare center gives the children of the first family for a hefty fee. The first family has an income \$52,000 greater than the second. But Obama gives the first family, not the second, his tax credit. The mother in the second family gave up income and material comfort to raise her own children. For this, Obama punishes her with the tax code. The perversely logical corollary to Obama's desire to structure the tax code to the disadvantage of stay-at-home mothers is his desire to use tax dollars to replace working fathers with the government itself." Meanwhile, *International Business Times* reports, "Islamist terrorists are plotting to attack rallies held by Germany's far-right Pegida [Patriotic Europeans Against the Islamisation of the Occident] movement, according to intelligence sources. Foreign intelligence services have intercepted communications by 'known international jihadists' planning strikes against those taking part in the rallies of the group, which aims to halt what it describes as the 'Islamification' of Europe, according to AFP and Der Spiegel reports. The intelligence was passed to German authorities, with an unnamed and high-ranking security official telling Der Spiegel 'we take these leads very seriously.'" NYPost.com reports, "In a wild swing of the ax that has shocked many pundits, Wall Street's biggest banks have slashed nearly 50,000 jobs, and bonuses and expense money are being cut as profit opportunities dry up. And there's no easy way out, analysts say, because the Fed's [Federal Reserve's] quantitative easing [artificial expansion of the money supply] that once rescued the financial system with trillions of cheap dollars is at least for now—history. ...The fourth quarter saw thousands more workers fired. Total reductions for 2014 were about 20,000 at Brian Moynihan's Bank of America; 10,000 at Citigroup led by Michael Corbat; and 10,000 at Jaime Dimon's JP Morgan. Morgan Stanley reports on Tuesday. ...'Look, I think head count in the banking industry is likely to decline,' said CLSA investment group bank analyst Mike Mayo. 'And if this environment remains, headcount would get significantly reduced.' By Mayo's calculations, bank revenues are the weakest in eight decades, a shocking throwback to the Great Depression." Muslims attend a "Stand with the Prophet" event in Garland, Texas. The keynote speaker is imam Siraj Wahhaj, who WND.com notes once said, "It is my duty and our duty as Muslims to replace the U.S. Constitution with the Quran." Wahhaj was an unindicted coconspirator in the 1993 World Trade Center bombing, and is a friend of the bombing's planner, Omar Abdel Rahman (the "blind sheikh"). Several thousand protesters gather outside for a "Free Speech Rally." One demonstrator's sign reads, "Don't behead me, bro!!" Pamela Geller tells the crowd, "We're living in an age where evil is good, and good is evil. ... This is theater, and the media is the director. They're coming here to film a narrative. They're coming here to make you look bad. ... Never give them what they're looking for. They want you to say something wrong. They want you to have a bad sign [a placard with provocative wording]. Because that becomes the front page. ... You have a role here. Your role is an educator. Your message is beautiful. So please, be beautiful. Each of you are beautiful. Act beautiful and be righteous. Make the cause proud." She tells Breitbart.com, "The media can smear us and [Obama] can stand with [the radical Muslims]. We the people are not having it. If there is any proof of that, it's today. We dwarfed them [with our numbers]." (Earlier in the week, Geller wrote that the rally would "stand for the freedom of speech against all attempts, violent and stealthy, to impose Islamic blasphemy laws on Americans and stifle criticism of Muhammad and Islam.") On January 18 NYPost.com reports, "In top-secret talks to settle federal lawsuits against the NYPD for monitoring mosques, the city is weighing a demand that it scrub from its Web site a report on Islamic terrorists... The groundbreaking, 92-page report, titled 'Radicalization in the West: The Homegrown Threat,' angers critics who say it promotes 'religious profiling' and discrimination against Muslims. But law-enforcement sources say removing the report now would come at the worst time—after mounting terror attacks by Islamic extremists in Paris, Boston, Sydney and Ottawa. ... 'The harm is that it sends the message that the NYPD is going to back down on its counterterrorism effort in the name of political correctness,' said a former NYPD official. France has a reported 751 such zones (*Zones Urbaines Sensibiles*, or "sensitive urban zones"). In The New York Times, Marie Le Pen, leader of France's National Front, writes, "'To misname things is to add to the world's unhappiness.' Indeed, the French Foreign Minister Laurent Fabius no longer even dares pronounce the real name of things. ... Let us call things by their rightful names, since the French government seems reluctant to do so. France, land of human rights and freedoms, was attacked on its own soil by a totalitarian ideology: Islamic fundamentalism. It is only by refusing to be in denial, by looking the enemy in the eye, that one can avoid conflating issues. Muslims themselves need to hear this message. They need the distinction between Islamist terrorism and their faith to be made clearly. Yet this distinction can only be made if one is willing to identify the threat. It does our Muslim compatriots no favors to fuel suspicions and leave things unspoken. Islamist terrorism is a cancer on Islam, and Muslims themselves must fight it at our side. ... These mistakes must also be called by their names. I will mention only three, but they are of crucial importance. First, the dogma of the free movement of peoples and goods is so firmly entrenched among the leaders of the European Union that the very idea of border checks is deemed to be heretical. In the longer run, most important, national border checks must be reinstated, and there should be zero tolerance for any behavior that undermines laïcité and French law. Without such measures, no serious policy for combating fundamentalism is possible. France has just gone through 12 days it will never forget. After pausing to grieve its dead, it then rose up to defend its rights. Now the French people, as if a single person, must put pressure on their leaders so that these days in January will not have been in vain. From France's tragedy must spring hope for real change. The petty logic of political parties cannot be allowed to stifle the French people's legitimate aspirations to safety and liberty. We, the French, are viscerally attached to our laïcité, our sovereignty, our independence, our values. The world knows that when France is attacked it is liberty that is dealt a blow. I began by saying that we must call things by their names. I will end by saying that some names speak for themselves. The name of our country, France, still rings out like a call to freedom." The *Daily Mail* reports on a case of political correctness run amok: "A convicted Al-Qaeda terrorist with close links to the Paris massacre cannot be deported from Britain because it would breach his right to a family life... Baghdad Meziane was jailed for 11 years in 2003 for running a terror network recruiting jihadists and fund-raising for Al-Qaeda. But despite a judge saying he was a dangerous man and should serve his full sentence then be deported, he was released from prison five years early and allowed to return to his family home in Leicester. 'It's a nonsense that people who are a threat to our society are able to use their human rights to avoid being sent back to their home country when it is clear they have no regard for the human rights of our citizens,' he said." Obama advisor Dan Pfeiffer is interviewed by Bob Schieffer on *Face the Nation*. Schieffer says, "Let's just start with what [Obama] said overnight. [Obama] is going to announce a plan in the State of the Union [address] to raise \$320 billion in new taxes on the wealthy, that's over 10 years. Capital gains taxes are going up with this new revenue. He's going to do such things as provide free community college and so forth for people. New tax breaks for working families. Increased child care credit. I would just ask you this Mr. Pfeiffer: do you in any way shape or form believe that a new Republican Congress is going to do what a Congress that had Democrats and Republicans in control would not do? The Wall Street Journal writes that Obama is now objecting to Congressional support for what had been his Iran policy: "If Iran does not fully meet its commitments during this six-month phase, we will turn off the [sanctions] relief and ratchet up the pressure.' That was ... Obama in November 2013, pledging he would not allow an interim nuclear deal with Tehran to become an opportunity for the mullahs to play for time while wringing economic concessions from the West. [Obama's] interpretation of 'six months' turns out to be as elastic as his reading of U.S. immigration law. That became clear on Friday when Mr. Obama warned he would veto any Congressional attempt to impose sanctions on the Islamic Republic if the latest round of negotiations fail. 'My main message to Congress at this point is just hold your fire,' he said in a press conference with British Prime Minister David Cameron, who seconded [Obama's] plea and admits to personally lobbying U.S. Senators against sanctions legislation as if he is White House legislative liaison. What seems to exercise Mr. Obama is a Congress that holds his Administration to its word. 'The United States and our partners will not consent to an extension merely to drag out negotiations,' wrote Secretary of State John Kerry in a Washington Post op-ed last summer. Yet two deadlines to finalize a deal have come and gone. The next one expires in June.' [70465]

"The Administration's latest argument is that a sanctions bill would be interpreted as a hostile act by Tehran, potentially provoking retaliation while spoiling the diplomatic mood. The Administration also frets that it would disrupt unity among the so-called P5+1, referring to the permanent five members of the United Nations Security Council plus Germany, while the West would be blamed if negotiations fail. These are remarkable

claims about legislation that would penalize Iran only after the current deadline expires and if Iran does not come to terms. The bill that is likely to emerge after the Senate Banking Committee holds hearings Tuesday will be a revised version of last year's bipartisan Kirk-Menendez bill, named after [Senate] sponsors Republican Mark Kirk of Illinois and Democrat Robert Menendez of New Jersey. It would reimpose the sanctions Mr. Obama suspended when he signed the interim deal, impose visa bans and asset blocks on top Iranian officials, and further tighten oil and financial sanctions. Passing the bill now could help persuade Iranian negotiators that they cannot string the West along indefinitely without paying a price. Would that cause Iran to walk away from negotiations? That's a strange argument coming from an Administration that boasts that Iran agreed to the interim deal thanks to the bite of strong sanctions. Mr. Obama's real reason for opposing the bill may be that he knows it is also a message to him not to strike a bad deal. ... In any case this boils down to negotiating the terms of how easily Iran can violate the deal it is supposedly pledging not to violate. That is the measure of how much Iran has gained in these talks so far. ... The next two years will be full of foreign-policy dangers as adversaries seek to exploit Mr. Obama's weakness and desire for diplomatic agreements of any kind. Passing Kirk-Menendez would at least send a signal that the American people are not as pliable and that help is on the way after 2016." [70465]

Republic Day honors the date when the Constitution of India took effect (Jan. 26, 1950). Obama will also take the first lady to the Taj Mahal in Agra (about 140 miles south of New Delhi). ... As of July 2014, the Obama clan had already spend a whopping \$44,351,777.12 in taxpayer funds on vacations. That dollar amount is obviously substantially higher now. In 2008, thencandidate Obama promised gullible New York Times columnist Bob Herbert that he would not to take vacations if he were elected president." Similarly, the proHezbollah *al-Akhbar* in Lebanon announced, 'Israel will not be able to prevent Hezbollah from sending its forces into Galilee. ... That works out to \$1.69 per hour, assuming a 40-hour work week. The 39.2 percent figure is the nonpartisan Tax Policy Center's estimate of the average corporate tax rate in America, which is the highest in the world. Finally, the administration has called for adding up to seven days of paid sick leave annually, which IBD estimates would cost employers another 30 cents per hour. Along with the other proposals, that works out to an additional labor cost of \$5.06 an hour." (If the minimum wage were boosted to \$10.10 per hour, any new minimum wage employee would actually cost the employer about \$15.00 per hour. The result would be

fewer unskilled Americans getting hired, because employers simply do not think their labor is worth \$15 per hour.) [70488]

No injuries were reported. ...Two U.S. Navy warships moved into new positions in the Red Sea late Monday to be ready to evacuate Americans from the embassy if needed, a U.S. official with direct knowledge of the planning told CNN..." [The point of] taxes are to bring in revenue. Obama's answer, a famous answer, was, 'Yes in the name of fairness.' This is a man who wants to punish the rich regardless of its effect on the economy. If it were to help the economy I would be in favor of it. [But] It would have the exact opposite effect." (Raising the capital gains tax actually reduces tax revenue because investors simply hold on to their assets. If their assets are not sold, there is no

capital gains to tax. Obama does not understand that 30 percent of nothing is not better than 15 percent of something.) [70485]

Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, leader of ISIS, is reportedly injured in an Iraqi airstrike on the town of Al-Qa'im. [70498]

Obama delivers his sixth State of the Union address (which talk show host and author Mark Levin calls Obama's "State of Delusion" speech), offering the usual laundry list of tax-and-spend Democrat proposals of tax increases for the wealthiest Americans and "free stuff" for select voting blocs. (Among Obama's guests in the House chamber, sitting with Michelle Obama, is illegal immigrant Ana Zamora. Her presence is clearly intended by Obama to be a poke in the eye of Republicans.) Obama begins by bragging, "Tonight, after a breakthrough year for America, our economy is growing and creating jobs at the fastest pace since 1999. Our unemployment rate is now lower than it was before the financial crisis. More of our kids are graduating than ever before; more of our people are insured than ever before; we are as free from the grip of foreign oil as we've been in almost 30 years. Tonight, for the first time since 9/11, our combat mission in Afghanistan is over." (The mission is merely "over." Obama cannot say the United States won the war.) "Six years ago, nearly 180,000 American troops served in Iraq and Afghanistan. Today, fewer than 15,000 remain. And we salute the courage and sacrifice of every man and woman in this 9/11 Generation who has served to keep us safe. We are humbled and grateful for your service. America, for all that we've endured; for all the grit and hard work required to come back; for all the tasks that lie ahead, know this: The shadow of crisis has passed, and the State of the Union is strong." (Obama does not mention the decades-low labor participation rate, the \$18+ trillion national debt, or the \$200+ trillion in unfunded Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, and other liabilities; those are apparently not crises.) "At this moment—with a growing economy, shrinking deficits, bustling industry, and booming energy production-we have risen from recession freer to write our own future than any other nation on Earth. It's now up to us to choose who we want to be over the next fifteen years, and for decades to come. Will we accept an economy where only a few of us do spectacularly well? Or will we commit ourselves to an economy that generates rising incomes and chances for everyone who makes the effort? Will we approach the world fearful and reactive, dragged into costly conflicts that strain our military and set back our standing? Or will we lead wisely, using all elements of our power to defeat new threats and protect our planet? Will we allow ourselves to be sorted into factions and turned against one another-or will we recapture the sense of common purpose that has always propelled America forward? In two weeks, I will send this Congress a budget filled with ideas that are practical, not partisan. And in the months ahead, I'll crisscross the country making a case for those ideas." (DailySignal.com notes, "The average annual deficit over the next decade is projected at \$950 billion, just shy of a trillion. Starting this year and looking out as far as projections go, the deficit—absent further policy changes is only heading in one direction: Up." Those projections come from the Congressional Budget Office.) [70479, 70541]

"...So the verdict is clear. Middle-class economics works." (According to the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, median household income in 2007 was \$56,436. By 2013 it had fallen to \$51,939. On average, middle-class Americans are worse off than they were when Obama took office in January 2009.) "Expanding opportunity works. And these policies will continue to work, as long as politics don't get in the way. We can't slow down businesses or put our economy at risk with government shutdowns or fiscal showdowns. We can't put the security of families at risk by taking away their health insurance, or unraveling the new rules on Wall Street, or refighting past battles on immigration when we've got a system to fix. And if a bill comes to my desk that tries to do any of these things, it will earn my veto. Today, thanks to a growing economy, the recovery is touching more and more lives. Tonight, together, let's do more to restore the link between hard work and growing opportunity for every American. ...[A]t every moment of economic change throughout our history, this country has taken bold action to adapt to new circumstances, and to make sure everyone gets a fair shot. We set up worker protections, Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid to protect ourselves from the harshest adversity. We gave our citizens schools and colleges, infrastructure and the internet-tools they needed to go as far as their effort will take them. That's what middleclass economics is-the idea that this country does best when everyone gets their fair shot, everyone does their fair share, and everyone plays by the same set of rules. We don't just want everyone to share in America's success-we want everyone to contribute to our success." [70479, 70702, 70703]

"[M]iddle-class economics means helping working families feel more secure in a world of constant change. That means helping folks afford childcare, college, health care, a home, retirement—and my budget will address each of these issues, lowering the taxes of working families and putting thousands of dollars back into their pockets each year. ...In today's economy, when having both parents in the workforce is an economic necessity for many families, we need affordable, high-quality childcare more than ever. It's not a nice-to-have—it's a must-have. It's time we stop treating childcare as a side issue, or a women's issue, and treat it like the national economic priority that it is for all of us. And that's why my plan will make quality childcare more available, and more affordable, for every middle-class and low-income family with young children in America—by creating more slots and a new tax cut of up to \$3,000 per child, per year. ...I'll be taking new action to help states adopt paid leave laws of their own. And since paid sick leave won where it was on the ballot last November, let's put it to a vote right here in Washington. Send me a bill that gives every worker in America the opportunity to earn seven days of paid sick leave. It's the right thing to do." [70479]

"Of course, nothing helps families make ends meet like higher wages. That's why this Congress still needs to pass a law that makes sure a woman is paid the same as a man for

doing the same work. Really. It's 2015. It's time. We still need to make sure employees get the overtime they've earned. And to everyone in this Congress who still refuses to raise the minimum wage, I say this: If you truly believe you could work full-time and support a family on less than \$15,000 a year, go try it. If not, vote to give millions of the hardest-working people in America a raise. These ideas won't make everybody rich, or relieve every hardship. That's not the job of government. To give working families a fair shot, we'll still need more employers to see beyond next quarter's earnings and recognize that investing in their workforce is in their company's long-term interest. We still need laws that strengthen rather than weaken unions, and give American workers a voice. But things like child care and sick leave and equal pay; things like lower mortgage premiums and a higher minimum wage-these ideas will make a meaningful difference in the lives of millions of families. That is a fact. And that's what all of us-Republicans and Democrats alike—were sent here to do." (Obama refuses to acknowledge that the Equal Pay Act was signed into law by President Kennedy in 1963. For 50 years it has been against federal law to pay an employee less because of gender. Female workers do not need new laws; they need Obama's Department of Justice and Department of Labor to enforce existing laws.) [70479, 70542]

"...By the end of this decade, two in three job openings will require some higher education. Two in three. And yet, we still live in a country where too many bright, striving Americans are priced out of the education they need. It's not fair to them, and it's not smart for our future. That's why I am sending this Congress a bold new plan to lower the cost of community college—to zero. ...I want to spread that idea all across America, so that two years of college becomes as free and universal in America as high school is today. And I want to work with this Congress, to make sure Americans already burdened with student loans can reduce their monthly payments, so that student debt doesn't derail anyone's dreams. ... 21st century businesses need 21st century infrastructure—modern ports, stronger bridges, faster trains and the fastest internet. Democrats and Republicans used to agree on this. So let's set our sights higher than a single oil pipeline. Let's pass a bipartisan infrastructure plan that could create more than thirty times as many jobs per year, and make this country stronger for decades to come." [70479]

"...Now, the truth is, when it comes to issues like infrastructure and basic research, I know there's bipartisan support in this chamber. Members of both parties have told me so. Where we too often run onto the rocks is how to pay for these investments. As Americans, we don't mind paying our fair share of taxes, as long as everybody else does, too. But for far too long, lobbyists have rigged the tax code with loopholes that let some corporations pay nothing while others pay full freight. They've riddled it with giveaways the superrich don't need, denying a break to middle class families who do. This year, we have an opportunity to change that. Let's close loopholes so we stop rewarding companies that keep profits abroad, and reward those that invest in America. Let's use those savings to rebuild our infrastructure and make it more attractive for companies to bring jobs home. Let's simplify the system and let a small business owner file based on her actual bank statement, instead of the number of accountants she can afford. And let's close the loopholes that lead to inequality by allowing the top one percent to avoid paying taxes on their accumulated wealth. We can use that money to help more families pay for

childcare and send their kids to college. We need a tax code that truly helps working Americans trying to get a leg up in the new economy, and we can achieve that together." [70479]

"... My first duty as Commander-in-Chief is to defend the United States of America. In doing so, the question is not whether America leads in the world, but how. When we make rash decisions, reacting to the headlines instead of using our heads; when the first response to a challenge is to send in our military—then we risk getting drawn into unnecessary conflicts, and neglect the broader strategy we need for a safer, more prosperous world. That's what our enemies want us to do. I believe in a smarter kind of American leadership. We lead best when we combine military power with strong diplomacy; when we leverage our power with coalition building; when we don't let our fears blind us to the opportunities that this new century presents. That's exactly what we're doing right now—and around the globe, it is making a difference. ...In Cuba, we are ending a policy that was long past its expiration date. When what you're doing doesn't work for fifty years, it's time to try something new. Our shift in Cuba policy has the potential to end a legacy of mistrust in our hemisphere; removes a phony excuse for restrictions in Cuba; stands up for democratic values; and extends the hand of friendship to the Cuban people. And this year, Congress should begin the work of ending the embargo." [70479]

"...Our diplomacy is at work with respect to Iran, where, for the first time in a decade, we've halted the progress of its nuclear program and reduced its stockpile of nuclear material. Between now and this spring, we have a chance to negotiate a comprehensive agreement that prevents a nuclear-armed Iran; secures America and our allies—including Israel; while avoiding yet another Middle East conflict. There are no guarantees that negotiations will succeed, and I keep all options on the table to prevent a nuclear Iran. But new sanctions passed by this Congress, at this moment in time, will all but guarantee that diplomacy fails—alienating America from its allies; and ensuring that Iran starts up its nuclear program again. It doesn't make sense. That is why I will veto any new sanctions bill that threatens to undo this progress. The American people expect us to only go to war as a last resort, and I intend to stay true to that wisdom." [70479]

Obama says, "No challenge—no challenge—poses a greater threat to future generations than climate change," and claims "2014 was the planet's warmest year on record. Now, one year doesn't make a trend, but this does—14 of the 15 warmest years on record have all fallen in the first 15 years of this century. I've heard some folks try to dodge the evidence by saying they're not scientists; that we don't have enough information to act. Well, I'm not a scientist, either. But you know what—I know a lot of really good scientists at NASA, and NOAA, and at our major universities. The best scientists in the world are all telling us that our activities are changing the climate, and if we do not act forcefully, we'll continue to see rising oceans, longer, hotter heat waves, dangerous droughts and floods, and massive disruptions that can trigger greater migration, conflict, and hunger around the globe. The Pentagon says that climate change poses immediate risks to our national security. We should act like it." (Obama does not mention that the margin of error in the NASA study is greater than the actual temperature increase that

allegedly made 2014 the hottest year on record since 1880. Nor does Obama explain that temperatures have not been uniformly recorded in the same locations since 1880. Additionally, more than a few of "the best scientists in the world" disagree with Obama.) [70479, 70508, 70571]

"As Americans, we respect human dignity, even when we're threatened, which is why I've prohibited torture, and worked to make sure our use of new technology like drones is properly constrained. It's why we speak out against the deplorable anti-Semitism that has resurfaced in certain parts of the world. "As Americans, we have a profound commitment to justice—so it makes no sense to spend three million dollars per prisoner to keep open a prison that the world condemns and terrorists use to recruit. Since I've been [in the Oval Office], we've worked responsibly to cut the population of GTMO in half. Now it's time to finish the job. And I will not relent in my determination to shut it down. It's not who we are." (The taxpayers can save a fortune by emptying every prison in the country as well, but that doesn't make doing so a good idea.) [70479]

"...You know, just over a decade ago, I gave a speech in Boston where I said there wasn't a liberal America, or a conservative America; a black America or a white America—but a United States of America. I said this because I had seen it in my own life, in a nation that gave someone like me a chance; because I grew up in Hawaii, a melting pot of races and customs; because I made Illinois my home—a state of small towns, rich farmland, and one of the world's great cities; a microcosm of the country where Democrats and Republicans and Independents, good people of every ethnicity and every faith, share certain bedrock values. Over the past six years, the pundits have pointed out more than once that my [administration] hasn't delivered on this vision. How ironic, they say, that our politics seems more divided than ever. It's held up as proof not just of my own flaws—of which there are many—but also as proof that the vision itself is misguided, and naïve, and that there are too many people in this town who actually benefit from partisanship and gridlock for us to ever do anything about it. I know how tempting such cynicism may be. But I still think the cynics are wrong. I still believe that we are one people. I still believe that together, we can do great things, even when the odds are long." [70479]

"...So the question for those of us here tonight is how we, all of us, can better reflect America's hopes. I've served in Congress with many of you. I know many of you well. There are a lot of good people here, on both sides of the aisle. And many of you have told me that this isn't what you signed up for—arguing past each other on cable shows, the constant fundraising, always looking over your shoulder at how the base will react to every decision. [Immediately after Obama's speech, he sends a fundraising email to his supporters—as do the Democrat National Committee and the Democrat Congressional Campaign Committee.] Imagine if we broke out of these tired old patterns. Imagine if we did something different. Understand—a better politics isn't one where Democrats abandon their agenda or Republicans simply embrace mine. "We still may not agree on a woman's right to choose, but surely we can agree it's a good thing that teen pregnancies and abortions are nearing all-time lows, and that every woman should have access to the health care she needs. Yes, passions still fly on immigration, but surely we can all see something of ourselves in the striving young student, and agree that no one benefits when a hardworking mom is taken from her child, and that it's possible to shape a law that upholds our tradition as a nation of laws and a nation of immigrants. We may go at it in campaign season, but surely we can agree that the right to vote is sacred; that it's being denied to too many; and that, on this 50th anniversary of the great march from Selma to Montgomery and the passage of the Voting Rights Act, we can come together, Democrats and Republicans, to make voting easier for every single American. We may have different takes on the events of Ferguson and New York. But surely we can understand a father who fears his son can't walk home without being harassed. Surely we can understand the wife who won't rest until the police officer she married walks through the front door at the end of his shift. Surely we can agree it's a good thing that for the first time in 40 years, the crime rate and the incarceration rate have come down together, and use that as a starting point for Democrats and Republicans, community leaders and law enforcement, to reform America's criminal justice system so that it protects and serves us all." "That's a better politics. That's how we start rebuilding trust. That's how we move this country forward. That's what the American people want. That's what they deserve. I have no more campaigns to run." (After applause from the Republican side of the chamber, Obama adds, in an obviously well-planned "ad lib," "I know, 'cause I won both of them"—which elicits applause, cheers, and jeering from the Democrats.) My only agenda for the next two years is the same as the one I've had since the day I swore an oath on the steps of this Capitol—to do what I believe is best for America. If you share the broad vision I outlined tonight, join me in the work at hand. If you disagree with parts of it, I hope you'll at least work with me where you do agree. And I commit to every Republican here tonight that I will not only seek out your ideas, I will seek to work with you to make this country stronger. Because I want this chamber, this city, to reflect the truth—that for all our blind spots and shortcomings, we are a people with the strength and generosity of spirit to bridge divides, to unite in common effort, and help our neighbors, whether down the street or on the other side of the world. I want our actions to tell every child, in every

neighborhood: your life matters, and we are as committed to improving your life chances as we are for our own kids. I want future generations to know that we are a people who see our differences as a great gift, that we are a people who value the dignity and worth of every citizen—man and woman, young and old, black and white, Latino and Asian, immigrant and Native American, gay and straight, Americans with mental illness or physical disability." [70479, 70533, 70553, 70665]

"I want them to grow up in a country that shows the world what we still know to be true: that we are still more than a collection of red states and blue states; that we are the United States of America. ...My fellow Americans, we too are a strong, tight-knit family. We, too, have made it through some hard times. Fifteen years into this new century, we have picked ourselves up, dusted ourselves off, and begun again the work of remaking America. We've laid a new foundation. A brighter future is ours to write. Let's begin this new chapter—together—and let's start the work right now. Thank you, God bless you, and God bless this country we love." [70479]

Obama does not mention al-Qaeda once during his speech. Nor does he mention the collapse of the government in Yemen, the atrocities of Boko Haram in Nigeria, or the ongoing disaster in Libya. [70575]

During his speech, Obama refers to a guest in the audience, Rebekah Erler, who wrote him a letter about her economic hardships and whose life has been turned around by his "middle-class policies." (Obama neglects to mention that Erler is a former Democrat operative and campaign staffer who has been used in the past for propaganda photo-ops.) [70622, 70624, 70626]

During Obama's speech, Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg falls asleep. (She later tells an audience at George Washington University, "The audience, for the most part, is awake because they're bobbing up and down all the time and we sit there stone-faced, sober judges. At least I wasn't 100 percent sober because before we went to the State of the Union we had dinner. ...Justice Kennedy brought in ...it was an Opus something or other, very fine California wine that Justice Kennedy brought and I vowed this year just sparkling water, stay away from the wine. But in the end, the dinner was so delicious, it needed wine to accompany it. So I got a call when I came home from one of my granddaughters and she said, 'Bubbe, you were sleeping at the State of the Union." [70557, 70558, 70568, 71560, 75161]

On Fox News, a focus group of Republicans and Democrats dial positive or negative reactions into an electronic device during Obama's speech. As he says, "America, for all that we've endured; for all the grit and hard work required to come back; for all the tasks that lie ahead, know this: The shadow of crisis has passed, and the State of the Union is strong," the group's members all enter dramatic, negative responses. Even if Obama believes the state of the union is strong, the average American does not. [70576, 70577]

Will Antonin tweets, "Crumbling infrastructure, poor education, high energy costs: man, I hope Obama can save us from whoever's been in charge these last 6 years." [70558]

According to Nielsen ratings, an estimated 33.3 million viewers watch Obama's speech, down from 37.8 million in January 2014 and the smallest audience since 2000. Variety.com reports, "Fox News Channel averaged 4,718,853 viewers—more than double MSNBC (2,292,169) and CNN (2,081,431). FNC held a sizable advantage in the key news demo of adults 25-54 as well (1,197,554), with CNN ranking second by this measure (762,450) and MSNBC third (752,054). ...On the broadcast side, CBS led in average audience for the SOTU address, while NBC was tops in key demos. For the post-address analysis, NBC led with 6.702 million viewers... while CBS drew 6.558 million... and ABC bagged 5.565 million..." [70578, 70617]

Newly-elected Senator Joni Ernst (R-IA) delivers the Republican response to Obama's address. [70486, 70544, 70562]

MSNBC's Ronan "Sinatra" Farrow tweets, "Joni Ernst delivering response in the style of an in-flight safety video." (Mary Katharine Hamm writes, "It's not the end of the world, but how fast would this have become, 'My, that strong, woman veteran who is a United States Senator sure does remind me of a sweet stewardess I once met in Milwaukee,' in the hands of the media had roles [political parties] been reversed. Anyway, I'm not outraged, but I do like to point out the double standard.") [70562]

On MSNBC, Andrea Mitchell says Obama's "economic message... is so politically in tune with where the broad specter of the American people are. He's laying out themes that are equidistant between the [Senator] Elizabeth Warren [D-MA] and Hillary Clinton branches of the Democratic Party, and I think that he's setting up a legacy campaign. He wants to take ownership of 2016, and... he's not going to be the main Democratic figure this time next year, but he still has a lot of influence over how the Democratic Party evolves..." (Inasmuch as Obama's economic message is essentially, "The government will give you free stuff paid for by others," it is not surprising that it is "in tune" with many Americans.) [70554]

Chris Matthews says to Mitchell, "...I kept thinking tonight that there's a real world out there [Obama] didn't really talk about, and [he] had perhaps overambitious notions about where we stood in the war against ISIL, the Islamic State. He doesn't want to call it the Islamic State, but that's what they call themselves. Those two Japanese people [being held captive by ISIS] with no guilt on their shoulders, just staring there out of the desert who are going to be apparently decapitated—that reality, what's going on in Nigeria [with Boko Haram terrorism] is reality. How close was [Obama] to reality overall, globally, tonight?" Mitchell responds, "I think that on foreign policy, his projection of success against terrorism and against ISIS, in particular, ...is not close to reality. They have not come up with a strategy, and they've built a global coalition, but again, he's talked about Ukraine, he's talked about Putin being isolated. Yes, Putin is isolated economically and the falling oil prices have hammered his economy. But at the same time, there's renewed fighting in Donetsk, and we haven't figured out Ukraine, we haven't figured out how the NATO alliance can push back. Sanctions have not really worked, and Ukraine is going to need more weaponry, and they have not reached that point. So you're right, Chris, it doesn't match the reality." [70561]

On CBS, Bob Schieffer says, "I think it's the best speech he's made in awhile. ...[T]onight, going into a House there where you had a majority of Republicans for the first time, he seemed more relaxed and more at ease than I can recall in a long time. It was a speech aimed directly at the middle class. It was a speech aimed at putting Republicans on the defensive. ...One of the things... we [journalists] talked about [was] how he rolled out so much of this before this speech tonight. Tonight, he could use the soaring rhetoric. He didn't have to go into details about, hey, you're the one whose taxes are going to be raised, and so forth, to pay for all of this. So probably, there was—that was maybe a smart thing to do, because tonight, this was a—this was a State of the Union speech that had more soaring rhetoric in it. It was uplifting at the end. Too many times, these are laundry lists of things and programs and get into a lot of details that just kind of bog him down. This was not that kind of a speech tonight, and I think that's why it went over well." (Giving your spouse ticket to an around-the-world cruise might "go over well" too—if you do not have to explain that you went deep into debt to pay for it.) [70555]

Senator Orrin Hatch (R-UT) responds to Obama's address, saying he "missed a real opportunity to put forward a bold economic vision that meets the demands of the American people and puts an aggressive jobs agenda center stage. From overreaching regulations to higher taxes that fuel more government spending to premature veto threats and a refusal to enforce laws he doesn't agree with, ...Obama's unilateralism and refusal to set politics aside further demonstrates his unwillingness to work together and reach lasting solutions for the American people. Our country deserves something other and better than [Obama's] politics of division. It's time for all of us, Republicans and Democrats alike, to come together and unite behind an agenda that will move America forward." [70535]

Kevin Martin, a member of the Project 21 black leadership network, comments that Obama "really did not offer anything new in his address to Congress. All he did was present the American people with the same old clunker policies sprayed with a new car scent. ...Obama wants more new taxes and more new spending, but he seems unwilling to do anything substantial to reduce our national debt, curtail unfunded liabilities, shrink the bureaucracy or really fight fraud and waste in our government. Conservatives, on the other hand, have preached that it's the spirit of the individual—and not government—that has made America successful, and it's that spirit that can once again return us to greatness. The Washington Post's Chris Cillizza comments, "Obama tone and demeanor tonight to me is the story: Confident, confident, confident. And not keen on reaching out to GOP. At all." [70593]

TruthRevolt.org's Ben Shapiro: "The good news is that we know Obama eats his fiber, since he just dropped an epic load of crap in Congress." [70593]

On NBC, Brian Williams addresses chief foreign correspondent Richard Engel: "Richard, we woke up here in the States this morning-[to a] new ISIS video, two Japanese hostages, they're asking for 200 hundred thousand dollars [sic; \$200 million], or they're going to assassinate both of them, video of a Russian intelligence ship cruising into the harbor in Havana—[it] might as well have been 1962. And then this on-again, off-again possible coup in Yemen, a U.S. ally... What did you make of that portion of [Obama's] speech?" Engel replies, "Well, it sounded like [Obama] was outlining a world that he wishes we were all living in, but which is very different than the world that you just described, with terror raids taking place across Europe, ISIS very much on the move. One thing [Obama] said is that American leadership... 'is stopping ISIL's advance.' That just isn't the case, according to military officials I've been speaking to. They [ISIS] are taking new territory, the U.S. is removing, by that I mean killing, about a thousand ISIS fighters in Iraq and Syria every month, but they are replacing those with new recruits, with 1,500 fighters. ...[Obama] talked about building the moderate Syrian opposition. That effectively isn't happening. There is no real support for the moderate Syrian opposition. In fact, one military official told me that they are calling the moderate Syrian opposition the 'unicorn' because they have not been able to find it." [70559]

Former U.S. ambassador to the United Nations states, "I think the ISIS threat is growing. They have consolidated control over the territory. They have seized, going back a year now, a year since they took Fallujah, seven months since they took Mosul. And they see weakness on the American side. They think it's winning support among colleagues in the region. ...[Obama] is living in a dream world [when he says he is stopping the advance of ISIS]. The fact is, we have no effective way of containing ISIS. I think moderate Arab regimes in the region, the king of Jordan, the oil-producing monarchies of the Iranian Peninsula, are in fear of what ISIS will do. [Obama's] notion that we have got opportunities is belied by the continued Iranian progress towards a deliverable nuclear weapons capability. The Middle East is descending into chaos and we are watching." [70570]

Some will argue that Obama used his speech to challenge Republicans by outlining proposals they will likely never pass. But he may also have been challenging Hillary Clinton with policies that she is less likely to support than her possible 2016 primary challenger, Senator Elizabeth Warren (D-MA). Warren is more than comfortable with soak-the-rich schemes, denunciations of Wall Street (even though she herself is a millionaire), and plans for grandiose expansions of government. Clinton, on the other

hand, is far less likely to go along with Obama proposals to tax college savings accounts and again increase the capital gains tax. That is, Obama is not just pushing his leftist vision to poke a finger in the eye of Republican legislators, he is lining up the 2016 goalposts for the Democrat candidate who most believes in that collectivist, socialist vision.

On January 21 Obama advisor Valerie Jarrett appears on Fox & Friends and is asked by Elizabeth Hasselbeck, "For the first time since 9/11, the words al-Qaeda were not used in a State of the Union address. Why is it, in fact, because I think the American people deserve accurate terminology here, why won't [Obama] say Islamic extremism or radical Islam? Why?" Jarrett replies, "Well, first of all, there is nothing more important to [Obama] than the safety and the security of the American people. That's his focus. That's his first priority. That's what he's dedicated to doing. And many of the countries who are helping us fight terrorism are Islamic majority countries. And let's look right here at home, where there is a Sikh temple in Wisconsin or a, uh, the Holocaust Museum right here in Washington, D.C. Those were terrorists. Those were extremists, but they weren't of any particular faith. And so before we start throwing around labels, let's look more broadly at terrorism. Let's not limit it. Let's look broadly at it and let's attack it together, and that's what [Obama] is absolutely—" Hasselbeck: "Miss Jarrett, there are other nations, leaders that have come out with specifics in terms of saying radical Islam. Does [Obama] find it more offensive that radical Islam exists or the term radical Islam? Which is more offensive to [Obama]?" Jarrett: "You know what, I think his philosophy is let's keep America safe and let's focus on that. Let's put the American people's safety first. Let's use both our diplomatic and our military power. We're the strongest military power in the world. But he also believes in diplomacy. Let's focus on that and let's keep our perspective and let's look wherever we can across the world, working with our allies and partners on seeing what we can do to end terrorism of all forms." Meanwhile, Nasr Al-Ansi, a spokesman for al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP), advises jihadists in the West not to travel to the Middle East to fight but should instead commit acts of terror at home. [70991]

On the *Today* show, Vice President Joe Biden defends Obama's call for increases in the capital gains tax and the estate ""death") tax: "There's nothing partisan about saying that this really unique group of people gets an extra \$210 billion, the so-called 'trust fund babies' …Nobody thinks there's any productive value to that and no one thinks it's going to damage the wealth or the capability of people who have that kind of—that kind of money." (Obama's tax increases would impact *millions* of Americans—not just the "trust fund babies" who might inherent fortunes from people like Donald Trump, Oprah Winfrey, Warren Buffett, or Tom Steyer. Increases in the estate tax will force many middle-class Americans to sell family farms and businesses when the owner dies.) [70619]

At Spectator.org Ben Stein writes, "I watched Mr. Obama's SOTU speech. It was great. Give everyone free day care. Who pays for it? Where do they find enough qualified daycare workers? Where do they train them? Everyone gets free education. Wait. Isn't public education up through high school already free? And the ones who need it most, the blacks and Hispanics, drop out at terrifying rates. Who will make them stay in school and do their homework? Who pays for this? And where do the teachers come from? Senator Bob Menendez (D-NJ), ranking Democrat on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, states, "I have to be honest with you, the more I hear from the administration and its quotes, the more it sounds like talking points that come straight out of Tehran. And it feeds to the Iranian narrative of victimization when they are the ones with original sin—an illicit nuclear weapons program, going back over the course of 20 years, that they are unwilling to come clean on." Townhall.com political editor Guy Benson comments, "The Senate may have the votes to override an Obama veto, as Menendez isn't alone among alarmed Democrats. Tuesday night, it was 'free' college tuition, daycare, paid leave ...the whole, always expanding list. ...[Obama] lives in a great dream palace, his innocence never corrupted by workaday considerations like reality, or even Economics 101. That sort of thing is for those of us who have to live in the real world rather than his. But never fear. With Obama lacking a backbone to even identify radical Islam as a problem, let alone commit to its destruction, House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) invites Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu to address the U.S. House of Representatives. According to the Associated Press, Boehner "released a letter extending the invitation to Benjamin Netanyahu for Feb. 11. Boehner also told a private meeting of GOP lawmakers that Congress would proceed on new penalties against Iran despite Obama's warning that any legislation would scuttle diplomatic negotiations over the country's nuclear program. 'You may have seen that on Friday, [Obama] warned us not to move ahead with sanctions on Iran, a state sponsor of terror,' Boehner told colleagues, according to his office. 'His exact message to us was: 'Hold your fire.' He expects us to stand idly by and do nothing while he cuts a bad deal with Iran. 'Two words: 'Hell no!' ... We're going to do no such thing,' the speaker said. ... The high-stakes invitation came just hours after Obama, in his State of the Union address, told Congress that he would veto any sanctions legislation and he urged Congress to delay further penalties against Iran. ... Boehner said in a statement that Netanyahu 'is a great friend of our country, and this invitation carries with it our unwavering commitment to the security and well-being of his people. In this time of challenge, I am asking the prime minister to address Congress on the grave threats radical Islam and Iran pose to our security and way of life. Americans and Israelis have always stood together in shared cause and common ideals, and now we must rise to the moment again.""

The White House, which has called Netanyahu a "coward" and a "chickenshit" leader, whines that Boehner is not following "protocol." But when Boehner did follow protocol when previously seeking to invite Netanyahu to address Congress, the White House reaction was different. Bruce Bialoski writes at Townhall.com, "Soon after becoming Speaker in 2011, Boehner had gone through 'proper channels' to invite Prime Minister Netanyahu to speak to Congress. Boehner's chief of staff, Barry Jackson, checked with Obama's chief advisers. Jackson stated he was left hanging for a month with no response from Obama. ... As confirmed in Politico, Thomas Donilon, who was Obama's national security advisor in 2011, recalls Jackson's call to him. Donilon stated 'The Speaker's office did notify us. I indicated it was their decision. I appreciated them checking with us, but it was our view it was their decision. I don't think we gave them a judgment one way or the other.' Then what is in question? ... And why is there all this hand-wringing about whether Netanyahu should have accepted the invite or the protocol surrounding it? ...[A]fter being dissed by the Administration the first time he invited Netanyahu, it appears that Boehner might have been acting like a gentleman by not calling ... Obama on how he handled the first invite. Think about it. The Speaker of the House of Representatives, the person third in line to the Presidency, politely asks to invite the leader of one of our closest allies to speak to Congress and Obama and his staff cannot give them an answer. HotAir.com notes the hypocrisy of Senator Charles Schumer (D-NY) on legislation to approve construction of the Keystone XL pipeline: Schumer states, "We have some suggestions on how to make the bill better and actually make it an American jobs bill. If Republicans oppose us they will be making it crystal clear to Americans that they are on the side of narrow special interests rather than on the side of America's middle class. If Republicans vote against these amendments none of them can say it's an American jobs bill." But, says Schumer, the amendments will not be enough for him to vote for the legislation. HotAir.com: "So essentially Chuck Schumer wants to tack on a bunch of poison pills to the bill, but even if [Senate Majority Leader Mitch] McConnell goes along with it and the measures pass, he'll still *vote against the bill?* Well done, gentlemen. We can tell that you're truly serious about working together and getting the work of the people done." [70560]

Lynn Liddle, executive vice president of Domino's Pizza, tells the *Washington Free Beacon* that ObamaCare's calorie display requirements are "impossible" to comply with: "Essentially we think this rule is a kind of disaster for everybody. Not just pizza but restaurants, and anybody that's going to fall within this law. It's still not workable." ObamaCare requires that calorie information be posted on all menus, but Liddle states, "We no longer know what a menu is. It's really hard to interpret. Essentially they're saying anything that a consumer can look at and make a potential ordering decision from is a menu. ...If you take it to the broadest thing it could be an ad on the television. That makes it literally impossible to comply." *Free Beacon* notes, "A problem specific to pizza chains is the challenge of displaying a vast number of possible calorie totals across all of the materials that the rule potentially counts as a 'menu.' Considering that Domino's customers can customize their own pizzas, there is an endless number of possible combinations of toppings, each of which has a different calorie count. Liddle said a low-ball estimate of combinations Domino's offers is 34 million. Pizza Hut has 2 billion possible combinations. ...Despite the fact that the [ObamaCare] rule runs 391 pages and addresses details such as whether a limited-time 'pumpkin spice muffin' should be covered, it still does not give clear guidance about how restaurants are supposed to comply, according to critics. The rule, finalized in November, will affect chains with 20 or more stores." Liddle points out, "They say there could be civil and criminal penalties for having incorrect calorie information. And not only is that frightening, that is also very unclear and invites a whole host of potential problems not just for pizza, but for anybody that [sic; who] I can think of who is preparing food and selling it to the public. You can go to jail, according to the way this is written, if somehow you did it wrong." (Violations call for a maximum \$1,000 fine, one year in prison, or both. Repeat violations carry a \$10,000 fine and up to three years in prison.) [70616]

On MSNBC, tax-cheat Al Sharpton (who should be in jail) defends Obama's call for increased taxes. A Secret Service source responds, "Although it's our policy not to discuss specific security measures, in this instance we can say this number is grossly inaccurate and exaggerated.") NYTimes.com reports, "Justice Department lawyers will recommend that no civil rights charges be brought against the police officer who fatally shot an unarmed teenager in Ferguson, Mo., after an F.B.I. investigation found no evidence to support charges, law enforcement officials said Wednesday. Attorney General Eric H. Holder Jr. and his civil rights chief, Vanita Gupta, will have the final say on whether the Justice Department will close the case against the officer, Darren Wilson. But it would be unusual for them to overrule the prosecutors on the case, who are still working on a legal memo explaining their recommendation. ...But a broader Justice Department civil rights investigation into allegations of discriminatory traffic stops and excessive force by the Ferguson Police Department remains open. That investigation could lead to significant changes at the department, which is overwhelmingly white despite serving a city that is mostly black." (Milwaukee County Sheriff David Clarke later comments, "The grand jury in Ferguson, Missouri, got it right. Officer Wilson has been exonerated. The thing I want to know is how does he get his reputation back? ... I don't expect anything intelligent to come out of the mouth of Al Sharpton. We know he is a charlatan. Al Sharpton ought to go back into the gutter he came from. The police officer is owed a lot from him, Eric Holder and [Obama].") [70584, 70585, 70608, 70644, 70684]

WashingtonTimes.com reports, "Yemen President Abed Rabbo Mansour Hadi is being held captive by rebels who have attacked his compound, just as the U.S. military has moved the USS Iwo Jima and the USS Fort McHenry into the Red Sea, in position to take aboard evacuees from the U.S. Embassy in Yemen if tensions and violence continue to escalate. Various media have also reported that the presidential compound is under attack and Shiite Houthi rebels, backed by Iran, are holding the Yemeni president captive." [70540]

Obama releases \$490 million in previously frozen assets to Iran. FreeBeacon.com reports, the administration "will have released a total of \$11.9 billion to the Islamic Republic by the time nuclear talks are scheduled to end in June, according to figures provided by the State Department. ... The release of this money has drawn outrage from some Republican lawmakers who filed legislation last year to prevent the release of cash due to a lack of restrictions on how Iran can spend the money. These cash payments by the United States have been made with no strings attached, prompting concerns that Iran could use the funds to finance its worldwide terror operations, which include the financial backing of Hamas, Hezbollah, and other rogue entities." Pamela Geller comments, "Iran now controls four capitals in the region: Sana, Baghdad, Damascus, and Beirut. None of Iran's jaw dropping success in the region would have been possible without Obama's tacit support and sanction. They have postponed 'nuke talks' to the point where deadlines mean nothing. Every time Iran misses a deadline, Obama just moves it. And Iranians arm, build and enrich uranium. Whatever the US asks (begs, cajoles, suggests) is laughed off. Iran is the world's number one state sponsor of terror." [70552, 70647]

TheHill.com reports, "Major donors are ready to announce huge financial commitments to Hillary Clinton as soon as she announces a second run for the White House, according to Clinton allies and Democratic fundraisers. The Clinton team wants to build excitement about her campaign launch, which is expected in March or April. The money blitz would be a show of Clinton's strength meant to scare away potential primary rivals. 'The floodgates are going to open immediately, and there's going to be a rush to get on the team,' said Don Peebles, the real estate mogul who served on …Obama's national finance committee. 'There's nobody in the Democratic Party who can match her. Not even close.' 'It's going to be like nothing you've seen,' added one top Democratic donor, who supported both of Obama's presidential campaigns and plans to throw big support behind Clinton. 'The numbers will be astounding.'" [70588]

CGI, the Canadian company that was paid a fortune by the Obama administration to produce the disastrous Healthcare.gov Web site, is awarded a \$4.46 million contract to produce ObamaCare-compliance software for the IRS. DailyCaller.com notes, "About 7 million Obamacare policyholders and about 20 million Americans who don't have healthcare coverage will depend this year on the proper IRS processing of their 2014 income tax returns. Improper processing of health information could cause some Americans to receive smaller tax refunds, or even pay more out-of-pocket for their government-issued healthcare policies. ...The IRS did not reply to numerous inquiries to the agency about the CGI contract." [70591]

According to Deputy Secretary of State Antony Blinken, Obama does not need Senate approval for a nuclear agreement with Iran because it is a matter of "executive prerogative." (Blinken may not be aware of the U.S. Constitution, which requires Senate approval of all treaties. Article II, Section 2, Clause 2 states that a president "shall have Power, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate, to make Treaties, provided two thirds of the Senators present concur...") [70609, 70610]

Blinken, appearing before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, is asked by Senator Robert Menendez (D-NJ), "Let me ask you this, isn't it true that even the deal that you are striving towards is not to eliminate any Iranian [nuclear] breakout capability, but to constrain the time in which you'll get the notice of such breakout capability? Is that a fair statement, yes or no?" Blinken replies, "Yes, it is." Menendez: "We're not eliminating Iran's ability to break out. We're just getting alarm bells, and the question is how long are we going to get those alarm bells for?" Blinken: "We might want a little more time. That's possible. I wouldn't want to rule it out." Menendez: "The bottom line is, they get to cheat in a series of ways—and I'll call it 'cheat,' you won't—but they get to cheat in a series of ways and we get to worry about their perceptions." Senator Bob Corker (R-TN) asks, "Why would you oppose Congress weighing in on an issue of this importance?" Blinken responds, "In terms of the negotiations themselves, the knowledge that there would be very early on this kind of vote, in our judgment, could actually undermine the credibility of the commitments we would make [to Iran] in the context of negotiations. There's a concern that if a judgment is reached immediately [by Congress], yea or nay on this, it may be too soon to see if Iran has complied with its agreements." Corker: "I'm very disappointed that in essence what the administration is saying is, 'We really don't want, even though Congress put us in this place, we really don't want Congress to play a role in one of the most important geopolitical agreements that may take place during this administration." [70618]

It is worth noting that on May 2008 Obama said, "I mean, think about it. Iran, Cuba, Venezuela—these countries are tiny, compared to the Soviet Union. They don't pose a serious threat to us the way the Soviet Union posed a threat to us. And yet, we were willing to talk to the Soviet Union at the time when they were saying, 'We're going to wipe you off the planet." In July 2008 Obama said, "Just this past week, we passed out of the U.S. Senate Banking Committee—which is my committee—a bill to call for divestment from Iran as a way of ratcheting up the pressure to ensure that they don't obtain a nuclear weapon." (Then-Senator Christopher Dodd was chairman of that committee; it was not Obama's committee.) Former French president Nicolas Sarkozy called Obama's position on Iran "utterly immature" and consisting of "formulations empty of all content." A few days after winning the November 2008 election, Obama said, "Iran's development of a nuclear weapon is I believe unacceptable. And we have to mount an international effort to prevent that from happening." (Obama has gone from claiming Iran does not pose a threat, to saying a nuclear Iran is "unacceptable," to allowing Iran to continue its nuclear program. Some might suggest that Obama is eager to see Iran destroy Tel Aviv.) [415, 1608, 2670, 2671, 2672, 2673, 2674]

On *The Five*, Greg Gutfeld observes, "The Left makes bad ideas sound great, and the Right makes great ideas sound old and wooden. Case in point, you had [Senator] Joni Ernst last night... she came off, in a way, like a toll-free recording from your bank, because they [Republican handlers] took the life out of her. ...Conservative values are like the car you don't have to sell because it all works. On January 22, as about 200,000 abortion opponents attend a "March for Life" pro-life rally in Washington, D.C., Obama issues a statement celebrating abortion and the 42nd anniversary of the *Roe v. Meanwhile, as the Pope tweets, "Every Life is a Gift," the White House threatens to veto the proposed House Resolution 7, which would prohibit federal funding of abortions. [70543]

He took bold steps in advancing the Arab Peace Initiative, an endeavor that will outlive him as an enduring contribution to the search for peace in the region. ... May God grant him peace." Amid the furor over charges that the New England Patriots violated NFL rules by deflating footballs in their 45-7 victory over the Indianapolis Colts on January 18, and the less-than-believable denials by the coach and the quarterback, Congressman Todd Young (R-IN) posts a quiz that reads, "For a little Friday fun, see if you can pass our 'Who Said It: The Obama White House or New England Patriots?' quiz. Below are eight statements that refer to either DeflateGate or one of the Obama administration scandals. Can you guess who said each of the following in response?" The statements: "I was shocked to learn of the news reports... I had no knowledge whatsoever of this situation until Monday morning." "I first learned about it from the same news reports that I think most people learned about this." "We learned about them through the reports... That is when we learned about them." "Everyone is obviously trying to figure out what happened. I was as surprised as anybody when I heard Monday morning what was happening." "I have no knowledge of anything, of any wrongdoing. I'm very comfortable saying that." "I heard on the news about this story..." "I have questions too. There's nobody I know that can answer the questions that I have." "Other than press reports, we have no knowledge of [this]." (Like Obama, the Patriots have a reputation for violating the rules.) [70601, 70612]

Talk radio host Dana Loesch, author of *Hands Off My Gun: Defeating the Plot to Disarm America*, reports that TSA workers are "raising a FIT" because she tried to board a flight carrying a pen made from bullet casings. (Live ammunition is allowed in checked bags—yet a brass casing *with its gunpowder removed* and converted to a ballpoint pen is considered "dangerous" and confiscated.) It is worth noting that, although some 400 TSA workers have been fired for theft since 2003, the agency has yet to apprehend a terrorist. Congressman John Mica (R-FL), chairman of the House Transportation Committee, has stated, "TSA is probably the worst personnel manager that we have in the entire federal government. It is an outrage to the public and, actually, to our aviation security system." [70640, 70641, 70735, 70736]

Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) files the Expatriate Terrorist Act, which would prohibit Americans from returning to the United States if they engage in fighting with ISIS or other designated terrorist groups. Cruz states, "...Obama's approach to foreign policy refuses to acknowledge the threats our enemies pose to our national security—it is detached from reality and making the world a more dangerous place. We've seen the grave consequence of the Obama-Clinton-Kerry foreign policy unravel with respect to Iran, Russia, and now Yemen. These consequences are not confined to faraway lands. They directly threaten America and our allies." (French courts have ruled that Ahmed Sahnouni, a Moroccan-born naturalized citizen of France, can be stripped of his citizenship as a result of his conviction on terrorism charges. Pamela Geller writes, "This is exactly what needs to be done with all Muslims from Western countries who go wage jihad for the Islamic State. If they are non-citizens, they should be deported. If they are citizens, they should be stripped of their citizenship. To join the Islamic State is treason and should be treated as such.") [70691, 70692, 70693, 70713, 70714]

U.S. District Judge Raymond Moore sentences 19-year-old Shannon Conley to four years in prison for conspiracy to provide material support to ISIS. Moore states, "That woman is in need of psychiatric help. To me, it doesn't seem like she gets it." JPost.com notes, "Conley was arrested last April at Denver International Airport as she was on her way to Syria to support ISIS. She pleaded guilty to the charge in September. 'Even though I supported a jihad, it was never to hurt anyone. It was always in the defense of Muslims,' ABC quoted Conley saying during the sentencing. 'I do not believe I am a threat to society and would appreciate an opportunity to prove it,' she said. According to the report, the teenager's lawyer argued during the sentencing that his client, a Muslim convert, 'was misled while exploring her faith,' and only deserved to spend one year in jail. The teenager planned to marry a Tunisian who was fighting for ISIS in Syria who she had met on line and communicated with on Skype, according to the facts of her plea agreement, ABC reported. The plan was for Conley to travel to Syria to join her fiancé after, 'refining and obtaining additional training and skills in order to provide support and assistance to any al-Qaida and/or ISIS fighter.'" Although Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu will be in Washington, D.C. in March to address the U.S. House of Representatives, the White House states that Obama will not meet with him. White House press secretary Josh Earnest tells reporters the brush off is "to avoid the appearance of influencing a democratic election in a foreign country." (Netanyahu is running for reelection. Obama hopes he loses his reelection bid, and refusing to meet with him is intended to show Israeli voters that Netanyahu lacks influence.) [70602, 70607, 70627, 70674]

FoxNews.com reports, "The Obama administration reportedly is fuming over Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's plans to address Congress in March regarding the Iranian threat, with one unnamed official telling an Israeli newspaper he will pay 'a price' for the snub. ...In public, White House Press Secretary Josh Earnest politely describes this as a 'departure' from protocol. ...But in private, Obama's team is livid with the Israeli leader, according to Haaretz. 'We thought we've seen everything,' a source identified as a senior American official was quoted as saying. 'But Bibi [Netanyahu] managed to surprise even us. There are things you simply don't do. He spat in our face publicly and that's no way to behave. Netanyahu ought to remember that ...Obama has a year and a half left [sic; two years left in the White House], and that there will be a price." (On more than one occasion Obama has humiliated Netanyahu, but the thinskinned temporary occupant of the Oval Office cannot handle the shoe being on the other foot. Additionally, it is hypocritical for Obama to complain about Netanyahu addressing Congress when just one week earlier he had British Prime Minister David Cameron telephone U.S. Senators in an attempt to persuade them not to vote to impose new sanctions on Iran. Lastly, the White House can hardly claim it does not interfere in the elections in other nations. It was Obama who pulled the rug out from under Egyptian ally Hosni Mubarak in order that the radical Muslim Brotherhood's Mohammed Morsi could succeed him, and bombing Libya to help oust Moammar Gaddafi can hardly be considered staying out of another sovereign nation's business.) HotAir.com's Noah Rothman quips, "They [Obama and White House advisors] will have their revenge against Netanyahu by completely yielding to him control of the national stage. That ought to show him." Rothman observes, "Someone in the White House has been watching far too many episodes of *House of Cards* and thought that the casual casting about of petty and impotent threats makes the issuer seem tough and appear in command. In fact, it just sounds juvenile. It's almost like the White House has no interest in reining in supposedly rogue elements within their ranks who are more than happy to provide the press with inflammatory quotes designed to sour [Obama's] bilateral relationship with Netanyahu's government. According to Richard Engel of NBC News, Abdullah's feelings were not warm, and if they seemed that way to Obama, they were not genuine. ...Said Engel: 'The king could not stand ...Obama

Brute, lethal force is all they respect.' In August 2011 Aaron drew his last breath shoving the full weight of his brute, lethal force down the throats of those terrorists. He died a hero. In return for that courage, ultimate sacrifice, and willed determination to defeat evil at any cost, he was made a promise—that his actions would mean something. As they placed that folded flag in our arms, they promised us it would mean something; that our son's death would be avenged and his enemies defeated. The White House announces that Obama and his wife will cut short their trip to India to stop in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia to meet King Abdullah's successor. (This would be the same Obama who could not find the time to attend the funeral of former British Prime Minister Margaret "Iron Lady" Thatcher.") [70635]

F-16 fighter jets escort two airliners (Delta flight 1156 and Southwest flight 2492) to Atlanta after "credible" bomb threats. Both planes land safely. [70659, 70660, 70705]

In Madrid, police arrest two brothers suspected of planning an Islamist terrorist attack. [70710, 70716]

NYPost.com reports, "Former President Bill Clinton took a romantic jaunt in 2002 to convicted pedophile pal Jeffrey Epstein's 'orgy island' with 'two young girls' from New York, according to a shocking new interview. Virginia Roberts, who's accused Epstein of turning her into a 'sex slave' at age 17 and forcing her to sleep with his powerful friends, claimed Clinton stayed in one of the many villas on Epstein's US Virgin Islands estate— where group sex was a 'regular occurrence.' 'I remember asking Jeffrey, 'What's Bill Clinton doing here?' kind of thing, and he laughed it off and said, 'Well, he owes me a favor,'' Roberts told her lawyers in a 2011 interview obtained by RadarOnline.com. 'He never told me what favors they were.' At the Iowa Freedom Summit, conservatives hear speeches by Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker, New Jersey Governor Chris Christie, Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX), former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee, former Texas Governor Rick Perry, former Pennsylvania Senator Rick Santorum, businesswoman Carly Fiorina, and neurosurgeon Ben Carson all trying to make good impressions with voters a year ahead of the 2016 presidential primaries. Perry tells the audience, "If Washington refuses to secure the border, Texas will." (The statement prompts heckling from illegal immigrants in the audience, who are quickly drowned out by Perry supporters.) Walker tells the enthusiastic crowd, "There's a reason we take a day off to celebrate the 4th of July and not the 15th of April. Fiorina says, "Like Hillary Clinton, I have traveled around the globe. Unlike her, I have accomplished something. You see, Mrs. Clinton, flying is not an accomplishment. It is an

activity. ... I have met Vladimir Putin. I know that it takes far more than a gimmick reset button to halt his ambition. ... I know what difference it makes, that our American ambassador and three other brave Americans were killed in a deliberate terrorist attack on the anniversary of 9/11 in Libya. Apparently, unlike Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama, I know our response must be more forceful than the arrest of a single individual one year later. ... I have traveled and lived all over the world, and I know that it is still true in 2015 that it is only in the United States of America that a young woman can start as a secretary and become the chief executive officer of the largest technology company in the world. I know when he warns us that Iran is a threat to our nation and to his own, we must listen." [70783]

Another of the summit's attendees is Donald Trump, who says, "The last thing we need is another Bush. He's very, very weak on immigration. His brother gave us Obama because Abraham Lincoln coming back from the dead could not have beaten Obama. And Mitt [Romney]? No." Trump also says, "I'm looking at it very seriously ...I want to make this country great again. I am seriously thinking of running for president." [70699]

At the annual meeting of the Arizona Republican Party, Senator John McCain (R-AZ) is subjected to boos and jeers. According to WND.com, McCain "paused after his introduction as many Republicans in the audience shouted at him to 'go home' and called McCain a 'traitor,' presumably because of his more centrist stances in the Senate and his office's reported attempts to purge conservatives and tea-party types from the ranks of the Arizona GOP. It wasn't the first time the party faithful have risen up against McCain in his home state. In 2014, the same annual meeting censured the senator in absentia for joining Democrats in the 'Gang of Eight' to draft an immigration bill conservatives opposed. McCain was already on thin ice for calling his tea-party critics 'hobbits' and 'wacko birds' in 2011 and 2013, respectively." (Some argue that had McCain campaigned on conservative values and policies in 2008, rather than as a "Democrat-lite" candidate," he could have defeated Obama.) [70730]

'Argentina had hard evidence against at least one Iranian leader, which prevented him from traveling abroad,' a source said. A key Iranian suspect was identified as Ali Akhbar Velayati, foreign minister from 1981 until 1987, and deemed close to supreme leader Ali Khamenei. Velayati has been on the official wanted list of Interpol since 2007 and a subject of an international arrest warrant by Argentina. ... On Jan. 18, a leading Argentinian prosecutor assigned to investigate an alleged government cover-up on AMIA was found shot to death in his home. The prosecutor, Alberto Nisman, had been scheduled to appear in front of Congress and present evidence that [Hugo Chavez "wannabe"] President Cristina Kirchner and Foreign Minister Hector Timerman shielded Teheran in connection with the bombing." The Argentinian government has purportedly

been involved in the cover-up in exchange for favorable grain-for-oil trade deals with Iran.) Pamela Geller writes, "A prosecutor was assassinated in cold blood for pursuing the truth while the Obama administration sided with the jihadists and pressed for an end into the investigation of the truth behind the Islamic attack on the Jewish center in Argentina. Obama sided with the Iranian assassins." (It is believed that Iranian President Hassan Rouhani was involved in the decision to bomb the Jewish center.) WashingtonTimes.com reports, "Border Patrol agents' labor union announced their opposition Friday to the House GOP's new border security bill, calling it 'window dressing' that doesn't add any new agents or updated their firepower to get the job done in sealing off the U.S.-Mexico border. The agents' opposition could be a major problem for House GOP leaders who have scheduled a vote on their bill for Wednesday [January 28], but who are facing a revolt among some conservative lawmakers who say the bill needs to go much further. The legislation... would direct the Homeland Security Department to build about 50 miles of more fencing, to fly more drones and add more technology sector-by-sector along the border, and to come up with a strategy for catching 100 percent of illegal immigrants or smugglers trying to cross. But the National Border Patrol Council said the bill needs to be more specific in calling for an additional 5,000 agents on the southwest border-there are about 20,000 now-and for updating training to a 20-week course, and to acquire more M-4 rifles and other gear so they can operate out in the field." National Border Patrol Council spokesman Shawn Moran states that the proposed legislation-which was drafted without input from front-line border agents-"will not be effective in helping to secure our borders. This legislation speaks about metrics but frankly does not provide either the strategy or the resources necessary to achieve them. ... Although there are some positive elements to H.R. 399, we believe in it's entirety it will only serve as window dressing..." [70695, 70761]

According to Townhall.com, the Federation for American Immigration Reform [FAIR] calls the legislation "a band-aid on a broken arm" that "does nothing to stop …Obama from simply releasing illegal aliens caught at the border and giving them work authorization. It does nothing to reduce the further incentives driving illegal immigration, such as sanctuary cities, the availability of driver's licenses, in-state tuition and automatic birthright citizenship. Most importantly, the bill does not stop the Obama administration's broad use of discretionary power to grant amnesty to millions of illegal aliens and his relaxing of enforcement standards to all others. At DCClothesline.com Dave Hodges writes, "The Obama administration has a new partner in crime and it is the American Psychiatric Association (APA). The APA created the new Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (5th Edition) which was recently adopted. DSM 5 is highly controversial and has sparked outrage from the mental health practitioners. As many of these practitioners point out, the new DSM-V makes a pathology out of simple and normal behaviors such as grieving for the loss of a loved one. Particularly disturbing is that the new manual targets internet users and conspiracy theorists. If someone is judged, by some vague set of criteria, to spend too much time on the internet, they could be judged to be mentally ill and ineligible to own a gun. ... Under Obama's new proposed gun regulations, anyone who has a diagnosable, or is potentially diagnosable (i.e. precrime) for being mentally ill, can have their gun confiscated. Vice President Biden even feels that they can violate HIPPA [sic; HIPAA] privacy regulations in requiring the states to report who has been treated for a mental illness. Therefore, in the name of confiscating your gun, this administration thinks it is acceptable to violate federal privacy laws." [70706]

While the mainstream media argues that there are no Muslim "no-go zones" in Europe, Pamela Geller posts a documentary showing the rampant anti-Semitism in Malmo, Sweden, and the dangers face by Jews who dare to enter Muslim neighborhoods. (There are about 500,000 Muslims in Sweden, and they make up about 20 percent of Malmo's population.) Andrew C. McCarthy points out, "[N]o sensible person is saying that state authorities are *prohibited* from entering no-go zones *as a matter of law*. On January 25 Obama heads to India.

Secretary of State John Kerry travels to Lagos, Nigeria to meet with presidential candidates ahead of the country's February 14 election—just days after White House press secretary Josh Earnest told reporters it would be against protocol for the House of Representatives to hear an address from Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu before elections in Israel. (Kerry apparently is excused from following protocol.) Nigeria's current president, Goodluck Jonathan, a Christian, is being challenged by former president Muhammadu Buhari, a Muslim. At PJMedia.com, Bridget Johnson writes, "Boko Haram was born many years after Buhari was overthrown in a coup following two years of Buharism checkered with human rights abuses. Jonathan inherited the scourge of Boko Haram and has been accused by the United States of violating human rights in sweeps aimed at stopping the terrorist group, which reached the self-proclaimed caliphate stage last year. A 2012 Pew survey showed Christianity edging out the country's Muslim population, 49.3 percent to 48.8 percent." (This *Timeline* believes violence will mar the elections. If Buhari wins, it may be open season on Christians in Nigeria, but if Buhari loses, his supporters may take out their anger on Christians.) [70769, 70770, 70903]

Tarik Kafala, head of BBC Arabic, the largest of the BBC's non-English language news services, tells *The Independent*, "Terrorism is such a loaded word. The UN has been struggling for more than a decade to define the word and they can't. It is very difficult to. We know what political violence is, we know what murder, bombings and shootings are and we describe them. That's much more revealing, we believe, than using a word like terrorist which people will see as value-laden. ...We try to avoid describing anyone as a terrorist or an act as being terrorist. What we try to do is to say that 'two men killed 12 people in an attack on the office of a satirical magazine'. That's enough, we know what that means and what it is." [70745, 70746, 70816]

Meanwhile, a poll of Palestinians shows that 84.4 percent believe "the operation [the terrorist attack at Charlie Hebdo in Paris] was suspicious, and that Israel may be behind it." A mere 8.7 percent "believed that the murder of the French [citizens] in Paris was a natural result of the spread of Islamic extremism in Europe." [70747, 70819]

TheHill.com reports that Obama "will ask Congress to enact further protection's [sic; protection or protections] for the remote wilderness area in Alaska's northern reaches in an effort to stop any potential oil or natural gas drilling there. The request, announced Sunday, would put the 1.5 million-acre Coastal Plain area of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (ANWR) off limits to drilling, closing off the last area of ANWR that Congress could consider for oil and gas development, since the rest of the refuge has been protected. Alaska's all-Republican congressional delegation immediate lambasted the plan as a 'war on Alaska's future.' ... Alaska's lawmakers and Gov. Bill Walker (I) said [the Department of the] Interior is also gearing up this week to block offshore drilling in Alaska's waters as part of a five-year drilling plan the department will release. Taken together, the actions set up a high-stakes fight with Senator Lisa Murkowski (R), Alaska's senior senator and chairwoman of the Energy and Natural Resources Committee, which has authority over energy development in public land and water. Alaska lawmakers have pushed for decades to allow the state to lease more land for drilling, including ANWR, which is believed to be the most promising oil prospect in the state. 'What's coming is a stunning attack on our sovereignty and our ability to develop a strong economy that allows us, our children and our grandchildren to thrive,' Murkowski said in a statement. 'It's clear this administration does not care about us, and sees us as nothing but a territory." (Ironically, Obama's statement announcing his policy proposal is filmed as he heads to India aboard Air Force One-which does not operate on solar, wind, or electric power. Breitbart.com notes that the plane's fuel tanks hold 53,611 gallons.) DailyCaller.com points out that Obama has visited Alaska (briefly) only three times: to refuel Air Force One. DailyCaller.com also notes that Obama advisor John Podesta, "one of the architects" of Obama's plan "to end any future drilling for oil on Alaska's coastal plain," received an \$87,000 consulting paycheck in 2013 from "a shadowy foreign billionaire [Hansjorg Wyss] whose passion is preventing energy exploration on American land." Governor Walker states that the Obama restrictions on federal land may prompt him to accelerate the approval of gas and oil permits for exploration and drilling on state land. (In other words, if Obama believes he is curtailing drilling, he is wrong. He will only be moving it from one area of Alaska to another.) HotAir.com's Noah Rothman writes, "Of course, Alaska's wilderness is not the administration's primary concern. ...Any issue that can be used to spark a fight with Republicans in order to create contrasts with Democrats ahead of the 2016 election cycle seems to be on the table for this White House. The 114th Congress will not be restricting future oil exploitation in this massive and virtually uninhabited area of the country anytime soon. This is just another opportunity to mobilize the dispirited liberal base amid a contrived policy fight." [70720, 70721, 70725, 70739]

Senators Ted Cruz (R-TX), Marco Rubio (R-FL), and Rand Paul (R-KY) participate in an American Recovery Policy Forum panel discussion hosted by the non-profit Freedom Partners. ABC's Jonathan Karl is the moderator. Karl asks if billionaires have too much influence in politics. To much applause, Rubio responds, "As opposed to Hollywood or the mainstream media?" [70678, 70679, 70763]

On *Face the Nation*, Obama's foreign policy (or lack thereof) is criticized in a panel discussion. One guest says, "I think it [the rebel coup in Yemen] just came faster and harder than we expected, the government was more fragile than we expected, and now those [U.S.] counter-terrorism operations [in Yemen] against al-Qaeda as a result of the government basically collapsing appear to be on hold or close to it, and that... has real consequences for American security." Moderator Bob Schieffer: "...But that's the way it always seems to be lately, it always happens and then we're surprised." The Atlantic's Jeffrey Goldberg: "I mean, Mosul fell, in Iraq, to ISIS, and we were... shocked, [even though] people said it was coming for a year before that. ... The broader question here is that what we see over and over again in the greater Middle East is more and more countries are becoming ungoverned spaces. Yemen has always had al-Qaeda problem, but now the entire country could fall under control of a group that could use that territory to plot attacks against America. We have that across a broad swath of Iraq and Syria right now, obviously Pakistan and Afghanistan are problematic, and so, Libya of course is collapsing on itself, so we have a situation in which [Obama] could be leaving office in January 2017 with hundreds of thousands of square miles of the greater Middle East... under the control of terrorists plotting against the West, a terrible problem." Schieffer asks *USA Today's* Susan Page, "Is this an example of what [Obama's] critics are calling leading from behind?" Page replies, "Well, it could be, and [Obama], you know, would very much like to talk about how the economy's gettin' [sic] better, and how the Affordable Care Act is working for some Americans, but he is forced to deal, over and over again, with these foreign policy crises, and we heard not only criticism from Senator [John] McCain [R-AZ], ...but from Senator [Dianne] Feinstein [D-CA] and other Democrats, ...expressing concern about the fact that [there have been] intelligence failures here, in Ukraine, and elsewhere." *The Washington Post's* Dana Milbank comments, "Think about the extraordinary disconnect we saw this week… we began with a State of the Union address that was about broadband [service] and community colleges, you know he didn't mention the word al-Qaeda, he certainly didn't mention Saudi Arabia or Yemen, he gave all of, I think, 65 words to counter-terrorism at all [sic], and then you see, it's been completely overtaken, so I think, as [Obama] said Tuesday night, he wants to 'turn the page,' he's saying, 'the shadow of crisis has passed,' but you can't just make it so by saying it..." John Dickerson, CBS News political director, says, "And also, in the State of the Union, [Obama] talked about his foreign policy as being 'deliberate, measured,' a little bit 'smarter' than maybe his critics had suggested. But what those critics are now saying is this deliberation that [Obama] boasted about... there is a kind of 'asleep at the switch' quality. He had mentioned Yemen when he was talking about U.S. operations in Iraq and Syria, he held Yemen up as the model. And so... critics are now saying, 'You're holding up a country as a model that's now fallen. You just are not aware of what's going on.' ...And that's where this is particularly damaging, because it's a question of really whether the administration knows what's going on." [70731]

On ABC's *This Week*, former "Gitmo czar" Cliff Sloan says 54 of the terrorist detainees have been approved for transfer, and "Of the 54 who are approved for transfer, 47 of

them are from Yemen. They need to be resettled to other countries; we've been doing that—[and have] recently resettled 12 Yemenis in other countries." ("Resettled" arguably means "released" to possibly again commit acts of terrorism.) Sloan also complains about an "irrational bent" to keep Gitmo open. [70789]

Also on *This Week*, Obama's chief of staff Denis McDonough inadvertently provides the name of an American woman held hostage by ISIS. McDonough says, "And as it relates to our hostages, we are obviously continuing to work those matters very, very aggressively. We are sparing no expense and sparing no effort, both in trying to make sure that we know where they are and make sure that we're prepared to do anything we must to try to get them home. But [redacted]'s family knows how strongly [Obama] feels about this and we will continue to work this." Her family asked that she not be identified out of fear for her safety." (The woman was kidnapped in Aleppo, Syria while doing humanitarian work at a hospital. (Like everyone else in the Obama administration, McDonough refuses to name radical Islamists as the enemy. Western civilization is only fighting "manifestations" of al-Qaeda. On *Fox News Sunday*, McDonough brags about the nation's increased oil production. CNSNews.com relates the conversation with host Chris Wallace. McDonough: "It's decades now that wages have stagnated, for hard-working middle-class families. [Obama's] saying enough is enough, we're out of the crisis of the last several years. Unemployment is down under 5.6 percent. More oil [has been] produced in this country than in any time in the last several decades." "No thanks to the Obama administration," Wallace said, referring to the increased oil production. McDonough complained that Obama is blamed for bad things that happen, but gets no credit for the good things, such as increased oil production. Wallace noted that the increased oil and gas production has happened on private and state-owned lands, not on land owned by the federal government. 'More clean energy than ever in this country,' McDonough responded. 'More oil and gas—' 'Again, no thanks to this administration,' Wallace said. She tells the audience the Obama administration's lack of transparency and treatment of journalists is "so bad that in 2013 the free press advocacy group 'Reporters Without Borders' gave a serious downgrade to America's standing in the global free press rankings, rating the Obama administration as worse than Bush's. …In March of 2014 *New York Times* reporter James Risen… called the Obama administration 'the greatest enemy of press freedom in at least a generation.'" Attkisson also tells the students, "White House officials have exploited non-news media to spoon-feed unfiltered messaging, at times pure propaganda, into the public's mouth. The Google-sponsored chat I mentioned—that came with a pre-selected audience and questions submitted in advance by the White House's own YouTube channel-that's the way they like it. They generate their own content, rely on surrogates to help spread partisan blogs, Twitter and Facebook, give lots of interviews to entertainment programs, digital media and feature press. ... One way they do it is by self-producing videos and building their very own television production facilities where the upper echelon give interviews and speeches, controlling everything from content to lighting. When top officials from those federal agencies appear on camera, naturally they have to look good. So your tax dollars may kick in for the cost of their hairstylists, makeup artists and wardrobe consultants. One insider told me that the head of a federal agency even had her fashion colors analyzed at taxpayer expense. ... Both the Defense Department and the Centers for Disease Control provide taxpayer-funded advisers to television and Hollywood entertainment producers to promote accuracy or propaganda, depending on your viewpoint." Attkisson says that the Department of Agriculture alone has more than 1,200 "media relations employees." [71062]

Examiner.com reports, "Commenting on revelations about Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) and Department of Justice (DOJ) actions in the case of retired agent Jay Dobyns against his former employer, attorney David Hardy equated them with 'a BATF and DOJ Watergate... or worse,' Friday. Noting that [government] actions taken over a civil lawsuit evidently have included concealing evidence, secret threats against witnesses, and surveillance of attorneys and witnesses, the new information lends further credence to Dobyns' allegations and appears to show government lawyers engaged in a criminal conspiracy. ...Dobyns gained fame after infiltrating the Hells Angels and writing about his experiences in the New York Times bestseller, 'No Angel: My Harrowing Undercover Journey to the Inner-Circle of the Hells Angels.' He has since been the subject of numerous reports focused on retaliation he has been subjected to for coming forward with information exposing official wrongdoing. He was also instrumental in providing background information on management personalities and practices involved in the Operation Fast and Furious 'gunwalking' scandal." (In other

words, Obama's Department of Justice does not take kindly to whistleblowers—and is more than willing to intimidate witnesses.) [70737, 70760]

At PowerLineBlog.com John Hinderaker writes, "The New York Times features one of the most misleading headlines ever: '2014 Was the Warmest Year Ever Recorded on Earth.' The first paragraph drives the hysteria home: 'Last year was the hottest in earth's recorded history, scientists reported on Friday, underscoring scientific warnings about the risks of runaway emissions and undermining claims by climate-change contrarians that global warming had somehow stopped.' It would be hard to pack more misinformation into a single sentence. First, the Times headline, and countless others like it, convey the impression that 2014 was the hottest year ever! But note the paper's reference to 'recorded history.' If you keep reading, you see that 'recorded history' goes back only to 1880. But in 1880, the Little Ice Age had just ended, and the Earth was beginning to warm after several hundred years in the deep freeze. So, yes, temperatures are a little warmer now than they were then-happily. Indeed, the Earth may still be recovering to more average temperature levels after the Little Ice Age. The Times and other news outlets deliberately try to create the impression that today's temperatures are unprecedented. But that is simply false. In fact, the Earth was warmer than it is now for about 90% of the time since the end of the last Ice Age approximately 12,000 years ago. ... So 2014 was far from the warmest year ever. The year 2014 was actually among the coldest three percent of years in the last 10,000 years, according to Dr. Tim Ball. The claim is that "2014 was the warmest year ever recorded"—if no years before 1880 are considered. Ball points out, "The instrumental data is spatially and temporally inadequate. Surface weather data is virtually non-existent and unevenly distributed for 85 percent of the world's surface. On the land, there is virtually no data for the 19 percent mountains, 20 percent desert, 20 percent boreal forest, 20 percent grasslands, and 6 percent tropical rain forest. In order to 'fill-in,' the Goddard Institute for Space Studies (GISS), made the ridiculous claim that a single station temperature was representative of a 1200 km radius region. Initial claims of AGW [Anthropogenic Global Warming] were based on landbased data. The data is completely inadequate as the basis for constructing the models." Additionally, "Most surface stations are concentrated in eastern North America and Western Europe and became the early evidence for human induced global warming. IPCC [the United Nations' Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change] advocates ignored, for a long time, the fact that these stations are most affected by the urban heat island effect (UHIE)." Ball also questions the claim that is 2014 is 0.02°C warmer than any other year, when the majority of weather stations (in the United States) are not accurate to less than one degree. (In other words, recording temperatures for 2014 and claiming their average is 0.02 degrees higher than a previous record year is next to meaningless when the thermometers themselves are not that accurate.) IMRA.org (Independent Media Review and Analysis) reports, "Haaretz reporter Roi Arad revealed in an article in the Hebrew edition today that the foreign funded [leftist] organization, 'One Voice,' is bankrolling the V-2015 campaign to defeat Binyamin Netanyahu's national camp in the March 2015 Knesset Elections. One indication of the generous financing is that it has now flown in a team of five American campaign experts (including Jeremy Bird, the Obama campaign's national field director) who will run the campaign out of offices taking up the ground floor of a Tel Aviv office building. Marine Corps Maj. Gen. Frederick M. Padilla, president of National Defense University, states, "This scholarly research competition presents NDU students with a unique opportunity to focus their research and writing efforts on relevant issues at the intersection of U.S. security interests and the Arab-Muslim world." In India, Obama offends Prime Minister Narenda Modi by chewing gum—possibly Nicorette—during their meeting. Under the new schedule announced Monday afternoon, the House will no longer vote on any bills Monday evening, but will spend Tuesday and Wednesday working on bills dealing with human trafficking and liquid natural gas. The border bill had been planned for debate on Wednesday, but is no longer on the schedule. ...Democrats are overwhelmingly opposed to the border bill, arguing that Congress should leave it up to the Obama administration to decide how to enforce the laws. That means GOP leaders weren't able to count on any Democratic support for the bill. Republicans could still pass the bill through the House if they were unified, but conservatives have rebelled, arguing the border bill doesn't go far enough in cracking down on the problem. By 2018, the goal is to put half of payments under the new system. For doctors and health facilities, the system will tie tens, and then hundreds, of billions of dollars in payments to how their patients fare, rather than how much work a doctor or hospital does, lowering the curtain on Medicare's system of paying line-by-line for each scan, test and surgery." The *Daily Mail* reports, "It will cost the federal government—taxpayers, that is—\$50,000 for every person who gets health insurance under the Obamacare law, the Congressional Budget Office revealed on Monday. The number comes from figures buried in a 15-page section of the nonpartisan organization's new ten-year budget outlook. The best-case scenario described by the CBO would result in 'between 24 million and 27 million' fewer Americans being uninsured in 2025, compared to the year before the Affordable Care Act took effect. Pulling that off will cost Uncle Sam about \$1.35 trillion—or \$50,000 per head. The numbers are daunting: It will take \$1.993 trillion, a number that looks like \$1,993,000,000,000, to provide insurance subsidies to poor and middle-class Americans, and to pay for a massive expansion of Medicaid and CHIP (Children's Health Insurance Program) costs. Offsetting that massive outlay will be \$643 billion in new taxes, penalties and fees related to the Obamacare law." [70801]

That said, some advisers are already privately talking up potential running mates, with Sens. Michael Bennet of Colorado and Tim Kaine of Virginia dominating the early speculation. (Some might suggest that the mental disorders and musculoskeletal system and connective tissue diagnoses are the top two because they are easiest to fake. "I suffer from depression" and "My back hurts" are difficult to disprove, but make it possible for someone in his mid-to-late 50s who can't find a job to go on the federal dole.) [70852, 70952]

At WeeklyStandard.com Stephen Hayes reports on a "hard-hitting speech" by Lieutenant General Michael Flynn, former head of the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA). According to Flynn, "The dangers to the U.S. do not arise from the arrogance of American power, but from unpreparedness or an excessive unwillingness to fight when fighting is necessary." Hayes writes, "Flynn left government last summer, a year before scheduled. He did not provide a reason for his early departure, but sources close to Flynn told THE WEEKLY STANDARD that he was forced out after years of making arguments the Obama administration did not want to hear. ...One key fight came over the analysis of the documents captured during the raid that killed Osama bin Laden. The CIA was responsible for the first scrub of the collection of more than 1 million documents and retained 'executive authority' over the cache when it was completed. But the CIA stopped analyzing or 'exploiting' the documents after that first quick and incomplete assessment and the Agency made no attempt to systematically examine and codify all of the intelligence included in the intelligence haul. Flynn assembled a team at the DIA to do exactly that, but the CIA initially refused to share the documents." Derek Harvey, a former DIA official says the government hasn't "done anything close to a full exploitation. A full exploitation? No. Not even close. Maybe 10 percent." [70870]

Ten Senate Democrats tell Obama they will wait until late March before they vote on an Iran sanctions bill, giving him more time to negotiate a nuclear arms deal. TheBlaze.com notes, "The Obama administration extended negotiations with Iran on a nuclear deal last November, and is now targeting March 24 as a deadline for reaching a framework agreement. The administration hopes to reach a final deal by June 30." In a letter to Obama the Senators write, "After March 24, we will only vote for this legislation on the Senate floor if Iran fails to reach agreement on a political framework that addresses all parameters of a comprehensive agreement. This deadline is the critical test of Iranian intentions." [70882, 70883]

Breitbart.com reports, "An Islamic Tribunal using Sharia law in Texas has been confirmed by Breitbart Texas. The tribunal is operating as a non-profit organization in Dallas. One of the attorneys for the tribunal said participation and acceptance of the tribunal's decisions are 'voluntary.' Breitbart Texas spoke with one of the 'judges.' Dr. Taher El-badawi. He said the tribunal operates under Sharia law as a form of 'nonbinding dispute resolution.' El-badawi said their organization is 'a tribunal, not arbitration.' A tribunal is defined by Meriam-Webster's Dictionary as 'a court or forum of justice.' The four Islamic attorneys call themselves 'judges' not 'arbitrators.'" Pamela Geller comments, "This is how it starts. This is how it started in the United Kingdom. When Sharia courts were instituted there, Muslim and non-Muslim officials alike all assured the British public and the world that they would be voluntary, restricted to matters involving non-criminal matters, and subject to the British courts. Any areas in which British law and Sharia law conflicted would be referred not to the Sharia courts, but to the British courts. That is not how it worked out. The Telegraph reported in August 2011 that 'there are growing concerns' that the Sharia courts 'are creating a parallel legal system—and one that is developing completely unchecked.' The Independent stated in April 2012 'some Sharia law bodies have been misrepresented by the media as being transparent, voluntary and operating in accordance with human rights and equality legislation. This is not the case. Many Sharia law bodies rule on a range of disputes from domestic violence to child residence all of which should be dealt with by UK courts of law.' Instead, 'they operate within a misogynist and patriarchal framework which is incompatible with UK legislation." [70898, 70899]

On *On the Record*, Congresswoman Tulsi Gabbard (D-HI), an Iraq combat veteran, says of the fight against radical Islamist terrorism, "It's not just about words, it's not about semantics, it's really about having a real true understanding of who our enemy is and how important that is, that we have to understand what their motivation is and what their ideology is, this radical Islamic ideology that's fueling them. Just a couple of days ago, Secretary [of State John] Kerry said in a speech that ISIS and al-Qaeda are engaging in, quote, 'criminal conduct rooted in alienation, poverty, thrill seeking and other factors.' Now if we really look at what he's saying and if that's really the cause, then the solution would be to give them a trophy, give them a hug, give them a good paying job, \$10,000, and a skateboard so they can go and get their thrills and say, OK, great, they're going to be happy and they won't be fighting anymore. That's not the case. Unfortunately, we have people who are living in poverty all around the world, people who have this same feeling of alienation from their government, but they're not terrorists. So we've got to look at what their ideology is and how that's fueling these tragic attacks that keep occurring." [70884, 70885, 70888]

Gabbard states that Obama "really is not recognizing that Islamic extremism is the enemy. We can see that through their actions, through the decisions that this administration has made. And Libya is a perfect example, where if you don't know who your enemy is, you end up going to war with people who are not your enemy. In Libya, we had a situation where [Moammar] Gadhafi was taken out. We attacked Libya, and we look now, rather than eliminating our enemy, these Islamic extremists, they're stronger there now than they were before. And there are other examples. We look at the proposed attacks on Syria that occurred just over a year ago. Again, we're dealing with a situation where this is not our enemy, this is not the people who are threatening the American people. It's a real problem because of a very simple reason actually. That is something I learned as military 101, but something that's easy for everyone to understand, and that is, if you are at war, which we are, you have to know who your enemy is in order to defeat them. You've got to recognize what's fueling them, what's motivating them, what are their strategies and tactics that they're using in order to be able to defeat them and prevent them from attacking the American people." On January 28 Obama's nominee for Attorney General, Loretta Lynch, is questioned by the Senate Judiciary Committee. Asked about the scandal involving IRS targeting of conservative groups, Lynch responds, "With regards to the actions of any of the agencies in our government there is certainly no place for bias, or favoritism, or anything other than the even-handed application of the relevant laws and regulations. Certainly, that has always been my goal as a prosecutor and would be my continued goal should I be confirmed. With respect to the IRS investigation, I am generally aware that there is an investigation going on but it's not a matter that's either being conducted by my office or that I've been briefed on as United States attorney so I am not able to comment on the status now." Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich writes, "Tomorrow Catherine Engelbrecht, President of voter integrity group True The Vote, will testify in front of the Committee about DOJ's role in the IRS targeting scandal, which included inquiries about how the agencies could work together on criminal prosecution and charges for conservative groups who 'lied' about political activity on application forms. Department of Justice

leaders appointed trial attorney Barbara Bosserman in 2013 to investigate targeting of conservative groups. Bosserman is a democratic donor and gave thousands of dollars to ...Obama's 2012 re-election campaign." [70854, 70855, 70856]

Senator Jeff Sessions (R-AL) addresses Lynch: "[Obama's amnesty action] would give people who came here unlawfully the right to work, the right to participate in Social Security and Medicare, when Congress has not [authorized] that, allows them to stay, for at least a period, lawfully. Let me ask you this: In the workplace of America today, when we have a high number of unemployed, we've had declining wages for many years, we have the lowest percentage of Americans working—who has more right to a job in this country, a lawful immigrant who's here, a green-card holder, or a citizen, or a person who entered the country unlawfully? Lynch replies, "Well, Senator, I believe that, um, the right and the obligation to work is one that's shared by everyone in this country, uh, regardless of how they came here and certainly if someone is here, regardless of status, I would prefer that they be participating in the work place than not participating in the workplace." (The "obligation" to work is most certainly not "shared by everyone in this country." If it were, there would not be more than 90 million people of working age who are not working. Lynch's response is clearly a dodge that does not directly answer Sessions' question. Additionally, it is against federal law for an employer to hire an illegal immigrant. Lynch is essentially condoning lawbreaking—hardly a position to take for someone who wants to be the nation's top law enforcement officer.) [70857, 70921]

Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) addresses Lynch: "Let me ask about your understanding of prosecutorial discretion. Would it allow a subsequent president... to state that there are other laws that the administration will not enforce—labor laws, environmental laws—would it allow a president to say every existing federal labor law shall heretofore not apply to the state of Texas because I am using my prosecutorial discretion to refuse to enforce those laws? In your judgment, would that be constitutional?" Lynch: "Again, I would have to know what legal basis was being proposed for that..." Cruz: "I find it remarkable that you are unable to answer that question. I can answer it straightforward. It would be patently unconstitutional for any subsequent president to refuse to enforce the tax laws, or the labor laws, or the immigration laws for the very same reason that ...Obama's actions refusing to enforce immigration laws are unconstitutional. And it is discouraging that a nominee who hopes to serve as attorney general will not give a straightforward answer to that question." [70925]

Deputy White House press secretary Eric Schultz tells reporters the exchange of five Taliban fighters for Bowe Bergdahl was not negotiating with terrorists because "the Taliban is an armed insurgency," rather than a terrorist group. [70863, 70864, 70910, 70922, 70939]

In an ISIS video in which a Kurdish soldier is decapitated, the group warns that they will reach America: "This is a message to the whole world. This is the fate of anyone who opposes Islam. Know, oh Obama, that we will reach America. Know also that we will cut off your head in the White House and transform America into a Muslim province. And this is my message to France and to its sister, Belgium. We advise you that we will come

to you with car bombs and explosive charges, and we will cut off your heads. ...Know that we are men who fear no one." (Pamela Geller quips, "Apparently when Obama told the American people that the 'JV team' was on the run, he neglected to mention where it was they were running to. The White House." She adds, "Obama is wholly responsible for their growth and their power. You can deny reality, but you cannot deny the consequences of denying reality.") [70876, 70877, 70897, 70920]

Jordan agrees to release terrorist bomber Sajida al-Rishawi in exchange for its pilot, Moaz al-Kasasbeh (referred to as Muath al-Kaseasbeh in some articles), but demands proof that he is still alive. The fact that [Obama] could barely get a smile from the servicemen and women assembled on what was, ostensibly, a happy occasion tells you everything you need to know about [his] relationship with the U.S. military." D. W. Ulsterman reports, "Rumors are circulating of an ever widening rift between the Clinton and Obama camps, most recently worsened by [Obama's] State of the Union address last week. That delegation member, Waleed Sharaby, is a secretary-general of the Egyptian Revolutionary Council and a spokesman for Judges for Egypt, a group reported to have close ties to the Brotherhood." The State Department initially claims the meeting with the Muslim Brotherhood leaders was organized by Georgetown University. Department spokeswoman Jen Psaki later tells reporters, "The meeting was set up by the Center for the Study of Islam and Democracy [CSID], a nonprofit. So the visit was not funded, as you know, by us or the U.S. Government, but it was also not funded by Georgetown." JihadWatch.org observes, "[I]t is hardly better that the CSID was behind this meeting. Here is a portion of the Discover the Networks entry on the CSID: 'The Center for the Study of Islam and Democracy (CSID) was established in March 1999 by board members and former staffers of the American Muslim Council (AMC). Georgetown University academic John Esposito was also instrumental in CSID's founding, and later went on to serve as vice chair of the organization. According to Islam scholar Daniel Pipes, 'CSID is part of the militant Islamist lobby. It is well-disguised, and has brought in all the Islamist trends, giving them a patent of respectability." The American Muslim Council was once the leading 'moderate' Muslim organization in the U.S. Its founder, Abdurrahman Alamoudi, is now in prison for funding al-Qaeda. The CSID was founded by board members and former staffers of the AMC. The CSID, adds Discover the Networks, 'has numerous ties to the Muslim Brotherhood and its affiliated groups.' This is the kind of group that Obama's State Department partners with." [71093, 71134]

DailyCaller.com reports, "The Obama administration's Consumer Financial Protection Bureau is threatening banks to be silent about the administration's new programs supervising and investigating private bank account holders. A shocking bulletin that CFPB issued to banks, which was obtained by The Daily Caller, was sent around this week in the midst of controversy regarding the administration's Operation Choke Point program, by which the administration pressures banks to cut off accounts for supposedly suspicious businesses, including gun dealers. Operation Choke Point's anti-gun mission was recently confirmed in a series of audiotapes published by the US Consumer Coalition, in which a bank teller explained to a gun dealer why his account was being shut down." (Banks have been pressured by the Obama administration to close accounts of businesses which it opposes, such as gun stores. The administration is now warning banks not to explain to the businesses why their accounts are being canceled. Because Obama cannot get restrictive gun control legislation pass, he is bypassing Congress and using regulatory bureaucrats to punish gun businesses.) [70919]

According to the Associated Press, Raul Castro has "demanded... that the United States return the U.S. base at Guantanamo Bay, lift the half-century trade embargo on Cuba and compensate his country for damages before the two nations re-establish normal relations." On January 29 CNN reports, "The U.S. military and intelligence community now suspect that one of the five Taliban detainees released from Guantanamo Bay in return for Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl in May of last year has attempted to return to militant activity from his current location in Qatar by making contact with suspected Taliban associates in Afghanistan, multiple officials tell CNN. The development has led to an ongoing debate inside the administration about whether there is a new threat from this man, and potentially the other four. ... The officials would not say which of the five men is suspected. But an ongoing U.S. intelligence program to secretly intercept and monitor all of their communications in Qatar turned up evidence in recent months that one of them

has 'reached out' to try to encourage militant activity, one official said. The official would offer no further details." Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich reminds readers of a statement by Hillary Clinton: "As long as they're in Qatar, they're not a threat to the United States. ...In Qatar with an agreement that has been entered into, they are supposed to be constrained from what they can do, and certainly they are not supposed to be permitted to travel, that is as my understanding tells me, what the deal is and in that situation, they are not a threat." The law that covers this is Sec. 1189(a) of Title 8, U.S. Code, from the federal Immigration and Nationality Act." [70937, 70994, 71001]

Sky News reports that child sexual abuse cases are still rampant in Rotherham, England, but the perpetrators are not being arrested or charged because the authorities fear being labeled "Islamophobes." They bully and threaten access of journalists who do their jobs, news organizations that publish stories they don't like and whistleblowers who dare to tell the truth. When I reported on factual contradictions in the Administration's accounts regarding [Operation] Fast and Furious, pushback included a frenzied campaign with White House officials trying to chill the reporting by calling and emailing my superiors and colleagues, using surrogate bloggers to advance false claims, one White House official got so mad he angrily cussed me out. You and your sources will be subjected to the kind of surveillance devised for enemies of the state. The [Attorney General] nominee [Loretta Lynch], if confirmed, should chart a new path to reject the damaging policies and practices that have been used by others in the past. Milwaukee County Sheriff David Clarke tells the committee, "I want to spend some time critiquing... I reject out of hand the mere suggestion of it. If I'm wrong, someone needs to show me the evidence. Officers at the local level put on their uniforms and go out everyday to make their communities better and safer. Without them our communities would collapse into utter chaos. ... Are cops perfect? No, in fact far from it, but they are the community's finest. Every community is unique in what will work and what will not work. For the nation's sake, stop undermining the integrity and character of the American law enforcement officer." [70907]

Demonstrators from the leftist activist group Code Pink interrupt a meeting ot the Senate Armed Services Committee, demanding that former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger be arrested for war crimes. In addition to protest signs, at least on demonstrator brandishes a pair of handcuffs. (Why Capitol police allow people with handcuffs and protest signs into committee meetings is not clear.) Committee chairman John McCain (R-AZ)—perhaps confusing the protesters with conservatives—says, "Get out of here you low-life scum." (One of the protesters appears to be Code Pink co-founder Medea Benjamin. In June 2009 Benjamin personally delivered a letter from the terrorist group Hamas to Obama. In September 2009 she met with then-Iranian president Mahmoud Ahmadinejad in New York City in September 2009. Benjamin's fellow co-founder, Jodie Evans, has been an Obama fundraiser and frequent White House visitor. Schultz tells the committee, "I see nuclear weapon proliferation. That is devastating... my physicist friends say the Hiroshima weapon was just a little play thing. Well, look at the damage it did. A thermonuclear weapon would incinerate the Washington area totally. ...And we were making progress, but that's been derailed and we're going the wrong way right now. ...It should be pointed out that a bomb made from enriched uranium is much easier to make than [the] Hiroshima bomb. [The] Hiroshima bomb was a uranium enrichment bomb. It wasn't even tested ...[Y]ou can make an unsophisticated bomb from enriched uranium fairly easily. That's not a big trick. Our pipelines transport natural gas, refined petroleum products, crude oil, carbon dioxide (CO2) and more.") The Media Research Center notes, "Not a single second of coverage on Keystone appeared on English language networks ABC, CBS, and NBC in addition to Spanish-language networks Telemundo and Univision." This was a bungled attempt by me to thank one special veteran, and by extension, our brave military men and women, veterans everywhere, those who have served while I did not. Williams does not note that he once claimed, during his reporting of Hurricane Katrina, that from the window of his French Quarter hotel in New Orleans he saw a body floating down the street. "So if there was no major flooding in the Quarter, how does Brian Williams spot a dead body floating past his hotel window? You need a good 18 inches of standing water to float a body, if not more. If there was 18 inches of flood water in the Quarter, we'd all know about it. So this is a lie. NBC News' anchor and editor in chief has now been caught in two lies about major world events."
