## The Obama Timeline – Part II

## The Doomed Presidency

May 2013

On May 1 the Associated Press reports, "A private survey shows U.S. companies added just 119,000 jobs in April, the fewest in seven months. The report Wednesday from payroll processor ADP suggests that government spending cuts and higher taxes could be starting to weigh on the job market. And new requirements under ...Obama's health care law may be prompting some small and mid-size companies to hold back on hiring." Reuters comments, "...[D]etails of the report remained consistent with a slowdown in economic activity. Construction employment fell for the first time since May, while manufacturing payrolls were flat. The average workweek pulled off a nine-month high, but average hourly earnings rose four cents..." According to the Heritage Foundation, "Regulatory burdens on Americans increased by nearly \$70 billion during ...Obama's first term in office, during which federal agencies imposed 131 new major regulations. In 2012 alone, the Administration issued a total of \$23.5 billion in new regulatory costs from 25 major rulemakings. Only two rules last year decreased burdens. Much more regulation is on the way, with another 131 major rules on the Administration's agenda, including dozens more implementing Dodd–Frank and Obamacare. Action is needed by Congress, including requiring congressional approval of each new major regulation before it may take effect." [44633, 44634]

TheBlaze.com reports that three additional suspects have been taken into custody in connection with the Boston Marathon bombing. "Azamat Tazhayakov and Dias Kadyrbayev, both of Kazakhstan, are charged with conspiring to obstruct justice. A third man, Robel Phillipos, is charged with making false statements to federal investigators after Tsarnaev was identified as one of the suspects in the April 15 attack that killed three people and injured more than 260. An FBI affidavit states Tazhayakov, Kadyrbayev and Phillipos all attended the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth together with Dzhokhar Tsarnaev. According to the affidavit, the three admitted that they removed Tsarnaev's backpack from his dorm room on the night of April 18, the day investigators released images of the bombing suspects. 'Kadyrbayev and Tazhayakov have admitted that they agreed to get rid of it after concluding from news reports that Tsarnaev was one of the Boston Marathon bombers,' the affidavit states." Asked about Benghazi whistleblowers being blocked by the Obama administration, White House press secretary Jay Carney says, "Let's be clear: Benghazi happened a long time ago. We are unaware of any agency blocking an employee who would like to appear before Congress to provide information related to Benghazi." (A "long time ago" was September 11, 2012.) [44617] Dailycaller.com reports, "...Obama's pick to head the Federal Housing Finance Agency once said that a 'majority of white voters' would never vote for a black candidate and that they should be excluded from 'the democratic process.' The White House announced Wednesday that Obama will nominate Democratic North Carolina Congressman Mel Watt to take over the FHFA, which regulates Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac, the country's government sponsored mortgage companies. Watt, the former chairman of the Congressional Black Caucus, has in the past accused white Americans of racism." [44620]

At FreedomOutpost.com Tim Brown reports, "Not that we are surprised, but now there are multiple copies of Barack Hussein Obama's 'real' birth certificate that are surfacing and they are clearly indicating fraud. In a rare move, the Alabama Democrat Party has submitted an amicus brief in the McInnish Goode v Chapman Appeal case. The reason being is most likely because the Alabama Supreme Court has Chief Justice Roy Moore presiding over it. The Alabama Democrat Party just submitted a completely different birth certificate than the one that was posted at the White House website in 2011. Larry Klayman, the plaintiff's counsel submitted the forgery of Barack Hussein Obama's birth certificate that was posted to whitehouse.gov on 4-27-2001... Newsmax.com reports, "Arrests of illegal immigrants crossing into the United States have nearly tripled in recent months in anticipation of Congressional efforts to enact comprehensive immigration legislation, border patrol agents told CBS News Wednesday. 'Once the first group gets across, they call their family, they call their friends and let them know, 'Hey the time is right, come on over,'' Border Patrol agent and union representative Chris Cabrera told CBS News. In March, 7,500 illegals were arrested in the Rio Grande Valley of South Texas, which includes McAllen, Cabrera told CBS News. That's up from 2,800 in January." [44622] At a news conference while visiting Mexico to push amnesty legislation, Obama states he is comfortable with revised FDA guidelines that allow over-the-counter sales of "morning after" pills to girls as young as 15. Obama claims the change from age 17 to 15 is based on "solid scientific evidence." (For many Americans, of course, the issue is not the *science* of the drug, but the *morality* of allowing 15-year-olds to purchase it without the knowledge of their parents. Leftists want the age limit eliminated entirely. Left unsaid is how young teenagers will hide or explain to their parents the most common side effects of the drug levonorgestrel: heavier menstrual bleeding, nausea, lower abdominal pain, fatigue, headache, and dizziness.) Congressman Steve Stockman (R-TX) responds to the morning after pill ruling with a Twitter message: "Democrats on health care: 15-year-olds who want birth control are adults. 26-year-olds who want health insurance are children." [44652]

During his Mexico appearance at the Museo Nacional de Antropologia, Obama falsely claims that "most of the guns used to commit violence here in Mexico come from the United States. ...I think many of you know that in America, our Constitution guarantees our individual right to bear arms... But... I will continue to do everything in my power to pass common-sense reforms that keep guns out of the hands of criminals and dangerous people. That can save lives here in Mexico and back home in the United States. It's the right thing to do. So we'll keep increasing the pressure on gun traffickers who bring illegal guns into Mexico. We'll keep putting these criminals where they belong: behind bars." (Obama does not mention Operation fast and Furious, or suggest that he will place Attorney General Eric Holder behind bars for the scheme that resulted in thousands of weapons being sent across the border into Mexico.) The state legislature in South Carolina passes a bill declaring ObamaCare "null and void" and criminalizing its implementation. According to WashingtonTimes.com, "The state's Freedom of Health Care Protection Act intends to 'prohibit certain individuals from enforcing or attempting to enforce such unconstitutional laws; and to establish criminal penalties and civil liability for violating this article.' The measure permits the state Attorney General, with reasonable cause, 'to restrain by temporary restraining order, temporary injunction, or permanent injunction' any person who is believed to be causing harm to any person or business with the implementation of Obamacare." On *Special Report*, Charles Krauthammer quotes Jay Carney: "Benghazi happened a long time ago.' That's the definition of chutzpah. This administration has stonewalled every inquiry and delayed its answers and not released names and told all kinds of stories is now saying, 'Well, it's an old story.' I have argued from the beginning, the administration's strategy has always been string it out over time and count on the mainstream media being uninterested in the story. And that's worked up until now. It echoes what Hillary Clinton said at her hearings: 'What difference does it make at this point?' Well, because, if you wait that long the evidence will fade. But I think they will not get away with it. Because I think there are people in the State Department who want to testify and now that it's out in the open, they are—at least the accusation is that the administration is threatening them. I think in cases like that, they are going to be allowed

to testify. And as we heard in the reports from [Fox News channel's] Adam Housley, there is stuff that happened there that contradicts—at least according to people who were there—the official story, and that is when the story of the unraveling of this will begin." [44624]

On May 2 Obama nominates billionaire Penny Pritzker to head the Commerce Department. ChicagoTribune.com says the move "could prove controversial for the longtime political supporter and fundraising heavyweight. Pritzker is on the board of Chicago-based Hyatt Hotels Corp., which was founded by her wealthy family and has had rocky relations with labor unions. Her nomination, which still needs Senate confirmation, also could bring up questions about the failure of a bank partly owned by her family. ...[Pritzker] could also face scrutiny over the collapse of Superior Bank, which was co-owned by her family. The bank, based in Hinsdale, Ill., was involved in subprime mortgage lending, and its failure in 2001 stirred charges of fraud and mismanagement. Four years ago, Pritzker withdrew her name from consideration for the Commerce job, citing family obligations. At that time, the peak of the financial crisis, Pritzker was managing a large portion of the family's billions of dollars in assets. ...A major donor to Obama, Pritzker has given hundreds of thousands of dollars to Democrats and their state parties across the U.S. During Obama's 2008 run for the White House, she was a campaign 'bundler' who encouraged friends and associates to give and raised between \$200,000 and \$500,000 for him that cycle, according to the Center for Responsive Politics. Pritzker also was an Obama bundler during the 2012 race, raising at least a half-million dollars for his re-election. A co-chair of Obama's first inauguration, Pritzker just gave \$250,000 to help pay for his second one in January, federal reports show." [44623, 44627, 44630, 44638, 45220]

According to BuzzFeed.com, there is "no love lost" between Pritzker and Obama's closest advisor Valerie Jarrett. ...Indeed, Jarrett tried to torpedo the appointment, someone she made the case to told BuzzFeed. And their tense relationship could help define the administration's attempts to mend ties with the business world that frayed badly during the first term. ...A White House official, speaking on the condition of anonymity, discounted any suggestion that the women would clash." FoxNews.com reports, "On the night of the Benghazi terror attack, special operations put out multiple calls for all available military and other assets to be moved into position to help—but the State Department and White House never gave the military permission to cross into Libya, sources told Fox News. The disconnect was one example of what sources described as a communication breakdown that left those on the ground without outside help. ...Multiple sources spoke to Fox News about what they described as a lack of action in Benghazi on Sept. 11 last year, when four Americans, including Ambassador Chris Stevens, were killed. 'They had no plan. They had no contingency plan for if this happens, and that's the problem this is going to face in the future,' one source said. 'They're dealing with more hostile regions, hostile countries. This [type of] attack's going to happen again.'" [44628] Fox also reports, "The State Department's Office of Inspector General [IG] is investigating the special internal panel that probed the Benghazi terror attack for the State Department, Fox News has confirmed. The IG's office is said by well-placed sources to be seeking to determine whether the Accountability Review Board, or ARB—led by former U.N. Ambassador Thomas Pickering and former Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Adm. Mike Mullen—failed to interview key witnesses who had asked to provide their accounts of the Benghazi attacks to the panel. ...This disclosure marks a significant turn in the ongoing Benghazi case, as it calls into question the reliability of the blueribbon panel that then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton convened to review the entire matter. Until the report was concluded, she and all other senior Obama administration officials regularly refused to answer questions about what happened in Benghazi." [44629]

On May 3 the Department of Labor estimates that the economy added 165,000 jobs in April. The official unemployment rate is lowered to 7.5 percent. The unemployment rate for government workers falls to 3.3 percent. CNSNews.com reports, "There were 33,000 more 'discouraged workers' in April, according to the latest economic release from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The BLS defines discouraged workers as 'persons not currently looking for work because they believe no jobs are available for them.' In April, there were 835,000 discouraged workers, up from 803,000 discouraged workers in March." The number of Americans of working age who are "not in the labor force" is 89,936,000. (That number includes individuals on welfare, receiving unemployment benefits, collecting disability benefits, etc.) Since Obama took office, 9.5 million Americans have left the work force. Politico reports that "Michelle Obama will headline a Democratic National Committee fundraiser in New York the same day she is due at a Boston fundraiser for the Senate campaign of Rep. Ed Markey (D-Mass.). The May 29 New York event is billed as the DNC's LGBT [lesbian, gay, bisexual, transsexual] Leadership Council 2013 gala and is to be hosted by Andy Cohen, the Bravo TV network executive and host. The DNC is asking donors for at least \$1,250 and up to \$32,400 per person for the Park Avenue reception..." [44642]

At MrConservative.com Katie Kieffer writes, "Retired Navy SEAL Billy Allmon is coming forward with a scorching testimony saying that ...Obama and former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton deliberately left Americans to die in the September 11, 2012 attack on the U.S. consulate and CIA annex in Benghazi, Libya. Allmon's story supports and adds credibility to previous Benghazigate whistleblowers. Allmon wrote a column today for The Western Center for Journalism based on his sources that were on the ground during the Benghazi tragedy that left four Americans dead, including U.S. Ambassador J. Christopher Stevens who died in the first attack on the U.S. consulate and Navy SEALs Tyrone Woods and Glen Doherty who died in the second attack on the CIA annex about a mile away from the consulate. Allmon says that ...Obama is directly to blame for the deaths of Woods and Doherty because the fight at the CIA annex lasted over four hours and he says there was aid nearby to call and, 'Obama... is the ONLY one who can give cross-border permission to any military command or unit to go into another country. Obama NEVER gave that permission.' Apparently, Obama told Delta Force operators and a special Marine FAST unit (both Tier One Special Operations) to hold off on coming to the aid of Woods and Doherty. Woods also specifically requested aid from a nearby C-130 aircraft that was meant for deep firefights like the one at the annex. Inexplicably, Allmon says Obama also turned down this request. So, Woods and Doherty died at the hands of militants and the mortar round wounds on Woods' body indicate that it was not a quick death—he likely spent the last two hours of his life bleeding profusely." That price tag largely masked the true ten-year cost because of the delayed implementation of the law, and the CBO revised its cost estimate in 2013 to show that the law will spend \$1.85 trillion in the next ten years. Obamacare is already experiencing cost overruns, and the Obama Administration expects the states to pick up the tab. One of Obamacare's provisions, the Pre-Existing Condition Insurance Plan, has nearly run out of its \$5 billion budget, and HHS Secretary [Kathleen] Sebelius has proposed that the states that run the administration of the program find a way to pay for it themselves." Also at Townhall.com, Mike Shedlock reports, "Obamacare is behind the surge in parttime employment as corporations have been cutting hours worked and hiring more parttime workers to make up the difference. Part-time employment rose this month by a whopping 441,000 as private average weekly hours fell 0.2 to 34.4 hours and average weekly earnings fell from \$824.52 to \$821.13 due to fewer hours worked." The names of "Benghazi whistleblowers" set to testify before the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee on May 8 are released and reported by Fox News: "Gregory N. Hicks, the deputy chief of mission at the U.S. Embassy in Libya at the time of the terrorist attacks; Mark I. Thompson, a former Marine and the deputy coordinator for Operations in the agency's Counterterrorism Bureau; and Eric Nordstrom, a diplomatic security officer who was the regional security officer in Libya, the top security officer in the country in the months leading up to the attacks." At WeeklyStandard.com Stephen F. Hayes reports, "Even as the White House strove last week to move beyond questions about the Benghazi attacks of Tuesday, September 11, 2012, fresh evidence emerged that senior Obama administration officials knowingly misled the country about what had happened in the days following the assaults. The Weekly Standard has obtained a timeline briefed by the Office of the Director of National Intelligence detailing the heavy substantive revisions made to the CIA's talking points, just six weeks before the 2012 presidential election, and additional information about why the changes were made and by whom. As intelligence officials pieced together the puzzle of events unfolding in Libya, they concluded even before the assaults had ended that al Qaeda-linked terrorists were involved. Senior administration officials, however, sought to obscure the emerging picture and downplay the significance of attacks that killed a U.S. ambassador and three other Americans. The frantic process that produced the changes to the talking points took place over a 24-hour period just one day before Susan Rice, U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, made her now-famous appearances on the Sunday television talk shows. The discussions involved senior officials from the State Department, the National Security Council, the CIA, the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, and the White House." Hayes' detailed review of the talking points makes it clear that "they were changed to obscure the truth." Hayes charges that Obama advisor Ben Rhodes was the chief architect of the Benghazi cover-up. (Conveniently for Obama, David Rhodes is the brother of Ben Rhodes and the president of CBS News. The president of ABC News is Ben Sherwood, whose sister, Elizabeth Sherwood-Randall, is a Special Assistant to Obama. Additionally, CNN deputy bureau chief Virginia Moseley, is married to Tom Niles, a former Hillary Clinton deputy. On Fox News Watch, media commentator Richard Grenell says "There's no question" that Rhodes, Sherwood, and Moseley are "covering" for Obama and Clinton. White House press secretary Jay Carney is married to ABC reporter Claire Shipman. White House lawyer Michael Gottlieb is married to NPR's White House correspondent Ari Shapiro.) Blogger Doug Ross posts a damning timeline of the Benghazi events which makes it clear that "a) Hillary Clinton lied under oath to Congress. b) Barack Obama went to sleep knowing that a U.S. Ambassador and other Americans were under terrorist attack. c) Barack Obama awoke refreshed the next day to begin fundraising. d) The entire Executive Branch lied repeatedly to the American people to save Obama's chances for reelection." In Afghanistan, seven U.S. soldiers are killed by Taliban fighters. [44656, 44666]

Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro says in a speech, "We are here defending our institutions, peace, democracy, the people of Venezuela... and we can sit down with anyone, even the grand chief of devils: Obama." [44661]

Obama's domestic terrorist pal William Ayers responds to a reporter who compares his Weather Underground bombing activities and the Boston Marathon bombers: "There's no equivalence. Property damage. That's what we did. ...How different is the [school] shooting in Connecticut from shooting at a hunting range? Just because they use the same thing, there's no relationship at all." On May 5 Congressman Darrell Issa (R-CA) appears on *Face the Nation* and charges that the Obama administration's decision to blame the Benghazi attacks on an angry mob outraged over a video was purely political: "We can't find a classified reason for it. We can't find a diplomatic reason for it." Issa references anticipated "whistleblower" testimony at an upcoming hearing of the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee he chairs. On Fox News, Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) says of the expected whistleblower testimony, "It's going to make you mad. It's going to make you upset. Come Wednesday [the May 8 hearing date], you're going to start hearing the truth about Benghazi." [44664]

Congressman Steve Lynch (D-MA) appears on *Fox News Sunday* and criticizes the Obama administration's narrative regarding the Benghazi attacks of September 11, 2012: "Well, it was scrubbed. It was totally inaccurate. There's no excuse for that. It was false information. And what they [administration officials] try to do is harmonize what happened in Benghazi with what happened everywhere else across the Middle East." [44662]

On *This Week*, Democrat strategist James Carville defends Obama and claims he remains relevant, but his Republican-strategist wife, Mary Matalin, calls Obama "soufflé. In six weeks, he's soufflé. He single-handedly wiped out the congressional majority in the last midterm [elections in 2010]. He set in place Republican dominance at the state level for decades because we picked up so many—7,000 legislators and 30 governors, in control of the legislatures in the states, which is the bench—back bench for rising stars. In this cycle, he's going to wipe out his Senate—if not the majority, certainly, the critical mass of the majority." Regular panelist Cokie Roberts, a Democrat, says, "[T]he truth is, [Obama] is a lame duck." [44672]

*The New York Times* reports, "A series of powerful explosions rocked the outskirts of Damascus early Sunday morning, which Syrian state television said was the result of Israeli missile attacks on a Syrian military installation. If true, it would be the second Israeli airstrike [sic; air strike] in Syria in two days and the third this year. The airstrike [sic] that Israeli warplanes carried out in Syria overnight on Thursday [May 2] was directed at a shipment of advanced surface-to-surface missiles from Iran that Israel believed was intended for Hezbollah, American officials said Saturday. That strike was aimed at disrupting the arms pipeline that runs from Syria to Hezbollah, the militant Lebanese organization, and it highlighted the mounting stakes for Hezbollah and Israel as Syria becomes more chaotic." DailyCaller.com reports, "Mel Watt, …Obama's nominee for director of the Federal Housing Finance Agency, pushed government programs to help welfare recipients buy

homes during the creation of the subprime mortgage bubble. Watt, a 20-year Member of Congress from North Carolina's 12th district, also had a hand in programs allowing borrowers with poor credit to buy homes with no down payment. The American financial system was subsequently destroyed when millions of bad borrowers defaulted on their loans, setting off a market crash that wiped out nearly 40 percent of the net worth of Americans. In 2002, Watt teamed up with Freddie Mac and Fannie Mae, Bank of America, BB&T, and UJAMMA Inc., to announce Pathways to Homeownership, a pilot initiative designed to give home loans to welfare recipients." In a commencement address at Ohio State University, Obama says, "I'm not going to offer some grand theory on a beautiful day like this—you guys all have celebrating to do. I'm not going to get partisan, either, because that's not what citizenship is about." He then encourages students to rely more on government programs and in a markedly partisan mode criticizes conservatives for warning that "tyranny is always lurking just around the corner." (Arguably, some conservatives warn that tyranny is not "just around the corner" but in the Oval Office.) Obama tells the graduates, "Unfortunately, you've grown up hearing voices that incessantly warn of government as nothing more than some separate, sinister entity that's at the root of all our problems; some of these same voices also doing their best to gum up the works. They'll warn that tyranny is always lurking just around the corner. You should reject these voices. Because what they suggest is that our brave and creative and unique experiment in self-rule is somehow just a sham which can't be trusted. ... The [Founding] Founders trusted us with this awesome authority. We should trust ourselves with it, too. Because when we don't, when we turn away and get discouraged and cynical, and abdicate that authority, we grant our silent consent to someone who will gladly claim it. That's how we end up with lobbyists who set the agenda; and policies detached from what middle-class families face every day; the wellconnected who publicly demand that Washington stay out of their business-and then whisper in government's ear for special treatment that you don't get. That's how a small minority of lawmakers get cover to defeat something the vast majority of their constituents want. That's how our political system gets consumed by small things when we are a people called to do great things." [44670. 44675, 44684, 44685, 44694]

*The New York Times* strains credulity in another attempt to defend Obama for his statement that the use of chemical weapons in Syria crosses a "red line" by calling it only an "off-the-cuff" remark. (Author and columnist Ann Coulter responds, "It's very embarrassing. ...Oh, it's an off-the-cuff remark? This is more than just covering up. The media is now the Praetorian Guard to protect [Obama] from the dumb things he does, including this. And yeah, don't make the threat if you are not going to follow up. ...Not only has Obama allowed Iraq to disintegrate and that's a lot of the problem with Syria now, you have Iran trying to dominate Iraq and Syria to gang up together with Islamic lunatics. But we could have done something in Syria two years ago. This is what is so heartbreaking about Syria. When Assad first started slaughtering his people, the insurgents were just normal Syrians minding their own business, who were being murdered by this crazy dictator. If we had stepped in then we would have been aiding people who are not al-Qaeda, who are not Muslim Brotherhood. But, no, Obama goes out to get an ice cream and who steps in? Al-Qaeda. We also know that members of the administration went to great lengths to avoid calling the Benghazi episode a terrorist act." [44728]

I just go where the story leads. ...People can say what they want about me, I don't care. I just want to get the information out there." (It is worth noting that CBS News president David Rhodes is the brother of Obama advisor Ben Rhodes, who was involved in developing the Benghazi talking points.) According to Bloomberg.com, "[T]he White House has told all Cabinet members and senior officials to use commencement speeches to drive home for graduating college

students and their parents the benefits they gain from a provision of the law that allows young adults to stay on their family's insurance plans until they turn 26." [44764, 44765]

General Michael Hayden, former director of the National Security Agency and the Central Intelligence Agency, gives NewsmaxTV.com his opinion on the Obama administration's Benghazi narrative, "I've been in these kinds of circumstances where if you've got a worldview, if you've got a narrative that you believe in, you try to make the facts presented to you fit the narrative. I fear there may have been some people in our government who kind of fell into that trap in the days after Benghazi, which is understandable and, frankly, forgivable, and then in the weeks after Benghazi, which is not understandable and is not forgivable. Anyone like me who saw those events would quickly conclude it was a terrorist attack. It was fairly complex, synchronized, direct and indirect fire weapons on multiple locations, and it took place in a part of Libya that was the heartland of the Libyan Islamic fighting group. I mean, the immediate explanation that this was a bad movie review, that just beggared comprehension." [44746]

Three families of Navy SEAL Team VI special forces servicemen, along with one family of an Army National Guardsman hold a press conference to disclose information about how and why their sons along with 26 others died in a fatal helicopter crash in Afghanistan on August 6, 2011, just a few months after the raid on the compound of Osama Bin Laden. The families state, "The areas of inquiry at the press conference will include but not be limited to: 1. How ... Obama and Vice President Biden, having disclosed on May 4, 2011, that Navy Seal Team VI carried out the successful raid on Bin Laden's compound resulting in the master terrorist's death, put a retaliatory target on the backs of the fallen heroes. 2. How and why high-level military officials sent these Navy SEAL Team VI heroes into battle without special operations aviation and proper air support. 3. How and why the denial of requested pre-assault fire may have contributed to the shoot down of the Navy SEAL Team VI helicopter and the death of these special operations servicemen. 6. How Afghani forces accompanying the Navy SEAL Team VI servicemen on the helicopter were not properly vetted and how they possibly disclosed classified information to the Taliban about the mission, resulting in the shoot down of the helicopter. 7. How military brass, while prohibiting any mention of a Judeo-Christian God, invited a Muslim cleric to the funeral for the fallen Navy SEAL Team VI heroes who disparaged in Arabic the memory of these servicemen by damning them as infidels to Allah..." On *The O'Reilly Factor*, syndicated columnist Charles Krauthammer says, "This [Benghazi] story isn't going to explode; this is a drip, drip, drip. And what the drip, drip, drip is about is this: the administration tried to suppress the truth about what happened in Benghazi and did that consistent and deliberately while[Obama]—at the same time—tried to say that his only objective was to collect the facts and to share them as they

receive them with the American people. Every piece of evidence that we heard yesterday [in the congressional hearing] contradicted that. Now, this is not a hanging offense, it is not a jailing offense; it's not a break-in, it's not a burglary. It is an administration trying to cover up what was not a criminal act that could have been misjudgments, and there were. But there was a lot of human error. You can have some sympathy, they might have made the wrong judgment about a rescue, or not. You have to balance it left and right. So it was not that great of a crime. But they decided, in the middle of an election, where [Obama] had proclaimed 'al Qaeda was gone, we've conquered all of this. The War on Terror is over. I'm a big hero. Osama is slain. GM is alive and Osama is dead.' In the middle of a campaign where they're pushing this, they decided to maintain that line they would suppress the truth, they would demote a hero like [Gregory] Hicks. They would shout at him, they would threaten him, they would not allow him to meet with a Congressional delegation. All of these things, I think, are part of a cover-up." [44759]

On May 10 Obama's schedule includes only two tasks: receiving his daily briefing (10:45 a.m.) and giving a statement on ObamaCare (2:40 p.m.). [44803]

ABC's Jonathan Karl reports, "ABC News has obtained 12 different versions of the talking points that show they were extensively edited as they evolved from the drafts first written entirely by the CIA to the final version distributed to Congress and to U.S. Ambassador to the U.N. Susan Rice before she appeared on five talk shows the Sunday after that attack. White House emails reviewed by ABC News suggest the edits were made with extensive input from the State Department. The edits included requests from the State Department that references to the Al Qaeda-affiliated group Ansar al-Sharia be deleted as well references to CIA warnings about terrorist threats in Benghazi in the months preceding the attack. That would appear to directly contradict what White House Press Secretary Jay Carney said about the talking points in November. ...The significant edits—deleting references to al Qaeda and the CIA's warnings—came after a White House meeting on the Saturday before Ambassador Susan Rice appeared on five Sunday shows." The White House holds an "off the record" meeting on the Benghazi investigation with selected reporters. According to Politico, "The session was announced to reporters in the wake of an ABC News report showing that White House and State Dept. officials were involved in revising the now-discredited CIA talking points about the attack on Benghazi. Emails obtained by ABC News show that State Dept. spokesperson Victoria Nuland requested that the CIA scrub references to an Al Qaeda-linked group, which, Nuland told White House officials, 'could be abused by members [of Congress] to beat up the State Department for not paying attention to warnings." (In other words, the White House is attempting to get reporters to slant their stories so that they are less damaging to Obama and Hillary Clinton.) [44726, 44727, 44741, 44751]

In the *Washington Times*, Senator Rand Paul (R-KY) writes, "The secretary of state's responsibility is to protect our diplomats. [Hillary] Clinton should have been relieved of her post for denying pleas for additional security. ... My office is currently seeking out the witnesses and survivors of Benghazi to testify before the Senate Foreign Relations

Committee. To date, the Obama administration has refused to let them testify. Too many questions remain unanswered. Now, there are too many new questions. The evidence we had in January already suggested that Mrs. Clinton ignored repeated requests for more security in Benghazi. The new evidence we have today—and that continues to mount—suggests that at the very least, Mrs. Clinton should never hold high office again." [44731, 44732]

The mainstream media works to protect Obama and Hillary Clinton from the fallout from the Benghazi hearing. Dan Gainor writes at FoxNews.com: "NBC said there was an 'obvious political undercurrent' to the hearings and accused the GOP of going after the 'most popular Democrat,' Hillary Clinton. The New York Times public editor criticized her own paper's Benghazi coverage and The Washington Post's Twitter account inexplicably mocked those Tweeting about the case as 'Chick-fil-A lovers.' AP even called it a 'GOP' hearing, to make sure readers saw it as partisan. A Politico story about CBS showed the truly insidious nature of media bias on this story and how the network held back Emmy award-winning reporter Sharyl Attkisson. ... It hasn't just been CBS that has been trying to corral this story. New York Times coverage might still damage the administration even though that paper has tried to prevent it. ... The Washington Post's Dana Milbank treated the testimony as if witnesses were lying. His column called the sworn comments a 'yarn' and referred to our No. 2 diplomat in Libya as a 'virtuoso storyteller.' Milbank pushed the standard lefty response you can expect to see at least till November, 2016: 'Hicks didn't lay a glove on the former secretary of state Wednesday.' ... Other liberal sites went even further, ignoring the hearing and the testimony entirely. The Nation, Alternet and Democracy Now had no visible coverage. ... It doesn't really matter how they spin it, the news continues to get out. But if all major news outlets do is cover for the administration, they may well succeed in protecting their 2016 candidate." The Internal Revenue Service apologizes for targeting conservative groups during the 2012 election season and demanding that they provide additional information to justify their tax exempt status. According to the Associated Press, "IRS agents singled out dozens of organizations for additional reviews because they included the words 'tea party' or 'patriot' in their exemption applications, said Lois Lerner, who heads the IRS division that oversees tax-exempt groups. In some cases, groups were asked for lists of donors, which violates IRS policy in most cases, she said. ...Lerner said the practice was initiated by low-level workers in Cincinnati and was not motivated by political bias." (How singling out groups because they are tea party-related is not political is not explained. Tea Party leaders refuse to accept the IRS apology and call its actions a "disturbing, illegal and outrageous abuse of government power.") [44749, 44752, 44754, 44760, 44768]

Former Alaska Governor Sarah Palin comments on the IRS persecution of Tea Party groups: "Today we learned that our government targeted and harassed conservative Americans who simply wanted to be involved in the national discussion. Is it any wonder why Americans are so distrustful of D.C.? I'm sure ...Obama is grateful for all the help the IRS gave his reelection campaign, but, still, you have to wonder how the bureaucrats

who tried to pull this off can sleep at night. ... This IRS revelation is another step in the unraveling of the Obama administrations self-proclaimed 'hope and change.' Between the Benghazi cover-up and the IRS targeting Obama's political opponents, we see the corruption at the heart of big government. Americans should remember that this same corrupt IRS will be in charge of enforcing Obamacare. And this same inept and corrupt government will supposedly secure our now unsecured borders in advance of immigration reform and will implement a completely ethical and non-political IPAB panel to make life and death health care decisions for you and your family. Forgive me for not trusting these big government promises any more than I trust the White House's latest Benghazi spin or the IRS' fairness. Despite all of this, I still believe that this 'fundamental transformation of America' is temporary. This attempted transformation into a disheartened, weakened, unrecognizable nation is so far below anything Americans deserve. Congresswoman Michele Bachmann (R-MN) suggests that the timing of the IRS apology was intentional and meant to direct attention away from the Benghazi scandal. This is when they put their negative stories out. ...I was in that Benghazi hearing. I think the Obama administration is desperate to spin Benghazi, and they can't. I think they saved this [IRS] story up for a day like today so that conservatives would focus on this admission. [But] Conservatives can handle two shocking stories at the same time. Both are equally unconstitutional and call into question [Obama]." [44779, 44783]

HotAir.com lists some of the outrageous demands the IRS made of conservative political groups, including copies of direct and indirect communications with members of legislative bodies, information about members, resumes of past and present employees, lists of board members and officers and their relatives who have served any other organization, specific information about all rallies, events, and discussion groups the group has conducted, and a description of "any activities with the news media." The IRS also threatened the groups with revocation of their tax exempt status if the requested information was not received by a specific date. [44829]

DCClothesline.com reports, "Congresswoman and former United States Ambassador to Luxembourg Ann Wagner (R-MO) appeared on The Dana Loesch show and placed the blame, of the stand down order to those that could have offered assistance to Americans under attack, on none other than Barack Obama." [44753]

At NewYorker.com Alex Koppelman writes, "It's a cliché, of course, but it really is true: in Washington, every scandal has a crime and a coverup. The ongoing debate about the attack on the United States facility in Benghazi where four Americans were killed, and the Obama Administration's response to it, is no exception. For a long time, it seemed like the idea of a coverup was just a Republican obsession. But now there is something to it. On Friday, ABC News's Jonathan Karl revealed the details of the editing process for the C.I.A.'s talking points about the attack, including the edits themselves and some of the reasons a State Department spokeswoman gave for requesting those edits. It's striking to see the twelve different iterations that the talking points went through before they were released to Congress and to United Nations Ambassador Susan Rice, who used them in Sunday show appearances that became a central focus of Republicans' criticism of the Administration's public response to the attacks. Over the course of about twenty-four hours, the remarks evolved from something specific and fairly detailed into a bland, vague mush." [44761]

At BBC.co.uk Mark Mardell writes, "There's new evidence, obtained by ABC, that the Obama administration did deliberately purge references to 'terrorism' from accounts of the attack on the Benghazi diplomatic mission, which killed four people including the US ambassador to Libya. Conservatives have long maintained that the administration deliberately suppressed the truth about the attacks. This is the first hard evidence that the state department did ask for changes to the CIA's original assessment. Specifically, they wanted references to previous warnings deleted and this sentence removed: 'We do know that Islamic extremists with ties to al-Qa'ida participated in the attack.' There's little doubt in my mind that this will haunt Hillary Clinton if she decides to run for president, unless she executes some pretty fancy footwork. State Department spokesperson Victoria Nuland is directly implicated, and the fingerprints of senior White House aides Ben Rhodes and Jay Carney are there as well. …However you read the motives, the State Department and apparently the White House did get the CIA to change its story. This is now very serious, and I suspect heads will roll. The White House will be on the defensive for a while." [44762, 44763]

The House Ways and Means Subcommittee on Oversight demands that the Internal Revenue Service turn over all documents related to its handling of the tax exempt status of Tea Party and other conservative groups. [44770, 44781]

Former Chicago Bulls basketball player Dennis Rodman tells TMZ.com he plans to return to North Korea in an effort to persuade Kim Jong-Un to release American prisoner Kenneth Bae. Rodman says, "I'm gonna try and get the guy out. ...It's gonna be difficult. ...We got a black [man in the White House who] can't even go talk to [Jong-Un]. Obama can't do shit; I don't know why he won't go talk to him." [44785, 44786]

CNSNews.com reports, "The federal government spent more than \$2 billion to provide food stamps to Puerto Rico in 2012, up to 25 percent of which is untraceable because it is distributed in cash and there is 'no way to verify that funds are spent on food,' according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). The funds are used to supply more than one-third of the population of Puerto Rico with food stamps." (In 2009, \$165 million in Obama's "stimulus funds" was also given to Puerto Ricans for food stamps. How that created jobs in the United States is not known.) [44801]

On May 11, 2013 FoxNews.com reports, "House Speaker John Boehner [R-OH] is facing mounting pressure to create a special or select committee to investigate the Benghazi terror attacks in which four Americans were killed. The House resolution to form a special committee now has at least 139 co-sponsors who are putting Boehner in the difficult position of leading efforts to get the White House to release emails on Benghazi-gate but not agreeing to the demands of many rank-and-file Republicans." CNN reports, "Officials at the Internal Revenue Service knew in June 2011 that their agents were targeting conservative groups for additional scrutiny on tax documents, an inspector general report to be released this week is expected to say, according to a congressional source familiar with the inquiry. Further, an early timeline of events compiled by the inspector general and obtained by CNN indicates the agency's practice of singling out conservative groups began as early as March 2010, and in July of that year, unidentified managers within the agency 'requested its specialists to be on the lookout for tea party applications.' In August, specialists were warned to be on the lookout for 'various local organizations in the tea party movement' applying for tax-exempt status. The specific criteria would change several times over the next two years, according to a portion of the report." [44771]

It is worth noting that in February 2012 WeeklyStandard.com reported, "The Richmond Tea Party group is blasting the IRS for allegedly failing to grant tax exempt status to the pro-limited government organization. 'The Internal Revenue Service has served Richmond Tea Party (RTP) with unreasonable requests to obtain a tax-exempt status, fitting the pattern of the Federal Government's forcing liberty groups to spend inordinate time and money complying with their demands during this critical 2012 election year,' RTP claims in a press release." The RTP stated, "This illustrates everything the American people find unacceptable from their government. A simple request for tax-exempt status should not take years to complete, involve hundreds of pages of documentation, require hundreds of volunteer hours, and request private information we should never have to disclose. This grants the Federal Government the dangerous power to selectively stymie those voices with which they disagree, bogging them down in endless paperwork and compliance costs so that they are unable to spend time serving the principles they founded their organization to advance." (Among other unreasonable requests, the IRS demanded that the Richmond Tea Party provide a full list of donors and volunteers.) [29253, 29971, 44771]

At Time.com Joe Klein writes, "The Internal Revenue Service's targeting of conservative groups is outrageous. Those who did this should be fired immediately. That's obvious. ...Yet again, we have an example of Democrats simply not managing the government properly and with discipline. This is just poisonous at a time of skepticism about the efficacy of government. And [Obama] should know this: the absence of scandal is not the presence of competence. His unwillingness to concentrate—and I mean concentrate obsessively—on making sure that government is managed efficiently will be part of his legacy. Previous Presidents… have used the IRS against their enemies. But I don't think Obama ever wanted to be on the same page as Richard Nixon. In this specific case, he now is." [44780]

NationalReview.com reports, "Along with targeting tea-party groups, the IRS may also have given extra-special attention to the tax-exempt status of some Jewish groups for political reasons." (Politico later reports, "A leader of one of the organizations involved, Lori Lowenthal Marcus of Z Street, said Monday [May 13] that she was convinced the added attention her group got was no accident. 'I can't believe it was just about Z Street, because it's a tiny organization,' Lowenthal Marcus said of the group, which has been critical of …Obama for being too cozy with left-leaning Jewish groups like J Street and with pro-Palestinian entities. Z Street filed a lawsuit against the IRS in 2010 alleging that one of its attorneys were told its application for tax exemption was delayed and sent to a 'special unit… to determine whether the organization's activities contradict the Administration's public policies.") [44789, 44790, 44845]

At WashingtonPost.com Karen Tumulty and Philip Rucker wonder if Obama will "Suffer the 'second-term curse." They note that "...even some of Obama's allies worry privately that his difficulties may be made worse by his lack of deep relationships on Capitol Hill, notwithstanding his round of dinners with members lately. His congressional liaison, Miguel Rodriguez, came to the job virtually unknown by lawmakers. [Obama] himself has a tendency to hunker down with a tight circle of loyalists. 'I don't think he has adequate people questioning him on these things,' said one close Obama ally and Washington veteran." Ken Duberstein, White House chief of staff during Reagan's second term, observes, "The suggestions that Obama is in a deep ditch are probably premature. But when you get in a ditch, you need to stop digging. You need to put down the shovel." [44772]

At the Iowa GOP's annual Lincoln Dinner, Senator Rand Paul (R-KY) excoriates former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton over her handling of the Benghazi terrorist attack and the Obama administration's cover-up. Paul states, "First question to Hillary Clinton: Where in the hell were the Marines? ...It was inexcusable, it was a dereliction of duty, and it should preclude her from holding higher office." Judicial Watch announces that it has filed three Freedom of Information Act lawsuits related to the Benghazi terrorist attacks. One lawsuit seeks "all [State Department] videos and photographs" from Benghazi between September 10–13, 2012. Another seeks information regarding the security contract for the Benghzai facility, and a third lawsuit seeks "Any and all memoranda, assessments, analyses, and/or talking points regarding the September 11, 2012, attack on the U.S. Consulate in Benghazi, Libya and/or the killing of U.S. Ambassador J. Christopher Stevens produced by the Office of the Director of National Intelligence between September 11, 2012, and September 20, 2012. This request includes, but is not limited to, the 'speaking points' memorandum referred to by Senator Dianne Feinstein during a televised interview on October 17, 2012..." [44775, 44776]

The *New Hampshire Union Leader* writes, "Last week was stunningly bad for the Obama administration. Whistleblowers testified before Congress that the administration misled the American people about the terrorist attacks that killed four Americans in Benghazi on

the anniversary of the Sept. 11 attacks last year. Then the IRS admitted to having targeted right-leaning non-profit groups for additional scrutiny in 2012. Were this a Republican President, demands for hearings and investigations (if not impeachment) would be on the lips of not only the far-left activists, but mainstream Democrats and many in the media. How these scandals affect ...Obama will be a test of the value of the Democratic brand in deflecting well-deserved scrutiny. First, Benghazi. When the No. 2 diplomat in Libya tells Congress that a) the attackers in a fatal assault that killed a U.S. ambassador were known immediately to be terrorists, b) he told superiors that, and c) they told him to keep his mouth shut, this is the stuff of genuine scandal." "Next, The Weekly Standard and ABC News revealed that the Benghazi talking points drafted by the CIA were changed by State Department officials to remove every reference to terrorism. White House spokesman Jay Carney had said the revisions were merely cosmetic in nature. That was not true. They made it appear that terrorists had no role in a fatal attack on a U.S. diplomatic installation, when everyone involved already knew it was an act of terrorism. This was done less than two months before the election. Then the IRS apologized for harassing [sic], during an election year, non-profit groups that had 'tea party' or 'patriots' in their name. Lois Lerner, head of the IRS division that oversees non-profit groups, confirmed that the IRS had targeted these specific right-of-center organizations for extra scrutiny. She blamed the 'inappropriate' behavior on low-level staff members in Cleveland. So in the months before a presidential election, IRS officials sought to undermine citizens' groups that opposed [Obama's] policies, and the administration tried to prevent the American people from learning that terrorists had attacked us. How is this not cause for more investigation?" [44810]

On *Huckabee*, Pat Smith, the mother of Sean Smith, one of the Americans killed in Benghazi, states, "I want to wish Hillary [Clinton] a Happy Mother's Day. She has her child. I don't have mine because of her." [44777, 44788]

On May 12 Senator Susan Collins (R-ME) appears on State of the Union and addresses the Internal Revenue Service's attacks on Tea Party groups: "It is absolutely chilling that the IRS was singling out conservative groups for extra review and I think that it's very disappointing that [Obama] hasn't personally condemned this and spoken out. ... This is truly outrageous and it contributes to the profound mistrust that the American people have in government. [Obama] needs to make crystal clear that this is totally unacceptable in America. ... I just don't buy [the claim] that this was [done by] a couple of rogue IRS employees. After all, groups with 'progressive' in their names were not targeted similarly. If it had been just a small group of employees, then you would think that the high-level IRS supervisors would have rushed to make this public, fire[d] the employees involved and apologized to the American people and informed Congress." On Fox News Sunday, Congressman Mike Rogers (R-MI) says, "This is something we cannot let stand. It needs to have a full investigation. I don't care if you're a conservative, a liberal a Democrat or a Republican, this should send a chill up your spine. ... I don't know where it stops or who's involved. [The investigation] has to be external. It's clearly shown that they can't do it themselves. And I think Congress needs to have that oversight. ... We have had people come forward because of the [hearing] and say we would also like to

talk. I do think we're going to see more whistle-blowers. Certainly my committee has been contacted; I think other committees as well." On *Meet the Press*, Congressman Darrell Issa (R-CA) says, "This mea culpa [from the IRS] is not an honest one." [44781, 44782, 44793, 44798, 44802]

On *This Week*, George Will states, "A week ago [White House press secretary Jay] Carney—whose usefulness to this administration is diminishing rapidly—a week ago he said Benghazi was a long time ago as though it was the Punic Wars. ... We started out with three arguments. Was security lax in Benghazi? Demonstrably. Could forces have been got there to rescue them? Doubtful. Has the nation been systemically misled? Certainly. Now, we need a select committee in Congress because the State Department's misnamed accountability review board neglected to interview even the Secretary of State." With regard to the IRS scandal, Will says, "In response to a question at American Bar Association convention, a second-level IRS person said, 'Oh by the way, we did target these people [conservative groups].' The Tea Party people have known about this and were working on this. But they said—it was just some odd underlings out in Cincinnati who did this and there was no political motive whatever involved. Now the question is, how stupid do they [in the Obama administration] think we are? Just imagine... if the George W. Bush administration had an IRS underling, he's out in Cincinnati, of course, saying we're going to target groups with the word 'progressive' in their title. We'd have all Hell breaking loose." Will also notes that one of the impeachment charges against Richard M. Nixon was his discriminatory use of the IRS against political enemies. [44792, 44811, 44879]

Also on *This Week*, Jonathan Karl reports that then-CIA director David Petraeus found the final Obama administration talking points "useless," and stated, "I would just as soon not use them, but it's their [the White House's] call." (HotAir.com observes, "That would contradict the meme over the last few days that this was an intramural fight between State and CIA with the White House just serving as bystanders. The CIA Director called the 'demonstration' talking points useless *the day before Susan Rice went on five Sunday talk shows*, but the White House apparently disagreed. They, evidently, found the false narrative *very* useful." [44799]

On *Face the Nation* Thomas Pickering, who headed the "Accountability Review Board" that investigated the Benghazi situation, is asked why the board did not interview then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. Pickering responds, "The decisions were made and reviewed at the level that we fixed responsibility for failures of performance. ...We knew where the responsibility rested." (In other words, the board decided in advance that Clinton and Obama would not be assigned blame and was content to interview people who would be made the "fall guys." But the board's final report did not even go that far, and essentially held no one accountable.) CBS investigative correspondent Sharyl Attkisson says, "I'm still learning new things [about Benghazi]. ...I also wonder if a pattern is emerging, now that we've seen all mention of terrorism, Islamic extremists, al-Qaeda, [and] Ansar al-Sharia removed from the talking points. ...Is there a pattern of someone wanting to avoid the terrorism narrative in exchange for, basically, the 'YouTube spontaneous demonstration' narrative." In all, the government seized the records for more than 20 separate telephone lines assigned to AP and its journalists in April and May of 2012." 'There can be no possible justification for such an overbroad collection of the telephone communications of The Associated Press and its reporters. These records potentially reveal communications with confidential sources across all of the newsgathering activities undertaken by the AP during a two-month period, provide a road map to AP's newsgathering operations and disclose information about AP's activities and operations that the government has no conceivable right to know,' Pruitt said." (On May 3, 2012, while his Justice Department was surreptitiously obtaining AP phone records, Obama said, "On this World Press Freedom Day, the United States honors the role of a free press in creating sustainable democracies and prosperous societies. White House press secretary Jay Carney tells reporters, "Other than press reports, we have no knowledge of any attempt by the Justice Department to seek phone records of the AP. We are not involved in decisions made in connection with criminal investigations, as those matters are handled independently by the Justice Department. Any questions about an ongoing criminal investigation should be directed to the Department of Justice." [44824]

Obama addresses the IRS action, saying, "You don't want the IRS ever being perceived to be biased and anything less than neutral in terms of how they operate. Breitbart.com reports, "True the Vote, a Houston-based nonprofit which focuses on election integrity issues, was formed by Catherine Engelbrecht and her King Street Patriots Tea Party group. True the Vote applied to the IRS for their 501(c3) non-profit status in July 2010, and almost immediately their problems began. Within two years, multiple federal agencies, along with an EPA-affiliated Texas state agency, began auditing True the Vote and its founders, visiting their group, their businesses, and asking questions of people who knew them. The IRS was not the only governmental agency involved." Engelbrecht states, "We applied for nonprofit C-3 status early in 2010. Since that time the IRS has run us through a gauntlet of analysts and hundreds of questions over and over again. They've requested to see each and every tweet I've ever tweeted or Facebook post I've ever posted. They also asked to know every place I've ever spoken since our inception and to whom, and everywhere I intend to speak in the future." The IRS and OSHA audited an Engelbrecht family business and the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms demanded to see her family's firearms. According to Breitbart.com, "The Democratic Party of Texas filed a lawsuit against her, as did an ACORN affiliated group. Both the FBI and the BATF continued to poke around her life, the lives of people in her Tea Party group, and her businesses." Engelbrecht says, "This is what the beginning of tyranny looks like. My family and I have lived with great concern that we would be subject to even greater government abuses if we were vocal about what they were doing to us because of our political views and our efforts to increase governmental accountability. The Wall Street Journal reports, "Leaders in Congress are questioning Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius's solicitation of funds from private businesses and charities to help pay for public outreach on Obamacare to get prospective enrollees signed up for health exchanges. Sen. Lamar Alexander of Tennessee, ranking Republican on the Senate Health committee, told the New York Times he plans to ask the Government Accountability Office to check the legality of Sebelius's actions, done after Congress denied the administration funds for public outreach in the 2014 budget. The Washington Post also said that Utah Sen. Orrin Hatch, top Republican on the Finance Committee, questioned the legality of the action. The Times said Sebelius obtained \$10 million from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and \$500,000 from H&R Block for the effort. HHS officials said that Sebelius's efforts would continue, after first denying they were soliciting funds for the effort. But a spokesman for Sebelius said a section of the Public Health Service Act allows her to encourage others to support those working to help carry out public health activities. Sebelius reportedly has sought donations for Enroll America, a private non-profit group that is working to get the uninsured covered under the 2010 health-care law." (It is illegal for federal officials to solicit funds from any organization or business with whom they do business or regulate. Sebelius therefore violated federal law.) [44828, 45071]

Reuters reports, "The Obama administration is unlikely to make a decision on the Canada-to-Nebraska Keystone XL pipeline until late this year as it painstakingly weighs the project's impact on the environment and on energy security, a U.S. official and analysts said on Friday [May 10]. The decision may not be made until November, December or even early 2014, said a U.S. official, as ...Obama will not rush the process,

which still has a number of stages to work through. One of those stages has not even begun yet and will run for months." (The project has been pending for more than four years.) [44927, 44928]

According to the Treasury Department, the federal government collected \$406.7 billion in taxes in April 2012—the largest monthly amount since April 2008. (The total represents individual income taxes, corporate income taxes, excise taxes, Social Security and Medicare taxes, estate and gift taxes, customs duties, and other taxes.) PatDollard.com reports that 59 Congressmen have sent Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel a letter demanding to know why Pentagon officials met with anti-Christian extremist Michael Weinstein, who has called Christians "monsters who terrorize their fellow Americans" and faith-based family groups "die-hard enemies of the United States Constitution." Reuters reports, "Higher-level Internal Revenue Service officials took part in discussions as far back as August 2011 about targeting by lower-level tax agents of 'Tea Party' and other conservative groups, according to documents reviewed by Reuters on Monday. The documents show the offices of the IRS's chief counsel and deputy commissioner for services and enforcement communicated about the targeting with lower-level officials on August 4, 2011, and March 8, 2012, respectively. The two communications occurred weeks and months before Doug Shulman, then the commissioner of the IRS, told congressional panels in late March 2012 that no groups were being targeted for extra scrutiny by the tax agency." On C-SPAN, CBS reporter Sharyl Attkisson says, "That act [Freedom of Information Act] has now been used, instead of to facilitate the release of public information—which was its intention—it's now in my opinion been used to withhold and delay the release of public information. I get pretty much zero response. That didn't start under the Obama administration. He seems to have perfected it, he and the federal agencies. But this was true also under George Bush. Obama admitted that his theory—that after the 2012 election, the Republican 'fever' would break, and they'd decide to co-sign some of his agendawas wrong. 'My thinking was when we beat them in 2012 that might break the fever, and it's not quite broken yet,' Obama said, according to the White House pool report. This is because of a certain corpulent radio host. 'I genuinely believe there are Republicans out there who would like to work with us but they're fearful of their base and they're concerned about what Rush Limbaugh might say about them. And as a consequence we get the kind of gridlock that makes people cynical about government."" (Rush Limbaugh later comments, "[Obama] simply cannot get me off his mind. I live rent free in his head. And he is using me as his convenient excuse for not being able to get anything done. He really thinks the Republicans would work with him if it weren't for me. So he's telling these Hollywood people—and you gotta understand, they're sitting there and they're very sympathetic, and they love Obama, and they want Obama to succeed. I'm the guy who said, 'I hope he fails.' So Obama's sitting there and he's telling these Hollywood people, 'You know, this Limbaugh guy, this Limbaugh guy... If it weren't for this Limbaugh guy, Good Lord, look what I could get done!' ... Now, let's be honest, folks. Who am I? I'm a guy on the radio. I am your beloved host, El Rushbo. I'm a guy on the radio. The fact remains that the truth of the matter is, by his own admission, I am the opposition to Barack Obama.") [44796, 44814, 44822, 44875]

At the \$34,000-per-person fundraiser in the mansion of Hollywood producer Harvey Weinstein, Obama strangely comments, "More than anything, what I will be striving for over the next three and a half years is to see if that spirit we saw in Boston [after the terrorist bombing] and West Texas [after a deadly industrial explosion], to see if we can institutionalize that [and] if we can create a framework where everybody's working together and moving this country forward." (Obama apparently wants to "institutionalize" fear and use it to boost public support for his agenda.) [44821]

On May 14 Watergate reporter Carl Bernstein appears on *Morning Joe* and comments on the administration's access of Associated Press telephone records: "This is outrageous. It is totally inexcusable that this administration has been terrible on this subject from the beginning. The object of it is to intimidate people who talk to reporters. This was an accident waiting to become a nuclear event and now it's happening. There's no excuse for it whatsoever..." [44832]

Also appearing on *Morning Joe* is Associated Press executive editor Kathleen Carroll, who states, "We're distressed that the Justice Department felt the need to seize our [telephone] records and not tell us about it, and certainly distressed... that the scope of the inquiry was so huge. I've been in this business more than 30 years, and our First Amendment lawyers and our lawyers inside the AP, and our CEO is also a well-known First Amendment lawyer—none of us have ever seen anything like this." On *This Morning*, Congressman Darrell Issa (R-CA) discusses the administration's thuggish tactics at the IRS and comments, "How dare the administration imply that they're going to get to the bottom of it. This was the targeting of [Obama's] political enemies effectively and lies about it during the election year so that it wasn't discovered until afterwards. The fact is this is the kind of investigation that has to be open and transparent to the American people." [44830]

Jim Geraghty writes at NationalReview.com's *Morning Jolt*, "When there is evidence of scandalous or bizarre behavior on the part of a political figure, and no reasonable explanation is revealed within 24 to 48 hours, then the truth is probably as bad as everyone suspects. ... Geraghty continues, "The federal government made awful, unforgivable wrong decisions about the security for its people in Benghazi. They compounded the error by failing to put together even the beginning of a rescue mission during the seven-hour assault. Perhaps those responsible for making the call had a fear of a 'Black Hawk Down' scenario, in which the rescuers find themselves needing rescue, but whatever the reasoning, the net effect was the same: Our people were under fire, fighting for their lives, and nobody was coming to help. The decisions made that night make a mockery of the unofficial, but widespread motto of our armed forces: 'Nobody gets left behind.' The decisions made up until [that] point may or may not have involved [Obama] or then-secretary of state Clinton, but they sure as hell were involved in the decisions that came afterwards. The morning after the attack, the administration tried to offer the excuse that it was a completely unforeseeable event, randomly triggered by some YouTube video. And they sought to intimidate and punish anyone who would contradict their storyline."

"My friends in media, you know what is going on when you see ...Obama say this: 'The whole issue of talking points, frankly, throughout this process has been a sideshow. What we have been very clear about throughout was that immediately after this event happened we were not clear who exactly had carried it out, how it had occurred, what the motivations were.' The only evidence where monies were spent involves a compound, which housed Malik's 12 wives with a restaurant including a mosque with a madrassa. While building mosques is legally considered charity, evidence shows that the entire funding came directly from entities and individuals from Saudi Arabia, Qatar and Bahrain. There is nothing of charitable nature to show for all the funds Malik raises from the United States. To date, there is no

evidence for any accomplishments towards building homes for orphans, widows and AIDS victims in Kogelo or anywhere else in Kenya." Additionally, according to Shoebat.com, "[T]he relationship between ...Barack Obama's half-brother Malik Obama and Sudan's President Omar Al-Bashir is much closer than previously thought. Malik is the Executive Secretary of the Islamic Da'wa Organization (IDO) as reported by all major Saudi press, including Okaz. ...The IDO has been created by the Sudanese Government, which is considered by the U.S. State Department as a terrorist state. This places Malik Obama in bed with terrorists and working as an official with a terrorist state." 'There's no way in the world I'm going to defend that. Hell, I spent my youth vilifying the Nixon administration for doing the same thing. If they did that, there should be hell to pay,' U.S. Rep. Michael E. Capuano (D-Somerville) said about the IRS scandal. 'Not only is it bad government and bad to society, it is horrendous politics. The worst thing you can do is give your opponent an easy hammer with which to hit you." (It is, of course, not a matter of, "If they did that" because the IRS has admitted that it targeted conservative non-profit organizations.) "It doesn't seem to be a couple rogue employees. The Associated Press reports, "The Obama administration has never fined or prosecuted a wind farm for killing eagles and other protected bird species, shielding the industry from liability and helping keep the scope of the deaths secret, an Associated Press investigation has found. More than 573,000 birds are killed by the country's wind farms each year, including 83,000 hunting birds such as hawks, falcons and eagles, according to an estimate published in March in the peer-reviewed Wildlife Society Bulletin. Each death is federal crime, a charge that the Obama administration has used to prosecute oil companies when birds drown in their waste pits, and power companies when birds are electrocuted by their power lines. The men told police they were chemical engineers and recent college graduates. The Quabbin, in Belchertown, is one of the country's largest man-made public water supplies. Boston's drinking water comes from the Quabbin and the Wachusett Reservoirs. State Police say there were no warrants or advisories on any of the individuals and 'there was no evidence that the seven were committing any crime beyond the trespassing.'" [44910, 44911, 45025]

WND.com reports, "[T]he IRS also put an organization in its bull's-eye that wanted to do nothing more than share its pro-life message with churches. [and] said the IRS contacted him regarding his application for nonprofit status, and was told he didn't qualify. 'The representative was telling me I had to provide information on all aspects of abortion, I couldn't just educate the church from the pro-life perspective,' he said. 'Every time I pressed her on this issue and asked her to clarify her position, she would state that it wasn't what she was saying, and then, she would repeat it almost the same way. ... She did get nervous though in the end when I pressed her that I wanted specific information about why I had to educate from a pro-abortion perspective not just pro-life. I explained to her that the Pro-Life Action League even has pro-life in their title and they certainly don't teach pro-abortion topics and they are still 501(c)(3). I also told her that Planned Parenthood does not teach about pro-life issues yet they are also still a 501(c)(3)." (The IRS also denied tax-exempt status to "Coalition for Life of Iowa" and told its leaders that the status would be granted only if the group agreed never to protest or picket in front of Planned Parenthood facilities.) Attorney General Eric Holder, asked about the Justice Department's secret monitoring of telephone records of Associated Press reporters, says, "I'm not sure how many of those cases... I have actually signed off on. I take them very seriously. I know that I have refused to sign a few [and] pushed a few back for modifications." [44816, 44874]

CNN's Jessica Yellin asks White House press secretary Jay Carney, "You have to understand and hear how it sounds like the administration might be hiding something. Can you just say plainly, does [Obama] believe [the IRS] is being truthful and does he think that the leadership there needs to change?" On Special Report, Charles Krauthammer comments, "...It's clear that that the press has turned [on Obama]. I have to assume, I say I would probably [be] 95 percent, 99 percent certain the deputy attorney general acting in my stead was the one who authorizes the subpoena [of the telephone records]." "I'm not sure [when I recused myself], I think it was towards the beginning of the matter. I don't know exactly when but it was towards the beginning of the matter." Asked why the Justice Department did not inform the Associated Press it was reviewing its telephone records, as required by law, Holder responds, "I do not know why that was or was not done. I simply don't have a factual basis to answer that question." Asked why his department did not ask the AP for cooperation in gathering documentation it needed, Holder says, "I don't know what happened there. I was recused from the case." To various questions Holder responds, "I don't have a factual basis to answer the questions that you have asked, because I was recused." "I don't know. I don't know." "I would not want to reveal what I know." "I don't know why that didn't happen." "I know nothing, so

I'm not in a position really to answer." (Dana Milbank writes at WashiongtonPost.com, "Holder seemed to regard this ignorance as a shield protecting him and the Justice Department from all criticism of the Obama administration's assault on press freedoms. But his claim that his 'recusal' from the case exempted him from all discussion of the matter didn't fly with Republicans or Democrats on the committee, who justifiably saw his recusal as more of an abdication.") Congressman James Sensenbrenner (R-WI) tells Holder, "Mr. Attorney General, I think that this committee has been frustrated for at least the last two and a half years—if not the last four and a half years—that there doesn't seem to be any acceptance of responsibility in the Justice Department for things that have gone wrong. DailyCaller.com reports, "IRS managers delayed approval of tea party requests for routine tax exemptions by assigning all of them to a single employee in Cincinnati for

special review, according to footnote 14 of the blockbuster Inspector General report. The single employee was the only person working on the reviews for at least 18 months. ...[T]he bottleneck ensured that many tea party groups' requests were extensively delayed, hindering their political activity and curbing their fundraising throughout 2010, 2011 and 2012." TheBlaze.com reports, "In the midst of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) scandal, individuals and groups, alike, are continuing to come forward with ever-startling allegations. On Wednesday, Dr. Anne Hendershott, a devout Catholic and a noted sociologist, professor and author, exclusively told TheBlaze that she believes she may have been one of the IRS's targets. A special prosecutor, though nominally working for the attorney general, would have the kind of independence needed to really go down all the pathways that are going to emerge as corruption at the IRS—and perhaps elsewhere in the administration—is uncovered. The emails, ranging from Sept. 14 to Sept. 15, indicated that CIA Deputy Director Mike Morell requested that references to Al Qaeda, an Al Qaeda linked terrorist group operating in Eastern Libya, and prior terrorist attacks in the area be scrubbed from public talking points-hours before State Department spokeswoman Victoria Nuland made a similar request, as previously reported. But the documents also include a significant discrepancy in the process for drafting the document between the office of United Nations Ambassador Susan Rice and Morell, according to senior administration officials." The terrorist attack took place on September 11, 2012. *Therefore, emails from the first two days were not included in the "complete set.*" The first email released by the administration occurred 67 hours after the attack began. (If Richard Nixon was forced to resign partly over 18 missing minutes of White House recordings, Obama should arguably be held accountable for 67 hours of withheld emails.) WashintonTimes.com reports, "Under growing pressure, the White House on Wednesday released emails that showed the talking points crafted to explain the deadly terrorist attack in Benghazi last year were changed at the behest of a State Department worried about political fallout. The 100-page cache of email printouts shows that during the editing process references to the fact that U.S. intelligence agencies believed al Qaeda-linked extremists may have been involved in the attack were removed, as were references that the CIA had received general warnings about the worsening security situation in Benghazi, Libya's second-largest city. The talking points were originally drafted by the CIA, but the references to terrorist groups and the security situation were stripped after 'deep concerns' were raised by the 'leadership' at the State Department, the emails show. It wasn't only the State Department, though. The emails show that several changes were made at the behest of White House officials, including John O. Brennan, Mr. Obama's top counterterrorism adviser at the time who is now director of the CIA. That contradicts repeated statements by White House press secretary Jay Carney." [44902]

Obama announces that Treasury Secretary Jack Lew requested and accepted the resignation of Steven Miller, the acting director of the IRS. (Miller had planned to leave in June anyway. His resignation is next to meaningless.) Under Miller, during a 27-month period starting in February 2010, the IRS did not approve any applications for tax-exempt status from conservative or Tea Party groups, even though it approved many from leftist and "progressive" groups. Yahoo News reports that after Drew Ryun ran into more than eight months of obstacles trying to obtain tax-exempt status for Media Trackers, a "non-partisan investigative watchdog dedicated to promoting accountability in the media and government," he resubmitted the application and referenced its connections to the liberal-sounding "Greenhouse Solutions." Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) tells Newsmax.TV the IRS not only cannot be trusted to implement ObamaCare, "I don't think we ought to have ObamaCare. And, certainly, the IRS part of administering ObamaCare, particularly in the wake of this IRS scandal with regard to suppressing the views of Americans who were critical of the IRS, raises further suspicions about their involvement in the administration of ObamaCare." (There are 47 provisions of the ObamaCare legislation that involve the IRS.) "We'll find out the answers to all these questions [about the IRS targeting scandal]. The *Daily Mail* reports, "Letters from the IRS to tea party-related organizations in Oklahoma City and Albuquerque, New Mexico show that IRS headquarters in

Washington, D.C., and two satellite offices in California, were directly involved with sending harassing letters to conservative organizations that sought tax-exempt status. The IRS has acknowledged only the involvement of its Exempt Organizations office in Cincinnati, Ohio, which typically makes most decisions about granting or denying tax-exempt status to non-profit organizations." On the floor of the U.S. Senate, Senator Marco Rubio (R-FL) says, "So in the span of four days, [there were] three major revelations about the use of government power to intimidate those who are doing things that the government doesn't like. The Federal Direct Student Loan Program already has built-in debt forgiveness plans for people who end up earning low incomes or for those who entered lines of work preferred by the government. Charles Krauthammer observes that Obama's announcement of the resignation of IRS head Steven T. Miller "was a holding operation. That was the absolute minimum he could have done. He relieves one person. He obviously had to. He had to relieve at least one person. And he chose, of course, the acting commissioner. But, I would have expected more. The other actions he announced are up to now meaningless. Obama and this administration have said a hundred times they're going to hold x, y, z accountable for all kinds of behavior—in Benghazi, regarding a lot of other scandals. He even speaks about you know, Syrian generals will be held accountable. It means nothing. ...And then he says there will be an investigation from the Treasury. Well, that just means the left hand of the government investigating the right hand. But Ingram has since left that part of the IRS and is now the director of the IRS' Affordable Care Act office, the IRS confirmed to ABC News today." (Townhall.com's Guy Benson comments, "If you're waiting for a rim shot, give it up. Smell the reality, friends. And In case you were curious, yes of course Ms. Ingram raked in more than \$100,000 in taxpayer-funded bonuses as she oversaw her office's... abusive targeting scheme Now she's off to bigger and better things; namely, *monitoring and enforcing your healthcare arrangements.*" According to WashingtonExaminer.com, "Ingram received a \$7,000 bonus in 2009... then a \$34,440 bonus in 2010, \$35,400 in 2011 and \$26,550 last year, for a total of \$103,390. DailyCaller.com reports, "IRS Exempt Organizations Division director Lois G. Lerner, who has been described as 'apolitical' in mainstream press coverage of the IRS scandal, is married to tax attorney Michael R. Miles, a partner at the law firm Sutherland Asbill & Brennan. The firm is based in Atlanta but has a number of offices including in Washington, D.C., where Miles works. The 400-attorney firm hosted an organizing meeting at its Atlanta office for people interested in helping with voter registration for the Obama re-election campaign." (Lerner cancels her plans to deliver a May 18 commencement address at Western New England University Law School. She was to have been given an award for outstanding public service—which may or may not include discriminatory IRS treatment of conservative groups.) [44912, 44913]

CNN's Jake Tapper reports, "The U.S. Marshals Service lost two former participants in the federal Witness Security Program 'identified as known or suspected terrorists,' according to the public summary of an interim Justice Department Inspector General's report obtained by CNN. The Marshals Service has concluded that 'one individual was and the other individual was believed to be residing outside of the United States,' according to the summary.' [44930]

Politico reports, "A second appeals court has joined the D.C. Did anyone at the White House know what the IRS was doing?" (The IRS question comes during a press conference with Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogen. The event is held outside at the White House, and Obama calls for U.S. Marines to hold umbrellas for them—a direct violation of military rules, which prohibit male Marines from carrying umbrellas. Sarah Palin Tweets, "Mr. [Obama], when it rains it pours, but most Americans hold their own umbrellas...") [44936, 44940, 44950, 44955, 44965, 44968, 44982, 44996, 45162]

During the press conference Obama asks Congress to provide more money for embassy security. Obama states, "I've directed the Defense Department to ensure that our military can respond lightning quick in times of crisis. But we're not going to be able to do this alone. We're going to need Congress as a partner." Obama dodges questions, blames Congress for the Benghazi "incident," refuses to apologize for the Justice Department's secret seizure of Associated Press telephone records, and "knows nothing" about IRS abuses beyond what he has read in the press. Obama says, "And I also appreciate the advice [Erdogen] he gives me, because he has two daughters that are a little older than mine—they've turned out very well, so I'm always interested in his perspective on raising girls." (Obama is closer to the Jew-hating Erdogen than any other foreign leader. Whether Obama agrees with him on the issues of Muslim honor killings, female genital mutilation, forced marriages, and child marriages is not known.) [44951, 44955]

Obama tells reporters "I have complete confidence in Eric ["I don't know"] Holder as Attorney General. He's an outstanding attorney general and he does his job with integrity. I expect he will continue to do so." [44958]

The House of Representatives votes 229–195 to repeal ObamaCare. House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) calls the vote "a clear waste of time." (The Senate, of course, will not vote to repeal the legislation, and even if it did Obama would veto the repeal bill.) [44954]

Senator Rand Paul; (R-KY) introduces a resolution condemning the IRS for its targeting of Tea Party and other conservative organizations. Senate Democrats block the resolution. Paul states, "This resolution is not about Republican versus Democrat or conservative versus liberal. It is about arrogant and unrestrained government versus the rule of law. The First Amendment cannot and should not be renegotiated depending on which party holds power. Each senator took an oath to uphold and defend the

The Biblical Recorder, published by the North Carolina Baptist State Convention, said it was singled out by the agency in March, Fox News reports. Last summer, the Recorder gained national attention after Allan Blume, its editor, published an interview with Chick-fil-A President Dan Cathy. In the interview, Cathy said that he was 'guilty as charged' in his support of traditional family values. The Recorder also published ads from the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association—which also was targeted by the IRS—that backed North Carolina's marriage amendment. The newspaper then received a telephone call from the IRS, Fox reports. 'It raised some red flags and made me wonder why we were being targeted for an audit when we have been around since 1833 and have never been audited before,' Blume told Fox News. FreedomWorks.org reports, "The National Treasury Employees Union, NTEU, which represents the IRS employees who harassed and delayed tea party and conservative

groups, has come out against the proposal to put federal workers into exchange-based health insurance. FreeBeacon.com reports, "The 1851 Center for Constitutional Law, a conservative nonprofit group, filed a FOIA [Freedom of Information Act] request in 2010 through investigative journalist Lynn K. McCarthy writes at NationalReview.com, "...I am puzzled why so little attention has been paid to the Obama-Clinton phone call at 10 p.m. on the night of September 11. But you weren't born then I would guess, but I have to tell you that is exactly the approach that the Nixon administration took. They said, 'These are all second-rate things. After Pfeiffer goes through his talking points, Schieffer responds, "But Mr. Pfeiffer, and I don't mean to be argumentative here, but [Obama] is in charge of the executive branch of the government. She was asked repeatedly to provide security in Benghazi on several occasions, including direct cables, and she says she never read the cables on security. I find that inexcusable and a dereliction of duty. Whether it has political overtones or not, it really goes to the heart of who you are as secretary of state if you do not provide security for an embassy that's begging for it. That's absolutely a dereliction of duty, and she should have resigned and accepted blame for it." (Some may suspect that Paul expects to run against Clinton for president in 2016 and will therefore continue to excoriate her every chance he gets. Meanwhile, The Washington Post reports, "Howard Wolfson, the 2008 communications director for Hillary Rodham Clinton, has said he will not return for a 2016 presidential campaign. Neither, for that matter, will Neera Tanden, the campaign's policy director. Ditto for Mark Penn, the chief strategist, and Patti Solis Doyle, the embattled campaign manager.") [45041, 45046]

Newsmax.com reports, "A new poll found that Americans by a large margin believe that Congress is not overreacting to the burgeoning scandals plaguing the Obama administration. Two House committees have begun investigating the solicitations. Five senior Republicans from the Senate and the House have asked the comptroller general of the United States, Gene L. Dodaro, to investigate the actions of Ms. Sebelius to determine if she was improperly circumventing spending limits imposed by Congress. ... Reports emerged this month that Ms. Sebelius had urged business executives and nonprofit groups to assist Enroll America, a private nonprofit organization that will encourage millions of Americans to sign up for insurance this fall. Enroll America is led by veterans of the Obama White House and Mr. Obama's presidential campaigns and will use campaign-style techniques to locate the uninsured. A federal health official said potential donors had become 'gunshy' because of the onslaught of Republican criticism of the administration's fund-raising practices. According to the White House Visitors Log... the president of the anti-Tea Party National Treasury Employees Union, Colleen Kelley, visited the White House at 12:30 pm that Wednesday noon time of March 31st. ...The very next day after her White House meeting with [Obama], according to the Treasury Department's Inspector General's Report, IRS employees—the same employees who belong to the NTEU—set to work in earnest targeting the Tea Party and conservative groups around America. ...In short: the very day after the president of the quite publicly anti-Tea Party labor union—the union for IRS employees—met with ...Obama, the manager of the IRS 'Determinations Unit Program agreed' to open a 'Sensitive Case report on the Tea Party cases.' But Tea Party Patriots head Jenny Beth Martin [said] she received requests to protest across the country. A call to action on the group's web site tells supporters that 'the IRS is out of control' and so it is 'calling for anyone and everyone to protest the IRS' complete abuse of power' on Tuesday at noon. The site helpfully includes a map of local IRS offices for protesters, as well as sample protest signs (such as 'Abolish the IRS') and a form for those who believe they were inappropriately reviewed by the IRS to fill out and get help." The statement gave few details regarding the deaths of Special Agents Christopher Lorek and Stephen Shaw, other than to say the helicopter encountered unspecified difficulties and the agents fell a 'significant distance.'" According to DCClothesline.com, the "FBI agents killed in copter crash were investigating Boston [Marathon] Bombing." [45250, 45251]

According to a CNN/ORC poll, 37 percent of those surveyed have a favorable opinion of the Tea Party—up from 28 percent in March. [45059]

Senate Democrats block several Republicans amendments to the illegal immigrant amnesty legislation that, according to DailyCaller.com, "would have improved current enforcement measures, curbed financial aid to illegal immigrants and excluded many criminals from the proposed amnesty." [45066]

DailyCaller.com reports, "The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) demanded information about conservative groups' college-aged interns, prompting outrage from one of the country's top conservative activist organizations and leading one former intern to wonder whether his family's pizza parlor would be endangered. The IRS requested, in an audit, the names of the conservative Leadership Institute's 2008 interns, as well as specific information about their internship work and where the interns were employed in 2012, according to a document request the IRS sent to the Leadership Institute, dated February 14, 2012." WashingtonTimes.com reports, "The man who led the Internal Revenue Service when it was inappropriately scrutinizing conservative groups' applications for tax-exempt status said Tuesday that he intentionally kept himself in the dark about those kinds of decisions because he thought, as a political appointee, he should keep his distance. Douglas H. Shulman, who was commissioner from 2008 to 2012, told the Senate Finance Committee that he didn't learn details of the agency's political targeting until the inspector general released a blockbuster report last week. Mr. Shulman becomes the second IRS official to testify in the burgeoning scandal, which has the agency reeling and has the White House trying to explain how much it knew." (In early 2009 Shulman appeared at an event with Congressman Charles Rangel and said, "He's one of the leaders in this country on tax policy issues. I work closely with him every day, and I'm honored to be on this stage with him." For failing to pay income taxes on rental property for 17 years, Rangel was forced to leave his post as chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee. He was not prosecuted.) [45102, 45520]

ABCNews.com reports, "The first groups that claim they were unfairly scrutinized by the Internal Revenue Service have filed suit against the agency in federal courts, seeking damages and the granting of their long-delayed tax-exempt status application. True the Vote, a Houston-based voter watchdog group, filed a complaint in federal court in Washington, D.C., today over what it is calling 'unlawful actions by the IRS in the

processing of its application for exempt status.' The group was founded in June of 2010 and is affiliated with the King Street Patriots, a Tea Party group started in December of 2009. The group says it has been waiting three years for its tax exempt status to either be granted or denied, first applying in July of 2010. During that time, the group's president Catherine Engelbrecht told ABC News she has been personally audited and even visited by agents from the Bureau of the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms. The group wants the IRS Review Policy declared unconstitutional under the First Amendment and it is asking the court to 'permanently enjoin the IRS from further implementing and applying the IRS Review Policy and any other similar policies.' Damages sought include the awarding of \$1,000 for 'each unauthorized inspection of its return information.''' (Among the many outrageous demands of Engelbrecht made by the IRS was that she provide every Facebook and Twitter post she had ever written.) The NorCal Tea Party has also filed a lawsuit against the IRS. [45094, 45095]

According to Breitbart.com, "The US Attorney for the District of Columbia, Ronald C. Machen—the man responsible for the aggressive surveillance and phone record scrutiny at Fox News—is also a big donor to the Obama Campaigns." [45106]

Ben Stein writes at Spectator.org, "[I]f you criticize Mr. Obama, you are a racist. Thus, *quod erat demonstrandum*, Mr. Obama cannot be criticized. (Congressman Trey Gowdy (R-SC) points out that a witness cannot provide a statement and also refuse to answer questions. He states, "She just waived her Fifth Amendment right to privilege; you don't get to tell your side of the story then not be subjected to cross examination. That's not the way it works. She waived her right to Fifth Amendment privilege by issuing an opening statement. She ought to stand here and answer our questions." Despite her trying to have it both ways, the committee fails to force Lerner to testify or hold her in contempt of Congress.) It is worth noting that Lerner previously headed the Federal Elections Commission's Enforcement Office, where she allegedly harassed conservative groups such as the Christian Coalition-going so far as to demand that Lieutenant Colonel Oliver North explain the content of prayers he shared with evangelist Pat Robertson. While at the FEC Lerner did nothing about the millions of dollars in illegal foreign campaign contributions collected by Obama and reported in the early summer of 2008 by AtlasShrugs.com. Lois Lerner, Head of Exempt Organization...says she will invoke her 5th amendment right to not incriminate herself when called before Congress on Wednesday [May 22]. Holly Paz, Director of Exempt Organizations, subpoenaed to Washington to be interviewed by members of Congress. All of this IRS leadership, in Washington D.C. Then one level down is Cindy Thomas, the highest ranking employee in Cincinnati in this Tax Exempt and Government Entities Department that no one in Congress is talking to... yet." (Amazingly, Paz—an Obama campaign donor—reportedly sat in on 36 of 41 interviews with IRS employees conducted by the Inspector General. KMOV announces it has fired reporter Larry Conners for expressing his personal political opinions on one of the station's Facebook pages. KMOV president Mark Pimental states, "Larry's departure has nothing to do with the particular position he took, but it does have to do with our belief that his actions made it impossible for him to report for KMOV on certain political matters going forward without at least an appearance of bias. Bringing you accurate and unbiased reporting is the reason we exist." According to TheBlaze.com, "Conners recently claimed that the IRS started "hammering" him shortly after his tough [April 2012] interview with Obama. Here are some excerpts of the Facebook message he posted earlier this month: 'I don't accept "conspiracy theories", but I do know that almost immediately after the interview, the IRS started hammering me.' Fewer of our troops are in harm's way, and over the next 19 months they will continue to come home. Our alliances are strong, and so is our standing in the world. In sum, we are safer because of our efforts." (Arguably, the nation is not more secure, and that there have been no "large-scale attacks" in the United States hardly matters to the victims of the many "small-scale attacks"—such as the Boston Marathon bombing.") On ABC's *This Week*, Dennis Blair, Obama's former Director of National Intelligence, says that information leak investigations "have been directed, the ones that I knew about, mostly against the U.S. government employees who were talking with reporters—which is where I think they should be directed. At the end of the day this is the most tone-deaf [commander in chief] I ever could imagine, making such a speech at a time when our homeland is trying to be attacked [sic] literally every day. Changing the standards of when you can go after someone with a drone; it has to be a continuing imminent threat to the American people with no chance of civilian casualties, virtually no chance of civilian casualties. I think we are diminishing our national security infrastructure. Sequestration is dismantling the military when we need it most. I have never been more worried about the national security than right now. The speech did not help." (Of course, if the terrorists understand that the Obama administration policy is to rule out a drone attack whenever there is a risk of civilian casualties they will respond by surrounding themselves with civilians.) Sequestration spending cuts notwithstanding, according to WashingtonTimes.com, since "...March 4, the government has posted openings for 4,300 federal job titles to hire some 10,300 people. The median position has a salary topping out at \$76,000, and one-fourth of positions pay \$113,000 or more, according to an analysis by The Washington Times of federal job listings. Altogether, the jobs will pay up to \$792 million per year. Including job postings that have been open since before sequestration, the government is in the market for 27,000 employees who will make up to \$1.8 billion a year. ...The jobs posted since sequestration include 10,195 positions at the Department of Agriculture, 2,800 at the Department of Veterans Affairs and 1,611 the Department of Health and Human Services. ...Nearly 200 positions related to Army-run bowling alleys are also open. One position in Hawaii pays up to \$110,000—plus a 12 percent cost-of-living adjustment—to oversee such recreation facilities." [45378]

In London, police arrest a 10th suspect in connection with the beheading of a British solider in Woolwich. Breitbart.com reports, "The latest arrest came as around 1,000 supporters of a far-right group marched through central London protesting the killing, clashing with a smaller group of anti-fascist demonstrators. Police have already taken

nine other suspects into custody, including the two main ones who were shot and wounded by officers at the scene of Wednesday's [May 22] killing. Michael Adebolajo, 28, and Michael Adebowale, 22, remain under armed guard in separate London hospitals. Four other men remain in custody at a London police station. ...Kenyan officials have confirmed that Adebolajo was arrested in Kenya in 2010 with five others near the country's border with Somalia. Police believed Adebolajo was going to work with Somali militant group al-Shabab." (AtlasShrugs.com's Pamela Geller comments, "It does appear that the Brits might be taking this murderous ideology seriously. Once again the 'lone wolf' meme is blown to smithereens. Lone-wolf jihad is an oxymoron. All jihadists are part of the ummah (worldwide Muslim community). All jihadists wage holy war in the cause of Islam. All jihadists use the same playbook (the Quran). At HotAir.com Erika Johnsen writes, "...Obama's lecture commencement speech to the Naval Academy graduates on Friday [May 24] left behind such a poor and lingering aftertaste, I thought [the] commencement speech from Sen. According to NBCNews.com, "Additional scrutiny of conservative organizations' activities by the IRS did not solely originate in the agency's Cincinnati office, with requests for information coming from other offices and often bearing the signatures of higher-ups at the agency, according to attorneys representing some of the targeted groups. At least one letter requesting information about one of the groups bears the signature of Lois Lerner, the suspended director of the IRS Exempt Organizations department in Washington. Sekulow states, "We've dealt with 15 agents, including tax law specialists—that's lawyers—from four different offices, including [the] Treasury (Department) in Washington, D.C. So the idea that this is a couple of rogue agents in Cincinnati is not correct." [45249]

GovtSlavesInfo.com reports, "A former insider at the World Bank, ex-Senior Counsel Karen Hudes, says the global financial system is dominated by a small group of corrupt, power-hungry figures centered around the privately owned U.S. Federal Reserve. The network has seized control of the media to cover up its crimes, too, she explained. In an interview with The New American, Hudes said that when she tried to blow the whistle on multiple problems at the World Bank, she was fired for her efforts. Putin may be helping Assad not so much for the sake of helping Assad, but to prevent the Muslim brotherhood from expanding its reach even further. Dealing with a brutal dictator like Assad may be far more palatable to resisting millions of radical Islamists Hell-bent on establishing a world caliphate and overthrowing every government standing in its way.) TheDailyBeast.com reports, "The White House has asked the Pentagon to draw up plans for a no-fly zone inside Syria that would be enforced by the U.S. and other countries such as France and Great Britain, two administration officials told The Daily Beast." [45271]

McCormack writes that Goolsbee made his statements "at the same time that top Democrats, including ...Obama himself, were demonizing Charles and David Koch, the owners of Koch Industries, for giving money to Tea Party groups. Goolsbee's remark led to a federal investigation, the results of which have never been released. ...[I]n light of the recent IRS scandals—involving not just the targeting of conservative groups for extra scrutiny but also the sharing of confidential tax information—the administration doesn't exactly deserve the benefit of the doubt." The Republican Insider continues, "Now please do not take this information as 100% certainty that Attorney General Holder's position at the DOJ will not survive this current challenge. Michelle Obama attends a fundraiser in Massachusetts. According to NYTimes.com, "rich donors... paid up to \$37,600 per ticket at the Taj Boston Hotel" for a lunch of "roasted Chilean sea bass with a fricassee of asparagus." [45293]

DailyCaller.com reports, "Publicly released records show that embattled former IRS Commissioner Douglas Shulman visited the White House at least 157 times during the Obama administration, more recorded visits than even the most trusted members of [Obama's] Cabinet." (Mark Everson, Shulman's predecessor at the IRS, visited the White House only once during four years in the Bush administration.) Political strategist and former Clinton advisor Dick Morris later comments, "The incredible frequency of the White House visits—essentially weekly—indicate that Obama must have been deeply involved with the inner workings of the audits and harassment of conservative groups. Last week Investor's Business Daily highlighted the fact that Gibson CEO Henry Juszkiewicz has contributed to Republican politicians, including Blackburn. It further noted that the CEO of C.F. Martin & Co—one of Gibson's competitors, which has used the same type of Indian wood with impunity—is a long-time Democratic donor.") Katie Pavlich reports at Townhall.com, "Last night, [Attorney General Eric] Holder offered to meet with reporters off the record to discuss the balance between national security and the First Amendment. In response, Holder received a thanks but no thanks from nearly every media outlet that was invited." Associated Press media relations manager Erin Madigan White states, "If it is not on the record, AP will not attend and instead will offer our views on how the regulations should be updated in an open letter." New York Times executive editor Jill Abramson states, "It isn't appropriate for us to attend an off-the-record meeting with the attorney general." Huffington Post Washington bureau chief Ryan Grim says, "A conversation specifically about the freedom of the press should be an open one. We have a responsibility not to betray that." Pavlich quips, "It seems that if Holder really wants to know how reporters feel about leaks and how DOJ handles them, he could just read reporters' emails and listen to their phone calls." (Politico's editor in chief and *The Washington Post's* executive editor—apparently eager for off-the-record advice on how to slant the news in the Obama administration's favor will reportedly attend Holder's meeting.) On Dennis Miller's radio program, columnist Charles Krauthammer comments, "It is amazing, and there are two parts to that [lowered expectations for the U.S. economy]. The first is, 'You didn't build it.' This is the ideology of, you know, 'I built the roads, I gave you your grade school.' In a Quinnipiac poll released May 1, he received a 48 percent jobapproval rating, with 45 percent disapproving. Former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton's favorability rating has fallen from 61 percent in February 2013 to 52 percent, with 48 percent blaming her at least in part for the death of U.S. ambassador to Libya Christopher Stevens. 'This is an educational effort with civil rights laws as they play into freedom of religion and exercising freedom of religion,' Killian says in the local news story. 'This is also to inform the public what federal laws are in effect and what the consequences are.'" (At AtlasShrugs.com Pamela Geller responds, "How is this any different than Islamic law in, say, Turkey (Obama's favorite and most trusted ally)? In October, 43-year-old Fazil Say went on trial in Turkey for 'denigrating' Islam for a series of tweets earlier that year. Amid this backdrop of disappointing news, on Friday, Politico trumpeted that the 'rising economy' would alter the 2014 midterm elections. While littered with caveats, the feature article predicts a newly robust economy will lift Democrat fortunes next year. ... [But] Earnings are flat and the job market is weak. Record numbers of Americans are unemployed or out of the workforce, on food stamps or earning disability payments. American households have only recovered 45% of the \$16 trillion in wealth lost during the recession. In a few months, the individual and employer health care mandates of ObamaCare take effect. While their precise impact is arguable, it is unlikely to lead to a boost of hiring activity. Most economists are revising downward their forecasts for 2nd Quarter GDP growth to 1.5–2%. [Politico's] article is an admirable piece of political spin.
