The Obama Timeline - Part II

The Doomed Presidency

May 2014

On May 1 former CNBC talk show host Donny Deutsch appears on MSNBC's *Morning Joe* and ridicules the notion that Obama advisor Ben Rhodes' Benghazi talking points email is meaningful. He says, "I want to put up a warning for the Republicans because obviously the Republicans are seizing on this and jumping in. I think this is fools gold for 2016. I do not think the Benghazi—I think if they focus on this—" Host Joe Scarborough interrupts, "What about the cover-up for the White House? I got [sic] everybody here [on the program's panel], I got [sic] everybody apologizing for the White House. ... What about a cover-up here, Donny? ... [W]hy are you jumping to political strategy instead of talking about what [White House press secretary] Jay Carney did, the double speak? ... So tell me, what's the politics of the White House lying about something that we all know they're lying about? When Jay Carney is saying it's not about Benghazi when you know it's about Benghazi? And we know it's about Benghazi." Deutsch: "If they're gonna run against Hillary Clinton on this, I think it's a bad political move." [58246, 58247, 58252, 58263, 58286]

Scarborough: "And [NBC's] Chuck Todd knows it's about Benghazi. And he [pointing to panelist and journalist Mike Barnicle] knows it's about—everybody watching knows it's about Benghazi. And you're talking about how the Republicans—you see the White House spokesperson lying on national television. You see an ABC News person [Jonathan Karl] shocked that he's lying and treating the press corps and Americans like they're stupid. He's says it's not about Benghazi. Republicans and conservatives have been called fools for a year now for saying this happened. They don't release it with the original the documents. They finally, reluctantly are forced to release it. Then you have the White House lying about it, saying it's not about Benghazi, and you're only reaction is, 'Hey, Republicans better not overreact to the cover-up?'" Deutsch: "My reaction is this, that we as voters understand both Republicans and Democrats are political animals and are going to manage a crisis in their situation to their favor. Scarborough: "So, when Democrats cover something up, it's politics. ... When Republicans cover something up, it's a scandal. ... It would be on the front page of *The New York Times*. It would be on the front page of every newspaper in America. But when Democrats cover up, you think it's shrewd political gamesmanship. That's a disgrace, Donny. ... It's a disgrace. ... This is disgraceful." Deutsch: "... I am saying that if the Republicans bite, it's a stupid move. And what I just said I will stand by." Scarborough: "What about the media biting? What about the media doing their job? What about the media calling a cover-up a cover-up?" Deutsch: "The media has covered this..." Even liberal co-host Mika Brzezinski jumps on Deutsch: "Was he engaging in double speak or even a potential cover-up? ... Now, come on. It's either they were covering up something

or they forgot to release the email. The question we have now is whether they released other prep emails for Susan Rice and where Hillary Clinton stands on all of this. And [questioning] that may serve the Republicans very well if they [the White House spinmasters] don't have good answers." (Rice, of course, was selected to appear on the Sunday talk shows, rather than Hillary Clinton, precisely because Rice did *not* know anything about Benghazi beyond what she was told to say—and Rice was not planning to run for president in 2016. Congressman Darrell Issa (R-CA), chairman of the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee, begins a Benghazi hearing by stating, "The White House produced the talking points that [then-] ambassador [Susan] Rice used, not the intelligence community. In pushing the false narrative that a YouTube video was responsible for the deaths of four brave Americans, it is disturbing—and perhaps criminal that these documents—that documents like these were hidden by the Obama administration from Congress and the public alike, particularly after Secretary [of State John] Kerry pledged cooperation and [Obama] himself told the American people in November of 2012 that, quote, 'every bit of information we have on Benghazi has been provided.' This committee's job is to get to the facts and to the truth. I, for one, will continue to chip away at this until we get the whole truth. ... The Americans who lost their lives in Benghazi, those who were wounded, and the American people deserve nothing less. So today's hearing is critical for what our witnesses will give us, and I welcome you and I thank you for being here. But it comes in a week in which the American people have learned that you cannot believe what the White House says, you cannot believe what the spokespeople say, and you cannot believe what [Obama] says, and the facts are coming out that, in fact, this administration has knowingly withheld documents pursuant to Congressional subpoenas, in violation of any reasonable transparency or historic precedent, at least since Richard Milhous Nixon." Retired Air Force Brigadier General Robert Lovell testifies before the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee. Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich reports that Lovell "said the military should have and could have done more to help Americans who were killed in Benghazi on September 11, 2012. Lovell is the former deputy director for intelligence at Africa Command. His testimony today is the first testimony from a member of the military who was at Africa Command during the time of the Benghazi attack on the U.S consulate." Lovell tells the committee, "Many with firsthand knowledge have recounted the heroism displayed by the brave Americans in Benghazi that night. They fought the way they trained. That is in the record. Outside of Libya there were discussions that churned on about what we should do. These elements also fought the way they were trained. Specifically, the predisposition to interagency influence had the military structure—in the spirit of expeditionary government support—waiting for a request for assistance from the State Department. There are accounts of time, space and capability discussions of the question, could we have gotten there in time to make a difference. Well, the discussion is not in the 'could or could not' in relation to time, space and capability—the point is we should have tried." [58237, 58257, 58294, 58299, 58304]

"As another saying goes: 'Always move to the sound of the guns. It is with a sense of duty as a retired General officer that I respectfully submit these thoughts and perspectives. ... The military should have made a response of some sort. ... We didn't know how long this would last when we became aware of the distress nor did we completely understand what we had in front of us, be it a kidnapping, rescue, recovery, protracted hostile engagement or any or all of the above. But what we did know quite early on was that this was a hostile action. This was no [anti-video] demonstration gone terribly awry. To the point of what happened, the facts led to the conclusion of a terrorist attack." (It is of course preposterous for Obama's defenders to argue, "There was not enough time for a military response" because at the time of the attack no one could possibly have known how long it would last.") Lovell also states, "None of them think it's a video. None of them. The military, the CIA, the CIA station chief, the State Department, all of them—the facts at the time, Mr. Chairman, the facts do not point to a video. That only comes from the White House." White House press secretary Jay Carney, prodded about the Benghazi cover-up, says, "What hasn't changed is the effort by Republicans to claim a conspiracy when they haven't been able to find one." Republicans are "trying to politicize a tragedy. ... This is a conspiracy theory. How much time have we spent focused on talking points? ... There is an active investigation to find the people who are responsible. There is an active investigation into the details." (The media has already interviewed at least one of the Benghazi attackers, who had made no effort to hide himself. The Obama administration is apparently less skilled than CNN at finding terrorists.) Carney is asked by a DailyCaller.com reporter if the instability in Libya that arose after Moammar Gaddafi was forced out of power is an example of the "broader failure of policy" suggested in the Ben Rhodes memo. At NationalReview.com former terrorist prosecutor Andrew C. McCarthy writes that "Obama's 'blame the video' fraud started in Cairo, not Benghazi. ... When Benghazi comes up, the administration—...Obama, Hillary Clinton, Susan Rice, Jay Carney, et al.—loves to talk about the Cairo 'protests.' Why? Because the media, and thus the public, have bought hook, line, and sinker the fraudulent claim that those 'protests' were over the anti-Muslim video. Obama & Co. shrewdly calculate that if you buy 'Blame the Video' as the explanation for Cairo, it becomes much more plausible that you will accept 'Blame the Video' as the explanation for Benghazi—or, at the very least, you will give Obama officials the benefit of the doubt that they could truly have believed the video triggered Benghazi, despite a mountain of evidence to the contrary. You see, the Benghazi fraud hinges on the success of the Cairo fraud. If you are hoodwinked by the latter, they have a much better chance of getting away with the former. But 'Blame the Video' is every bit as much a deception when it comes to Cairo. Thanks to ... Obama's policy of supporting the Muslim Brotherhood and other Islamic supremacists in Egypt, post-Mubarak Cairo became a very hospitable place for jihadists. That included al-Qaeda leaders, such as Mohammed Zawahiri, brother of al-Qaeda emir Ayman Zawahiri; and leaders of Gama'at al-Islamia (the Islamic Group), the terrorist organization led by the Blind Sheikh—Omar Abdel Rahman, the terrorist I convicted in 1995 for running the jihadist cell that bombed the World Trade Center and plotted to bomb other New York

City landmarks. In the weeks before September 11, 2012, these jihadists plotted to attack the U.S. embassy in Cairo. In fact, the Blind Sheikh's son threatened a 1979 Iran-style raid on the embassy: Americans would be taken hostage to ransom for the Blind Sheikh's release from American prison (he is serving a life sentence). Other jihadists threatened to burn the embassy to the ground — a threat that was reported in the Egyptian press the day before the September 11 'protests.'" [58362]

"The State Department knew there was going to be trouble at the embassy on September 11, the eleventh anniversary of al-Qaeda's mass-murder of nearly 3,000 Americans. It was well known that things could get very ugly. When they did, it would become very obvious to Americans that ... Obama had not 'decimated' al-Qaeda as he was claiming on the campaign trail. Even worse, it would be painfully evident that his pro-Muslim Brotherhood policies had actually enhanced al-Qaeda's capacity to attack the United States in Egypt. The State Department also knew about the obscure anti-Muslim video. Few Egyptians, if any, had seen or heard about it, but it had been denounced by the Grand Mufti in Cairo on September 9. Still, the stir it caused was minor, at best. And indeed, they did storm it, replace the American flag with the jihadist black flag, and set fires around the embassy complex. Nevertheless, before the rioting began but when they knew there was going to be trouble, State Department officials at the embassy began tweeting out condemnations of the video while ignoring the real sources of the threat: the resurgence of jihadists in Muslim Brotherhood–governed Egypt, the continuing demand for the Blind Sheikh's release (which underscored the jihadists' influence), and the very real danger that jihadists would attack the embassy (which demonstrated that al-Qaeda was anything but 'decimated'). The transparent purpose of the State Department's shrieking over the video was to create the illusion that any security problems at the embassy (violent rioting minimized as mere 'protests') were attributable to the anti-Muslim video, not to ... Obama's policies and patent failure to quell al-Qaeda." [58362]

"Because there was a kernel of truth to the video story, and because the American media have abdicated their responsibility to report the predominant causes of anti-Americanism in Egypt, journalists and the public have uncritically accepted the notion—a false notion—that the video caused the Cairo rioting. That acceptance is key to the administration's 'Blame the Video' farce in connection with the lethal attack in Benghazi. At about 10 p.m. Washington time on the night of September 11—after they knew our ambassador to Libya had been murdered and while the siege of Benghazi still raged—Secretary of State Clinton and ...Obama spoke on the telephone. Shortly afterwards, the State Department issued a statement from Secretary Clinton blaming the video for the atrocity in Benghazi. That was the beginning of the fraud's Benghazi phase—the phase Susan Rice was prepped to peddle on nationwide television. But it wasn't the beginning of the fraud. Secretary Clinton's minions at the State Department had started spinning the video fraud hours earlier, in Egypt. The sooner Americans grasp that, the sooner they will comprehend the breathtaking depth of [Obama's] Benghazi cover-up." [58362]

Asked about claims that only about two-thirds of those who have enrolled in an ObamaCare plan have paid premiums and are actually covered Carney responds, "We dispute their numbers. We don't have hard, concrete numbers, but we dispute them." Carney also suggests that insurance company data cannot be trusted because they are "profit-making" companies. At DailyCaller.com David B. Cohen writes, "White House Press Secretary Jay Carney, once a respected journalist, has been morphing before our very eyes into 'Jay Isuzu.' I refuse to call Carney a liar. But it's clear that when he's called upon to defend the indefensible, he stubbornly resists telling the truth. And with the White House press corps rediscovering some journalistic skepticism after years of credulous slumber, Carney is having to defend the indefensible with increasing frequency. The result isn't pretty: Carney, like [1980s automobile commercial pitchman] Joe Isuzu, is not being taken seriously. ... Carney's hapless tap-dancing act is becoming a daily event, as he struggles to explain away a relentless parade of 'phony scandals.' It is strange to think that Carney was once *Time* magazine's Washington bureau chief, a vaunted position at the highest echelon of the mainstream media. More than any press secretary in recent memory, Carney has squandered the credibility and reputation that he brought with him to the job. It makes one wonder how many other mainstream journalists could flip so seamlessly from aggressive, skeptical reporter to partisan hack. I don't think it's plausible that Carney has changed so dramatically in just a few years. It's more likely that when Carney was supposedly an objective reporter, he was secretly the same person he is today deeply partisan, deeply biased." [58295]

"...I suspect that mainstream journalists are generally cut from the same cloth as Carney, and would, like Carney, readily trade their 'lofty journalistic ideals' for the chance to flack for a liberal administration. And that attitude, I believe, finds its way into the journalism they produce before they get the call to join Team Obama—or Team Hillary. If the mainstream media are indeed full of Jay Carneys waiting to happen, then conservatives are right to distrust them. Under Jay Carney, the position of White House press secretary has become more partisan than ever. As Carney once again showed on Wednesday, he is intent not on disseminating the truth but on obstructing its dissemination. This raises a question: Why should taxpayers pay for a spokesman whose job is not to inform the public, but rather to spout partisan propaganda on behalf of the president's party? Why should Republican taxpayers have to pay for a Democrat to constantly insult them, and why should Democrat taxpayers have to pay for a Republican to constantly insult them? Shouldn't the president's party, be it Democrat or Republican, pay the press secretary's salary?" [58295]

Politico reports, "Sign-ups in Obamacare exchanges eclipsed 8 million by mid-April, and nearly 5 million people got Medicaid, according to official data released by the administration Thursday. About 2.2 million, or 28 percent of the exchange enrollees,

were young adults aged 18-34. A huge surge of young people signed up at the last minute. More than eight in 10 enrollees qualified for subsidies to help purchase health insurance on the exchanges. The report didn't say how many people had paid their premiums so far." (Five million new Medicaid enrollees means five million more people receiving government hand-outs. That more than 80 percent of ObamaCare enrollees are getting federal subsidies means another six million or so additional Americans are getting new taxpayer handouts. Some argue that was a primary goal of ObamaCare: get millions more Americans dependent on government and likely to vote for Democrats to protect their hand-outs.)

House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) calls on Secretary of State John Kerry to testify before Congress about the Benghazi cover-up. "Someone needs to answer why this administration hid these documents—and tell the American people what else is being concealed. The House used its subpoena power to obtain documents, including emails, last year, but these emails didn't show up until now, after a court ordered their release to an outside watchdog group" [58267]

Former CIA director General Michael Hayden tells the Foundation for Defense of Democracies' annual forum in Washington that it was dangerous for Obama to draw a red line over chemical weapons in Syria and then take no action: "My raw emotion, watching it from the outside, was just embarrassment. Sometimes the certainty of an action is far more powerful than the severity of an action. We've made everything uncertain, which actually makes you appear weak at some times, but also then demands that when you want to appear strong, you may have to be overly severe to overcome the uncertainty. It's just bad all around." [58418]

According to CampusReform.org, "Officials at colleges in Illinois are warning that if the state hikes its minimum wage, it will have to cut hours for and even fire some student workers. The minimum wage in the state is already \$8.25—the third highest in the nation—but there is legislation pending to raise it to \$10.25. 'Right now, we are able to hire eight part-time student workers in the Athletic Department,' Mac Ingmire, athletic director at Lincoln Christian University, said in an interview with *Journal Standard*. 'If the minimum wage were to increase by two dollars or more, that number would be closer to four or five, and the hours we can offer to our students would be cut.' Western Illinois University Budget Director Matt Bierman said the hike would likely force the college to fire some of its nearly 1,500 student workers. 'We either have to raise fees or make reductions in student employment,' he said." (The city of Seattle, Washington is reportedly close to phasing in a minimum wage of \$15.00 per hour. Waiters and bartenders are less than thrilled with the proposal; they anticipate reduced tips as restaurants and bars raise prices to cover the cost of the wage increase. Seattle workers with limited skills can expect to lose their jobs.) [58271, 58317, 58321]

The U.S. Senate confirms four executives and judges selected by Obama. TheHill.com reports, "Theodore Chuang and George Hazel will serve as U.S. district judges for Maryland. The Senate voted 53-42 on Chuang's nomination and 95-0 on Hazel's. ... The

Senate also confirmed Janice Schneider to be an assistant secretary of the Interior on a 64-32 vote. Senators confirmed Suzan LeVine to be U.S. ambassador to Switzerland and Liechtenstein by voice vote." Senator Charles Grassley (R-IA), ranking member of the Senate Judiciary Committee, states, "I can't support [Chuang's] nomination because of the central role Mr. Chuang played in the administration's efforts to stonewall an investigation into the situation in Benghazi. These questions remain unanswered because the administration refuses to recognize the rights of congressional oversight." [58341]

On Newsmax.tv Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) says, "We need a joint select committee in the House. [White House press secretary Jay Carney] is misleading the public and clearly he's lying." Graham addresses Carney's preposterous claim that Ben Rhodes' email was not about Benghazi: "...Let's call Ben Rhodes, the author of the document, and ask him what it was about and use common sense. Do you think they were worried about property damage to the embassy in Cairo from a protest? No. They were worried about the four dead Americans in Benghazi. What did Susan Rice get asked about on Sunday television? Benghazi and the four dead Americans. The third goal of the email [was] to reassure the American people that we will bring those to justice who harmed Americans. Well, nobody was harmed other than [in] Benghazi so the document itself clearly demonstrates they were worried about Benghazi. To suggest otherwise is insulting and disrespectful, but that's the way they've been. And they've generally got away with it. ... The email is important because it shows that they're not trying to explain what happened in Benghazi because all the evidence was of a coordinated terrorist attack and the story they wanted Susan Rice to tell was of a protest caused by a video that never happened. ...It's sad, really, that our Democratic friends for the most part seem to have no interest in trying to uncover [the truth] about how four Americans died in the line of duty seven weeks before an election. It's really sad for the country and let's just remember this: remember when ... Obama told us as things become available about Benghazi, we will be transparent and share them with the American people? Remember that statement? This email, which is a smoking gun about how they drove the narrative toward a protest based on a video rather than a coordinated terrorist attack, came about through an independent judiciary. Thank God for an independent judiciary. This administration would have never provided this one document because they know how damning the document is." [58287]

It was Rhodes who called Obama's strikes on Libya a "kinetic military action," rather than an act of war. He told reporters at the time, "I think what we are doing is enforcing a resolution that has a very clear set of goals, which is protecting the Libyan people, averting a humanitarian crisis, and setting up a no-fly zone." Of course, Obama had no authorization to order military action to support a vague United Nations National Security Council resolution, and he failed at both protecting the Libyan people and averting a humanitarian crisis. Libya is today in shambles. In November 2012 Rhodes told reporters the White House did not edit the CIA talking points about Benghazi to remove references to a planned terrorist attack by al-Qaeda affiliate Ansar al-Shariah. Rhodes said, "The only edit that was made by the White House and also by the State Department was to change the word 'consulate' to the word 'diplomatic facility,' since the facility in Benghazi was not formally a consulate." According to former CIA director David

Petraeus, the agency's talking points were changed by the time they were given to U.N. ambassador Susan Rice. According to Rhodes, they were not changed by the White House. Rhodes was lying. In May 2013 the *Weekly Standard's* Stephen F. Hayes charged that Rhodes was the chief architect of the Benghazi cover-up. Jofi Joseph, a former national security staffer, has suggested that Rhodes was the source of leaks of classified information about the Stuxnet virus, a U.S.-Israeli cyber warfare effort to sabotage Iran's nuclear centrifuge program. Joseph stated, "Gotta imagine Ben Rhodes is lawyering up now that a leak investigation is underway. If anyone in the Obama White House leaked, it was him." On Hugh Hewitt's radio program CNN's Jake Tapper says, "Look, I'm a reporter and what I do is the opposite of what press secretaries do, quite often. Their job is to paint somebody in the most flattering light regardless of what the truth is, and my job is to... head right for the truth. ... To me, what bothers me most about these Benghazi emails, the newly-released ones, is that they should have been released a year ago... They [in the White House] have an interpretation of events that does not sit with what I think happened, um, but, you know, calling somebody [press secretary Jay Carney] a liar is, uh, it's, it's... not normally the kind of language I use. ... I think that... the comments that are being made... are dissembling... obfuscating... and often, you now, insulting... so I... I don't disagree with those who don't care for, uh, what's going on at the [White House] press conferences..." [58278, 58323, 58365]

On Special Report, former National Security Council Spokesman Tommy Vietor admits to host Brett Baier that Obama was not in the White House situation room as others met to respond to the news of the terrorist attack in Benghazi on September 11, 2012. Vietor states he does not know where Obama was—which is almost impossible to believe. (Former Secret Service Agent Dan Bongino writes on Facebook, "I worked within the walls of the 18 acre White House complex for many years and assure you that they absolutely know where [Obama] was. The answer is uncomfortable and therefore they ignore the question." Baier does not ask Vietor where National Security Advisor Tom Donilon was on September 11, 2012—or the next day, for that matter. Some might suspect that it was Donilon, a career political operative, who concocted the YouTube video cover story; it is unlikely that it originated with Ben Rhodes.) Asked about his changing the word "attacks" to "demonstrations" in the talking points, Vietor says he cannot remember, adding, "Dude, this was like, two years ago." (Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich comments: "[That] is apparently his version of 'what difference, at this point, does it make?' At this point, we still do not know where ... Obama was on the night of the attack or what exactly he was doing while four Americans fought for their lives in Benghazi.") Obama was not only not in the situation room, he also skipped his daily national security briefing the day after the attack—because he was flying to Las Vegas for a fundraiser. (Vietor's first Obama-related job was driving a press van while Obama was in the U.S. Senate. Somehow that led to him qualifying for a position with the National Security Council. In 2013 Vietor and former Obama speechwriter Jon Favreau formed a "political communications" firm. Whether they advise their clients to use the

According to visitor logs, on September 11, 2012 Michael Donilon (Vice President Joe Biden's legal counsel, now a partner at David Axelrod's AKPD Message and Media), David I. Ginsberg (vice president in the Sales and Marketing Group at Intel Corporation), and lead debate coach Ron Klain (lawyer, political operative, and former chief of staff of Al Gore and Joe Biden) all visited the White House on September 11, 2012 for what was listed as "debate prep." The entry, listed at Patterico.org, does not indicate the time of the visit. Whether Obama was practicing for his next debate with Mitt Romney, rather than dealing with the Benghazi attack, is not known. (After leaving his position with Biden, Klain—who was involved with the push for the failed Solyndra loan—became a lobbyist with U.S. Airways, Airborne Express, and ImClone. Michael Donilon is the brother of Tom Donilon, former Obama National Security Advisor—who had no military experience, and was a corporate lawyer and lobbyist who spent six years as a Fannie Mae executive. Tom Donilon worked for Jimmy Carter, Walter Mondale, Joe Biden, Michael Dukakis, and Bill Clinton. Donilon's wife is Biden's chief of staff. Donilon also worked to destroy Judge Robert Bork's chances of being confirmed for the Supreme Court. According to Politico, Donilon left Fannie Mae as it was mired in an accounting scandal in 2005, three years before [its] spectacular collapse when the mortgage market imploded in 2008." Secretary of Defense Robert Gates once stated that Donilon would be "a disaster" if given the position of National Security Advisor. On *The O'Reilly Factor*, host Bill O'Reilly says, "*The Wall Street Journal* editorialized today, quote, 'Mr. Carney still insisted Ms. Rice had relied on points about the Benghazi attack that were produced by the CIA. He must think the press corps is stupid.' While Carney may think the press corps is stupid, he knows the press corps doesn't care, and that's why he says these outrageous things. He knows the coverage will be minimal, except on Fox News. Last night, CBS Evening News didn't cover Benghazi. NBC did a 30-second reader. ABC did a report with Jonathan Karl, the [reporter] you saw there who gave Carney a hard time, that was 10 minutes into the broadcast. ABC should have led with it. Most newspapers today either ignored or minimized the story, same thing yesterday. ... See, that's what this story is all about, the failure of the U.S. Government to protect Americans under fire in Benghazi. And then after the fact, trying to say, 'Oh, the killers weren't organized terrorists.' Are we all getting this? But, again, the national media won't cover it. Does it get any worse than that in our democracy? ... The Obama administration was completely derelict in the Benghazi terror attack and was dishonest in the aftermath. And the national press doesn't give a damn? Disgraceful." [53892]

On *Hannity*, Pat Smith, mother of Benghazi victim Sean Smith, comments on the latest revelations of the cover-up and the fact that the U.S. military was never ordered to send

help, telling Sean Hannity, "I've got a pretty strong reaction [to] that. First of all, I keep flashing back on my son receiving the telephone call that says, 'Sorry, there's no help coming, you're on your own.' And I can picture his face as he... was about to die. And why didn't our government and our military go in to help him and all of the others who were there? Nobody cared enough. They were covering their butts for something." Smith says that when Obama and then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton met her they told her "it was the fault of the video... and I said, 'Please, I've got to know what happened.' And they said they promised it was the video and if they found out any different they would get back to me and let me know. They did not get back to me, they just dis-acknowledged ny existence." Smith states that the day before the attack in which he lost his life her son telephoned her and said, 'Mom, there's [sic] people from the... hired security force that was out there taking pictures of everything.' He said, 'There's something bad's gonna happen. It's building up, something really bad's gonna happen.' And he said he asked for more security and again—again—he got turned down. I want to know why he got turned down. What was the reason? They've got to have a reason for it, but nobody has given me any yet. Nobody wants to give me any because they're covering... I don't know why. They must be covering [up] something." [58273]

On May 2, in response to a question about the violence in Ukraine, Obama says, "The notion that this is some spontaneous uprising in eastern Ukraine, uh, is belied by all the evidence of well organized, trained, armed militias, with the capacity to shoot down helicopters—generally, uh, local protestors, uh, don't possess that capacity of surface-to-air missiles or, uh, whatever weapons were used to shoot down helicopters..." Peggy Noonan writes at WSJ.com, "You have to stand for something. You have to suffer for it. ([Pope] John Paul was shot and almost killed, and he spent the last third of his pontificate in constant physical distress. He kept showing up anyway.) You have to be brave. (He wasn't afraid of any earthly power, not even the Soviet Union.) You have to stand by your beliefs as long as you know they are right; you have to speak and write the truth. Explaining what you believe involves trusting people to hear and consider; it assumes they will respond fairly and even with their highest selves. In this way you develop a relationship with people, an ongoing conversation between your articulations and their private thoughts. You are talking to them. When eventually they respond, they are talking to you. Great leaders are clear, honest, suffer for their stands and are brave. They conduct a constant dialogue. At the end, when they are gone, the crowd declares what they heard. When John Paul died, they issued their judgment: He was a saint. Popes aren't presidents, and presidents aren't saints. Both operate within wildly different realities and have wholly different obligations, so to compare the two isn't quite just. And yet I couldn't help think the past week of ... Obama, whom I started to think of as poor Obama—whose failings as a leader are now so apparent, and seem so irremediable, partly because they spring from not only his nature and personality but his misunderstanding of

what leaders do. Does he stand for something? I suppose he stands for many things, but you can't quite narrow it down and sum it up. A problem with his leadership is that there's always the sense that he's not quite telling you his core and motivating beliefs. There are a lot of rounded banalities. There are sentiments and impulses. But he isn't stark, doesn't vividly cut through. There's a sense he's telling people as much as he feels he can within the parameters of political safety, and no more." [58404]

"As for speaking truthfully, well, he speaks, in many venues and sometimes at great length. He is not passive when it comes to his political fortunes—he goes out and speaks and tries to rally the base—but even there, and certainly when it comes to governing, he seems bored, as if operating at a remove. Valerie Jarrett was once quoted saying he's so exceptionally gifted that he's been bored most of his life. It seems to me more likely an exceptionally gifted person would be exceptionally interested in and alive to the wonder and drama of things. I think her meaning was that only the most demanding and important of jobs would consistently arouse his engagement and focus. But he seems pretty bored [in the Oval Office]. He's not a dynamist. He doesn't seem excited about all the possibilities for America." [58404]

The House Oversight and Government Reform Committee, chaired by Congressman Darrell Issa (R-CA), subpoenas Secretary of State John Kerry to testify about Benghazi on May 21. Issa states, "The State Department's response to the congressional investigation of the Benghazi attack has shown a disturbing disregard for the Department's legal obligations to Congress. Compliance with a subpoena for documents is not a game. Because your Department is failing to meet its legal obligations, I am issuing a new subpoena to compel you to appear before the Committee to answer questions about your agency's response to the congressional investigation of the Benghazi attack. ... The fact that these [latest] documents [including emails from Obama advisor Ben Rhodes] were withheld from Congress for more than 19 months is alarming. The Department is not entitled to delay responsive materials because it is embarrassing or implicates the roles and actions of senior officials. ... Just weeks before taking over for outgoing Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, while serving as Chairman of the Senate Foreign relations Committee, you expressed a commitment to obtaining the full record of facts related to the deadly September 11-12, 2012, attack on U.S. diplomatic facilities in Benghazi, Libya. You said, 'From the very beginning of the Benghazi events, every member of this Committee has shared with [Obama] and Secretary Clinton our determination to get all of the facts about what happened and why in Benghazi.' House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) issues a statement: "Americans learned this week that the Obama Administration is so intent on obstructing the truth about Benghazi that it is even willing to defy subpoenas issued by the standing committees of the People's House. In light of these new developments, the House will vote to establish a new select committee to investigate the attack, provide the necessary accountability, and ensure justice is finally served. The administration's withholding of documents—emails showing greater White House involvement in misleading the American people—is a flagrant violation of trust and undermines the basic principles of oversight upon which our system of government is built. And it forces us to ask the question, what else about Benghazi is the Obama administration still hiding from the American people?" "The House committees that have been investigating this attack have done extraordinary work, using their subpoena power, holding dozens of hearings, and conducting hundreds of interviews. This dismissiveness and evasion requires us to elevate the investigation to a new level. I intend for this select committee to have robust authority, and I will expect it to work quickly to get answers for the American people and the families of the victims. Four Americans died at the hands of terrorists nearly 20 months ago, and we are still missing answers, accountability, and justice. It's time that change." (Congressman Trey Gowdy (R-SC) will reportedly chair the committee. If the White House isn't nervous, it should be. Gowdy is quick-witted and through, and does not suffer fools gladly. His tough questioning will likely provide the media with more than a few video clips that will not make the person being questioned look good. Gowdy tells On the Record's Greta van Susteren, "Four Americans died at the hands of terrorists nearly 20 months ago, and we are still missing answers, accountability, and justice. I can't disclose that evidence yet, but I have evidence that there was a systematic, intentional decision to withhold certain documents from Congress, and we're just sick of it. Republicans care more about defending billionaires like the Koch brothers and trying to rekindle debunked right-wing conspiracy theories than raising the minimum wage or ensuring women receive equal pay for equal work. ... There have already been multiple investigations into this issue and an independent Accountability Review Board is mandated under current law. For Republicans to waste

the American people's time and money staging a partisan political circus instead of focusing on the middle class is simply a bad decision. While Republicans try to gin up yet another political food fight, Senate Democrats will remain focused on fostering economic growth for all hard-working Americans." [58296]

The Department of Labor reports that the economy added an estimated 288,000 jobs in April. The unemployment rate falls to 6.3 percent—mostly because 806,000 Americans stopped looking for work altogether and are no longer counted in the equation. The total number of working Americans actually *fell* by 73,000 in April, and there are still fewer Americans working in 2014 than in 2008. (As noted several times in this *Timeline*, the government's unemployment rate is deceptive because it does *not* count people who have dropped out of the workforce. If, for example, 95 people out of 100 are working and five are not, the unemployment rate would be 5.0 percent, or five out of 100. If two people give up looking for work in the following month, the "official" unemployment rate would actually go down, because there would be only three out of 98 not working, or 3.06 percent. Thus, the unemployment rate can go down even if no one has found a job. If only one million Americans were working and the remaining 315+ million were all on welfare, the unemployment rate would be zero—because those on welfare would not be counted in the equation.) The percentage of people in the workforce falls to 62.8 percent, the lowest level since March 1978. The unemployment rate notwithstanding, a record 92,594,000 Americans of working age were *not* in the workforce in April 2014. The figure includes a record high 55,116,000 women—up 428,000 from March. One out of six men between the ages of 25 and 54 are unemployed. (Arguably, the economy is getting worse—even though the unemployment rate is falling. Ironically, if the economy starts improving the unemployment rate can actually go up, as more people who had previously given up looking for work start seeking employment again—which places them back into the calculations.) Obama, who generally opposes the death penalty, calls the incident "troubling," and adds, "We have seen significant problems—racial bias, uneven application of the death penalty, situations in which there were individuals on death row who were later on were discovered to have been innocent ...and all these I think do raise significant questions about how the death penalty has been applied. I'll be discussing with [Attorney General] Eric Holder and others to get me an analysis of what steps have been taken. Investigative journalist Sharyl Attkisson reports, "A newly-released government email indicates that within hours of the Sept. 11, 2012 attacks on Americans in Benghazi, Libya; the State Department had already concluded with certainty that the Islamic militia terrorist group Ansar al Sharia was to blame. The private, internal communication directly contradicts the message that ... Obama, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, U.S. Ambassador to the U.N. Susan Rice and White House press secretary Jay Carney repeated publicly over the course of the next several weeks. They often maintained that an anti-Islamic YouTube video inspired a spontaneous demonstration that escalated into violence. The email is entitled "Libya update from Beth Jones." Jones was then-Assistant Secretary of State to Hillary Clinton. According to the email, Jones spoke to Libya's Ambassador at 9:45am on Sept. 12, 2012 following the attacks. 'When [the Libyan Ambassador] said his government suspected that former Qaddafi regime elements carried out the attacks, I told him the group that conducted the attacks—Ansar Al Sharia—is affiliated with Islamic extremists,' Jones reports in the email. ... Among those copied on the emails: Deputy Secretary William Burns; Under Secretary for Political Affairs Wendy Sherman; Jake Sullivan, then-Deputy Chief of Staff (now promoted to national security advisor to Vice President Joe Biden); Under Secretary of State Patrick Kennedy; Cheryl Mills, then-Secretary Clinton's Chief of Staff (now on the board of directors of the global investment firm BlackRock); and Victoria Nuland, then-State Dept. spokesperson (now promoted to Asst. Secretary of State)." [58297, 58638]

It is worth recalling that on September 25, 2012 Obama addressed the United Nations General Assembly and was still clinging to the lie that a spontaneous demonstration against a YouTube video caused the deaths of four Americans in Benghazi. He lectured, "The future must not belong to those who slander the prophet of Islam." [58331]

But the Times waited until Thursday [and page 8] to publish a story that Fox News and others were blaring on Tuesday, because it was somehow deemed to be nonnews. That position became untenable on Wednesday, when ABC's Jonathan Karl and others were pressing White House spokesman Jay Carney on the spinning that took place in the wake of the Benghazi attack. By yesterday, CNN's Jim Acosta and CBS's Major Garrett were taking on Carney as well." [58308]

Senators John McCain (R-AZ), Kelly Ayotte (R-NH), and Lindsey Graham (R-SC) send Obama a letter that reads: "Over a year and a half has passed since the terrorist attacks, and the American people still do not have an accounting of your activities during the attack. ...[C]an you now confirm that Mr. [Tommy] Vietor's account of your absence in the White House Situation Room is accurate?" (Obama did not need to be in the situation room. *The Obama Timeline* believes he was relaxing in the White House living quarters, waiting for a telephone call from Egyptian President Mohammed Morsi to announce that U.S. ambassador to Libya Christopher Stevens had been captured, and that the prisoner exchange between Stevens and Omar Abdel Rahman—the "blind sheikh"—could proceed as planned. But Morsi's thugs inadvertently killed Stevens, upsetting the plans. The YouTube video story then had to be used to cover four killings, rather than just a kidnapping.) [58334]

Aaron Klein reports at WND.com, "A just-released U.S. government email reveals a top Obama administration official was immediately concerned the Benghazi attack was a concerted effort to kidnap U.S. Ambassador Chris Stevens. The night of the Sept. 11, 2012, attack, Eric Pelofsky, senior adviser to United Nations Ambassador Susan Rice, sent an email to Rice in which he expressed concern about a possible kidnap plot. The message was contained in the 112 pages of documents released to Judicial Watch as part of a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit. 'Yes—I'm very worried. In particular, that he is either dead or this was a concerted effort to kidnap him,' wrote Pelofsky at 9:06 p.m. Eastern the night of the attack. The email was sent after the initial assault at the U.S. special mission and just prior to the second assault at the nearby CIA annex, according to administration timelines. ... Has the Obama administration been suppressing evidence of

a kidnapping or attempted kidnapping of Stevens? As WND reported, the State Department's lead Benghazi investigator, Thomas Pickering, refused to deny there was a plan to kidnap Stevens. Pickering was the author of the 39-page report by the State Department's Accountability Review Board, or ARB, which largely absolved then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and other top State officials of wrongdoing regarding the Benghazi attack. At RenewAmerica.com, Joan Swirsky points out that "in August 2012, Morsi's de facto boss, Ayman Al-Zawahiri, the leader of al Qaeda, issued a Fatwa that was published worldwide and demanded that Muslims attack American citizens, interests, and military installations anywhere and everywhere for the purpose of freeing [Omar Abdel] Rahman." (Rahman, also known as the "blind sheikh," engineered the 1993 bombing of the World trade Center and is in prison in North Carolina.) Morsi possibly engineered the anti-video demonstrations in Cairo as a cover for the attacks. Some believe the Benghazi attack was, in fact, a kidnapping gone awry, and that Obama had arranged in advance with Morsi to have ambassador Christopher Stevens abducted and then traded for Rahman. Swirsky writes, "[T]he Benghazi facility had to be [left] unprotected [by Hillary Clinton] for the kidnappers to carry out their mission." The CBS Evening News finally gets around to reporting on the Ben Rhodes Benghazi talking points email, and tells viewers that his brother David is the president of CBS News. [58391]

On *Hannity*, Charles Woods, the father of Benghazi victim Tyrone Woods, says, "The smoking gun out of this was document, was when they said, 'Emphasize that the protests were rooted in the Internet video.' ... The failure of Obama's policy was that the weapons and the material that was given to al-Qaeda resulted in the deaths of these four American heroes. ... For seven or eight hours they watched this battle happen. They didn't watch a video protest. They watched a battle with militants [who] were associated with al Qaeda." (House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) has claimed that the families of two of the four Benghazi victims do not want the House to establish a select committee to investigate the attack and the cover-up. That is unlikely. In addition to Charles Woods, the mother of Sean Smith has appeared on Fox News several times and demanded answers about her son's death. The family of Glen Doherty has yet to receive any benefit payments from the government, and Doherty's friends, including Brandon Webb,

chipped in to pay for his burial expenses. On Facebook, Webb demands that "Patrick Kennedy (yes he's a 'Kennedy'), the DOS [Department of State] Undersecretary of management, be held accountable at State. His leadership resulted in denied security requests, and he purposely slowed down the follow on investigation at State. He left his people and Stevens in perilous danger, and his neglect, and lack of leadership (Lions led by Lambs at DOS) contributed to four dead Americans." If the families of Woods, Smith, and Doherty believe their questions have not yet been answered, it is difficult to believe that Pelosi's claim is valid.) [58336, 58586, 58587, 58588]

On May 3 FoxNews.com reports, "On Friday [May 2], Secretary of State John Kerry urged South Sudan's warring government and rebel leaders to uphold a months-long promise to embrace a cease-fire or risk the specter of genocide through continued ethnic killings. South Sudan's president tentatively agreed Friday to revitalize peace talks that have been stalled for months, taking what the U.S. described as a necessary step toward creating a new government and halting rampant bloodshed in the world's newest nation. But it was not immediately clear whether President Salva Kiir's main rival would participate in the talks, despite being urged by Kerry." (Sudan has been rocked by violence for years. During the 2008 presidential campaign Obama criticized then-President Bush for not doing more to end the violence in Sudan and Darfur, and even promised, "I will make ending the genocide in Darfur a priority from day one." Once in office, Obama essentially turned his back on the people in the region, and offered to deal with the murderous president of Sudan, Omar al-Bashir, saying, "To advance peace and security in Sudan, we must engage with allies and with those with whom we disagree." Obama's "Sudan czar," J. Scott Gration, naively said in 2009, "We've got to think about giving out cookies. Kids, countries, they react to gold stars, smiley faces, handshakes, agreements, talk, engagement." It was Sudan that once offered to hand over Osama bin Laden to Bill Clinton. Susan Rice, along with Richard Clark, persuaded Clinton not to accept the offer. Despite her monumental lack of judgment, Obama made Rice his ambassador to the United Nations. Why were our troops hamstrung by what Lovell described as 'deference to the Libyan people?' On the night of September 11, 2012, AFRICOM was not beholden to Mrs. Clinton or Tripoli. The *Daily Mail* reports, "A group of 11 terrorists with links to Al Qaeda were yesterday being interrogated on whether they are behind the disappearance of Malaysia Airlines flight MH370. The suspects were arrested in the capital Kuala Lumpur and in the state of Kedah last week and are members of a violent new terror group said to be planning bomb attacks in Muslim countries. The interrogations come after international investigators, including the FBI and MI6, asked for the militants, whose ages range from 22 to 55 and include students, odd-job workers, a young widow and business professionals, to be questioned intensively about Flight MH370. Nearly two months after the Beijing-bound plane vanished soon after take-off from Kuala Lumpur, no trace has been found despite a huge sea search costing hundreds of millions of pounds. It is thought to have crashed into the Indian Ocean with 239 people on board. An officer with the Counter Terrorism Division of Malaysian Special Branch said yesterday the arrests had heightened suspicion that the flight's disappearance may have been an act of terrorism. 'The possibility that the plane was diverted by militants is still high on the list and international investigators have asked for a comprehensive report on this new terror group,' the officer said. In interviews conducted so far, some suspects have admitted planning 'sustained terror campaigns' in Malaysia but denied being involved in the disappearance of the airliner, he added." [58344]

Elizabeth Harrington, of the *Washington Free Beacon*, tells Fox News that Senator Jeff Session (R-AL) is investigating the loose Social Security Administration (SSA) rules for receiving disability benefits. Applicants are supposed to be U.S. citizens who are totally and permanently disabled in order to receive benefits, but the SSA is more likely to grant benefits for applicants with limited education and minimal English skills. Some applicants reportedly bring interpreters with them to eligibility hearings even though they do no need them, in a ruse to "score extra points." (A person who does not speak English is not supposed to even be granted U.S. citizenship, let alone lifetime benefits funded by the taxpayers.) The abuse of disability benefits has increased dramatically, with applications increasing 230 percent over the last decade. The increases are especially acute among employers with workforces made up of younger, healthier men. That's because Obamacare prohibits offering lower rates to healthier groups. It also narrows the allowed premium gap between older and younger enrollees. ... The changes put as many as 90,000 policies across Nevada at risk of cancellation or nonrenewal this fall, said Las Vegas insurance broker William Wright, president of Chamber Insurance and Benefits. That's more than three times the 25,000 enrollees affected in October, when Obamacare-compliant plans first hit the market." [58420]

In his bio, Alhassani is identified as a student of George Washington University (GWU) who was President of the Muslim Student Association (MSA) there from 2005 to 2006 and who served as an intern at both the White House and the U.S. State Department. There is overwhelming evidence that MSA is a Muslim Brotherhood front. ...In addition to a work history that includes time at the State Department and White House, Alhassani has also worked at the Arab American Institute (AAI), which actively collaborates with the Arab American Action Network (AAAN) and CAIR. The AAAN was founded in Chicago by Rashid Khalidi, who was the Director of the PLO press agency at a time when the PLO was designated as a terrorist organization." [58352, 58353, 58374, 58524]

As noted previously in this *Timeline*, Rashid Khalidi is a close friend of Obama. Khalidi, an Obama fundraiser and former PLO operative who justifies Palestinian terrorism as contributing to "political enlightenment," taught at a university in Beirut, Lebanon in the 1970s and frequently spoke to reporters on behalf of terrorist Yasser Arafat's Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO). From 1976 to 1982 Khalidi was director of the Palestinian press agency, Wikalat-al-Anba al-Filastinija (WAFA), which was operating in exile from Beirut with the PLO. In the 1990s, Khalidi advised the Palestinian delegation during peace negotiations. He is currently a professor of Arab studies at Columbia University. Khalidi also taught at the University of Chicago, lived near the Obamas in Hyde Park, and was their friend and frequent dinner companion. While Obama served on the board of the Woods Fund, it approved (in 2001) a \$40,000 grant to the Arab American Action Network (AAAN). A second grant, for \$35,000, was approved in 2002. President of the AAAN is Mona Khalidi, Rashid Khalidi's wife. The AAAN calls the founding of Israel a "catastrophe," supports liberal immigration reform in the United States, and encourages giving drivers licenses to illegal aliens. In 2003, Obama attended a dinner held in honor of Khalidi. (Obama has consistently denied a close relationship with Khalidi, even though the Obamas have dined more than once at the home of Khalidi and his wife, Mona, and used them as occasional baby-sitters.) Obama praised Khalidi during the decidedly anti-Semitic event. William Ayers also attended the dinner, and both Ayers and Obama signed Khalidi's guest book. One speaker at the dinner, which was sponsored by the AAAN, remarks that if Palestinians cannot secure a return of their land, Israel "will never see a day of peace." The *Los Angeles Times* has a videotape of the Khalidi dinner but refuses to make it public. It is

assumed the tape's contents are damaging to Obama, likely because the event included anti-Semitic sentiments and Obama heaping praise on Khalidi. Further, appearing as entertainment at the Khalidi dinner was a children's dance group, the Sanabel AlQuds Dabka troupe. The Milwaukee-based Muslim children's dance group typically performs the "debka," a Middle-Eastern dance. The group's performances have been known to include simulated beheadings with fake swords, and stomping on American, Israeli, and British flags. It has been alleged that, in his speech at the Khalidi dinner, Obama stated "Israel has no God-given right to occupy Palestine," and there has been "genocide against the Palestinian people by (the) Israelis." Newsmax.com reports, "Former Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice has backed out of delivering the commencement address at Rutgers University following protests by some faculty and students over her role in the Iraq War. 'Commencement should be a time of joyous celebration for the graduates and their families,' Rice said. 'Rutgers' invitation to me to speak has become a distraction for the university community at this very special time.' The school's board of governors had voted to pay \$35,000 to the former secretary of state under President George W. Bush and national security adviser for her appearance at the May 18 ceremony. Rutgers was also planning to bestow Rice with an honorary doctorate. But some students and faculty at New Jersey's flagship university had protested, staging sitins and saying Rice bore some responsibility for the Iraq War as a member of the Bush administration. Barchi and other school leaders had resisted the calls to disinvite Rice, saying the university welcomes open discourse on controversial topics. The news of Rice's decision came a day after Barchi spoke with students protesting Rice's planned speech and told them the board of governors would not rescind its invitation." (Photographs of the bearded and head-covered student protestors suggest the opposition was mostly from Muslims. In 2011 "reality TV star" Nicole "Snooki" Polizzi was paid \$32,000 for a speaking appearance at Rutgers. Among her words of wisdom: "Study hard, but party harder.") The protests against Rice, following a decision by Brandeis University to disinvite author Ayaan Hirsi Ali, demonstrate the excessive influence of Muslims and the Council on American Islamic Relations on free speech. Colleges and universities invite far more leftists than conservatives to address students, and school administrators "pull the plug" on the latter at the first sign of resistance from Muslims and "progressives." will only be a smattering of high-wattage names at Saturday night's edition of the annual event. A number of those involved with the dinner told the *Washington Post* this week that reduction in the number of celebrity guests is deliberate, reflecting a desire to put the evening's focus back on the journalists who cover the White House. However, one Hollywood insider, who asked not to be identified, tells *The Hollywood Reporter* that the lack of swoon-worthy A-list movie stars shows that the lure of the event 'has faded dramatically.' ...One longtime DC political consultant, who also declined to be named, told THR that there's probably less celebrity enthusiasm for this year's dinner as opposed to the 2013 event because ...Obama was fresh from his re-election victory, and many of those who attended that star-studded evening had raised funds for [him]." At the dinner "roast," a comedian named Joel McHale tells Obama, "[Y]ou have to admit, and you already have, the launch of healthcare.gov was a disaster. Look, I don't even have an analogy because the website is now the thing people use to describe other bad things. Red Eye's Greg Gutfeld calls the audience "saggy bags of chuckling toadies," and tweets that the event "might be the best reminder of why we hate these people." (At PJMedia.com Rick Moran writes, "Face it, Dems. Obama doesn't do humor—at least the kind of self-deprecating humor that presidents like John Kennedy and Ronald Reagan were famous for. Obama's humor is mean-spirited. His zingers aimed at others feel like twisting the knife rather than a good-natured nudge. While there is always some measure of exaggeration when it comes to zinging an opponent, Obama's premise is usually false to begin with. This makes his humor self-serving and decidedly unfunny.") On May 4 Senator Al Franken (D-MN) appears on ABC's *This Week* and says of his past life as a comedian, "When I would make fun of politicians, only because they were screwing up in some way, and I don't think I could find anything frankly [about myself to now criticize] ...I'd be a really hard subject to satirize because I've just been impeccable. ...I've made some small mistakes, I suppose." On *Face the Nation*, Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) says, "So if we're [we Republicans are] playing politics with Benghazi, then we'll get burned. Several senior diplomats at the U.S. State Department, as well as a number of French Foreign Ministry employees (not those stationed in Abu Dhabi) subscribe to this website email list and one would hope they would take steps to have the Book Fair's organizers remove the anti-Semitic titles." The animosity stems from America's policies of not backing the Egyptian people and their war on terrorism. On our recent trip, members of Egypt's civil society, that very backbone which any future democratic polity must be built on, asked us why Washington is supporting terrorism and not supporting the Egyptian people and military in their fight against terrorism. Many everyday Egyptians simply don't understand why the U.S. cannot perceive the political reality on the ground." [58375]

Morris writes, "[F]rom the outset, it may have been Hillary who injected the idea that the video caused the attack. Then, it appears, that it was her language that Rhodes copied in instructing Susan Rice on how to handle the issue during her appearances on all the Sunday talk shows. But Hillary knew that was not the case. Because at 9:45 on the morning immediately after the attack, Assistant Secretary of State Beth Jones sent an email to Hillary Clinton reporting on a conversation she had with the Libyan Ambassador in which she told him that terrorists were responsible for the attack. There was no mention of any protest, demonstration, or video." Jones' email, which does not mention any YouTube video, reads, "When [the Libyan Ambassador] said his government suspected that former Qaddafi regime elements carried out the attacks, I told him the group that conducted the attacks—Ansar al-Sharia—is affiliated with Islamic extremists." Morris concludes, "So the decision to blame the video may have not originated in the bowels of the State Department or in the White House, but it may have stemmed directly from the Secretary of State herself. The protest outside the U.S. Embassy in Cairo was announced Aug. 30 by Jamaa Islamiya, a State Department-designated terrorist group, to protest the ongoing imprisonment of its spiritual leader, Sheikh Omar abdel Rahman [the 'blink sheikh']. He is serving a life sentence [for his participation] in the 1993 bombing of the World Trade Center." [58431]

At WND.com Bob Unruh writes, "The news that Barack Obama will accept an award Tuesday from filmmaker Steven Spielberg for his humanitarian work on behalf of the Jewish people is evoking a strong reaction from Israel supporters and critics of [Obama]. Townhall.com's Guy Benson observes, "That's probably not a development Oregon Democrats are too excited about. Gov. John Kitzhaber (D) oversaw the Cover Oregon Chernobyl and appears to have misled the public about the extent to which he was aware of its imminent, \$300 million collapse. Sen. Jeff Merkley (D) merely voted for the unpopular law, falsely reassuring concerned citizens that they would be able to keep their preferred plans and doctors. Both Kitzhaber and Merkley could be beatable this November—and Beaver State Republicans have a decent shot at retaking the Senate in Salem, too." [58462, 58463]

On May 6 Democrat strategist Bob Beckel tells Fox News' Martha MacCallum he was told by Tom Donilon, then-National Security Advisor, that he was also not in the White House situation room on the night of the Benghazi attack. (Former National Security Council spokesman Tommy Vietor has already stated that Obama was not in the situation room. Nor was then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. Nor was Donilon. No doubt there were Department of Defense officials, such as then-Secretary of Defense Leo Panetta, but they could not order a response to the attack without cross border authority—something that only Obama could give.)

The CBS affiliate in Washington, D.C. reports, "The State Department said Monday that Secretary of State John Kerry would not appear before the House Oversight Committee on May 21 to talk about Benghazi—as demanded in a subpoena from the panel's chairman, [Congressman] Darrell Issa [R-CA]. Department spokeswoman Marie Harf said Kerry planned to travel to Mexico at that time and officials would discuss alternative options with the committee." [58441, 58455]

According to StandardMedia.co.ke, Obama's aunt, Zeituni Onyango Obama, "has been laid to rest in Kisumu [Kenya] under the Muslim religion traditions." (Obama's aunt was living in the United States illegally, received taxpayer-funded welfare and disability benefits, and reportedly never had a job. Ordered deported in 2003, Zeituni Onyango Obama filed an appeal, lost the appeal, and was ordered deported in 2004, but she failed to leave. After her nephew entered the White House she was eventually granted asylum—even though she was under no threat of persecution in Kenya. According to the U.S. Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, asylum is granted only to persons who face persecution in their home country based on race, religion, nationality, or membership in a

particular social group, or political opinions. As the aunt of Obama, Onyango would have a difficult time arguing to an immigration judge that she would be subject to persecution in Kenya—but she apparently found such a judge. She illegally donated \$260 to Obama's 2008 campaign, and also attended one of his inaugural balls—accompanied by her immigration attorney, Margaret Wong. Like her nephew, Zeituni used a stolen Social Security number. She used a number issued in Indiana, a state where she never lived or worked.) In a poll of 266 industry decision makers, such as chief financial officers, human resources executives, and benefit managers, 60 percent say the Affordable Care Act will up healthcare costs, according to PlanSource, a healthcare software provider." (Obama claimed that the Affordable Care Act would lower premiums by an average of \$2,5000 per family.) [58443, 58444]

At a Senate Finance Committee hearing, Senator Jay Rockefeller (D-WV) rails against Senators who oppose an increase in the federal tax on gasoline, saying, "It's an American characteristic that you don't do anything which displeases the voters, because you always have to get reelected here. I understand part of it. It has to do with—for some, it's just we don't want anything good to happen under [Obama], because he's the wrong color." (In Rockefeller's view, it is apparently racist to not want to increase the cost of gasoline for consumers. He may not be aware that black people buy gasoline.) [58541, 58987]

DailyCaller.com reports, "Climate scientists have said the White House's National Climate Assessment (NCA) resembles pseudoscience more than actual science. The National Climate Data Center released its third NCA on Tuesday, which warns of an ever-worsening environment and extreme temperature rises due to man-made carbon dioxide emissions from burning fossil fuels. But it has been panned in some quarters. 'This National Assessment is much closer to pseudoscience than it is to science,' wrote scientists Patrick Michaels and Paul Knappenberger of the libertarian Cato Institute in their comments submitted to the Obama administration. 'It clearly believes that virtually everything in our society is tremendously dependent on the surface temperature, and, because of that, we are headed towards certain and inescapable destruction, unless we take its advice and decarbonize our economy, pronto,' Michaels and Knappenberger added. ... The NCA suggests a slew of regulatory solutions from cap-and-trade to green energy subsidies to mitigate global warming. 'It is to provide cover for a massive regulatory intrusion, and concomitant enormous costs in resources and individual liberty,' Michaels and Knappenberger wrote. 'History tells us that when scientists willingly endorse sweeping governmental agendas fueled by dodgy science, bad things soon happen.' Michaels' and Knappenberger's 75-page critique of the NCA points out the many weak points and flaws present in the government's analysis of the impact of global warming. For example, the NCA relies on not only peer-reviewed scientific literature, but also non-peer reviewed work from environmental activist groups—which the government did not disclose. ...Michaels and Knappenberger also pointed out that the measure of climate sensitivity used by the report is 40 percent higher than what more recent scientific literature points to." House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) states she is open to Democrats serving on the select committee on Benghazi: "If this review is to be fair, it must be truly bipartisan. The panel should be equally divided between Democrats and Republicans as is done on the House Ethics Committee. It should require that witnesses are called and interviewed, subpoenas are issued, and information is shared on a bipartisan basis. Only then could it be fair." (Of course, when Pelosi was Speaker of the House, she often saw to it that committees had more Democrats than Republicans. DailyCaller.com notes that House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) "is not expected to appoint as many Democrats as Republicans on the committee. In response to Pelosi's statement Tuesday, his office pointed out that in 2007, Pelosi thought a 9-6 ratio of Democrats and Republicans was 'fair' when she established a Select Committee on Energy Independence and Global Warming. Political maneuvering, therefore, may be at play: Pelosi's request for an equal number of Democrats and Republicans on the committee may be about giving her an excuse not to appoint any Democrats at all if she doesn't get her way." Having Democrats on the committee, of course, means they will be privy to information as soon as it is gathered, giving them an opportunity to better help the Obama administration defend itself from fallout.) Pelosi also argues that Benghazi has already been investigated enough: "There has been a review at the State Department by the Accountability Review Board. There were two bipartisan reviews in the United States Senate, and four partisan reviews in the House of Representatives." (Of course, the State Department merely investigated itself, and the Accountability Review Board was run by people appointed by Hillary Clinton and who did not even bother to interview her and other key persons.) Congressman Steny Hoyer (D-MD) tells CNN, "If they [Republicans] want to have a substantive effort, it ought to be an equally balanced [select] committee [on Benghazi] so this is not an exercise in partisanship. But we'll see whether that's the case." (In other words, "We want as many Democrats as Republicans on the committee so we can vote to block any progress they are making in the investigation." The *Chicago Tribune*—which apparently forgot that it endorsed Obama in 2004, 2008, and 2012—argues that "Congress should press for answers on Benghazi. ... We've instead... in six editorials, and reiterate today, that U.S. decisions made before, during and after assaults on two outposts in Benghazi have to be fully and honestly explained to the American people—the grieving families of Smith, Stevens, Doherty and Woods included." The Associated Press reports, "Abdel-Fattah el-Sissi, the former military chief who removed Egypt's Islamist president and who is now poised to win the post in elections this month, says the Muslim Brotherhood will never return as an organization, accusing it of using militant groups as cover to destabilize the country. El-Sissi spoke in the first TV interview of his campaign, aired late on Monday, vowing that restoring stability and bringing development are his priorities. The comments were a seemingly unequivocal rejection of any political reconciliation with the Brotherhood, which was Egypt's most powerful political force until el-Sissi removed President Mohammed Morsi, a member of the group, last summer. Since ousting Morsi, el-Sissi has been riding an overwhelming media frenzy lauding him as Egypt's savior, and his status as the country's strongest figure all but guarantees him a victory in the May 26-27 election. El-Sissi's only opponent in the race is leftist politician Hamdeen Sabahi, the third-place finisher in the 2012 election won by Morsi." [58582]

Reuters reports, "A car that trailed a motorcade carrying ...Obama's daughters on to Pennsylvania Avenue prompted a security lockdown at the White House on Tuesday. A Secret Service spokesman said the car entered the security checkpoint at 17th Street and Pennsylvania and was immediately stopped by Secret Service uniformed officers. The male driver was arrested and Washington police checked the car for explosives. The Secret Service identified the driver as Mathew Evan Goldstein, 55. He was arrested and charged with unlawful entry and was transported to city police for processing. Goldstein was identified as an employee of the Internal Revenue Service. People were unable to leave or enter the White House grounds while the car was being checked out. After more than an hour, the security lockdown was lifted." [58464]

DailyCaller.com reports, "Just one of Obamacare's many taxes could cost the U.S. hundreds of thousands of jobs over the next decade, according to an industry report published Tuesday. The National Federation of Independent Business projects that between 152,000 and 286,000 jobs will be lost by 2023 due to Obamacare's health insurance tax. NFIB, a nonprofit association of business owners, actively supports the repeal of the tax. The health insurance tax has proved to be one of Obamacare's more controversial fundraising measures. The tax targets insurance companies, charging each one proportional to their market share—the more health plans sold, the more insurers are required to pay. The report found that the tax will cause a spike in the cost of employer-sponsored health coverage, which will lead primarily small businesses to cut jobs. NFIB estimates that 57 percent of the job losses will come from small businesses—firms with under 500 employees, according to the federal Small Business Administration." [58487]

DailyCaller.com also reports, "The administration will invite at least 100,000 extra foreign workers to man jobs in the U.S. over the next four years, according to a May 6 statement by Alejandro Mayorkas, the deputy secretary of the Department of Homeland Security. ...In June 2012, during the 2012 presidential campaign, Obama began granting work permits to young illegal immigrants. Since then, he has given work-permits to 521,815 illegal immigrants, who compete for the jobs sought by the 4 million Americans who turn 18 each year." Senator Jeff Sessions (R-AL) responds, "This will help corporations by further flooding a slack labor market, pulling down wages. It is good news for citizens in other countries who will be hired... [but] for struggling Americans, it will only reduce wages, lower job opportunities, and make it harder to scrape by." [58491]

According to HollywoodReporter.com, "Lionsgate will distribute Dinesh D'Souza's next movie, which opens wide July 2 after a limited release June 27, insiders said Tuesday. The movie, originally called *America* though now called *America*: *Imagine a World Without Her*, was set for wide release on July 4 to take advantage of Independence Day, though Lionsgate moved the date up two days, insiders say. America is the follow-up to the right-leaning 2016: Obama's America, which is the second-most-successful political documentary in U.S. history after 2004's *Fahrenheit 9/11*, the left-leaning Michael Moore film also distributed by Lionsgate." At TheDailyBeast.com Eli Lake writes, "In the nearly 20 months since the September 11, 2012 Benghazi attacks, al Qaeda operatives and allied terrorists have flocked to Libya, making the fragile North African country a hub for those seeking to wage jihad from north Africa, current and former U.S. counterterrorism officials tell The Daily Beast. Not only does al Qaeda host Ansar al-Sharia, one of the militias responsible for the Benghazi attacks that killed Ambassador Chris Stevens and three other Americans. But U.S. intelligence now assesses that leaders from at least three regional al Qaeda affiliates—al Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb, al Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula and members of the organization of Al-Mulathameen Brigade loyal to Algerian terrorist, Mokhtar BelMokhtar—have all established havens in the lawless regions of Libya outside the control of the central government. One U.S. military contractor working on counterterrorism in Africa summed up the situation in Libya today as simply, 'Scumbag Woodstock.' The country has attracted that star-studded roster of notorious terrorists and fanatics seeking to wage war on the West. An American counter-terrorism official used a different metaphor to describe the situation. 'Libya today plays host to members and associates of several AQ-allied groups, in some ways becoming a jihadist melting pot,' this official told The Daily Beast. 'These groups haven't united under the same banner, but the ad hoc links and intermittent cooperation among them are worrisome, especially as some of these groups have made no secret of their desire to conduct attacks beyond Libya's borders.'" (The disaster called Libya is the direct result of Obama's eagerness to oust Moammar Gaddafi, apparently without having a clue as to who or what would replace him. When Obama advisor Ben Rhodes wrote that the goal of his Benghazi talking points was "To underscore that these protests are rooted in an Internet video, and not a broader failure of policy," the broader failure of policy to which he was referring

Explaining the Donahue case, which also contains a FOIA request, Taitz states, 'This case is against the Postmaster General and Inspector General for the USPS. It demonstrates that a year ago Attorney Orly Taitz provided them with information, a sworn affidavit of the Chief investigator of the Special Investigations unit of the U.S. Coast Guard, showing that Obama's Selective Service certificate is a forgery, and it contains a fabricated postal stamp. For a year, they covered it up and did not take any action. I filed a FOIA request. They did not respond within 20 days as required; a legal action was filed. Congressman Trey Gowdy (R-SC), who will chair the select committee on Benghazi, tells Fox News' Martha MacCallum the committee will have more Republicans than Democrats: "It's not going to be evenly constituted. We're in the majority and we're in the majority for a reason." Noting that House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) gave committees a Democrat advantage when she was Speaker of the House, Gowdy adds, "I find it interesting that people's ability to do math changes when they go from being speaker to being minority leader. There are more Republicans than Democrats [in the House]. There are consequences to elections." [58513]

Gowdy is the author of H.R. 4138, the "Executive Needs to Faithfully Observe and Respect Congressional Enactments of the Law Act of 2014" (the "ENFORCE the Law Act of 2014"). The Center for Individual Freedom explains, "At only two-and-a-half

pages, the ENFORCE the Law Act nonetheless stakes out an ambitious claim, styling itself as a bill 'To protect the separation of power in the Constitution of the United States by ensuring that the President takes care that the laws be faithfully executed, and for other purposes.' The bill does this by allowing either house of Congress, or both together, to sue the president or one of his officers for implementing a policy contrary to law. Gowdy and other House Republicans deem the bill necessary to check ... Obama's historic abuse of discretion. ... To a prosecutor like Gowdy and many others, the actions of ... Obama and his subordinates come dangerously close to violating the constitutional oath of office to 'faithfully execute the laws'—that is, laws passed by Congress and signed by the president. ... Due to a judicially crafted requirement for lawsuits called standing, Members of Congress aren't usually allowed to sue the president and his officers for violating the law. ... Because non-enforcement undermines the traditional rationale for barring inter-branch lawsuits, giving each house of Congress standing to sue the president and his subordinates may be the only way to maintain the integrity of laws the Obama administration seems determined to render null and void. Left unsaid during the House's debate and passage of the ENFORCE the Law Act is the reality that if Gowdy's bill fails—and ...Obama has already said he will veto the measure if it reaches his desk—then the only remedy left for stopping this lawless dereliction of duty is impeachment. By proposing the ENFORCE the Law Act, Trey Gowdy is actually throwing Barack Obama a political lifeline. No president wants to undergo an impeachment proceeding, but Obama's actions to date seem to lead straight toward such a fate if he continues flaunting the law and Republicans win control of Congress in the midterm elections later this year. A smart president would see Gowdy's bill as an opportunity to make peace with the opposition by throttling back on arbitrary rulemaking. But that kind of calculation doesn't appear to be Obama's strong suit." [58995]

On The Kelly File, Fox News' Catherine Herridge reports, "a seven-page email circulated at the highest levels of the White house apparently to come up with a media strategy to deal with [a September 2012] Fox News report [about Benghazi] is being withheld by the State Department citing executive branch deliberations." The subject line of the email reads, "Fox News: US officials knew Libya attack was terrorism within 24 hours, sources confirm." According to Examiner.com, the email "was circulated September 27th and September 28th 2012 [and] concluded the intelligence community knew Benghazi was terrorism within 24 hours." Among the emails recipients were Denis McDonough, Obama's deputy national security adviser during the Benghazi terrorist attack; John Brennan, former White House counterterrorism adviser, and later CIA Director; thendeputy director of the CIA Michael Morell; and Obama aide Ben Rhodes. Chris Farrell, the key investigator for Judicial Watch, states, "A 7-page dialogue concerning one Fox News report to me demonstrates an alarm bell situation where they are reacting to and trying to shape a response or commentary to react to or to shut down reporting." (The seven-page email about how the administration should deal with Fox reporting of Benghazi may be more of a significant talking points memo than Ben Rhodes' talk show directives for Susan Rice. If it were not, the White House would not be trying to hide it.) [58460]

In the North Carolina primary, state house speaker Thom Tillis wins the GOP nomination for the U.S. Senate. He will face off against Senator Kay Hagan (D-NC) on November 4. (The odds that Tillis will defeat Hagan are good, as are the chances that the GOP can win control of the Senate. A desperate Hagan—who won only 77 percent of the vote in the Democrat primary—ran deceptive campaign ads against Tillis even before the primary.) [58478, 58490]

On May 7 Obama heads to California for five fundraisers over three days. According to FreeBeacon.com, "Obama will ...attend a Democratic fundraiser at the home of Alan Horn, the chairman of the Walt Disney Studios, with tickets going as high as \$64,000 per couple." (In between fundraisers, Obama squeezes in a speech on energy efficiency—in order to make the trip "official" and pass the travel costs on to the taxpayers.) [58442, 58472, 58473, 58556]

At one fundraiser, Obama says, "Here's what's more disconcerting. Their [Republicans'] willingness to say no to everything—the fact that since 2007, they have filibustered about 500 pieces of legislation that would help the middle class just gives you a sense of how opposed they are to any progress—has actually led to an increase in cynicism and discouragement among the people who were counting on us to fight for them." (*The Washington Post* gives Obama "four Pinocchios" for his monumental 500-filibuster lie, and states, "On just about every level, this claim is ridiculous." There have been 133 successful filibusters since 2007, and 86 dealt with judicial and executive nominees, *not* legislation. Obama is inflating a number that was lower than 50 to 500. Obama's claim that the legislation would "help the middle class" is also debatable. His declaration that a bill would help the middle class does not mean it will.) [58559, 58565, 58683]

Secretary of State John "head in the sand" Kerry, addressing a Council of the Americas conference in Washington, D.C., says fighting poverty in Africa will help stop terrorist groups like Boko Haram from being formed: "They [African leaders] all talked about poverty and the need to alleviate poverty, and that much of this challenge comes out of this poverty where young people are grabbed at an early stage, proffered a little bit of money. Their minds are bended, and then the money doesn't matter anymore. They've got the minds, and they begin to direct them into these very extreme endeavors." (Osama bin Laden was quite wealthy. For Kerry to believe that poverty, not Islam, is the major driver of terrorism is both naive and dangerous.) [58539]

Secretary of Health and Human Services Kathleen Sebelius fails to show up for a Senate Appropriations Committee hearing to discuss her department's budget. FoxNews.com reports, "According to Senator Richard Shelby (R-AL), the secretary skipped the hearing

not due to a scheduling problem, but because 'she doesn't want to' testify. 'Her absence speaks volumes about transparency,' Senator Mike Johanns (R-NE) said, adding he was 'astonished, absolutely blown away that she is not here today.' Sebelius' absence was unusual as heads of departments typically speak at such hearings to defend their agency's budget requests. In her place, leaders from each department of HHS testified on their specific budget allocations." [58476]

Michelle Obama tweets a "sad duck face" photo of herself with a holding up a handlettered sign that reads, "#BringBackOurGirls." (Whether the radical Islamists of Boko Haram who kidnapped more than 200 girls in Nigeria care one whit about Michelle Obama or her Twitter messages remains to be seen.) At TruthRevolt.org Caleb Howe writes, "This is another example of the self-indulgent culture of the left, concerned primarily with gestures. Like [Barack] Obama suggesting that [Vladimir] Putin would cave before the condemnation and peer pressure of being on the 'wrong side of history.' It is a culture that believes everyone craves approval from the cool kids. ... Obama yesterday promised to send a team to Nigeria to try and help secure the rescue of the kidnapped girls. That is policy. Tweeting for what we want is no substitute for real talk, and real action. For someone in a position of power, it's pretty far on the silly side." ("Tweet foolishly but carry a dumb sign" is not exactly what Teddy Roosevelt had in mind when he suggested how to deal with the nation's enemies. On Facebook, Leona Plato Coyne asks, "Where is Mrs. Obama's hashtag for the Marine held captive in Mexico? Where is Mrs. Obama's hashtag for Pastor Saeed Abedini?") FoxNews.com reports, "A small team of U.S. military personnel will arrive in Abuja, Nigeria, in the coming days to help find hundreds of schoolgirls kidnapped by Islamic terrorists, the Pentagon said Wednesday. The team will be composed of roughly 10 uniformed soldiers from AFRICOM headquarters in Stuttgart, Germany. They will be logistics and communications experts who will assess the situation and advise Nigerian officials, Pentagon spokesman Col. Steve Warren said. Warren also made clear the U.S. military has no plans to carry out a rescue mission." [58482, 58501, 58502, 58512]

At Townhall.com political editor Guy Benson reports that many of ObamaCare's alleged eight million enrollees are nothing more than duplicates, because the problems with Healthcare.gov prompted the government to suggest that applicants apply a second time. "What is almost certainly the case," writes Benson, "is that the genuine enrollment figure is seven figures lower that the White House-touted one. ... That's why the administration's enrollment statistics are useless in the aggregate. They just manufactured the largest-sounding number possible and heralded it as exciting proof that the 'law is working' and the

'debate is over.' Much of the media blindly repeated the number, some going so far as to pant excitedly about an Obamacare 'winning streak.'" [58486]

In one case, an employee was getting paid for one or two years after moving to a retirement home, where the employee allegedly did not work. When an investigation began, the worker was simply placed on sick leave. In another case, an employee with multiple-sclerosis was allowed to work at home for the last 20 years. However, for the past five years, she allegedly produced no work—though she was paid roughly \$600,000. She retired after an investigation. In yet another case, an employee was accused of viewing pornography for two-to-six hours a day since 2010. An IG probe found the worker had 7,000 pornographic files on his EPA computer." FreeBeacon.com reports, "Despite adding more than 8 million people to the working-age population since 2007, total employment has declined by half a million, according to an analysis by the Senate Budget Committee. Before ... Obama took office 259.7 million people were part of the working-age population, or between ages 16 and 65. Now, the number has risen to 267.7 million. However, in the same time period, total employment declined from 146.3 million to 145.7 million. In other words, 531,000 fewer people have jobs. 'This statistic highlights an alarming trend that has embodied [Obama's] economic policies: more and more people are leaving the workforce entirely,' according to the analysis, which was released by Ranking Member of the Senate Budget Committee Jeff Sessions (R-AL). But they acknowledged a huge fire that was sweeping the industrial city, about 130 kilometers north of Teheran. ...Iranian opposition

sources said scores of people were killed in the blast. They said Iranian Army and security forces closed much of Qazvin, with a population of 1.1 million." [58531]

The House of Representatives votes 231–to–187 to hold former IRS official Lois Lerner in contempt of Congress for refusing to testify about the agency's discrimination against conservative organizations that applied for tax-exempt status. Six Democrats join the Republicans in voting for the charge. The case will proceed to the Department of Justice, which will likely refuse to do anything—although Lerner could conceivably face up to one year in prison and a fine of \$100,000. (House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) does not cast a vote. According to TheHill.com, "She was... at a Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee fundraiser attended by [Obama] and roughly 90 guests at the home of Disney Chairman Alan Horn in Bel Air, Calif....") House Speaker John Boehner [R-OH], is right to convene a select committee devoted to uncovering all relevant facts connected to Benghazi, just as the House committees of jurisdiction were right to investigate Benghazi before this. Despite the passage of 20 months, there remain unresolved questions. Why was security for our facility in Libya inadequate, and why were repeated calls for additional security unheeded and, indeed, explicitly rejected? Was our military response during the pendency of the siege sufficient? And in the days and weeks after the attack, was the Obama administration transparent and forthright with our fellow Americans in describing the impetus behind the attack? Moreover, no one has been arrested, prosecuted, or punished for the murders of our fellow Americans. This trend has been ongoing for years. The latest exodus of workers pushed the labor force participation rate down from 63.2% to 62.8%, an unusually sharp monthly drop. Apart from October and December 2013, also at 62.8%, the rate now is at the lowest level since March 1978. Each individual who drops out of the job market creates another lost taxpayer and another individual who is more likely to receive government support. But the media coverage of the jobs data treated this stunning development as a mere afterthought. What should have been of particular concern, but was not even mentioned, was that more than 80% of the 288,000 jobs came from birth/death assumptions the government makes about the net number of new companies that formed during the month and the number of people those companies would have been expected to hire. For some reason the statisticians always assign a disproportionally high number of these assumed jobs to April and May. The rationale for this is likely buried deep within bureaucratic small print, so we have to take that number with a grain of salt. But what if only 100,000 new jobs were added as a result of birth/death

assumptions, as was averaged in February and March? ... The story even gets worse when you consider the types of jobs that are being added. As has been the case for years, the new hires are heavily weighted to the lower end of the spectrum, particularly in low-paying service sector and retail jobs. The drop in the labor participation rate would not be so alarming if those who remained working were finding jobs that could support families. But that is not what is happening. We are replacing good jobs with bad jobs and getting poorer with each passing month." [58504]

HotAir.com's Ed Morrissey writes, "Who didn't see this coming? According to Kaiser Health News, employers are increasingly looking at the benefits of getting out of the health-insurance delivery process. Fueling this interest are ObamaCare-related spikes in health-insurance premiums, plus the opportunity to fix costs and reduce vulnerabilities presented by employees who develop serious health issues. ... We have pointed out these perverse incentives in the employer mandate since before Democrats put the [Affordable Care Act] up for a vote. That will make a hash of the carefully managed cost analyses offered by ObamaCare supporters, and subsidy payments will explode far past the ability of revenues within the ACA to keep pace." (The Obama Timeline believes the Obama administration knows full well that thousands of employers will dump employees into the ObamaCare exchanges, and that it *wants* that to happen—because Obama's goal is to destroy the private health insurance industry and have American "covered" by, and dependent on, the federal government.) BayouBuzz.com reports, "[B]ased on a survey of 600 likely Louisiana voters conducted April 28-30, 2014, Senator Mary Landrieu (D-LA) continues to drop, with her positive rating now hitting an all-time low of 39% and her negative numbers skyrocketing to 58%. ...Senator Landrieu's job performance rating continues to deteriorate. Her positive

ratings have dropped to an all-time low of 39% in this current poll. Her negative ratings have increased by 30 percentage points in a little over a year and a half (from 28% in September 2012 to 58% in this current poll)." That Landrieu is chairman of the Senate Energy Committee seems not to be helping her: "59% of the voters thought electing someone new was more important than keeping her in office. Landrieu's seniority does little to sway voter choice for the U.S. Senate. Of the voters who responded they were undecided in the U.S. Senate trial heat question, 72% were of the opinion that electing someone new was more important than keeping her in office." The House Veterans Affairs Committee votes to subpoena Obama's Veteran Affairs Secretary, Eric Shinseki, and his staff to obtain documents and emails related to the revelations that the veterans hospital in Phoenix, Arizona maintained "secret lists" to hide the fact that veterans were being denied prompt medical care. There are also accusations that VA officials in Colorado, Wyoming, Illinois, North Carolina, Florida, Mississippi, New Mexico, and Texas have falsified appointment data to hide long wait times. Democrat members of Congress will likely be watching the polls closely, and will either defend Shinseki in order to protect Obama from yet another scandal, or call for his resignation if they think that is what the voting public wants.) WashingtonTimes.com reports, "Democratic leadership was encouraging members of their caucus to vote no on the creation of the panel, and a caucus meeting is scheduled for Friday morning to determine the party's next steps on whether or not Democrats will participate. Republicans are expected to announce the rest of their appointments to the committee on Friday. The panel is to be comprised of seven

Republicans and five Democrats." Congressman Steve King (R-IA) "said that if Democrats oppose the makeup of the House committee, they could set up a similar one in the Senate. 'They could set up their select committee in the Senate and run it just the way we are going to run one in the House,' Mr. King said." [58527, 58552, 58560]

Before the vote, Congressman Tom Cotton (R-AR) says on the floor of the House, "A couple lessons I learned in the Army were, you move to the sound of gunfire, and the most important step in the troop-leading procedures is to supervise the execution of your orders. When Americans were fighting for their lives in Benghazi, Barack Obama did neither. He sent no quick-reaction force, and he didn't even stay in the Situation Room to supervise the execution of his orders." Addressing Democrat criticism that the Benghazi committee is nothing more than a partisan political exercise, Cotton says, "When I was leading troops in Iraq in 2006, men and women who were being shot at and blown up by al-Qaeda, where was the outrage as they [Democrats] fundraised endlessly off the Iraq war? Yellen does not admit that the "official" inflation rate is kept artificially low. That is done in order to avoid paying out higher benefits to Social Security recipients. The "pretend" inflation rate also allowed the government to claim first quarter GDP growth was 0.1 percent, when it was almost assuredly negative. The numbers will probably continue to be manipulated in order to avoid an "official" recession—which is defined as two consecutive quarters of negative GDP growth. Mrs. Clinton, like the Obama administration more broadly, believes that appeasing Islamists—avoiding actions that might give them offense, slamming Americans who provoke them—promotes peace and stability. ...Furthermore, if you are claiming to have 'decimated' al-Qaeda, as the Obama administration was claiming to have done in the runup to the 2012 election, the last thing you want to do is add jihadists to the terror... It is very simple. Most of us on the national-security right recognize that Islamic supremacism is an ideology rooted in Muslim scripture—a strict, literal, ancient interpretation of

Muslim scripture. Essentially, it advocates the adoption of sharia, Islam's legal code and societal framework. It is not the only way of construing Muslim scripture... but Islamic supremacism is far more mainstream than the West likes to admit, particularly in the Middle East and growing swaths of Africa. It is an ideology that endorses violent jihad, the treatment of women as chattel, sex slavery, child marriages, and the other horrible stuff that outfits like Boko Haram are into. ... The Left, by contrast, seems to believe that 'Islamists'—adherents of Islamic supremacism (though the Left would not refer to 'Islamic supremacism')—are motivated not by an ideology derived from scriptural commands but by American policies that promote national defense, pursue other U.S. interests, and regard Israel as a key ally. Indeed, progressives like Mrs. Clinton are antianti-terrorists in the sense that they portray the national-security right as a greater threat than Islamic supremacism. Mrs. Clinton and her cohort do not deny that there are terrorists motivated by Islam. But they see *terrorists* and *Islamists* as separate categories, not united by a single ideology." [58591]

"Mrs. Clinton and ... Obama have convinced themselves that they know more about Islam than Muslim terrorists do, and that the peaceful, pliable, progressive Islam they have concocted somehow renders the jihadists' Islam false. This means, abracadabra, that Muslim terrorist groups can be miniaturized: They're not really Islamic, not really united by an ideology that seeks global conquest, and therefore should be seen as isolated, standalone, ragtag cabals whose grievances are strictly local. The Left has even done this with al-Qaeda: The organization heretofore regarded as global is now atomized into something they call 'core al-Qaeda'—which Obama purports to have 'decimated' by killing Osama bin Laden—and a bunch of regional franchises (al-Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb, al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula, etc.). We are supposed to see these franchises not as tentacles of an international terror network but as local gangs trying to make themselves look bigger and more threatening than they really are by adopting the 'al-Qaeda' brand name. ...[T]he Left not only marginalizes terrorists but divorces them from Islamists. Mrs. Clinton and [Obama] accept Islamists as authentic Muslims but see them as evolving beyond Islamic scripture and toward the progressive Islam of the Left's imagination. The mental gymnastics at work here require (a) studiously ignoring what Islamists actually believe and the fact that it squares with what Islamic terrorists believe; and (b) belittling, suppressing, and framing as an 'Islamophobe' anyone who has the audacity to point out what Islamists actually believe." "Having imposed the premise that the Islamists' version of Islam should not trouble us in the slightest, Mrs. Clinton and the Left posit that what really animates Islamists against the West are aspects of American policy—which, conveniently, just happen to be the same aspects of American policy opposed by the Left. If only we'd change these policies—less emphasis on American security and interests, more distance from Israel—we'd alter the perception that America is "at war with Islam." This will make Muslims like us better, promoting peace and stability. So that's the plan: pretend terrorists and Islamists are unconnected, miniaturize terrorists, and appease Islamists with the Left's policy preferences. It's the plan that convinces you not to put Boko Haram on the terrorist list—that way, you can pretend that the jihadists are not really that important while telling the Islamists, 'See? We're going to treat them like a local criminal gang—the fact

that they're Muslims citing scripture in support of their murder, mayhem, kidnapping and misogyny is irrelevant. No 'war on Islam' on our watch.'" [58591]

On *The Kelly File*, attorney Cleta Mitchell tells host Megyn Kelly that some tea party groups unknowingly complied with illegal IRS requests for donor lists, and the agency than used them to pick taxpayers to audit. Kelly notes, "And now if you happen to be on one of those lists, your odds of getting audited go up from 1 percent to 10 percent." [58608]

On May 9 House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) announces the names of the Republicans who will be on the select committee on Benghazi: Susan Brooks (IN), Trey Gowdy (SC), Jim Jordan (OH), Mike Pompeo (KS), Martha Roby (AL), Peter Roskam (IL) and Lynn Westmoreland (GA). Boehner states, "This investigation is about getting answers for the families of the victims and for the American people. These members have each demonstrated a commitment to this goal, and I have confidence that they will lead a serious, fact-based inquiry. As I have expressed to each of them, I expect this committee to carry out an investigation worthy of the American lives lost in Benghazi. I also urge my Democratic colleagues to treat this tragedy with the proper respect and appoint members so that we can finally, on a bipartisan basis, get answers, provide accountability, and help deliver justice. It is critical that this committee do its work in a focused, timely manner, so that the House can continue to make the economy and job creation its priorities." [58547, 58605, 58609]

Congresswoman Rosa DeLauro (D-CT) urges her fellow Democrats to appoint only one person to the Benghazi committee. She states, "Such a participant could maintain Democratic access to committee proceedings and material, question witnesses, monitor the House Majority's activities and provide a powerful voice to raise issues and make appropriate public comments." (In other words, "If we protest the committee by appointing no Democrats, we will not have a spy.") [58549]

House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) tells reporters, "[E]ither people have gotten tired about [sic; of] Benghazi or they never knew about it in the first place." [58547, 58572]

In a letter to House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH), Pelosi states the Democrats will appoint no one to the Benghazi committee. [58550]

At Townhall.com Katie Pavlich reports, "IRS officials have agreed to turn over all emails belonging to former head of tax exempt groups Lois Lerner as the Congressional probe into improper targeting of conservative groups by the agency gets deeper." DailyCaller.com adds, "New IRS commissioner John Koskninen previously said that it could take years to provide all of Lerner's emails to congressional investigators. But Ways and Means' referral of criminal charges against Lerner to the Department of Justice, coupled with the House of Representatives' holding Lerner in contempt of

Congress Wednesday, has changed the tenor of the investigation into the IRS conservative targeting scandal." (*The Obama Timeline* suspects the IRS is lying and will hold back Lerner's more incriminating emails, simply pretending that they do not exist.) [58548, 58551]

Mark Steyn, noting Michelle Obama's limp "#BringBackOurGirls" Twitter post, responds with a column titled, "#BringBackOurBalls." He writes, "It is hard not to have total contempt for a political culture that thinks the [Michelle Obama] picture... is a useful contribution to rescuing 276 schoolgirls kidnapped by jihadist savages in Nigeria. Yet some pajama boy at the White House evidently felt getting the First Lady to pose with this week's Hashtag of Western Impotence would reflect well upon the Administration. The horrible thing is they may be right: Michelle showed she cared—on social media!—and that's all that matters, isn't it? Just as the last floppo hashtag, #WeStandWithUkraine, didn't actually involve standing with Ukraine, so #BringBackOurGirls doesn't require bringing back our girls. There are only a half-dozen special forces around the planet capable of doing that without getting most or all of the hostages killed... So, unless something of that nature is being lined up, those schoolgirls are headed into slavery, and the wretched pleading passivity of Mrs Obama's hashtag is just a form of moral preening. ... As [blogger Daniel] Payne notes, these days progressive 'action' just requires 'calling on government' to act. But it's sobering to reflect that the urge to call on someone else to do something is now so reflexive and ingrained that even 'the government'—or in this case the wife of 'the government'—is now calling on someone else to do something." At NationalReview.com Nina Shea suggests "The Obama State Department's understanding of Boko Haram was even more delusional than [was] thought." "In 2012," writes Shea, "the State Department was declaring that Boko Haram was motivated not by Islamic extremism, but by anger at 'poor government service delivery' and 'poverty' generally. Its policy was to actively oppose Nigerian military involvement and support greater American aid and investment to the country, particularly to the areas giving rise to Boko Haram militants. ...The State Department attributed the phenomenon of Boko Haram to the poverty and low levels of literacy in the north, rather than the other way around. ...The U.S. State Department's delay in giving 'terrorist' designation to Boko Haram had real policy consequences. It helped the Obama campaign narrative that al-Qaeda was on the run. But it didn't help Nigeria, whose girls and boys, men and women, Christians and Muslims are now paying with their lives and living in dread of a larger, more powerful Boko Haram." [58671]

After the Ukrainian government shoots and kills 20 or more demonstrators, a U.S. State Department spokesman says, "We condemn the outbreak of violence caused by pro-Russia separatists." (Some might argue that the soldiers wielding the weapons caused the violence.) [58632]

On May 10 NYTimes.com reports, "Details emerged of a shooting last month [April 24] in which the Obama administration said two Americans killed two armed Yemeni

civilians who were trying to kidnap them. ... While much about the encounter remains unclear, a Yemeni official said the two civilians were part of a Qaeda-linked cell that had planned and executed several attacks on foreigners in the country. Whether by design or chance, the official said, the Americans had disrupted a kidnapping ring that government officials blame for killing a Frenchman last week, kidnapping a Dutch couple last year, trying to assassinate a German diplomat last month, and attacking the central prison in Sana in February, freeing 19 inmates." Obama's sanctions notwithstanding, reports Bloomberg.com, Russia "shipped 2 percent more gas to Europe in the first three months of 2014 than it did in the same period last year, government data show. Diesel output for export increased, while cargoes of grains, palladium and nickel either climbed or were about the same. Russia's crude oil exports fell 0.2 percent from last year. ... 'Investors are paying more for those commodities where there's perceived to be a greater risk of supply disruption,' said Caroline Bain, an analyst at Capital Economics in London. 'The data prove it hasn't happened yet, and if tensions subside, those risk premiums could diminish.' Last year, Russia produced 42 percent of the world's palladium, used in pollution-control devices [catalytic converters] in cars, and was the second-largest source of refined nickel, a component in stainless steel. At the same time, China was the world's biggest metal importer." According to ZeroHedge.com, Russia's Rosneft may also soon "join forces with Indian state-run Oil and Natural Gas Corp to supply oil to India over the long term... Russia is the world's top oil producer, pumping over 10 million barrels per day..." [58577, 58583]

According to *The Telegraph*, "The wife and two children of a retired police officer have been abducted by Boko Haram, and 3,000 people have fled the town of Liman Kara, after yet another attack. Three thousand people have fled their homes in northern Nigeria, and the wife and two children of a retired policeman have been abducted, as Islamist militants launch another attack on the embattled region. As the hunt for the missing 276 schoolgirls taken on April 14 continued, suspected Boko Haram militants continued their campaign of terror unabated." [58578]

Obama's weekly radio/Internet address is delivered by his wife Michelle, who notes the kidnapping of school girls in Nigeria and says, "In these girls, Barack and I see our own daughters. We see their hopes, their dreams—and we can only imagine the anguish their parents are feeling right now. Like millions of people across the globe, my husband and I are outraged and heartbroken. This unconscionable act was committed by a terrorist group determined to keep these girls from getting an education—grown men attempting to snuff out the aspirations of young girls. ...I hope that any young people in America who take school for granted—any young people who are slacking off or thinking of dropping out—I hope they will learn the story of these girls and recommit themselves to their education. ...We know that girls who are educated make higher wages, lead healthier lives, and have healthier families. And when more girls attend secondary school, that boosts their country's entire economy. So education is truly a girl's best chance for a bright future, not just for herself, but for her family and her nation." (Pamela Geller observes that Obama is "hiding behind his wife's skirt. It demeans the issue for

Obama to throw Michelle out there—this isn't about school obesity.") Mrs. Obama's comments are farcical. She blames "grown men" rather than the *real* cause of female suppression and suffering in the Muslim world: Islam. She then proposes her "solution": stay in school and don't slack off slack off, rather than annihilating the Islamist terrorists around the world—as if staying in school in the United States will somehow keep Nigerian thugs from engaging in horrific acts of violence.) It is worth noting that Michelle Obama and Hollywood leftists expressed no outrage in February, when Boko Haram killed more than 90 people in the mostly Christian village of Izge, Nigeria. They were also silent when Boko Haram murdered 59 school boys that same month. Some were shot and others were burned alive in their dormitory in the town of Buni Yadi. In April, members of the terrorist group killed 71 and wounded 124 at a bus station in Abuja, Nigeria. It was only after more than 200 school girls were kidnapped that the Obama administration and Hollywood appeared to pay any attention. (Murdering Christians and boys apparently warrants no outrage.) At JihadWatch.org, Robert Spencer writes, "While world leaders and mainstream media commentators continue to insist that Boko Haram, the Congregation of the People of the Sunnah for Dawah and Jihad, have nothing to do with Islam, the only people not to have gotten the memo are the members of Boko Haram itself." [58599]

According to *The Washington Post*, "Top Secret Service officials ordered members of a special unit responsible for patrolling the White House perimeter to abandon their posts over at least two months in 2011 in order to protect a personal friend of the agency's director... The new assignment, known internally as Operation Moonlight, diverted agents to a rural area outside the southern Maryland town of La Plata, nearly an hour's drive from Washington. Agents were told that then-Director Mark Sullivan was concerned that his assistant was being harassed by her neighbor, the three people said. Two agents were sent twice a day, in the morning and the evening, to monitor the home of the assistant, Lisa Chopey. The trips began June 30, 2011, and extended through the summer before tapering off in August, according to people familiar with internal shift records. The agents were members of a surveillance team code-named Prowler, which patrols the outskirts of the White House compound and responds to reported problems. The unit is also tasked with monitoring the southern side of the White House whenever crowds gather to watch [Obama] and first family travel via motorcade or helicopter. Agents inside the Washington field office were concerned that Operation Moonlight increased security risks to the compound and [Obama], two people familiar with the discussion said. ... The agents thought the reassignment was a potentially illegal use of government resources. They were concerned enough about their own liability that they kept records of their involvement and their superiors' instructions." (HotAir.com's Ed Morrissey writes, "The basic issue here is that this was none of the Secret Service's business. This was a matter for the local police and court to adjudicate; the employment of the assistant did not give Sullivan any writ or authority over the situation.") [58593, 58615]

On May 11 Newsmax.com reports, "Fast-food restaurants operating on military bases are in a bind: Due to an executive order signed by ... Obama, they are being forced to raise worker's compensation, but they can't raise prices to compensate. As a result, hundreds of fast-food outlets could close, eliminating thousands of jobs, the Washington Examiner reported. Obama on Feb. 12 signed the executive order raising the minimum wage for employees of federal contractors from \$7.25 to \$10.10 an hour. ... The order doesn't take effect until January 2015. But it is already having an impact. Military Times reported in late March that three McDonald's restaurants and another food outlet will soon close on Navy bases, while other national-name chains have 'asked to be released from their Army and Air Force Exchange Service contracts to operate fast-food restaurants at two other installations.' In addition to the increased minimum wage, fast-food employers must also pay a 'health and welfare' payment that the administration has now raised from \$2.56 to \$3.81 an hour. Fast-food operators in the past did not have to make the health and welfare payment, but the Obama Labor Department ruled last fall that they must. So between the increase of \$2.85 an hour in the minimum wage and the health and welfare payment, employers must pay \$6.66 more per hour to each employee. But 'military contracting laws do not allow businesses to raise their prices above the level prevailing in the local community,' the Examiner's Byron York noted. 'The fast-food operators can't charge more to make up their losses." [58554, 59117]

Obama's minimum wage increase also applies to private companies that provide services to nursing home facilities for veterans, and may force some of them to cease operations. Americac2c.com reports, "Sandy Franks, public affairs officer at Shreveport's [Louisiana] Overton Brooks V. A. Medical Center, explains that nursing homes that have contracts for subsidized care from the Veterans Administration become federal contractors. If they refuse to raise their wages [in accordance with Obama's executive order], their contracts will not be renewed. ... Shreveport Manor is owned by Gamble Guest Care. Their Chief Operating Officer [COO] says if they raise wages for workers there, they have to do that at all eight of their facilities. In a statement, Gamble COO Matt Machen said, in part, 'The additional labor expenses are simply unaffordable. As such, many long term care providers have indicated that they will no longer seek or renew V.A. contracts.' Franks at the V.A. agrees that this has the potential to be a national problem as more V.A. contracts with nursing homes expire." An increase from \$7.25 to \$10.10 per hour represents almost \$6,000 per year for a full-time employee. The nursing homes cannot pay the increases out of increased revenues because they cannot even consider increasing their fees until their federal contract expires—and there is no guarantee the next contracts will cover the increased costs. The Obama administration is essentially telling the facilities, "You must pay more money, but we will not give you more money." (It is tantamount to telling fast-food restaurants they must pay their workers more but are prohibited from raising prices to offset the increased costs.) The directive to increase wages means that some nursing homes will simply close their doors, and the aging veterans will be left to fend for themselves any way they can. [58585, 58781]

In the *New York Post* Michael Goodwin writes, "Not since Jimmy Carter was held hostage by Iran has the Oval Office seemed so inconsequential against the forces of

international darkness. The mismatch is particularly striking because smallness has been Obama's choice. ...[Obama's] estrangement from the demands of global leadership is giving a green light to tyrants and malevolent opportunists everywhere. His preference for navel gazing over action was on full display last week. We can teach our children warm and fuzzy things—assuming they and we are not killed by madmen first. In which case, there's nothing we can do. The speech reflects how little Obama has grown in office. He initially viewed American power as a problem that needed to be checked if the world was to find lasting peace and harmony. By and large, he followed that bad prescription by deliberately shrinking America's global footprint, and the result is the astonishing chaos we see around us. The vacuum is being filled not with democratic movements but by al Qaeda, China, Russia and other authoritarian regimes eager to take advantage of our retreat." [58845]

Obama "congratulates Michael Sam, the Rams & the NFL for taking an important step forward today in our Nation's [sic; nation's] journey. From the playing field to the corporate boardroom, LGBT Americans prove everyday [sic; every day] that you should be judged by what you do and not who you are." (Sam, an openly gay football player, is selected by the St. Louis Rams in the seventh round of the annual NFL draft. Why a fuss must be made about Sam's choice of sexual partners is unclear. Why it is relevant to his playing ability is also unclear—his being chosen in the final rounds says enough about his abilities. Obama does not explain the nature of the "journey" the nation is on.) Obama breaks with tradition and does not tweet a photo of himself to "commemorate" the occasion. (To argue that people should be judged by what they do and not who they are incorrectly suggests that "who they are" has no relation to "what they do." If a man wears a dress to work and wants to use the women's bathroom, he should most certainly expect to be judged by "what he does.") [58646, 58647]

On Fox News Sunday Congressman Xavier Beccera (D-CA) suggests that House Democrats may participate in the select committee on Benghazi is "fair and balanced"—yet House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) has demanded that Democrats sign off on all subpoenas issued by the committee. (An investigation can hardly be fair and balanced if the Democrats block the Republicans from subpoenaing relevant documents or calling for testimony from key participants, such as then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, then-ambassador to the United Nations Susan Rice, or any of the survivors of the

attack.) On a Fox News panel later in the evening, the Benghazi scandal is discussed by Democrat strategists Pat Caddell and Doug Schoen, and former Republican Congressman John Leboutillier. According to Leboutillier, the survivors of the Benghazi attack have not only been ordered by the Obama administration not to talk about what happened, but have been subjected to monthly lie detector tests to affirm that they have not been doing so. There have also been accusations that some survivors have been given aliases in order to hide them. Those who believe the issue has been investigated thoroughly need to explain why the administration is afraid to have survivors testify. One of those who survived the attack is reportedly a State Department employee, diplomatic security agent David Ubben, who was severely injured and has been forbidden by the Obama Administration from speaking publicly. The select committee should subpoena Ubben and have him testify. The nation can then perhaps learn why the Obama administration is afraid to have him speak.) It was an opportunistic terrorist attack that... grew out of that video... If you're gonna put people on trial we should put [former CIA director] David Petraeus on trial, not Hillary Clinton." Clift does not elaborate on the manner in which the three other Americans died in Benghazi. One Twitter user writes, "I guess Mary Jo Kopechne wasn't left to drown, she just inhaled too much water.") Reuters reports, "Israel offered Nigeria help... in locating 200 schoolgirls abducted last month by Islamist rebel group Boko Haram in an attack that has drawn global condemnation and prompted some Western powers to provide assistance. 'Israel expresses deep shock at the crime against the girls,' Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office quoted him as telling Nigerian President Goodluck Jonathan by phone. 'We are ready to help in finding the girls and fighting the cruel terrorism inflicted on you.' The statement did not elaborate on how Israel might enlist in the search, with which British and U.S. experts are also helping. A spokesman for Israel's Foreign Ministry said he knew of no cooperation efforts under way. Israel has defense ties with Nigeria, and has provided it in the past with surveillance drones. Last September, Israel was among several countries that sent advisers to Kenya to assist in a stand-off with Islamist gunmen who attacked a mall in Nairobi." (Whether Netanyahu's wife will post a fear-inducing hashtag on Twitter remains to be seen.) [58596]

Apparently not cowed by Hillary Clinton's and Michelle Obama's Twitter messages, Boko Haram blows up a bridge, kills more villagers, and abducts the wife and children of a retired police officer. NYPost.com reports, "News of the ongoing carnage came as a team of French intelligence experts landed in the country, joining American and British teams with hopes of rescuing 276 school girls kidnapped more than three weeks ago by the terrorist group. According to a May 2–4 CNN/ORC International poll, only 12 percent of Americans want ObamaCare left "as is." Forty-nine percent want to "make some changes," 18 percent call for "repeal and replace," and 20 percent want full repeal. [58633, 58634]

The Wall Street Journal reports that health insurers in Virginia plan to increase premiums in 2015 by as much as 16.6 percent. "[T]he Anthem HealthKeepers Inc. plan offered by a unit of WellPoint said it would raise premiums by an average of 8.5% across its individual plans in Virginia, which cover about 110,000 people and are sold on the online insurance exchange set up by the health law, as well as directly to consumers... The Virginia filings show other health plans proposing rate increases ranging from 3.3% for Kaiser Foundation Health Plan of the Mid-Atlantic States, Inc., with around 10,000 members in the state, to 14.9% for CareFirst BlueChoice Inc., which said it had about 32,000 members... For HealthKeepers policyholders, the impact of the 8.5% increase varies across the different individuals' plans being sold in Virginia. Some consumers could see an increase of 16.6%, while others will see their rates go up only 0.5%, the company's filing says." [58634, 58635, 58653, 58789]

On May 12 Guy Benson writes at Townhall.com, "A... salient question about the administration's oft-touted [ObamaCare] enrollment totals is how many of those 'newly insured' consumers actually lacked coverage prior to the advent of Obamacare? Dozens of girls were shown wearing full veils and praying in the video, whose contents could not immediately be independently verified by NBC News. 'These girls have become Muslims,' Shekau said in the 17-minute recording, according to a translation from AFP. 'We will never release them until after you release our brethren.'" Soros, a New York City hedge fund manager who amassed great wealth through his company Soros Fund Management, has used his foundation network—known as the Open Society Foundations (OSF)—to dispense more than \$11 billion to groups abroad as well as numerous left-leaning U.S. groups in the last three decades. He is perhaps the Democratic Party's most famous donor, contributing almost \$24 million to advocacy groups that supported Kerry's failed presidential bid in 2004, according to the Center for Responsive Politics. He also donated \$1 million to the Priorities USA Action Super PAC that helped reelect ... Obama in 2012." (Pamela Geller calls Soros "one of the most dangerous and politically powerful individuals on earth." The American Enterprise Institute's Michael Rubin says hosting Soros—who once wrote that "the main obstacle to a stable and just world order is the United States"—is the "diplomatic equivalent of prostitution." NASA is working to restore U.S. transport to the station by 2017." (Obama's sanctions against some prominent Russians prevents them from visiting Disney World. How could this determination have been made when the duration of the attack was unknown?" "Where was [Obama] during the hours-long raid? ... With an ambassador missing, a consulate under attack, and American lives hanging in the balance, why wasn't he actively managing the US response?" "During the attack, a rapidresponse, investigative "FEST" team was reportedly told to stand down. Is that true, and if so, why?" According to ZeroHedge.com, Russia has "dumped a record \$26 billion [in U.S. Treasury debt], or some 20% of all of its holdings, bringing its post-March total to just over \$100 billion—the lowest since the Lehman crisis." Meanwhile, a "mystery buyer" has, acting

through Belgium, purchased as much as \$381 billion in Treasury debt over a number of months, including \$40 billion in March alone. "The question remains: who? Who has bought a whopping \$200 billion in Treasurys using Belgium as a proxy since October?" Author and economist Peter Schiff observes, "What is clear is that this is not likely the government of Belgium, or private Belgian capital, that is doing the buying. The numbers are just too large. This is particularly true in the First Quarter of 2014 when the buying averaged a stunning \$41.5 billion per month (January was the biggest month with \$54 billion). In all likelihood, the only European buyer with a wallet that big would be the European Central Bank (ECB) itself. But why would the ECB buy when the Federal Reserve was supposed to be tapering?" (Meanwhile, George Soros' Soros Fund Management LLC, has, according to Bloomberg.com, "sold out of its positions in JPMorgan Chase & Co. (JPM), Citigroup Inc. and Bank of America Corp., according to a [May 15] regulatory filing... JPMorgan has dropped 12 percent since March 31 and Bank of America has slid 15 percent.") Former Assistant Treasury Secretary Paul Craig Roberts comments on the Treasury debt purchases via Belgium: "There is only one source. The money came from the US Federal Reserve, and the purchase was laundered through Belgium in order to hide the fact that actual Federal Reserve bond purchases during November 2013 through January 2014 were \$112 billion per month. In other words, during those 3 months there was a sharp rise in bond purchases by the Fed. The Fed's actual bond purchases for those three months are \$27 billion per month above the original \$85 billion monthly purchase and \$47 billion above the official \$65 billion monthly purchase at that time. "...A hundred billion dollar sale of US Treasuries is a big sale. If the seller was a big holder of Treasuries, the sale could signal the bond market that a big holder might be selling Treasuries in large chunks. Such a stampede would raise interest rates, collapse US financial markets, and raise the cost of financing the US debt. To avoid the rise in interest rates, the Fed would have to accept the risk to the dollar of purchasing all the bonds. This would be a no-win situation for the Fed, because a large increase in QE would unsettle the market for US dollars. ... That the Fed believed that it could not buy the bonds outright but needed to disguise its purchase by laundering it through Belgium suggests that the Fed is concerned that the world is losing

Political instability would rise. If the dollar lost substantial value, the dollar would lose its reserve currency status. Washington would not be able to issue new debt or new dollars in order to pay its bills. Its wars and hundreds of overseas military bases could not be financed. The withdrawal from unsustainable empire would begin. The rest of the world would see this as the silver lining in the collapse of the international monetary system brought on by the hubris and arrogance of Washington." The problem faced by the federal government was apparently that it could find no new buyers for \$104 billion in new bonds to replace those that had just been redeemed. When China or Russia (or some other bondholder) redeemed \$104 billion in bonds, the Treasury Department had no choice but to hand over \$104 billion in cash. But the Treasury Department also has to pay the government's bills—and it does not have \$104 in cash sitting around collecting dust. It therefore quickly had to raise \$104 billion to replace the lost assets. The Federal Reserve secretly came to the rescue, essentially creating money out of thin air with new bond purchases. As Roberts suggests, the Obama administration did not want the markets to know that the situation was dire. If the Federal Reserve did not buy the debt, the Treasury Department would have had to offer a higher interest rate to attract a normal buyer. But the government cannot afford to pay higher interest rates. It already pays hundreds of billions of dollars per year in interest on the national debt—and that is at historically low interest rates. If interest rates were to climb by even a point or two, the deficit would increase substantially. The episode shows how precarious the finances of the U.S. government are. With \$17 trillion in debt, the government's entire house of fiscal cards could collapse if too many holders of that debt came forward and demand their portion to be paid off. (The situation is tantamount to a family with massive credit card debt, living from paycheck to paycheck. It makes a minimum payment on one card, and then another, and makes new purchases with still others. For the U.S. government, the Federal Reserve is the new credit card that arrives in the mail. But that new card does not *solve* the problem; it merely delays the inevitable day of reckoning. The Federal Reserve and the Treasury Department have no idea how to solve their problem. All they can do is juggle their credit cards.)

WND.com reports, "Criminal illegal aliens released by the Obama administration [who were arrested] between 2008 and 2011 went on to be charged with 19 murders, three attempted murders and 142 sex crimes, a House Judiciary Committee report previously documented. The statistics pose a grim outlook for the 36,007 additional criminal illegal aliens reportedly released last year by the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement agency, or ICE. A 2012 House report reviewed the effectiveness of the Secure Communities program, a project initially launched by the Bush administration to build databases that identify illegal aliens who qualify for deportation. The data covered arrests from October 2008 through July 2011. The report analyzed data on 159,286 legal and illegal immigrants arrested by state or local police, including 7,283 illegal aliens who could have been deported but who were not taken into custody by ICE despite being identified as living in the country unlawfully. The data shows that along with drunk-

driving charges, the released illegals went on to commit 16,226 new crimes, including 19 murders, 142 sex offenses, 1,420 drug crimes, 682 cases of burglary or theft and 48 firearms charges. On Monday, a Center for Immigration Studies report found that in 2013, ICE again released violent criminals, this time including murderers, rapists, kidnappers and drug dealers. The offenders were among the 36,007 criminal illegal aliens released last year who committed 87,818 crimes, including 15,635 for driving while intoxicated. The statistics show ICE released illegals jailed for 9,187 dangerous drug infractions, 426 sexual assault convictions, 303 kidnapping convictions, 193 homicide convictions, 1,317 domestic violence convictions and 1,075 aggravated assault convictions." Do these numbers suggest that your Department is employing 'catch and release' enforcement tactics?" Breitbart.com reports that Immigrations and Customs Enforcement (ICE) offices have refused to comment on the issue of the 36,000 criminals—who have committed 88,000 crimes. We look into the faces of nearly 3,000 innocent souls—men and women and children of every race and every creed from every corner of the world. We can touch their names and hear their voices. Here we tell their story so that generations yet unborn will never forget," he said. And in spite of the tragedy, he added, America is a stronger and more resilient nation. [This] nation [stands] tall and united and unafraid because no act of terror can match the strength and character of our country. Like a great wall and bedrock that embraces us today, nothing can ever break us. Nothing can change who we are as Americans. Those we lost live on in us. In the families who love them still. In the friends who remember them always. And in a nation that will honor them now—and forever." [58746, 58760, 58771]

In Sudan, a Muslim judge condemns a pregnant Christian woman to flogging and death by hanging because she refused to convert to Islam. According to WND.com, the U.S. State Department issues a statement: "We are deeply disturbed over the sentencing today of Meriam Yahya Ibrahim Ishag to death by hanging for apostasy. ... We continue to call upon the government of Sudan to respect the right to freedom of religion, a right which is enshrined in Sudan's own 2005 Interim Constitution as well as international human rights law." Human rights advocate Robert Spencer states, "It's possible that the Obama administration could put pressure on the Sudanese government to release this woman and give her protection from Shariah vigilantes, but because of the administration's willful ignorance regarding jihad and Shariah, it will certainly not do that. ... Soon afterwards Wani began the process of applying for a spousal visa to bring his bride to the safety of the United States, but he still had not received the visa when Ibrahim was arrested and charged with adultery in August 2013. According to Amnesty International, a distant relative reported her to the authorities. The court added the further charge of apostasy in February 2014 when Ibrahim asserted that she was a Christian and not a Muslim and provided them with her marriage certificate indicating her Christian faith and the location of her wedding in a church in Khartoum. ...On Thursday State Department deputy spokeswoman Marie Harf released a statement that was almost word for word the tepid statement released by the U.S. Embassy in Khartoum on May 13. 'We understand that the court sentence can be appealed,' meekly says the State Department. Perhaps they need to be reminded of the following facts, omitted from their statement: This is the wife of an American citizen. Her toddler, also imprisoned, is an American citizen. Her unborn baby will be an American citizen. Concerned citizens should also point out that the U.S. State Department, eager as it is to indiscriminately provide visas in some cases, has made it impossible for a Christian American citizen to bring his wife to the United States by not providing a spousal visa in a timely manner (nor, indeed, at all yet, as of this writing)." The Media Research Center (MRC) announces "it has filed a motion in US District Court [Media Research Center v. The senator also sent a letter to then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton urging her to do the same.") [58798, 58812]

Meanwhile, residents of the Nigerian village of Rann fight back when attacked by Boko Haram terrorists. At Shoebat.com Theodore Shoebat reports, "a certain militia, awaiting for their attackers, rose up with their guns and bravely attacked the jihadists. Four hundred Muslim fighters arrived at around 3:00 AM, and they stormed the village, only to be counterattacked by the militias who came on the attack with guns and bows and arrows. By the end of the violent struggle, the militia managed to slaughter 200 jihadists. ... The situation in Nigeria will lead to a civil war. This is why a society must have the right to bear arms. A people who do not bear arms, will eventually be killed off by those do." [58819]

WIBX reports, "Officials at Remington Arms confirmed today that the Bushmaster and R1 Automatic hand gun manufacturing lines will be moving from Ilion [New York] to the new Huntsville, Alabama plant, according to media reports. The move is expected to cost about 80 or more local jobs, although that hasn't yet been confirmed by Remington. Media reports say it could cost as many as 200 Herkimer County jobs. The New York Times reports that the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has "set up an emergency shelter" at Texas' Lackland Air Force base to cope with increasing numbers of illegally immigrant minors who are crossing the border without parents. "The flow of child migrants has been building since 2011, when 4,059 unaccompanied youths were apprehended by border agents. Last year more than 21,000 minors were caught, and Border Patrol officials had said they were expecting more than 60,000 this year. But that projection has already been exceeded. By law, unaccompanied children caught crossing illegally from countries other than Mexico are treated differently from other migrants. After being apprehended by the Border Patrol, they must be turned over within 72 hours to a refugee resettlement office that is part of the Health Department. Health officials must try to find relatives or other adults in the United States who can care for them while their immigration cases move through the courts, a search that can take several weeks or

more." Texas Governor Rick Perry argues that using the base for a shelter only encourages more illegal immigrants. [58902]

Hillary Clinton addresses the New America Foundation in Washington, D.C., with what some may suggest is her first campaign speech. At WashingtonExaminer.com Byron York writes that Clinton "repeatedly criticized economic and social conditions under ...Obama, barely mentioning the accomplishments of the man who appointed her secretary of State. Clinton's address... was a broad indictment of the country's current leadership, with exactly one—[only] one—note of praise for [Obama]. ... In remarks focused almost exclusively on domestic economic concerns, Clinton began by noting what she called 'the basic bargain of America.' 'No matter who you are or where you come from,' she said, echoing her husband's campaigns from the 1990s, 'if you work hard and play by the rules, you'll have an opportunity to build a good life.' But: 'For too many families in America today, that isn't the way it works. Instead of getting ahead, they're finding it harder and harder than ever to get their footing in our changing economy. The dream of upward mobility that made this country a model for the world feels further and further out of reach..... 'Forget about getting rich,' Clinton told the audience, 'I'm talking about getting into the middle class and staying there.' While productivity is up, Clinton noted, 'wages have stagnated.' 'Americans are working harder, contributing more than ever ... and yet many are still barely getting by.' ... To get the country out of its current hole, Clinton said, 'We'll need some big ideas, like evidence-based decision making—an old idea that I hope can be restored.' The Democratic Party line would, of course, hold that Obama has restored 'evidence-based decision making,' but Clinton spoke as if that never happened. ... Any Democratic candidate for president, especially one who served under Obama, will have to strike a tone that both calls for change and pays tribute to his achievements. Friday's speech shows that Clinton is more inclined to call for change." [58807, 58818, 58837]

Addressing high school students for a "senior recognition day" in Topeka, Kansas, Michelle Obama says, "[M]any young people are going to schools with kids who look just like them," and "Today, by some measures, our schools are as segregated as they were back when Dr. King gave his final speech. ... And too often, those schools aren't equal, especially ones attended by students of color which too often lag behind [sic]." (Michelle Obama is incorrect. There is no legal segregation in American schools. There is, of course, some segregation of races simply because of where people live, and some black and Hispanic students may be exposed to fewer white students than were there parents because of declining birth rates among whites, but no *legal* segregation is causing those changes. By schools that "aren't equal" Mrs. Obama no doubt means varying amounts of spending, but according to the Census Bureau, public schools in the District of Columbia spend more money per student per year—about \$30,000—than public schools in the 50 states—yet the D.C. schools are generally considered to be among the worst in the nation, with 80 percent lacking proficiency in reading and math. She may want to entertain the thought that perhaps it is the students and parents in the nation's capitol who are the problem, rather than the schools and their budgets. Mrs. Obama does not mention that her children attend an incredibly expensive—and predominantly white—private school, or that she and her husband oppose voucher programs that give

children in poor neighborhoods a chance to attend good private schools. Barack Obama, Senator Dick Durbin (D-IL), and their fellow Democrats once worked to end a voucher program in Washington, D.C., even though it reduced per pupil costs by 25 percent and was incredibly popular with parents. "But no matter what you do," continues Mrs. Obama, "the point is to never be afraid to talk about these issues, particularly the issue of race. Because even today, we still struggle to do that. Because this issue is so sensitive, is so complicated, so bound up with a painful history. And we need your generation to help us break through. We need all of you to ask the hard questions and have the honest conversations, because that is the only way we will heal the wounds of the past and move forward to a better future." (Her assumption that people are afraid to talk about race is absurd. It is talked about incessantly, and far too often. The best way to get past the issue of race is to *not* make a fuss about it. The media should *not* emphasize that a particular person is the "first black" this or that—because his or her race is *irrelevant*. Emphasizing race contributes to racism. The "wounds of the past" are, of course, in the past. The United States has no living slaves or slave owners; discrimination based on race is illegal; and being accused of racism has become the charge any person of integrity and consequence fears. The election of Barack Obama, far from defusing the issue of race, has arguably aggravated the situation because of the frequency with which he, his administration, and his supporters use "the race card" as an excuse for failure and leverage for political advantage. The nation would have been far better off had the words race and racism never been uttered after Obama's election. But the race card must be played by the Democrats, because no Democrat presidential candidate has won the white vote since Lyndon Baines Johnson in 1964. At a time when, tragically, we are seeing increased efforts to criminalize or oppress LGBT persons, we call on partners everywhere to join us in defending the equal rights of our LGBT brothers and sisters, and in ensuring they are treated with the dignity and respect they deserve." (Obama apparently believes that being opposed to dress-wearing boys who want to use girls' bathrooms somehow rises to the level of 1950s racism.) [58767, 59768]

At FrontPageMag.com Daniel Greenfield notes that, in an effort to help Obama, McClatchy newspapers ran a story in 2008 titled, "Some wonder if McCain's too old and wrinkly to be president. ... By October, spurred by repeated media attacks on his age, 34 percent of Americans said that McCain was too old to be president. The sharp spike in the poll numbers over one month showed how effective the Democratic age smear was. Had McCain been elected, he would have taken office at 72. If Hillary Clinton wins, she'll be 69. On MSNBC's Politics Nation, Congressman Alan Grayson (D-FL) tells host Al Sharpton he would like to serve on the select committee on Benghazi if House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) decides to assign one or more Democrats. Judicial Watch announced Thursday that it has filed suit against the Office of the Director of National Intelligence [DNI]. The constitutional advocacy group has named DNI adviser Theodore H. Moran as working for Chinese company Huawei Technologies while on the US government payroll. According to Judicial Watch, the Chinese company, Huawei Technologies, has been cited by the United States Congress as having potential ties to Chinese intelligence. According

to a 2012 House Intelligence Committee report, Huawei and the Chinese government's relationship could provide for 'economic and foreign espionage by a foreign nation-state already known to be a major perpetrator of cyber espionage.' DNI adviser Moran may have a serious conflict of interest due to his relationship with Huawei. According to Judicial Watch, his role at the Office of DNI was to 'provide intelligence agencies with judgments on key international issues, including foreign investments in the U.S.' ...Judicial Watch President Tom Fitton said of the pending suit, 'Once again, we've had to sue the Obama administration to get basic information about a pressing national security issue. We want basic documents to evaluate any conflicts of interest at the heart of our nation's intelligence establishment—the Office of the Director of National Intelligence." (Clapper, Obama's Director of National Intelligence, is not particularly intelligent. The Veterans Administration announces the resignation of Robert Petzel, undersecretary for health—possibly believing it will appease critics of the scheduling scandal. VA Secretary Eric Shinseki states, "Today, I accepted the resignation of Dr. Robert Petzel, Under Secretary for Health in the Department of Veterans Affairs. As we know from the Veteran community, most Veterans are satisfied with the quality of their VA health care, but we must do more to improve timely access to that care." Shinseki's statement implies that Petzel is being relieved of his duties because of the scandal. In fact, in September 2013 40-year employee Petzel had announced his retirement. The White House releases its own deceptive statement: "Today Secretary Shinseki accepted the resignation of Dr. Robert Petzel, Under Secretary for Health in the Department of Veterans Affairs. [Obama] supports Secretary Shinseki's decision." The statement suggests that Shinseki demanded Petzel's resignation, but there is no "decision" for Obama to "accept"—Petzel simply retired. (Both Shinseki's and Obama's statements are intended to make people believe that Petzel is being "thrown under the bus" because of the scandal, but he is merely being "Photoshopped under the bus." Petzel may possibly be partly to blame for the despicable actions of the VA, but there is no indication that he did not retire of his own free will. 'My guess is that [Obama's] staff want[ed] to be in control and not to be forced into a position that they have not been seeking themselves,' he said. 'It could have been perceived that someone was consciously or subconsciously thinking about the prospect of having Obama visit Norway. Obama wouldn't have visited Norway if it hadn't have been for the Peace Prize." [58800]

FoxNews.com reports, "As Hollywood hotshots protest the iconic Beverly Hills Hotel over its ownership by Brunei's sultan—and his recent full-fledged embrace of Islamic law—it turns out the Brunei government has financial connections to another American institution: The Clinton Foundation. The nonprofit foundation lists Brunei alongside Kuwait, Oman and Qatar as donors that gave between \$1 million and \$5 million through last year. The foundation confirmed the donation from Brunei was made in 2002, in connection with the construction of the Clinton Presidential Library in Arkansas. 'The Clinton Foundation's impact would not be possible without the generous support of our donors,' the foundation's website reads. 'Their contributions have made a difference in the lives of tens of millions across the world.' The contribution could prove an uncomfortable detail in the foundation's financial records, particularly as Hillary Clinton weighs a possible presidential run. Though The Clinton Foundation has thus far avoided any major controversy over the matter, a Brunei connection has caused headaches for the Beverly Hills Hotel on the other side of the country. Brunei's Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah has come under heavy criticism since the ultra-wealthy leader, who has been in power for decades, embraced a harsh Islamic penal code for his southeast Asian nation of roughly

408,000 residents. The change would make adultery, abortion and same-sex relationships offenses punishable by ancient methods—flogging, or even stoning." [58813]

Pamela Geller completes the story: "Daniel Greenfield reported last October that 'Odeh works as an associate director at the Arab American Action Network, a Chicago-area nonprofit group that advocates for new immigrants and tries to combat anti-Muslim and anti-Arab prejudice, according to its director, Hatem Abudayyeh.' And 'the Arab American Action Network [AAAN] has some ties to, who else, Barack Hussein Obama.' So who knows how this plea will go. With Odeh's friends in high places, expect her to get off lightly." Khalidi also taught at the University of Chicago, lived near the Obamas in Hyde Park, and has been their friend and frequent dinner companion. While Obama served on the board of the Woods Fund, it approved (in 2001) a \$40,000 grant to the Arab American Action Network (AAAN). A second grant, for \$35,000, was approved in 2002. In 2003, Obama attended a dinner held in honor of Khalidi. Obama has consistently denied a close relationship with Khalidi, even though the Obamas have dined more than once at the home of Khalidi and his wife, Mona, and used them as occasional baby-sitters. Obama praised Khalidi during the decidedly anti-Semitic event. William Ayers also attended the dinner, and both Ayers and Obama signed Khalidi's guest book. One speaker at the dinner, which was sponsored by the AAAN, remarks that if Palestinians cannot secure a return of their land, Israel "will never see a day of peace." The Los Angeles Times has a videotape of the Khalidi dinner but refuses to make it public. It is assumed the tape's contents are damaging to Obama, likely because the event included anti-Semitic sentiments and Obama heaping praise on Khalidi. Further, appearing as entertainment at the Khalidi dinner was a children's dance group, the Sanabel AlQuds Dabka troupe. The Milwaukee-based Muslim children's dance group typically performs the "debka," a Middle-Eastern dance. The group's performances have been known to include simulated beheadings with fake swords, and stomping on American, Israeli, and British flags. It has been alleged that, in his speech at the Khalidi dinner, Obama stated "Israel has no God-given right to occupy Palestine," and there has been "genocide against the Palestinian people by (the) Israelis." Experts warned that his case could signal the start of a new wave of British-Nigerian extremists travelling to fight for Boko Haram, attracted by its global notoriety following the kidnapping of more than 270 girls. The Nigerian authorities are now seeking the extradition of Ogwuche for the bombings of a poor suburb of Abuja, which is home to people displaced by the government's war against Boko Haram in the north of the country. ... Former classmates in Wales spoke of their shock that Ogwuche had been alleged to be a terrorist mastermind after spending three years studying for a degree in business science at the University of Glamorgan—now the University of South Wales from 2007 to 2010. ... During his time in Britain in 2010, his Facebook pages included comments expressing his willingness to die. The following year it read: 'The only punishment of those who wage war against Allah and His Messenger and strive to make mischief in the land is that they should be murdered, or crucified, or their hands and their feet should be cut off, or they should be imprisoned." (Pamela Geller comments, "So remember, when the dhimmedia ["dhimmi media"] and political clowns like [Secretary of State] John Kerry tell you that jihad is about poverty or that Boko Haram is off in some distant corner of the planet where such things happen... they are clueless or

complicit. But ignorance is unacceptable. In fact, it is an outrage. There is no excuse for not knowing, or worse, apologetics. 'What I saw at N.S.A. is that there is a lot more coming our way.' 'We're at greater risk,' Alexander said. 'Look at the way Al Qaeda networks. In Libya, gunmen storm parliament as gun fights between rival militias erupt across Tripoli. According to Reuters, "Saudi Arabia closed its embassy and consulate in the Libyan capital and withdrew its entire diplomatic staff on Monday because of security concerns. Underscoring the turmoil, the commander of the Libyan army special forces, Wanis Bukhamada, said on Monday that he had allied with renegade general Khalifa Haftar [or Hafter] in his campaign against militant Islamists. The Tripoli government has denounced Haftar as attempting to stage a coup." WorldTribune.com later reports, "Diplomatic sources said renegade Gen. Khalifa Hafter was receiving guidance and military support from Egypt. ... 'The Arab states see Hafter as the only hope to provide stability in Libya,' a diplomat said. The sources said Hafter succeeded in recruiting virtually the entire Libyan military. They said the military, despite statements by the General Staff, has not stopped operations by troops loyal to Hafter. Hafter, said to have worked with the CIA for more than 20 years, has long been seen as a supporter of the United States. But the sources said Egypt and the GCC [Gulf Cooperation Council] groomed Hafter for a takeover of Libya after they determined that the United States was protecting the Islamist militias connected to the Muslim Brotherhood. 'The assessment by the Arab regimes was that Washington wanted the Islamists regardless of what this was doing to Libya,' another source said." (That is, as a result of Obama's efforts to oust President Hosni Mubarak and support the radical Muslim Brotherhood, Egypt does not trust Obama. Egypt's current leaders also believes Obama's actions to remove Libyan leader Moammar Gaddafi were meant to give power to the radical Islamists.) [58994, 590871

By a three-to-one margin, voters in Switzerland reject the establishment of a minimum wage of approximately \$25 per hour. There are powerful interests that won't want to see the petition succeed and it may go nowhere. But the sentiment it expresses is spreading fast. Street Journal's MarketWatch. 'Flaring gas releases CO2 as a byproduct of combustion, so it would be environmentally preferable for the gas to be sold.' One-third of North Dakota's total production is flared. Allowing more exports would help the state's economy and increase America's gross domestic product." [58830]

Newsmax.com reports, "As the Department of Veterans Affairs faces an increasing amount of scrutiny over allegations of "secret" waiting lists that left veterans at VA hospitals untreated for months, a new report shows that the VA settled several claims that appear related to treatment delays. The Dayton Daily News, in a story published Sunday, says its investigation of a database of paid claims shows that since 2001 the words 'delay in treatment' were used 167 times. The VA paid out \$36.4 million to settle the claims, the Daily News reported. ... More than 100 payments a year are made on claims that veterans died as a result of VA medical care, the Daily News and WSB-TV in Atlanta reported. So far, the VA has admitted that 23 veterans have died waiting for care, but the Daily News said that number could be closer to 1,100 from 2001 through 2013, according to records it obtained through the Freedom of Information Act." On Meet the Press, Republican National Chairman Reince Priebus says he does not think Hillary Clinton will run for president in 2016, and that questions about her age and health are fair game: "It's going to be an issue. It's going to come up... We're going to be at this point at some time if Hillary Clinton runs for president. I mean the issue of her health and her age is going to come up. And it's... I'm not a doctor. What I do know is that the issue's going to come up, as it does for any person running for president. 'The 'secret wait list' for patient appointments is being either moved or was destroyed after what happened in Phoenix,' according to a doctor who works at the Albuquerque VA hospital and spoke exclusively with The Daily Beast. 'Right now,' the doctor said, 'there is an eight-month waiting list for patients to get ultrasounds of their hearts. Some patients have died before they got their studies. It is unknown why they died, some for cardiac reasons, some for other reasons.' ... When another of the doctor's colleagues, a physician in a managerial position at the Albuquerque VA, saw the initial story about secret wait lists break he heard him say, 'I always knew that Phoenix was better than us at playing the numbers game.' ... Veterans with heart problems are waiting an average of four months to see a cardiologist at the Albuquerque VA, according to the doctor there who has access to patient records. There are eight physicians in the cardiology department. But at any given time, only three are working in the clinic, where they see fewer than two patients per day, so on average there are only 36 veterans seen per week. That means the entire eightperson department sees as many patients in a week as a single private practice cardiologist sees in two days, according to the doctor." [58890]

On May 19 White House press secretary Jay Carney is asked when Obama and other top administration officials learned of the Veterans Administration's "secret waiting lists" of veterans seeking medical treatment. Carney (who says that Obama "has confidence in Secretary [Eric] Shinseki"), responds, "... I believe, uh, we learned about them through, uh, the [news media] reports, uh, I will double-check [to determine] if that's not the case, but that's when we learned about them..." Karl: "Are you suggesting regarding Dr. [Robert] Petzel that he was forced to resign because of this controversy?" Carney: "He did resign. Karl: "How can you suggest that his resignation comes as accountability when the VA put out a press release on September 20 saying he was leaving? It's almost eight months ago. Carney: "Well, I would point you to the American Legion, which obviously has deep interest in this matter and has been reported on significantly by your network and others in terms of what they have said about this issue and note that they look at Mr. Petzel, Dr. Petzel's resignation as quote 'a step towards addressing the leadership problem at the VA.' NBC's Chuck Todd says to Carney: "You seem very eager to rely upon the American Legion's statement about the resignation of Dr. Petzel, not on what the American Legion wants with General Shinseki." Carney: "We've made clear our view on Secretary Shinseki and the service he has provided. I would refer you to what Secretary Shinseki has said about Dr. Petzel and what the American Legion has said about Dr. Petzel, because these questions are asked in large part in response to those who have called for

personnel actions in response to some of these allegations." Todd: "Why shouldn't we view this as window dressing—sort of politically advantageous—because you know he is already leaving, so you are taking action." Carney: "You can view it any way you like. I would refer you to what the American Legion has said, and I would simply say as I said earlier, that the secretary, and [Obama] eagerly await the results of the individual investigation." Todd: "If you're eagerly awaiting the results of the investigation, that's where this sort of feels like where we're chasing our tails. You want this to be seen as taking immediate action but over here you want 'Oh, whoa, whoa, whoa, we gotta wait for an investigation." Some might expect the Obama administration to demand more money to address the Veterans Administration problems, but the agency's budget had already ballooned from \$73 billion in 2006 to \$154 billion in 2012. Average waiting times for patients nevertheless increased from 100 days in 2008, to 115 days in 2010, to 255 days in 2012, and 360 days in 2014. Additionally, the replacement for Robert Petzel, the retiring VA undersecretary for health, is Dr. Jeffrey Murawsky—who has been in charge of the region that includes the Edward Hines, Jr. VA Hospital in the Chicago area. The Hines facility is also under investigation for maintaining secret waiting lists. According to Investors.com, "...the VA spent millions on bonuses during the last three years at Hines. Worse, in 2013, only about one-in-four of Hines' 4,230 employees were those providing the actual primary care: doctors (309) or nurses (about 800), Open the Books found. Five veterans died waiting for care at Hines. As far back as 1999, the VA had found systemic quality-of-care problems at Hines with little done to correct them. A VA study concluded that 'Hines has the most inefficient physical plant for inpatient care and the most significant compliance issues with patient privacy.' In 2005, a VA study rated Chicago the worst regional office in the country. Now the man in charge at Hines, Murawsky, has been elevated to oversight of the entire VA system." Congressman Steve Stockman (R-TX) states, "New revelations [from a Freedom of Information Act request] that ...Obama has known since 2008 about delayed care and record falsification at Veterans Affairs facilities but did nothing, even as veterans died, call into question his personal role in the scandal. Obama knew. Obama knew for over five years. And Obama chose to do nothing even as veterans continued to die. ...Obama continued to ignore the rising death toll until it was publicly exposed. DailyCaller.com reports, "Republicans are hitting the Obama administration over a weekend report that at least one million of those receiving Obamacare subsidies aren't being paid the right amount. The House Energy and Commerce Committee wrote Monday to outgoing Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius and three federal contractors—Accenture, CGI and Serco—asking for all documents relating to incorrect subsidy payments, as well as problems with enrollees' immigration status. The Washington Post reported Saturday that the federal government may be paying out incorrect health-care subsidies to over one million Americans. A large proportion of those who have signed up for coverage through Obamacare exchanges listed incomes that differ significantly from their incomes on file with the IRS." [58859]

A national poll from left-leaning Politico shows Obama with a dismal approval/disapproval rating of 40/59 percent. Additionally, Republicans hold a 41/34 lead in generic Congressional polling, and a 43/36 lead in U.S. Senate polling. (The poll has an unusual 34/39/26 D/R/I, which may be valid only if Republican voters are more enthusiastic than Democrats in November 2014. In typical surveys, the samplings tilt more toward Democrats. Even if one takes this [poll] with a small grain of salt based on the composition of the sample, it's bad news almost all the way around for Democrats. ... AmericanBanker.com reports, "The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau [CFPB] released an internal report on Monday that showed 'statistically significant disparities' in employee evaluations based not just on race, but also age, location, tenure, and whether staffers were part of the agency's union. As a result, the CFPB said it was scrapping its current system and would pay most agency employees as if they received the highest rating available at the time of their evaluation. Ultimately, the remediation to its staff is expected to cost between \$5 million to \$5.5 million, a spokesman said." According to a "2013 internal agency report... 74.6% of whites received ratings of 4 or 5 compared to 65.2% of Hispanics and 57.6% of African-Americans. One-fifth of white employees, or 20.7% received a 5, compared with 10.5% of African-Americans... The report said the average white employee received a 3.94 rating, compared with 3.81 for Asian employees, 3.69 for Hispanics and 3.63 for blacks." CNSNews.com asks State Department spokeswoman Jennifer Psaki about the 20-month old child of Meriam Yahya Ibrahim, who is in prison with her because she was convicted of apostasy and sentenced to death by hanging. "You don't know whether that little boy in prison is a U.S. citizen?" Psaki responds, "I don't have any more details to share." The

boy's father, Daniel Wani, is reportedly a naturalized U.S. citizen. Ibrahim is Sudanese. Wani states, "I have tried to apply for papers to travel to the USA with my wife and child, but the American Embassy in Sudan did not help me. My son is an American citizen living in a difficult situation in prison." (The child has one U.S. citizen parent and one non-American parent—and the State Department does not know whether he is considered a U.S. citizen. Obama himself had one U.S. citizen parent and one non-American parent, and the government not only considered Obama a U.S. citizen, it (wrongly) considered him a natural born citizen.) The report also found that the city misused roughly \$1.1 million when acquiring and fixing properties because some of the properties were not put toward housing lowerincome families as required by HUD." (Obama believes that the mayor of a city that misused HUD funds should be the next head of the agency. HotAir.com's Ed Morrissey observes, "The defense for Castro will no doubt revolve around the fact that the mayor in San Antonio is largely ceremonial. It holds no executive power at all; the city is actually run by the city council and a city manager that runs all of the executive functions in San Antonio... But that lack of executive power that will serve as a defense against the conclusions of this IG report also raises questions about what qualifications Castro has in running a vast federal bureaucracy with a current annual budget of \$42 billion. ... Even that defense will still snag Castro on the IG report, though. One of his bragging points is that he 'brought a sense of urgency' to urban revitalization—which one would presume had some connection to HUD efforts in San Antonio. Did Castro miss the abuse and waste of HUD money in San Antonio? Did he ever go on record challenging [city manager Sheryl] Sculley's administration of those funds, or did he play along with it?") En route to a fundraiser in Maryland, Obama's motorcade stops at a Little League baseball game in Washington, D.C. where he makes a limp-wristed, "photo op" pitch to the catcher—and disrupts traffic for thousands of commuters. Obama claims that Republicans "don't believe that we as a community, as a country have any serious role to play in giving people a hand up, whose budget reflects an interest in cutting back commitments to the most vulnerable and freeing the most powerful from any constraints, and whose principal focus at any given point in the day is trying to figure out how can they make people sufficiently cynical, sufficiently angry, sufficiently suspicious that they can win the next election. I hate to be blunt about it, but that's the play. And, by the way, when I say a party has been captured, it's because I actually want an effective, serious, patriotic, capable, sober-minded Republican Party. And we've had that in the past. I come from the land of Lincoln. Abraham Lincoln thought infrastructure was a pretty good idea. That's part of why we got a [sic; an] Intercontinental Railroad system." (This is not the first time Obama has incorrectly referred to the nation's transcontinental railroad as "intercontinental." He does not explain which continents it connected. At another fundraiser, the White House press pool is forced to wait in a bedroom of the host's mansion to prevent them from reporting on Obama's remarks. [58956]

CNN president Jeff Zuckerman states in an interview that he is "not going to be shamed" into covering Benghazi "by others who have political beliefs that [sic; who] want to try to have temper tantrums to shame other news organizations into covering something," but will instead focus more on stories about "climate change." Zuckerman says, "Climate change is one of those stories that deserves more attention, that we all talk about [even though] when we do do [sic] those stories, there does tend to be a tremendous amount of

On May 20 filmmaker Dinesh D'Souza pleads guilty in response to charges of using "straw donors" to make donations to a Republican U.S. Senate candidate. USAToday.com reports, "Mr. D'Souza agreed to accept responsibility for having urged two close associates to make contributions of \$10,000 each to the unsuccessful 2012 Senate campaign of Wendy Long and then reimbursing them for their contributions,' his attorney Benjamin Brafman said in a statement Tuesday. D'Souza is scheduled to be sentenced Sept. 23. He faces up to 16 months in prison and a fine of up to \$30,000, according to a plea agreement released Tuesday by prosecutors. ... The conservative author has been harshly critical of ... Obama. In 2012, he released 2016: Obama's America, a film that claims Obama's worldview was shaped by anti-colonialist views of his Kenyan father, with whom Obama had little contact." It is worth noting that a 2004 John Edwards donor was charged with a mere misdemeanor for the same crime. It is also worth noting that Obama's closest advisor, Valerie Jarrett said in 2012, "After we win this election, it's our turn. Payback time. Everyone not with us is against us and they [had] better be ready because we don't forget. The ones who helped us will be rewarded, the ones who opposed us will get what they deserve. Or he may mean that the issue has become a scandal because white veterans are not being treated promptly, and that Americans would not be making a fuss if mostly blacks were being mistreated. In either event, Rangel's remark will not doubt be considered despicable by many Americans.) [58893]

At Townhall.com John Ransom suggests the real reason Obama is upset about the Veterans Administration scandal: "The mainstream media is positioning the liberal message to be, 'We've got great ideas we just have the wrong guy implementing them. With an eye on 2016, the media must convince the rest of us that there's nothing wrong with the model of cradle-to-grave care, but there's something wrong with the poor execution by the Obama administration. While Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) continues to complain about spending by wealthy conservatives in support of their political philosophy, FreeBeacon.com reports, "A secretive dark money group backed by George Soros and other liberal megadonors is looking to steer nearly \$40 million to left-wing groups in 2014 to support highprofile political and policy efforts, according to documents obtained by the Washington Free Beacon. The documents reveal for the first time the Democracy Alliance's full portfolio of supported organizations, a large network of powerful liberal groups looking to win key electoral and legislative victories. The Democracy Alliance connects major Democratic donors with some of the largest and most influential liberal activist groups in the country. Previous beneficiaries, such as the Center for American Progress and Media Matters for America, are set to get millions more in 2014. The list also reveals DA support for newer organizations, such as Organizing for Action, the advocacy group that succeeded President Barack Obama's reelection campaign. That group has received official sanction from the White House, and operates websites and social media accounts branded with the president's name. In all, the document reveals, the Democracy Alliance hopes to provide \$39.3 million to 20 organizations this year. If it meets those fundraising targets, it will likely be responsible for one out of every five dollars in those groups' 2014 budgets. Alliance-supported organizations will spend more than \$175 million in 2014, according to budget projections contained in the document. The Democracy Alliance is highly secretive in all of its operations. The donors it solicits and the organization to

which it directs their financial support are prohibited from speaking publicly about its operations." [58933, 58934]

CNSNews.com reports, "The federal government is piecing together a sweeping national 'biosurveillance' system that will give bureaucrats near real-time access to Americans' private medical information in the name of national security, according to Twila Brase, a public health nurse and co-founder of the Citizens Council for Health Freedom. ...Brase warns that the NHSS [National Health Security Strategy] proposal would allow the federal government to monitor an individual's behavior before, during and after any government-defined health 'incident'—which could be anything from a local outbreak of the flu to a terrorist anthrax attack." Oregon has spent \$250 million and three years on an ambitious IT project that failed to produce a fully functional exchange. Instead, what was produced was bug-ridden and largely unfinished, documents show." (Meanwhile, the state of Nevada decides to drop its own ObamaCare exchange site and rely partly on HealthCare.gov.) Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) defeats Tea Party-aligned candidate Matt Bevin in the GOP primary in Kentucky. In November, McConnell faces Democrat candidate Alison Lundergan Grimes—who has refused to state whether she would have voted for ObamaCare had she been in Congress in 2010. (Johnson was endorsed by Obama—despite Johnson having once asked Admiral Robert Willard, head of the U.S. Pacific Fleet, if he was worried that the island of Guam would tip over if too many Marines were stationed there: "My fear is that the whole island will become so overly populated that it will tip over and capsize." Somehow managing to keep from laughing, the Admiral dryly replied, "We don't anticipate that.") [41592, 41593, 58952, 58971, 59982]

In the Oregon GOP primary, Dr. Monica Wehby defeats her challengers and will try to unseat Senator Jeff Merkley (R-OR) in November. [58942]

In Pennsylvania, Clinton-endorsed House candidate Marjorie Margolies (a former member of Congress and now the mother in law of Chelsea Clinton) loses to Brendan Boyle in the Democrat primary.

On May 21 Veterans Administration (VA) head Eric Shinseki meets with Obama at the White House. Shinseki (who has not had a one-on-one with Obama since July 26, 2012) does *not* resign, even though VA officials in Washington, D.C. knew as early as 2010 that its facilities were engaging in "improper scheduling practices"—and even though Obama is reportedly "mad as Hell." Obama then holds a press conference to say Shinseki "has been a great soldier, and nobody cares more about our veterans. That's why, when I came into office, I said we would systematically work to fix these problems, and we have been working really hard to address them." (In other words, "Blame George W. Bush, not me.") "The point is, caring for our veterans is not an issue that popped up in recent weeks. Some of the problems with respect to how veterans are able to access the benefits that they've earned—that's not a new issue, that's an issue that I was working on when I was running for the United States Senate. Taking care of our veterans and their families has been one of the causes of my [administration], and it's something that all of us have to be involved with and have to be paying attention to." Obama also says, "I know that people are angry and want swift reckoning. I sympathize with that. But we have to let the investigators do their jobs and get to the bottom of what happened. So when I hear allegations of misconduct—any misconduct—whether it's allegations of VA staff covering up long wait times or cooking the books—I will not stand for it, not as commander in chief, but also not as an American. None of us should. So, if these allegations prove to be true, it is dishonorable, it is disgraceful, and I will not tolerate it, period." (In other words, "I'll stall this as long as I can with a phony investigation, and hope that the voters forget about the scandal.") [58980, 58986]

Obama states, "We launched an all-out war on the disability-claims backlog. And in just the past year alone, we've slashed that backlog by half." (The claim is, of course, meaningless because the scandal involves secret waiting lists to make it appear as though wait times for appointments are not significant. Obama cannot "know" that wait times and backlogs have been slashed in half if the figures that have been reported are phony. NationalReview.com's Jim Geraghty observes, "Obama ignoring this means A) he's willing to claim that allegedly falsified records are true to save his own butt or B) he really hasn't followed this story at all, and doesn't even know what the core accusations are.")

"And I think it is important to recognize that the wait times generally—what the IG [inspector general] indicated so far, at least, is the wait times were [for] folks who may have had chronic conditions, were seeking their next appointment, but may have already received service. It was not necessarily a situation where they were calling for emergency services. And the IG indicated that he did not see a link between the wait and them actually dying." (WhiteHouseDossier.com's Keith Koffler translates Obama's excuse for

the 40 or so veterans who died while being hidden on the secret waiting lists: "[P]eople died *while* they were waiting for treatment, nobody died *because* they were waiting." Koffler adds, "Well, the IG is hardly finished. And there appear to have been some who committed suicide while they were waiting. I'd be very surprised if, given the delays and incompetence, there weren't may deaths directly caused by the VA. Even if it were possible nobody died because of their wait, it would merely be fortuitous. Like a defendant saying, *Well, I tried to murder my boss, but at least I didn't succeed!*") [59065]

White House press secretary Jay Carney tells reporters, "[Obama] looks forward to the results both of the [internal VA] review and of the independent investigation that is underway and is being conducted by the inspector general. ...[Obama] obviously wants both of these two inquiries to proceed efficiently and quickly, but to be comprehensive and effective. So he's not setting an arbitrary deadline. He expects both of them—or hopes that both of them will be, again, comprehensive and effective." (One of the two investigations is being conducted by the VA inspector general—who reports to VA head Eric Shinseki. The other is being conducted by White House deputy chief of staff Rob Nabors. Neither can be considered objective or independent. The Government Accountability Office has already issued a report clearly indicating that there are patient scheduling "anomalies" at various VA hospitals.) [58980]

A reporter asks Carney, "What about this criticism of [Obama's] management style? Is he too detached from some of the nuts and bolts of running the government, running an administration—" Carney interrupts, "I know that's a Republican meme, and—" Reporter: "...catching him off guard. The healthcare website, now this [VA scandal]." Carney: "I think that if you look at how [Obama] handles a challenge like the [Healthcare.gov] website and handles this [VA] challenge, he responds by demanding action, demanding that Americans who are counting on benefits and services—whether it is a functioning website or benefits through the VA—that they are taken care of. And you saw that with the efforts that were undertaken to fix the website and you've seen that with the efforts that are already underway to investigate the problems and allegations that have arisen here with regards to the waiting times for appointments at facilities around the country. And he expects results and he holds people accountable. And when we see whether or not some of these allegations prove to be true, he will insist that misconduct, mismanagement will be met with consequences." (Carney's response is laughable. Regardless of what Obama may have "demanded," it has never been produced, and he has almost never held anyone accountable for anything. One or more heads will likely roll over the VA scandal, but only because he will be forced to do so by Democrats as well as Republicans. It is not a "Republican meme" that Obama is detached from leadership duties and realities. He is detached.) [59005]

Senator John McCain (R-Z) responds to Obama's remarks: "While I am glad that after many weeks of refusing to acknowledge this widening scandal, ... "Craig Roberts, media manager for the American Legion, properly calls Obama's proposal a 'desperate search for money at any cost.' After meeting with Obama, [chief of staff] Rahm Emanuel, and Veteran Affairs Secretary Eric Shinseki to object to the absurd scheme, the American Legion's Commander David K. Service-related injuries have traditionally been paid for by the government; in fact, private health insurance policies typically exclude coverage for injuries or illnesses that are the result of combat service in the Armed Forces. Roberts states that Obama ignored the argument that the government obviously has a moral responsibility to pay for the treatment of injured soldiers. '[Obama] deflected any discussion when it got into any moral issue... Any attempt to direct the conversation (to the moral aspect of the issue) was immediately deflected.' A letter of protest from the 11 veterans organizations states, 'there is simply no logical explanation' for a plan to bill veterans' personal insurance 'for care that the VA has a responsibility to provide.' The letter called it 'unconscionable' to shift the burden of the country's 'fiscal problems (to) the men and women who have already sacrificed a great deal for this country." (Faced with immediate and intense criticism of an attempt to increase federal revenue by forcing the cost of medical care for wounded veterans onto private insurance carriers, Obama quickly dropped the plan. Then-press secretary Robert Gibbs made the absurd and convoluted claim that Obama floated the idea as an attempt to "to maximize the resources available for veterans." Gibbs announced the plan's cancellation with the statement, "[Obama] listened to concerns raised by the VSOs [veteran service organizations] that this [program] might, under certain circumstances, affect veterans and their families' ability to access health care. It also bears repeating that VA health facilities in New York and New Jersey were investigated for processing more than 1,500 contracts with dollar amounts that conveniently fell below the \$25,000 threshold for public disclosure. Bloomberg.com reported, "Lawmakers said they were concerned that many of the transactions were done on the same day with a single vendor, and potentially violated a federal law requiring agencies to seek competitive bids for government work..." There were "25 purchase orders issued for Bismark Construction Corp. at \$24,900 each, on December 30, 2010, for a total of \$622,500" and "...the employee in question created 25 transactions for \$24,900 each for orders to Kinetic Concepts Inc. ...on Nov. 9, 2011." A VA hospital employee in North Carolina tells Infowars.com, "Recently there's been a very rapid race to move records, boxes, change labels, whatever it may be, they're putting them in rooms that nobody would look in... and there's [sic] multiple times that I have seen in the past week or so them [sic] moving boxes... so apparently they're hiding their tracks somewhere. He also claims that one supervisor has stated that older veterans "should be taken outside and shot in the head because they're worthless." The whistleblower asks, "How can you stop the corruption and the insanity if you have a supervisor who is a non-veteran saying these things to veterans, scaring them about their jobs and telling them because they're an older veteran 'you ought to be taken outside and shot in the head?' ...It's a huge bureaucracy and it's a huge game and somebody has to break the corruption. ...There's more than just what you're seeing on TV and they're

hiding a lot of things and you're never going to see it on the mass media." [58977, 58978, 59027]

Congressman David Scott (D-GA) says on the floor of the House, "The first person we need to fire is the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, Mr. Sandeki [sic; Shinseki] himself. ...In my own hospital in Atlanta, four of our soldiers were [sic] committed suicide in the hospital. And the... inspector general of the VA laid the blame directly at the foot of the VA administration for the lack of management... We asked, 'Is there one more? Is [sic] there any more that has [sic] committed suicide?' 'No, there's been no more.' And they told a damn lie, 'cause the very next day it was exposed [that] there was another soldier that committed suicide, and they covered it up. ...I listened to [Obama] today, and I was very disappointed with ...Obama today. There was no urgency! Mr. [Obama], we need urgency! We need you to roll up our sleeves and get into these hospitals!" (Scott is not only a Democrat, he is black. The marines in Sigonella are part of a crisis response unit focused on embassy security. The unit was created after the attack on the US diplomatic compound in Benghazi, Libya, on September 11 2012 that killed US ambassador Christopher Stevens and three other Americans." [58981, 58994]

Eli Lake writes at TheDailyBeast.com, "In 2012, the Obama administration produced a draft National Intelligence Estimate that reached a surprising conclusion: al Qaeda was no longer a direct threat to America. Unsatisfied, some of the lawmakers started to leave one by one before the meeting had finished. Mandating the VA to fix different things, mandating the VA to report different things, mandating them to fix their website, bipartisan bills that went to the Senate, and they are DOA [dead on arrival] on the Senate side. ...We can pass bills all day long here on the House side, but if the Senate doesn't get in gear and be held responsible and be held accountable for these veterans, it's not going to work. ...These things have been dead on arrival. [Senate Majority Leader] Harry Reid [D-NV] has not moved one of these bills." [59093]

During a House Foreign Affairs Committee hearing, State Department undersecretary Sarah Sewall is asked by Congressman Jeff Duncan (R-SC) if the terrorist group Boko Haram specifically targets Christians. Sewall replies, "I wish there was such discrimination in Boko Haram attacks. Boko Haram attacks everyone who is Nigerian. Boko Haram is an equal-opportunity threat for all Nigerian citizens." (Her response does not sit well with several members of the committee. It should also anger most Americans that she would prefer targeting of Christians to more random acts of violence. China will become Russia's largest trade partner. This was not the much ballyhooed 'pivot to Asia' that ... Obama expected. It is, however, the long-dreaded embrace between the Chinese dragon and Russian bear that has given western strategists the willies. ... Russia has thus given its economy a big boost and made western sanctions look inconsequential. Chinese funds will allow cash-strapped Russia to modernize its oil and gas industry. The new gas pipelines will be a major economic boost for Russia's distressed eastern regions and Siberia. ... [T]he Sino-Russian energy deal may further alter the world's balance of power to the East. Russia and China working in tandem could offset the great power and wealth of the US and its rich allies. DailyCaller.com reports, "A poll released Wednesday shows that 47 percent of unemployed Americans have given up looking for work. Conducted on behalf of Express Employment Professionals last month, Harris Poll asked 1,500 unemployed adults whether they agreed with the statement 'I've completely given up looking for a job.' Seven percent said they 'agree completely' with the statement; another seven percent said they 'agree a lot;' 15 percent 'agree somewhat;' 18 percent 'agree a little.' Eighty-two percent of those polled agreed that they were 'becoming more discouraged the longer I am unemployed.' A large majority of those polled indicated that unemployment benefits were keeping them from searching harder for a job. Politicians have divided largely along party lines over whether to extend unemployment benefits, with Republicans arguing that the benefits provide an incentive to remain unemployed. Democrats have generally resisted that thinking and pushed for more benefits. According to the Harris Poll, 82 percent of the unemployed said they would 'search harder and wider for a job' if their unemployment benefits ran out." [58991]

The Los Angeles Times reports, "The Obama administration has quietly adjusted key provisions of its signature healthcare law to potentially make billions of additional taxpayer dollars available to the insurance industry if companies providing coverage through the Affordable Care Act lose money. The move was buried in hundreds of pages of new regulations issued late last week. It comes as part of an intensive administration effort to hold down premium increases for next year, a top priority for the White House as the rates will be announced ahead of this fall's congressional elections. Administration officials for months have denied charges by opponents that they plan a 'bailout' for insurance companies providing coverage under the healthcare law." (HotAir.com's Ed Morrissey: "Their lips say no no no, but their regulations keep saying yes. ... In other words, it's a payoff to perpetrate a fraud. [Obama is essentially using taxpayer dollars to bribe health insurers to keep their premium increases to a minimum.] The White House has long argued that their takeover of the health-insurance industry would 'bend the cost curve downward,' but instead, premiums have spiked upward dramatically—as have deductibles, a powerful one-two punch to the gut of consumers. That threatens the political prospects of Democrats in the midterms, especially since the next round of

premium increases will hit right before the election. In that context, the new regulations make it clear that the White House intends to use its regulatory authority to provide a false sense of relative affordability, or at least disaster avoidance. Johnson: "I was called a racist, I think most people would lose their temper, Mr. Chairman." (For the record, most conservatives also opposed "HillaryCare" in 1993. The Obama administration honors Harvey Milk with a postage stamp. Milk, an openly gay member of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, was shot to death on November 27, 1978, along with Mayor George Moscone. (WhiteHouse.gov notes, "In 2009, ...Obama posthumously awarded Harvey Milk with [sic] the Medal of Freedom for his courage, exceptional leadership, and dedication to human rights." Guests at the White House ceremony include U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Samantha Power, House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA), Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-WI), Congressman Representative John Lewis (D-GA), and Deputy Postmaster General Ronald A. Stroman. (Milk was not only gay, he was a pederast, child molester, and drug addict. For some reason he is celebrated by the nation's leftists.) [50319, 50350, 50378, 59513]

At Townhall.com Victor Davis Hanson reviews the various Obama administration scandals and concludes, "The common denominator" is that "politics trumped ethics. The attack marks the latest and deadliest of several recent attacks in the restive region of Xinjiang, of which Urumqi is the capital. Attacks have also taken place elsewhere in China. Authorities have blamed these attacks on terrorists and separatists seeking independence from China for Xinjiang. Some of its native Uighur people oppose Beijing's rule and chafe at government policies they complain repress their culture and religion." (Uighurs are Muslims.) [59034]

RiaNovosti reports, "Moscow may sign an intergovernmental agreement with Tehran this year to build eight new reactors for nuclear power plants in Iran, a source close to the negotiations told journalists Thursday. Two reactors could be built at the Bushehr Power Plant and six reactors at other sites, the source said, adding that the talks were in their final stage. Russian President Vladimir Putin said earlier this week that Russian-Iranian cooperation will continue despite international turbulence around Tehran. Putin said that Russia and Iran are not only neighbors, but also long-standing reliable partners. Iran's only nuclear power plant near Bushehr came online September 2011 and began operating at full capacity a year after. Moscow handed over operational control of the Russian-made plant to Iran in September last year." (Russia has also entered into an agreement to build two more nuclear plants in India.) [59282, 59283]

Politico reports, "The Internal Revenue Service will scrap a proposed rule governing the political activities of so-called social welfare groups, the regulations at the center of the tea party controversy that rocked the agency last summer. The IRS said it will start writing new regulations from scratch, amid criticism from both the left and especially the right, on the proposal which would tighten rules for tax-exempt status of political nonprofits."

Townhall.com reports, "A federal court temporarily halted the Obamacare abortion pill mandate for two Christian colleges, ruling that compliance with the law could cause 'irreparable harm' to their religious freedom. Dordt College in Iowa and Cornerstone University in Michigan argued that in addition to violating the First and Fifth amendments of the U.S. Constitution and the Religious Freedom Restoration Act, the government has been inconsistent with enforcing the mandate." [59038]

Senator Marco Rubio (R-FL) introduces legislation, the "VA Management Accountability Act of 2014," that would make it easier for the Veterans Administration to fire people. Socialist Senator Bernie Sanders (I-VT) says, "[A]s the senator from Florida knows, we have not held a hearing on this legislation. And some of us are old-fashioned enough to know that maybe folks in the Senate might want to know what is in the bill before we voted on it." (Sanders demands a June hearing to discuss the three pages of legislation, yet voted for ObamaCare without having read it.) A similar bill has passed the House in a bipartisan vote. (Some might ask why such legislation would apply only to the Veterans Administration. The head of any federal department should have the ability to readily fire incompetent employees—especially those who are "cooking the books" to make themselves look better.) It is worth noting that 78 percent of VA employees are union members, which also contributes to the problems—because it is difficult to fire union workers (especially federal union employees). At WashingtonExaminer.com Mark Flatten describes some of the ordeals of Veterans Administration employees who have been persecuted for daring to come forward with stories of secret patient waiting lists. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) and Senator Chuck Schumer (D-NY) issue House Republicans an ultimatum. Reid states, "We've waited 329 days, we're willing to wait another six weeks [for the House to pass immigration legislation]. But at the end of six weeks, if something hasn't been done, then there's gonna [sic] have to be a move made. And it's too bad we have to do that, because we all know things can be done administratively, but it's better to change the law." At the Chicago fundraiser, Obama complains that the Founding Fathers did not create a Constitution to his liking. (House seats are based on population, while each state gets two Senators. That is *intentional*, and is meant to prevent the more populous states from ramming through legislation that discriminates against states with fewer citizens. Without such safeguards, legislators could vote to rob states like Wyoming and North Dakota of their wealth and give it to residents of California and New York. Obama apparently does not like such safeguards. The U.S. Constitution was carefully drafted to make it difficult to pass controversial legislation. That is a "feature," not a "bug.") Obama also whines that Democrats "tend to congregate a little more densely" in the large cities, which, claims Obama, gives Republicans an advantage in Congress. "So there are some structural reasons why, despite the fact that Republican ideas are largely rejected by the public, it's still hard for us to break through." (If Obama believes the Republicans have the advantage in Congress, he might want to explain how they were unable to block the

passage of ObamaCare or collect enough votes for its repeal. He is correct, however, that Democrat voters are more "densely packed" in the cities. That gives many Democrat legislators extremely "safe seats" where the GOP has almost no chance to defeat them. If some of those "excess Democrats" were to relocate to "Republican territory, the GOP would lose some of its own "safe seats." The email would suggest the White House was connecting the attack to the video almost from the outset—though their initial claim that the attack sprung out of protests over the film would later be proven false. According to Issa, who discussed excerpts from the otherwise classified emails on Wednesday, the email was sent at 9:11 p.m. ET on Sept. 11 to the Diplomatic Security Command Center. According to Issa, the email said: 'White House is reaching out to UTube [sic; YouTube] to advise ramifications of the posting of the Pastor Jon Video [Innocence of Muslims].' Issa said this email is 'troubling' because it 'contradicts' White House claims that the faulty storyline on the video was drawn from the intelligence community's talking points. The congressman also said 'the email shows the White House had hurried to settle on a false narrative—one at odds with the conclusions reached by those on the ground—before Americans were even out of harm's way or the intelligence community had made an impartial examination of available evidence." (HotAir.com adds, "The 'Pastor Jon video' is, I believe, a garbled reference to Pastor Terry Jones, who was publicizing the Mohammed movie to coincide with the anniversary of 9/11. But anyway: Does the e-mail prove the White House's good faith by showing that the YouTube video was on their radar from the beginning and not something they cooked up to make Susan Rice's spin that Sunday a bit easier? Or does it prove that the YouTube video [excuse] did indeed come from a political outfit like the White House, not intelligence agents? Actually, you don't need the new e-mail to ask that question. At 10:08 p.m. on the night of the attack, less than an hour after the e-mail was sent, the State Department issued [a] statement from Hillary Clinton" that claimed the attack was "a response to inflammatory material posted on the Internet.") Former Congressman Allen West (R-FL) summarizes what he believes was taking place in Benghazi: "[T]here was a covert weapons scheme going on in Libya, Benghazi. And to those Democrats appointed to the committee: if you seek to obstruct the revelation of the truth, you are complicit and guilty as well." [59088, 59095, 59097, 59114]

According to Politico, the White House "is again extending its review of Clinton White House records that the National Archives has proposed making public, an Archives spokeswoman said Friday. The 30-day extension is at least the fourth the Obama White House has taken to complete the process of signing off on the release of Clinton White House files or proposing that some be held back on grounds of executive privilege. So far, no executive privilege claim has been publicly announced. In recent months, about 25,000 pages of previously withheld Clinton-era records were released online by former President Bill Clinton's library in Little Rock, Arkansas. The process has drawn the attention of the media and some of former first lady Hillary Clinton's political rivals in part because she may be a presidential candidate in 2016. The Archives did not say Friday precisely how many records are still under review. At one point, it appeared that about 8,000 pages had not yet been released from the set of documents withheld earlier under legal provisions that expire 12 years after a president leaves office—a deadline that passed in January 2013 in President Clinton's case. It's unclear whether all 8,000 unreleased pages remain under review at the White House or some of those pages have been cleared but have not yet been published by the National Archives. In either event, no previously withheld records have been posted by the Archives-run Clinton Library in five weeks. ... The Obama administration has not offered its view on the measure. An executive order Obama signed in 2009 allows for an initial 30-day review and an unlimited number of extensions. The order does require that each extension be 'for a time certain." (Twelve years was apparently not enough time for political operatives to purge the files of documents that might be considered damaging to the Clintons.) [59120]

At Townhall.com Michelle Malkin provides examples of how illegal immigrants in the United States often receive better health care than military veterans. "In Sacramento, Calif.," writes Malkin, "lawmakers are moving forward with a budget-busting plan to extend government-funded health insurance to at least 1.5 million illegal aliens. In Los Angeles, federal bureaucrats callously canceled an estimated 40,000 diagnostic tests and

treatments for American veterans with cancer and other illnesses to cover up a decadelong backlog. In New York, doctors report that nearly 40 percent of their patients receiving kidney dialysis are illegal aliens. ... In Memphis, a VA whistleblower reported that his hospital was using contaminated kidney dialysis machines to treat America's warriors. ...In Arizona, illegal aliens incurred health care costs totaling an estimated \$700 million in 2009. In Phoenix, at least 40 veterans died waiting for VA hospitals and clinics to treat them, while government officials created secret waiting lists to cook the books and deceive the public about deadly treatment delays. ... And last December, Democrats led the charge to reduce cost-of-living increases in military pensions—while blocking GOP Alabama Sen. Jeff Sessions' efforts to close a \$4.2 billion loophole that allows illegal aliens to collect child tax credits from the IRS, even if they pay no taxes. The fraudulent payments to illegal aliens would have offset the cuts to veterans' benefits. America: medical and welfare welcome mat to the rest of the world, while leavings its best and bravest veterans to languish in hospital lounges, die waiting for appointments, and compete for jobs and educational opportunities against illegal border-crossers, document fakers, visa violators and deportation evaders. Shame on us." [59024]

Knowing where public opinion lies on the issue, Democrat candidates for the U.S. Senate Alison Lundergan Grimes (Kentucky) and Michelle Nunn (Georgia) call for the resignation of VA head Eric Shinseki. No sitting Senate Democrat has called for Shinseki's ouster—yet. (On May 28 and 29 Senators Mark Udall (D-CO), Kay Hagan (D-NC), John Walsh (D-MT), Al Franken (D-MN), Jeanne Shaheen (D-NH), and Mark Warner (D-VA) call for Shinseki to resign.) Townhall.com political editor Guy Benson points out that, in defense of ObamaCare, Democrats previously touted the nation's health care for veterans as a reason not to fear the Affordable Care Act. In August 2009 Howard Dean, then the chairman of the Democrat Party, endorsed a "public option" for any health care legislation, using as examples Medicare and the Veterans Administration, which were "two very good programs that have been around for a long time." In May 2009 The New York Times' Paul Krugman wrote, "You see, we actually have a real live case of impressive cost control in health care: the VA system." Timothy Noah wrote at Slate.com, "Socialized medicine has been tried in the United States, and it has proven superior to health care supplied by the private sector. ... The socialized medicine to which I refer is the complex of hospitals managed by the Veterans Administration." In August 2009 Mike Madden wrote at Salon.com, "Opponents of reform trot out comparisons to government services frequently when they try to argue against a public, government-funded healthcare plan. ...The Department of Veterans Administration also runs a healthcare system that experts praise for its well-developed health information technology network..." Also in 2009, Nicholas Kristof wrote in *The New York Times*, "Take the hospital system run by the Department of Veterans Affairs, the largest integrated health system in the United States. It is fully government run, much more 'socialized medicine' than is Canadian health care with its private doctors and hospitals. And the system for veterans is by all accounts one of the best-performing and most cost-effective elements in the American medical establishment." Princeton University's Uwe Reinhardt wrote in the *Times* in 2013, "Remarkably, Americans of all political stripes have long reserved for our veterans the

purest form of socialized medicine, the vast health system operated by the US Department of Veterans Affairs... If socialized medicine is as bad as so many on this side of the Atlantic claim, why have both political parties ruling this land deemed socialized medicine the best health system for military veterans? Or do they just not care about them?" [59069, 59070, 59071, 59072, 59073, 59077]

CNSNews.com reports, "Twenty-two House lawmakers led by Rep. Scott Garrett (R-NJ) have sent a letter on Thursday to Secretary of State John Kerry, asking him to confront the Sudanese government about Meriam Ibrahim, a jailed pregnant Christian woman facing execution for apostasy. 'We urge the State Department to condemn the ruling handed down by Sudan's court and call upon the Sudanese government to respect human rights and free Mariam Yahya Ibrahim [Meriam Yahya Ibrahim Ishag] and her young son immediately,' stated the letter, signed by 21 Republicans and one Democrat." (Obama has apparently done nothing to help free Ibrahim, even though her husband is a U.S. citizen. Michelle Obama has not even issued a Twitter message with a "#Free Meriam" hashtag.) Examiner.com reports, "In a bombshell revelation that has broad implications for the integrity of elections in the United States, Judicial Watch has announced that it now has 'indisputable evidence' that the White House engaged in election tampering in at least two states in 2009. Rahm Emanuel and Jim Messina, both of whom were top White House staffers at the time, are named as the chief perpetrators of the scheme to attempt to manipulate election outcomes in Pennsylvania and Colorado. Judicial Watch filed a complaint in 2010 along with a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to obtain records regarding possible violations of The Hatch Act—a federal law passed in 1939 that prohibits federal employees working in the Executive Branch from engaging in partisan political activity. Government employees who work in the Executive Branch are not allowed to work for and promote the reelection of the president under whom they serve, nor any challenger to that sitting president. "But in 2009 Rahm Emanuel allegedly used his position as White House Chief of Staff to attempt to persuade Pennsylvania Congressman Joe Sestak to drop his plans to challenge Arlen Specter for the U.S. Senate. The White House believed that since Specter had turned Democrat, a primary fight would greatly weaken the candidate who won. In order to avoid such a scenario Sestak was offered various positions in the Executive Branch. Rahm even went as far as to enlist the help of former President Bill Clinton to attempt to persuade Sestak to take one of the government positions. It turned out that Sestak rebuffed these offers. Khaled Mashaal, leader of the Hamas political bureau, states, "The reconciliation and politics are not an alternative to resistance. The reconciliation will actually consolidate the resistance. Our steadfast people are continuing to move from one revolution to another and from one intifada to another until the liberation of Palestine." Pamela Geller writes, "Hamas and Fatah have reconciled, and now Obama wants Israel to negotiate with Hamas. Of course. That is consistent with his anti-Israel stance that has been consistent since the beginning of his political career. Meanwhile, Hamas and Fatah are both making it clear that their accord is directed toward what everything they do is directed toward: killing Jews and destroying Israel." [58939, 59127, 59128]

The Republican National Committee files a lawsuit against the Federal Election Commission, challenging contribution limits on individual donations. The Associated Press notes, "Under the current rules, the RNC may only accept \$32,400 each year from donors, and local-level parties are capped at \$10,000." [59154, 59155]

Former Congressman Allen West (R-FL) talks with Fox News' Andrea Tantaros about Sergeant Andrew Tahmooressi, who remains in a Mexican prison after making a wrong turn and inadvertently entering Mexico—with several legally registered weapons in his vehicle. West points out that Secretary of State John Kerry, in a recent official visit to Mexico, reportedly did not bring up the issue. West says, "So right now what we have are these very neutered, pajama boy leaders, faux leaders in Obama and in Kerry and it's very embarrassing. It is a sad state of affairs that a Marine is being detained, a combat veteran, who could possibly be suffering from PTSD, who is guilty of nothing." Mexico is reportedly demanding cash for the Marines' release. "It's extortion," says West. "This is absolutely heinous, it is appalling and it's unconscionable." (The United States has considerable leverage because it provides Mexico with troop training and military equipment, including planes and helicopters. It should not be difficult for Obama to

And as commander in chief, I believe that taking care of our veterans and their families is a sacred obligation. It's been one of the causes of my presidency. And now that we've ended the war in Iraq and as our war in Afghanistan ends as well, we have to work even harder as a nation to make sure all our veterans get the benefits and opportunities that they have earned. They've done their duty, and they ask nothing more than that this country does ours [sic; its duty], now, and for decades to come. Happy Memorial Day everybody. May God watch over our fallen heroes and may he continue to bless the United States of America." (Obama indirectly addresses the Veterans Administration scandal as if it is something he has known about for only weeks, rather than at least seven years. He states that "we" need to "work even harder" for the veterans, when it is he and his administration that neglected to do what was necessary and what the taxpayers assumed was being done.) At GOPTheDailyDose.com Rick Wells writes, "The Hussein speech writers have provided the typical Memorial Day message of poetic phraseology and words, but the delivery is empty, lacking any semblance of sincerity." (Wells is being too kind. Not only is his delivery "empty" and insincere, Obama comes close to slurring a number of words; he has trouble following the teleprompter; and he appears to be lost in another world. The

more generous might say Obama was incredibly tired when he recorded the address. Others might claim he was under the influence of drugs.) [59146, 59147, 59148]

Bloomberg.com reports that on May 28 Obama will deliver a graduation address at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point to "outline how the U.S. plans to adapt to fight the evolving nature of al-Qaeda and other terrorist groups in regions including South Asia, according to the official who asked not to be identified to discuss the goals of the talk. He also will discuss the galvanizing role the U.S. must play in pushing for action on trade, climate change and other issues, while making the case for a sustainable international

system that cooperates to confront such matters, the official said yesterday." At Examiner.com Jim Kouri writes that Obama's "goal is to defend his approach to combating Islamist terrorism which involves more talk than action, according to his critics in the military, law enforcement and the intelligence. ... While Obama's minions and his news media sycophants defend his so-called 'leading from behind approach,' often facing laughs and ridicule from real security, military and law enforcement experts, he hopes his team of campaigners-turned-security-advisers will create a speech that will frame his foreign policy—which includes terrorism plaguing the Middle East and North Africa—and how he will react to emergencies during his days in the Oval Office." The Department of Justice has the "authority to do a prompt and effective criminal investigation of the secret waiting lists, potential destruction of documents, falsification of records, in effect, the cooking of books, and covering up that may have occurred. These are allegations, but there's evidence to support them. We're not rushing to judgment, but the Department of Justice can convene a grand jury if necessary. The inspector general cannot." Senator John Thune (R-SD) says, "You had reports of up to 40 people who died on waiting lists. You had these reports of secret lists and falsifying records and all these kinds of things. [Yet] It took three weeks for [Obama] to act." [59144]

And for a very long time, the mainstream Republicans just sat there and took the pummeling. What we saw this week, they woke up finally and they fought back. And when they fought back, they won." White House political advisor David Plouffe remarks, "I don't get the celebration. Maybe it's a low bar. So they're not witches and defenders of rape? Ok, so maybe they don't pledge allegiance to all the crazy? Let's look at these candidates, and let's look at 2016. Different electorate, battleground states. All against immigration reform, all denying climate change, all against gay marriage, all against funding things like education and transportation to help jobs. This is [sic; these are] not people that [sic; who] are not going [sic; are going] to win the middle part of the electorate or the emerging part of the electorate. I think Matt makes a very good point." (From the White House perspective, tea party members are witches who defend rape, embrace killer storms, hate gays, oppose education, and enjoy collapsing bridges and unemployment.) [59167]

On Fox News Sunday, Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) says, "You've got a crime being committed against veterans." Washington Post columnist Charles Lane says, "Obama has been pushing very hard—his wife has been working with military families and so forth—trying to sort of turn veterans into a Democratic group, based on the younger, more diverse military that we have. Nevertheless, the media spent weeks covering the incident and labeling the act of disclosure treasonous—because a Republican was in the White House. The disclosure of the identity of the Kabul station officer—on a distribution list with over 6,000 recipients—is *far* more significant, and even dangerous, because it puts lives at risk. A new IRS ruling calls for employers to be fined \$100 per employee per day if they try to shift workers to the ObamaCare exchanges and not provide insurance for them—even if the employer offers to give the employees raises to offset the cost of the health insurance. NYTimes.com notes, "Many employers—some that now offer coverage and some that do not—had concluded that it would be cheaper to provide each employee with a lump sum of money to buy insurance on an exchange, instead of providing coverage directly. But the Obama administration raised objections, contained in an authoritative question-andanswer document released by the Internal Revenue Service, in consultation with other agencies. ... When employers provide coverage, their contributions, averaging more than \$5,000 a year per employee, are not counted as taxable income to workers. But the Internal Revenue Service said employers could not meet their obligations under the health care law by simply reimbursing employees for some or all of their premium costs. ... If an employer wants to help employees buy insurance on their own ... it can give them higher pay, in the form of taxable wages. But in such cases... the employer and the employee would owe payroll taxes on those wages, and the change could be viewed by workers as reducing a valuable benefit. ... Andrew R. Biebl, a tax partner at CliftonLarsonAllen, a large accounting firm based in Minneapolis, said the ruling could disrupt arrangements used in many industries. 'For decades,' Mr. Biebl said, 'employers have been assisting employees by reimbursing them for health insurance premiums and out-of-pocket costs. The new federal ruling eliminates many of those arrangements by imposing an unusually punitive penalty.' When an employer reimburses employees for premiums, the arrangement is known as an employer payment plan. 'These employer payment plans are considered to be group health plans,' the I.R.S. said, but they do not satisfy requirements of the Affordable Care Act." [59137, 59138]

Election results in Europe will no doubt frustrate Obama, as "eurosceptic" political parties opposed to the European Union and loose immigration policies score victories. The new law also reduces federal aid to hospitals that treat large numbers of poor and uninsured people, creating an additional pressure on some to restrict charity care." If the U.S. cannot pour out vast virtual dollars, it cannot ever repay old loans and certainly not new ones, so the U.S. lifeline of borrowing paid for with virtual dollars will be cut as well. 'But if she sides with big corporations against everyday people, there will be a huge amount of political space for some insurgent to run on an economic populist platform.' 'Every candidate who thinks about running will be faced with a whole set of questions, on holding Wall Street accountable, on combatting [sic; combating] student debt, on expanding social security,' said Ilya Sheyman, the executive director of MoveOn.Org Political Action. 'Whether it's Secretary Clinton or Sen. Warren or others, all of them are going to have to address the issues that progressives really care about.' Many progressives yearn for Sen. Elizabeth Warren (D-MA) to run, though she has been adamant she will not. ... Obama, elected with the left's full ardor (and with a Democratic Congress) in 2008, has achieved much of his agenda, but has still left many progressives disappointed. Conservatives do not believe that heightened awareness of economic inequality axiomatically leads to support for the left's preferred solutions. 'They argue for redistribution of wealth. Well, there are two major ways to do that—by massive tax increases or by more social programs,' said veteran GOP consultant Ed Rollins. 'That's a very tough sell, politically. There are constituencies within the Democratic Party that have benefitted from those things, but I don't think they are issues that are going to win them elections.' federal poverty line, about \$16,100 for an individual. Washington pays the entire cost for that group through 2016, gradually phasing down to a 90 percent share. About half the states have accepted the offer to expand coverage in this way. But whether or not a state expands Medicaid, all states are on the hook for a significantly bigger share of costs when it comes to people who were Medicaid-eligible under previous law. The federal government's share for this group averages about 60 percent nationally. In California, it's about a 50-50 split, so for each previously eligible resident who signs up, the state has to pony up half the cost." [59145]

Venezuela's foreign minister, Elias Jaua, tells reporter that violence in his country is "not an issue that concerns [U.S. Secretary of State] Mr. John Kerry." Reuters notes, "In Venezuela's worst violence in a decade, 42 people have died during months of daily protests demanding President Nicolas Maduro's departure and solutions to economic hardships. ...Maduro, who became president after the death of Hugo Chavez last year, says the protests are a veneer for a U.S.-supported conspiracy to bring him down." You don't just sort of snap your fingers and do that. You don't just put in on a boat or plane, you've got to have

Roughly 2,000 housekeepers, waiters and others at nine of 10 downtown Las Vegas casinos voted this month to go on strike June 1 if they don't reach agreements on a series of issues, the thorniest of which involve new ACA-related cost increases, according to the Unite Here union." VA fraud does not always involve secret waiting lists. The deception could be as simple as listing the next available date for an appointment with a physicians as the date the patient requested. (That is, a veteran might arrive on January 10 and ask for an appointment as soon as possible. The VA employee, noting that the next available date is April 9 simply cancels the request, which would have reflected a wait time of about three months, and simply re-enters the appointment as if the veteran had requested an April 9 appointment in the first place. 'There is no constitutional basis for conferring such status, and Congress has repeatedly refused to confer this status,' said Carissa Mulder, a spokeswoman for two members of

the federal Commission on Civil Rights. 'This seems to be yet another case of the Obama administration ignoring the law to achieve its policy objectives,' she added." The Syria question was therefore not inappropriate.) During the science fair event, Obama is photographed ducking behind a young boy as a projectile is fired from one of the exhibits. The Journal added that power plant 'operators could trade emissions credits or use other offsets in the power sector, such as renewable energy or energy-efficiency programs, to meet the target.' ... News reports say that the EPA will require states to reduce their carbon dioxide emissions from power plants by a whopping 25 percent in the coming decades. The new rules are set to be unveiled next week by ... Obama himself, underpinning the significance of the new rules. The EPA's emissions limits for existing power plants will put new burdens on coal-reliant states and raise electricity prices as more coal plants are retired." The U.S. Chamber of Commerce warns that planned "greenhouse gas" regulations from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) may cost consumers \$50 billion through 2030, and cause the loss of 224,000 jobs per year. The White House shut down the political office in 2011 amid questions from an ethics watchdog that it may have violated the Hatch Act, a federal law that prevents federal employees from politicking on government time. But in January, the White House said it was reviving it, renaming it the Office of Political Strategy and Outreach and saying it would be more limited in its role." [59230]

The State Department's Counter Terrorism Bureau apologizes for issuing a Twitter message that promoted a Muslim "scholar" and an article on his web site. According to FreeBeacon.com, Sheik Abdallah Bin Bayyah's organization "has reportedly backed Hamas and endorsed a fatwa authorizing the murder of U.S. soldiers in Iraq. ...Bin Bayyah has long been a controversial figure and his attendance at a 2013 meeting at the White House sparked a fury among critics of the Obama administration. Bin Bayyah has served as the vice president of the International Union of Muslim Scholars (IUMS), which was founded by [a] Muslim Brotherhood leader 'who has called for the death of Jews and Americans and himself is [sic; is himself] banned from visiting the U.S.' ...Terrorism analyst Patrick Poole condemned the State Department's tweet last week, stating that it must more carefully vet the Muslim leaders it promotes. 'This administration is continuing to push extremist clerics like Bin Bayyah as part of a fantasy foreign policy that somehow they are somehow a counter to al Qaeda.'" [59272]

Congressman Peter King (R-NY) tells CNN's Erin Burnett that Obama's troop withdrawal announcement for Afghanistan is a "big mistake" because it "just gives the enemy the opportunity to plan their strategy." [59255]

Are they political critics and dissidents and activists? Are they genuinely people we'd regard as terrorists? What are the metrics and calculations that go into choosing those targets and what is done with the surveillance that is conducted? Those are the kinds of questions that I want to still answer." A far better black female poet is Phillis Wheatley who, Frederick William Dame notes in his upcoming book, America's Indomitable Character, "was the first African-American woman and poet to publish her work." Once a slave in 18th century Boston, Wheatley, who corresponded with and even met George Washington, produced an admirably long list of published works before her untimely death at the age of 31.) ThinkProgress.org notes, "Angelou was a close associate with [sic; of] Malcolm X prior to his assassination and had plans to start a new effort with him to advance African-American rights." (Note to ThinkProgress.org writers: Angelou could not have been a close associate of Malcolm X after his assassination.) "Angelou was a leader of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference." "Angelou supported Cuban leader Fidel Castro." "Angelou was a staunch advocate for marriage equality" (that is, same-sex marriage). [59204, 59205, 59206, 59207, 59208, 59209, 59262, 59392, 61203]

FreeBeacon.com reports, "The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is refusing to answer Congress' questions about the existence of a secret terrorist 'hands off' list that is said to have permitted individuals with terrorist ties easy entrance into the United States. The existence of the hands-off list was first publicized earlier this month by Sen. Chuck Grassley (R-IA), who released a cache of internal DHS emails detailing the list's existence and a discussion about permitting an alleged member of the Muslim Brotherhood to enter the United States. The revelation that individuals tied to terrorists were given special treatment drew outrage among lawmakers and led U.S. Customs and Border Patrol (CBP), one of the agencies involved with the list, to hold a closed-door briefing with Grassley's staff last week, according to a senior Senate source with

knowledge of the meeting. The *Washington Free Beacon* has further reported that the documents are part of a larger campaign by DHS and its former head Janet Napolitano to purge the internal security records of potentially hundreds of terror suspects, allowing them to more easily travel in and out of the United States. When questioned by Grassley's staff last week during the closed-door briefing, CBP officials refused to answer multiple questions about the purported 'hands off' list, according to Grassley spokeswoman Beth Pellett Levine.' Obama delivers a foreign policy address at West Point's graduation class, receiving what CNN's Jim Clancy calls an "icy reception." Clancy says, "[It] probably, you know, wasn't really a great speech to give at the U.S. Military Academy. It was a philosophical speech. It was not a commander-in-chief speaking to his troops. And you heard the reception. I mean, it was pretty icy." (To a great extent the speech was little more than Obama defending—point by point—criticism of his foreign policy. It was a speech about him, not a speech about the proper role of the United States of America around the world.) Only about one quarter of the cadets stood upon Obama's introduction, and the applause was called "tepid" by the *Daily Mail*. Even fewer of the parents and guests in the audience stood an applauded. The thin-skinned Obama, apparently *still* upset over criticism of his shameful 2009 "American exceptionalism" remark, says, "I believe in American exceptionalism with every fiber of my being. But what makes us exceptional is not our ability to flout international norms and the rule of law; it's our willingness to affirm them through our actions." (In Strasbourg, France, in June 2009, Obama was asked by Ed Luce of the Financial Times if, like his predecessors, Obama believed in American exceptionalism. Obama replied, "I believe in American exceptionalism, just as I suspect that the Brits believe in British exceptionalism and the Greeks believe in Greek exceptionalism." In other words, Obama does not believe America is exceptional; in his view it is just one nation among many and isn't all that special. Obama's comment and his apologies for the United States prompted people to say, "He sounds like a European." During the 1988 campaign, George H.W. Bush said of Democrat candidate Michael Dukakis, "He sees America as another pleasant country on the U.N. roll call, somewhere between Albania and Zimbabwe. I see America as the leader—a unique nation with a special role in the world." The remark applies to Obama more than it did Dukakis. PJMedia.com's Andrew Klavan later writes, "Wow. Got that? [Obama] has a vision of our nation as a place where we obey international law and live up to the international norm. I mean, I wouldn't want to think America was exceptional for what it stood for—like, oh I don't know; freedom, say—because then we'd have to stand against something too—like the kind of oppression and slavery that actually is the norm in a whole lot of non-western countries around the world... and, increasingly, in western countries where Muslims have been allowed to have their way and opposing them out

loud has been outlawed. We'd have to stand up for Americans when they made videos others didn't like and loudly declare that our way—toleration, respect for private property and western law—is morally superior to the savagery of sharia and the travesty of communism. And then maybe some people wouldn't like us anymore. We might 'create more enemies than we take off the battlefield,' as [Obama] nonsensically fretted in his West Point speech. No, better to show everyone how exceptionally we obey international law and affirm the international norm, whatever the hell that is. Then people will like us and the world will be a safer place. Like it is now. Can't you tell? ... Obama is a [man] without a vision, or with a vision so puny it's hardly worth the name. All those big windy words—that hopey-changey stuff? Forget about it. During the address, Obama says, "I am calling on Congress to support a new Counter-Terrorism Partnerships Fund of up to \$5 billion, which will allow us to train, build capacity, and facilitate partner countries on the front lines. These resources will give us flexibility to fulfill different missions, including training security forces in Yemen who have gone on the offensive against al Qaeda; supporting a multinational force to keep the peace in Somalia; working with European allies to train a functioning security force and border patrol in Libya; and facilitating French operations in Mali." With regard to Syria, Obama says, "As frustrating as it is, there are no easy answers—no military solution that can eliminate the terrible suffering anytime soon. ... I made a decision that we should not put American troops into the middle of this increasingly sectarian civil war, and I believe that is the right decision. But that does not mean we shouldn't help the Syrian people stand up against a dictator who bombs and starves his people." (Arguably, the American people made that decision, not Obama. With his "red line" challenge he appeared eager to launch a military strike against Syria. It was pressure from Congress that caused Obama to back down.) "The partnership I've described does not eliminate the need to take direct action when necessary to protect ourselves. When we have actionable intelligence, that's what we do—through capture operations, like the one that brought a terrorist involved in the plot to bomb our Embassies in 1998 to face justice; or drone strikes, like those we have carried out in Yemen and Somalia. But as I said last year, in taking direct action, we must uphold standards that reflect our values. I will increasingly turn to our military to take the lead and provide information to the public about our efforts. Our intelligence community has done outstanding work and we must continue to protect sources and methods. But, when we cannot explain our efforts clearly and publicly, we face terrorist propaganda and international suspicion; we erode legitimacy with our partners and our people; and we reduce accountability in our own government." Obama tells the cadets that a "spirit of cooperation needs to energize the global effort to combat climate change—a creeping national security crisis that will help shape your time in uniform, as we are called on to respond to refugee flows and natural disasters and conflicts over water and food, which is why next year I intend to make sure America is out front in putting together a global framework to preserve our planet. You see,

American influence is always stronger when we lead by example. We can't exempt ourselves from the rules that apply to everybody else. We can't call on others to make commitments to combat climate change if a whole lot of our political leaders deny that it's taking place." [59333]

Probably to the surprise of no one, Obama sprinkles his speech with straw man arguments that would result in a failing grade for a high school debate student. He says, "U.S. military action cannot be the only or even the primary component of our reaction in every instance," "To say we have an interest in pursuing peace... beyond our borders is not to say that every problem has a military solution," "A strategy that involves invading every country that harbors terrorist networks is naïve and unsustainable," and chastises "critics who think military intervention is the only way to avoid looking weak." (Of course, no one has suggested that military action should be the nation's first reaction to every crisis, or that all problems have military solutions, that we should invade every country that harbor terrorists, or that an appearance of weakness can only be avoided with the use of military force.) "In taking direct action," says Obama, "we must uphold standards that reflect our values. That means taking strikes only when we face a continuing, imminent threat, and only where there is near certainty of no civilian casualties, for our actions should meet a simple test: We must not create more enemies than we take off the battlefield." (At Townhall.com, radio talk show host Mark Davis comments, "If the prevention of civilian casualties had guided our strategy in World War II, the entire [European] continent would speak German today. Any fighting force with a conscience will always weigh risks to non-combatants as a factor in evaluating its strategy. But the fighting force placing civilian protection above victory will never have victory. This is why we have not driven terrorists from Iraq and Afghanistan; we have been too interested in building schools and laying water pipelines and not interested enough in the stark necessity of war—killing enough of the enemy to persuade its surrender. If our cause is just and our methods measured, we do not need to wring our hands over what the locals think of us. If we are in the right and have the will to win, the rightness of our actions will be appreciated over time. I'm sure we were not popular with the Japanese as we dropped bombs on Hiroshima. If Harry Truman, who reminds us what Democrats used to act like, had been paralyzed by Japanese opinion polls, the war could have continued through his presidency and beyond. Instead, we chased Hitler into his fetid bunker and bombed Imperial Japan into submission. Within less than a generation, both vanquished nations were steadfast allies.") [59353]

Obama states, "We reserve all options to prevent Iran from obtaining a nuclear weapon. But for the first time in a decade, we have a very real chance of achieving a breakthrough agreement, one that is more effective and durable than what we could have achieved through the use of force. And throughout these negotiations, it has been our willingness to work through multilateral channels that kept the world on our side." (The odds of a "breakthrough agreement" are minimal. Iran has made the Obama administration look ike amateurs in the negotiations, and it is close than ever to having nuclear weapons.

Additionally, "keeping the world on our side" is not the goal. The goal is preventing Iran from obtaining nuclear weapons it would use against our allies. That Obama does not understand the priorities is why his negotiations have failed.) [59353]

Remarkably, Obama says, "I will continue to push to close Gitmo, because American values and legal traditions do not permit the indefinite detention of people beyond our borders." (That Obama is still frustrated over the issue of Guantanamo reveals much about his personality. On his second day in office he issued a king-like command that the terrorist detention center be closed, without having a clue as to what that would require or what the consequences would be. More than five years later, Obama remains childishly upset that he did not get his way. He is also historically mistaken, of course. During World War II the United States most certainly did detain prisoners of war in various countries, and with no knowledge of when hostilities would end. There is nothing illegal about detaining enemy combatants. That those combatants may come from various nations and not wear identical uniforms is irrelevant.) [59353]

D. W. Ulsterman calls Obama's speech "rambling" and "excuse-laden," and notes that the "decidedly less than enthusiastic crowd... remained quiet throughout his many 'not my fault' talking points. ... Obama tried repeatedly to assure the military audience that he believed in American exceptionalism. This comes after several years of [his] downplaying, and at times, apologizing for America's influence throughout the world. [He] went on to demand the United States work with the United Nations, that such a relationship will be the hallmark of future U.S. foreign policy. The West Point grads appeared less than enthusiastic about such a goal, perhaps noting the inherent contradiction of a [leader] trying to convince them he believes in American power, while at the same time, demanding that power play a secondary role behind working with such entities as the United Nations. The Daily Mail described [Obama's] reception with the following: 'Receiving tepid applause and a short standing ovation from less than one-quarter of the audience upon his introduction, Obama argued for a contradictory foreign policy that relies on NATO and the United Nations while insisting that 'America must always lead on the world stage.'" Even *The New York Times* pans Obama's speech, writing, "...Obama and his aides heralded his commencement speech at the United States Military Academy at West Point on Wednesday as a big moment, when he would lay out his foreign policy vision for the remainder of his term and refute his critics. The address did not match the hype, was largely uninspiring, lacked strategic sweep and is unlikely to quiet his detractors, on the right or the left. ...He provided little new insight into how he plans to lead in the next two years, and many still doubt that he fully appreciates the leverage the United States has even in a changing world. Falling back on hackneyed phrases like America is the 'indispensable nation' told us little. ...Mr. Obama's talk of the need for more transparency about drone strikes and intelligence gathering, including abusive surveillance practices, was ludicrous. His administration had to be dragged into even minimal disclosures on both topics. Just Tuesday, the administration said it wanted to make further deletions from a legal memo on drone strikes that a court ordered it to make

public. ...Mr. Obama's comments on China and Russia barely touched on how he plans to manage two major countries that have turned increasingly aggressive. Pledging anew to close the jail at Guantánamo Bay, Cuba, which Congress has blocked, was, at this point, little more than a reassuring gesture. This was far from Mr. Obama's big moment. But since he has no office left to run for, what matters ultimately is his record in the next two and a half years." [59304, 59320]

The Chicago Tribune writes that Obama "charted a vision for protecting America that relies less on military power and more on training foreign security forces to fight on their own soil. His context: Wars in Afghanistan and Iraq have taught American leaders about the power—and limits—of U.S. military options. ... Obama also promised that all U.S. troops would be withdrawn by the end of 2016. Then Afghan forces will be 'fully responsible' for Afghan security. We think that timetable needs an asterisk: Depends on conditions on the ground. What happens if military leaders tell Obama in 2016 that closing U.S. bases will cripple their ability to devastate terror havens and target plotters? What if a future Afghan president urgently requests continued U.S. military backup? We don't know if Afghan forces can hold their own against the Taliban after the U.S. leaves. The end of 2016 is undiscovered territory, a world impossible to fully imagine or anticipate. Obama's speech will be parsed in capitals around the world (including Washington), as friend and foe gauge [his] inclination to send aid or to let conflicts burn on their own. We're sure Obama realizes that Wednesday's foreign policy pronouncement has a limited shelf life. By this time next year, a fresh field of presidential candidates will be touting their agendas. They'll debate the use of force, how to battle terror and protect America—in short, how to build on Obama's successes and avoid his failures." (The Tribune does not try to list those successes; it does not have to list his failures.) [59305, 59320]

The Wall Street Journal writes, "The speech ...Obama delivered Wednesday at West Point was intended to be a robust defense of his foreign policy, about which even our liberal friends are starting to entertain doubts. But as we listened to [Obama] chart his course between the false-choice alternatives of 'American isolationism' and 'invading every country that harbors terrorist networks,' we got to thinking of everything that wasn't in his speech. [The Russian "reset," the "pivot to Asia," the "red line" in Syria, the Israeli-Palestinian peace process, and the "world without nuclear weapons.] We know that no foreign policy speech can cover the entire world. But listening to Mr. Obama trying to assemble a coherent foreign policy agenda from the record of the past five years was like watching Tom Hanks trying to survive in 'Cast Away': Whatever's left from the wreckage will have to do." At DailySignal.com national security foreign policy expert James Carafano writes, "The 'enemy' chosen by Obama to animate America's grand strategy is climate change. The nation's existential goal, therefore, is 'to energize the global effort to combat climate change, a creeping national security crisis that will help shape your time in uniform,' the commander-in-chief told his new troops at West Point. Apparently, the new second lieutenants will spend their careers fighting the weather. Weather may seem an odd foe

for the military. But for [Obama], it's the perfect choice. Obama can't be accused [of being] a warmonger because he doesn't want the military to fight anyone—he wants the military to help people. Weather isn't a person or a country. He risks offending almost no one. Making climate change a national security matter also helps [Obama] press for other statist agenda items—from pet green energy projects to adopting the right-to-protect doctrine. Unfortunately, as an organizing principle for national security, climate makes a terrible 'enemy.' It is enormously complex and unpredictable. Basing strategy on climate would be the ultimate march of folly. Mr. Obama may well know that. The reference to climate may be just like the rest of the address: knowingly empty rhetoric. Congressman Mac Thornberry (R-TX) comments, "Power and influence in the world come from having capability plus the will to use it. ...I am not willing to accept that we must have a smaller military and a smaller role in the world [as Obama suggests]. Because we know that as the United States retreats, others will fill the void, and those others will not move the world toward greater freedom and greater prosperity." [59310]

While Obama addresses West Point graduates, Vice President Joe Biden delivers a speech to Air Force Academy graduates in Colorado Spring, Colorado. Biden says, "I believe we, and mainly you, have an incredible opportunity to lead in shaping a new world order for the 21st century in a way consistent with American interests and common interests. ... First and foremost, our work begins by rebuilding America's foundations, our economic foundations, our moral and strategic foundations." [59338]

Talk show host Montel Williams, a Navy and Marine veteran, tells Fox News' Neil Cavuto, "I am angry, my friend. I'm angry because, you know, we made a promise. When I stood with my hand up proudly, I said, 'I do solemnly swear and affirm to support and defend the Constitution against all enemies foreign and domestic and I will bear true faith,' I went through my oath. I told the world I'm willing to put my life on the line and die for you. Now, our guys went over. They left body parts. Some of them never made it back. Some of them are here now and their souls are still there. And we have the audacity to turn our back on them right this second? I'm going to tell you something. All societies are judged by what they do for the least of us. The least of us, the ones that protected this democracy. We owe this debt, more than anything else. ...[Obama] just promised \$5 billion for terrorists around the world? At West Point? Where he could have used today to say, 'I'm sorry! For the pain that I've caused you, the families! And I'm going to fix it today!'" [59313, 59317, 59335]

On *The Five*, Kimberly Guilfoyle comments on Obama's strange foreign policy address: "Did he have to say it at West Point? ...With the international community watching, here's [Obama] addressing some of the nation's brightest and bravest who have vowed to

serve our country... and that was just such a confusing, disappointing message. ... This is the problem. I just don't think he understands—honestly—I really don't think he has a grasp on what it means to have a cohesive, coherent foreign policy or how to combat the war on terror. We cannot go around to our enemies, 'Let me hug you and then let me drone you.'" Democrat strategist Bob Beckel erupts, "That's treason, what you just said!" They want to make it optional, not mandatory, for schools to serve fruits and vegetables to our kids." A preliminary report by the Veterans Administration's Inspector General states, "To date, our work has substantiated serious conditions at the Phoenix HCS. We identified about 1,400 veterans who did not have a primary care appointment but were appropriately included on the Phoenix HCS' EWLs [electronic wait lists]. However, we identified an additional 1,700 veterans who were waiting for a primary care appointment but were not on the EWL. Until that happens, the reported wait time for these veterans has not started. Most importantly, these veterans were and continue to be at risk of being forgotten or lost in Phoenix HCS's convoluted scheduling process. As a result, these veterans may never obtain a requested or required clinical appointment. A direct consequence of not appropriately placing veterans on EWLs is that the Phoenix HCS leadership significantly understated the time new patients waited for their primary care appointment in their FY 2013 performance appraisal accomplishments, which is one of the factors considered for awards and salary increases. ... To review the new patient wait times for primary care in FY 2013, we reviewed a statistical sample of 226 Phoenix HCS appointments. VA national data, which was reported by Phoenix HCS, showed these 226 veterans waited on average 24 days for their first primary care appointment and only 43 percent waited more than 14 days. However, our review showed these 226 veterans waited on average 115 days for their first primary care appointment with approximately 84 percent waiting more than 14 days." (The average wait time of almost four months was reported as only a few weeks—so that VA employees could be eligible for awards and salary increases.) [59219, 59260, 59287]

One Texas VA whistleblower tells TheDailyBeast.com, "For lack of a better term, you've got an organized crime syndicate. People up on top are suddenly afraid they may actually be prosecuted and they're pressuring the little guys down below to cover it all up. I see it in the executives' eyes. They are worried." The White House claims Obama found the Inspector General's report "extremely troubling." (Why he did not also find similar reports in 2008 and other years "extremely troubling" is not explained.) [59237]

I am directing that the Phoenix VA Health Care System (VAHCS) immediately triage each of the 1,700 Veterans identified by the OIG to bring them timely care. I have already placed the Phoenix VAHCS leadership on administrative leave, and have directed an independent site team to assess scheduling and administrative practices at the Phoenix VAHCS. This team began their work in April, and we are already taking action on multiple recommendations from this report. We will aggressively and fully implement the remaining OIG recommendations to ensure that we contact every single Veteran identified by the OIG. I have directed the Veterans Health Administration (VHA) to complete a nation-wide access review to ensure a full understanding of VA's policy and continued integrity in managing patient access to care. Further, we are accelerating access to care throughout our system and in communities where Veterans reside." [59237, 592381

At HotAir.com Ed Morrissey writes, "Eric Shinseki had five-plus years to discover this issue, and either he was too incompetent to do so, he willfully ignored it, or worse. This period of self-investigation essentially gives everyone a few extra months to cover their tracks, and at least according to [The Daily Beast's Jacob] Siegel's source, VA executives are making the most of the time. It also sends the message down to the rank and file that Barack Obama cares more about preserving the command structure at VA than he does about solving the problem—and that provides another set of perverse incentives for corruption." The House Veterans Affairs Committee holds a hearing to grill three Veterans Administration officials: Dr. Thomas Lynch, M.D., Assistant Deputy Under Secretary for Health for Clinical Operations, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; Ms. Joan Mooney, Assistant Secretary for Congressional and Legislative Affairs, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; and Mr. Michael Huff, Congressional Relations Officer, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Committee Chairman Jeff Miller (R-FL) and other

committee members are less than satisfied with some of the responses they receive to their questions. Miller tells the VA officials, "Until the VA understands that we're deadly serious, you can expect us to be over your shoulder every single day." Lynch tells the Congressmen he is "not sure" who authorized the secret waiting lists of veteran patients. Congressman Tim Huelskamp (R-KS) points out that requested documents have yet to be turned over. Huelskamp asks Lynch, "So you knew about these veterans that were waiting for care, primary care?" Lynch replies, "I had identified the number of veterans, and we could have moved forward more quickly." Huelskamp: "Did you try to do anything to get care for these veterans... [who were] waiting?" Lynch: "Congressman, we identified the processes and we put people on the ground—" Huelskamp: "Yes or no, did you do anything for those 1,100 [sic; 1,700] veterans?" Lynch: "Congressman, I put in place an understanding of the process, which allowed us to—" Huelskamp: "They are still waiting for care. I think that's your answer." [59233, 59302, 59331]

According to an Associated Press-GfK poll, only 28 percent of Americans support ObamaCare and 43 percent oppose the law. [59245]

The troubling aspect of the directive outlines presidential authority for the use of military arms and forces, including unarmed drones, in operations against domestic unrest. 'This appears to be the latest step in the administration's decision to use force within the United States against its citizens,' said a defense official opposed to the directive. Directive No. 3025.18, 'Defense Support of Civil Authorities,' was issued Dec. 29, 2010, and states that U.S. commanders 'are provided emergency authority under this directive.' ... 'Federal action, including the use of federal military forces, is authorized when necessary to protect the federal property or functions,' the directive states. Military assistance can include loans of arms, ammunition, vessels and aircraft. The directive states clearly that it is for engaging civilians during times of unrest. A U.S. official said the Obama administration considered but rejected deploying military force under the directive during the recent standoff with Nevada rancher Cliven Bundy and his armed supporters....Defense analysts say there has been a buildup of military units within nonsecurity-related federal agencies, notably the creation of Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) teams. The buildup has raised questions about whether the Obama administration is undermining civil liberties under the guise of counterterrorism and counternarcotics efforts. Other agencies with SWAT teams reportedly include the Department of Agriculture, the Railroad Retirement Board, the Tennessee Valley Authority, the Office of Personnel Management, the Consumer Product Safety Commission, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Education Department." That means he's going to override the Constitution when he likes? American exceptionalism—does he like free market capitalism? No, he detests it. Does he like individual liberty and success? If we were talking about food stamps [rather than delayed medical care for veterans], he'd move heaven and earth to fund the food stamp program and make sure everybody got their food stamps, or if he's talking about inequality and redistributing wealth or some massive stimulus program where all that money is wasted, again, he'd move heaven and earth to get that done. The veterans are not a top priority. ... We've got a combination here that is really troublesome system for the country—a radical ideologue who's a complete incompetent! And it's a disaster. ... The next president of the United States is going to have a hell of job not just rebuilding the economy, but rebuilding the United States military. Also on *Hannity*, former Vice President Dick Cheney observes, "I think the perception [of the United States] around the world is increasingly negative, but I think the main focus is on [Obama]. And I know from my own experience on a recent trip through the Middle East spending several days talking with folks I've dealt with all the way back to [Operation] Desert Storm, they all are absolutely convinced that the American capacity to lead and to influence events in that part of the world has been dramatically reduced by [Obama]. Graham (CEO of the Washington Post Company), Richard Holbrooke (Vice Chairman, Perseus, LLC and former board member of AIG), James A. Johnson (Vice Chairman, Perseus, LLC, and former head of Fannie Mae), Craig J. Mundie (Chief Research and Strategy Officer, Microsoft), Condoleezza Rice (Secretary of State), Charlie Rose (Producer, Rose Communications), Mark Sanford (Governor of South Carolina), Eric Schmidt, and Kathleen Sebelius (Governor of Kansas). (As noted previously in this Timeline, at a convenient moment the Westfields Marriot's fire alarm went off, enabling staff to clear the premises of media investigators trying to cover the event. Investigators said the hotel was swarming with security and they were followed as they drove their cars near the area. There is an idea floating around college campuses, including here at Harvard, I think, that scholars should be funded only if their work conforms to a particular view of justice. There's a word for that idea; censorship and it is just a modern form of McCarthyism. Think about the irony: In the 1950s, the right wing was attempting to repress left wing ideas. Today, on many college campuses, it is liberals trying to repress conservative ideas even as conservative faculty members are at risk of becoming an endangered species. And that is probably nowhere more true than it is here in the Ivy League. In the 2012 presidential race, according to Federal Election Commission data, 96 percent of all campaign contributions from Ivy League faculty and employees went to Barack Obama. Ninety-six percent! There was more disagreement among the old Soviet politburo than there is among Ivy League donors. And that statistic should give us some pause. I say it as someone who endorsed ... "Let me tell you something, neither party has a monopoly of truth or God on its side." Speak loudly and carry a soft stick." Lisa Kennedy Montgomery: "What the hell is the Obama Doctrine?" Paul Begala: "That's not the Obama Doctrine." Charles Krauthammer: "Unconnected ad hoc decisions. And that's the Obama Doctrine." Norah O'Donnell: P. J. Crowley: "The Obama Doctrine, it's more like a reaffirmation of something that we've seen in the past, the Powell Doctrine." 'A lot of people [are] coming in with the disease, and it seems to be spreading rapidly, not just within the McAllen station, but throughout the Valley and to some of our agents,' Chris Cabrera, a spokesman for the National Border Patrol Council, told the local media outlet. According to the Associated Press, the RGV sector has arrested more than 130,000 people for immigration violations since October 1—this marks a 67 percent increase from last year. And as agents are overwhelmed, Zack Taylor, Chairman of the National Association of Former Border Patrol Officers, told TRN that illegal aliens are often not screened for diseases during processing. 'We don't screen for diseases,' RGV Border Patrol spokesman Omar Zamora told Breitbart Texas. 'All we are is a processing center, so we don't do that.' RGV Border Patrol spokesman Daniel Tirado said his sector is 'overwhelmed' with the number of illegal aliens that currently need to be processed. 'We're catching an average of 1,000 per day and our agents are processing them around the clock. Processing takes between one to two hours per individual-it varies case by case,' he said. Scabies is a very contagious skin infection caused by mites which burrows themselves under the host's skin." [59337]

The House Judiciary Committee questions Jeh Johnson, Obama's Department of Homeland Security secretary, about the 36,000 illegal immigrants—including violent criminals—who were released rather than deported. Congressman Lamar Smith (R-TX)

asks, "By the administration's own admission, 90 percent of those who were voluntarily released had committed thousands of crimes, such as murder, sexual assault, kidnapping, drug trafficking and hit-and-run. I just don't think it's being very honest with the committee to say that there's legal ambiguity here. If there were, this would be a whole different discussion." (Johnson, like Obama often does, is using a false choice argument: "Either deport every illegal immigrant or make them legal citizens." A third choice also exists: neither deport the illegal immigrants nor allow them to become voting citizens. Let them simply "remain in the shadows" for the rest of their lives and give them no special treatment. If they hate the situation they can return home. If they don't mind living "in a dark hole," so be it.) [59369]

Committee member Trey Gowdy (R-SC), noting the Obama administration's "prosecutorial discretion" excuse for failing to enforce immigration law, asks Johnson, "Are there any categories of law that the chief executive really, actually has to enforce, and this time we really mean it?" That transcends politics and begins to impact the foundation of this republic. And I would urge you to help me find where that line is between prosecutorial discretion and, 'you don't like to enforce the law.'" [59372]

At Heritage.org Stephen Moore writes, "This morning's depressing revised calculation of the growth of the economy in the first quarter of 2014 (-1.0 percent) makes it official: The Obama expansion is now \$2 trillion short of where we would be if growth in this recovery had matched the Reagan recovery that started in 1982. CNSNews.com reports, "The cost for the lodging, entertainment, and security by the Secret Service for the June 2013 Africa trip by ...Obama and his family cost \$2,189,727, according to documents obtained through the Freedom of Information Act by the government watchdog group Judicial Watch. As far as working hard to investigate and identify problems, Obama entered office having already been warned of those problems by the Bush administration. While the previous administration deserves considerable blame for not resolving the problems, Shinseki most certainly did not identify them. He ignored them. In June 2012, Fortune Magazine writer Katherine Eban published a 5,000 word hit-piece on Dodson. The piece was thoroughly denounced by the House Oversight Committee for being grossly false. In between the yelling that I received from the Justice Department yesterday, the spokeswoman—who would not put anything in writing—I was asking for her explanation so there would be clarity and no confusion later over what had been said. At WeeklyStandard.com Stephen Hayes notes Hillary Clinton's explanation of her "What difference does it make?" remark in her new book, *Hard Choices* [which was likely ghost-written written by Edward Widmer]: "My point was simple: If someone breaks into your home and takes your family hostage, how much time are you going to spend focused on how the intruder spent his day as opposed to how best to rescue your loved ones and then prevent it from happening again?" Hayes writes, "That makes no sense. The hostage-taking, to use her comparison, was long over when she appeared before Congress. And the attack wasn't an act of random violence; it came as part of a long pattern of anti-American violence that had led the country into decade-long global war on jihadist terror. The motives of the attackers not only matter, they matter more than just

about anything else. Those who insist on politicizing the tragedy will have to do so without me." Hewitt: "This is a three-part lie: It is not 'just plain wrong' to demand answers from those in charge that night, it is not 'politicizing' to hold those people to account for their failures, and the investigation into Benghazi will indeed involve Clinton whether or not she agrees to be questioned about her collapse that

night. This risible attempt at a 'pre-emptive strike' on the subject will not work, not when the event it seeks to exile from the national debate involves the death of an ambassador and three other Americans at the hands of terrorists and not when her failure to anticipate the attack and her collapse in the face of it goes to her central claim of competency to be president." According to WND.com, Trump calls Obama "the biggest liar I know, and I've known some pretty big liars." "Why couldn't Obama tell the truth [when he said he reluctantly accepted VA chief Eric Shinseki's resignation]? Obama wanted to see Shinseki go. It's just another lie, like the lies Obama told about ObamaCare that we could keep our doctors and our health insurance, when Obama knew all along that wasn't going to be possible. ... According to a 2008 Pentagon dossier on Guantanamo Bay inmates, all five men released were considered to be a high risk to launch attacks against the United States and its allies if they were liberated. The exchange shows that the Obama administration was willing to pay a steep price, indeed, for Bergdahl's freedom. The administration says they will be transferred to Qatar, which played a key role in the negotiations. ... A senior U.S. defense official confirmed Saturday that the prisoners to be released include Mullah Mohammad Fazl, Mullah Norullah Noori, Abdul Haq Wasiq, Khairullah Khairkhwa and Mohammed Nabi Omari. ... 'They are undoubtedly among the most dangerous Taliban commanders held at Guantanamo,' said Thomas Joscelyn, a senior editor at the Long War Journal who keeps a close watch on developments concerning the detainees left at the Guantanamo Bay prison." In the White House Rose Garden, with Bergdahl's parents beside him, Obama states, "This morning, I called Bob and Jani Bergdahl and told them that after nearly five years in captivity, their son Bowe is coming home. While Bowe was gone, he was never forgotten. ... We're committed to winding down the war in Afghanistan, and we are committed to closing Gitmo. But we also made an ironclad commitment to bring our prisoners of war home. That's who we are as Americans." ("We Americans" also choose not to negotiate with terrorists, something Obama apparently has forgotten.) "The Qatari government has given us assurances it will put in place measures to protect our national security." (Obama's "deal" requires that the Qatar retain the five terrorists for one year. After one year they are free to leave Qatar and return to the battlefield.) "It is our hope Sergeant Bergdahl's recovery could potentially open the door for broader discussions among Afghans about the future of their country by building confidence that it is possible for all sides to find common ground." (Recognizing Obama's terrible atrocious negotiating skills, The Obama Timeline suggests this trade: Mexico returns to the United States Andrew Tahmooressi, a Marine who was jailed for making a wrong turn and inadvertently crossing the border with several legally registered weapons in his vehicle, and the United States gives back to Mexico all 11–20 million of its illegal immigrants.) The senior Bergdahl is apparently quite sympathetic toward Afghanis. God will repay for the death of every Afghan child, ameen!" (It is worth noting that the story of Bowe Bergdahl's capture is not without controversy. According to *The Wall Street Journal*, "Then-Pfc. Bergdahl was captured on June 30, 2009, by militants after leaving his U.S. base in Paktika province in eastern Afghanistan. The circumstances surrounding his decision to walk off the base have remained murky. While a prisoner, he has received regular military promotions. However, the circumstances of his captivity have never been clear. U.S. officials have said he was believed to be held for most of the last five years in Pakistan by the Haqqani network, an insurgent group that is allied with but separate from the Taliban, and not directly by the Taliban. But officials said Sgt. Bergdahl was handed over by Taliban, not Haqqani militants." That Bergdahl may have left the base alone and on his own, and that his father appears to be supportive of the Taliban, is considerable fodder for conspiracy theorists.) On May 6, 2011 Bob Bergdahl posted a YouTube video in which he pleaded for the release of his son. He said, "I address the Pakistani armed forces. Our family is counting on your professional integrity and honour to secure the safe return of our son. And we thank you. Our family knows the high price that has been paid by your men in the army and the frontier corp. We give our condolences and thanks to the families of those who have fallen for Pakistan. Strangely to some, we must also thank those who have cared for our son for almost two years ...and others who have played a role in sheltering the American prisoner. We know our son is a prisoner and at the same time a guest in your home. We understand the rationale the Islamic Emirate has made through its video. No family in the United States understands the detainee issue like ours. Our son's safe return will only heighten public awareness of this. That said, our son is being exploited. It's past time for Bowe, and the others, to come home. To the nation of Pakistan our family would wish to convey our compassionate respect. We have watched the violence of war, earthquake, epic floods and crop failures have devastated your lives, all while our son has been in captivity. We have watched your suffering through the presence of our son in your midst. We have wept that God may show his magnificence, his mercy and that his peace may come upon the people of Pakistan. 'We ask that your nation diligently help our son be freed from his captivity. I pray that this video may be played to our only son. God bless you, we love you! We have been quiet in public but we have not been quiet behind the scenes. Continue to be patient and kind to those around you. You are not forgotten." [59430]

At WeeklyStandard.com, Thomas Joscelyn writes, "There are good reasons why the Taliban has long wanted the five freed from Gitmo. All five are among the Taliban's top commanders in U.S. custody and are still revered in jihadist circles. Two of the five have

been wanted by the UN for war crimes. And because of their prowess, Joint Task Force-Guantanamo (JTF-GTMO) deemed all five of them 'high' risks to the U.S. and its allies. The Obama administration wants to convince the Taliban to abandon its longstanding alliance with al Qaeda. But these men contributed to the formation of that relationship in the first place. All five had close ties to al Qaeda well before the 9/11 attacks. Therefore, it is difficult to see how their freedom would help the Obama administration achieve one of its principal goals for the hoped-for talks." In executing this transfer, [Obama] also clearly violated laws which require him to notify Congress thirty days before any transfer of terrorists from Guantanamo Bay and to explain how the threat posed by such terrorists has been substantially mitigated. (U.S. security "will not be compromised," yet Qatar has agreed only to keep the five released terrorists from returning to the battlefield for one year. Federal law requires not only that the administration must notify Congress 30 days in advance of a prisoner release, it must certify that the destination country must ensure that those prisoners do not pose a future threat to the United States,

It is worth noting that on March 2, 2014 CBSNews.com reported that some "are convinced that on June 30, 2009, just a few months after he arrived in Afghanistan, Bergdahl willingly walked away from his unit, which was deployed in Paktika province in eastern Afghanistan, adjacent to the border with Pakistan. While they do want Bergdahl home, they think he should have to answer allegations that he deserted his unit. ...Rolling Stone magazine quoted emails Bergdahl is said to have sent to his parents that suggest he was disillusioned with America's mission in Afghanistan, had lost faith in the U.S. Army's mission there and was considering desertion. Bergdahl told his parents he was 'ashamed to even be [an] American.' Bergdahl, who mailed home boxes containing his uniform and books, also wrote: 'The future is too good to waste on lies. And life is way too short to care for the damnation of others, as well as to spend it helping fools with their ideas that are wrong.' The Associated Press could not independently authenticate the emails published by the magazine in 2012. Bergdahl's family has not commented on the allegations of desertion, according to Col. Tim Marsano, a spokesman for the Idaho National Guard. Marsano is in regular contact with Bergdahl's mother, Jani, and father, Bob, who has grown a long, thick beard and has worked to learn Pashto [also Pashtun], the language spoken by his son's captors. A senior Defense Department official said that if Bergdahl is released, it could be determined that he has more than paid for leaving his unit—if that's what really happened—'and there's every indicator that he did.'" As Nazi tanks crossed into Poland in 1939, an American senator [Idaho Republican William Borah] declared: 'Lord, if only I could have talked to Hitler, all of this might have been avoided.' We have an obligation to call this what it is: the false comfort of appeasement, which has been repeatedly discredited by history." Obama responded in a statement, "It is sad that President Bush would use a speech to the Knesset on the 60th anniversary of Israel's independence to launch a false political attack. Private Bowe Bergdahl disappeared in June 2009 while based in eastern Afghanistan and is thought to be the only U.S. serviceman in captivity. The 24-year-old has converted to Islam and now has the Muslim name Abdullah, one of his captors told The Sunday Times. A Taliban deputy district commander in Paktika, who called himself Haji Nadeem, told the newspaper that Bergdahl taught him how to dismantle a mobile phone and turn it into a remote control for a roadside bomb. Nadeem claimed he also received basic ambush training from the U.S. soldier. 'Most of the skills he taught us we already knew,' he said. 'Some of my comrades think he's pretending to be a Muslim to save himself so they wouldn't behead him.'" [59421]

Stephen Kirouac, calling Bergdahl a 'dirtbag' and 'sympathizer,' was among many who seized on that speculation to criticize the rescued soldier. Bergdahl's mysterious disappearance from the small military outpost there and the subsequent revelation that he was in enemy hands prompted questions that still linger. ...[I]n the weeks before his capture, Bergdahl had made murky statements that suggested he was gravitating away from the soldiers in his unit and toward desertion, a member of his platoon told Rolling Stone. ...As a teen, the home-schooled son of Calvinists took up ballet—recruited to be a 'lifter' by 'a beautiful local girl,' Rolling Stone reported, 'the guy who holds the girl aloft in a ballet sequence.' ...At age 20, he traveled to Paris and started learning French in hopes of joining the French Foreign Legion. His application was rejected, and he was devastated, the magazine reported. Bergdahl would drift for years, working mainly at a coffee shop near home. He briefly

considered moving to Uganda to help villagers being terrorized by militias before deciding on a different adventure. 'I'm thinking of joining the Army,' he told his folks after already having signed up. Bergdahl's dream was to help Afghan villagers rebuild their lives and learn to defend themselves, his dad told the magazine. ...Bowe Bergdahl would detail his disillusionment with the Afghanistan campaign in an email to his parents three days before he went missing. 'I am sorry for everything here,' he wrote. 'These people need help, yet what they get is the most conceited country in the world telling them that they are nothing and that they are stupid.' ... 'I am ashamed to be an American. And the title of US soldier is just the lie of fools,' he concluded. 'I am sorry for everything. The horror that is America is disgusting.' Bob Bergdahl responded in an email: 'OBEY YOUR CONSCIENCE!'" [59454, 59455, 59464]
