The Doomed Presidency

July 2013

On July 1 taxpayer-subsidized Stafford student loan rates increase from 3.4 to 6.8 percent after Democrat leaders in the U.S. Senate fail to move forward with bi-partisan legislation intended to prevent the automatic increase. One Republican aide tells DailyCaller.com, "Senate Democrats don't want a deal. They think they'll be able to blame Republicans for opposing their political fix, but with Senate and House Republicans and [Obama] all in basic agreement on the fundamentals here, somehow Senate Democrats think they won't be held responsible for their obstruction. If I were starting college in the fall and needed to get a loan, I'd be furious that Senators [Harry] Reid and [Tom] Harkin are getting in the way of this kind of rare Washington agreement." (The increase in interest rates may actually keep tuition rates from increasing at their present pace because colleges and universities will not be able to take advantage of the below-market rates given to students.) Moneynews.com reports, "U.S. manufacturing activity grew in June at its slowest pace in eight months as overseas demand dried up and firms took on the fewest new workers in more than three years, a survey showed on Monday. Financial data firm Markit said its final U.S. Manufacturing Purchasing Managers Index stood at 51.9 in June, below 52.3 in May and a preliminary June estimate of 52.2. A reading above 50 indicates expansion in the sector. ... The employment sub-index fell to 49.9, the lowest since January 2010 and 'consistent with roughly 30,000 jobs being lost per month in the manufacturing sector,' according to Markit chief economist Chris Williamson said. It stood at 52.6 in May. 'Firms are responding to the increasingly worrying order book trend by pulling back on recruitment,' Williamson said." [46165]

Obama visits Tanzania, where a "First Ladies Summit" event hosted by the George W. Bush Foundation is also held. In attendance at the summit are Michelle Obama, Laura Bush, Hillary Clinton, Barbara Bush, and Rosalyn Carter. Mrs. Obama says, "There are some prison elements to [being First Lady], but it's a really nice prison." Laura Bush cites having a White House chef as a major benefit, to which Obama responds, "You can't complain, but there is [sic] definitely elements that are confining." [46158, 46182]

At his press conference in Tanzania, Obama addresses the demonstrations in Egypt, saying, "Everybody has to show restraint. ... What is clear right now is that although Mr. Morsi was elected democratically, there is more work to be done to create the conditions in which everybody feels their voices are heard, and that the government is responsive and truly representative." Obama praises George W. Bush for his AIDS relief program in Africa: "I think this is one of his crowning achievements. Because of the commitment of the Bush administration and the American people, millions of people's lives have been saved." (At a state dinner later in the evening, Obama also praises former Tanzania

president Julius Nyerere—who pretty much destroyed the nation's economy with his collectivist schemes.) [46174, 46175, 46182, 46194]

WND.com reports, "The Egyptian Military Council and the country's secular opposition have rejected an Obama administration proposal to keep embattled President Mohamed Morsi in power as a transition leader until new elections can be held, according to a senior member of the council... The Military Council member further said there was a feeling of distrust for the White House among the opposition and that the Obama administration was asked by protest leaders to 'stay out of it.' 'The opposition feeling is the U.S. did enough to put the Muslim Brotherhood in power and then try to keep Morsi there,' said the council member. 'The message sent to [U.S. Ambassador to Egypt] Anne Patterson was that this is an internal Egyptian matter and [Obama should] stay out of it.' The council member said it was Patterson who delivered the Obama administration proposal to keep Morsi in office until new elections are set. Protest leaders, who are calling for more mass demonstrations today, gave Morsi until 5 p.m. local time to step down from office. The powerful Egyptian armed forces themselves yesterday gave Morsi an ultimatum of 48 hours to resolve the crisis or else they will introduce a plan for the country's future. 'If the demands of the people are not realized within the defined period, it will be incumbent upon (the armed forces) to announce a road map for the future," said the statement by General Adbel Fattah al-Sisi, the commander-in-chief of the Egyptian Armed Forces. Also yesterday, the Washington Post reported Patterson herself became a target of opposition protesters in Egypt, with some waving signs telling her to 'get out' and accusing her of secretly aiding the Muslim Brotherhood and Morsi." One protest banner reads, "Obama & Patterson Support Terrorism in Egypt." (Pamela Geller advises at AtlasShrugs.com, "Best foreign policy primer for those who don't follow these things closely enough. Whoever Obama supports—support the other guy. Stand for freedom? The Investigative Project on Terrorism reports, "Egypt's Islamist government teetered on the brink Monday in the wake of stunning weekend protests against Muslim Brotherhood rule. 'Theocracy failed here,' Egyptian blogger Mahmoud Salem, also known as 'Sandmonkey,' wrote in a Twitter post Monday. Sixteen people were killed and hundreds were injured during weekend protests that reportedly drew millions of Egyptians to the streets. Many estimated that the protests were larger than the 2011 demonstrations that forced dictator Hosni Mubarak from power. Numerous media accounts describe the broad demographic base of the protesters, from young women to old men, from liberal secularists to conservative Muslims. Several deaths took place when Muslim Brotherhood members opened fire on demonstrators who attacked, set on fire or looted Brotherhood offices. Four cabinet ministers—over tourism, parliamentary affairs, environment and communications—resigned from the government Monday in support of the protesters. Opposition organizers, calling themselves the June 30 Front, are asking demonstrators to wage a campaign of civil disobedience until President Mohamed Morsi resigns, just one year into his four-year term. That includes a continuation of protests, a general strike and other actions. More ominously, the Egyptian army gave Morsi a 48hour ultimatum to negotiate some kind of resolution with the opposition or face what

could amount to a coup, as the military promises to 'announce a future roadmap and measures to oversee its implementation.'" [46176, 46179, 46180, 46184]

Meanwhile, Morsi apparently feels confidant he can ride out the storm of protests if Obama remains in his corner. According to *The Guardian*, one Morsi aide states, "Obviously we feel this is a military coup. But the conviction within the presidency is that [the coup] won't be able to move forward without American approval [and U.S. funding]." [46177]

In Aleppo, Syria, Obama-backed Islamist rebels issue an order banning women from wearing "immodest dress" or "in tight clothing that shows off their bodies or wearing makeup on their face. It is incumbent on all our sisters to obey God and commit to Islamic etiquette." [46178]

In Germany, demonstrators protest the U.S. government's spying on European communications. Some demonstrators carry placards showing Obama wearing headphones and listening to their telephone calls, with the words, "All you data is belong to us [sic]" and with a caption "Stasi 2.0"—referring to the secret police of the former East Germany. European Parliament President Martin Schulz states, "We need more precise information [about U.S. spying practices]. But if it is true, it is a huge scandal. That would mean a huge burden for relations between the EU and the US. We now demand comprehensive information." Luxembourg's Foreign Minister, Jean Asselborn says, "If these reports are true, then it is abhorrent. It would seem that the secret services have gotten out of control. The US should monitor their own secret services rather than their allies. ... The US justifies everything as being part of the fight against terrorism. But the EU and its diplomats are not terrorists. We need a guarantee from the very highest level that it stops immediately." German Justice Minister Sabine Leutheusser-Schnarrenberger states, "If media reports are correct, then it is reminiscent of methods used by enemies during the Cold War. It defies belief that our friends in the US see the Europeans as their enemies. There has to finally be an immediate and comprehensive explanation from the US as to whether media reports about completely unacceptable surveillance measures of the US in the EU are true or not. Comprehensive spying on Europeans by Americans cannot be allowed." Markus Ferber, a member of the European Parliament, says, "A democratic constitutional state that uses Stasi methods sacrifices all credibility as a moral authority. It has destroyed trust." Guy Verhofstadt, former Belgian prime minister and current head of the Alliance of Liberals and Democrats for Europe, states, "This is absolutely unacceptable and must be stopped immediately. The American data collection mania, shown publicly with SWIFT and hidden with Prism, has achieved another quality by spying on EU officials and their meetings. Our trust is at stake." (The Europeans are apparently realizing that Barack "transparent" Obama is not the polar opposite of George W. Bush they thought he was in 2008.) [46154, 46159, 46173]

Secretary of State John Kerry brushes off the charges of spying, telling reporters, "I will say that every country in the world that is engaged in international affairs and national

security undertakes lots of activities to protect its national security and all kinds of information contributes to that. All I know is that is not unusual for lots of nations." (Kerry apparently does not understand there is a difference between spying on enemies and spying on allies.) [46161]

Edward Snowden issues a statement via Wikileaks: "On Thursday ... Obama declared before the world that he would not permit any diplomatic 'wheeling and dealing' over my case. Yet now it is being reported that after promising not to do so, [Obama] ordered his Vice President to pressure the leaders of nations from which I have requested protection to deny my asylum petitions. This kind of deception from a world leader is not justice, and neither is the extralegal penalty of exile. These are the old, bad tools of political aggression. Their purpose is to frighten, not me, but those who would come after me. For decades the United States of America have been one of the strongest defenders of the human right to seek asylum. Sadly, this right, laid out and voted for by the U.S. in Article 14 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, is now being rejected by the current government of my country. The Obama administration has now adopted the strategy of using citizenship as a weapon. Although I am convicted of nothing, it has unilaterally revoked my passport, leaving me a stateless person. Without any judicial order, the administration now seeks to stop me exercising a basic right. A right that belongs to everybody. The right to seek asylum. In the end the Obama administration is not afraid of whistleblowers like me, Bradley Manning or Thomas Drake. We are stateless, imprisoned, or powerless. No, the Obama administration is afraid of you. It is afraid of an informed, angry public demanding the constitutional government it was promised — and it should be. I am unbowed in my convictions and impressed at the efforts taken by so many." (Noting Snowden's shock that Obama would lie, Morning Jolt's Jim Geraghty later points out that "all statements from Barack Obama come with an expiration date." Geraghty also notes Snowden's grammar. His use of "the United States of America have been" indicates someone else drafted—or coached—the statement, because virtually all Americans would incorrectly write has been. Wikileaks then changes the statement to read has been. Of course, have been is, in fact, grammatically correct because it relates to the plural, *states*. One would say, "states have been..." and not "states has been.") [46171, 46172]

Obama's approval rating reaches a record low 43.2 in the IBD/TIPP Presidential Leadership Index. (His rating was 48.9 just one month earlier.) [46196]

Bloomberg.com reports that cash-strapped cities are considering dumping their retired employees on the ObamaCare exchanges in order to reduce the costs of insuring them. "The municipalities plan to end or limit health coverage for retirees under 65 who don't yet qualify for Medicare, with the expectation they can get insurance in the exchanges opening Jan. 1 under ... Obama's health-care law. With U.S. cities facing rising benefit costs and billions of dollars in unfunded liabilities, more municipalities will consider moving retirees off city rolls and into the exchanges, even if they continue to subsidize the coverage, said Neil Bomberg, a program director at the National League of Cities in Washington. ... Chicago plans to phase out retiree health coverage by the beginning of 2017, according to a May 15 letter from Comptroller Amer Ahmad. The city projects that

health-care spending would increase to \$540.7 million in 2023 from \$108.8 million in 2012 without changes, according to a Retiree Healthcare Benefits Commission report in January." (In essence, this means that the city of Chicago plans on shifting the burden of insuring its retired municipally employees on taxpayers who do not even live in Chicago. Of course, if many other cities across the nation do the same, no one's tax burden will be reduced. Dumping older retired city workers onto the ObamaCare exchanges means even higher insurance for the younger customers who will be forced to pay more to subsidize the retirees.) [46324, 46341]

At USDL.info Daniel Greenfield reports, "Obama has announced the appointment of Azizah al-Hibri to the United States Commission on International Religious Freedom. Al-Hibri (full name, Azizah Yahia Muhammad Toufiq al-Hibri) is a Muslim professor and the granddaughter of a Sheikh, who claims that the Koran inspired Thomas Jefferson and the Founders and that the Saudi criminal justice system is more moral than the American one because it accepts blood money from murderers. Appointing a Muslim scholar to a commission on international religious freedom is only justifiable if that scholar recognized that much of the injustice in the world originates from Islamic law. But Al-Hibri has made her career whitewashing Islamic law and even presenting it as superior to American law. While she has been called a reformer, her call in 2001 for a return to the fundamentals echoes Wahhabi rhetoric. Rather than examining the incompatibilities of Islamic law and the modern world, and urging the appropriate adjustments, as genuine reformers have done, Al-Hibri instead builds myths that uphold the Islamist agenda. According to Al-Hibri 'Islamic figh is deeper and better than Western codes of law.' She favorably compares Saudi Arabia's willingness to accept blood money bribes to excuse a murder, to the 'impersonal and powerful' American justice system." [46201, 46202]

Blogger Doug Ross posts "15 photos from the Tahrir Square protests you'll never see in legacy media." They include photos of banners and signs that read, "Wake up America, Obama backs up a fascist regime in Egypt," "Obama supports terrorism," "Obama supports dictator Morsi," "Obama, your bitch is our dictator," and, "From the Egyptian people to U.S. policymakers: Get your dirty hands out of Egypt. To all the American people: We've got nothing but love for you." (IsThatBaloney.com comments, "While the main stream media is covering the protests in Egypt and letting us know that Egyptians are absolutely fed up with Mohamed Morsi and his thuggish radical Islamic regime, they aren't going to tell you that many of the protestors are also against Obama for supporting Morsi. These latest round of protests are being called by some as the largest protests in human history but since they are against the Muslim Brotherhood that Obama supports, the White House has remained virtually silent about them. Of course the willing State Run Media is also playing along with Obama and even though they are showing the large scale of the protests, they are not showing the real sentiment behind them and what's going on via Twitter. The pictures... tell a different story. The people of Egypt see and experience the evil of the Muslim Brotherhood backed Morsi and his fundamentalist Islamic regime he is trying to implement. On *Special Report*, columnist Charles Krauthammer comments on the Egyptian protests against President Mohamed Morsi: "Obama is a bystander, again. Here are the Egyptians in the millions out on the street, trying to bring down an Islamic government, increasingly dictatorial, increasingly intolerant, arresting journalists and judges, trying to Islamicize the military and the people are saying no. And what does [Obama] do? He takes a position of studied neutrality, says he is not supporting either side. And yet... in the Mubarak revolution, he obviously strongly took the side of the people, he demanded that [Hosni] Mubarak had to go. He was not neutral. But this reminds me of the Green Revolution in Iran in 2009 when the same thing happened. Islamists, dictatorial government, the people out in the street, and they were shouting 'Obama, Obama, are you with us or against us?' And he took a position that was essentially supportive of the regime. And the reason was he wanted to negotiate a nuclear deal he thought he could do, and he didn't want instability. That was a shameful episode. There's also the idea of national interest. Mubarak was pro-American. He was an ally of ours. He helped us in all kinds of ways. Obama worked against him." Krauthammer continues, "Morsi represents a movement which is essentially deeply anti-American, and deeply anti-democratic. And yet he is neutral on this. This is a shocking position for [Obama] to take." Moderator Bret Baier points out that Morsi, bad as he may be, was elected. Krauthammer replies, "We have a long history of dictatorial parties that get elected and then end elections. You had [Vladimir] Putin in Russia. [Adolf] Hitler is the greatest example, of course. [Hugo] Chávez, the Sandinistas. The list of these is long. The [Muslim] Brotherhood is not a democratic party. It's not the British Labor, not the Democratic Party of America. It is a movement that has an ideology. Its allegiance is to Islam. And it was—in the short year it was in office [in Egypt], it ran through an Islamist extreme constitution with no compromise with anybody and was ruling dictatorially. I think for a president to pretend if elected once, you have the protection and support of the United States is a complete misunderstanding of what legitimacy is." [46149, 46183]

On July 2 the White House confirms that Obama telephoned Egyptian President Mohamed Morsi. According to the Associated Press, "Obama told Morsi that the United States is committed to the democratic process in Egypt and does not support any single party or group. The statement also said Obama underscored to Morsi that the current crisis can only be resolved through a political process." (It is worth noting that in 2011 Obama "took sides" and urged Morsi's predecessor, Hosni Mubarak, to step down, but is unwilling to take sides and encourage the decidedly anti-American Morsi to resign.) Obama enlists the aid of Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff General Martin Dempsey to help rescue Morsi, with Dempsey telephoning Egyptian chief of staff General Sedki Sobhi—probably in an attempt to dissuade the Egyptian military from ousting Morsi. Meanwhile, Morsi refuses to step down from the presidency or even accede to any of the demands of millions of protestors. He defiantly states, "I am the president of Egypt. ... The remnants of the former regime [of Hosni Mubarak], they are fighting against our democracy. If they come back to the people they will be rejected. They are accustomed to

corruption, rigging elections sucking dry the blood of the people. They cannot thrive in democracy. ... Safeguard Egypt, safeguard the revolution. The revolution we earned by the sweat of our eyebrows and by the blood of our martyrs." [46208, 46210]

At Townhall.com Kevin McCullough reports, "On Wednesday June 26, 2013 reports began to pop up across the Arabic world citing an internal Libyan government memo that has not yet been acknowledged in the American press. ... Multiple sources have confirmed this document details several confessions of the six Egyptians in Libyan custody for the 9.11.12 bombing of the U.S. Consulate in Benghazi. The document details the involvement of the Muslim Brotherhood and Egyptian President Mohamed Morsi as being involved with and in the funding, support, planning, and execution of the attack. ...[The memorandum] was prepared by Mahmoud Ibrahim Sharif, the Director of National Security of Libya. In his report Sharif conveys that the Libyan investigation unearthed an Egyptian (terror) cell that had been involved in the planning and execution of the attack. Six confessions [are extracted] from those arrested at the scene—all of them Egyptian—and all connected to the U.S. terror watch listed group Ansar al-Sharia. Concerning the most important claim of the Libyan memo, Raymond Ibrahim, (an American research librarian, translator, and author, whose focus is Arabic history, language, and current events) indicates that 'during interrogations, these Egyptian jihadi cell members 'confessed to very serious and important information concerning the financial sources of the group and the planners of the event and the storming and burning of the U.S. consulate in Benghazi... And among the more prominent figures whose names were mentioned by cell members during confessions: Egyptian President Mohamed Morsi...' The investigation also seems to have unearthed a video taken the night of the attack in which members of the jihadists identify themselves as being sent personally by 'Dr. Morsi.'" [46206]

McCullough asks, "If in fact Egyptian President Mohamed Morsi was even remotely involved, tacitly aware, or even seen giving nodding approval, why on earth did ...Obama turn around and deliver 16 fighter jets and 200 tanks to the Egyptian regime roughly three months later? Why was Morsi invited to the White House in September 2012? Then invited for December 5, 2012? Then February 2013, then March? Why does his visit get continually postponed as though the White House seems to know something about him and his visit that they are not comfortable with? Why was [Obama] so thoroughly unreachable when the attack took place, and for a period of six to eight hours, incapable of accounting for where he was as the worst of it played out? ... Why did the Obama White House and the National Security Council meet with and host a Muslim Brotherhood radical on June 13, 2013? ... And why does the current administration have as many as a half dozen mid to upper level appointees that have ties to the Muslim Brotherhood—either directly or through Brotherhood member organizations? ... Is it possible that something even more sinister was playing out on the night of 9.11.12, and the rationale for all the lies about the incendiary video, and Dr. Susan Rice, and the changing of the story during a Presidential debate, was in fact to keep us from having the bigger story told? Was Egypt part of the intentional set-up with the out-of-the-blue protest at the American embassy initiated by the Morsi government to help give the Obama administration the cover for the narrative about 'the video?' There is no doubt

that when Obama had the choice to assist Hosni Mubarak—who while far from perfect—kept a tight leash on the extremist elements under his rule, chose instead to push Mubarak aside in favor of the Brotherhood's Mohamed Morsi. Note that *The Obama Timeline* continues to believe that the Obama-Morsi scheme was for U.S. Ambassador to Libya Christopher Stevens to be kidnapped, after which Obama would "negotiate" a deal in which Stevens would be exchanged for Omar Abdel Rahman, the "blind sheik" who is serving time in a U.S. prison for planning the 1993 World Trade Center bombing. Morsi had promised radical Muslims that one of his primary goals as president of Egypt would be the release of Rahman, and Obama believed he could reassure his reelection with his "brilliant" actions to save Stevens. But the Obama-Morsi scheme went awry when Morsi's thugs inadvertently killed Stevens, forcing Obama to rely on the story that the attack was simply a YouTube video protest that got out of hand. Hillary Clinton was forced to go along with the story to protect her own political future and assure that Obama would support her in 2016, and Obama was forced to "play nice" with Morsi to keep him from revealing the truth—which would result in the impeachment of Obama and criminal charges being filed against him for conspiracy to kidnap. If this conjecture is accurate, Obama has to protect Morsi in order to keep him quiet—or somehow insure that his silence is guaranteed.

Canada's *National Post* reports, "A British Columbia man and woman are facing three terror charges after they allegedly left devices similar to those used in the Boston Marathon bombing intended to 'cause death' during Canada Day [July 1] celebrations at the B.C. Parliament Buildings. John Stewart Nuttall, 38, and Amanda Marie Korody, 28, have been charged with knowingly facilitating a terrorist activity and making or possessing an explosive device. RCMP [Royal Canadian Mounted Police] said the pair took steps to build explosives devices—using pressure cookers, which were used in the Boston attack—to cause "death and injuries" during Canada Day celebrations in Victoria and they were inspired by Al Qaeda ideology. Pictures provided by the RCMP showed rusted nails inside the pressure cookers. 'These individuals were inspired by al-Qaeda [that is, Islamist] ideology. Our investigation demonstrated that this was a domestic threat, without international linkages,' RCMP Assistant Commissioner James Malizia said in a statement." (Obama has no comment.) Obama faces political reality with one aspect of ObamaCare, as Bloomberg.com reports: "Businesses won't be penalized next year if they fail to provide workers health insurance after the Obama administration decided to delay a key requirement under its signature 2010 health-care law. The government will postpone enforcement of the so-called employer mandate until 2015, the administration said today. Under the provision, companies with 50 or more workers face a fine of as much as \$3,000 per employee if they don't offer affordable insurance." (In other words, "The employer mandate is being postponed until after the November 2014 elections.") Obama advisor Valerie Jarrett states, "In our ongoing discussions with businesses we have heard that you need the time to get this right. We are listening." (In other words, "If the economy suffers any more job losses, Democrats will lose big in the Congressional elections.") HotAir.com predicts, "Expect lots of public pronouncements from Hillary Clinton, beginning sooner than you think, about how she admires [Obama] for having tried on universal health care but emphasizing that she would have done things 'quite a bit differently." (Although delaying the employer mandate for one year may result in fewer ObamaCare job losses, insurance premiums for most policies will still likely increase substantially throughout 2014—and many voters will remember that at the ballot box. Delaying the employer mandate will also cost the taxpayers billions of dollars because employees who do not receive employer-paid insurance will then buy it at the ObamaCare exchanges, where the cost will subsidized by the taxpayers—to the tune of about \$5,290 per enrollee.) Senator John Barrasso (R-WY) calls the regulatory announcement a "clear admission" that ObamaCare is "unaffordable, unworkable, and unpopular. It's also a cynical political

(Barrasso does not ask, "If Obama can unilaterally delay implementation of portions of ObamaCare, what is to stop him from arbitrarily delaying any border enforcement requirements in amnesty legislation?") In 2011 the administration postponed ObamaCare's long-term nursing home care program, which was so unworkable it was repealed in 2012. Earlier in 2013 the Obama administration delayed until at least 2015 the Small Business Health Option Program, yet another indication that ObamaCare is unworkable—or that the people responsible for its implementation are incompetent. House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) issues a statement declaring that ObamaCare "is already raising costs and costing jobs. This is a clear acknowledgment that the law is unworkable, and it underscores the need to repeal the law and replace it with effective, patient-centered reforms." [46205]

LATimes.com reports, "The nation's largest health insurer, UnitedHealth Group Inc., is leaving California's individual health insurance market, the second major company to exit in advance of major changes under the Affordable Care Act. UnitedHealth said it had notified state regulators that it would leave the state's individual market at year-end and force about 8,000 customers to find new coverage. Last month, Aetna Inc., the nation's third-largest health insurer, made a similar move affecting about 50,000 existing policyholders." (Obama's promise that "You can keep your policy" under ObamaCare is meaningless if the insurance company is pushed out of the market by the legislation.) [46216, 46217]

Via Twitter, Fox News, Bret Baier reports, "Various sources expect the Egyptian military to remove [Mohamed] Morsi from the Presidency tomorrow." But on Facebook, a Muslim Brotherhood leader, Mohammed el-Beltagi, states, "Seeking martyrdom to prevent the ongoing coup is what we can offer as a sign of gratitude to previous martyrs who died in the revolution." HotAir.com observes, "It's easy to draw the conclusion from the size of the mammoth anti-Morsi protests in Cairo that the people are entirely against him. Not true. The Islamists waited decades to take power in Egypt. They're not ready to hand it back after two years..." [46189]

The U.S. embassy in Cairo, Egypt remains closed for a third consecutive day, and CNSNews.com reports, "Foreign Minister Mohamed Kamel Amr became the fifth cabinet minister to resign in two days; a former armed forces chief of staff said he was resigning as an advisor to [President Mohamed] Morsi and throwing his support behind opposition protestors; and the Salafist Nour party, once allied to the Muslim Brotherhood, also joined calls for early elections." [46194]

At FoxNews.com Chris Stirewalt writes, "...Obama has reached that unhappy moment in which his best defenders are the cynics. The world-weary porters of low expectations for

political courage and reform are rousing themselves to [his] defense, telling his detractors left and right to demand less of Obama. ... The idol of 2008, a healer of the Age of Oprah, dissolved faster in the eyes of the American people. The man who promised that we could 'be the change' we wanted if we only could 'believe,' had been mostly replaced by 2010 with a guy who often explained that things were much worse than he thought and that we could only 'be the change' if Republicans stopped being so Republican-y. ... As problems foreign and domestic overtake [his] second term, Obama's defenders are turning into apologists. Yes, the IRS is a thoroughgoing disaster and the Department of Justice was out of line. And America's stature in the world isn't what it used to be, so [Obama] is bound to get punked from time to time by Vladimir Putin. Author and Middle East expert Raymond Ibrahim reports, "Sheikh Hazim Abu Ismail, an important figure among Egypt's Islamists, who bridged between the Muslim Brotherhood and the Salafis—and who was even a former 2012 presidential candidate, before being disqualified—has been arrested. The report does not indicate why Abu Ismail was arrested. But it is interesting to note that his name—along with President Morsi and other prominent Egyptian Islamists—was mentioned in a recent Libyan report as being involved in the attack on the U.S. embassy in Benghazi. As news was announced that the anti-freedom, Sharia-pushing sheikh had been arrested, Egyptian protesters in front of the presidential palace celebrated by shooting fireworks and chanting 'Still more! Still more!'—a reference to other Islamist leaders, namely of the Muslim Brotherhood, that many Egyptian protesters hope to hear are soon returned to their prison cells." (Within hours, in fact, additional prominent members of the Muslim Brotherhood are arrested in Egypt.) [46203]

William W. Taylor III, attorney for IRS official Lois "Plead the Fifth" Lerner, tells Politico she will testify before Congress about the agency's discriminating against conservative groups only if she is granted immunity from prosecution. [46212, 46221]

DailyCaller.com reports, "Federal Bureau of Investigation and Internal Revenue Service investigators working on the federal government's probe into the IRS targeting scandal have not contacted any of the conservative groups involved in a class-action lawsuit against the tax agency. 'No one from the FBI or the IRS investigative team has contacted any of the 41 conservative groups we represent or any of our attorneys,' American Center for Law and Justice spokesman Gene Kapp told The Daily Caller. ACLJ is representing tea party and other conservative groups in the lawsuit." [46215]

The Senate Intelligence Committee releases a letter from James Clapper, Obama's Director of National Intelligence, in which he claims he falsely testified that the government was not spying on the telephone records of U.S. citizens only because he "simply didn't think of Section 215 of the Patriot Act." (That is, "I said we weren't spying on Americans because I forgot that we were spying on Americans." *The Obama Timeline* does not suggest that any American tell the IRS, "I did not pay my taxes because I forgot there was an income tax.") A June 20–24 Gallup poll shows that only 48 percent of Americans believe Obama "shares their values." The general consensus is that Americans find him likeable (76 percent) but less than competent, with only 44 percent believing he "can manage government effectively," 38 percent believing he "has a clear plan for solving the country's problems," and 40 percent believing he "works well with both [political] parties in Washington." The Wall Street Journal reports, "Florida State's Attorney Angela Corey has been indicted by a citizens' grand jury, convening in Ocala, Florida, over the alleged falsification of the arrest warrant and complaint that lead [sic' led] to George Zimmerman being charged with the second degree murder of African-American teenager Trayvon Martin in Sanford, Florida. The indictment of Corey, which was handed down last... charges Corey with intentionally withholding photographic evidence of the injuries to George Zimmerman's head in the warrant she allegedly rushed to issue under oath, in an effort to boost her reelection prospects. At the outset of this case, black activists such as Jesse Jackson and Al Sharpton, who whipped up wrath against Zimmerman, demanded that he be charged with murder, after local police had thus far declined to arrest him pending investigation. Following Corey's criminal complaint charging Zimmerman, legal experts such as Harvard Law Professor Alan Dershowitz condemned her for falsely signing an arrest affidavit under oath, which intentionally omitted exculpatory evidence consisting of the photographs showing the injuries Zimmerman sustained, and rushing to charge him with second degree murder under political pressure. Dershowitz called her actions unethical and themselves crimes." (A "citizens' grand jury" is one convened by concerned citizens who believe justice is not being served on a particular issue. Their applications to official courts are usually ignored.) [46690, 46691, 46692, 46693]

On July 3 Congressman Steve King (R-IA) says, "If ...Obama wants to make changes to ObamaCare, he must come to Congress. Two years ago, the Obama Administration, through a memo from a Homeland Security Department bureaucrat, declared it would not enforce our nation's immigration laws. Now the Obama Administration, through a blog post by an Assistant Secretary in the Treasury Department, is declaring it won't even enforce its own health care law on employers. We live in a Constitutional Republic. We are a nation governed by laws written by Congress, not memos and blog posts written by bureaucrats." (Obama did not have the courage to announce that he was delaying the implementation of the employer mandate in ObamaCare. Instead, the surprising change was announced by a bureaucrat via the Internet.) King states that Obama "has no constitutional authority to amend his own bill. He has no constitutional authority to simply waive the law. No matter Obama's determination to suspend his own law, only

Congress can do so." (Obama cannot simply choose to implement some parts of ObamaCare while delaying others. The job of the executive branch of the federal government is to implement and enforce the law, not write or interpret the law.) [46222, 46239]

At WashingtonExaminer.com Philip Klein points out various ways in which the delay of the employer mandate "wreaks havoc" with ObamaCare. "One of the main ways that ...Obama's health care law plans to expand insurance coverage is by offering subsidies for individuals to purchase insurance on government-run exchanges. There are a number of eligibility requirements attached to the subsidies such as income level and immigration status. But another fundamental requirement is that applicants for federal subsidies must be able to show their employer does not offer health insurance that meets the federal government's standards for affordability and breadth of benefits. If the employer offers qualifying health insurance, then the worker is not eligible. Yet in its Tuesday announcement, the Treasury Department said it was not only delaying the implementation of the employer mandate, but also the employer insurance reporting requirements. If the Obama administration won't be making judgments on whether employers are meeting the requirements of Obamacare, how can it assess individuals' eligibility to receive subsidies to purchase insurance on the exchanges?" On *CBS This Morning*, John Dickerson comments on the ObamaCare employer mandate delay: "As a political matter, this is not good. The White House made the decision, though, [to] take the pain now before the July 4th weekend rather than have all of these stories over the next year of companies that were laying off workers or having such a hard time implementing this. ... And though this delay, again, takes this story from being a chronic ailment as it gets implemented, it doesn't really reduce the fact that in a lot of these states where Democrats are running, red states, this law is unpopular." Home Depot co-founder and former CEO Bernie Marcus tells the Fox Business channel's Neil Cavuto that ObamaCare "is going to have a very dramatic effect on the way we live our lives. It's going to hurt every one of them. This is a bad deal for America. It's a bad deal for business, it's a bad deal for job creation in America and I don't know what's going to happen. I can't believe the American people don't understand that their costs are going to go up, that the kind of medical attention in the future is nothing like what they had in the past. ...It just doesn't make any sense to me. ...Older people, the people who [can] least afford it, the poor people and the single people who voted overwhelmingly for him [Obama] are gonna have to come up and involve themselves in the mandate or they're gonna pay a fine. ...This [employer mandate delay] is all a political maneuver and it's bad for America. Why aren't we thinking about what's good for the American people? This is very destructive for jobs, it's very destructive for anybody out there. It's

only what's good for the politicians and we know there's an election coming up in 2014 and we know that if this thing had gone into effect in 2014, there would have been hell to pay." [46370]

The Wall Street Journal writes, "These columns fought the Affordable Care Act from start to passage, and we'd now like to apologize to our readers. It turns out we weren't nearly critical enough. The law's implementation is turning into a fiasco for the ages, and this week's version is the lawless White House decision to delay the law's insurance mandate for businesses, though not for individuals. The employer mandate is central to ObamaCare's claim of providing universal coverage. Companies with 50 or more 'employee equivalents' must pay a \$2,000 penalty per full-time employee if they don't provide government-approved health insurance. The provision was supposed to start in January, and delaying it is like Ford saying its electric car is ready to go, except the electric battery doesn't work. ... This [delay] is probably an admission that Treasury's information technology isn't ready to process and cross-check paperwork across the 5.7 million businesses in America, especially the pass-through S-corps and partnerships that file under the individual tax code. This is more than a typical government snafu. It relates directly to the design of the law, which was thoughtlessly written and rammed through Congress with instructions for the bureaucracy to figure it all out. And, lo, over eight interim final rules, three final rules, 20 requests for comment, 21 proposed rules, one information collection request, two amendments to the interim final rules, six requests for information and one frequently-asked-questions document, the Administration has created an employer-mandate system that, for example, requires business to track and report every full-time employee's hours of service on a monthly basis." "Meanwhile, the law stipulates that a full-time workweek for the purposes of the mandate is 30 hours, when general business practice is at least 35. The result is that businesses have been scrambling to insulate themselves from higher labor costs by hiring part-time workers, or splitting shifts, or in some industries like fast food even sharing workers. Small firms trying to expand while avoiding the 50-worker trigger have come to be known as 49ers. The delay will help these and other employers avoid immediately higher costs, which is why the main business lobbies endorsed it. But the decision will continue to dampen overall job creation because businesses know they'll still be whacked in a year. Businesses don't hire workers with the intention of sacking them later. The Administration's media cheerleaders are nonetheless portraying this as a stroke of political genius to push all the pain past the 2014 elections. But if that's the goal, it is too clever by half. If Republicans have any sense, they will move immediately to delay the rest of the bill for at least a year too. They should start with the individual mandate to buy insurance or pay a tax. Individuals are only supposed to be eligible for ObamaCare's subsidies if their employer doesn't offer the right benefits. But how will the Treasury know who qualifies in 2014 if they lack the information that businesses are supposed to provide?" [46271]

"Citizens must also pay the individual mandate-tax if they decline coverage from their employer. How will the Treasury verify these offers? Which brings us to the dubious legality of this delay. The Affordable Care Act's Section 1513 states in black-letter law

that '(d) Effective Date.—The amendments made by this section shall apply to months beginning after December 31, 2013.' It does not say the Administration can impose the mandate whenever it feels it is politically convenient. This selective enforcement of laws has become an Administration habit. From immigration (the Dream Act by fiat) to easing welfare reform's work requirements to selective waivers for No Child Left Behind, the Obama Administration routinely suspends enforcement of or unilaterally rewrites via regulation the laws it dislikes. Now it is doing it again on health care, without any consultation from, much less the approval of, Congress. ... Obama probably figures business and Republicans won't object because they don't like the law anyway. But Republicans should give Mr. Obama the legal authority to suspend the mandate—in return for other concessions. In addition to forcing votes on suspending the individual mandate-tax, this could include repealing the medical device tax and other harmful provisions. Democrats will find it hard to defend an individual mandate-tax now that businesses are spared. And a delay of one year can easily become two, then three, and then past the next Presidential election. ObamaCare has become a rolling 'train wreck,' in Senator Max Baucus's memorable phrase, and it gets worse the more of it the public sees. The employer mandate is terrible policy, as the law's critics said before it passed. Now the Administration is all but admitting it can't implement it properly, and the task for opponents is to press the concession and begin to delay the rest of the law and dismantle it piece by piece." WashingtonTimes.com reports that immigrants "...have accounted for all of the job gains in the U.S. labor market since 2000, according to a report that highlights the stiff competition for jobs in a tight economy as Congress debates adding more workers to the mix. The Center for Immigration Studies report, which is being released Wednesday, says 22.4 million immigrants of working age held jobs at the beginning of this year, up 5.3 million over the total in 2000. But native-born workers with jobs dropped 1.3 million over that same period, from 114.8 million to 113.5 million. Meanwhile, the number of Americans who aren't in the labor force at all has jumped by almost 13 million to reach 48.6 million—a finding the report's authors say signals profound changes in the American job market and challenges conventional wisdom that immigration is good for the economy." Millions of Egyptians celebrate as their army removes President Mohamed Morsi from power. Many in the crowd chant, "No more beards!" According to NBCNews.com, "The former leader was placed under house arrest at the Republican Guard Club, a senior adviser to the Freedom and Justice Party and spokesman for the Muslim Brotherhood said. Most members of the presidential team have also been placed under house arrest. Egyptian security forces also arrested the head of the Muslim Brotherhood's Freedom and Justice Party and another of the movement's top leaders. The commanding general of the armed forces, Gen. Abdel Fattah al-Sisi, said on Egyptian television that the military was suspending the constitution, which Morsi pushed through and which many Egyptians saw as slanted toward Islamists. ...[Al-Sisi] spoke alongside a leading Sunni Muslim cleric and the head of Egypt's Coptic Christians, as well as a prominent political opponent of Morsi—Mohamed ElBaradei, the former head of the U.N. nuclear weapons agency. Armored vehicles, tanks and troops deployed throughout the Egyptian capital,

including near the presidential palace. The army seized the headquarters of the state television and the state-run newspaper, which reported that Morsi had been told he was no longer president." [46224, 46228, 46249, 46276]

Obama states, "As I have said since the Egyptian Revolution, the United States supports a set of core principles, including opposition to violence, protection of universal human rights, and reform that meets the legitimate aspirations of the people. The United States does not support particular individuals or political parties, but we are committed to the democratic process and respect for the rule of law." (Obama did, of course, support the ouster of Hosni Mubarak in 2011 in deference to the Muslim Brotherhood, so he can hardly say he does not pick sides.) "Since the current unrest in Egypt began, we have called on all parties to work together to address the legitimate grievances of the Egyptian people, in accordance with the democratic process, and without recourse to violence or the use of force." "The United States is monitoring the very fluid situation in Egypt, and we believe that ultimately the future of Egypt can only be determined by the Egyptian people. Nevertheless, we are deeply concerned by the decision of the Egyptian Armed Forces to remove President Morsi and suspend the Egyptian constitution." (The military is well respected by most Egyptians and has no desire to take control of the presidency. Adli Mansour, head of the constitutional court, will be acting president until new elections are held.) "I now call on the Egyptian military to move quickly and responsibly to return full authority back to a democratically elected civilian government as soon as possible through an inclusive and transparent process, and to avoid any arbitrary arrests of President Morsi and his supporters." (Obama has no business deciding which Egyptians have broken the law and warrant arrest.) "Given today's developments, I have also directed the relevant departments and agencies to review the implications under U.S. law for our assistance to the Government of Egypt." (The Obama administration unilaterally waived restrictions in aid to the Morsi regime in March 2013 and again, secretly, in April 2013. With his Muslim Brotherhood buddy Morsi removed from office, Obama now suddenly decides he wants to follow the rules for providing aid. PPJMedia.com notes that Obama ignored Senator Rand Paul (R-KY) when he argued that aid to Egypt should be suspended because of Morsi's human rights violations.) The voices of all those who have protested peacefully must be heard—including those who welcomed today's

developments, and those who have supported President Morsi." (Obama demanding that the Muslim Brotherhood not be excluded from the political process in Egypt is tantamount to demanding that gang members and drug dealers be represented on the Chicago City Council.) "No transition to democracy comes without difficulty, but in the end it must stay true to the will of the people. An honest, capable and representative government is what ordinary Egyptians seek and what they deserve. (Of Obama's statement, Mary Katherine Ham remarks at HotAir.com, "There's a dash of 'let me be clear' mixed with a classic 'I've consistently supported a vague framework within which this happens to totally fall,' seasoned with an emphasis on non-violence and a mild brow-furrowing over use of force. The statement does not come to a conclusion on Allah's approve/disapprove question, but notes 'deep concern' and a promise to 'review' law governing assistance to Egypt.") Egypt's Al-Tahrir newspaper responds to Obama's remarks with a front page message: "It's a revolution... not a coup, Mr. Obama." [46297]

It did not have to be this way. When Morsy was elected a little more than a year ago ... (WhiteHouseDossier.com suggests that the delay in the employer mandate and its enforcement mechanism is an effort by Obama to get more people to sign up for federal insurance at the ObamaCare exchanges. That is, many Americans may obtain taxpayer-subsidized health insurance by lying about their income at the exchanges, and "Millions may sign up who don't qualify. ...Once our citizens start getting their new subsidized gifts, they will be LOATHE TO GIVE THEM BACK. The Obama people know that. It's the guiding principle of the whole welfare state: Roll out the benefits, and let the Republican just try to roll them back!") The State Department acknowledged last week that one of its officials is the target of a probe over 'allegations of improprieties relating to a Consular Officer formerly assigned to Georgetown, Guyana' without providing further details. Local media are also claiming the official, who was recently withdrawn from normal duties pending completion of an official investigation, associated with drug lords as part of his visa scam. The scandal began when executives and tourists complained that their visa applications were being held up, and local media began reporting that a visa official was demanding bribes and sex in exchange for visas. ... [Edy] Duran has been 'accused of selling visas to many corrupt businessmen [and] drug dealers ... for as low as US\$15,000,' according to a news report in the Guyana Observer News. 'The Feds have not stumbled on concrete evidence on the issue of money for visas, but sufficient evidence on the sex for visas.'" [46339]

Jeff Cohen, a former senior producer for MSNBC, writes at Alternet.org. "When it comes to issues of U.S. militarism and spying, the allegedly 'progressive' MSNBC often seems closer to the 'official network of the Obama White House' than anything resembling an independent channel. With a few exceptions... MSNBC has usually reacted to expanded militarism and surveillance by downplaying the abuses or defending them. Had [John] McCain or [Mitt] Romney defeated Obama and implemented the exact same policies, treating whistleblowers like [Bradley] Manning and [Edward] Snowden as foreign espionage agents, one would expect MSNBC hosts to be loudly denouncing the Republican abuses of authority. ...For the most part, the left is perfectly okay with MSNBC being a branch of the Obama White House on every other issue. As he travels to presidential swing states, Mr. Obama won't attempt to pressure particular House members, but rather underscore the point that the GOP must improve its standing among Latino voters if it hopes to win presidential races down the road, White House officials said. He will go to 'areas that Republicans hope to do better in and need to do better in,' one White House official said. (It is absurd, of course, for anyone to believe that Obama would offer advice that is helpful to Republican candidates. He simply wants millions of illegal immigrants turned into Democrat-voting U.S. citizens.) [46358, 46359]

On July 8 Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) writes in *The Wall Street* Journal, "... Obama's decision last week to suspend the employer mandate of the Affordable Care Act may be welcome relief to businesses affected by this provision, but it raises grave concerns about his understanding of the role of the executive in our system of government. Article II, Section 3, of the Constitution states that the president 'shall take Care that the Laws be faithfully executed.' This is a duty, not a discretionary power. While the president does have substantial discretion about how to enforce a law, he has no discretion about whether to do so. ... The only constitutional power the president has to suspend or repeal statutes is to veto a bill or propose new legislation. Writing for the court in Clinton v. City of New York, Justice John Paul Stevens noted: 'There is no provision in the Constitution that authorizes the president to enact, to amend, or to repeal statutes.' The employer mandate in the Affordable Care Act contains no provision allowing the president to suspend, delay or repeal it. Section 1513(d) states in no uncertain terms that 'The amendments made by this section shall apply to months beginning after December 31, 2013.' Imagine the outcry if Mitt Romney had been elected president and simply refused to enforce the whole of ObamaCare. ... Democrats too may acquiesce in Mr. Obama's action, as they have his other aggressive assertions of executive power. Yet what will they say when a Republican president decides that the tax rate on capital gains is a drag on economic growth and instructs the IRS not to enforce it? And what of immigration reform? Why bother debating the details of a compromise if future presidents will feel free to disregard those parts of the statute that they don't like? ...Of all the stretches of executive power Americans have seen in the past few years, [Obama's] unilateral suspension of statutes may have the most disturbing long-term effects. As the Supreme Court said long ago (Kendall v. United States, 1838), allowing the president to refuse to enforce statutes passed by Congress 'would be clothing the president with a power to control the legislation of congress, and paralyze the administration of justice." (Some Democrats also question Obama's action. Senator Tom Harkin (D-IA) asks, "This was the law. How can they change the law?") [46376, 46386]

ArsTechnica.com reports that the Economic Development Administration, an agency within the Department of Commerce, responded to a possible malware infection in its computer systems in late 2011 by destroying "desktop computers but also printers,

cameras, keyboards, and even *mice*. The destruction only stopped—sparing \$3 million of equipment—because the agency had run out of money to pay for destroying the hardware. The total cost to the taxpayer of this incident was \$2.7 million: \$823,000 went to the security contractor for its investigation and advice, \$1,061,000 for the acquisition of temporary infrastructure (requisitioned from the Census Bureau), \$4,300 to destroy \$170,500 in IT equipment, and \$688,000 paid to contractors to assist in development of a long-term response. Full recovery took close to a year. ... The malware that was found was common stuff. There were no signs of persistent, novel infections, nor any indications that the perpetrators were nation-states rather than common, untargeted criminal attacks. [An] audit does, however, note that the EDA's IT infrastructure was so badly managed and insecure that no attacker would *need* sophisticated attacks to compromise the agency's systems." MyWay.com reports, "The nation's top special operations commander ordered military files about the Navy SEAL raid on Osama bin Laden's hideout to be purged from Defense Department computers and sent to the CIA, where they could be more easily shielded from ever being made public. The secret move, described briefly in a draft report by the Pentagon's inspector general, set off no alarms within the Obama administration even though it appears to have sidestepped federal rules and perhaps also the Freedom of Information Act. ...[S]ecretly moving the records allowed the Pentagon to tell The Associated Press that it couldn't find any documents inside the Defense Department that AP had requested more than two years ago, and could represent a new strategy for the U.S. government to shield even its most sensitive activities from public scrutiny. 'Welcome to the shell game in place of open government,' said Thomas Blanton, director of the National Security Archive, a private research institute at George Washington University. 'Guess which shell the records are under. If you guess the right shell, we might show them to you. It's ridiculous.'" [46340]

The Washington Times reports, "During his recent \$100 million 'working' vacation in Africa ... Obama was upbraided by the president and vice president of his father's native Kenya and got into a very public spat with the president of Senegal, all over homosexual rights and same-sex marriage. On the initial leg of his weeklong trip, Mr. Obama took African nations to task for discriminating against homosexuals. Senegal is one of 38 African nations that criminalize 'consensual same-sex conduct.' With hundreds of journalists watching, Mr. Obama traded barbs with Senegalese President Macky Sall. Mr. Sall told him bluntly: 'We are not ready to decriminalize homosexuality.' Senegal's tabloid press came down firmly on the side of Mr. Macky. The newspaper Liberation, mocking Mr. Obama's 2008 campaign cry, declared: 'No, we can't.' According to a Pew poll, 96 percent of the Senegalese disapprove of the practice of homosexuality. Mr. Obama's gay evangelism continued on the other side of the African continent. Kenyan President Uhuru Kenyatta and Deputy President William Ruto, at separate religious events Sunday, both rebuffed Mr. Obama's overtures. Mr. Ruto said Kenya, which wasn't even on Mr. Obama's itinerary, 'is a God-fearing nation,' and that it would uphold its strong religious strictures on homosexuality. The Pew poll found 90 percent of Kenyans think homosexuality is wrong. Mr. Obama's gay crusade isn't limited to Africa. Religious leaders in the Dominican Republic are angry over Mr. Obama's nomination of

a homosexual activist to be the ambassador to the Caribbean island nation. The nomination of James Brewster, co-chairman for homosexual issues at the Democratic National Committee, has drawn the wrath of Cardinal Nicolas de Jesus Lopez, the Catholic archbishop in the Dominican capital, and other religious leaders there. Vicar Pablo Cedano told The Associated Press that the nomination showed 'a lack of respect, of consideration, that they send us that kind of person as ambassador.' They asked Dominican President Danilo Medino to reject the nomination." [46344]

According to the Department of Agriculture, an estimated 101 million Americans receive food stamps or benefits from one of 14 other federal food programs. CNSNews.com points out, "That means the number of Americans receiving food assistance has surpassed the number of full-time private sector workers in the U.S." (The food programs cost the taxpayers \$114 billion in 2012.) TheHill.com reports, "The Obama administration is urging companies to thoroughly check a person's eligibility before providing cellphone service that is subsidized by the government. The FCC expressed concerns that wireless companies might be activating phones for the program, known as Lifeline, 'prior to fully verifying the eligibility of such consumers.' ... Many of the companies that receive money under the Lifeline service offer free or cheap phones to consumers who participate. The notice from the FCC comes a few weeks after Project Veritas, a conservative organization led by activist James O'Keefe, released a video that shows distributors giving free Lifeline phones to people who said they planned to resell them. One of the recipients said he planned to use it for drug money." (In other words, O'Keefe shamed the administration into following the law.) [46351]

In an interview with WorldTribune.com, Mike Zullo, the lead investigator for the "cold case posse" investigation of Obama's birth certificate, says, "We have obtained an affidavit from a certified document analyzer, Reed Hayes, that states the document is a 100 percent forgery, no doubt about it." Reuters reports, "Congressional committees are holding up a plan to send U.S. weapons to rebels fighting Syrian President Bashar al-Assad because of fears that such deliveries will not be decisive and the arms might end up in the hands of Islamist militants, five U.S. national security sources said. Both the Senate and House of Representatives intelligence committees have expressed reservations behind closed doors at the effort by ...Obama's administration to support the insurgents by sending them military hardware." On July 9 FoxNews.com reports, "The IRS mistakenly posted the Social Security numbers of tens of thousands of Americans on a government website, the agency confirmed Monday night. One estimate put the figure as high as 100,000 names. The numbers were posted to an IRS database for tax-exempt political groups known as 527s and first discovered by the group Public.Resource.org. ...The group said the Social Security numbers were largely those of donors, though some were also from people who prepared tax returns to furnish to the IRS." CBSNews.com reports, "The Obama administration—in yet another health care overhaul delay—has quietly notified insurers that a computer system glitch will limit penalties that the law says the companies may charge smokers. A fix will take at least a year to put in place. Older smokers are more likely to benefit from the glitch, experts say. But depending on how insurers respond to it, it's also possible that younger smokers could wind up facing higher penalties than they otherwise would have." (CBS does not explain why it will take "at least a year" to fix a "computer glitch.") [46362, 46363]

Congressman Paul Ryan (R-WI), chairman of the House Budget Committee, asks the Congressional Budget Office to reevaluate the cost of ObamaCare in light of changes announced by the Obama administration. TheHill.com reports, "Experts have suggested that delaying the employer mandate and the consumer income verification requirements could increase the law's cost by making more people eligible for tax subsidies on the exchanges." (With the delay of the employer mandate, more Americans will be forced to buy insurance on the federal health care exchanges. With the suspension of the income verification requirement, more Americans will claim they are eligible for federal subsidies to buy insurance—and that will increase the taxpayer cost of ObamaCare.) At PJMedia.com Patrick Richardson warns that the Dodd-Frank bank reform legislation will "strain community banking" because it fails to consider bank size and "would

require small regional and community banks to adhere to the same rules and regulations as 'too big to fail' banks like J.P. Morgan Chase." (Small community banks, typically with assets of \$250 million or less, simply do not have the manpower to comply with the regulations. While a huge Wall Street bank can add several new compliance officers to deal with the bureaucratic burden of Dodd-Frank, a small bank cannot hire additional employees without having to pass on their cost to local customers.) Former U.S. ambassador to the United Nations John Bolton tells Newsmax.TV, "The [Egyptian] army did the only thing it could do. The Muslim Brotherhood was engaged in a creeping coup after their election. With millions of people on the street demonstrating against the Muslim Brotherhood and with the Brotherhood on the street demonstrating in favor of [President Mohamed] Morsi, it was only a matter of time before the civilians started mayhem against each other. From the evidence we have, it looks to me like the Muslim Brotherhood provoked it, that they wanted the army to react the way it did. The Brotherhood was looking to create martyrs for its cause. And for well or ill, there are plenty of people in the military who'd be just as happy to help them reach that objective of martyrdom. We've got to find a way to keep this calm. Morsi's single-minded pursuit of radical Islamic political theory alienated a lot of the Egyptian people. But if something isn't done to turn the economy around ...then you're going to have potentially serious humanitarian problems, shortages of food and the like, and enormous political instability, because of people not having jobs, not having incomes. ... We need to cut through the semantics. Of course it's a coup. Look at the reality on the ground. The army overthrew Mohammed Morsi. Case closed. There is a law that prohibits American assistance in such circumstances. [Obama], typically, is trying to reinterpret the law to mean something that it doesn't say. The more honest, more direct approach is for [Obama] to say, 'I need a congressional fix to this. I need it immediately.' We shouldn't let a technicality stand in the way of protecting American interests. We need to get this done. And then I would make sure that the assistance, which is primarily military assistance to the army, keeps flowing." [46371]

Kerry's mediation skills are limited to pressuring Israel to make dangerous concessions

Assyrian International News Agency reports, "Syria has invited the United Nations top Syrian chemical weapons investigator and the UN high representative for disarmament to Damascus following the discovery of enough rebel-held chemical weapons to 'destroy a whole country,' the Damascus envoy to the world body said on Monday. ... The Syrian government in March accused the rebels in northern Syria of firing a chemical rocket at the town of Khan al-Asal that killed more than 26 people, while Britain, France and the United States alleged use of chemical weapons by the Syrian government. ... The industrial chemicals were listed as 79 barrels of polyethylene glycol (PEG), 67 barrels of mono ethylene glycol, 25 barrels of mono ethanol (or ethanolamine) and 68 barrels of diethanolamine (DEA) and 42 barrels of triethanolamine (TEA)." (In January 2013 AtlasShrugs.com reported, "Leaked emails have allegedly proved that the White House gave the green light to a chemical weapons attack in Syria that could be blamed on Assad's regime and in turn, spur international military action in the devastated country.") Supporters of Egypt's ousted president, Mohamed Morsi, open fire at Mar Mina Church in Port Said, Egypt. (Obama has no comment.) [46379, 46380, 46381]

Obama nominates Matthew Barzun to be the next U.S. ambassador to Great Britain, and John R. Phillips to be ambassador to Italy. (Both Barzun and Phillips are being rewarded for raising cash for the Obama campaigns in 2008 and 2012. Barzun was an Obama campaign finance chairman in 2008 and 2012 who reportedly bundled as much as \$2.3 in 2012. Phillips, who raised more than \$1 million, is married to Linda Douglas, an ABC reporter who served as communications director in Obama's Office of Health Reform.) According to CNSNews.com, Obama has rewarded "at least 18 top fundraisers with plum diplomatic positions since 2009"—despite the fact that the Foreign Service Act of 1980 requires that "contributions to political campaigns should not be a factor in the appointment of an individual as a chief of mission" and the positions "should normally be accorded to career members of the Service." According to Newsmax.com, the law also requires that ambassadors have a "useful knowledge" of the language of the nation where they will serve. It is assumed that Barzun speaks English; whether Phillips speaks Italian is not known. [46389, 46437

On July 10 Townhall.com's John Ransom looks at Obama's decision to delay ObamaCare's employer mandate and asks, "Are you really this stupid or is this part of some devious plan? ... What got me thinking about this was an interview I did with Cato's Dan Mitchell... who thought perhaps that when Obama postponed the implementation of the big company mandate, requiring companies to provide healthcare coverage for employees under Obamacare, that Obama got what he really wanted. to create more dependency and more government spending." The Cato Institute's ObamaCare expert, Michael F. The administration doesn't go around looking for ways to make implementation harder. This decision can only be understood as an effort to take the path of least resistance—and if this is the path of least resistance, then Obamacare itself must be even more chaotic. Some CRS employees come to the agency with anti-law enforcement or anti-what they would call the 'white establishment' [attitudes]. ... I was shocked to learn that one black CRS employee in [the southeast] region told a white CRS employee that the Civil Rights Act was meant for black people, not white people. DailyCaller.com reports, "The cost of complying with federal environmental regulations has forced American Electric Power to shut down an Ohio coal plant rather than convert it to a natural gas-burning power plant, says a Buckeye State congressman.

...Environmental regulations, lawsuits brought by activist groups and low-priced natural have contributed to the shutdown or slated retirement of more than 15,000 megawatts of coal-fired power plants. Power companies expect to shut down more than 37,000 megawatts of coal-fired electrical generation in the next decade. ...The plant operators would have had to spend \$275 million upgrading the facilities to meet the EPA's costly Mercury Air Toxics Standards, or MATS rule." Congressman Tim Murphy (R-PA) states, "The front line in the [Obama] administration's war on coal is right here in Southwestern Pennsylvania, and the casualties are the factories and homeowners who will pay higher electric bills, as well as the hundreds of utility workers, boilermakers, and miners who will be out of work. ...With the shutdown of the Mitchell plant and Hatfield's Ferry, which just four short years ago underwent \$1 billion in upgrades, [Obama] is making good on his promise to 'bankrupt' anyone who operates a coal plant." Insurance Commissioner Dave Jones also said the exchange does not have a plan for investigating any complaints that might arise once the counselors start work. That means consumers who might fall prey to bogus health care products, identity theft and other abuses will have a hard time seeking justice if unscrupulous counselors get ahold [sic] of their Social Security number, bank accounts, health records or other private information, he said." In his weekly radio/Internet address Obama calls for immigration reform, arguing that the nation needs more immigrants paying taxes. George Zimmerman is found not guilty of second degree murder charges in the selfdefense shooting of Trayvon Martin—despite the judge's pro-prosecution bias and the attempt to politicize the incident by Obama and the mainstream media. The verdict is followed by rioting and vandalism in Oakland, California. The prosecutor had in her possession photographs that would definitely show a judge that this was not an appropriate case for second-degree murder. She deliberately withheld and suppressed those photographs, refused to show them to the judge, got the judge to rule erroneously this was a second-degree murder case. That violated a whole range of ethical, professional, and legal obligations that prosecutors have. Moreover, they withheld other evidence in the course of the pretrial and trial proceedings, as has been documented by the defense team. ... I think people's rights have been violated, but it was the rights of the defendant and the defense team, by utterly unprofessional, irresponsible, and in my view criminal actions by the prosecutor.") At a Trayvon Martin rally in Portland, Oregon, one speaker tells the crowd, "Every fucking cop is a target." Another says the police need to be prepared for more broken windows. [46453]

Popular former Montana Governor Brian Schweitzer announces he will not run for the U.S. Senate in 2014. (The decision makes it more likely that Republicans will be able to pick up the seat with the retirement of Democrat Senator Max Baucus.)

NYTimes.com reports that when Obama "proclaimed that those who commit sexual assault in the military should be 'prosecuted, stripped of their positions, court-martialed, fired, dishonorably discharged,' it had an effect he did not intend: muddying legal cases across the country. In at least a dozen sexual assault cases since [Obama's] remarks at the White House in May, judges and defense lawyers have said that [his] words as commander in chief amounted to 'unlawful command influence,' tainting trials as a result. Military law experts said that those cases were only the beginning and that

[Obama's] remarks were certain to complicate almost all prosecutions for sexual assault. ... At Shaw Air Force Base in South Carolina last month, a judge dismissed charges of sexual assault against an Army officer, noting the command influence issue. At Fort Bragg in North Carolina last month, lawyers cited [Obama's] words in a motion to dismiss the court-martial against Brig. Gen. Jeffrey Sinclair, who is accused of forcing a lower-ranking officer to perform oral sex on him, among other charges. In Hawaii, a Navy judge ruled last month that two defendants in sexual assault cases, if found guilty, could not be punitively discharged because of ... Obama's remarks. In Texas, a juror was dismissed from a military panel on a sexual assault case after admitting knowledge of [Obama's] words. In Alexandria, Va., Eric S. Montalvo, a former defense counsel in the Marine Corps who is now in private practice, has cited [Obama's] words in motions to dismiss two sexual assault cases, one against an Army sergeant and the other against a Navy seaman." NSA whistleblower Edward Snowden accepts an offer of political asylum from Russia, reportedly on the condition that he ceases releasing intelligence information. [46445]

On July 14 Politico reports, "The Department of Justice said Sunday it would review the Travyon Martin-George Zimmerman case to determine if it should consider prosecuting Zimmerman, who was acquitted Friday [sic; Saturday] in a Florida court, in the shooting case. 'Experienced federal prosecutors will determine whether the evidence reveals a prosecutable violation of any of the limited federal criminal civil rights statutes within our jurisdiction, and whether federal prosecution is appropriate in accordance with the Department's policy governing successive federal prosecution following a state trial,' the DOJ said." On Meet the Press, Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV), apparently eager for the Department of Justice to prosecute Zimmerman, says, "This isn't over with and I think that's good." Race baiter Al Sharpton also appears on the program and states, "I will convene an emergency call with preachers tonight to discuss next steps and I intend to head to Florida in the next few days." Obama avoids using the name George Zimmerman in a statement: "I know this case has elicited strong passions. I know those passions may [now] be running even higher. But we are a nation of laws, and a jury has spoken. I now ask every American to respect the call for calm reflection from two parents who lost their young son." Obama also uses the verdict as an excuse to push gun control, saying, "We should ask ourselves if we're doing all we can to stem the tide of gun violence that claims too many lives across this country on a daily basis. We should ask ourselves, as individuals and as a society, how we can prevent future tragedies like this. As citizens, that's a job for all of us. That's the way to honor Trayvon Martin." (Obama does not explain why Martin should be honored if he was shot in self-defense by a man he was attempting to beat to death.) [46446, 46447, 46463, 46465]

On Fox & Friends author Ann Coulter comments on the George Zimmerman trial: "This was a media-led mob, and an innocent man almost went to prison for thirty years because of, well, Al Sharpton stirring up hatred and creating a narrative for which there was never any evidence and after this long trial there is still never any evidence. This case never should have been brought. It was purely political for the media to continue their narrative of all of America as 'Mississippi Burning.' They want to keep us divided by race, ginned up by race, and it's a relief that someone who was innocent did not have to be the sacrificial lamb for this media narrative about America as being run by the [Ku Klux] Klan." Coulter argues that race relations changed "...after the O.J. verdict. At that moment, when a mostly black jury—100 percent Democrat by the way—found a spectacularly guilty black celebrity not-guilty of murder, white America said, 'That's it we are shutting down the white guilt bank.' And we had peace for a decade. And you'll notice we didn't have cases like this for about ten years after O.J. ... NBC—probably intentionally—omitted the crucial portion of the conversation in which the dispatcher asked Zimmerman, "OK, and this guy—is he black, white or Hispanic?" to which Zimmerman replied, "He looks black.") At HotAir.com Ed Morrissey writes, "[I]f the Zimmerman team wants to show malice at

NBC News, all they have to do is play MSNBC's coverage of the trial and especially the acquittal. The anger and malice (and even more misinformation) didn't just come from guest panelists on their coverage, it came from MSNBC's hosts, paid by NBC News. The phrase 'shooting fish in a barrel' comes to mind when proving this particular aspect of the case. If Zimmerman's legal team is moving ASAP to get the case to trial, NBC's lawyers should be moving ASAP to get the check cut for the settlement. Don't expect that to take very long, either." On Fox News Sunday Congressman Steve King (R-IA) says the House of Representatives should not bother passing border security legislation because Obama won't enforce the law anyway. "There's nothing we can do," says King, "to force [Obama] to enforce a law he doesn't like. He has proven it over and over again. [Obama] is already refusing to enforce existing immigration laws. For a couple minutes I was pinned down to the ground—one gentleman on top of me slugging me across the face repeatedly as an indeterminable number of others kicked me in the side of the head, and tried to get my phone out of my hand... The harder my grip tightened, the harder their punches to my face became." According to Hartsock, an ABC news van was "less than 20 feet away" yet the ABC employees neither helped him nor filmed the incident. [46461, 46466]

WashingtonTimes.com reports, "A government watchdog has found for the first time that confidential tax records of several political candidates and campaign donors were improperly scrutinized by government officials, but the Justice Department has declined to prosecute any of the cases. Its investigators also are probing two allegations that the Internal Revenue Service 'targeted for audit candidates for public office,' the Treasury's inspector general for tax administration, J. Russell George, has privately told Sen. Chuck Grassley. In a written response to a request by Mr. Grassley, the ranking Republican on the Judiciary Committee, Mr. George said a review turned up four cases since 2006 in which unidentified government officials took part in 'unauthorized access or disclosure

of tax records of political donors or candidates,' including one case he described as 'willful.' In four additional cases, Mr. George said, allegations of improper access of IRS records were not substantiated by the evidence. Mr. Grassley has asked Attorney General Eric H. Holder Jr. to explain why the Justice Department chose not to prosecute any of the cases. The Iowa Republican told The Washington Times that the IRS 'is required to act with neutrality and professionalism, not political bias.' The investigation did not name the government officials who obtained the IRS records improperly, nor did it reveal the identities or political parties of the people whose tax records were compromised. By law, taxpayer records at the IRS are supposed to be confidential. The disclosures deal another blow to the IRS and the Obama administration, which are still grappling with revelations that IRS agents inappropriately targeted conservative groups seeking tax-exempt status for extraordinarily burdensome scrutiny during ...Obama's first term. Amid that furor over the abuse of the agency's powers, the IRS has denied that the tax records of political candidates or donors were improperly accessed. [46481]

Attorney General Eric Holder tells the Delta Sigma Theta sorority convention, "Of course, as this celebration unfolds, we are also mindful of the pain felt by our nation surrounding the tragic, unnecessary shooting death of Trayvon Martin in Sanford, Florida last year—and the state trial that reached its conclusion over the weekend. As parents, as engaged citizens, and as leaders who stand vigilant against violence in communities across the country, the Deltas are deeply, and rightly, concerned about this case. The Justice Department shares your concern—I share your concern—and, as we first acknowledged last spring, we have opened an investigation into the matter. Independent of the legal determination that will be made, I believe that this tragedy provides yet another opportunity for our nation to speak honestly about the complicated and emotionally-charged issues that this case has raised. We must not—as we have too often in the past—let this opportunity pass. I hope that we will approach this necessarily difficult dialogue with the same dignity that those who have lost the most, Trayvon's parents, have demonstrated throughout the last year—and especially over the past few days. They suffered a pain that no parent should have to endure—and one that I, as a father, cannot begin to conceive. Even as we embrace their example and hold them in our prayers, we must not forego this opportunity to better understand one another and to make better this nation we cherish." "Moreover," continues Holder, "I want to assure you that the Department will continue to act in a manner that is consistent with the facts and the law. We are committed to standing with the people of Sanford, with the individuals and families affected by this incident, and with our state and local partners in order to alleviate tensions, address community concerns, and promote healing. We are determined to meet division and confusion with understanding and compassion—and also with truth. We are resolved, as you are, to combat violence involving or directed at young people, to prevent future tragedies and to deal with the underlying attitudes, mistaken beliefs and stereotypes that

serve as the basis for these too common incidents. And we will never stop working to ensure that—in every case, in every circumstance, and in every community—justice must be done." (HotAir.com comments, "'Independent of the legal determination that will be made' sounds to me like he's preparing people for a letdown." That is, the Department of Justice is unlikely to prosecute George Zimmerman under the Shepard-Byrd Hate Crimes Prevention Act of 2009—partly because FBI documents have already suggested that Zimmerman's actions on the night of the shooting were not racist. Holder is also unlikely to do anything about the many death threats against Zimmerman.) Holder does not comment on the fact that while the Zimmerman trial was being conducted four children in Chicago were shot and killed—and his Department of Justice is doing next to nothing to address the problem of gangs and black-on-black violence. Jim Goad writes at TakiMag.com, "George Zimmerman is now a free man. He is free to be stalked, threatened, harassed, persecuted, and possibly killed at the hands of the perpetual malcontents who are sorely displeased with his acquittal late Saturday night. But he is not free to sleep soundly—not now, nor possibly for the rest of his life. Like O. J. Simpson after his murder acquittal, he is likely to face big-money civil suits from Trayvon Martin's family members. There have been many reports of companies slashing working hours of their employees to fewer than 30 per week in order to avoid the ObamaCare requirements. Additionally, TheHill.com reports, "According to The Wall Street Journal, employers have added more part-time employees—about 93,000 a month—in 2013 than full-time workers—averaging about 22,000 per month. The Affordable Care Act reduced national Medicare funding by \$155 billion over a 10-year period that starts this year, Ryall said. He added that the fiscal impact on Arkansas was roughly \$2 billion. Compounded by the federal sequestration cuts made earlier this year, which lopped another two percent across-the-board cut to Medicare, Arkansas hospitals are feeling the pinch. 'This is a result of reimbursement reduction,' Ryall tells Talk Business. 'You're talking about a lot of cuts that hospitals cannot absorb. They have to make adjustments to keep their doors open.'" 47065]

WLFHN reports that Indiana's Purdue University "faces a \$2.8 million ObamaCare bill" in 2014. [46518]

Addressing the NAACP convention in Orlando, Florida, Attorney General Eric Holder states, "It's time to question laws that senselessly expand the concept of self-defense and sow dangerous conflict in our neighborhoods. Because opposing a law-enforcement effort to stop lynchings is so totally like opposing another big, costly, and destructive government intervention in the health-insurance industry.") The *Orlando Sentinel* reports, "The U.S. Department of Justice on Monday afternoon appealed to civil rights groups and community leaders, nationally and in Sanford, for help investigating whether a federal criminal case might be brought against George Zimmerman for the shooting death of Trayvon Martin, one advocate said. The DOJ has also set up a public email address to take in tips on its civil rights investigation. Barbara Arnwine, president and executive director the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law—who earlier in the day joined calls for federal civil rights charges against

Zimmerman, said that later in the afternoon, she joined a U.S. Department of Justice conference call to discuss the prospects. 'They were calling on us to actively refer anyone who had any information,' that might build a case against Zimmerman for either a civil rights violation or a hate crime, Arnwine said. 'They said they would very aggressively investigate this case.'" (In other words, Obama's Department of Justice is worried it has no civil right case against George Zimmerman and is shamelessly "trolling" for evidence that he is a racist. Meanwhile, the administration is doing nothing about the many death threats received by the Zimmerman family.) [46519, 46520, 46521, 46526, 46527, 46529, 46565, 46621]

DailyCaller.com reports, "African Americans benefit from Florida's 'Stand Your Ground' self-defense law at a rate far out of proportion to their presence in the state's population, despite an assertion by Attorney General Eric Holder that repealing 'Stand Your Ground' would help African Americans. Black Floridians have made about a third of the state's total 'Stand Your Ground' claims in homicide cases, a rate nearly double the black percentage of Florida's population. The majority of those claims have been successful, a success rate that exceeds that for Florida whites. Nonetheless, prominent African Americans including Holder and 'Ebony and Ivory' singer Stevie Wonder, who has vowed not to perform in the Sunshine State until the law is revoked, have made 'Stand Your Ground' a central part of the Trayvon Martin controversy." (George Zimmerman did *not* invoke the "stand your ground" law as part of his defense.) [46530, 46545]

In an interview with Univision, Obama says he "probably" cannot give illegal immigrants amnesty via an executive order. (In other words, "I'm not sure, but I don't think I have dictatorial powers.") [46531]

On July 17 The Atlantic Wire.com reports, "As an aside during testimony on Capitol Hill today, a National Security Agency representative rather casually indicated that the government looks at data from a universe of far, far more people than previously indicated. Chris Inglis, the agency's deputy director, was one of several government representatives—including from the FBI and the office of the Director of National Intelligence—testifying before the House Judiciary Committee this morning. Most of the testimony largely echoed previous testimony by the agencies on the topic of the government's surveillance, including a retread of the same offered examples for how the Patriot Act and Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act had stopped terror events. But Inglis' statement was new. Analysts look 'two or three hops' from terror suspects when evaluating terror activity, Inglis revealed. Previously, the limit of how surveillance was extended had been described as two hops. This meant that if the NSA were following a phone metadata or web trail from a terror suspect, it could also look at the calls from the people that suspect has spoken with—one hop. And then, the calls that second person had also spoken with—two hops. Terror suspect to person two to person three. Two hops. And now: A third hop. ... For a sense of scale, researchers at the University of Milan found in 2011 that everyone on the Internet was, on average, 4.74 steps away from anyone else." (Meanwhile Robert Zimmerman, the brother of George Zimmerman, tells Fox News, "We do have concerns and always have of having our phones tapped, having

our phones listened to by the administration or whomever because George is now, as we know, continually the subject of ongoing investigation. ...I think Eric Holder is being pressured by some groups who were calling for, initially, just an arrest. These same groups keep moving around the goal posts: the NAACP, Al Sharpton, the Rainbow Push Coalition with Jesse Jackson. First they wanted just a simple arrest and that's it, have his fair day in court and whatever the verdict is, we'll respect it. Then when the verdict was coming they wanted him to be found guilty. But the verdict isn't what they wanted, so now they're moving the goal post again, and calling on the Department of Justice to investigate him more.") [46510, 46511]

CNSNews.com reports, "The battle surrounding ... Obama's nomination of Samantha Power to be the next U.S. ambassador to the United Nations heated up Tuesday when a group of conservative policy experts and others urged senators not to confirm her, accusing her of having an 'affinity for those who would diminish our sovereignty and strengthen our adversaries.' Several Republican senators have indicated they will not oppose Power's nomination, however, including some members of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, which has scheduled a confirmation hearing for Wednesday. A letter organized by the Center for Security Policy, sent to every senator, characterized Power's views as in line with those held by U.N. member-states that are antagonistic to America." The letter states, "In light of [Power's] low regard for our country, her animus towards one of our most important allies, Israel, and her affinity for those who would diminish our sovereignty and strengthen our adversaries, we consider her to be a wholly unacceptable choice for this sensitive post and urge you to reject this nomination. ... It is imperative that the American people be presented with the stark contrast between the views of ... Obama's nominee to be the next U.S. ambassador at the United Nations, and those of generations of our countrymen and women, who have fought for this country's sovereignty and helped achieve—and believed in—its greatness. Samantha Power's record suggests that she is better suited to represent the virulently anti-American U.N. to the United States, rather than the other way around." [46539]

During her Senate confirmation hearing, Power disavows some of her written statements when questioned by Senator Marco Rubio (R-FL). With regard to her statements that the United States should invade Israel in order to create a Palestinian state, Power says, "I have disassociated myself from those comments many times. I gave a long, rambling, and very remarkably incoherent response to a hypothetical question that I should never have answered. A negotiated settlement is the only course." Rubio asks about her statements that the United States has committed war crimes: "Which crimes were you referring to and which decisions taken by the current administration would you recommend for such a reckoning?" Power responds, "I would never apologize for America. America is the light to the world. We have freedoms and opportunities here that people dream about abroad." Rubio presses her for an answer: "Which ones did the United States commit or sponsor that you were referring to?" Power: "Again, sir, I think this is the greatest country on earth. We have nothing to apologize for." Rubio: "So you don't have any in mind now that we've committed or sponsored?" Power: "I will not apologize for America. I will stand very proudly if confirmed behind the U.S. placard." Rubio: "No, I understand, but do you believe the United States has committed or sponsored crimes?"

Power: "I believe the United States is the greatest country on earth. I really do." (In other words, "I will say anything in order to get the job as ambassador to the United Nations, where I will eagerly work against Israel and my own country.") [46555]

By a vote of 264–161 the House of Representatives passes legislation delaying ObamaCare's *employer* health insurance mandate by one year—thereby giving Obama potential justification for his illegal action in delaying he requirement. By a vote of 251–174 the House also passes legislation delaying the *individual* health insurance mandate for one year. Carter Hull, a tax law specialist with 48 years of experience at the IRS, told investigators that Lois Lerner, the former head of the Exempt Organizations division, demanded he send some of the reviews of tea party groups to the IRS chief counsel's office in Washington. The chief counsel is one of two political appointees in the IRS." Senator Jeff Flake (R-AZ) states, "It is clear that misconduct at the agency was not isolated to 'rogue employees' in the tax-exempt applications division. This recent development suggests that political targeting was potentially more widespread." [46552, 46553]

On Special Report Charles Krauthammer comments on reports that many labor unions no longer support ObamaCare: "It is true, they [labor unions] supported the bill, they supported the administration, they helped elect it, had the boots on the ground and they were swindled, but it isn't as if they weren't warned. (The letter warns, "Right now, unless you... enact an equitable fix, the ACA will shatter not only our hardearned health benefits, but destroy the foundation of the 40 hour work week that is the backbone of the American middle class.") Michelle Obama and her daughters attend a Beyonce Knowles concert in Chicago. (The cost to the taxpayers is not revealed.) [46535]

On July 18 the U.S. Senate votes 54–46 to confirm Obama's nominee to head the Department of Labor, Tom Perez. The Senate also confirms Gina McCarthy, on a 59–40 vote, to lead the Environmental Protection Agency. (Both Perez, a racist, Islamist-sympathizing, illegal immigration advocate, and McCarthy are anti-business leftists. Perez was involved in the Obama "hotline" to solicit evidence that George Zimmerman is a racist. Sometimes I just try to figure out why. Maybe, they [House Republicans] think it's good politics." (Obama apparently does not believe anyone noticed that his delay of the employer mandate by one year was in any way connected to politics—or the 2014 elections.) [46581, 46582]

Meanwhile, MoneyNews.com reports, "Researchers have concluded that Obamacare may drive nearly one million Americans out of the workforce to take advantage of government-provided health benefits. In October 2012 Obama said, "I refused to let Detroit go bankrupt. And three years later, that bet is paying off in a big way.") Media leftists and Democrat politicians blame Detroit's problem on its plummeting population, which has reduced its tax revenue—while neglecting to consider what caused the population to fall in the first place. Chicago has at least \$19 billion in unfunded employee pension liabilities and Los Angeles may be close to \$30 billion.) MSNBC's Ed Schultz blames Republicans for Detroit's collapse—a laughably absurd argument, considering that Democrats and labor unions have continuously controlled the city and its policies for decades. (Despite its financial situation, Detroit plans to build a new stadium for the Red Wings hockey team—with a \$450 million bond issue to be repaid over 30 years.) Second, to have one's head bashed against concrete pavement most certainly justifies acting in self-defense; simply "feeling" threatened is an entirely different issue altogether—although Obama's Secret Service agents can be expected to draw and perhaps fire their weapons if they "feel" that Obama is threatened. Lastly, the federal government has nothing to do with state criminal statutes—which properly grant citizens the right to self-defense. (It also reinforces the arguments of those who claim Hastings was murdered either in retaliation for what he had reported about the Obama administration or to prevent him from additional reporting. Hastings was reportedly working on a story about the CIA.) [46989]

It also stops the Education Department from encouraging states to adopt common academic standards. The bill faces a veto threat from ...Obama and is likely going nowhere in the Senate."

WND.com reports that the Washington D.C. voter rolls include an individual named Barry Soetoro who lists his address as 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue. PJMedia.com's J. Obama to stir the pot—again. Obama's surprise appearance in the White House briefing room yesterday was a mixture of self indulgence and political exploitation of the tragic death of the Florida teenager. Robbins notes that "Thousands of [federal 'navigators'] will have unfettered access to the Data Hub, but there are only sketchy guidelines on how they will be hired, trained and monitored. Given the slap-dash, incoherent way Obamacare is being implemented the prospect for quality control is low. And the Obama administration's track record of sweetheart deals, no-bid, sole-source contracting and other means of rewarding people with insider access means the Data Hub will be firmly in the hands of trusted White House loyalists. TimesOfIsrael.com reports, "Amid conflicting accounts of the basis on which Israel and the Palestinians are set to renew negotiations, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Saturday night hailed the resumption of the talks, announced Friday by Secretary of State John Kerry, as fulfilling Israel's 'vital strategic interests.' Israeli ministers said the government had held firm to its insistence on there being no preconditions for resuming the negotiations, while Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas had given ground. According to the ministers, the talks would resume without Israel agreeing to a settlement freeze, without Israel agreeing to negotiations for a Palestinian state on the basis of the pre-1967 lines, and without there first being a release of longtime Palestinian prisoners. Still, Israel would release Palestinian prisoners, with Israeli blood on their hands—up to 350, according to some sources—in phases as the talks continued, they said. However, a Palestinian official said Abbas agreed to restart talks only after receiving a letter from Kerry guaranteeing that the basis of the negotiations will indeed be Israel's pre-1967 borders. The official, quoted by AP, said Kerry's letter also stipulated that both the Israelis and the Palestinians must refrain from taking any steps that would jeopardize the outcome of the talks. Thus, the unnamed official said, Israel is not to issue new tenders for West Bank settlements, while the Palestinians are to refrain from pursuing action against Israel at international organizations." A spokesman for Abbas later disputes Kerry's claim that talks are imminent and makes it clear that the Palestinian Authority continues to demand as a pre-condition to any talks Israel's acceptance of its pre-1967 "Auschwitz" borders. HotAir.com's Ed Morrissey later writes, "When Kerry became Secretary of State, he did promise to bring a fresh diplomatic approach to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Who knew that would be *fantasy fiction*? On the surface, this appears to be something out of *The Parent Trap*—tricking Mom and Dad into meeting someplace so that they can really discover how much they missed each other. Obama's national approval/disapproval percentages drop to 41/48 in a McClatchy-Marist poll. [46644, 46645, 46649]

At Washington, D.C.'s Mandarin Oriental Hotel, Obama addresses supporters at Organizing for Action, and announces he will deliver an address on the economy in Illinois on July 24. He says, "I'm going to talk about where we need to go from here, how we need to put behind us the distractions and the phony debates and nonsense that somehow passes for politics these days, and get back to basics." (In other words, "Let's stop talking about the Benghazi cover-up, the NSA spying on Americans, the IRS targeting conservatives, the Department of Justice going after a Fox News reporter, and the ObamaCare train wreck, and let me change the subject back to the economy—where, for some strange reason, many Americans continue to give me the benefit of the doubt.") Meanwhile, White House adviser Dan Pfeiffer whines in an email to Obama supporters that "too many in Congress are trying to score political points, re-fight old battles, and trump up phony scandals." (Pfeiffer does not explain why Operation Fast and Furious,

According to a Viewpoint Florida poll, 56 percent of the state's residents believe the George Zimmerman verdict was correct and 63 percent believe he should not face federal charges. At NBCNews.com Michael Isikoff reports, "... Obama's nominee to be the Homeland Security Department's No. 2 official is under investigation over alleged intervention to obtain approval for a company run by a brother of Hillary Clinton to participate in a program that provides U.S. visas for foreign investors, according to an email the department's inspector general sent to lawmakers Monday night and obtained by NBC News. The investigation into Alejandro Mayorkas—who currently serves as director of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (UCIS), an agency within Homeland Security—was opened in September 2012 based on a referral from an FBI counterintelligence analyst, according to the email. The inspector general probe was first reported by The Associated Press. ... The probe is based on allegations that Mayorkas personally intervened to win an approval [for visas] for Gulf Coast Funds Management, a financing company headed by Clinton's brother Anthony Rodham, after USCIS officials rejected its application, according to an aide to GOP Sen. Charles Grassley, who had received internal USCIS emails about the matter from a department whistleblower." (Under the EB-5 visa program, a foreigner can obtain a "green card" to remain in the United States if he invests at least \$500,000 in a business and creates at least 10 jobs.

Mayorkas allegedly helped provide visas to foreigners who did not meet the requirements.) [46680, 46681]

Prior to a House vote on an amendment to rein in NSA's spying on the phone records of Americans, White House press secretary Jay Carney accuses House Republicans of attempting to "hastily dismantle one of our Intelligence Community's counterterrorism tools" and says their "blunt approach is not the product of an informed, open or deliberative process." (The next day the House votes 217–205 to reject the amendment. Carney's criticism is misdirected, as more Democrats than Republicans—111 versus 95—support the amendment. Obama? The solution to the epidemic of violent crime in poor black neighborhoods is to actively discourage pregnancies out of marriage, to impose strict discipline in the public schools, including mandatory student uniforms, and to create a zero tolerance policy for gun and drug crimes imposing harsh mandatory prison time on the offenders." "And finally, challenging the entertainment industry to stop peddling garbage. Hey, listen up you greed heads, if a kid can't speak proper English, uses the 'f' word in every sentence, it's disgraceful, it's disrespectful—it's disrespectful in his or her manner. That child will never, never be able to compete in the marketplace of America... never. And it has nothing to do with slavery. It has everything to do with you Hollywood people and you derelict parents. You're the ones hurting these vulnerable children. You want a conversation, you got it. You want a better situation for blacks, give them a chance to revive their neighborhoods and culture. Work with the good people to stop the bad people. Pumping money into the chaos does little. You can't legislate good parenting or responsible entertainment. But you can fight against the madness, with discipline, a firm message and little tolerance for excuse-making. It is now time for the African-American leadership, including ...Obama to stop the nonsense. Walk away from the world of victimization and grievance and lead the way out of this mess." [46666]

On July 24 White House press secretary Jay Carney appears on MSNBC's *Morning Joe* to promote a series of upcoming Obama speeches on the economy. Carney whines that

there has been too much focus "on the skirmishes that cause gridlock" and "the phony scandals that have consumed so much attention..." The attention, says Carney, "should be focused on what we can do to strengthen and grow the middle class, because when the middle class is thriving, when the middle class is growing, our economy is at its best and that's what we need to do as we move forward in the 21st century." (Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich observes, "As predicted, Obama gave America the same speech he's been giving for five years, saying the country needs more infrastructure spending due to crumbling roads and bridges, that we must fight poverty, that CEOs are making too much money while the poor suffer, etc. He even went so far as to tout 'saving the auto industry' one week after Detroit filed for bankruptcy. ... While Obama claims America is 'back,' 50 million people are on food stamps and 23 million people are unemployed. The healthcare system is starting to collapse as doctors leave their practices and gas is on average \$3.68 per gallon. It isn't just the rich Obama has asked to 'pay a little more.' Obama says, "As a country, we've recovered faster and gone further than most other advanced nations in the world. With new American revolutions in energy, technology, manufacturing, and health care, we are actually poised to reverse the forces that have battered the middle class for so long, and rebuild an economy where everyone who works hard can get ahead. But—and here's the big but—I'm here today to tell you that we're not there yet. We all know that. We're not there yet, we've got more work to do." (At RealClearPolitics.com's "Daily Debate," Robert Tracinski later writes that Obama "has 'pivoted' back to jobs for the umpteenth time and launched a new set of speeches to start a conversation with the American people—also for the umpteenth time. When you have a hammer, everything looks like a nail, and when you have been celebrated for your ability to give a good speech, it's tempting to think that your best option in every situation is to give more speeches." Obama's economic message, notes Tracinski, "has shrunk from 'hope and change' to 'we're not there yet.'") [46699]

Obama pats himself on the back, saying, "It's interesting, in the run-up to this speech, a lot of reporters say that, well, Mr. [Obama], these are all good ideas, but some them of you've said before; some of them sound great, but you can't get those through Congress. Republicans won't agree with you. And I say, look, the fact is there are Republicans in Congress right now who privately agree with me on a lot of the ideas I'll be proposing. I don't know how that can happen, but it is. ...He's out there in Galesville, Illinois, and he's talking about the economy and how we've gotta [sic] get things rolling again finally, and he said, 'Washington has taken its eye off the ball, and it has to stop.' He's not in Washington, you see? He has nothing to do with what is happening in Washington! Obama has nothing to do with what's gone on in Washington." [46683]

"Folks," says Limbaugh, "we're listening to the wrecking ball [called Obama] who has already torn down a bunch of buildings, tell us how he's building new cities. It's pathological. Secretary of State John Kerry honors Muslims with an Iftar dinner. According to the State Department, "Secretary Kerry will highlight State Department efforts to reach out in innovative and exciting ways to engage with Muslim communities around the world. The event will reinforce programs that build bridges of understanding and partnership, and celebrate people whose work exemplifies a spirit of cooperation and commitment to change. An Iftar is a celebratory dinner breaking the fast during the Islamic month of Ramadan, the month of the Islamic calendar during which Muslims fast from dawn to sunset. Ramadan is the month Muslims believe the Qu'ran was revealed to the Prophet Mohamed; it is a month of reflection, generosity, and compassion for nearly 1.7 billion Muslims worldwide." The White House reports that Obama will nominate Caroline Kennedy Schlossberg to be the next U.S. ambassador to Japan. (Schlossberg does not speak Japanese; nor does she speak English very well. The Senate votes 81–18 to tie federal Stafford student loan rates to the regular financial market rates. [46689]

McClatchy.com reports, "Yemeni journalist Abdulelah Haider Shaye, whom ...Obama once personally lobbied to have remain in jail, has been pardoned and released, fulfilling a months-old pledge from Yemen's president, Abed Rabbo Mansour Hadi. It was unclear whether Hadi had told American authorities in advance when Shaye would be released, but the White House said in an email Wednesday that it was 'concerned and disappointed' by his release before the expiration of his five-year prison term for associating with al Qaida in the Arabian Peninsula." MoneyNews.com reports, "Nearly one-third of the homeowners who got help through the government's main foreclosure prevention program are defaulting again on their mortgages, according to a government watchdog's report. The Home Affordable Modification Program (HAMP) has worked on 1.2 million mortgage modifications since it started four years ago. Of those, more than 306,000 borrowers have defaulted again on their loans, and another 88,000 are at risk as well, reports CNN. The Special Inspector for the Troubled Asset Relief Program (SIGTARP), which conducted the review, said homeowners are also more likely to default again on the modified loans the longer they stay in the program, with 46 percent of those involved in the program since 2009 defaulting on their loans again. The re-defaults have cost taxpayers some \$815 million, according to SIGTARP. So far, the Treasury Department has allocated \$19.1 billion to HAMP, and \$4.4 billion has been spent. The program was recently extended for another two years, until the end of 2015. The Obama administration's Treasury Department created HAMP to help borrowers avoid foreclosure by making their house payments more affordable through a combination of reduced mortgage principals and interest rates and extended loan terms. But borrowers are dropping out of the program as they default again on their loans, and SIGTARP Director Christy Romero said Treasury needs to research why so many people drop out of a program that kept their homes safe from foreclosure." According to an NBC News/ Wall Street Journal poll, 61 percent of Americans believe the nation is on the wrong track—up from 53 percent in December 2012. Obama's approval/disapproval rating is 45/50; it was 53/43 in the December poll. Democrat pollster Peter Hart comments, "There's palpable unhappiness with Washington. Outside the Beltway, voters are simply saying, 'You don't get it." The same poll shows that only 52 percent of whites and 38 percent of blacks view race relations in the nation favorably. I mean, somebody ought to tell [Obama] that the 2012 election is officially over and he won and there isn't going to be another one for him. The main complaint I would have is that if you wanted to deliver a completely empty speech and you do it in Washington, you'll save the CO2 emissions that you get on Air Force One from delivering it in Illinois. That's the main critique I would offer, from a global warming perspective." [46700]

On July 25 The Heritage Foundation's Amy Payne lists "3 whoppers from Obama's big economic speech." Obama claims that "Obamacare is going great," but "There are folks out there who are actively working to make this law fail." "Nope," writes Payne, "the law is failing just fine on its own. And that's why Congress should not fund it with taxpayer dollars." Obama also claims he cut the deficit in half. Romina Boccia, Heritage's Grover M. Hermann Fellow in Federal Budgetary Affairs, points out that "Public debt doubled under [Obama's] watch. Deficits projected at \$642 billion by the Congressional Budget Office for this year are 'low' only when compared to their trillion-dollar-plus levels over the past four years. The U.S. deficit and debt situation actually worsened since before the recession." (In other words, Obama's deficits are not half what they were under George W. Bush, they are merely half in 2013 what they were in 2009 and 2010—after Obama tripled them.) Obama claims, "The income of the top 1 percent nearly quadrupled from 1979 to 2007, while the typical family's barely budged." In fact, after-tax income has risen for all American income groups. According to the Congressional Budget Office, income has increased by almost 40 percent for Americans in the middle three quintiles also known as "typical middle class families." [46717]

A *Wall Street Journal* editorial responds to Obama's economic address: "For four and a half years, Mr. Obama has focused his policies on reducing inequality rather than increasing growth. The predictable result has been more inequality and less growth. As even Mr. Obama conceded in his speech, the rich have done well in the last few years

thanks to a rising stock market, but the middle class and poor have not. [Obama] called his speech 'A Better Bargain for the Middle Class,' but no [White House resident] has done worse by the middle class in modern times. ... [M]edian real household income is \$2,718, or 5%, lower than the \$54,218 median in June 2009 when the recession officially ended. Median incomes typically fall during recessions. But the striking fact of the Obama economy is that median real household income has fallen even during the recovery. ... The core problem has been Mr. Obama's focus on spreading the wealth rather than creating it. ObamaCare will soon hook more Americans on government subsidies, but its mandates and taxes have hurt job creation, especially at small businesses. Mr. Obama's record tax increases have grabbed a bigger chunk of affluent incomes, but they created uncertainty for business throughout 2012 and have dampened growth so far this year." [46765]

According to Politico and Newsmax.com, the Obama administration is less than pleased with the Supreme Court's recent ruling that struck down an outdated provision of the 1965 Voting Rights Act—and Attorney General Eric Holder plans to urge a federal judge to force Texas to comply with the "pre-clearance" rules that are no longer in force. (The "pre-clearance" provisions of the law required certain states to seek advance approval from the federal government for changes in their voting procedures. Obama and Holder apparently intend to act in defiance of the Supreme Court. Anyone who attempts to stop them will likely be excoriated as racists by the administration—and by cooperative members of the media. But Holder's threat is meaningless; Texas will simply ignore him.) Senator Orrin Hatch (R-UT) tells Newsmax.TV, "The court has already ruled—and he's trying to reinstitute the Voting Rights Act in Texas. If I were a Texan, I'd be so doggone livid that I don't think I'd ever get over it. That's not the thing to do, and it just shows how this administration ignores the law. They act like they're despots. [Obama] is continuously doing things that he has no authority to do—and yet they just do it and they get away with it because many in the liberal media just will not hold them to account like they would a Republican..." [46724, 46725, 46735, 46750, 46754]

Obama travels to Jacksonville, Florida to push his even-bigger-government economic agenda. [46728]

The Telegraph reports, "The shocking conditions in Britain's hospitals have been laid bare by an official report which disclosed that failings uncovered in NHS [National Health Service] wards were so bad that inspectors felt compelled to abandon their impartial roles and step in to alleviate patient suffering. Eleven NHS trusts were put into 'special measures' after an investigation found thousands of patients died needlessly because of poor care. The report blamed poor staffing levels and lack of oversight, and said that staff did not address the needs of patients. It concluded the hospitals investigated were 'trapped in mediocrity.' In a row that quickly became political, David Cameron said responsibility lay with the previous Labour government, which he accused of 'covering up' the NHS failings that stretched back to 2005. Jeremy Hunt, the Health Secretary, said the findings exposed by the investigation into 14 NHS trusts were Labour's 'darkest moment.' ... The review, ordered by the Prime Minister, began in February following the public inquiry into the scandal at Mid Staffordshire Hospital Foundation Trust, where up

to 1,200 people died amid 'appalling' failings in care. ...Figures showed up to 13,000 excess deaths since 2005 at the 14 trusts investigated, advisers to the review said." (Many ObamaCare supporters consider Great Britain's National Health Service to be the ideal system for health care.) [46729]

CNET.com reports, "The U.S. government has demanded that major Internet companies divulge users' stored passwords, according to two industry sources familiar with these orders, which represent an escalation in surveillance techniques that has not previously been disclosed. If the government is able to determine a person's password, which is typically stored in encrypted form, the credential could be used to log in to an account to peruse confidential correspondence or even impersonate the user. Obtaining it also would aid in deciphering encrypted devices in situations where passwords are reused. 'I've certainly seen them ask for passwords,' said one Internet industry source who spoke on condition of anonymity. 'We push back.' A second person who has worked at a large Silicon Valley company confirmed that it received legal requests from the federal government for stored passwords. Companies 'really heavily scrutinize' these requests, the person said. 'There's a lot of 'over my dead body.'" [46732]

Discussing the imprisonment of Pastor Saeed Abedini in Iran, Reverend Franklin Graham, president of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association and Samaritan's Purse, tells Fox News, "Many in the international community are expressing outrage over this blatant example of religious intolerance. I ask that our government do the same and demand that Pastor Saeed Abedini be released and allowed to return home to his wife and family in the United States. ...[Abedini's wife] Naghmeh worries that she and her two young children may never see Saeed again. She's discouraged by the fact that our own government seems to have abandoned them. ...Obama has been silent on the issue as an American Christian endures the horrors of Evin Prison. ...Sadly ...our government appears to have done little to pressure Iran to release a fellow American citizen. ...Pastor Saeed was in Iran trying to help children. With the permission of Iran's government, he was working to build an orphanage. But his humanitarian mission led to an arrest on bogus charges and nearly a year of inhumane treatment simply because he loves Jesus Christ." [46736]

After meeting with Vietnamese President Truong Tan Sang at the White House, Obama tells reporters, "[W]e agreed that one of the great sources of strength between our two countries is the Vietnamese American population that is here but obviously has continued strong ties to Vietnam." (At FrontPageMag.com Daniel Greenfield comments, "Much of America's Vietnamese population came here as refugees. It's like claiming that the Cuban community bonds us to Castro.") Obama also claims that North Vietnam's communist dictator Ho Chi Minh had been "inspired by the words of Thomas Jefferson." (At FoxNews.com Chris Stirewalt writes, "In Obama's credulous citing of the Constitution as an inspiration, there is particular historical dissonance. One of the great murderers of the 20th century could not have been truly inspired by the most significant advancement of the rights of the individual in human history. Obama may have just been trying to flatter his guest who was obviously eager to show that Ho was not the monster history shows him to be. But his connection between the American founders and Ho

shows either a massive lack of historical knowledge on the part of [Obama] or a remarkable degree of moral flexibility." At AtlasShrugs.com Pamela Geller writes, "The Muslim Brotherhood Morsi, Chavez, Ho Chi Minh... who's next? Hitler? Barack Hussein said that the communist dictator was inspired by founding fathers. He is either supremely stupid or evil. Either way, we are screwed. He always sides with evil. Always." At Spectator.org, Paul Kengor calls Obama's claim "nonsense" and "the product of communist propaganda." Kengor notes that the Communist Party USA (CPUSA) "...and its mouthpieces regularly compared Ho Chi Minh to the American Founders, claiming he was fighting for the ideas not of the Bolshevik Revolution but of the American Revolution. This line was employed constantly, and it worked magically with wide-eyed liberals." Obama was no doubt also fed the "Ho Chi Minh was like Thomas Jefferson and George Washington" line by his communist mentor, Frank Marshall Davis.) [46756, 46758, 46761, 46762, 47072]

According to a Fox News national poll, "By a large 47-11 percent margin, voters expect the 2010 health care law will cost them rather than save them money in the coming year. Another 34 percent think the law won't change their family's health care costs. ... The poll asks people to take an up-or-down vote on ObamaCare: 40 percent say they would vote to keep the law in place, while just over half—53 percent—would repeal it." [46739]

WeeklyStandard.com posts a Wisconsin news story reporting that the state's Trig's Supermarket stores will be reducing part-time workers hours to fewer than 30 per week to avoid ObamaCare's insurance coverage requirement. Angie Dreifuerst, the company's Vice President of Human Resources and Benefits, says, "Doing nothing was not an option. ...[ObamaCare's requirement] would have put us out of business... within a year. There's no doubt about that." Meanwhile, the White Castle restaurant chain is considering hiring only part-time workers in the future. Vice President Jamie Richardson states, "If we were to keep our health insurance program exactly like it is with no changes, every forecast we've looked at has indicated our costs will go up 24 percent." According to Richardson, the typical per-employee profit per employee is about \$750 hardly enough to cover the cost of providing them with insurance. Bob Westbrook tells Fox News Channel's Greta Van Susteren he has been forced to sell or close his three CiCi's Pizza franchises—which he has owned for almost 20 years—because he cannot afford to comply with ObamaCare or pay its penalties. (ObamaCare's fines would cost Westbrook \$221,000 per year—\$78,000 more than his restaurant profits.) [46797, 46798, 467991

Pat Smith, whose son Sean was killed in Benghazi on September 11, 2012, appears on the Fox News Channel's *Your World* to counter Obama's "phony scandals" claim. Smith says, "I don't believe [Obama] anymore. He's wrong. My son is dead. How could that be phony? ... When I was there at the ceremony of the welcoming of the caskets, both Obama and Hillary [Clinton] and [Joe] Biden and all of the other ones, all promised me they would get back to me to tell me what happened. I begged them. Please, I must know what happened with my son. How come this happened? They all promised me they would get back to me. You know, not one of them, not one of them ever got back to me in any way shape or form—not by a letter, not by anything other than I got a memo

stating that I didn't need to know because I was not part of the immediate family. ...I mean, it is wrong. It is not phony. It is not fake. My son is dead, and why is he dead? All I am waiting for even to this day is just someone to get back to me and tell me what happened. Why did Hillary do as she did? Why was there no security there when there was supposed to be? Who was the general that called back the troops when they were going to help?" (DailyCaller.com reminds readers that Obama "has never revealed what, if anything, he was doing while workers at the Benghazi embassy were urgently requesting support, nor has the administration explained why no forces were sent to protect the embassy. The administration also denied the attack was a terrorist incident, claiming it was a spontaneous protest against an obscure YouTube trailer for a film that may or may not exist.") [46746, 46752]

After several days of the Obama administration denying that its scandals are scandals, Becky Garritson—whose Wetumpka Tea Party organization was among those discriminated against by the IRS—says, "I think it's like the captain of the Titanic calling the icebergs phony. I think the only phony thing going on is the narrative that the White House is trying to push off on the American people." [46774, 46775]

DailyCaller.com reports, "A new report published by the Century Foundation shows that though the unemployment rate is going down, the decreasing numbers aren't due to a spike in employment rates or job creation. Instead, more people are leaving the work force entirely. The labor force participation rate is seeing a large decline. Rather than resulting in less unemployment because more people are becoming employed, there are simply fewer people to employ..." [46748]

Obama celebrates Ramadan at the White House by hosting an iftar dinner for Muslims. Obama says, "As the Koran teaches, whoever does an atom's weight of good will see its results. Muslim-Americans and their good works have helped to build our nation, and we've seen the results. Every day, Muslim-Americans are helping to shape the way that we think and the way that we work and the way that we do business, and that's the spirit that we celebrate tonight—the dreamers, the creators whose ideas are pioneering new industries, creating new jobs and unleashing new opportunities for all of us." (For five consecutive years Obama has celebrated Ramadan with an iftar dinner.) JihadWatch.com asks, "Have you ever heard Obama talk about Jewish or Christian or Hindu Americans helping build this nation? And how exactly have Muslims built this nation? Somehow I cannot recall their contributions to the Constitutional Convention, or the settling of the West, or the Civil War period, or any other aspect of American history, for that matter." (Muslims have, of course, dramatically change the New York City skyline.) [46763, 46764]

While Obama virtually ignores Muslims persecution of Christians, Jews, and Hindus, Russian President Vladimir Putin tells a group of Orthodox Christian leaders, "In many of the World's regions, especially in the Middle East and in North Africa interconfessional tensions are mounting and the rights of religious minorities are infringed, including Christians and Orthodox Christians." [46781]

On July 26 Michael Barone, Senior Political Analyst for the Washington Examiner and a Resident Fellow at the American Enterprise Institute, writes at Townhall.com that Obama "loves to give campaign speeches to adoring crowds, but... doesn't seem to have much interest in governing. That was apparent Wednesday, when Barack Obama delivered the first of several promised 'pivot to the economy' speeches at Knox College... [T]here was not much in the way of serious public policy. Nothing much that seems likely to speed up the nation's sluggish economic growth or to increase the lowest-in-three-decades labor force participation. Obama called for increasing the minimum wage. That always tests well in polls. But in real life it tends not to create but to destroy jobs, especially for young people with few skills and little work experience. He also called for job retraining, a Community College to Career Initiative. Unfortunately, studies have shown for years that government job training programs aren't very effective. ...[Obama] said more about his proposal for universal pre-school education. But the administration's own studies have shown that the four-decades-old Head Start program produces little in the way of lasting educational gains. This looks more like an expensive attempt to create more jobs for teacher union members—and more union-dues money to help elect Democratic politicians—than a serious attempt to stimulate the economy. Amazingly, Obama called for more money to create jobs in wind and solar energy. No mention was made of the hundreds of millions in loan guarantees lavished on the now bankrupt Solyndra and A123 Systems. ... And, ominously, he added, 'I'm also acting on my own to cut red tape for responsible families who want to get a mortgage, but the bank says no.' But didn't granting mortgages to non-creditworthy borrowers trigger the collapse of the housing market? ... The problem Obama faces on this latest pivot to the economy is that most voters believe his policies have retarded rather than stimulated economic growth and job creation. This speech is not likely to change their minds." [46742]

Also at Townhall.com, Katie Pavlich reports the reaction of the family of slain Border Agent Brian Terry to Obama's statement about "phony scandals." Terry's mother Josephine states, "These deaths are real. My son's death was real. I am outraged that ... Obama is talking about phony scandals when he knows all too well that my son was a victim of Operation Fast and Furious that was authorized by members of his Justice Department and a U.S. Attorney that he appointed. Operation Fast and Furious was all too real for me and my family, and it directly contributed to my son's murder. Mr. [Obama], come to Michigan and I will show you my son's grave... then let's have a conversation about your definition of phony scandals." Brian Terry's uncle, Ralph Terry, states, "The entire Terry family has experienced a level of 'trust deficit' in their government and its leaders since Brian was killed. It hurts to be treated like this and just adds insult to injury when [Obama] speaks of phony scandals and minimizes the efforts of those officials tasked to investigate these matters." [46743]

Pavlich also writes about the difficulty Obama will have getting healthy young people to buy health insurance in order to support ObamaCare: "Not only do they say they can't afford health insurance, they just aren't making it a personal budget priority. With Obamacare specifically, they'd rather pay a penalty for lack of coverage than sign up for an expensive plan they don't need. A few things could potentially happen here: 1) Obamacare will start to collapse due to a pool of young healthy people going unfilled. 2)

The administration through the Department of Health and Human Services will raise the penalty for not having coverage faster than first anticipated to being higher than the price of insurance. Currently, starting in 2014 the penalty for lack of coverage is \$95. In 2015 the penalty jumps to \$325 and then in 2016 to \$695. 3) More delays will be implemented to make up for the lost cost and lack of young people enrolled. The bottom line here is this: Obamacare needs young people *now* and can't wait until after 2016 to get them enrolled. The administration is going to have to do something in order to fix the problem. Regardless of the decisions that are made, young people still won't be able to afford what the administration is selling whether it's a penalty or expensive insurance they don't need." Former Congressman Bob Beauprez notes that there are "2 million less [sic; fewer] working Americans today than pre-recession, the smallest percentage of the population with a job or even looking for work in more than a generation, economic growth just half of normal recoveries, etc., etc., etc. Too many of the jobs that Obama wants to take credit for creating have been part-time jobs, low-wage, entry level jobs. ...Depending on whether you use the Presidential puff-master Jay Carney's 7.2 million jobs created number, or [Obama's] chief economic adviser Alan Krueger's 5.3 million, that means for every one job of any kind added during this non-recovery, there were at least two—or nearly three—Americans that signed up for food stamps. Some recovery!" [46745]

CNSNews.com reports, "The National Treasury Employees Union [NTEU] is urging its members to oppose legislation that would force federal employees off their government healthcare plans and onto the state and national healthcare exchanges established under Obamacare. Members of Congress and their staffers are already required to participate in the exchanges, which will go into effect next October 1st under the Affordable Care Act." (IRS employees who will be tasked with enforcing the individual mandate provisions of ObamaCare are members of the NTEU. They expect the taxpayers to pay them to enforce a law from which they want to be exempt.) At a Congressional hearing, acting IRS head Daniel Werfel is asked, "Why are your employees trying to exempt themselves from the very law that you're tasked to enforce?" Werfel responds, "I don't want to speak for the NTEU, but I'll offer a perspective as a federal employee myself and a federal employee at the IRS. And that is, we have right now as employees of the government, of the IRS, affordable health care coverage. I think the ACA was designed to provide an option or an alternative for individuals that do not. And all else being equal, I think if you're an individual who is satisfied with your health care coverage, you're probably in a better position to stick with that coverage than go through the change of moving into a different environment and going through that process. So I think for a federal employee, I think more likely, and I would—can speak for myself, I would prefer to stay with the current policy that I'm pleased with rather than go through a change if I don't need to go through that change." (Of course Werfel has "affordable" health care—because it is provided to him by the taxpayers. He does not want to "move to a different environment," but has no problem enforcing such a move for millions of Americans who do not work for the IRS to do so.) Senator John Cornyn (R-TX) comments, "Count the head of the IRS among the growing list of folks that includes Big Labor and the law's chief architect who are deeply

skeptical of [Obama's] signature achievement and don't want any part of it." [46755, 46788, 46868, 46883]

Elian Johnson reports at NationalReview.com, "In order to ensure Americans understand how to access the benefits available to them when many provisions of the Affordable Care Act go online October 1, the Obama administration announced last month that it is setting up a call center that will be accessible to Americans 24 hours a day. One branch of that call center will be located in California's Contra Costa County, where, reportedly, 7,000 people applied for the 204 jobs. According to the Contra Costa Times, however, 'about half the jobs are part-time, with no health benefits—a stinging disappointment to workers and local politicians who believed the positions would be full-time.' The county supervisor, Karen Mitchoff, called the hiring process 'a comedy of errors' and said she 'never dreamed [the jobs] would be part-time.'" [46760]

At ThePostEmail.com Montgomery Blair Sibley reports that in June 2009 the Obama administration acted to dismiss an indictment and arrest warrant against Elizabeth Duke, who was indicted in 1988 for bombing the U.S. Capitol on November 7, 1983. (Duke has been a fugitive since 1985, when she failed to re-appear in court after she was released on bail.) Sibley asks, "[W]hy did Magistrate Judge Deborah A. Robinson grant the government's Oral Motion and enter an Order Dismissing the Indictment? Curiously, neither the Oral Motion nor the Order Dismissing the indictment gives any reason for this extraordinary action of dismissing an action against a dangerous felony fugitive." According to Sibley, "neither the law nor the facts granted Magistrate Judge Robinson the authority to dismiss the indictment against Elizabeth Duke." According to Martha Trowbridge at the blog Terrible Truth, Duke "is a long-time comrade of Weather Underground leader Bill Ayers and co-founder of May19CO, a New York City based communist organization dedicated to Malcolm X and Ho Chi Minh that advocated violent overthrow of the United States Government." (Some speculate that Obama's real father was Malcolm X, not the drunken wife-beater from Kenya, and that his mother was not Stanley Ann Dunham, but Elizabeth Duke/aka Jo Ann Newman. The Obama Timeline is unable to confirm or disprove the various theories of Obama's ancestry, but reports them so that readers can be as well-informed as possible. The entire truth may never be known—and Obama himself may not even know the truth.) [46769, 46770, 46771, 46772, 46835, 46869, 46870]

On July 27 Obama says in a *New York Times* interview "there is no evidence" that the Keystone XL pipeline "would be a big jobs generator. ...I meant what I said; I'm going to evaluate this based on whether or not this is going to significantly contribute to carbon in our atmosphere. And there is no doubt that Canada at the source in those tar sands could potentially be doing more to mitigate carbon release." (It is absurd to argue that building a pipeline across hundreds of miles would not create jobs. The pipeline would not construct itself—it would require workers. Even if the bulk of the several thousand new construction jobs would last only one or two years and not be permanent, the same would be true of any jobs created by Obama's "infrastructure" proposals. Further, blocking the pipeline will not eliminate any "carbon release," as Canada would simply

sell the oil to China. Canada will not stop accessing its natural resources simply because Obama wants to please believers in man-caused global warming.) [46766, 46802]

Obama also tells the *Times*, "Racial tensions won't get better; they may get worse, because people will feel as if they've got to compete with some other group to get scraps from a shrinking pot." (One of Obama's 2008 campaign promises was that he could improve race relations in the United States. Five years later he essentially claims that progress is impossible because he won't be able to confiscate as much wealth from whites as he would like to give to blacks and Hispanics.) [46792]

Asked about Obama's questionable legal authority to delay ObamaCare's employer mandate, Obama avoids the question and tells the Times, "[I]f Congress thinks that what I've done is inappropriate or wrong in some fashion, they're free to make that case. But there's not an action that I take that you don't have some folks in Congress who say that I'm usurping my authority. Some of those folks think I usurp my authority by having the gall to win the presidency. And I don't think that's a secret. But ultimately, I'm not concerned about their opinions—very few of them, by the way, are lawyers, much less constitutional lawyers. [Despite media stories to the contrary, Obama also was never a constitutional law professor. More than half of the nation's U.S. Senators are lawyers who can legally practice law—unlike Obama, who relinquished his law license when it was challenged by someone who noticed that he lied about his use of drugs and aliases.] I am concerned about the folks who I spoke to today who are working really hard, are trying to figure out how they can send their kids to college, are trying to make sure that they can save for their retirement. And if I can take steps on their behalf, then I'm going to do so. And I would hope that more and more of Congress will say, you know what, since that's our primary focus, we're willing to work with you to advance those ideals. But I'm not just going to sit back if the only message from some of these folks is no on everything, and sit around and twiddle my thumbs for the next 1,200 days." (In other words, "I will do want I want to do, regardless of the law, and I dare anyone to try to stop me." HotAir.com comments, "Evidently if Congress doesn't do what he wants, he enjoys legal authority under the Doin' Good For The People Clause of the Constitution to do it himself. That's not the first time he's invoked that clause either; remember, he decided to continue his intervention in Libya even though his own lawyers concluded that he had no power to do so under the War Powers Act. ... If [George W.] Bush pulled the 'because I said so' shtick in defending his own decision not to enforce a statute, Senator Obama would have screeched about it endlessly, just like he screeched about executive overreach, signing statements, drone warfare, domestic surveillance, and all the other supposed ills of the Bush age that he's ended up adopting.") [46815, 46820, 46849]

FoxNews.com reports, "Attorneys general across the country are fighting back against new Obama administration guidelines on businesses using criminal background checks for job applicants and two federal lawsuits that followed, calling both 'a quintessential example of gross federal overreach.' The nine attorneys general sent the letter Wednesday to the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, which in April 2012 voted in favor of the new guidelines that warn such checks can discriminate against

African-Americans because they being are [sic; they are being] arrested at a disproportionate rate compared to the rest of the U.S. population." [46767]

While the Obama administration worries that criminal background checks will prevent black ex-convicts form getting good jobs (something one should consider before committing a crime), it is also pushing transgender bathrooms in schools. According to FoxNews.com, Obama's Department of Justice is "fighting for a [female] transgendered California ninth-grader's [alleged] right to use the boy's room at school—has conservative groups wondering just how far Washington will go in the name of civil rights." [46768]

At the Western Conservative Summit, Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) calls for the de-funding of ObamaCare, saying, "On January 1 the exchanges kick in and the subsidies kick in. Once those kick in, it's going to prove almost impossible to undo ObamaCare. The administration's plan is very simple: Get everyone addicted to the sugar so that ObamaCare remains a permanent feature of our society. ...Right now we don't have the votes. Right now we're not even close. There's only one way we're going to get 41 Republicans in the Senate and 218 Republicans in the House of Representatives [to agree to de-fund the program], which is if they hear from the American people in overwhelming numbers." On July 28 FoxNews.com reports, "Israel and Palestine will resume face-to-face peace talks on Monday in Washington, the State Department said Sunday. Agency spokeswoman Jen Psaki said both sides had accepted invitations from Kerry to come to Washington 'to formally resume direct final status negotiations' that are scheduled to begin Monday evening and continue Tuesday. Psaki said in a statement that Kerry on Sunday called Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas and that the leaders agreed the talks would 'serve as an opportunity to develop a procedural work plan for how the parties can proceed with the negotiations in the coming months." (The discussions will lead nowhere, but Netanyahu is likely doing his best to demonstrate that it is not Israel that is standing in the way of peace progress—so that if and when Israel strikes Iran's nuclear facilities it will be more unreasonable for Obama to criticize the Jewish state. As usual, the Palestinians—with the support of the Obama administration—demand the release of jihadi terrorists from Israeli prisons as a precondition to the talks. Pamela Geller writes at AtlasShrugs.com, "The Muslim authority (the PA) of Gaza, Judea and Samaria have stated unequivocally that they will never recognize the Jewish state. They cannot. It would violate the tenets of Islamic Jew-hatred. And this Israel refuses to recognize. How many thousands of Muslim terrorists has Israel released, to no good end? How much Jewish land has Israel given to savages, to no good end? Israel released more than 1,000 terrorists in exchange for Gilad Shalit, and so many went back to attacking Jews. The Israeli Cabinet approves the release of 104 imprisoned Palestinians, as requested by the Palestinian Authority as a pre-condition for peace talks—and as demanded by Obama and Secretary of State John Kerry. Algemeiner.com reports, "Ahead of the cabinet meeting, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu justified the move saying, 'This moment is not easy for me. It is not easy for the ministers. It is not easy especially for the families, the bereaved families, whose heart I understand. But there are moments in which tough decisions must be made for the good of the country and this is one of those moments.'" (Israel has released prisoners countless times in the past, each time in the mistaken belief that it would help lead to progress in peace talks with the Palestinians. But the goal of the Palestinians is not peace; it is the release of prisoners and the destruction of Israel.) AtlasShrugs.com's Pamela Geller asks, "And what is the Islamic authority in Gaza, Samaria and Judea giving in return? Nothing. At PJMedia.com Barry Rubin later asks, "Is there some secret American promise [that is prompting the release of the 104 terrorists? Well, what is an Obama promise worth? Obama personally mediated a deal in which Israel made concessions, than he did nothing when Turkey ignored all the provisions and openly broke the agreement. HotAir.com reports on some of the false claims that insurance premiums are going down because of ObamaCare. The leftist ThinkProgress.org, for example, claims, "Health premiums in Maryland's exchanges will be 'among the lowest of the 12 states that have available proposed or approved rates for comparison,' the state's exchange—Maryland Health Connection—announced Friday." In fact, states HotAIr.com, "Well... not so fast. The headlines are carefully scripted to give one impression, but the reality is something else. ...[T]he prices aren't actually going *down* anywhere. They're just going up *less* than projected in some places. And... even that isn't thanks to Obamacare. It's from blue state governments trying to bring the hammer down as hard as possible to put some lipstick on this pig." (During the 2008 campaign Obama repeatedly promised that premiums would, on average, go down by \$2,500 per family.) [46794, 46795]

On July 29 WashingtonExaminer.com reports that the Obamas will be spending their upcoming Martha's Vineyard vacation "at a \$7.6 million resort home on southern edge of the island in the town of Chilmark where homes feature water access to Chilmark Pond, tennis courts and swimming pools. ... As in the past, the Wesley Hotel in Oak Bluffs will house security and communications officials. The owner told the Vineyard Gazette that the Secret Service has booked 70 rooms and another five have been reserved for the Transportation Security Agency. Rates at the hotel run from \$225-\$345. Also, telephone and communications lines are being installed on the island for [Obama's] use." (Meanwhile, White House tours remain canceled due to spending reductions.) With tongue in cheek, WhiteHouseDossier.com writes, "...Obama plans to continue his crusade for income equality from his \$7.6 million vacation estate on Martha's Vineyard, demanding action in Congress and handing out free lobster rolls on the driveway. ...Obama has also convinced Secretary of State John Kerry to pop over from Nantucket to give low-income children wind surfing lessons. 'They'll be trained and ready to go the minute they get their first sailboard,' Kerry said in a brief interview. ... White House sources say that upon returning to Washington, Obama plans to write a book about his luxury vacation, titled, 'I'll Bet My Father Never Dreamed of This,' and make plans for his excursion to Hawaii this winter." Financial Times reports, "A judge has ordered Ben Bernanke, the Federal Reserve chairman, to testify about the bailout of AIG in a case where the government is accused of illegally appropriating the insurer and using it 'to covertly funnel billions of dollars to foreign entities.' Government lawyers had argued Mr. Bernanke was too senior and the

facts had been raked over too often for his appearance to be necessary. Judge Thomas Wheeler disagreed. Compelling Mr. Bernanke to travel to a Washington law firm to answer questions about the government bailout, he wrote on Monday that the 'court cannot fathom having to decide this multibillion-dollar claim without the testimony.' The claim comes from Hank Greenberg, the former chief executive of AIG, who says he and other shareholders were unfairly diluted when the Federal Reserve Bank of New York took an 80 per cent equity stake in return for \$182 billion in emergency funding. He is suing the government for compensation." [46801]

YnetNews.com reports, "Without much publicity or official announcements, the United States released five Guantanamo Bay detainees as a nod of willingness to open peace talks in Afghanistan. After officials in Kabul expressed desire for negotiations, the Obama administration released five members of the Taliban who were detained at the US detention center. A top US official said that the prisoners were released under the condition that they will not engage in any violent activity. While it is clear that they are guilty of crime, the benefit in releasing them—the potential withdrawal of US forces from Afghanistan by the summer of 2014—is greater than the risk. The US announced it will attempt to negotiate peace talks with the Taliban and Afghanistan government officials some months ago. ...Releasing the detainees from Guantanamo Bay serves another purpose for ... Obama: The more prisoners released from the camp, the likelier it is for Congress to approve shutting down the facility altogether—a campaign promise which Obama he has been trying to realize since first being elected in 2008." At AtlasShrugs.com Pamela Geller writes, "Want to score points with the Obama regime? Bomb schools, kill teachers, poison girls' schools, strap bombs on to children, oppress and torture women, harbor jihad leaders like Osama Bin Laden—the more the better. Then you, too, will get on Obama's favored status list. This is monstrous. Obama's Ramadan gift to savages." Meanwhile, The New York Times reports, "Under a wrinkle that dates back to enactment of the [ObamaCare] law, members of Congress and thousands of their aides are required to get their coverage through new state-based markets known as insurance exchanges. But the law does not provide any obvious way for the federal government to continue paying its share of the premiums for the comprehensive coverage. If the government cannot do so, it could mean an additional expense of \$5,000 a year for individuals and \$11,000 for families under some of the most popular plans. Not surprisingly, that idea is unpopular on Capitol Hill. 'It's a very serious concern,' said [Congressman] Billy Long, a Missouri Republican who said staff members were 'freaked out' at the prospect of paying the full cost of insurance out of their own pockets. 'They're thinking about leaving government service,' said Mr. Long, noting that some staff members already lived in group houses and cramped apartments to make ends meet on Capitol Hill salaries. 'They're thinking about taking jobs other places. We have tried, and tried, and tried to get the answer on what they're going to be paying. The Office of Personnel Management cannot tell us." (Some might argue that thousands of federal employees leaving their government jobs would be a good thing.) [46817]

Over a Muslim iftar dinner hosted by Secretary of State John Kerry, aides to Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu and Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas begin discussing guidelines and preconditions for peace talks. According to Reuters, "The major issues to be resolved in the talks include borders, the future of Jewish settlements on the West Bank, the fate of Palestinian refugees and the status of Jerusalem." On July 30 Obama visits an Amazon.com distribution facility in Chattanooga, Tennessee to push his even-more-government agenda—and blame the GOP for the lack of jobs. He states, "If [the Republicans have] got a better plan to bring back more manufacturing jobs here to Tennessee and around the country, then let them know—let me know. I want to hear them. If they've got a better plan to create jobs rebuilding our infrastructure or to help workers earn the high-tech skills that they need, then they should offer up these ideas. But I've got to tell you, just gutting our environmental protection, that's not a jobs plan. Gutting investments in education, that's not a jobs plan. They keep on talking about this—an oil pipeline coming down from Canada that's estimated to create about 50 permanent jobs—that's not a jobs plan. Wasting the country's time by taking something like 40 meaningless votes to repeal Obamacare is not a jobs plan. That's not a jobs plan." (According to FoxNews.com, Obama's own State Department estimates that the Keystone XL pipeline "would create nearly 4,000 annual construction jobs—and potentially 'support' an annual 42,000 jobs." Using Obama's math, 4,000–42,000 is the equivalent of 50. Building a pipeline that would create jobs is, in Obama's opinion, "not a jobs plan," but giving tax breaks to his Democrat donors to invest in "green energy" businesses is.) [Obama] challenges Republicans to come up with better ideas, but he has rejected all of their much better ideas on reducing the incredibly costly EPA regulations that are stifling innovation, new business start-ups, and job creation." Daniel Kish, senior vice president for policy at the Institute for Energy Research, says of Obama's speech that its is the "same stuff he's been saying for five years now about how he wants to increase taxation on the kind of energy people want to use—and do use in this country—and instead subsidize the sorts of energy that he likes. The things that stand on their own merits, you [Obama] whack 'em in the knees.") Obama also calls for an increase in the minimum wage—apparently ignorant of the fact that such an increase is a surefire way to keep unskilled youths from being able to find jobs. (Obama is an economic idiot if he does not understand that government employee salaries and benefits are paid by the taxpayers. Paying a federal worker \$50,000 means taking \$50,000 from other individuals via taxes. The unemployment rate would be zero if the government hired 23 million unemployed and underemployed Americans and gave them holes to dig and then fill up—but that does not make doing so a good idea.) Obama is welcomed in Tennessee by a stinging editorial in the *Times Free Press*, which is bluntly titled, "Take your jobs plan and shove it... Your policies have harmed Chattanooga enough,": and which reads in part, "Welcome to Chattanooga, one of hundreds of cities throughout this great nation struggling to succeed in spite of your foolish policies that limit job creation, stifle economic growth and suffocate the

Economists—and regular folks with a basic understanding of math understand that these are three of the most damaging policies imaginable when a country is mired in unemployment and starving for job growth." The administration also says there was no attempt to cover up any facts, that that the State Department has taken steps to fix shortfalls in security procedures after an appointed Accountability Review Board conducted an investigation." CNBC reports, "Working more could ultimately mean thousands of dollars less for you under a quirk in the new health-care law going into effect this fall. This could prompt some people to cut back on their hours to avoid losing money. ... Under the ACA [ObamaCare], federal subsidies in the form of tax credits to buy insurance on new state health insurance exchanges will be available to millions of people who can start enrolling on those exchanges Oct. 1. The subsidies are available to people or families whose incomes total 400 percent above the federal poverty level [FPL] or less, and are designed to cap their insurance premiums at 9.5 percent of their total income. For a single person, that FPL income maximum is \$45,960 per year. The maximums are adjusted upward for couples and families until maxing out at \$94,200 for a family of four. Under a scenario that ValuePenguin.com identified, a couple in Ohio, both age 50, would be eligible for subsidies worth \$3,452 to purchase a so-called silver insurance plan—a moderately priced level of benefits under the ACA's scheme—that costs \$9,346 annually if they made up to \$62,040 per year. But if they made just \$1 more than that, they would lose the subsidy. ...[T]he couple then would have to earn at least \$65,492 to make up for the lost subsidy. ... In New York, a family of three whose annual income totals \$78,120, would pay \$12,784 for the second-lower-priced silver plan on that state's insurance exchange. After getting a \$5,363 tax credit, the family's net cost for the insurance would be \$7,421. But if the family earned even slightly more than \$78,120, they would have to pay the entire \$12,784 for the insurance because they then wouldn't qualify for the subsidy. To make up for that, the family's annual income would have to reach \$83,483..." [46983]

DailyCaller.com reports, "The Obama administration's plan to target young people with a public-relations campaign on the benefits of enrolling in Obamacare appears to violate the federal Age Discrimination Act. The Obama administration reportedly plans to roll out 'campaign-style demographic targeting' to encourage younger, healthier people to enroll in the Affordable Care Act and effectively balance Obamacare exchanges, which will initially serve primarily older people closer to death and would drive up health care rates under the law. The administration hopes that 18-to-30-year-olds will comprise 2.7 million of the 7 million people expected to sign up for Obamacare exchanges in the first six months of the law's implementation." The administration's planned "demographic targeting could violate the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, which states that no program that receives federal money can discriminate with respect to age." ... American Enterprise Institute health policy scholar Joseph Antos comments, "Maybe in some general sense there's a violation. But you've already seen the administration directly violate the law.

Delaying the employer mandate for a year is the most recent example. If the administration can violate clearer laws, then violating something that is at best second-hand to this act should be relatively easy." [46810]

On the floor of the U.S. Senate, Senator Marco Rubio (R-FL) says, "If we pass a budget that pays for everything except for ObamaCare, and [Obama] says he'll veto that, it is he who wants to shut down the government. It is he who is basically saying, 'I will shut down the government unless it pays for ObamaCare.' And that is an unreasonable position. It's unreasonable because this law is so bad. ... Why would we continue to pour billions and hundreds of millions of taxpayer dollars into a disaster? Why would we double down with your hard-earned money on a program that's going to hurt you? ...[This is] our last best chance to do something about this, [because ObamaCare] is going to make it harder on the middle class. Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) states, "If ObamaCare were a good thing, if it were working, we can be sure ... Obama would want it to go into full effect before the next election. He would want to take credit with the American people for the benefits of this signature bill. The fact that [Obama] was forced to concede 'the wheels are coming off' to move the employer mandate until after the next election, I would suggest is highly, highly revealing." Senator Mike Lee (R-UT) calls ObamaCare "ill-conceived, poorly crafted and damaging. ...[T]he American people deserve better. The American people demand better. This is not a good way to run a government. This is not a kind thing to do to an unsuspecting public, who hopes and expects that we have their best interests at heart. ... FoxNews.com reports, "The federal government is hiring what it calls a 'Behavioral Insights Team' that will look for ways to subtly influence people's behavior, according to a document describing the program obtained by FoxNews.com. Critics warn there could be unintended consequences to such policies, while supporters say the team could make government and society more efficient. While the program is still in its early stages, the document shows the White House is already working on such projects with almost a dozen federal departments and agencies including the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Agriculture. ...Such policies—which encourage behavior subtly rather than outright require it—have come to be known as 'nudges,' after an influential 2008 book titled 'Nudge' by former Obama regulatory czar Cass Sunstein and Chicago Booth School of Business professor Richard Thaler popularized the term." (Sunstein, allegedly a closet homosexual, was a Harvard classmate of Obama. Sunstein is married to Obama's U.N. ambassador pick, Samantha Power. In a 2007 speech Sunstein supported "eliminating current practices such as... meat eating. ...We ought to ban hunting, I suggest, if there isn't a purpose other than sport and fun. That should be against

the law. It's time now." In his book *Animal Rights: Current Debates and New Directions*, Sunstein wrote, "animals should be permitted to bring suit, with human beings as their representatives. Any animals that are entitled to bring suit would be represented by [human] counsel, who would owe guardian-like obligations and make decisions, subject to those obligations, on their clients' behalf." In his 2008 book, *Nudge: Improving Decisions About Health, Wealth, and Happiness*, Sunstein complained, "The major obstacle to increasing [organ] donations is the need to get the consent of surviving family members." To rectify that "problem," Sunstein suggested that the concept of "explicit consent" (opt in) be changed to "presumed consent" (opt out). That is, the deceased would always be *assumed* to be a donor—unless there was a signed statement from the deceased asking that his organs *not* be removed. Because most Americans would object to such a policy, Sunstein says that "...the best choice architecture for organ donations is mandated choice." The House Oversight and Government Affairs Committee accuses the IRS of stonewalling the investigation of its program to discriminate against conservative groups seeking tax-exempt status. The committee's letter to IRS acting commissioner Danny Werfel charges the agency has "attempted to delay, frustrate, impede and obstruct" the investigation, and states, "The actions of the IRS under your leadership have made clear to the committee that the agency has no intention of complying completely or promptly with the committee's oversight efforts." The letter also notes that "Obstructing a congressional investigation is a crime." According to FoxNews.com, "The agency has turned over just 12,000 pages of the roughly 64 million pages it deemed potentially relevant to the investigation, [committee chairman Darrell] Issa said. Furthermore, many of the documents are duplicates and so excessively redacted that they are 'completely unintelligible and useless,' according to the letter." (Page after page of the documents provided by the IRS to the committee are almost completely blacked out. FreeBeacon.com reports, "A Muslim outreach group with ties to the White House is distancing itself from a Canadian organization that shares its name following revelations that the Canadian group may have funded Pakistani jihadists. The Canadian Islamic Society of North America (ISNA) sent \$280,000 to a Pakistani organization that the Canadian government says has terror ties, according to an official investigation first reported by the *Star*. The Canada Revenue Agency audited ISNA-Canada's Development Foundation (IDF) and found the charity 'facilitated the transfer of resources that may have been used to support the efforts of' Pakistani separatist group Hizbul Mujahideen, as well as the extremist group's 'armed wing.' ISNA-America, which federal prosecutors have identified as a U.S. Muslim Brotherhood 'member organization,' came under scrutiny in 2009. ... The news from Canada has led to new scrutiny of ISNA-America, which critics say is too close to the White House... ISNA officials visited the White House in March. A top outreach official said the group was [Obama's] 'primary means of outreach to the American Muslim community.'" (AtlasShrugs.com reminds readers that

the ISMA "was named an unindicted coconspirator in the largest terrorist funding trial in our nation's history"—but that has not stopped Obama from dealing with the organization. The ISNA was formed in 1981 by members of the radical Muslim Brotherhood jihad movement and, along with the Council on Islamic-American Relations, was an unindicted co-conspirator in the case against the Holy Land Foundation for directing charitable donations to the terrorist group Hamas; five HLF officials were indicted on 108 counts. Republicans in the Senate have attempted to stop the Justice Department from dealing with the ISNA. On July 31 Eliana Johnson reports at National Review.com, "Embattled Internal Revenue Service official Lois Lerner and an attorney in the Federal Election Commission's general counsel's office appear to have twice colluded to influence the record before the FEC's vote in the case of a conservative non-profit organization, according to e-mails unearthed by the House Ways and Means Committee and obtained exclusively by National Review Online. The correspondence suggests the discrimination of conservative groups extended beyond the IRS and into the FEC, where an attorney from the agency's enforcement division in at least one case sought and received tax information about the status of a conservative group, the American Future Fund, before recommending that the commission prosecute it for violations of campaign-finance law. Lerner, the former head of the IRS's exempt-organizations division, worked at the FEC from 1986 to 1995, and was known for aggressive investigation of conservative groups during her tenure there, too. ... House Ways and Means Committee chairman Dave Camp [R-MI] and oversightsubcommittee chairman Charles Boustany [R-LA] are calling on the IRS, in the wake of these revelations, to provide all communications between the agency and the FEC between 2008 and 2012. 'The American public is entitled to know whether the IRS is inappropriately sharing their confidential tax information with other agencies,' Camp and Boustany write in a letter they will send to acting IRS administrator Danny Werfel on Wednesday." WND.com reports, "While the sexting of former congressman and current candidate for New York [City] mayor Anthony Weiner is still making national headlines, a blast-fromthe-past sex tape involving Monica Lewinsky and former President Bill Clinton has just

reportedly surfaced. An audio tape obtained by the National Enquirer purports to reveal the former White House intern planning a secret sexual meeting with the president and proclaiming to her paramour she's 'too cute and adorable' to be ignored. The recording, made in November 1997 at the height of the pair's sexual affair, is three minutes, 47 seconds long, and is addressed to 'handsome.' At one point, Lewinsky is heard trying to seduce Clinton, saying: 'I could take my clothes off and start ...well ... I know you wouldn't enjoy that? I hope to see you later and I hope you will follow my script and do what I want.' Monica's voice is the only one heard on the tape, which was thought to have been destroyed years ago, though a duplicate was secretly made and has now surfaced, according to the Enquirer. On the recording, Lewinsky tells the commander in chief: 'Since I know you will be alone tomorrow evening, I have two proposals for you, neither of which is you not seeing me.' She then takes charge, instructing Clinton use his secretary, Betty Currie, to plan the president's schedule so they could secretly meet without any formal record of her visit. 'Now the first thing that has to happen is that you need to pre-plan with Betty that you will leave the office at, I don't know, at 7, 7:30 so that everyone else who hates me that causes me lots of trouble goes home,' Lewinsky tells Clinton. 'Then you quickly sneak back and then in the meantime I quickly sneak over and then we can have a nice little visit for, you know, 15 minutes or half an hour. Whatever you want." [46842]

At FoxBusiness.com Elizabeth MacDonald reports, "Health reform is now causing job turmoil across the country in three key groups that the White House has depended on for support—local government, school workers and unions. School districts in states like Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Utah, Nebraska, and Indiana are dropping to part-time status school workers such as teacher aides, administrators, secretaries, bus drivers, gym teachers, coaches and cafeteria workers. Cities or counties in states like California. Indiana, Kansas, Texas, Michigan and Iowa are dropping to part-time status government workers such as librarians, secretaries, administrators, parks and recreation officials and public works officials. ... To stop the wheels from coming off the school bus, school districts are doing the math, and are figuring out that cutting worker hours down to parttime status, or paying the [ObamaCare] mandate tax, or dropping part-time coverage is less expensive than offering health insurance benefits. ...On top of that, cities across the nation are discovering that the extra expense from health reform will trigger layoffs and cutbacks in city services like public works, city jails, government workers in nursing homes, parks and libraries if they don't push government workers down to part-time status. A record high 28.1 million workers are now part-time, though the recession officially ended four years ago. By a vote of 53–42 the U.S. Senate confirms B. Todd Jones to be the next director of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. (Jones is a long-time friend of Attorney General Eric Holder. Jones was reportedly in attendance at the first meeting of Holder's 'Southwest Border Strategy Group,' at which Operation Fast and Furious was probably conceived. Jones was under fire for issuing a video message to all department employees in which he threatened whistleblowers with the statement, "[I]f you make

poor choices, ...if you don't abide by the rules, ...if you don't respect the chain of command, if you don't find the appropriate way to raise your concerns to your leadership, there will be consequences...") Senator John Cornyn (R-TX) comments, "What could have been an opportunity for [Obama] to bring competent leadership to a department wrought with mismanagement is instead a signal from the top that reckless behavior is not only permissible in his administration, but rewarded. Mr. Jones' nomination is an insult to the memory and families of those who fell victim to the botched Fast and Furious program. Congressman Darrell Issa (R-CA), head of the House Oversight and Government Affairs Committee—which has been investigating Operation Fast and Furious—states, "Jones was first brought into the job of ATF Acting Director in the middle of the Fast and Furious scandal after Justice Department officials had falsely denied reckless conduct and allegations by his predecessor that there was an effort underway to shield the Department's senior political appointees from the scandal. Because of the numerous ATF mistakes during his tenure as Acting Director pertaining to Fast and Furious, his nomination is a slap in the face to the family of fallen Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry, Mexican citizens whose murder has been linked to Fast and Furious weapons, and ATF whistleblowers whom he failed to support." FoxNews.com reports, "House Republicans, in a lengthy report on the Justice Department's leak investigations, formally accused Attorney General Eric Holder of misleading Congress with 'deceptive' testimony that he knew nothing of the 'potential prosecution' of the press. The 70-page report was released late Wednesday by Republicans on the House Judiciary Committee. To coincide with the release, lawmakers also wrote a letter to ... Obama calling for a 'change in leadership' at the Justice Department. 'The deceptive and misleading testimony of Attorney General Holder is unfortunately just the most recent example in a long list of scandals that have plagued the department,' House Judiciary Committee Chairman Bob Goodlatte (R-VA) said in a statement. The report delved into the department's aggressive investigations over various security leaks, but focused in large part on the FBI affidavit seeking a search warrant for Fox News correspondent James Rosen's emails in connection with one such probe. The DOJ sought access to the documents by arguing Rosen was a likely criminal 'coconspirator' in a leak case, citing the Espionage Act. Yet on May 15, shortly before the document was made public, Holder told the House Judiciary Committee that he hadn't heard of any effort to prosecute reporters." [46846, 46847]

In a meeting with House Democrats, Obama indirectly indicates he may nominate former Treasury Secretary and White House economics advisor Lawrence "there is no housing bubble" Summers to replace Federal Reserve Board chairman Ben Bernanke when Bernanke's term expires in January 2014. DailyCaller.com notes, "Treasury Secretary Summers led the fight for deregulation of the financial industry under the Clinton administration in the 1990s, and successfully championed the repeal of last components of the Glass-Steagall act and complex derivatives regulation. Glass-Steagall was the law separating commercial banking from investment banking put in place after the 1929 stock market crash. Complex derivatives regulation prevented banks from using risky debt

swapping and trading practices. Both where huge components in manufacturing the housing and financial crisis that sent the economy into recession from 2008 on." (Arguably, the repeal of Glass-Steagall partially caused the economic crash in 2008 because it allowed major banks to make risky investments—which then failed and led to the taxpayer bailouts in the TARP program.) Summers' main competition for Bernanke's position is Janet "inflation dove" Yellin, vice chairman of the Federal Reserve Board of Governors. Yellin, like Bernanke, is a proponent of expanding the money supply to allow the government to continue its deficit spending schemes. For some Republicans, Summers—who cost Harvard University \$1.8 billion with risky investments when he was its president—is probably the lesser of the two Keynesian evils Obama has in mind. RT.com reports, "New revelations about NSA surveillance systems show that it was enough to fill in a short 'justification' form before gaining access to any of billions of emails, online chats, or site visit histories through a vast aggregation program called XKeyscore. The structure of XKeyscore, leaked by the UK's Guardian newspaper, is sourced from a classified internal presentation from 2008 and a more recent Unofficial User Guide, presumably obtained by Edward Snowden when he was a contractor for the National Security Agency in the past year. It shows that XKeyscore—then located on 750 servers around 150 sites worldwide—is a vast collection and storage program that served as the entry point for most information that was collected by the NSA. The Guardian claims that in one 30-day period in 2012 the program acquired 41 billion records. The information is not just metadata—depersonalized analytical usage statistics that allow spies to spot patterns—but includes almost all types of personal information. Using any piece of personal data on a subject—an email address, or the IP address of a computer an agent could look up all online user activities, such as Google map searches, website visits, documents sent through the internet or online conversations. The service operates both, in real time, and using a database of recently stored information. All that appears to have been necessary to log into the system is to fill in a compulsory line on a form that gave a reason for why a certain person needed to be investigated. The form was not automatically scanned by the system or a supervisor, and did not require a US legal warrant, as long as the person whose name was typed in was a foreigner (even if his interactions were with a US citizen). The slides appear to vindicate security specialist Edward Snowden's claims made during the original video he recorded in Hong Kong last month. 'I, sitting at my desk, could wiretap anyone, from you or your accountant, to a federal judge or even [Obama], if I had a personal email [address],' he alleged then. Mike Rogers, the Republican chairman of the House intelligence committee later said that Snowden was 'lying.'" [46886]
