The Complete Obama Timeline May 2015

On May 1 International Workers Day is celebrated around the world, and increasingly by labor unions and socialists in the United States. May Day protesters in New York City demand "the unconditional surrender of arms by the NYPD and police departments nationwide." [75138, 75139, 75143]

Politico.com reports, "Chicago will be the home of the Obama presidential library, according to numerous local reports. CBS' Chicago affiliate, citing unnamed sources, reported that the White House confirmed its choice last Friday during a telephone call from Obama to Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel and state Democratic leaders, including Illinois House Speaker Michael Madigan and Senate President John Cullerton. Obama reportedly thanked them for recently passing a law that would allow his library to be built on parkland." (In other words, "Obama thanked them for giving him free land at taxpayer expense.") According to CBS 2 Chicago's Jay Levine, the library "will rise either in Washington Park at [Martin Luther] King Drive and Garfield Boulevard or at the other site proposed by the University of Chicago, in Jackson Park, south of the Museum of Science and Industry, near 60th and Stony Island. ... The estimated price tag for the library and museum is a whopping \$500 million. It is expected to create 1,900 permanent jobs in a community that has struggled. An estimated \$220 million in economic activity would be generated annually." (How a library can possibly create 1,900 permanent jobs is not explained. In Frankfort, Germany, a professional cycling race known as the Frankfort Grand Prix is canceled amid fears of a terrorist attack. *The Telegraph* reports, "A married couple living nearby were arrested overnight, after police found a pipe bomb, assault rifle and ammunition for a bazooka inside their home. The arrested couple have been identified only as Halil D, 35, and Senay D, 34, under strict German privacy laws. Halil D, a German citizen of Turkish origin is known to have ties to Islamist extremist groups, according to the police. His wife is believed to be a Turkish citizen. The couple's home was raided after Halil D had purchased large quantities of chemicals commonly used in bombs. Also, Halil D was spotted hanging around car parks and repeatedly walking the route of the annual Eschborn-Frankfurt City Loop race where it runs through woodland." [75171, 75172, 75175, 76377]

Pamela Geller post signs in an "upper middle class neighborhood in a suburb outside of Denver" announcing enrollment for a new elementary school being built by the Colorado Muslim Society. The signs are posted in English, Spanish, and Arabic. [75173]

Caroline Glick, noting the Iranian boarding of the Maersk Tigris cargo ship, writes, "If the administration continues to stand by in the face of Iran's aggression, the strategic implications will radiate far beyond the US's bilateral ties with the Marshall Islands. If

the US allows Iran to get away with unlawfully seizing a Marshall Islands flagged ship it is treaty bound to protect, it will reinforce the growing assessment of its Middle Eastern allies that its security guarantees are worthless. ...But ...Obama apparently won't allow a bit of Iranian naval piracy to rain on his parade. This week Obama indicated that he feels very good about where his policy on Iran now stands. And he has every reason to be satisfied. With each day that passes, the chance diminishes that his nuclear deal with the mullahs will be scuppered. On the one hand, the Iranians are signaling that they are willing to sign a deal with the Great Satan. And this makes sense. For them the deal has no downside. ... At home as well, Obama no longer faces serious opposition to his Iran policy. The Iranian Nuclear Agreement Review Act, the bill now being debated on the Senate floor, ensures that Congress will have no ability to stand in the way of the deal. In contrast to the provisions of the US Constitution that require a two-third Senate majority to approve an international treaty, the Senate bill requires a two-third majority of senators to block the implementation of Obama's nuclear deal with the greatest state sponsor of terrorism. Obama has successfully bullied centrist Democrat senators into abandoning their concern for US national security and supporting his deal. They in turn have convinced centrist Republicans—and AIPAC—to push forward the legislation and so turn Congress into partner in Obama's nuclear gambit." [75174, 75176]

"Obama's confidence that his deal will go through has freed him up to mark the next target of his foreign policy in what he recently referred to as the 'fourth quarter' of his presidency: Israel. According to a report in Foreign Policy, the administration is now seeking to delay anti-Israel resolutions at the UN Security Council—including a French draft resolution that would require Israel to surrender all of Judea and Samaria and northern, southern and eastern Jerusalem to the Palestinians—until after the deal with Iran is concluded at the end of June. According to the report, the administration doesn't want to upset pro-Israel Democrats while it still needs them to approve the deal with Iran. But Obama has no problem with marking the target. And so, on Monday, Undersecretary of State for Political Affairs Wendy Sherman did just that. In an address before Reform Jews, Sherman issued a direct threat against Israel. In her words, 'If the new Israeli government is seen to be stepping back from its commitment to a two-state solution, that will make our job in the international arena much tougher... it will be harder for us to prevent internationalizing the conflict.' ...[O]n Wednesday US Ambassador Dan Shapiro gave an interview to Army Radio. ... Shapiro signaled that the Obama administration expects Israel to make significant concessions to the Palestinians in return [for] nothing, in the absence of negotiations. And if we [Israelis] fail to make such unreciprocated concessions, we will have no legitimacy and the US will have no choice but to act against Israel at the UN." [75174, 75176]

"There is a thread that runs between Obama's policy toward Iran and his policy toward Israel. That common threat is mendacity. Obama's actual goals in both have little to do with his stated ones. Obama claims that he wishes to prevent Iran from acquiring nuclear weapons. But as we see from his willingness to allow Iran to become a nuclear threshold state while running wild in the Straits of Hormuz, committing mass slaughter in Syria, building an empire that includes Iraq, Syria, Lebanon and Yemen, and threatening its Arab neighbors and Israel, the purpose of the administration's negotiations with Iran is

not to prevent Iran from becoming a nuclear power. The purpose of the negotiations is to build an American-Iranian alliance on Iran's terms. ... Three days after a ship sailing under their flag was seized by Iran's Revolutionary Guards, citizens of the Marshall Islands discovered that their decision to place their security in America's hands is no longer the safe bet they thought it was 29 years ago. Anyone who entertains the belief that Israel will gain diplomatic acceptance or even a respite from American pressure if it makes concessions to the Palestinians is similarly making a high risk gamble." In Baltimore, Maryland State's Attorney Marilyn Mosby announces that one police officer will be charged with murder, three will be charged with manslaughter, and two will be charged with assault in the death of Freddie Gray. According to FoxNews.com, the police union "requested a special prosecutor in the case, saying Mosby had conflicts of interest including a friendship with the Gray family's lawyer, Billy Murphy, who contributed to her campaign. Murphy was among Mosby's biggest campaign contributors last year, donating the maximum individual amount allowed, \$4,000, in June. Murphy also served on Mosby's transition team after the election. ...Gray suffered a broken neck, apparently while riding in the back of the Baltimore police van. While Mosby said Friday the medical examiner had ruled the death a homicide, police sources have said his injuries may have been caused by his head hitting a bolt inside the vehicle, according to local reports." BaltimoreSun.com reports, "A Fraternal Order of Police lodge is asking Baltimore State's Attorney Marilyn Mosby to appoint a special prosecutor to the Freddie Gray investigation because of her personal connection to the Gray family's attorney, William H. 'Billy' Murphy Jr., and her marriage to a city councilman. The letter from Gene Ryan, president of Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 3, also states that none of the six officers involved in Gray's arrest and death were responsible for the 25-year-old West Baltimore man's death that spurred protests and unrest, including rioting and looting on Monday. The letter was released just minutes before Mosby announced charges against the officers. 'Not one of the officers involved in this tragic situation left home in the morning with the anticipation that someone with whom they interacted would not go home that night,' the letter states. 'As tragic as this situation is, none of the officers involved are responsible for the death of Mr. Gray.' ...Murphy supported Mosby during her campaign last year. He donated \$5,000 to her campaign and served on her transition committee." [75166]

Townhall notes a 2014 poverty profile from the Maryland Alliance for the Poor. "According to the report, the 2012 median income in Baltimore was \$39,788. ...Baltimore is No. 1 in the child poverty rate. In 2012, '36.5 percent of children in Baltimore city lie below the poverty line—\$23,492 for a family of four,' the Alliance for the Poor noted. Baltimore is also No. 1 in Maryland for the number of senior citizens below the poverty line. It is also No. 1 in 'individuals living below 200 percent of poverty.' About 46 percent of people in Baltimore hit that mark. The city is No. 2 in unemployment. Again, from the Alliance for the Poor, '9.7 percent of residents of

Baltimore City are unemployed.' Baltimore ranks No. 1 in Maryland for 'residents receiving temporary cash assistance,' No. 1 for 'children receiving temporary cash assistance,' No. 1 in 'percent of population participating in food supplement program,' No. 8 in 'adults receiving temporary disability assistance,' No. 1 in 'percent of children who participate in the free and reduced price meal program... In other words, Baltimore City residents are being taken care of by the American taxpayer. ... The War on Poverty in the United States has done vastly more damage than good. It has created a culture of entitlement and dependency. It has aided the collapse of the American family. It has been deeply destructive in black homes. We have spent trillions of dollars to subsidize the poor, not elevate people out of poverty. ... Baltimore does not need a government spending-spree. It needs a change of culture within families." Milwaukee County Sheriff David Clarke calls the six police officers charged in Baltimore "political prisoners." Clarke tells Fox News' Neil Cavuto, "This neophyte prosecutor [Marilyn Mosby] stood up there and made a political statement, Neil, and I say that because she's chanting or voicing some of the chants ['no justice, no peace'] from this angry mob. Her job is to tune that out. She said, 'I hear the voices.' She is not supposed to hear anything as she reviews this case that is not consistent with the rule of law and our system of justice. ... There's no way I have ever gotten a criminal charge within 24 hours after taking over all the reports and evidence to a prosecutor. A prosecutor who is thorough needs several days to sift through hundreds of pages of reports. They usually want to interview some of the witnesses themselves in person, and they have to sift through all of the evidence, piece by piece, and they have to wait for some of the forensic evidence to conclude to come back. She just got this case yesterday... This is political activism. She'll never prove this beyond a reasonable doubt, and I'm not going to silently stand by and watch my brother officers offered up as human sacrifices, thrown like red meat to an angry mob, just to appease this angry mob." (Despite having been on the job for only a few months, it is clear that Mosby has aspirations for higher public office. She apparently believes that pandering to mobs will help her succeed.) DailyCaller.com reports, "Charges filed against the six Baltimore police officers for their involvement in the death of Freddie Grey will be dismissed, a George Washington University law professor predicted in an interview with The Daily Caller. John Banzhaf, who teaches public interest law, says that the charges announced by Baltimore state's attorney Marilyn Mosby on Friday 'go too far.' 'I think a prosecutor is going to have a hard time proving that the actions did in fact cause death, since they seem to have no theory as to how it occurred. ...I think it is very difficult to pin responsibility on one person when you have four or five or six each doing a variety of things—or not doing a variety of things—which in some generalized way contributes to the overall outcome. ...Again, you have to prove beyond a reasonable doubt, that each of the individuals—Officer X, Officer Y, Officer Z—what he did or didn't do was a direct cause of what happened.'" On Newsmax TV, civil rights lawyer Alan Dershowitz observes, "This is a very sad day for justice... Today had nothing to do with justice. Today was crowd control. Everything

was motivated by a threat of riots and a desire to prevent riots. The mayor outrageously said we're going to get justice for the victim, the family and people of Baltimore, never mentioning the defendants. Under our Constitution, the only people who are entitled to justice are the defendants. They are presumed innocent, they need due process of law, and the mayor and the state attorney have made it virtually impossible for these defendants to get a fair trial. They have been presumed guilty. ... I understand why the mayor and state's attorney want to prevent riots... but that's not the job of the justice system... You cannot allow police officers or any other defendants to become scapegoats for crowds demanding a continuation of rioting. ... There's no plausible, hypothetical, conceivable case for murder under the facts that we now know them. You might say that conceivably there's a case for manslaughter. [But] Nobody wanted this guy to die, nobody set out to kill him, and nobody intentionally murdered him. The worst-case scenario is a case for involuntary manslaughter or some kind of reckless disregard, but the idea of without further investigation coming down with murder indictments... This is a show trial. This is designed to please the crowd. It's designed to lower the temperature. ... My prediction? They've overplayed their hand, it's unlikely they'll get any convictions in this case as a result of this, and if they do, there's a good possibility it'll be reversed on appeal and will just postpone the riots for months ahead." In Austin, Texas, protesters march while chanting, "This racist violence has to stop. Execute those killer cops." [75179, 75180]

Washington Post contributor Sally Kohn tweets, "As Baltimore burned, what did Republicans do? Propose cuts to urban development while increasing Pentagon budget!" (Kohn is absurdly implying that riots that already took place are the fault of a proposed federal budget, ignoring that fact that her fellow "progressives" have been running Baltimore for almost 50 years.) WND.com reports, "A leading conservative is asking why the Obama State Department is barring a persecuted Iraqi nun from entry into the United States to share her message about the brutal treatment of Christians in her country. Nina Shea of the Hudson Institute's Center for Religious Freedom, writes in a National Review op-ed that Sister Diana Momeka is 'an internationally respected and leading representative of the Nineveh Christians who have been killed and deported by ISIS.' Yet this nun is being 'barred from coming to Washington to testify about this catastrophe?' Sister Diana was the only Christian in the delegation and the only member blocked from the trip, the Washington Times reported, leading some of her American supporters to question why she was singled out. ... Shea states that the State Department officials made the determination that the Catholic nun 'could be falsely asserting that she intends to visit Washington when secretly she could be intending to stay. That would constitute illegal immigration, and that, of course, is strictly forbidden. Once here, she could also be at risk for claiming political asylum, and the U.S. seems determined to deny ISIS's Christian victims that status." (The Obama administration has allowed hundreds of thousands of illegal immigrants into the United States and Obama has issued executive orders to make it possible for them to stay—yet the administration will not allow a Catholic nun to spend

one week in the United States to talk about the persecution of Christians in the Middle East.) [75167, 75671]

Former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich comments, "Congress has to investigate and find out who made this decision and what is the State Department going to do about it. The U.S. ambassador to Turkey, John Bass, childishly responds via Instagram, "American diplomats: we're all blonde." [75136, 75137]

Socialist presidential candidate Bernie Sanders tells *The Washington Post*, "Not only is climate change real and caused by human activity, but it is already causing devastating problems in America and around the world. In terms of the kind of planet we are going to leave our kids and grandchildren, the scientists tell us that if we do not get our act together, this planet may be five to 10 degrees Fahrenheit warmer by the end of this century. Just think of all the cataclysmic impacts that will mean. It is not only supporting what [Obama] done; it is saying we've got to lead the world." Sanders calls for "a tax on carbon." "a massive investment in solar, wind, geothermal," "making sure that every home and building in this country is properly winterized," and "putting substantial money into rail, both passenger and cargo, so we can move towards breaking our dependency on automobiles." ("Vote for me and I will tax the heck out of gasoline and force you onto trains" is arguably not a winning platform on which to run for president.) [75140, 75141, 75155]

Politico.com reports, "The Obama administration has imposed tougher safety regulations for trains carrying crude oil and ethanol, responding to growing alarm about the spread of oil-by-rail traffic and a series of fiery derailments across the U.S. and Canada. The rules, which inspired more than a year of furious lobbying by the railroad and energy industries, include stiffer construction standards for rail tank cars made after Oct. 1, requirements for phasing out older cars as soon as January 2018, mandates for advanced braking systems, and permanent versions of the speed limits that DOT announced last year." NationalReview.com's Jonah Goldberg comments on the Clinton Foundation: "Sure, the foundation spends a few pennies on the dollar for latrines and textbooks. But its real purpose is to serve as a super–super PAC with better branding. ...Many people thought

He says, "Those kids throwing rocks & bottles are the greatest youth of our generation... they are revolutionaries!" (This is the same Malik "Zulu" Shabazz who avoided jail because Obama's Department of Justice dropped charges against him for brandishing a billy club

Brian Moore, a 105th precinct police officer in Queens, New York City is shot in the head and chest and is in critical condition. At RealClearPolitics.com Rich Lowry writes that Obama "doesn't have the slightest idea how to fix Baltimore. His solutions fall back on liberal bromides going back 50 years. Dating back to the [Otto] Kerner Commission [National Advisory Commission on Civil Disorders] after the riots of the 1960s, the left's go-to solution to urban problems has been more social programs. Since then, we've gotten more social programs—and just as many urban problems. Exhibit A is Baltimore itself. The city hasn't been 'neglected." It has been misgoverned into the ground. It is a Great Society city that bought fully into the big-government vision of the 1960s, and the bitter fruit has been corruption, violence and despair. It was brilliant politics, as Democrats now enjoy an eight-to-one voter registration advantage.' ... The schools, predictably, are a disaster, run by and for the teachers unions. On top of all this, two-thirds of births in the city are out-of-wedlock. ... What is Obama offering in response to this deep, decades-long decline? Among other things, more pre-K education and job training, even though these programs have a long history of ineffectiveness. The imperative in Baltimore should be to think and act anew. But the left's takeaway will be that there's an urgent need for more of the same, as Baltimore and places like it continue to rot." [75189, 75190]

An attorney for New York City's Metropolitan Transit Authority (MTA), argues that the agency has the right to ban all political ads. minutes. It was gorgeous. ...Imagine in post 9/11 NYC, with scores of Islamic attacks thwarted in the subway, the Holland Tunnel, NY Stock Exchange, the Federal Reserve Building, Times Square, etc., and NYC is banning criticism of jihad and sharia." [75198, 75199]

FoxNews.com reports, "Leading Persian Gulf states want major new weapons systems and security guarantees from the White House in exchange for backing a nuclear agreement with Iran, according to U.S. and Arab officials. The leaders of the six-nation Gulf Cooperation Council, including Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates and Qatar, plan to use a high-stakes meeting with ... Obama later this month to request additional fighter jets, missile batteries and surveillance equipment. They also intend to pressure Obama for new defense agreements between the U.S. and the Gulf nations that would outline terms and scenarios under which Washington would intervene if they are threatened by Iran, according to these officials." Fox News also reports, "The State Department has reportedly deemed any mission to rescue U.S. government assets in war-torn Yemen too risky. ...Instead, State Department spokeswoman Marie Harf has pointed to an online system where Americans stranded in Yemen can register to receive updates on opportunities to leave the country. The department has also talked to other countries about Americans joining their rescue missions, she said. ...[T]he U.S. [usually] evacuates citizens when commercial methods of transport are cut off. However, the State Department made clear that no such operation was in the works for Yemen, where airports have been bombed and seaports are closed to commercial traffic. The Yemen crisis has been building for quite a while. The State Department has warned travelers for decades not to travel to the country. The U.S. Embassy in the capital closed in February. Despite warnings, Americans have kept coming and going." [75200]

On May 3 Mike Shedlock reports at Townhall.com, "Economists have been overly optimistic on the majority of economic reports for going on six months. Today the Bloomberg Consensus estimate for construction spending [in March] was for a 0.4% gain. The actual result was a decline of 0.6%." [75206]

Those who believe America's universities are bastions of free thought and open-mindedness may be surprised to learn that, according to an analysis of political contributions, 96 percent of donations from Harvard University faculty members over the last three years went to Democrats. Georgetown law professor Nicholas Quinn Rosenkranz tells Fox News, "It is a shame that our greatest universities have become ideologically monolithic. At many of these schools, including Georgetown Law School, most students will graduate without ever laying eyes on a single Republican professor. Ideally these universities would expose students to the most powerful arguments on both sides of the great issues, rather than indoctrinating them with the ideology of the far left." (That universities are mostly staffed by leftists is not surprising. Decades ago the political left made a conscious effort to infiltrate higher education as a means of turning the nation toward socialism. Revolutionaries like William Ayers went into education for a reason:

bombing the Pentagon landed them in jail, while brainwashing America's youth was not only illegal, it was a well-paid endeavor.) [75207]

Maryland Governor Larry Hogan tells reporters, "Monday night [April 17] we lost 200 businesses." (Most were minority-owned and few had insurance.) [75215, 75216]

An estimated 16 million previously uninsured people are now covered, some through Medicaid and others with private plans bought via online marketplaces. But instead of pulling back on emergency room care, the newly insured now have a plan to pay for those visits so they're not responsible for the entire bill. And that seems to be driving the change in patient load, at least for now. ...Much of that is likely driven by low-income Americans who have become newly eligible for Medicaid in states that chose to expand it." On *Fox News Sunday*, Congresswoman Donna Edwards (D-MD) is asked by Chris Wallace, "A lot of people, frankly conservatives, have pointed out that Baltimore has not had a Republican mayor in 50 years. Is it unfair to say that liberal policies have failed Baltimore?" Edwards replies, "No, I think it's been unfairly spread. Just prior to the Freddie Gray incident [the] mayor was actually prevailing upon our Republican governor to release money for school funding." Wallace: "Baltimore was already spending plenty for public schools and the schools were still lousy." (The Baltimore school system spends more than \$17,000 per student per year, which should be more than enough to provide each student with quality education inasmuch as many schools do an excellent job with half the resources. That group right there is doing this. ...I can only comment on how I think journalists should think about a word that actually doesn't have a lot of nuance and isn't specific, but somehow seems to be used a lot when you're talking about African-Americans. So me personally, I wouldn't call someone a thug. I think it's not a descriptive term. The journalist's job, and I think what's been sorely lacking in this story, frankly, is context, right, description and context." (The word "thug" is, of course, descriptive and specific. At NYPost.com Kyle Smith writes, "The Clintons have been playing the political press for idiots. Revealing what they've been up to took a little bit of work. It wasn't obvious. He said one officer and two suspects were shot. It wasn't immediately clear if the shooting was related to the event. Garland Police Department spokesman Joe Harn declined to confirm the SWAT officer's statements and said he had no details. Attendees were taken

to another room. Authorities said around 8 p.m. Sunday that the group would be moved to a nearby high school. The New York-based American Freedom Defense Initiative, led by conservative anti-sharia activist Pamela Gellar, was hosting a contest that would award \$10,000 for the best cartoon depicting Muhammad at the venue. ...Ms. Geller said that she planned the Sunday event to make a stand for free speech in response to the outcries and violence over drawings of Muhammad." (According to Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich, "There were 200 people at the event, 350 submissions were made from all over the world. The winner of the contest is a former Muslim and was awarded \$10,000.") A SWAT officer told WND two suspects 'are down,' but law-enforcement officers have put a perimeter around them, fearing they may have explosive devices. Attendees, including this reporter, have been moved to a secure location at the Curtis Culwell Center in suburban Dallas. Wilders left the building with members of his permanent Dutch security detail before the shooting. The condition of the officer is unknown. [The guard suffers a leg wound and is later released from the hospital.] On Thursday [April 30], a Twitter account purporting to belong to Mohamed Abdullahi Hassan, an American jihadi [from Minnesota, also known as Muhajid Miski] reportedly [now] fighting in Somalia, called for attacks to be carried out in the United States similar to those on Charlie Hebdo. The following message accompanied a link to a story about the event in Garland Sunday night: 'The brothers from the Charlie hebdo [sic] attack did their part. It's time for brothers in the #US to do their part.' ... There was massive security at the Texas event Sunday, including a SWAT team, a portable police tower, metal detectors inside and blockades outside." After they wound a security guard, two suspects are reportedly shot dead by police. One of the two body-armored attackers is identified as Elton Simpson. Simpson, identified in court papers as an American Muslim, had been convicted of lying to federal agents about his plans to travel to Somalia five years ago, but a judge ultimately ruled it could not be proved that he was heading there to join a terror group. He was placed on probation. The second gunman has not been named but KPNX-TV reported that the two shared an apartment at the Autumn Ridge complex in Phoenix." The second attacker is identified as Nadir Soofi, Simpson's roommate. Both Simpson and Soofi were members of the Islamic Community Center of Phoenix (ICCP) mosque. Mosque president Usama Shami had known Soofi for about 10 years. (There are conflicting reports of Soofi's allegiance to the mosque, but it posted a \$100,000 cash bond in a 2010 terrorism case in which he was convicted and sentenced to three years' probation.) Soofi's mother, Sharon Soofi, tells the *Los Angeles Times* her

son "was outgoing, he was intelligent, he did well in school; he just had a normal American upbringing. He lived in nice neighborhoods. ...He really wasn't denied anything." Soofi's father, Azam Soofi, states that his son "lived a real privileged life all his life. He was a very humble, soft-spoken person. Never said no to me." Shareef was arrested in 2006 for his role in a plot to set off hand grenades at a Rockford, Illinois shopping mall during the holiday season. The mosque also came under scrutiny in March 2008, when a large group of men from ICCP began firing semi-automatic weapons in an open area frequented by runners and bikers near a residential area... Needless to say, the usual suspects claimed the men were being targeted because of their Islamic faith, rather than their firing rifles in a prohibited area that endangered others. ICCP officials would most likely claim that the case of the "Draw Muhammad" terrorists coming out of their mosque, as had a traitor betraying classified military secrets to al-Qaeda, and a man planning a terror attack on a shopping mall during the holidays, is a matter of bad luck." Landay of McClatchy wish that Pamela Geller and I could be prosecuted for standing for free speech against violent intimidation, and describe completely wrongly the concept of 'fighting words,' which is actually about words spoken in an actual fight situation, not about an innocuous activity that others find so provocative as to commit murder. The free world is going quietly. ...I have offered to have a public discussion or debate with virtually every significant Muslim leader on the scene. They have all contemptuously refused. They don't want to fight speech with more speech. They don't want to confront our ideas. They want to smear us, defame us, marginalize us, and destroy us utterly. That is how the Left and the Islamic supremacists work these days." [75272, 75526, 75533]

Bill Clinton tells NBC News' Cynthia McFadden he will keep accepting \$500,000 per speech because "I gotta [sic; have to] pay our bills." He also excuses the shady dealings of the Clinton Foundation, saying, "There is no doubt in my mind that we have never done anything knowingly inappropriate in terms of taking money to influence any kind of American government policy. That just hasn't happened." (Clinton's response is like answering, "No, I've never been *convicted*" to the question, "Have you ever been *arrested*?") McFadden asks, "Do you understand though that the perception itself is a

problem?" Clinton replies, "No. I'm not responsible for anybody else's perception." [75260, 75264]

According to WashingtonTimes.com, "The Obama Justice Department turned down a request five years ago to help the Baltimore Police Department save a training program widely credited for improving the department's relations with the city's crime-ridden and minority neighborhoods and reducing homicides and police-involved shootings. The department was seeking \$200,000 in federal funding to help extend the Diamond Standard training program. It was discontinued in 2012 when Justice declined to act on the request and the city's new administration decided it no longer could afford it, according to interviews. The key organizer of the training told The Washington Times that he was floored when he later learned the same Justice program whose help he sought instead gave money to the company that produced the children's PBS series 'Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood.'" According to FreeBeacon.com, "The city of Baltimore received over \$1.8 billion from ...Obama's [2009] stimulus law, including \$467.1 million to invest in education and \$26.5 million for crime prevention. ...Obama claimed last Tuesday that if the Republican-controlled Congress would implement his policies to make 'massive investments in urban communities,' they could 'make a difference right now' in the city, currently in upheaval following the death of Freddie Gray. (Baltimore has about 622,000 residents. The \$1.8 billion in stimulus funds therefore represented about \$2,900 per resident. Of course, it was not meant to be distributed equally across the city; it was supposed to create jobs—yet the average unemployment rate in Baltimore in 2010 was higher than it was in 2009.) Obama travels to New York City for a speaking engagement at a My Brother's Keeper Alliance event at Lehman College, followed by an appearance on *The Late Show* with David Letterman—and two Democrat National Committee events. Obama tells the My Brother's Keeper audience that assisting young men of color will "remain a mission for me and for Michelle not just for the rest of my presidency, but for the rest of my life. And the reason is simple... we see ourselves in these young men. I grew up without a dad. I grew up lost sometimes and adrift, not having a sense of a clear path. And the only difference between me and a lot of other young men in this neighborhood and all across the country is that I grew up in an environment that was a little more forgiving." The Washington Post gives House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) "three Pinocchios" for claiming the House budget proposal "turns a cold shoulder to our veterans and ignores our crumbling infrastructure. In terms of our veterans, you see yesterday, Republicans sought to advance their appropriations bill under the level set by their new budget, which may or may not come to the floor today. But yesterday, the MilCon—military construction veterans bill—that cuts \$1.4 billion below ...Obama's budget... and then it cuts \$690 million from veterans' medical care alone, the equivalent of 70,000 fewer veterans receiving V.A. medical care in one year." The Post points out,

"The House passed a \$171 billion VA and military construction bill, which was a funding increase for both programs over fiscal 2015 levels. That included \$163 billion for VA's fiscal 2016 budget—a \$4 billion increase over the fiscal 2015 enacted budget... Discretionary funding for VA totaled \$69.7 billion—a nearly six percent increase over fiscal 2015. It included funding for treatment of 6.9 million patients and 770 new staff members to address the claims backlog. ... For the medical-services portion of the veterans' health budget, [Obama's] budget requested \$1.1 billion over what already was enacted for fiscal 2016. The appropriations bill agreed to 86 percent of that additional request." (As usual, a politician—in this case Pelosi—claims that a budget *increase* is a *cut*, simply because the increase is less than what some desired. If a worker is hoping for a six percent salary increase but gets an increase of only four percent, he certainly has *not* seen his salary go down two percent—yet that is the logic Pelosi is using.) Hillary Clinton's lawyer, David Kendall, tells the Select Benghazi Committee she will refuse to testify twice, as requested by the committee. (The committee wants one private hearing and one public hearing.) Despite that announcement, rumors persist from Inside the Beltway that Mrs. Clinton's health is of far greater concern to the campaign than is widely realized, and that some in the media already know but are purposely keeping the secret hidden from the public. The specific nature of the 67-year old Mrs. Clinton's health issues remain speculative, though most whispers suggest it is hampering the former Secretary of State's neurological abilities. She is said to continue struggling with occasional dizzy spells and at times, near debilitating fatigue as well as bouts of especially poor eyesight." [75318]

"Her days apparently include a rather large regimen of medications to alleviate her symptoms and keep her focused. At times, that focus still suffers greatly, glimpses of which have already been spotted despite a Clinton campaign that remains highly guarded. To date, nearly every statement she has uttered in public has been prepackaged, as can be seen in this public forum in Iowa just two weeks earlier which shows her repeatedly looking down at her notes while speaking. It has also been indicated Mrs. Clinton often wears a small ear piece (said to normally be placed in her right ear) that allows an aide placed off camera to assist her in answering even the most basic of questions if it appears she is getting mentally fatigued which apparently happens often due either to her

medications, her overall health issues, or possibly both. Concern over Hillary Clinton's ability to perform during a long and arduous campaign are such that a number of the largest political donors have made personal inquiries into the former First Lady's condition. Bosch Fawstin, the winner of the "draw Muhammed" contest in Garland, Texas, tells Fox News' Greta Van Susteren, "We can't be cowed by this [threat of violence] because once this goes, once free speech goes, it's over. I've been drawing Muhammed for years and I heard about the contest and I took it upon myself to take part in it. I think it's an important thing. It's about freedom of speech, which is deadly important, especially right now. It's under siege by the enemy, the Islamic enemy, by the left, by some on the right and it is a constant attack. We are being told that we 'shouldn't do this' or we 'shouldn't do that,' [but] we have the right to do that and we need express that right especially right now. I understand the threat that we face and that's why I do what I do. I don't refuse to do it because of the threat, I do it because we're being threatened. This has to be fought head on." At PJMedia.com Helen Smith asks, "Is Pam Geller the Bravest Woman in the U.S.?" and writes, "Love her or hate her, you have to admit that what she is doing is brave. How many women in this country (or men for that matter) would fight the good fight for free speech and do it at the risk of his or her life? How many Americans anymore really believe Patrick Henry's famous words: 'Give me liberty or give me death?' Ms. Geller has shown by her words and actions that she believes these words and believes in her freedom and that of her fellow Americans to address what they see as the concerns of the day. In these cowardly times, her actions put her head and shoulders above the mainstream press and others who believe that there is only one politically correct way to address those who wish to harm Jews and others. What might have happened in the 1930s if other Jews had spoken up like Geller? It might have changed history. Thank you, Pam, for your bravery and your love of liberty." (This *Timeline* suggests that the top three bravest women in America are Geller, True the Vote's Catherine Engelbrecht, and journalist Sharyl Attkisson.) [75300]

On MSNBC, Andrea Mitchell calls Pamela Geller's American Freedom Defense Initiative (AFDI) is "hateful" and "bizarre." Ayman Mohyeldin tells Mitchell the AFDI is "a group considered by the Southern Poverty Law Center [SPLC] and elsewhere around the world as a hate group." (Newsbusters.org points out that Mohyeldin "is the same reporter who sneered that Chris Kyle, the real-life 'American Sniper,' was a 'racist' who went on 'killing sprees.'" The SPLC is hardly an impartial source of anything. It is a far left organization that has falsely labeled all sorts of groups "hate groups." It has defamed and smeared tax protesters, conservatives, supporters of the U.S. Constitution, the Family Research Council, Jihad Watch, Glenn Beck, actor Chuck Norris, former

On May 5 Hillary Clinton uses the Cinco de Mayo occasion to announce that she supports Obama's illegal immigrant amnesty executive orders and a "pathway to citizenship" for illegal immigrants. She says, "If Congress refuses to act, as president I would do everything possible under the law to go even further [than Obama has]. I will fight to stop the partisan attacks on [Obama's] executive actions." Not surprisingly Clinton relies on the traditional false choice argument for the issue, saying it would be "absurd" to deport 11 million illegal immigrants. Amnesty supporters almost always use that argument, falsely suggesting that the only two policy options available are deporting all illegal immigrants or making them all voting citizens. "The 'ambush' election rule took effect on April 14, and with this ruling, union bosses—desperate to save their declining membership—now have valuable new tools to coerce and intimidate workers into joining their ranks. The new rule will significantly shorten the window of time in which an election to unionize can be held—from an average of 38 days now to as few as 11 days after a petition has been filed. Shorter election times mean a much greater likelihood of unionization. Data from the NLRB show that from 2004 to 2014, unions won 60 percent of elections that took place between 36 and 42 days, but 86 percent of elections that took place under 21 days. American small businesses, which often lack the infrastructure and support staff to ensure compliance with new and complex changes, will be acutely affected by the ruling. Employees now have much less time to educate themselves about unionization, while employers will be forced to submit a formal statement of position

within seven days and will not be able to amend their statement before a representation hearing." [75713]

"The new rules also eliminate an employer's automatic right to a post-election review. Instead, employers are left to trust that the results are accurate and fair. Union organizers can now approach any employee for their vote in unionizing the workplace without verifying that they are even eligible to vote. Incredibly, eligibility won't be decided until after an election takes place. These new NLRB policies also represent a serious violation of worker privacy. Union bosses now have blanket access to employees' personal information, including phone numbers and email address, job classifications, shift schedules, work locations and home addresses. Employers can no longer protect personal employee information, and there's no reason to think labor organizers will be shy about using it. In some instances, labor organizers have been known to camp out in front of workers' homes to attempt to bully them into joining the union. On the brink of irrelevance, labor unions bankrolled ...Obama's election and re-election campaigns, and now the administration is doing everything in its power to pay back its labor benefactors." FoxNews.com reports, "The Islamic State terror group (ISIS) Tuesday issued a claim of responsibility for Sunday's attack on a Texas cartoon contest featuring images of the Muslim prophet Muhammad. The claim was made in an audio message on the group's Al Bayan radio station, based in the Syria[n] city of Raqqa, which ISIS has proclaimed to be the capital of its self-proclaimed caliphate. It is the first time ISIS has taken credit for an attack on U.S. soil, though it was not immediately clear whether the group's claim was an opportunistic co-opting of a so-called 'lone wolf' attack as its own." (ISIS' claim notwithstanding, the attackers may only have been inspired, rather than orchestrated, by ISIS—not that it makes much difference.) [75280, 75281, 75293, 75292, 75331]

WashingtonPost.com's headline reads: "Event organizer offers no apology after thwarted attack in Texas." (The article is written by the newspaper's "social change reporter," who apparently wants Pamela Geller to apologize for a terrorist attack against the free speech event she held. Whether the *Post* will start demanding that rape victims apologize for wearing short dresses remains to be seen. Geller suggests other *Post* headlines: "Abraham Lincoln offers no apology after John Wilkes Booth lodges a bullet in his brain." "Julius Caesar offers no apology after Cassius and Brutus stab him to death." "Jews offer no apology after Nazis kill six million." Hypocritical media leftists condemn Geller for engaging in nothing more than speaking and displaying drawings and paintings, while trying to justify rioting in Baltimore by claiming that burning down a CVS pharmacy is somehow a legitimate expression of free speech. HotAir.com comments, "The media is so, so angry at Pam Geller for putting them in a position where they have to side with her (sort of). They already despised her. Now that she's made them unwilling allies in defending her right to mock Mohammed, they'll never forgive her.") [75287, 75333, 75352]

The Dallas Morning News proclaims in its headline that "Pamela Geller and company went looking for trouble." Accompanying the story is a photograph of Muslims holding a banner praising Texas attackers Nadir Soofi. (Geller writes, "It's telling: when the mainstream media condemns me, they're carrying water for the jihad killers.") [75324, 75325, 75326]

Amazingly, before the Garland, Texas event the FBI issued a bulletin declaring that it was "unlikely" to provoke violence. At PJMedia.com Patrick Poole notes that online chatter about the event "began when news broke that two Muslim congressmen, Keith Ellison [D-MN] and Andre Carson [IN], had appealed to Secretary of State John Kerry to deny entry into the U.S. for Dutch parliamentarian Geert Wilders. Wilders was scheduled to be the featured speaker at Sunday's cartoon contest. One law enforcement source who was monitoring potential threats to the event told PJ Media the following: '[Ellison and Carson] clearly set things off. Nothing was being said until that news story came out, and then the usual suspects began to talk about it. By the time the weekend rolled around, there were clear and identifiable incitements calling for an attack on the event.' ... According to those close to the investigation, the real heroes who quickly eliminated the threat on Sunday were the Texas Department of Public Safety, who took the online threats seriously. The threats included inciting tweets from known foreign Islamic State operatives overseas (namely, IS cybercaliphate chief Junaid Hussain), leading them to deploy a 'massive' presence at the cartoon contest event. The response from the FBI and DHS following yet another intelligence failure remains to be seen." [75340]

At IsraelNationalNews.com New York City novelist Jack Engelhard writes, "Pamela Geller made a mistake. She tested the First Amendment and the First Amendment lost. This fighter for Israel, this battler against Radical Islam can seem to find no friends after what she did. She tried to prove that America is not France, where 11 were murdered by Islamists for printing Mohammad cartoons, nor are we the Netherlands, where Ayaan Hirsi Ali's partner, Director Theo van Gogh was murdered for his documentary Submission, which exposed Islamist mistreatment of women. This cannot happen in America, assumed Miss Geller, here in the land of the free, home of the brave, and she was wrong. It can happen here, and it did... in part. The father threatened his daughter after Bagherzadeh's January 2012 death. 'I killed that b---h, and you're next,' Ali Mahwood-Awad Irsan is accused of saying, according to the Houston Chronicle. Then he came for her husband, Coty Beavers, shooting him to death in November 2012 in the couple's home, authorities said. The dad was charged with murder in the dual homicides. His wife and 21-year-old son also face charges in the case. Nadia Irsan hasn't been charged with murder in either of the deaths, but that could change, authorities said. She's accused of tailing her sister, even slipping a GPS device onto the estranged sibling's car in the leadup to Beaver's killing, according to prosecutors. Investigators later discovered the GPS buried in the Irsan's yard." (Those who hurl charges of "Islamophobia" against those who warn about the Islamization of America should recognize that the Irsan case is not unique. Shari'ah law justified honor killings are becoming increasingly common in the United States. Pamela Geller writes, "No one is enraged about this. This isn't on any TV shows, no one is writing indignant editorials about it, no one is condemning it, no one is taking any notice at all. No, the problem is Muhammad cartoons and Pamela Geller. Not Sharia blasphemy laws, or Islamic honor killing, or any jihad attack. The problem is me.") [75502, 75503, 75508]

Former Arkansas governor Mike Huckabee announces his candidacy for the presidency. (On his radio program, Glenn Beck suggests, "I think he's being put in as a spoiler. I think that's the only thing. I really do. I think he's there because he'll pull religious votes away from [Senator] Ted Cruz [R-TX]. And that's the one that big government progressives are afraid of. The establishment is afraid of Ted Cruz and [Senator] Rand Paul [R-KY]. They're going to do everything they can to make sure those two are nowhere to be seen when it comes to Election Day. And so if you want to take care of Ted Cruz, you go after the religious base. And you split the religious base. And that's what Mike Huckabee is doing." (Huckabee is religious, but he is also a strong supporter of big government. Asked what Iran will do with billions of dollars of assets once they are released in exchange for a finalized nuclear agreement, White House press secretary Josh Earnest tells reporters, "...I think it's the hope of the Iranian people that the influx of resources will be devoted to meeting the needs of the population there and to strengthening the economy that has taken a terrible toll on the daily lives of millions of Iranians. We've talked before about how the significant pressure that our sanctions regime has placed on Iran has had a negative impact on their economy and that poorly performing economy has added to some pressure inside of Iran for the Iranian leadership to consider a change in

policy and we're gratified by that because it's created an important diplomatic opportunity for us to prevent Iran from obtaining a nuclear weapon. But the fact is, there are two things I would point out. Even while these sanctions have been in place we have not seen Iran significantly scale back their support for terrorism or their destabilization activities in the region. The second thing is the pressure that they are feeling is not primarily rooted in the idea that they need to get rid of the sanctions or at least get the international community to relax these sanctions so that they can invest additional resources in those activities. I wouldn't be in a position to predict exactly what the Iranian reaction will be and I'm certainly not going to be in a position to mandate what kinds of economic decisions they'll make. A common sense analysis would be that they would use those additional resources to try and relieve that economic pressure that they're feeling [rather than fund terrorism]. But again, I'm not going to make any predictions about what they're going to do and certainly I'm not going to be in an position to prescribe what they should do. This is a sovereign country that will make their own decisions." (Translation: "Yes, Iran will continue to be a state sponsor of terror even after sanctions are lifted and Obama will do nothing about it.") [75282, 75283, 75335]

Earnest grits his teeth to comment on the Garland, Texas attack: "There is no act of expression, even if it's an offensive expression, that can justify an act of terrorism or even an act of violence. There is no room in our society, and it certainly doesn't reflect a commitment to universal human rights, to try to use an act of expression to justify an act of terrorism. There is no justification for an act of violence and an attempted act of terrorism like the one that we saw." (It was not an "attempted" act of terrorism; it was an act of terrorism. In any case, it is likely that no one in the White House supports Pamela Geller—*especially* Obama, who in September 2010 said at the United Nations, "The future must not belong to those who slander the prophet of Islam." Earnest defends Geller only because he has to, not because he wants to.) [37574, 37575, 37596, 37600, 37607, 75284]

On the issue of the economy, Earnest tells reporters Obama has, "for the last six and a half years... scratched and clawed to protect the interests of middle-class families all across the country." (At WhiteHouseDossier.com, Keith Koffler points out how Obama's policies have mostly benefited the poor and the wealthy: "These things he scratches and claws for. Not private sector expansion and business-friendly policies that would promote middle class expansion. And the results speak for themselves.") [75396]

Bridget Johnson reports at PJMedia.com, "A new warning from a purported American jihadist details specific levels of ISIS fighters in the U.S.—as well as targeted states—in the wake of the attack in Garland, Texas." The message states, "The attack by the Islamic State in America [in Garland, Texas] is only the beginning of our efforts to establish a wiliyah [province] in the heart of our enemy. Our aim was the khanzeer [swine] Pamela Geller and to show her that we don't care what land she hides in or what sky shields her; we will send all our Lions to achieve her slaughter. This will heal the hearts of our brothers and disperse the ones behind her. To those who protect her: this will be your only warning of housing this woman and her circus show. Everyone who houses her

events, gives her a platform to spill her filth are legitimate targets. We have been watching closely who was present at this event and the shooter of our brothers. We knew that the target was protected. Our intention was to show how easy we give our lives for the Sake of Allah. ...Out of the 71 trained soldiers 23 have signed up for missions like Sunday, We are increasing in number bithnillah ['with the permission of Allah," or 'Allah willing']. Of the 15 states, 5 we will name... Virginia, Maryland, Illinois, California, and Michigan. The disbelievers who shot our brothers think that you killed someone untrained, nay, they gave you their bodies in plain view because we were watching. The next six months will be interesting, To our Amir Al Mu'mineen [ISIS leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi] make dua [invocation] for us and continue your reign, May Allah enoble [sic; ennoble] your face." [75320, 75323, 75360, 75458]

At BaltimoreSun.com, veteran prosecutor Page Croyder writes, "Baltimore State's Attorney Marilyn Mosby's 'quick' and 'decisive' action in charging six Baltimore police officers a mere two weeks after the death of Freddie Gray reflects either incompetence or an unethical recklessness. ... John Banzahf, a George Washington University law professor, predicted the eventual dismissal of most if not all the charges. The breadth of the charges, Ms. Mosby's overreaching, is all-too-obvious. Any prosecutor interested in the truth and in justice would have used all the tools at her disposal to find them. Ms. Mosby ignored them. She has one of the most experienced homicide prosecutors in the state of Maryland as chief of her homicide unit, but did not ask him to investigate. She had the police report all of one day before filing charges, her mind already made up. And she failed to make use of the grand jury to gather, probe and test the evidence before a group of average citizens. ... She had no time to evaluate the crucial autopsy report, or consult with experts about its implications. In her haste to step into the national limelight, she circumvented normal charging procedures by grabbing a member of the sheriff's office to swear to their truth and file them for her. She calculated her actions for surprise and maximum effect, and she got it. ... In the long run, Ms. Mosby may be undermining the cause of justice rather than promoting it. She has created an expectation of guilt and conviction. If that does not happen, many will blame the system as unfair or unjust, when it may have been Ms. Mosby's own lack of competence and/or arrogance in bringing charges so quickly. ... If I were a Baltimore police officer, I'd be looking for another job immediately. And as a Baltimore citizen, I may start looking for someplace else to live. When the police cannot depend upon the state's attorney to be as thorough, competent, non-political and fair with them as she is supposed to be with all citizens, none of us will be safe." At Spectator.org Ben Stein states what Obama lacks the courage (or the intelligence) to state: "...Marilyn Mosby should not be allowed to be a law clerk, let alone a state's attorney/prosecutor. To prosecute police officers EXPLICITLY to please a mob ('I have heard your cries about 'no justice, no peace'...') is exactly the opposite of what a prosecutor should do. That is, to prosecute only when the facts and law demand it. To press charges because a gang of thugs loots liquor stores and promises to loot more liquor stores if charges are not pressed is exactly lynch mob justice. It has nothing to do with the sacred rule of 'innocent until proven guilty.' Usually prosecutors will show at least hint of impartiality in an important case. Ms. Mosby went straight for the jugular and

basically said, 'The thugs are my bosses and I answer to them and not to the Constitution.' This is a dangerous woman. She bears watching." [75312, 75313]

"...Mrs. Clinton and the New York Times talk about 'one and a half million missing black men...' They are not missing. We know where they are. They are in jail or prison for committing crimes. They haven't been taken away by space aliens. They're here, in prison. When they learn to work and participate in the labor force in an honest way, they won't be missing anymore. ... I was uplifted by many of the men and women of the poor parts of Baltimore. They were sensible. They were prayerful. They didn't play games around calling a thug a thug. Impressive. The 'leaders' are morally far behind the rank and file. Next, I turn to the greatest cure all for the problems of Baltimore and Ferguson. WORK. People with honest jobs are not robbing liquor stores. People who work all day long are too tired to loot. The people who get ahead in every society are not the ones who throw Molotov cocktails. They are the ones who actually work, study, add to their human capital and make a life for themselves and their families. Have you ever seen Vietnamese immigrants rioting? Or Chinese immigrants? No, because they are working. There is a lesson here about idle hands and the devil's playthings. The Asians' kids will be at Harvard. The rioters' kids will be 'missing.' Meanwhile, the media should be ashamed for using their power to kowtow to the mob, to tell young thugs that if you throw bricks at cops we will not call you thugs, and we will make you stars on TV. Shame. Turn off the cameras, lock up the vodka, and we will see how many turn out for 'political protest." [75312, 75313]

Not only might Mosby "bear watching," she is also incompetent. Two of her six arrest warrants contained errors in names, addresses, and drivers license numbers that prompted harassment of two innocent people by reporters and social media user. (An attorney for Alicia White, a cafeteria manager who is not the Baltimore police officer involved in the arrest of Freddie Gray, tells *The Baltimore Sun*, "Her life has been a living hell the past four days." Mosby also listed the wrong information for officer Brian Rice, instead identifying a plumber with the same name.) [75315, 75316, 75321, 75339]

Additionally, Mosby charged that the officers made a false arrest of Freddie Gray when, in fact, he was reportedly in possession of a knife with an illegal, spring-loaded blade. An attorney for one of the charged officers has asked that the knife be produced to demonstrate that the arrest was proper. Mosby responds, "While the evidence we have obtained through our independent investigation does substantiate the elements of the charges filed, I refuse to litigate this case through the media. The evidence we have collected cannot ethically be disclosed, relayed or released to the public before trial. As I've previously indicated, I strongly condemn anyone in law enforcement with access to trial evidence, who has or continues to leak information prior to the resolution of this case. These unethical disclosures are only damaging our ability to conduct a fair and impartial process for all parties involved." (Laughably, Mosby will litigate her side of the case through the media, but will not allow the officer she has charged to present their case in the same manner.) [75341]

Former prosecutor Andrew C. McCarthy comments on Mosby's actions: "At best, it is amateur hour. ... The chief prosecutor, in what can only be described as a gift to defense lawyers, proclaimed that she'd brought the charges to show not only 'the people of Baltimore' but also 'the demonstrators across America' that 'I heard your call for 'no justice, no peace.' ... Competent prosecutors charge crimes only when there is evidence sufficient to prove that specific laws have been broken. A government lawyer who publicly asserts that her case was brought for the purpose of dousing inflamed passions, satisfying political agitators, or even easing real suffering undermines the prosecution. It's not just the wrong thing to do; it's the dumb thing to do. At the eventual trial, Ms. Mosby's main audience is not going to be fawning journalists and anti-police activists. There are going to be experienced defense lawyers sowing doubt into the record, and a judge who instructs a jury that the case rises or falls on the strength of the evidence, not the 'call for 'no justice, no peace.'" "...It appears that Ms. Mosby filed charges as soon as the medical examiner (ME) determined that Mr. Gray's death was a homicide. But as I explained in connection with the death of Eric Garner after an altercation with police on Staten Island, an ME's conclusion that homicide occurred is not a judgment that murder or even some lesser form of culpable killing occurred. Homicide simply means death was caused by some course of conduct—conduct that could, in theory, be innocent. A competent prosecutor knows it is a long way from the ME's pronouncement of homicide to a compelling case that murder has been committed. ... A competent prosecutor does not charge first and investigate later. That inevitably leads to gaps in the proof. Worse, it leads to inconsistencies in the charges filed. Those are a defense lawyer's dream. ... You can hear the defense lawyers now: 'If the prosecutor herself cannot figure out what happened here, how can you fair-minded ladies and gentlemen of the jury possibly conclude, unanimously, that there is proof beyond a reasonable doubt supporting a murder conviction?'" McCarthy notes that Mosby charged the driver of the police van with second-degree murder *and* involuntary manslaughter. Under the former, the act was intentional. Under the latter, the act was unintentional. It clearly cannot be both, yet Mosby charged the officer with both—along with vehicular manslaughter by gross negligence and vehicular manslaughter by criminal negligence. McCarthy writes, "...Ms. Mosby has thrown against the wall several different homicide charges with all their internal distinctions that will force trial prosecutors to make contradictory arguments about the police officers' actions and states of mind. She's obviously hoping that something will stick." At the trial, "one hopefully suspects, the case will no longer be about 'social justice.' It will be about real justice: a careful examination of the state's charges and the evidence offered in support of them. When that day comes, the prosecutor better have more to say than 'no justice, no peace." [75342]

House and Senate Democrats push legislation calling for a \$12 per hour minimum wage. The bill will never get passed—because it will destroy jobs—but the goal of the Democrats is not to get it passed. Their goal is to portray Republicans as mean-spirited

and anti-worker. (The problems Republicans have is that even their supporters falsely believe increasing the minimum wage is a good idea. Republican legislators would be wise to continually ask the Democrats, "Why is being unemployed at \$12.00 per hour better than being employed at \$7.25 per hour?") [75299]

The Senate passes the House budget plan by a vote of 51-48. Senators Ted Cruz (R-TX) and Rand Paul (R-KY) join all Democrats in voting against the budget. Reuters notes, "The non-binding resolution does not go to Obama's desk to be signed into law. Instead, it helps guide Congress' consideration of government agency spending bills and serves as a Republican fiscal policy manifesto that will influence 2016 election campaigns. The blueprint would slash spending on the social safety net, education, infrastructure and other domestic programs by \$5.3 trillion over 10 years with no tax increases. At the same time, it boosts defense spending next year by adding about \$38 billion to an off-budget war operations account. ... While Obama is certain to veto any Republican bill to repeal his biggest domestic policy achievement, he may be more willing to compromise on changes to 'Obamacare' if the U.S. Supreme Court in June strikes down the law's health insurance subsidy mechanism in many states." (Between 2010 and 2015 the Senate, then controlled by the Democrats, never passed a regular-order budget.) [75346, 75349]

WashingtonTimes.com reports, "The IRS doled out more than \$5 billion in potentially bogus college aid payments in 2012 under an Obama stimulus tax credit, according to a report Tuesday from the agency's inspector general that said the administration still doesn't have a good handle on how to root out erroneous claims. Nearly 4 million students had questionable claims, totaling more than \$5.6 billion in that one year alone, the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration said. At least half of the students never provided tuition statements showing what they paid, while others attended schools that didn't qualify them for the tax credit. Other students claimed the credit for more than four years, which should have automatically earned a rejection, the investigators said."

CNSNews.com reports, "Iran will never give international inspectors access to its military facilities under a negotiated nuclear accord, the country's military chief declared at the weekend, underlining the regime's rejection of what the Obama administration portrays as a core element of a proposed agreement. 'Iranian military officials are not allowed to let the foreigners go through the country's security-defense shield and fence,' Major General Hassan Firouzabadi, commander of Iran's armed forces, wrote in a message to Iran's nuclear negotiators. ... In Iran's military hierarchy, Firouzabadi is second only to [Ayatollah] Khamenei, the commander-in-chief, who has himself already declared military sites off-limits to foreign inspectors." (Obama continues to insist that routine inspections will be used to verify that Iran is complying with any nuclear agreement.) [75307]

At TheBlaze.com author Wayne Allyn Root (*The Murder of the Middle Class*), who believes he was unfairly targeted by the IRS for his anti-Obama views, provides documentation that suggests he is correct. [75308]

At Breitbart.com Alex Swoyer reports, "The U.S. 9th Circuit Court of Appeals judge who previously dismissed terror charges against one of the Garland, Texas shooters has a connection to the controversial activist group, National Council of La Raza. Judge Mary Murguia, appointed by President Clinton and considered a potential nominee to the Supreme Court by ... Obama, was the judge who dismissed government charges against Elton Simpson for suspected terrorism in 2011. On Sunday, Simpson attacked a free speech event in Garland, Texas depicting the Prophet Muhammad in cartoons. ...Judge Murguria's twin sister Janet Murguia leads a controversial group known as National Council of La Raza, which has been criticized as a racist hate group. It is the nation's largest Latino civil rights activist organization. La Raza is closely linked to the Obama Administration's amnesty efforts. Human Events, a conservative blog, previously reported that the mainstream media views La Raza 'no more than a Hispanic Rotary Club.' But La Raza collected roughly \$15.2 million in federal grants in 2005. Human Events also reported that undisclosed amounts of that money were used in 'get-out-thevote efforts supporting La Raza political positions.' ... Moreover, Judge Murguria's brother, Carlos Murguria, helped coordinate the Immigration Amnesty Program prior to Clinton nominating him also for a judgeship, according to Front Page Magazine." [75309]

At Townhall.com Cortney O'Brien reports that Virginia will "expand" abortion services by not implementing health regulations for abortion clinics passed in 2013. O'Brien writes, "The law, SB 924, required clinics to be held to the same standards as hospitals... Yet, despite the progress the law has made in protecting women from unsafe or unsanitary abortion centers, Attorney General Mark Herring has just declared that the state Board of Health need no longer enforce the regulations, insisting they are 'medically inappropriate.' ... Unfortunately, Governor McAuliffe (D-VA) sides with Herring in putting abortion rights over safety standards. ... McAuliffe [a close pal of Bill and Hillary Clinton] and Herring's rejection of Cuccinelli's urgent advice puts the women of Virginia in danger. Instead of protecting them, the reversal of these regulations will permit women to walk into clinics that lack oversight and are left to operate under substandard conditions." [75310]

WashingtonTimes.com reports, "The emails of Huma Abedin, the top personal aide to former Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton, are now facing a disclosure lawsuit after the State Department failed to turn them over in response to an open-records request. Judicial Watch, a conservative public interest law firm that uses open-records laws to pry information loose, had filed a request to get a look at Ms. Abedin's emails during her four years at the State Department. News outlets have reported that Ms. Abedin also used the private email server Mrs. Clinton set up to handle government business, but the status of her messages is unclear. It's one of a number of open-records requests Judicial Watch filed after the email scandal broke, and Tom Fitton, president of the organization, said they've been stonewalled on all of them, so now they're turning to the courts." [75314]

The site also reports, "The Obama administration is quietly pushing Sunni Arab allies in the Persian Gulf to create an advanced missile defense system, and is preparing to ramp up sophisticated weapons sales to Saudi Arabia in an effort to ease regional fears over a potential nuclear deal with Iran. With Secretary of State John F. Kerry set to visit Saudi Arabia Wednesday and Thursday, officials privately say the administration is weighing whether to offer Riyadh—already a major buyer of American and European weaponry-GBU-28 bunker buster bombs Washington has so far only been willing to provide to Israel. The discussions are taking place under a cloak of secrecy. The officials who spoke with The Washington Times did so on condition of anonymity only, and the Saudi Embassy declined to comment." (Some might wonder if Obama is anticipating a Saudi use of the weapons against Israel in the future.) Meanwhile, according to the BBC, "The Saudi-led coalition carrying out air strikes in Yemen has used US-supplied cluster bombs banned by much of the world, a rights group has said. Human Rights Watch (HRW) said it had evidence that the bombs were used at least twice against Houthi rebels. There were no reports of casualties. Cluster bombs spread small bombs over a wide area and can leave unexploded munitions buried in the ground. They are banned under a treaty signed by 116 countries, but not Saudi Arabia." (The United States is also not signatory to the treaty.) [75334, 75337]

At least four Florida companies are licensed by the government to operate ferry services between the United States and Cuba. According to AFP, "That adds to the charter air services that had been permitted until now, focused on enabling Cuban-Americans to visit their families. The ferries will also be allowed to carry cargo to the communist island of 11 million, which sits just 150 kilometers (90 miles) off the southern tip of Florida. ... Whether by plane or ferry, American travelers to Cuba still have to come under one of 12 categories permitted in the landmark easing of US sanctions announced by the White House in December—including family visits, official government business, humanitarian projects and sports gatherings." [75343]

The Democrat National Committee announces it will sanction only six primary debates. The move is certainly designed to help Hilary Clinton—and is immediately criticized by a spokeswoman for former Maryland governor Martin O'Malley. [75348]

On *Hardball*, Chris Matthews suggests that Carly Fiorina "can get away with even scurrilous attacks on Secretary Clinton because she is a female." (To leftist Matthews—who does not specify which of Fiorina's statements he believes are "scurrilous"—a male cannot attack Hillary Clinton because that would be sexist, but for a woman to attack Clinton is to hide behind one's skirt. Matthews is the bigot he accuses others of being.) [75390]

With a record-breaking 80.1 percent, voters in Michigan crush a state constitutional amendment that would have increased sales taxes for road funding. According to *The Detroit News*, "This year's thumping occurred even though the measure was backed by Gov. Rick Snyder as well as the Republican and Democratic legislative leaders from last year's Michigan House and Senate. The Safe Roads Yes campaign ended up amassing

about \$9.5 million, 27 times as much money as the roughly \$350,000 the three opposition campaigns had combined. The result was a 4-1 defeat of the ballot proposal lawmakers cobbled together a week before Christmas." [75528, 75529]

On May 6 Obama's schedule contains only two tasks: receive his daily briefing and have lunch with Vice President Joe Biden. [75344]

FreeBeacon.com reports, "An Iranian naval fleet chased a U.S. warship and military planes through the waters off the southern coast of Yemen late Monday in yet another provocative encounter between the two nations, according to Iranian state media reports. A U.S. warship and several planes reportedly 'changed their direction' on Monday after encountering an Iranian naval fleet during a patrol in the Gulf of Aden near Yemen, Iranian state media revealed. The U.S. military assets fled 'after they came close to an Iranian naval fleet and were warned to move away,' Iran's state-controlled Fars News Agency reported. Iran also released video of the incident. The run-in between the United States and Iranian militaries is just the latest in several tense confrontations between the countries near Yemen, where Iran is believed to be smuggling weapons to opposition forces." (The Pentagon refutes the claim.) [75345]

WND.com reports, "In an extraordinary move that could mean billions lost to the American economy, Gulf monarchs meeting Tuesday in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, took a closed-door decision to potentially withhold investments from U.S. military firms if the terms of any final agreement with Iran causes significant harm to the Sunni Arab states. The meeting of the Gulf Cooperation Council brought together leaders from Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates. All of those countries, aside from Oman, participated in the Saudi-led strikes targeting Iranian-backed rebels in Yemen. According to a source who took part in the discussions, the Gulf countries talked about the possibility of providing a future advantage in weapons deals to European firms, particularly those based in France, Germany and Britain, along with companies in China. The move would take place pending the outcome of any final deal between Iran, the Obama administration and Western powers. ... 'This is kind of the start of financial sanctions on the USA in case a bad agreement is signed,' the source said. 'It could develop beyond military spending.'" [75447]

DailyCaller.com reports, "The State Department's chief freedom of information officer admitted during testimony at a Senate Judiciary Committee hearing Wednesday that it is 'not acceptable' for employees at the agency to use private email accounts and private servers in the way that former Secretary Hillary Clinton did. The official, Joyce Barr, also agreed that 'in theory' she would be concerned about any official that set up such a system in a 'premeditated and deliberate' attempt to avoid complying with laws and regulations." [75363]

On Twitter, CNN's not-so-bright Chris Cuomo (who has a plum media job only because his father was former New York governor Mario Cuomo, and whose brother Andrew is the current governor for the same reason) falsely claims that "hate speech is excluded from [First Amendment] protection," and challenges those who believe otherwise to read the Constitution. (It does not take longer for Twitters users more knowledgeable than Cuomo to point out his error.) HotAir.com comments, "This guy is a professional journalist. And a Yale grad. *And a law-school grad*. But let's be fair. If you polled the media, how many of them would agree? Don't stomp Cuomo just because he's bold enough to say what the rest are thinking [even though all are incorrect]." [75391, 75400, 75423, 75441, 75445]

PJMedia.com writes, "A pro-ISIS hacker, who goes by the names Abu Hussain al-Britani, has been linked to Sunday's attack on the Garland, Texas, 'Draw Mohammed' contest, and may have played a role in inspiring the gunmen, CNN reported Wednesday. On Tuesday, the day after the attack, someone from a Twitter account believed to be al-Britani's tweeted, 'you ain't seen nothing yet #QaribanQariba.'" [75392]

TheHill.com reports that Baltimore Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake "has asked the Department of Justice to investigate whether the city's police department had engaged in discrimination." (The likelihood is that new Attorney General Loretta Lynch "asked to be asked.") Baltimore's police union responds, "[W]e welcome the involvement of the Department of Justice and look forward to working with their representatives to heal the wounds of our city, and to improve the relationship between the community and our Department. Additionally, we suggest that, as a part of the comprehensive examination, the Department of Justice also consider expanding the scope of their review to include the practices and policies of the Mayor of Baltimore, Stephanie Rawlings-Blake." [75386, 75425, 75426, 75444]

Investors.com notes, "Just two months ago, ... Obama held up the Baltimore police force as a model of unbiased community policing. Now he's investigating it for civil-rights violations. What's changed? In a March White House report on police reforms, Obama and his Task Force on 21st Century Policing praised Baltimore's force and its black chief for 'implementing national best practices for policies and training,' including 'use of force' reforms. His task force even quoted Baltimore Police Commissioner Anthony Batts, who said he changed 'outdated procedures' that 'put officers at odds with the community.' WashingtonExaminer.com reports, "Internal Revenue Service officials rewarded more than 100 employees who cheated on their taxes, a government watchdog reported Wednesday. Nearly 1,600 IRS employees from 2003 to 2014 were caught intentionally

violating tax law, the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration found. Only a quarter of those employees were fired, while another 108 either received promotions or bonuses. 'Given its critical role in Federal tax administration, the IRS must ensure that its employees comply with the tax law in order to maintain the public's confidence,' Inspector General J. Russell George said in a statement. 'Willful violation of the law by IRS employees should not be taken lightly.' Nearly one-third of the employees from 2008 to 2013 caught cheating on their taxes received at least one bonus or raise within a year of being disciplined, investigators reported. These rewards include nearly \$145,000 in bonuses, almost 900 hours of time-off awards and 30 temporary and permanent promotions. Of 1,580 cases, IRS officials couldn't explain why 960 employees received disciplinary action less than a firing, such as a suspension. Another 220 resigned or retired before disciplinary action could be taken, the inspector general found." [75397]

The New York Times posts the first of what will likely be continuing columns devoted to listing the questions its reporters would ask Hillary Clinton if she would ever answer questions. [75366, 75367]

Radio host Hugh Hewitt asks Carly Fiorina, "So if you could have any question asked of the former secretary of state [Hillary Clinton] by a reporter, if she comes out like, you know, the groundhog on February 2nd, what would that question be?' Fiorina responds, "Oh, wow, that's a great question, Hugh. I have to think about this. But I guess my question would be why is it that you knew the right thing to do was to disclose these donations while you were secretary of state and simply failed to do it? And the second question I would ask is why were you willing to peddle a fiction about Benghazi starting as you stood over the bodies of four murdered Americans and for a month after that? Why were you willing to do that?" Hewitt: "Those are great questions, and she's agreed to six debates. And I don't believe either of those will be asked in any of those six debates." [75381]

On *Hannity*, Imam Anjem Choudary appears via satellite from England to state that Pamela Geller deserves the death penalty for offending Islam. He says, "The fact is you insulted the Prophet Muhammed, peace be upon him, and you knew the consequences." Geller, in the studio with Sean Hannity, responds, "What do you mean I knew the consequences? I live in America. I live in America. There are no consequences." (Choudary is allowed to spew his vile throughout England, yet Geller has been prohibited from entering the country to give speeches in defense of Western civilization. In Afghanistan in 2002, the Canadian-born but mostly Pakistaniraised Khadr threw a hand grenade and killed Delta Force Sergeant Chris Speer, a combat medic who, just weeks before his death, was awarded a medal for risking his life to save two Afghan children who were trapped in a minefield. Although the military sentenced Khadr to 40 years, it was reduced by the Obama administration to eight years. In 2012, Obama officials Samantha Power, Michael Posner, and Harold Koh then worked to get Khadr transferred from U.S. custody in Guantanamo to Canada. Khadr's father, Ahmed Said Khadr, was a senior lieutenant of Osama bin Laden. The Khadr family moved back and forth between Canada and Pakistan. Khadr's sister is the ex-wife of Canadian Joshua Boyle who, with his second wife, American Caitlin Coleman, are held by the Taliban. They were captured when "hiking" in an unsafe area. Khadr once bragged that the proudest moment of his life was constructing and planting explosive devices to kill Americans. A Toronto Sun columnist argued... that the jihadist 'deserves some kind of recognition' along the lines of the country's 'Order of Canada' for 'the dignity and stoicism with which he's borne the mingy behaviour of Canada's governments.' Disgusting. This deification of an al-Qaidatrained murderer is a slap in the face to every American soldier and every military family that has sacrificed to combat Islamic jihad." [75418]

A federal appeals court in New York rules illegal the National Security Agency's bulk collection of telephone records of U.S. citizens, arguing it is not authorized by the Patriot Act. Judge Andrew Napolitano later writes, "It is none of the government's business, [Paul] argues, what we say on our phone calls. If the NSA wants to hear us, let them present probable cause to a judge identifying the person they want to hear and seek a search warrant.") [75395, 75459, 75621]

At Townhall.com Todd Starnes reports that the Fairfax County (Virginia) Public Schools system (FCPS) is preparing to modify its "nondiscrimination" policy to "allow boys who identify as girls to use the locker rooms and bathrooms of their choice—as well as participate on athletic teams of their choosing." According to Deputy Superintendent Steven Lockard, "The Office of Civil Rights [OCR] of the U.S. Department of Education is requiring that school divisions revise their non-discrimination policies to include gender identity. …If FCPS refuses to amend its policy, OCR has the right to recommend

the termination of federal funding to FCPS." (In other words, the Obama administration is threatening schools with the loss of federal funding if they do not cater to allegedly gender-confused students.) School board member Elizabeth Schultz tells Starnes, "While the underlying issue is somewhat sensational, it is the gravitas in overreach of the federal government and the implications thereof that is so very chilling. It could have implications for every public school district in the nation. If they're going to come for us, they're going to come to them next. ... We are imperiling our federal education monies if we don't comply with the law. If they can do this, what can't they do? It's limitless." 'Children in lower grades are still developing who they are—it's very confusing,' Lafferty said. 'Parents should have a right to decide when and where and how to talk about it. ...This should be a concern to everybody. The Obama administration thinks they can do whatever they darn well please. [They are] recruiting and tasking at the same time. ...In a way, the old paradigm between 'inspired' and 'directed' breaks down here. ...Where are they on the pathway from 'talker' to 'doer'? And that's really hard [to determine]. Secretary Masud Shojaei-Tabatabaii told Iran's semi-official Fars news agency that 839 works had been submitted to the Second International Holocaust Cartoon Contest, a cynical sequel to a much derided 2006 competition making light of the slaughter of 6 million Jews in Europe during World War II. ... The contest was announced in January in response to international support for French satirical weekly Charlie Hebdo following an attack on the magazine's offices by Islamists apparently incensed by the magazine's depiction of Mohammed." FoxNews.com reports, "The exit poll in Britain's general election predicted late Thursday that the Conservative Party will win 316 seats, just short of a majority in the House of Commons, meaning that David Cameron will likely remain prime minister. The surprise poll results were in contrast to polls leading up to the election that suggested Cameron's party would not come close to a majority, and would be locked in a much tighter race with the opposition Labour Party, led by Ed Miliband—predicted to gain 239 seats in the exit poll. ... If the exit poll is accurate, the Conservative Party would be in a commanding position to form the next government by seeking coalition partners from smaller parties. The Liberal Democrats—Cameron's coalition partner—were predicted to see their support collapse and their seat tally drop from 56 to 10. ... If the poll is accurate, it would be a huge defeat for Miliband's Labour Party, which was predicted by many bookmakers to be most likely to form a government, possibly with the support of the Scottish National Party. The predicted result of 239 seats would be down from the 256 they won in 2010, despite Cameron's government engaging in painful austerity measures. It would also mean Labour would be wiped out in Scotland, an area in which it has traditionally been the dominant force." (Cameron is not a conservative in the American sense, but he is certainly more conservative that the leftist Miliband. Miliband courted the large Muslim vote in England, but because his ancestry is Jewish he may not have had much support from those voters.) [75405, 75407]

The election ushers in a new era in British politics, with veteran lawmakers ousted by a public that made clear it had lost trust in its political leaders. The victors included a 20-year-old Scottish nationalist who beat out a senior Labour Party leader in Scotland. ... With all the votes counted, the Conservatives had 331 seats to Labour's 232." The Department of Labor estimates that 223,000 jobs were created in April—below the monthly average of 260,000 in 2014. March figures are adjusted downward to a mere 85,000 jobs. The unemployment rate is 5.4 percent, down from 5.5 percent in March mostly because of the many Americans who dropped out of the work force and are no longer counted in the calculations. (The number of Americans working in April actually declined. There were still fewer people working in early 2015 than there were in January 2008, despite the growth in population.) For native-born workers that number in December 2007 was 123,524,000 by April of this year the number of employed native-born Americans was 123,769,000 or a net job growth of 245,000. The month of April marks the first month since the end of the recession where native-born Americans had more jobs than they did prior to the recession." [75451]

AFP reports, "[Australian] Prime Minister Tony Abbott's top business adviser on Friday claimed climate change was a ruse encouraged by the United Nations to create a new authoritarian world order under its control. Maurice Newman, chairman of the Prime Minister's Business Advisory Council, said the real agenda was 'concentrated political authority. Global warming is the hook.' In a column for The Australian newspaper to coincide with a visit by U.N. climate chief Christiana Figueres, he added that the world had been 'subjected to extravagance from climate catastrophists for close to 50 years. Butler, a shift commander in the Southern District, said his officers are expressing reluctance to go after crime. 'I'm hearing it from guys who were go-getters, who would go out here and get the guns and the bad guys and drugs. They're hands-off now,' Butler said. 'I've never seen so many dejected faces.'" (On May 10 Mosby, demonstrating that she is nowhere close to having the impartiality her position requires, appears on stage with entertainer Prince, as he sings about "no justice, no peace.") Judge Reggie B. Walton agrees to reopen a lawsuit filed by Judicial Watch seeking access to Hillary Clinton's emails. FoxNews.com notes, "Previously, the court dismissed Judicial Watch's request, on the grounds that the documents did not exist." Since then, of course, Clinton's efforts to hide and even destroy her emails has been reported by the news media. Walton's action is bad news for Clinton. Although the Select Benghazi Committee does not have the power to subpoena Clinton's documents, the court does—and Walton is known as a non-nonsense judge. On Fox News, Judge Andrew Napolitano explains that Walton "can order her husband, the former president of the United States, to deliver the server to him. And he, a federal judge, can hire experts to examine the server. This is authority that Congressman [Trey] Gowdy's [R-SC] committee lacks." [75557, 75558]

On May 9 jihadists from Yemen capture the port city of Jazan in southwestern Saudi Arabia. Jazan has a population of about 1.5 million. Examiner.com reports, "Senior Yemeni military sources said on Saturday that the country's tribal fighters won control over the city of Ahad al-Masareha in Jazan after exchanging fire with the Saudi forces for only about 3 hours. The tribesmen have also captured more than 60 Saudi soldiers and police officers after taking control of that major city, the sources added. ... Upon invading the Saudi city and driving out the Saudi military, the Yemeni invaders looted and plundered the city for what they said was their 'share of the spoils.' The tribal forces also commandeered upwards of 20 U.S.-built Hummer vehicles, 17 armor-plated Jeeps, a huge number of arms and an even larger amount of ammunition in the operation."

FoxNews.com reports, "North Korea boasted Saturday it had test-fired a secret new ballistic missile from a submarine and declared the firing a success. North Korean leader Kim Jong Un personally directed the test launching, the Wall Street Journal said, citing the official Korean Central News Agency. The Journal said Kim called the missile a

'world-level strategic weapon' and an 'eye-opening success.' Hours after the announcement, South Korean officials said the Kim government fired three anti-ship cruise missiles into the sea off its east coast, escalating tensions between the two countries. A State Department spokesman told Fox News Saturday the U.S. was aware of the reported firing of the submarine ballistic missile. 'Launches using ballistic missile technology are a clear violation of multiple UN Security Council resolutions,' the spokesman said. The official added, 'We call on North Korea to refrain from actions that further raise tensions in the region and focus instead on taking concrete steps toward fulfilling its international commitments and obligations.'" The *Daily Mail* reports, "The FBI has put more American terror suspects under constant surveillance following the attack deadly on a 'Draw Muhammad' competition." The actions of gunmen Elton Simpson and Nadir Soofi "have prompted the agency to keep a closer eye on 'marginal' or 'borderline' suspects in a bid to stop potential threats." [75456]

At Townhall.com Christine Rousselle reports, "Following Thursday's unexpected massive Conservative victory in the United Kingdom's general election, with the Conservatives winning an outright majority for the first time since 1992, some citizens of the UK have been taking the news better than others. Today, riots and protests broke out outside of 10 Downing Street, the Prime Minister's residence, demanding that the Tories be thrown out of office." [75463]

In The Telegraph, Janet Daley, who predicted the conservative victory in the British election, writes, "[A]ll that expertise, all those hours spent questioning and analysing enormous piles of data which was designed to the most foolproof standards—and it was all wrong. It is very important to examine how this terrible error came about because the reason is not methodological, it is political. And the political reason is fundamental to an understanding of what is going wrong with our public discourse. ... I am as sure of this as I was of the eventual election result: the four in 10 poll respondents who said they had not yet made up their minds who to vote for (a figure that remained remarkably consistent right to the end) did not, as one Labour spokesman claimed, suddenly decide 'when they had the pencils in their hands' that they were going to support the Tories. Most of them knew all along that they were going to do that—but they were not willing to say so. Somehow we have arrived at a point where the conscientiously held beliefs and values of the majority of the population have become a matter for secret shame. The desire to do as well as you can in life, to develop your potential and expect to be rewarded for it, to provide your family with the greatest possible opportunity for selfimprovement and to do that on your own without being dependent on the state—these are the assumptions that seem to have become so unacceptable that identifying with them is beyond the pale, or at least so socially outrageous that it is not worth the ignominy of admitting to them." "The Left has so dominated the conversation and so noisily traduced the 'petit bourgeois' values that guide the lives of what used to be called the 'respectable working class' that,

ironically, it is only the most socially confident who can openly embrace them. ... So they prevaricate and evade when asked how they will vote because they are intimidated by the condemnation of the Left-wing mob, or else they just are not self-assured enough to make the moral case (even in their own minds) for their choice. But when they reach the sacred solitude of the voting booth, they do what they know must be done for the sake of their own futures, and that of their families, and even of those the Left insists are being disadvantaged—because they genuinely believe that dependency is a bad thing and that self-determination is a social good. In the end, what does the Left (and its army of media friends) accomplish by all this activist pressure on public opinion? In a circle of mutually congratulatory agreement, the liberal establishment may demonise the social attitudes of the majority until they are blue in the face. They may succeed—as indeed they obviously have – in making ordinary people afraid to utter their real views. But there is a dreadful price to be paid: if you browbeat people into withdrawing from the debate, then you will never know how robust their convictions are—until it is too late and you have catastrophically lost an election, or staked your professional credibility on unsound predictions." (Perhaps as an example, Labour's Ed Miliband promised to "outlaw Islamophobia." The average Brit may have been reluctant to express outrage at that promise in public, but in the voting booth that outrage surfaced.) [75489]

Although Daley is writing about the political situation in Great Britain, her comments well apply to the United States. The leftist media has not only made it "unfashionable" to be conservative, it has made it something many people are unwilling to admit. The absurd political correctness in the United States has made people afraid to stand up for traditional values. They still hold those values, but are afraid to admit it. As a result, even media personalities who many might consider somewhat moderate or even conservative attacked Pamela Geller—not because they support radical Islamist jihad, but because they are afraid to be thought of as "Islamophobic" by the "cocktail party crowd." Similarly, leftists seem to have no problem allowing millions of illegal immigrants into the country, but they most certainly do not want them living next door to them. Hollywood leftists support gun control—while enjoying the protection of 24x7 armed security guards. The average Brit may have said "enough is enough" in the voting booth, even if he has been unwilling to say it in public. Political correctness may keep Americans from expressing their true opinion of Barack Obama, but they voted in a Republican House in November 2010 and a Republican Senate in November 2014. Many Americans may tell a pollster it's time for a female president, but in the voting booth in November 2016 they may declare, "Not that female." Hillary Clinton and the rest of the Democrat Party would be wise to take the election results in Great Britain seriously.

At LewRockwell.com Euro Pacific Capital's Peter Schiff comments on the Federal Reserve's history of incorrect predictions of economic growth: "In the eight years that the Fed has issued GDP forecasts in the prior Fall, only once, in 2010, did the actual economic performance come in the range of its expectations (referred to as its 'central tendency.') And even in that year, Fed forecasters did not manage to put the ball through the goal posts. Instead it just hit the upright (the low end of its range: 2.5% in actual growth vs. a central tendency of 2.5% to 3.5%). In all other years the Fed missed the mark completely on the downside. ...So what do we make of this? Are Fed economists

just horrible forecasters? And if so, why not hire others who more competent? ... A more sinister possibility is that the Fed is not really forecasting at all but cheerleading. The fact that all its forecasts have missed on the high side reveals that its misses may not be random. If the Fed were just wrong, one would expect some of its forecasts to be too low. An obvious explanation is that the Fed may be using its 'forecast' to talk up the economy. By forecasting strong growth, the Fed may be hoping to engender optimism, with more spending and hiring hopefully to follow. Kind of like a field of dreams recovery—if the Fed forecasts it; it will come. Plus the Fed may be hesitant to issue a somber assessment of future growth even if it expects it, fearful that its forecasts become self-fulfilling as businesses and consumers cut back to reflect that forecast. If so, its economics 'forecasts' would be in actuality just another policy arrow in its quiver, and should never be taken seriously. ...Based on what we have seen thus far in the year, fantasies about a 2015 recovery should be evaporating. Responding to criticism from Senator Elizabeth Warren (D-MA) of the Trans-Pacific Partnership trade deal he is pushing, Obama says, "I'd have to be pretty stupid [to take her position] and it doesn't make any sense. ... This is pure speculation. She and I both taught law school and one of the things you do as a law professor is you spin out hypotheticals and this is all hypothetical, speculative. ... You know the truth of the matter is ... Elizabeth is a politician just like everybody else, and she has a voice that she wants to get out there and I understand that, and on most issues she and I deeply agree. On this one, though, her arguments don't stand the test of fact and scrutiny." (Obama is facing criticism from both the political right and the left over the trade proposal. Former Florida governor Jeb Bush delivers a commencement address at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia. Bush slams the Obama administration's actions to restrict religious freedoms. He says, "Federal authorities are demanding obedience, in complete disregard of religious conscience—and in a free society, the answer is no. ... The mistake is to confuse points of theology with moral principles that are knowable to reason as well as by faith, and this confusion is all part of a false narrative that casts religious Americans as intolerant scolds, running around trying to impose their views on everyone. ...Our friends on the left like to view themselves as the agents of change and reform, and you and I are supposed to just get with the program. ... I'm betting that when it comes to doing the right and good thing, the Little Sisters of the Poor know better than the regulators at the Department of Health and Human Services. From the standpoint of religious freedom, you might even say it's a choice between the Little Sisters and Big Brother—and I'm going with the Little Sisters....Somebody here is being small-minded and intolerant, and it sure isn't the nuns, ministers, and laymen and women who ask only to live and practice their faith. ... How strange, in our own time, to hear Christianity spoken as some sort of backward and oppressive force. Your generation is bringing the Christian voice to where it always is needed, and sometimes isn't heard enough." [75479, 75480]

Michelle Obama addresses graduates at Alabama's Tuskegee University and, in an angry speech, whines about how difficult it is for her to be her, and the expectations she encountered while campaigning in 2008: "What kind of First Lady would I be? What kinds of issues would I take on?' ... The truth is, those same questions would have been posed to any candidate's spouse, but, as potentially the first African-American First Lady, I was also the focus of another set of questions and speculations; conversations sometimes rooted in the fears and misperceptions of others. Was I too loud, or too angry, or too emasculating? Or was I too soft, too much of a mom, not enough of a career woman?" She complains that people "will make assumptions about who they think you are based on their limited notion of the world. My husband and I know how frustrating that experience can be. We've both felt the sting of those daily slights throughout our entire lives. ... And all of that is going to be a heavy burden to carry." Michelle Malkin writes, "Obama's resurrected bitter half inspired the graduates by complaining about people complaining about her. She complained about the 'sting' of 'daily slights' throughout her life and her poor, beleaguered husband's. And then she complained. And complained. And complained some more." Mrs. Obama may perhaps be the wealthiest and most privileged person at the event, but she wants the graduates to know how tough her life has been. (How that information is supposed to encourage them as they begin their post-university careers is not known.) Perhaps to the surprise of few, some in the mainstream media fail to observe the rage and bitterness in her speech and instead shower her with praise. Newsbusters.org reports, "Hailing the speech as 'candid reflections on life in the spotlight,' CBS Evening News anchor Scott Pelley gushed that Obama revealed 'some remarkable insight' into what it's been like to be the first African-American First Lady and that 'it sounded a lot like a valedictory [address].' Correspondent Jan Crawford reported that: 'The speech was deeply personal as Michelle Obama recounted criticism and pressure she felt as the nation's first African-American First Lady.' Later, Crawford added that the First Lady told graduates how 'she tuned out the critics by focusing on issues she cares about,' ranging from gardening to hula-hooping at the White House to, in the words of the CBS correspondent, 'working to fight obesity and helping military families.' Over on NBC Nightly News, the coverage appeared even giddier as interim anchor Lester Holt gushed over the course of two teases that Obama offered a 'powerful message' and spoke 'like we have rarely heard before' in that she was '[d]eeply candid about race and the private pain she's endured.' Introducing senior White House correspondent Chris Jansing's segment, Holt explained that Obama's commencement address has been 'getting a lot of attention' and described it as 'candid, personal, heartfelt, [and] even blunt on the issue of race." At the Freedom Summit in Greenville, South Carolina, Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) says, "We saw the ugly face of radical Islam in Garland, Texas, recently. Thankfully, one police officer helped those terrorists meet their virgins. ...We can't win a war against radical Islamic terrorism with a president who won't utter the words 'radical Islamic terrorism.' This nation is in crisis. If we don't pull our country back from the brink, we

risk losing the greatest country in the history of the world. ... We must defend our constitutional rights—all of them." [75501]

In Hattiesburg, Mississippi, police officers Benjamin Deen, 34, and Liquori Tate, 25, are shot and killed during a traffic stop. After a manhunt, Joanie Calloway and brothers Marvin and Curtis Banks are arrested. [75481, 75487]

On May 10 GOP presidential candidate Carly Fiorina appears on *Meet the Press*. She tells moderator Chuck Todd that she purchased the domain name ChuckTodd.org—which now redirects users to CarlyforPresident.com. (Townhall.com notes, "After it was revealed that someone not-so-fond of Fiorina had purchased CarlyFiorina.org, Fiorina absolutely schooled Seth Meyers by revealing that she had purchased SethMeyers.org and redirected the domain to her official campaign site.") Also appearing on *Meet the Press* is *The Washington Post's* Kathleen Parker, who observes that Fiorina "acquitted herself very well with you. And she does that repeatedly. Every time I've seen her speak it's been with great conviction. She is not afraid of the facts. Her campaign will tell you, she answered 200 questions just last week and Hillary Clinton answered seven in the entire scope of her campaign thus far. I'm not saying [Fiorina] is going to be the president. I'm saying she is a viable candidate. She will get better and better as people know her." The *Post's* Ruth Marcus argues, "I don't think we would be taking her seriously at all if she weren't a woman." (Many might say the same thing about Hillary Clinton, of course.) [75516, 75518]

In the *London Review of Books*, respected journalist Seymour Hersh reports that the Obama administration account of the killing of Osama bin Laden contains more than a few falsehoods. The Pulitzer Prize-winning Hersh writes, "The most blatant lie was that Pakistan's two most senior military leaders—General Ashfaq Parvez Kayani, chief of the army staff, and General Ahmed Shuja Pasha, director general of the ISI—were never informed of the US mission. ... The major US source for the account that follows is a retired senior intelligence official who was knowledgeable about the initial intelligence about bin Laden's presence in Abbottabad. He also was privy to many aspects of the Seals' training for the raid, and to the various after-action reports. Two other US sources, who had access to corroborating information, have been longtime consultants to the Special Operations Command. I also received information from inside Pakistan about widespread dismay among the senior ISI and military leadership... over Obama's decision to go public immediately with news of bin Laden's death. After the mission, "...Obama's speech was put together in a rush, the retired official said, and was viewed by his advisers as a political document, not a message that needed to be submitted for clearance to the national security bureaucracy. praised 'a small team of Americans' for their care in avoiding civilian deaths and said: 'After a firefight, they killed Osama bin Laden and took custody of his body.' Two more details now had to be supplied for the cover story: a description of the firefight that never happened, and a story about what happened to the corpse. ...[Defense Secretary Robert] Gates wasn't the only official who was distressed by Obama's decision to speak without clearing his remarks in advance, the retired official said, 'but he was the only one protesting. Obama didn't just double-cross Gates, he double-crossed everyone. This was not the fog of war. The fact that there was an agreement with the Pakistanis and no contingency analysis of what was to be disclosed if something went wrong—that wasn't even discussed. And once it went wrong, they had to make up a new cover story on the fly.' ...The next day John Brennan, then Obama's senior adviser for counterterrorism, had the task of talking up Obama's valour while trying to smooth over the misstatements in his speech. ...Obama, he said, 'made what I believe was one of the gutsiest calls of any president in recent memory.'" "... None of the Seals thought that Obama was going to get on national TV and announce the raid. The Special Forces command was apoplectic. They prided themselves on keeping operational security.' The White House's solution was to silence the Seals. 'The Seals were not happy,' the retired official said. But most of them kept quiet, as did Admiral William McRaven, who was then in charge of JSOC. 'McRaven was apoplectic. He knew he was fucked by the White House, but he's a dyed-in-the-wool Seal, and not then a political operator, and he knew there's no glory in blowing the whistle on the president. When Obama went public with bin Laden's death, everyone had to scramble around for a new story that made sense, and the planners were stuck holding the bag." Hersh continues, "One lie that has endured is that the Seals had to fight their way to their target. Only two Seals have made any public statement: *No Easy Day*, a first-hand account of the raid by Matt Bissonnette, was published in September 2012; and two years later Rob O'Neill was interviewed by Fox News. Both men had resigned from the navy; both had fired at bin Laden. Their accounts contradicted each other on many details, but their stories generally supported the White House version, especially when it came to the need to kill or be killed as the Seals fought their way to bin Laden. O'Neill even told Fox News that he and his fellow Seals thought 'We were going to die.' 'The more we trained on it, the more we realised ...this is going to be a one-way mission.' But the retired official told me that in their initial debriefings the Seals made no mention of a firefight, or indeed of any opposition. The drama and danger portrayed by Bissonnette and O'Neill met a deep-seated need, the retired official said: 'Seals cannot live with the fact that they killed bin Laden totally unopposed, and so there has to be an account of their courage in

According to Hersh's sources, the claims that the Seals retrieved a large collection of videotapes and 15 computers from the bin Laden compound "were fabrications: there wasn't much activity for bin Laden to exercise command and control over. The retired intelligence official said that the CIA's internal reporting shows that since bin Laden moved to Abbottabad in 2006 only a handful of terrorist attacks could be linked to the remnants of bin Laden's al-Qaida. 'We were told at first,' the retired official said, 'that the Seals produced garbage bags of stuff and that the community is generating daily intelligence reports out of this stuff. And then we were told that the community is gathering everything together and needs to translate it. But nothing has come of it. Every single thing they have created turns out not to be true. It's a great hoax—like the Piltdown man.' ... 'Why create the treasure trove story?' the retired official said. 'The White House had to give the impression that bin Laden was still operationally important. Otherwise, why kill him? A cover story was created—that there was a network of couriers coming and going with memory sticks and instructions. All to show that bin Laden remained important." - "...In his address announcing the raid, Obama said that after killing bin Laden the Seals 'took custody of his body.' The statement created a problem. One consultant told me that bin Laden's remains were photographed and identified after being flown back to Afghanistan. The consultant added: 'At that point, the CIA took control of the body. The cover story was that it had been flown to the Carl Vinson.' The second consultant agreed that there had been 'no burial at sea'. He added that 'the killing of bin Laden was political theatre designed to burnish Obama's military credentials ... The Seals should have expected the political grandstanding." As noted previously in this *Timeline*, on January 28, 2002 CBS reported that Osama bin Laden was likely on dialysis for failing kidneys. If that story was correct, it is highly unlikely that he would have lived another 9 years. At LewRockwell.com, Linh Dinh reminds readers that on July 11, 2002 journalist Amir Taheri reported in *The New York Times* that bin Laden was dead: "The news first came from sources in Afghanistan and Pakistan almost six months ago: the fugitive died in December and was buried in the mountains of southeast Afghanistan." On November 2, 2007 former Prime Minister of Pakistan Benazir Bhutto told journalist David Frost that bin Laden was already dead. (Bhutto was assassinated a short time later). Hersh's report notwithstanding, the true story of Osama bin Laden's demise may never be known. (Needless to state, Hersh's article is immediately criticized by Obama supporters, as well as by some who are not so fond of Obama.) If there was no firefight, some might ask why Osama bin Laden was killed inasmuch as he would be more valuable alive than dead because he could provide information. At LewRockwell.com Michael S. Rozeff later writes that Obama "made a decision to murder bin Laden, rather than capture him. This was first and foremost a political decision, a matter of power. It controverted justice. It had nothing to do with bringing about justice. Obtaining information on terrorists through bin Laden's capture that might have saved lives also was ranked lower as a consideration. Both justice and the war on terror were dominated by other values. The central question is what were these values. ... We have suggestions of the political considerations that may have resulted in Obama's decision. They revolve around relations among the U.S. and portions of Pakistan's and Saudi Arabia's governments. Pakistan has close relations with Saudi Arabia. Pakistan is a nuclear power. The U.S. is always interested in assuring that its nuclear weapons are never used. Saudi Arabia has oil that the U.S. is always interested in securing. A living, captured and talking bin Laden, out to defend himself, could have led into what are called 'sensitive' areas and relationships among these three governments." [75667]

FoxNews.com reports, "Saudi Arabia's King Salman will not attend a Camp David summit of U.S. and allied Arab leaders, his foreign minister, Adel al-Jubeir, said Sunday. In a statement, al-Jubeir said the summit Thursday coincides with a humanitarian cease-fire in the conflict in Yemen, where a Saudi-led coalition is fighting Shiite rebels known as Houthis. He said Crown Prince Mohammed bin Nayef, who is also interior minister,

would lead the Saudi delegation and the king's son, Deputy Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, who is defense minister, will also attend. ... Obama had planned to meet Salman one-on-one a day before the gathering of leaders at the presidential retreat but the White House did not take his decision to skip the summit as a sign of any substantial disagreement with the U.S." Several other Arab leaders will not attend Obama's summit, and are instead snubbing him by sending representatives. Columnist Charles Krauthammer comments, "This isn't about geriatric travel problems [of an aging king]. This is a loud statement from the gulf states. You don't have to be an expert. You have to be about 11 or older to understand what this statement is. And it's not about Yemen. This is a rejection of the agreement that the United States is about to embark in with Iran by the states who are going to be very badly affected by and who strongly object to it." Pamela Geller endorses Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) for president. Geller writes, "The media is going to try to use this against him. But they have been thoroughly discredited in the past week. They are aligned with our enemies. Get behind Cruz. I know it's early but the truth is, it's late in the fight. The Connector was awarded \$204.3 million in federal grants to build and operate the online marketplace. All but about \$70 million of the federal grant money has been spent. The federal government's restriction on the remaining funds is affecting the Connector's ability to improve its technology, which has been a problem for users since its inception in October 2013." But it's been blown grossly out of proportion. What it really says to is how much disenfranchisement is taking place, that they could only find one anchor store in that neighborhood, and in that community. And that's what the community is crying out, almost like Freddie Gray did in the back of that police vehicle to no aid, no assistance. ... We need jobs, we need business, we need opportunities." A woman from Glen Allen, Virginia is sentenced to four and a half years in prison for encouraging a man to join ISIS. According to Richmond.com, "Heather Elizabeth Coffman, 30, was arrested in November. With credit for time served, she will spend roughly four years behind bars under the sentence imposed by U.S. District Judge John A. Gibney Jr. ...In pleading guilty in February to making a false statement involving international terrorism, Coffman admitted that last year she used Facebook accounts under different names to show her support for ISIS. ...Coffman, the mother of a boy, 7, who now lives with his father, served briefly in the U.S. Army. At the time of her misconduct, she was living with her parents and sister in Henrico County." [75531, 75532]

ABC's Chicago affiliate reports, "Eleven weeks after his failed run for Chicago mayor, multi-millionaire businessman Willie Wilson has set his sights on the White House. He has filed papers to form an exploratory committee to run for the nation's highest office. ... Wilson, who has never held public office, finished third in the first round vote for mayor. He says leading a successful worldwide medical supply company proves he can run the government and deal with foreigners. ... Wilson says that while he is running as a Democrat, he represents the people as opposed to the party. He called that the biggest

difference between himself and Democratic front-runner Hillary Clinton." (Wilson is black. Although some in the mainstream media were quick to label as racists Republicans who did not support Obama in 2008, it is unlikely that Democrats will be called racist for opposing Wilson.) [75524]

On Your World With Neil Cavuto, retired General Jack Keane comments on the decision by leaders of several Middle East nations to send surrogates to Obama's May 14 "summit." TruthRevolt.org reports, "The Obama administration apologized Monday [May 11] to the United Nation's Human Rights Council for American law enforcement personnel whom it described as 'willfully us[ing] excessive force,' at times with racist motivation. In its defense of its handling of the issue, the administration touts prosecuting over 400 law-enforcement officials and committing itself to take down those found guilty in the future. The Associated Press reports that the U.N. human rights council—which includes dozens of countries with deplorable human rights records—voiced 'widespread concern' about unjust practices by American police. The Obama administration responded by vowing to 'rededicate' itself to ensuring that 'our civil-rights laws live up to their promise' and touting its punishment of out-of-control personnel." The "progressive agenda" contract includes paid sick leave, free daycare before and after school, no free trade, a \$15 per hour minimum wage, immigration reform with a "pathway to citizenship"—and, of course, higher taxes. (The goal of the contract is to push Hillary Clinton further to the political left. As long as Obama is in office, his foundation has pledged not to take money from foreign nationals, foreign agents, registered federal lobbyists or corporations. There's nothing more lethal than a good excuse for failure—institutional racism, whatever that means. We need to just stop it, and we need to begin to concentrate on what we can do to elevate and lift ourselves, regardless of the resistance that other people may impose on us." (Woodson is black.) The Lawyers Chapter of the Phoenix Federalist Society holds a luncheon to honor Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia. Retired Commander Charles F. Kerchner (Kerchner v. Obama) relates that a "Patriotic Citizen" in attendance purchased a copy of Scalia's 2010 book (Reading Law: The Interpretation of Legal Texts), "stood in line to have Scalia autograph it, and then seized on the opportunity to ask, 'U.S. Constitution, Article 2, Section 1, Clause 5: Is it your understanding a 'natural born Citizen' is a person born in the U.S. to two US-citizen parents?' I have seen you cite the writings of Emer de Vattel in cases at the U.S. Supreme Court. As a self proclaimed 'originalist' I believe you already know the original intent, true meaning, and understanding of who a 'natural born Citizen' was and is per the founders and framers, i.e., a person born in the country to parents who are both citizens. You know the writings of Vattel inside and out and his influence on the founders and framers. But if you need a refresher course 'to research that,' visit the site [reference number 75616]. ... In the Senate, Obama fails to get approval for "fast track authority" on the Trans-Pacific Partnership trade deal. Senator Elizabeth Warren (D-MA) has led the effort to block Obama. The vote is 52-45, with 60 votes needed for passage. Meanwhile, Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH) suggests Obama was disrespectful of Warren for having called her "just another politician" and for calling her by her first name. Says Brown, "I'm not going to get into more details. I think referring to her as first name, when he might not have done that for a male senator, perhaps? I've said enough." At Georgetown University, Obama addresses the "Overcoming Poverty at the Catholic-Evangelical Leadership Summit." He whines that "on a regular basis" Fox News portrays poor people as "people who just want a free ObamaPhone, or whatever" and complains that too many "kids start going to private schools, kids start working out at private clubs" instead of using public facilities. (For the record, Obama attended expensive, private schools throughout his life, sends his two daughters to an expensive—\$37,750 per year per student—private school, and routinely plays golf at expensive, private country clubs.) Obama also complains, "The top 25 hedge fund managers made more than all of the kindergarten teachers in the country. So, when I say that, I'm not saying that because I dislike hedge fund managers, or I think they are evil, I'm saying that you're paying a lower [tax] rate than a lot of folks who are making \$300,000 a year. You pretty much have more than you'll ever be able to use in your family will ever be able to use. There's a fairness issue involved here. And by the way, if we were able to close that loophole, I could now invest in early childhood education to make a difference. That's where the rubber hits the road. That's ...where the question of compassion and 'I'm my brother's keeper' comes into play. And if we can't ask from society's lottery winners to just make that modest investment, then really this conversation [on poverty] is for show." (Thomas Sowell later observes, "Despite pious rhetoric on the left about 'asking' the more fortunate for more money, the government does not 'ask' anything. It seizes what it wants by force. If you don't pay up, it can take not only your paycheck, it can seize your bank account, put a lien on your home and/or put you in federal prison. So please don't insult our intelligence by talking piously about 'asking."") [75567, 75801, 75855]

Even if Obama is correct that the top 25 hedge fund managers earn more than the combined salaries of all kindergarten teachers, that is irrelevant. Hedge fund managers earn a fortune because they earn fortunes for their clients. Their fortune-producing skills enables them to also earn fortunes. That hedge fund managers (or Oprah Winfrey, Bill Gates, Warren Buffet, and virtually every Hollywood star) may earn more than their families can spend is also irrelevant. Obama's statements are intended only to encourage envy and resentment. Further, hedge fund managers who are paid salaries most certainly

do not pay a lower tax rate than "folks who are making \$300,000 a year." They would all be in the 39.6 percent tax bracket. Granted, hedge fund managers and others whose income comes from capital gains pay a lower rate, but that lower rate is intended to encourage investment—and that investment is what creates job. The snide remark about "society's lottery winners" is also meant to encourage class envy; it is pure Karl Marx. Obama is suggesting that wealthy Americans did not earn their wealth; they merely got lucky. While that is true for a small portion of wealthy people, their good fortune hardly justifies Obama condemning everyone who has worked hard and succeeded.

With regard to Obama's "brother's keeper" remark, the Bible story relates that after Cain killed Abel, God asked him about his whereabouts. Cain sarcastically replied, "Am I my brother's keeper?" The point of the Bible verse is God's condemnation of Cain for killing his brother. It has nothing to do with one group of people expecting or demanding that others provide for them. (Obama, of course, is certainly not the only person who misuses that Old Testament story to defend reliance on government programs.) Lastly, studies have shown that early childhood education programs like Head Start are a waste of money. They are glorified day care programs, but Obama believes hedge fund managers should be responsible for paying the child-rearing expenses of others. [75568, 75569, 75570]

Not content to attack only Fox News and the wealthy, Obama criticizes Christian churches. He says, "I think it would be powerful for our faith-based organizations to speak out on this [fighting poverty] in a more forceful fashion. ... There is great caring and great concern, but when it comes to what are you really going to the mat for, what's the defining issue ... this is often times viewed as a 'nice to have' relative to an issue like abortion." (In other words, Christians should stop resisting gay marriage and abortion.) [75593]

Obama lectures, "The stereotype is that you've got folks on the left who just want to pour more money into social programs, and don't care anything about culture or parenting or family structures, and that's one stereotype. And then you've got cold-hearted, free market, capitalist types who are reading Ayn Rand and think everybody are moochers [sic]. And I think the truth is more complicated. I think that there are those on the conservative spectrum who deeply care about the least of these, deeply care about the poor; exhibit that through their churches, through community groups, through philanthropic efforts, but are suspicious of what government can do. And then there are those on the left who I think are in the trenches every day and see how important parenting is and how important family structures are, and the connective tissue that holds communities together and recognize that that contributes to poverty when those structures fray, but also believe that government and resources can make a difference in creating an environment in which young people can succeed despite great odds." (Obama is eager to promote government and excoriate capitalism, but he fails to recognize that the government's 50-year "war on poverty" has failed, while capitalism has provided more wealth for more people than any other system in the history of the world.) The Associated Press reports, "State Department officials gave speedy and sometimes only cursory consideration to potential conflicts of interest when approving former President Bill Clinton's lucrative speeches to global companies and foreign governments during Hillary Rodham Clinton's tenure as secretary of state, an Associated Press investigation has found. Again and again, the ethics office responsible for vetting his appearances hurriedly signed off on them, even in cases where questions had been raised about the behavior of organizations hiring Bill Clinton to appear. It approved at least 330 requests for the former president's appearance at speeches, dinners and events. More than 220 of those were paid events that earned the family nearly \$50 million, according to AP's review of State Department documents and Hillary Clinton's financial disclosure forms. The ethics office's standard response: 'We have no objection.' Now, as Hillary Clinton moves forward with her presidential campaign, the ease with which her husband was repeatedly cleared to address companies and governments around the world highlights potential ethical complications that are likely to intensify in her campaign and if she becomes president." HotAir.com notes, "Bill Clinton took \$200,000 from HSBC while the British bank was under investigation for money laundering, a rather ironic happenstance to be sure. That pales in comparison to the \$840,000 UBS paid Bill for five events just two years after UBS admitted to 'a massive tax evasion scheme aiding American clients and paid \$780 million in penalties." Obama calls for a rewriting of the Patriot Act, which is set to expire on May 31. (It is absurd to expect a total rewrite of a law just weeks before it is set to expire. Obama and Congress should have addressed the issue months earlier.) [75560]

The Department of Health and Human Services announces stricter birth control regulations for insurers, which must now offer for free 18 forms of contraception, "including the ring, the patch and intrauterine devices," as well as "morning after" abortifacients. [75564]

CNSNews.com reports, "Inflation-adjusted federal tax revenues hit a record \$1,891,601,000,000 [\$1.892 trillion] for the first seven months of the fiscal year this April, but the federal government still ran a \$282,766,000,000 [\$283 billion] deficit during that time, according to the latest Monthly Treasury Statement." Government spending during those seven months was \$2.174 trillion. [75606]

At FoxNews.com, Todd Starnes reports that a strict interpretation of federal "non-discrimination" rules (Title IX) has forced the removal of a storage shed that was donated to Arbor View High School in Las Vegas for the baseball booster club—because an equal shed was not also built for the female students. The booster club and school have spent \$21,000 to remove the shed—which cost nothing. [75574]

On Hugh Hewitt's radio program, syndicated columnist Charles Krauthammer comments on Obama's most recent diatribe against Fox News: "He said, 'if you watch it all the time,' so I'm glad to know that he's joined this vast audience that Fox commands. damn thing about what's on Fox. The idea that Fox is constantly showing sponges and leeches and never shows, you know, the waitress trying to make it—it's just sort of the mythological world he lives in, or he may be cynical. I mean, he may know it's all nonsense. I mean, I can't tell. After all, you probably need a psychiatrist to figure that out. But he's either cynical or hopelessly delusional on this. I would prefer to think he's cynical because I'd like somebody in the White House who's not delusional. And this is the usual Obama cynicism; 'It's the media, it's the press. They're underreporting liberal successes. I mean, look, the fact is a war on poverty, the billions poured into helping the poor, which in my 20s I rather supported until in my 30s, the empirical social science evidence began to come out that not only was money poured down the drain, but it was undermining the traditional structures of even the poorest neighborhoods and leading to real terrible pathologies, including helping to accelerate the breakdown of the family. So these are, there's just the empirical social science refuting the liberal nostrums about how to help the poor. But [Obama] never engages in an argument. It's all ad hominem [attacks]." On May 13 White House press secretary Josh Earnest says Obama expects an apology from Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH) for suggesting Obama was sexist (for his having referred to Senator Elizabeth Warren (D-MA) as "just another politician" and for calling her by her first name). Earnest states, "I'm confident after he has gotten a chance to take a look at the comments he made yesterday that he'll find a way to apologize." (Obama may also have to demand an apology from Terry O'Neill, president of the National Organization for Women, who tells TheHill.com that Obama's comment "is sexist. ...I think [Obama] was trying to build up his own trustworthiness on this issue by convincing us that Senator Warren's concerns are not to be taken seriously. But he did it in a sexist way." The "clear subtext" of Obama's remark, states O'Neill, "is that the little lady just doesn't know what she's talking about.") [75585, 75590, 75598, 75652]

Earnest also predictably tells reporters, "We've been very clear about what we think is the appropriate level of funding for Amtrak and [Obama's] budget is I think what's nearly a billion dollar increase in funding for Amtrak. There are extensive infrastructure upgrades that could be made that would benefit the traveling public, it would be good for our economy and that's why we've long advocated for those kinds of investments. Republicans unfortunately are currently considering legislation at the Committee level that would actually cut funding from Amtrak's budget by I believe a quarter of a billion dollars a year. That certainly is not consistent with the kinds of priorities that [Obama] has advocated and sought to advance." [75579]

Philly.com reports, "Investigators of Tuesday's deadly Amtrak derailment say they are focusing on reports that the train was traveling more than twice the 50-mile-an-hour speed limit when it entered a sharp curve in Frankford. ... The train's engineer, who has not been identified, declined to give a statement to police investigators and left the East Detectives Division with an attorney, police commissioner Charles H. Ramsey said Wednesday. The train's conductor, also unidentified, was at Einstein Hospital with a skull fracture, Ramsey said." According to the National Transportation Safety Board, the train was traveling at 106 miles per hour when the engineer applied the brakes. [75584, 75611, 75612, 75693]

Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich observes, "It is important to point out that the reason for last night's crash wasn't a lack of funding, but instead because the train was going 100 mph in a 50 mph zone. Despite being funded by taxpayers at \$1.4 billion per year (and by \$50 billion over the course of its implementation 40 years ago) in addition to customers purchasing expensive tickets, Amtrak loses close to \$1 billion annually. The rail system has been called a 'massive failure' by one of its founders. But sure, let's throw more money at a system that is completely inefficient and non-profitable despite massive, heavy subsidies and over-priced ticket purchases from hard working Americans." (Instead of increasing Amtrak funding, the government should sell it to the highest bidder.) [75579, 75581, 75583, 75724]

New York City's leftist mayor, Bill de Blasio, tweets, "Congress must increase the federal transportation infrastructure investment to keep us safe." Senator Richard Blumenthal (D-CT) states, "We should be investing, redoubling our commitment to the quality and reliability of tracks and... other kinds of safety and reliability equipment." Congressman Chaka Fattah (D-PA) says, "While it's too early to speculate on the cause of last night's derailment, ensuring safety and reliability on our railways requires substantial investment in Amtrak." Congressman David Price (D-NC) says, "Yesterday's tragedy in Philadelphia should be a wake-up call to this [House Appropriations] committee—we must provide sufficient funding for Amtrak's critical infrastructure projects to ensure a safer transportation system." At Politico.com Rich Lowry calls Michelle Obama's commencement address at Tuskegee University "a ringing call for the graduates not to be discouraged by her whining. Much of the first lady's speech was what is right and proper for a Tuskegee commencement, drawing on the story of the determination and skill of the Tuskegee Airmen. But she devoted a long passage to her own struggles that was off key and characteristically self-pitying. Few women in modern America have been the focus of as much adulation as Michelle Obama, a Princeton University and Harvard Law School graduate who was making almost \$270,000 by the time her husband was elected senator. She is routinely lionized for her beauty and her public spiritedness. Yet, the first lady often strikes an aggrieved note when talking about her experience in America (her notorious comment in 2008 was that 'for the first time in my adult lifetime I'm really proud of my country'). ... After all the outrageous slings and arrows she suffered in the 2008 campaign... she managed to recover when it came to magazine covers, posing for

the March 2009 Vogue, looking resplendent on a cover with the lines, 'Michelle Obama: The First Lady the World's Been Waiting For.' ...Michelle Obama doesn't seem to fully realize that the narrative arc of being the wife of a political candidate celebrated by nearly every organ of elite culture on his way to a landslide victory in a presidential election, to becoming a 'fully-formed first lady,' isn't exactly that of the 'Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass.' But the logic of the microaggression increasingly defines the Democratic Party, because identity politics needs the oxygen of perpetual offense. Democrats can't even have a debate among themselves about trade policy without ...Obama himself getting accused of sexism (for referring to Sen. Elizabeth Warren by her first name). As channeled by Michelle Obama, the party's animating sentiment is we shall overcome—every insult real or imagined." [75654]

Sister Diana Momeka of the Dominican Sisters of Saint Catherine of Siena, who used to live in Mosul, Iraq, addresses the House Foreign Affairs Committee. Katie Pavlich relates the nun's testimony: "Christians of Iraq are the first people of the land. You read about us in the Old Testament of the Bible. Christianity came to Iraq from the very earliest days through the preaching and witness of St Thomas and others of the Apostles and Church Elders. While our ancestors experienced all kinds of persecution, they stayed in their land, building a culture that has served humanity for the ages. We, as Christians, do not want, or deserve to leave or be forced out of our country any more than you would want to leave or be forced out of yours. But the current persecution that our community is facing is the most brutal in our history. ...On June 10, 2014, the so-called Islamic State in Iraq and Syria or ISIS, invaded the Nineveh Plain, which is where Qaraqosh is located. Starting with the city of Mosul, ISIS overran one city and town after another, giving the Christians of the region three choices: convert to Islam, pay a tribute to ISIS, or leave their cities with nothing more than the clothes on their back. As this horror spread throughout the Nineveh Plain, by August 6, 2014, Nineveh was emptied of Christians, and sadly, for the first time since the seventh century AD, no church bells rang for Mass in the Plain of Nineveh. From June 2014 forward, more than a hundred and twenty thousand people found themselves displaced and homeless in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq, leaving behind their heritage and all they had worked for over the centuries. This uprooting, this theft of everything that the Christians owned, displaced them body and soul, stripping away their humanity and dignity." Momeka says, "This is cultural and human genocide. The only Christians that remain in the Plain of Nineveh are those who are held as hostages." [75580, 75640, 75671]

Reuters reports, "The Czech Republic blocked an attempted purchase by Iran this year of a large shipment of sensitive technology useable for nuclear enrichment after false documentation raised suspicions, U.N. experts and Western sources said. The incident could [that is, will most certainly] add to Western concerns about whether Tehran can be trusted to adhere to a nuclear deal being negotiated with world powers under which it would curb sensitive nuclear work in exchange for sanctions relief." [75675, 75676]

Russia's ambassador to the United Nations, Vitaly Churkin, tells Bloomberg.com "There can be no automaticity, none whatsoever" of re-imposing sanctions on Iran if they are

removed after a nuclear agreement—despite Obama's claim that they will be easily "snapped back." [75705]

TheBlaze.com reports, "Both the New York Times and NBC News are backing up parts of the recent story by Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist Seymour Hersh that accuses ...Obama of lying about the killing of Osama bin Laden. The key assertion of the Hersh piece... is that the Pakistani government knew the whereabouts of the world's most wanted terrorist. The White House strongly denied the story, calling it filled with 'inaccuracies and baseless assertions.' However, a New York Times correspondent Carlotta Gall wrote in a first-person account that some of Hersh's reporting checks out... Separately, NBC News reported that sources confirmed to them that Pakistani intelligence officials were aware of bin Laden's whereabouts..." [75602, 75608]

ChicagoBusiness.com relates the story of a six-unit condominium association in Chicago that has been fined \$200 for violating a garbage ordinance. "The notice indicated that a city inspector had paid a visit to the premises in November, half a year earlier, and noticed refuse in the alley 'improperly stacked against, piled (on) or overflowing from the dumpster or reform container.' Proof would be provided if the defendant appeared at a hearing before a city administrative law judge, the notice added. If an appearance wasn't made, the \$200 fine had to be paid within seven days or it would jump to \$500. ... But it got worse. Added the city's notice, in tiny print, 'Please note that if respondent named above is a corporation or legal entity other than an individual, the respondent must be represented by an attorney at all administrative hearing appearances.' In other words, spend a grand or two to hire a lawyer, or pay up. ...[Y]ou may wonder how Chicago got a system in which, just to challenge a \$200 fine, you have to blow a wad on a lawyer. The answer, from the appellate ruling: 'The underlying statute establishing in-house administrative adjudication, and raising their judgments to the dignity of court judgments, was the result of Public Act 90-516, sponsored by then-state Sen. Barack Obama." (This *Timeline*, of course, has no problem with a city full of rats expecting lids of garbage dumpsters to be kept closed. But requiring that a six-unit condominium association hire a lawyer just to argue that it is people who do not live in the building who are improperly using the dumpster is extreme. This is an example of typical "generate income for lawyers" legislation, in this case pushed by former lawyer Obama.) [75603]

The White House threatens a veto of the 2016 National Defense Authorization Act if, according to CNSNews.com, it "places restrictions on the administration's ability to release or transfer terror suspects from Guantanamo Bay, blocks funding for military base closures, and seeks to bypass the Iraqi government in providing arms directly to Kurdish and Sunni fighters..." [75605]

The House votes 242-184 to approve the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act—legislation banning abortions after the fetus is 20 weeks old. Pro-abortion leftists immediately condemn the action. Congresswoman Louise Slaughter (D-NY) calls the legislation "disgustingly cruel"—despite the fact that the vast majority of Americans

object to late-term abortions. The White House threatens a veto of the bill by the proabortion Obama if it passes the Senate (which is unlikely). [75623, 75624, 75651, 75658]

Hillary Clinton criticizes the 20-week abortion ban, through policy advisor Maya Harris: "Politicians should not interfere with personal medical decisions, which should be left to a woman, her family and her faith, in consultation with her doctor or health care provider. This bill is a direct challenge to Roe v. Wade, which has protected a woman's constitutional right to privacy for over forty years. The bill puts women's health and rights at risk, undermines the role doctors play in health care decisions, burdens survivors of sexual assault, and is not based on sound science." Clinton tweets, "When it comes to women's health, there are two kinds of experts: women and their doctors. True 40+ years ago, true today." (Clinton apparently supports abortion *at any time during a pregnancy*, despite the fact that most Americans do not hold that position. In fact, women oppose late-term abortions more than men.) Cecile Richards, head of the abortion mill Planned Parenthood, says the legislation lacks "compassion" and "respect." (Some might argue that prohibiting an abortionist from vacuuming out the brain of a 20-week old fetus demonstrates considerable compassion. Others might ask Richards how aborting a baby the day before its due date demonstrates "respect.") [75639]

In a new treaty, the Vatican officially recognizes the "state of Palestine," even though there is no such state. Vatican spokesman Rev. Federico Lombardi says, "Yes, it's a recognition that the state exists." Israel's foreign ministry responds, "This move does not promote the peace process and distances the Palestinian leadership from returning to direct and bilateral negotiations. Israel will study the agreement and will consider its steps accordingly." [75622, 75650, 75656]

DCClothesline.com posts several early photographs of Barack Obama and Michelle Robinson Obama, and raises questions about their authenticity. [75607]

WND.com reports on "a video of a U.S. Department of Homeland Security bus pulling into a Shell station in Victorville [California], on the night of May 7" that contained "Somalis and other Africans who had crossed the southern border... A man who appeared to be a Customs and Border Patrol agent was filmed at the gas station at 10:30 p.m." Questioned by Anita Fuentes of OpenYourEyesPeople.com, the agent replied, "Well, they're coming in asking for asylum." Fuentes: "That's what it is, that special key word, huh? That's a password now?" Agent: "That's what the password is now." WND.com's Leo Hohmann writes, "A Customs and Border Patrol agent, who asked not to be identified, told WND that many more Africans and Middle Easterners are likely crossing over the Mexican border than what DHS is willing to admit. 'You're not going to get an honest number, because they all want to look good and get promotions from the people in D.C.,' the border agent told WND. 'I'm absolutely confident that is happening.' That's why the video is raising eyebrows, because the agent appears unfazed, as though transferring busloads of Somalis and Africans to detention facilities is a routine task.

Once at the detention facility, asylum seekers are often asked to fill out legal documents, given a court date and set free." The agent warns, "[T]his administration's done everything they can do to shut down ICE [Immigration and Customs Enforcement] from doing its job." [75619, 75620]

On *Hardball*, Chris Matthews and several guests discuss the Amtrak derailment. Matthews asks, "Do we need to have a better right-of-way? Can we clear a straight line for this train?" (That is, "Why don't we just eliminate curves?") "...In Communist countries like China, they just draw a straight line, whether it goes through your house or not, it's a straight line. We have this Amtrak, I've been taking it for a half a century, it doesn't go in a straight line. In this case, it tried to make a turn and turned over! Because there's so many turns on that route. How do you get rid of the turns?" (Matthews' claim that Chinese rail lines have no curves is, of course, absurd. So is the suggestion that railroads could be built without them. They are usually necessary because of natural terrain, not houses.) [75644]

On May 14 Yahoo.com reports, "The engineer of the Amtrak train that crashed in Philadelphia 'has absolutely no recollection of the incident or anything unusual' and 'no explanation' for what caused the crash, his attorney told ABC News. The engineer, Brandon Bostian, 32, of Queens, New York, was 'very distraught' to learn that the crash killed at least seven people, the attorney, Robert Goggin, told ABC News. He added that Bostian voluntarily turned over a blood sample and his cell phone and is cooperating with authorities." [75653]

According to GotNews.com, Bostian is "a 32-year-old gay activist... After a careful study of his social media we conclude that he is an exhibitionist who is interested in odd sex acts." Bostian also apparently posted some strange questions and observations about operating trains at www.trainorders.com. [75662, 75663, 75664, 75753, 75754]

House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) thrashes a reporter for suggesting the Amtrak crash was the result of funding cuts. Boehner says, "Are you really going to ask such a stupid question? Obviously it's not about funding. The train was going twice the speed limit. ...It's hard for me to imagine that people take the bait on some of the nonsense that gets spewed around here." [75659]

Obama hosts an Arab summit at Camp David to discuss security and cooperation. (Four of the six invited leaders, including Saudi Arabia's King Salman, send surrogates. Bahrain's King Hamad bin Isa al-Khalifa attends the Windsor Horse Show with Queen Elizabeth II.) According to Politico.com, the meeting is not very successful: "Arab leaders who went to Camp David seeking a written security agreement with the United States are going home without one. ... Obama, who invited the Gulf allies to the presidential retreat in the hopes of getting more support for his opening to Iran, made only limited headway. ... Both sides agree it's worth pursuing a comprehensive and verifiable nuclear deal with Iran, but whether they will define those terms the same way is an open question. Both sides may concur it's important to bring calm to Syria, but the

details of how to achieve that peace are likely to stay a source of discord. Even Obama's reaffirmation of U.S. support is unlikely to keep the Arab countries from pursuing new military partners or asserting their independence in how to deal with their region's many troubles." [75674, 75689, 75695, 75714, 75831, 75832]

With Gulf leaders at his side, Obama tells reporters, "The United States will stand by our GCC [Gulf Cooperation Council] partners against external attack and will deepen and extend cooperation that we have." [75787]

The White House issues a statement that reads in part, "The United States is prepared to work jointly with the GCC states to deter and confront an external threat to any GCC state's territorial integrity that is inconsistent with the UN Charter. In the event of such aggression or the threat of such aggression, the United States stands ready to work with our GCC partners to determine urgently what action may be appropriate, using the means at our collective disposal, including the potential use of military force, for the defense of our GCC partners. As with Operation Decisive Storm, GCC states will consult with the United States when planning to take military action beyond GCC borders, in particular when U.S. assistance is requested for such action. ... The United States and GCC member states strongly affirmed the necessity of resolving the Israeli-Palestinian conflict on the basis of a just, lasting, comprehensive peace agreement that results in an independent and contiguous Palestinian state living side-by-side in peace and security with Israel. To that end, the United States and GCC member states underscored the enduring importance of the 2002 Arab Peace Initiative and the urgent need for the parties to demonstrate through policies and actions—genuine advancement of a two-state solution, and decided to remain closely engaged moving forward." [75788]

Obama's words and the White House statement do not answer a key question, "Whose side would Obama take if there were a war between Israel and the GCC?" At PJMedia.com Susan L. M. Goldberg writes, "The reality of the language of this latest agreement is simple: It paves the way for a US-backed military war against Israel in order to create a Palestinian state. Whether or not that language will ever be realized will hopefully not be a story for another day." [75789]

While Obama reassures Arab state leaders that the United States "has their backs," five Iranian gunboats fire warning shots at a Singapore-flagged ship in the Persian Gulf. According to CNN's Barbara Starr, "At that point, there's a lot of drama here, the UAE [United Arab Emirates] sent three of its cargo vessels out to protect the ship that was now in its national waters, and the Iranian's turned back." [75706]

The leftist organization Missourians Organizing For Reform and Empowerment (MORE) faces protests from people who had been promised paychecks for demonstrating in Ferguson, Missouri. According to WeaselZippers.us, MORE is "an ACORN organization which had received funding through George Soros to fund the protests." Newsmax.com later reports, "At least some of the protesters who looted, rioted, burned buildings and overturned police cars... were promised payment of up to \$5,000 per month to join the protests. ...Millennial Activists United (MAU) posted a letter on their website stating,

'On May 14, 2015 many individuals and organizations of the protest movement that began in Ferguson, Missouri, organized a sit-in in the office of Missourians Organizing for Reform and Empowerment (MORE).' The demand was simple: Cut the checks. The protesters say they are unable to pay their bills after taking time to travel to Ferguson. 'Questions have been raised as to how the movement is to sustain when white non-profits are hoarding monies collected of off [sic; off of] black bodies? When we will [sic; will we] hold the industry of black suffering accountable? The people of the community are fed up and the accountability begins here and now.'" [75805, 75806, 75854, 75866, 76011]

It is revealed that ABC's George Stephanopoulos never disclosed to the public or his network bosses that he donated \$75,000 to the Clinton Foundation—\$25,000 in 2012, and again in 2013 and 2014. FoxNews.com notes, "Even when he interviewed the author [Peter Schweizer] of 'Clinton Cash'—the high-profile book examining potential conflicts of interest behind Clinton Foundation funding—on ABC's 'This Week,' Stephanopoulos did not disclose his own contributions." Clinton lackey Stephanopoulos states, "In retrospect, I probably shouldn't have, even though I did it for the best reasons." (By "best reasons," Stephanopoulos wants viewers to think he means, "for charity." What he really means is, "to stay in good graces with the Clintons.") According to Politico.com, Stephanopoulos "said that he would not moderate ABC's GOP debate, which is scheduled to take place in February in New Hampshire." Senator Rand Paul (R-KY) "said... Stephanopoulos should be prohibited from moderating any debates during the 2016 presidential campaign." (FreeBeacon.com's Andrew Stiles questioned ABC on May 13 about Stephanopoulos' actions. Rather than answer those questions, ABC gave the story to Politico.com—knowing Politico would be less critical in its report.) [75618, 75626, 75627, 75628, 75635, 75636, 75637, 75647, 75648, 75660, 75661, 75666, 75668, 75694, 75701, 75770]

Townhall.com political editor Guy Benson reminds readers that during Obama's first term Stephanopoulos engaged in daily telephone calls with then-chief of staff Rahm Emanuel and political operatives James Carville and Paul Begala. (Needless to state, for an allegedly "objective" journalist to have daily conversations with the White House to coordinate talking points is beyond the pale. He did it anyway.) During one 2012 Republican primary debate, Stephanopoulos asked Mitt Romney, "Do you believe that states have the right to ban contraception, or is that trumped by a constitutional right to privacy?" Romney responded, "Uh, George, this is an unusual, uh, topic that you're raising. States have a right to ban contraception? I can't imagine a state banning contraception..." (The question was clearly orchestrated by Stephanopoulos and key Democrats, if not the White House, in an effort to push a "Republican war on women" meme. Stephanopoulos has proven on several occasions that "You can take a shameless political operative out of the White House but you can't take the shameless political operations out of that operative.") [75627, 75694]

Some leftist journalists immediately come to Stephanopoulos' defense, arguing all he did was give money to a "charity." The bigger problem, of course, is that Stephanopoulos

interviewed Schweizer without pushing too hard on the legitimacy of the Clinton Foundation's operations. (Had someone on Fox News donated \$75,000 to a questionable charity and then conducted a softball interview with a critic of that charity, media leftists who be screaming non-stop for days about the impropriety. Someone other than Stephanopoulos, who has close ties to the Clintons and even served in the White House with Bill Clinton, should have conducted the interview—even if Stephanopoulos had never given a dime to the Clinton Foundation.) Stephanopoulos interviewed Senator Bernie Sanders (I-VT) on the May 3 broadcast of *This Week*, and defended Hillary Clinton and the Clinton Foundation from Sander's criticism—without telling viewers that he is a strong supporter of Clinton or that he donated \$75,000 to her family foundation. (Stephanopoulos has also attended meetings of the Clinton Global Initiative and has been both a moderator and featured speaker at its events.) The next day Stephanopoulos issues an apology of sorts, telling *Good Morning America* viewers, "I want to address some news you may have seen about me. Over the last several years I've made substantial donations to dozens of charities including the Clinton Global Foundation. Those donations were a matter of public record but I should have made additional disclosures on air when we covered the foundation. And I now believe that directing personal donations to that foundation was a mistake. Even though I made them strictly to support work done to stop the spread of AIDS, help children, and protect the environment in poor countries, I should have gone the extra mile to avoid even the appearance of a conflict. I apologize to all of you for failing to do that." (Stephanopoulos does not tell viewers what his White House job will be if Hillary Clinton is elected president, but he may very well have one in mind.) [75675, 75700]

Townhall.com's Katie Pavlich comments, "Stephanopoulos wants the narrative during the fallout here to be this: If you criticize or question donations to the Clinton Foundation, you're basically against helping poor people, aids research and clean water. Further, he's apologized and regrets making the donations, so we should move on and stop questioning the ethics surrounding his decision not to disclose the donations while covering critical stories about the Foundation. Also, if you think non-disclosure of donations is more important than saving children, you're a terrible person. Here's the problem. This isn't about the donations being made in the first place, it's about hiding them from viewers while covering, and defending, the Clinton Foundation.

...Stephanopoulos didn't 'make a mistake' by donating [to] the Clinton Foundation or by failing to disclose the donations. They were both done deliberately as part of his role to shape narratives on behalf of the Left." [75675]

HotAir.com's Ed Morrissey comments that Stephanopoulos' weak apology "shows why he never should have conducted the interview with [author Peter] Schweizer in the first place. Stephanopoulos was already suspect, given his connections to the Clinton White House in the 1990s, on any topic that delves into potential scandal in Clintonland. ...[H]e admits that he went into that interview with the predetermined perspective that the foundation operates legitimately as a charity, a point which has come under heavy

scrutiny by watchdog groups such as Charity Navigator. The 'interview' was little more than a barely veiled attempt at spin control on behalf of the Clinton Foundation and the Clintons themselves, and now we know at least one reason why. [Politico.com] reports that ABC News is standing by Stephanopoulos, but one wonders for how long. What would they do with another reporter who failed to disclose a serious financial relationship between themselves and a story, especially one with the political consequences as this one? Because if they truly don't think that's a serious problem, then the smoking gun in this case points not just to the credibility of Stephanopoulos but to ABC News, too." [75649, 75677]

Carly Fiorina's campaign staff issues a statement: "Carly does interviews with Hillary apologists pretty often as you can see from our press coverage. So we'll leave it to ABC to decide whether their viewers can still trust that George [Stephanopoulos] is telling them everything they need to know when it comes to his 2016 coverage or just the things that are about to leak in the conservative press." On CNBC, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY)—apparently more of an exert troller than people realize—says, "I want to compliment [Obama] on the way he took on the base, took on Elizabeth Warren, took on the labor unions." At HotAir.com Mary Katherine Ham notes that Hillary Clinton "was for the trade bill while Secretary of State but is now too scared to stand up for it." [75702]

While some complain that money should be spend on automating trains so that engineers will not run them more than 50 miles per hour over the speed limit, few comment on the much more important infrastructure need: protecting the nation's electrical grid from an electromagnetic pulse (EMP) attack. Tara Copp writes at WashingtnExaminer.com, "An attack on the United States' unprotected grid could leave the nation without electricity for months or even years, experts are warning the government. Because the U.S. and its utility companies have not hardened the 450,000 miles of commercial transmission lines or the critical 2,000 transformers nationwide, a significant attack could black out the grid long term, damaging all the infrastructure Americans rely on to have access to money, food and transportation for months or years, a panel of experts warned the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee Wednesday. An attack 'could black out the national electric grid for months or years and collapse all the other critical infrastructures—communications, transportation, banking and finance, food and water necessary to sustain modern society and the lives of 310 million Americans,' warned panelist Peter Pry, executive director of the Task Force on National and Homeland Security for the Noah Group, a research organization." "A 2008 study on the long-term consequences of an electromagnetic pulse (EMP) attack found the U.S. so dependent upon electricity to access food, clean water and transportation that it concluded that if the U.S. was hit by a large-scale EMP attack, within 12 months of a nationwide blackout the after-effects would kill 'nine of 10 Americans through starvation, disease and societal collapse.' What maddens the experts is that the fixes that would greatly improve the United States' resistance to an attack on

the grid—whether from a kinetic attack, a natural disaster or an EMP attack—aren't that expensive in relation to the amount of money spent on other types of national defense. It would cost only about \$30 billion to upgrade the whole thing, said George Baker, a professor at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Va., who testified before the committee." (Eight people killed in a train crash is a terrible tragedy, but no words exist to describe the deaths of more than 200 million Americans from starvation, disease, and exposure.) [75655]

In a letter... to Secretary of State John Kerry, [Congressman] Trey Gowdy (R-SC) complained that the department has delayed providing emails and other documents involving Clinton, a former secretary of state. 'Simply put, the committee must have the records of communication requested more than six months ago before the secretary's appearance can be scheduled,' Gowdy wrote." [75665, 75704]

ISIS releases an audio message, allegedly from its leader, Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi. According to CBSNews.com, "The audio message posted on militant websites features a voice that sounds like al-Baghdadi's exhorting all Muslims to take up arms and fight on behalf of the group's self-styled caliphate. The speaker references the Saudi-led air campaign against Shiite rebels in Yemen, which began on March 26, and harshly criticizes the Saudi royal family. CBS News' Khaled Wassef reports that in previous speeches, al-Baghdadi always called on Muslims to flock to the group's self-styled caliphate and take up arms against the apostates and the Shiites. Here, for the first time, he seems to be giving his followers the choice to either join ISIS in Syria and Iraq, or just carry out attacks at home. 'Islam was never a religion of peace. Islam is the religion of fighting,' he said. 'No one should believe that the war that we are waging is the war of the Islamic State. It is the war of all Muslims, but the Islamic State is spearheading it. It is the war of Muslims against infidels.' 'O Muslims go to war everywhere. It is the duty of every Muslim,' the speaker said. It was not immediately possible to verify whether the voice was al-Baghdadi's." (Al-Baghdadi was purportedly severely injured or killed in an airstrike in November 2014.) [75669, 75670]

According to a May 9-12 Fox News poll conducted by Anderson Robbins Research and Shaw & Company Research, "Six in 10 voters think it is likely terrorists are living in their hometown (60 percent). The Independent reports, "An Egyptian court sentenced ousted President Mohammed Morsi and more than 100 others to death over a mass prison break during the 2011 uprising that toppled Hosni Mubarak and later brought Morsi's Islamist movement to power. ... The prosecution alleged that foreign fighters from Gaza had entered Egypt, and coordinated a mass jailbreak from three prisons using heavy weapons. They argued that the fleeing prisoners looted and destroyed property as well as committed murder." (Muslim Brotherhood leader Morsi might never have gained power had Obama not turned his back on Mubarak, a long-time U.S. ally.) [75950]

Wired.com reports, "A security researcher kicked off a United Airlines flight last month after tweeting about security vulnerabilities in its system had previously taken control of an airplane and caused it to briefly fly sideways, according to an application for a search warrant filed by an FBI agent. David Stockman, former Congressman and director of the Office of Management and Budget, makes it clear that Amtrak will never make money, will always require taxpayer subsidies, and should be sold to the highest bidder. Stockman writes, "There is not even a remote case that subsidizing intercity rail travel is a proper or necessary function of the state. Amtrak accounts for well less than 1% of intercity passenger miles. On every one of its 44 routes there are bus and air travel alternatives, and that is to say nothing of automobile travel—whether in cars with drivers today or in the driverless kind tomorrow. Moreover, the evidence overwhelmingly shows that passenger trains will never be economically competitive outside of a handful of densely populated corridors. ... The cumulative taxpayer subsidy since 1972 totals more than \$75 billion in dollars of today's purchasing power. During the span of nearly a half century, Amtrak has operated upwards of 40 routes that have never, ever made even an 'operating profit.'" Stockman notes that Amtrak's "capital consumption expense amounts to about 25 cents per passenger mile. ... The average airline fare in the US is about 15 cents per passenger mile and the average bus fare is about 11 cents per mile. Now how in the world does it make sense to operate a lumbering passenger rail system in which the true economic cost of its capital assets alone is 65% to 130% higher than the profitable fares charged by the perfectly adequate and available alternative modes of transportation?" "...Amtrak's current fare on [the Chicago-Los Angeles] route is about 15 cents per passenger mile and apparently it cannot go much higher if it wishes to remain competitive with air. Yet why in the world should bus drivers in Minneapolis pay Federal taxes in order to provide what amounts to a \$600 subsidy per ticket on the 180,000 tickets that are sold annually on the Chicago-Los Angeles route? And the latter is only typical of most of the other routes outside the northeast corridor. Zineb El Rhazoui, 33, was called to a preliminary dismissal hearing to remind her of her 'obligations' towards the French weekly following 'numerous incidents.' The French-Moroccan columnist accused her employers of trying to 'punish her' for speaking out about the direction of the magazine four months after the jihadist attack which left 12 dead. 'I am shocked and appalled that a management that has received so much support after the January attacks could show so little support for one of its employees, who is under pressure like everyone in the team and has faced threats,' she told Le Monde." Catherine Herridge reported this morning on 'America's Newsroom' that a Defense Intelligence Agency memo from Sept. 16, 2012, concluded that the Benghazi terror attack was planned at least 10 days in advance to coincide with 9/11 and was in retaliation for a drone strike that killed an al Qaeda strategist. The memo was copied to the National Security Council, the State Department and the CIA. 'The intention was to attack the consulate and to kill as many Americans as possible to seek revenge for the [U.S.] killing of Aboyahiye (Alaliby) in Pakistan and in memorial of the 11 September 2001 attacks on the World Trade Center buildings,' the memo said. Judicial Watch obtained the memos by suing in federal court. 'The Obama administration says it was a coincidence that [the Benghazi attack] occurred on 9/11. In fact, their intelligence said it wasn't a coincidence, and in fact, specifically the attack occurred because it was 9/11,' Judicial Watch President Tom Fitton said. Another 2012 DIA memo predicts the rise of ISIS and the establishment of a caliphate 17 months before ... Obama called ISIS 'jay-vee.' A third DIA memo, dated Oct. 5, 2012, leaves no doubt that U.S. intelligence agencies knew that weapons were moving from Libya to Syria before the attack that killed four Americans. Former CIA Director Mike Morell recently dodged questions about these weapons in an interview with Bret Baier. Baier

asked him: Were CIA officers tracking the movement of weapons from Libya to Syria? 'Can't talk about it,' Morell said." [75771, 75798]

WND.com adds that the documents "showed then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and other senior Obama officials were given reports within hours of the Sept. 11, 2012, attack. In those memos, the DOD [Department of Defense] described details of a plan 10 days in advance 'to kill as many Americans as possible.' The plans for attack had nothing to do with a provocative YouTube video by an obscure filmmaker, which the administration repeatedly blamed for the attacks. They had everything to do with terrorists from the 'Brigades of the Captive Omar Abdul Rahman,' the so-called 'Blind Sheikh.' Rahman is serving life in prison for his involvement in the 1993 World Trade Center bombing and other terrorist acts. Obama dismissed the Islamic State as a 'JV team,' a Defense Intelligence Agency [DIA] report predicted the rise of the terror group and likely establishment of a caliphate if its momentum was not reversed. While the report was circulated to the CIA, State Department and senior military leaders, among others, it's not known whether Obama was ever briefed on the document. The DIA report, which was reviewed by Fox News, was obtained through a federal lawsuit by conservative watchdog Judicial Watch. Documents from the lawsuit also reveal a host of new details about events leading up to the 2012 Benghazi terror attack—and how the movement of weapons from Libya to Syria fueled the violence there. 'As Mrs. Clinton became closer to her current run for president, donations amounts appear to have increased.' The family has maintained that none of those donations influenced her decisions as secretary of state and that the money is strictly philanthropic. ... 'Some of these 'donations' are categorized by the unions as 'political' on their financial disclosure report' to the Labor Department, the report says." [75778, 75828]

As a result of a lawsuit, Judicial Watch obtains and releases formerly classified documents from the Department of Defense and the State Department. According to LevantReport.com, "Defense Intelligence Agency [DIA] documents circulated in 2012" show "that an 'Islamic State' is desired in Eastern Syria to effect the West's policies in the region. ...The DIA report, formerly classified 'SECRET//NOFORN' and dated August 12, 2012, was circulated widely among various government agencies, including CENTCOM, the CIA, FBI, DHS, NGA, State Dept., and many others. The document shows that as early as 2012, U.S. intelligence predicted the rise of the Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (ISIL or ISIS), but instead of clearly delineating the group as an enemy, the report envisions the terror group as a U.S. strategic asset. ...[T]his is the highest level internal U.S. intelligence confirmation of the theory that western governments fundamentally see ISIS as their own tool for regime change in Syria. Examiner.com adds that the documents confirm "suspicions that the United States and some of its so-called coalition partners had actually facilitated the rise of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) as an effective adversary against the government of the Syrian dictator President Bashar al-Assad. In addition, ISIS members were initially trained by members and contractors of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) at facilities in Jordan in 2012. The original goal was to weaken the Syrian government which had engaged in war crimes against their own people... The DIA report also predicted that ISIS would declare a caliphate through its affiliation with other terrorist organizations in Iraq and Syria, including members of what the Obama administration terms 'core al-Qaida' to differentiate it from offshoots such as al-Qaida in the Arabian Peninsula. The now declassified document appears to confirm that the U.S., the European Union and other nations viewed Muslim extremists in ISIS as 'a strategic asset toward regime change in Syria.' All of his concentration seems to be, 'How can I shine a better light on myself from a national perspective?'" While Castro was its mayor, San Antonio misused more than \$1 million in HUD funds. On the John Catsimatidis radio program New York City police Commissioner Bill Bratton calls for at least 450 additional police officers to combat terrorist threats. He says, "We need to be very concerned about terrorism... The significantly increased threat from ISIS using social media to recruit people not only to go to Syria to fight, but encouraging people ...to attack police, to attack government officials, to basically brainwash them under their screwed-up ideology. It did not say whether the movie would go back up." (The video, *Innocence of Muslims*, was falsely claimed by the Obama administration to have sparked the Benghazi terrorist attack in which four Americans were killed.) In Camden, New Jersey, Obama announces restrictions on supplying police departments with military equipment. According to NYPost.com, "Chelsea Clinton is so unpleasant to colleagues, she's causing high turnover at the Bill, Hillary and Chelsea Clinton Foundation, sources say. Several top staffers have left the foundation since Chelsea came on board as vice chairman in 2011. 'A lot of people left because she was there. A lot of people left because she didn't want them there,' an insider told me. 'She is very difficult.' ... None of this would surprise her former co-workers at McKinsey and NBC News. At both the management consulting firm and the network, co-workers allegedly were told they couldn't approach Chelsea. A source at NBC, where Chelsea was paid \$600,000 a year, said, 'If someone wanted to talk to Chelsea about something, they had to go through a producer.' For Bill

Clinton loyalists who grew the foundation from nothing, the high turnover and the ethical questions over its funding are demoralizing. 'It's sad to see what's happening. The operational planning has gone downhill,' said a source. Instead of being something Hillary can point to with pride, the foundation has become a bloated slush fund that some critics say deserves an official investigation. And Chelsea's fingerprints are all over it." [75847, 75861]

At PJMedia.com Debra Heine notes massive ISIS convoys in Iraq's Anbar Province, and asks why coalition forces are not bombing them. "Obama allegedly has [an alleged] coalition of 60 nations fighting ISIS with us and they only managed 19 airstrikes in a three-day period. During the Gulf War's 'Shock and Awe' campaign, the U.S. rained down 300 to 400 cruise missiles a day on Iraq for two consecutive days. Mrs. Clinton continued to pass around his memos even after other senior diplomats concluded that Mr. Blumenthal's assessments were often unreliable. ... While advising Mrs. Clinton on Libya, Mr. Blumenthal, who had been barred from a State Department job by aides to ...Obama, was also employed by her family's philanthropy, the Clinton Foundation, to help with research, 'message guidance' and the planning of commemorative events, according to foundation officials. During the same period, he also worked on and off as a paid consultant to Media Matters and American Bridge, organizations that helped lay the groundwork for Mrs. Clinton's 2016 campaign." (According to Politico.com, Blumenthal was paid about \$10,000 by the Clinton Foundation, from 2009 until March 2013. Blumenthal was also on the payroll of the Hillary-pushing leftist organizations Media

Americans get this wealth. Communist politics + mercantilist economics = stupidity. It won't go on forever. Enjoy it while you can." [75797]

At an orchestrated public appearance in Iowa, Fox News' Ed Henry shouts out a question to Hillary Clinton, who arrogantly and smugly responds, "Just, wait, wait. ... Maybe when I finish talking to the people here [who are almost certainly hand-picked supporters]. How's that? I might. I'll have to ponder it. I, I, I will put it on my list, for due consideration." Townhall.com's Guy Benson writes, "The imperiousness and sense of entitlement was palpable as America's beleaguered, sneering, put-upon sweetheart contemptuously sniffed at members of the free press for attempting to do their jobs. Following her stilted Q&A with supporters... Mrs. Clinton generously accepted Henry's request and chose to submit to fleeting questioning from a waiting gaggle of journalists. Over the course of a few short answers, she affirmed that she's 'proud' of the Clinton Foundation, downplayed a query about the Sid Blumenthal scheme by lamely chalking her actions up to keeping in touch with 'old friends,' and urged the State Department to release her emails—dismissing timing concerns by asserting that those communications don't belong to her. And then, like a vapor in the wind, she was gone. The official Hillary Questions Clock was duly reset, and now the press is back to panting about when she might next interact with them. We've reached a point where a presumptive major party presidential nominee lowering herself to field two minutes' worth of questions from reporters somehow qualifies as a breaking news event." (Clinton limits her time with reporters to about five minutes—which allows her to give vague, general answers while allowing no follow-up questions.) But I can't share my criticisms with you. ... So-called 'cleared advisors' like me are prohibited from sharing publicly the criticisms we've lodged about specific proposals and approaches. YNetNews.com reports, "Two attempts by Islamic State in Syria to take up positions along the Golan Heights border with Israel have been thwarted in the past two weeks. The two groups of IS-affiliated militants were threatening to expand the radical organization's sphere of influence close to the border with Israel." At JihadWatch.com, Robert Spencer writes, "Prediction: if the Islamic State gets into a position to threaten Israel in any serious way, we will start seeing the mainstream media grow markedly sympathetic to it, with a spate of articles hailing the new 'maturity' and 'moderation' of the Islamic State." The *Daily Mail* reports, "ISIS is sending the 'prettiest virgins' they capture to slave markets in the Syrian city of Raqqa, where they are sold as sexual objects to the highest bidder, the United Nation's Special Representative on Sexual Violence in Conflict has said. After the depraved militants attack their villages, they strip the girls naked, conduct virginity tests, evaluate their bodies and send them to twisted auctions, Zainab Bangura claims. She discovered the gruesome extent of Islamic State's sexual crimes against young women—particularly from Iraq's Yazidi minority community—after collecting information from Syria, Iraq, Turkey, Lebanon and Jordan." Zainab Bangura, head of a United Nations sex crimes investigation team tells MiddleEastEye.net, "After attacking a village, IS [the Islamic State, or ISIS] splits women from men and executes boys and men aged 14 and over. The women and mothers are separated; girls are stripped naked, tested for virginity and examined for breast size and prettiness. The youngest, and those considered the prettiest virgins fetch higher prices and are sent to Ragga, the IS stronghold. There is a hierarchy: sheikhs get first choice, then emirs, then fighters. They often take three or four girls each and keep them for a month or so, until they grow tired of a girl, when she goes back to market. At slave auctions, buyers haggle fiercely, driving down prices by disparaging girls as flat-chested or unattractive. We heard about one girl who was traded 22 times, and another, who had escaped, told us that the sheikh who had captured her wrote his name on the back of her hand to show that she was his 'property.'" Members of ISIS "commit rape, sexual slavery, forced prostitution and other acts of extreme brutality. We heard one case of a 20-year-old girl who was burned alive because she refused to perform an extreme sex act. We learned of many other sadistic sexual acts. We struggled to understand the mentality of people who commit such crimes. ... When IS discovered girls used their headscarves to hang themselves, they forced them to remove them. I learned of three girls who tried to commit suicide by drinking rat poison, which had been left in a room. They started vomiting and were rushed to hospital and washed out. When they came back, they were brutally attacked." [75982, 76003]

At Townhall.com Guy Benson notes that not only have Bill and Hillary Clinton made at least \$30 million for speeches over the last 16 months, and more than \$125 million since leaving the White House, both of them have received six-figure payments for delivering

At DailySignal.com Veronique de Rugy writes, "The charter of the Export-Import Bank is set to expire on June 30 unless it is reauthorized by Congress. Scare tactics of bank supporters aside, the end of Ex-Im would not mean the loss of thousands of American jobs. Economists have long understood that subsidies doled out by government credit agencies such as the Ex-Im Bank are not only unnecessary, but that they can actually harm the economy. Yet in their quest to keep the subsidies flowing, proponents of the bank are claiming that failure to reauthorize its charter would lead to massive job loss. This blatant fear-mongering has caused concern among some lawmakers. House Speaker John Boehner [R-OH] only made matters worse on April 30, when he asserted that 'there are thousands of jobs on the line that would disappear pretty quickly if the Ex-Im Bank were to disappear.' First, and fundamentally, export subsidies do not 'create' or 'support' jobs—they redistribute them from unsubsidized firms to subsidized ones. Second, the job numbers touted by bank officials are dubious, at best, and have been roundly criticized as misleading by the Government Accountability Office, among others." De Rugy notes that companies like Boeing, General Electric, and Caterpillar "all have billions of dollars of backorders that will keep workers busy for years to come" and do not need the Export-Import Bank lending money to foreign countries to subsidize additional orders. The Export-Import Bank has provided foreign purchasers of Boeing planes with tens of billions of dollars to fund those purchases. The argument that those loans "create jobs at Boeing" is nonsensical, because other American jobs are destroyed by taking those billions from the U.S. economy. The government cannot lend \$10 billion to a foreign country to buy Boeing planes without first taking that \$10 billion from the taxpayers. Thus, every Boeing job created is more or less matched by a job lost somewhere else. Further, those foreign countries would buy Boeing, General Electric, and Caterpillar products even without the loans. The Export-Import Banks essentially declares that jobs at those companies are more important than other American jobs. Those decisions should be made by the free market, not government bureaucrats. Additionally, the government does not even have the cash it gives to the Export-Import Bank to lend to other countries. Because the U.S. government is operating at a deficit, the government must first borrow the money from China (or others) to lend. The taxpayers are then stuck with the bill for interest on those loans from China. The entire premise of the Export-Import Bank is flawed. The government could just as easily skip the pretense of lending cash to another country so that it can buy Boeing planes, and simply give the cash directly to the Boeing workers and tell them to not bother going to work. (Hillary Clinton is a strong supporter

of the Export-Import bank—perhaps because Boeing and General Electric have donated to the Clinton Foundation. Hillary Clinton cannot be president of the United States because she is not trustworthy. ... We need a nominee who can take a punch and who can throw a punch. We need a nominee who can win this job. But we also need someone who can do this job." [75900]

On May 21 NYPost.com reports, "New emails show Hillary Clinton got early warning that the deadly Sept. 11, 2012, attacks in Benghazi were premeditated terrorism and not a spontaneous response to an anti-Muslim video. Sidney Blumenthal, Clinton's longtime trusted friend and former campaign adviser, sent an intelligence assessment to the secretary of state's personal account on Sept. 13, 2012—two days after four Americans were killed at the Benghazi outpost. Citing sensitive sources, Blumenthal wrote Clinton that the attacks 'had been planned for approximately one month' and carried out by 'welltrained, hardened killers' from Ansar al-Sharia, the Libyan terrorist group. The emails, obtained by The New York Times, says the attackers wanted to use protests as cover for the siege. This was a change from his sources' assessment a day earlier—which he also shared with Clinton—that the attacks were a reaction to a US video that defamed the Prophet Muhammad. The Obama administration insisted in the week following Benghazi that the video was linked to the attacks that killed Ambassador Chris Stevens and three other Americans. UN Ambassador Susan Rice reiterated on Sunday talk shows that the attack began 'spontaneously' as a reaction to the video. 'We do not have information at present that leads us to conclude that this was premeditated or preplanned,' Rice said Sept. 16, 2012, on CBS's 'Face the Nation.'" (It is worth noting that the Clinton emails released so far are among those that she has allowed to be released. There are thousands she has refused to release—and may even have deleted. It is also worth noting that Sidney Blumenthal is the father of far-left journalist Max Blumenthal.) [75928, 76101]

ISIS controls about half of Syria, half of Iraq, and is gaining strength in Libya and elsewhere. [75891, 75892, 75901]

Asked in the interview how the United States can negotiate with people who "are captive to a conspiratorial anti-Semitic worldview" and "hold ridiculous views," Obama replies, "Well the fact that you are anti-Semitic, or racist, doesn't preclude you from being interested in survival. It doesn't preclude you from being rational about the need to keep your economy afloat; it doesn't preclude you from making strategic decisions about how you stay in power; and so the fact that the [Iranian] supreme leader is anti-Semitic doesn't mean that this overrides all of his other considerations. But the costs here are not low, and what we've been very clear [about] to the Iranian regime over the past six years is that we will continue to ratchet up the costs, not simply for their anti-Semitism, but also for whatever expansionist ambitions they may have. That's what the sanctions represent. That's what the military option I've made clear I preserve represents. And so I think it is not at all contradictory to say that there are deep strains of anti-Semitism in the core regime, but that they also are interested in maintaining power, having some semblance of

legitimacy inside their own country, which requires that they get themselves out of what is a deep economic rut that we've put them in, and on that basis they are then willing and prepared potentially to strike an agreement on their nuclear program." [75892]

Obama's response shows him to be delusional. His administration has most certainly not done anything to impose costs for Iran's anti-Semitism. If anything, Obama's anti-Israel statements and actions have demonstrated that he is on the side of the anti-Semites. Further, for Obama to claim that Iran's leaders are rational is absurd; he may as well have argued that Adolph Hitler was rational. The cost of Hitler's irrationality was not only not low, it was monumental—yet it did not stop him from taking actions that led to the deaths of tens of millions of people across Europe and in the Soviet Union. With journalists eagerly asking Republican presidential candidates, "Knowing what you know now, do you believe it was a good idea to invade Iraq in 2003?", Senator Tom Cotton (R-AR) tells WashingtonExaminer.com, "Knowing what we know now, I absolutely would have sent the Pacific Fleet out of Pearl Harbor on December 4 to intercept the Japanese Fleet. I say that to highlight how foolish the question is. You don't get to live life in reverse. What a leader has to do is make a decision, at the moment of decision, based on the best information he has. George Bush did that in 2002 and 2003 and he was supported by Hillary Clinton and Joe Biden and John Kerry and every western country's intelligence agency. ... There are lessons we can learn from the early

days of the Iraq war. One is that we clearly should be more critically analytical about our approach to intelligence assessments." (Journalists should ask Hillary Clinton, "Knowing what you know now about ISIS, would you still support Obama's decision to pull U.S. troops out of Iraq?") [75893, 75915]

The disclosure came as the foundation faced questions over whether it fully complied with a 2008 ethics agreement to reveal its donors and whether any of its funding sources present conflicts of interest for Hillary Rodham Clinton as she begins her presidential campaign. The money was paid as fees for speeches by Bill, Hillary and Chelsea Clinton." [75929]

Katie Pavlich reports at Townhall.com, "Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee Chuck Grassley [R-IA] has sent a letter to Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson demanding to know why an illegal alien who was working as a camp counselor, charged with child molestation and with distributing nearly 1000 images of child pornography, may have avoided deportation under ... Obama's deferred action program (DACA). ... According to Grassley and cited whistleblowers, [Edgar] Covarrubias-Padilla was scheduled for deportation but approved for DACA and a work permit in October 2012. Further, it seems DHS was aware his heinous behavior and allowed him to stay in the country anyway, jeopardizing the safety and well being of the children he was working with. ... Over the past two months, Grassley has written two letters to Secretary Johnson with inquiries about other criminal illegal aliens. Emanuel Rangel-Hernandez, who was charged with four counts of first-degree murder in North Carolina, and Jose Bojorquez who was recently charged with second degree murder. Rangel-Hernandez and Bojorquez were both scheduled for deportation but were able to staying in the United States thanks to, again, ... Obama's DACA program." [75886]

Senator James Inhofe (R-OK) comments on Obama's focus on "climate change" in his address to Coast Guard graduates: "It shows that [he is] getting more and more desperate. The Independent reports, "Google has apologised for offence caused by vandalism of its Maps tools that meant that users searching for racist terms are being sent White House. In what appears to be a result of Google bombing—where vandals flood a certain keyword with links to a place, meaning that the two will become associated in Google's results—users forced searches for 'nigger house' and 'nigger king' to redirect to the White House." By a vote of 62-38 the Senate votes to proceed with legislation giving Obama "fast-track" trade authority, giving the White House a victory—and the power to more quickly consummate trade deals. [75905]

According to the Department of Labor, first-time claims for unemployment benefits increased by about 10,000 to 274,000 for the week ending May 16. [75906]

Retired U.S. Army General Jack Keane testifies before the Senate Armed Services Committee. He states, "While there has been some progress and some success [in the fight against ISIS and the support of Iraq], looking at this strategy today, we know now that the conceptual plan is fundamentally flawed. The resources provided to support Iraq are far from adequate. The timing and urgency to provide arms, equipment, and training is insufficient. And as such we are not only failing, we are losing this war. Moreover, I can say with certainty that this strategy will not defeat ISIS. ... We have no strategy to defeat ISIS in Syria. We have no ground force which is [necessary to defeat ISIS]. Yes we have air power, but air power will not defeat ISIS. It has not been able to deny ISIS freedom of maneuver or the ability to attack at will. Syria is ISIS' sanctuary. We cannot succeed in Iraq if ISIS is allowed to maintain that sanctuary in Syria. ... ISIS is expanding beyond Iraq and Syria into Sinai, Yemen, Libya and Afghanistan. They are also inspiring and motivating radical sympathizers throughout the world. Yet there is no strategy with our allies to counter that expansion. I would go farther to say that there is no strategy to counter the destabilization of the Middle East." [75909]

Also at the Senate hearing, Dr. Frederick Kagan (who Townhall.com notes "is perhaps most famous for helping devise President George W. Bush's 'surge' strategy), observes, "This [ISIS] is not a terrorist organization. This is an army that is conducting military maneuvers on an operational level with a great deal of skill. It is not an accident that Ramadi fell over the weekend and Palmyra fell yesterday. This was a coherent campaign plan and a very intelligent one—very well executed. What I can't discern from the daily operations, let alone from the statements from the administration, is any coherent American strategy to respond to this threat. ... ISIS is one of the most evil organizations that has ever existed in the world. We really have to reckon with that. This is not a minor annoyance. And this is a group that is calling for and condoning and supporting and encouraging lone wolf attacks—and it will soon, I think, not be just lone wolf attacks—in the United States and the West. This is a group of unfathomable evil, and unfortunately they are extremely effective. And they have a degree of military capability, not terrorist capability, that we have not seen before in an al Qaeda organization. This is not something where we should be spectators." [75909]

Australia moves to revoke the citizenship of citizens who leave the country to fight for ISIS. The Associated Press reports, "The government wants to change the Citizenship Act to make fighting for ISIS a reason for losing citizenship, Immigration Minister Peter Dutton said. The government also wants to adopt the British legal model by revoking the citizenship of extremists who are Australian-born children of immigrants or an immigrant, forcing them to take up citizenship in the birth country of their parents, or parent, Dutton said. It also would apply to dual citizens. "The principle for us, which is very important, is that we don't render people stateless," Dutton told Sydney Radio 2GB. Australia can currently only revoke citizenship in cases of fraud in the citizenship application or where an Australian citizen joins the armed forces of another country to fight Australia. Because the Islamic State movement is not recognized as a state, membership is not a ground for losing Australian citizenship, Dutton said." [75920, 75921, 76427]

According to a May 8-11 YouGov poll, 51 percent of surveyed Democrats support making "hate speech" a crime. (That is, they oppose the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.) At WashingtonExaminer.com Philip Klein reports, "In recent weeks, large insurers selling coverage through Obamacare have proposed massive rate increases for 2016—even exceeding 40 percent—because they haven't been able to sign up enough young and healthy customers. This is an ominous sign for the future of Obamacare, because two federal programs that were supposed to act as training wheels for insurers in the early years of Obamacare by absorbing excess risk are set to expire after 2016. If insurers don't

do a better job of attracting a healthier risk pool, 2017 promises to be a rocky year for insurance markets, regardless of which party is in control of the White House. ... Now that insurers have had more time to look at the claims coming in from those enrolling from Obamacare, they're finding that the pool of customers is older and sicker than originally projected, driving up medical costs. ... Further, he cited sources saying roughly 21 fighters left from a base in East Benghazi and 'infiltrated the crowd' and began opening fire on the U.S. consulate. Libyan officers, he wrote, said the attacks were 'planned' for roughly one month. ... Despite the guidance, then-U.N. Ambassador Susan Rice went on several television programs Sept. 16 to claim the attacks were 'spontaneous,' and not premeditated, and link them to protests over the anti-Islam video. The department appeared to back her. In an email sent that day from top department official Jake Sullivan to Clinton, he said Rice had made clear 'our view' that 'this started spontaneously and then evolved." [75930, 75931, 75938]

The Associated Press reports, "Former Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton received information on her private email server about the deadly attack on U.S. diplomatic facilities in Benghazi that has now been classified. The email in question, forwarded to Clinton by her deputy chief of staff, Jake Sullivan, relates to reports of arrests in Libya of possible suspects in the attack. ...Friday's redaction shows that

Clinton received information considered sensitive on her unsecured personal server, which came to light just as she was beginning her presidential campaign." [75933]

In Oklahoma, former U.S. ambassador to the United Nations John Bolton addresses the Southern Republican Leadership Conference. He states, "I think the most telling information that we have seen in this limited number of emails is that there are repeated examples of Secretary of State Clinton being told in 2011 and 2012 that the security situation of our personnel in Tripoli and Benghazi was very precarious. The country's government had fallen apart—that the threat from terrorist attacks was high and that our people were very concerned about it. Now you'll recall in her limited public appearances to date that she has said, 'You know, I don't get involved in that security stuff, you know, I have people that do that.' Well, I have to say when I heard that I was stunned. I've worked for six different secretaries of state, everyone of them coming from very different backgrounds, every one of them cared about the safety of the Americans who worked for them in the State Department. And not one of them would have missed the danger that our diplomats in Libya faced. And this was called to her attention repeatedly and she didn't do anything about it. So when we ask the question, who is responsible for the tragedy of the murder of U.S. Ambassador Christopher Stevens and three other Americans in Benghazi, there is a very clear answer. It was Hillary Clinton. She said she didn't know the security situation in Libya, these documents alone, these are the first documents, it's only going to get worse after this, after the other documents come out, but these documents alone, we know she was advised repeatedly about how dangerous it was." Obama speaks at the Adas Israel Congregation in Washington, D.C. (May is Jewish American Heritage Month.) Obama pushes support for his nuclear deal with Iran, saying, "This deal will have my name on it. Nobody has a bigger personal stake in making sure that it delivers on its promise. I'm interested in a deal that blocks every single one of Iran's paths to a nuclear weapon. ...I can't stand here today and guarantee an agreement will be reached. We're working hard. [But] the people of Israel must always know, America has its back and America will always have its back. ...[N]o administration has done more to ensure that Israel can protect itself than this one." (Arguably, no administration has done more to *make it necessary* for Israel to worry about protecting itself.) [75942, 75943, 75944, 75949, 75966, 75975]

Obama also calls for the creation of a Palestinian state, pleasing some Jews and angering others. The leftist "J Street" lobby states, "...Obama's speech was notable because it laid out the fundamental principle that supporting Israel does not require blind support for every policy adopted by its government. ...We believe it is a view shared by the overwhelming majority of American Jews who love and support Israel but are dismayed by the stated positions of so many in the new Netanyahu government." Matt Brooks, executive director of the Republican Jewish Coalition states, "...Obama is not a friend to American Jews or Israel. Despite his best efforts, [Obama's] push to rewrite history and paper over the insults of the past will fail. ...Obama and his administration have attempted to isolate Israel by badgering and berating its democratically-elected Prime Minister in public. At the same time, they appease Islamist Iran—on its way to a nuclear

Goldberg is one of Obama's favorite Jewish journalists and is one of Obama's emissaries to the Jewish community. He repeatedly grants one-on-one interviews with Goldberg who, in turn, routinely touts Obama's pro-Israel bona-fides. Obama rarely grants interviews but will do so when he knows there will be no gotcha questions and he has a 'friendly' journalist who will serve his own purposes. Furthermore, the rabbi who praised Obama is Rabbi Gil Steinlauf. The rabbi made news a few years ago when he declared he was gay, even though he had been married for 20 years, Understandably, gay marriage is an important issue for him so he must be very appreciative for Obama's changed stance on gay marriage. Rabbi Steinlauf has made it very easy to view his priorities by having his blog. The blog is heavily populated with postings focusing on gay marriage and attacks on the religious right. Perusing the blog, I don't see any entries concerning the explosion of anti-Semitism in America and the world-let alone violence perpetrated on Jews as Jews. He agrees with Obama's scathing criticism of Prime Minister of Israel, Benjamin Netanyahu. Other posts are titled 'Slavery lives in our attitudes' and 'A Rabbi on the Economy & The Great Gatsby'—a critique of capitalism and free enterprise. Did any of the media outlets' actually drill down to why this particular synagogue would be so welcoming to Obama's speech? Did any journalist bother to point out this synagogue and its congregants are not reflective of anything other than Obama's political strategy to con American Jews into accepting a deal with Iran that will ineluctably lead to its becoming a nuclear armed terror state?" What Lloyd found was that the standard deviation of the temperature over the last 8,000 years was about 0.98 degrees Celsius—higher than the 0.85 degrees climate scientists say the world has warmed over the last century. 'This suggests that while some portion of the temperature change observed in the 20th century was probably caused by greenhouse gases, there is a strong likelihood that the major portion was due to natural variations,' Lloyd wrote in his study. ...If Lloyd's results hold, the IPCC may have to revise how much warming it attributes to mankind. In any case, the IPCC's estimate of man-made and natural warming (0.85 degrees) is still below the standard deviation for the last 8,000, according to Lloyd's results. This means that warming is not very significant within the context of the Earth's recent climate history." [75934, 75937]

According to the *Daily Mail*, "ISIS has released a chilling document in which it justifies the kidnapping and rape of slave girls—and brands Michelle Obama a prostitute whose

'price won't even exceed a third of a dinar.' These shocking admissions are made by a jihadi bride in the ninth edition of its propaganda magazine Dabiq, in a feature entitled: 'Slave girls or prostitutes.'" [75948, 75960, 75962, 75963]

The Senate votes to approve give "fast-track" authority to negotiate trade agreements. According to Politico.com, "The bill allows the White House to send trade agreements to Congress for straight up-or-down votes without any amendments, a procedure critics say is undemocratic but proponents say is needed to ensure other countries put their best offers on the table." (The legislation will face resistance in the House.)

The Democrat National Committee issues a Tweet showing a June 2014 photograph of Obama eating an ice cream cone while surrounded by adoring members of the media, and the caption, "Happy Memorial Day weekend, everyone!" (What Obama eating ice cream has to do with honoring the memory of members of the military who gave their lives to secure the freedoms enjoyed by all Americans is not clear.) On Special Report, Charles Krauthammer comments on the release of a few hundred of Hillary Clinton's emails: "This is an echo of what her own press secretary said, ... 'There isn't a shred of evidence.' And as I've said again and again, there isn't a shred of evidence because she shredded the evidence. This whole release is a farce. What is being released now, as [Congressman Trey] Gowdy [R-SC] indicates, is stuff that was scrubbed and cleansed and decided upon, chosen by her own people, acting in her own interests, rather than, as should happen, as the law requires to happen... the choosing ought to be done by people with an obligation to the public. So we are getting the cleaned-up version. And I think they are succeeding, the Clinton people, because everybody is hungrily looking through stuff pre-scrubbed. They are not going to find anything. The Clintons are secretive and deceptive, but they are not stupid. On May 23 the Senate votes to block the USA Freedom Act, legislation to reauthorize the Patriot Act *without* the National Security Administration's bulk phone record surveillance program. The House, in conflict with the Senate, passed the legislation by a vote of 338-88 earlier in the month. [75959]

Obama says in a video, "Hi, everybody! This weekend is Memorial Day, a time to pay tribute to all our men and women in uniform who've ever given their lives so that we could live in the [sic] freedom and security. This year, the holiday is especially meaningful. It's the first Memorial Day since our war ended in Afghanistan..." (Obama's demeanor is especially cheery, which is odd for a statement about fallen members of the

armed forces. Additionally, of course, the war in Afghanistan has not ended.) [76017, 76018, 76068]

At LewRockwell.com former director of the Office of Management and Budget David Stockman notes that in December 2007 the Bureau of Labor Statistics "reported 138.4 million payroll jobs. Last month the number was just 141.4 million, meaning that only 3 million net jobs have been created over the last 88 months. Again, that compares to 6 million new jobs in the comparable period after the 2000 peak and 13 million in the seven years after 1990. ...[T]he US economy has actually shed 2 million full-time, higher paying 'breadwinner' [jobs] since December 2007—down from 72 million to just 70 million in the April report. Accordingly, the net 3 million gain in the total payroll count is entirely attributable to a 2 million pickup in the part time economy—restaurant's [sic], bars, retail and personal services—and a 3 million gain in the fiscally dependent HES Complex (health, education and social services)." BizPacReview.com reports, "Protesters took to the streets and the Department of Justice promised an investigation after a judge on Saturday acquitted a Cleveland patrolman of manslaughter in the 2012 killing of a black couple suspected of firing at police. A Democrat congresswoman [Marcia Fudge, (D-OH)] called the verdict in the case against Officer Michael Brelo a 'miscarriage of justice,' but the judge in the case said he refused to 'sacrifice' Brelo to the nation's current hysteria over police use of force. According to Fox News, Brelo jumped on the hood of a car containing Timothy Russell and Malissa Williams and fired after a November, 2012, chase that started when Russell's car backfired when it was passing the Cleveland police headquarters. Thinking someone in the car had fired a weapon, police began a pursuit that turned into a high-speed chase. Police never determined why Russell didn't stop at some point during the 22-mile pursuit. The chase ended only after he rammed a police car in a middle school parking lot, according to CNN." [75968, 75972]

Meanwhile, violent crime is on the increase in Baltimore, perhaps partly because police officers are reluctant to respond to emergency calls without first getting back-up. Police Commissioner Anthony Batts tells *The Baltimore Sun*, "Officers tell me and their supervisors, any time they pull up to respond to a call, they have 30 to 50 people surrounding them. We have to send in multiple units just to do basic police work, which says we have to work on community engagement." [75969, 75970, 76100]

Byron Allen, CEO of Entertainment Studios, tells TMZ "...Obama is, at this point, a white president in black face. Black America would have done much better with a white president. It is a debt we can never fully repay, but it is a debt we will never stop trying to fully repay. By remaining a nation worthy of their sacrifice. By living our own lives the way the fallen lived theirs—a testament that 'Greater love has no other than this, than to lay down your life for your friends.' We are so grateful for them. We are so grateful for the families of our fallen. May God bless our fallen heroes and their families, and all who serve. And may He continue to bless the United States of America." They were three tactical units, eight buildings, two armored vehicles, two mortars, an ammunition storage area and a command center. 'This is worse than pathetic,' the former official said. ... The former official said a commitment of U.S. special operations forces and some infantry 'could defeat the Islamic State in weeks.' 'But then what?' the source asked, noting that the Shiite-dominated government has badly mismanaged the post-U.S. environment. 'I have never seen such disgruntlement before,' the source said of the mood in the Pentagon. Another official said a constant theme inside the Pentagon is that the White House does not seem committed to winning. The frequent public relations spin is that this will be a long process to take down the Islamic State when, in fact, officers say, it does not have to be." (Rather than hundreds of bombing runs per day, the Air Force typically conducts only about one dozen.) [76042, 76102, 76235]

The Baltimore Sun reports, "The recent rioting and unrest in Baltimore will cost the city an estimated \$20 million, officials said Tuesday. The expenses—which go before the city's spending board for approval Wednesday—include overtime for police and firefighters, damage to city-owned property and repaying other jurisdictions for police and other assistance. Henry J. Raymond, Baltimore's finance director, said the city can temporarily cover the costs from its rainy day fund while seeking reimbursement for up to 75 percent from Federal Emergency Management Agency. ...Both Gov. Larry Hogan and Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake have requested federal aid." (Protesters damaged the city because the police were ordered to "stand down," with Rawlings-Burke giving the looters and arsonists "space to destroy," and city and state officials want taxpayers from outside the area to cover 75 percent of the costs of their own failures.) The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit rules two-to-one in favor of Texas and against the administration by upholding Judge Andrew S. Hanan's injunction against the implementation of Obama's executive order regarding the deportation of illegal immigrants. The court states, "The public interest favors maintenance of the injunction." Thousands of fraudulent returns were filed under the attack, and final details about the amount the criminals stole is not available, though Mr. Koskinen predicted it will be less than \$50 million. 'This is not a security breach. Our basic information is secure,' Mr. Koskinen insisted in a call with reporters to discuss the theft, which he said came from online access by fraudsters, who he described as part of an organized crime syndicate. The IRS is sending out notices to those they have determined were affected by the breach, and has opened a criminal investigation into the operation." (Americans are supposed to believe there was no "security breach," while at the same time being advised that more than 100,000 people affected by the breach are being notified.) Senator Orrin Hatch (R-UT) responds, "That the IRS—home to highly sensitive information on every single American and every single company doing business here at home—was vulnerable to this attack is simply unacceptable." AFP reports, "A Kenyan lawyer has offered ...Obama 50 cows and other assorted livestock in exchange for his 16-year old daughter Malia's hand in marriage... Felix Kiprono said he was willing to pay 50 cows, 70 sheep and 30 goats in order to fulfil his dream of marrying the first daughter. 'I got interested in her in 2008,' Kiprono said, in an interview with The Nairobian newspaper. At that time ...Obama was running for office for the first time and Malia was a 10-year-old. Quinn points out that corporate profits as a percentage of GDP are far above the sixdecade average. "Corporate profits as a percentage of GDP have averaged 6.3% over the last six decades. They deviate wildly above and below this mean, with peaks attained near stock market highs and valleys at stock market lows. The current level of 8.7% is two standard deviations above the 6.3% long-term average, meaning it is above 95% of all instances in history. Based on history, what are the odds of corporate profits rising to three standard deviations above the mean (99.7% above all instances)? Not good. They have already fallen from the 10.1% high in 2012. ... Over the last six decades, when corporate profits edged above 6.3% of GDP, competition from new companies taking advantage of the high profits would result in price drops and eventually lower profits. It was called capitalism. The Great Deformation created by the Federal Reserve Politburo dictates and monetary machinations have disconnected corporate profits and stock market gains from the real world of everyday Americans. And it comes amid years of complaints from Republicans about ... Obama's regulatory agenda, which has encompassed everything from power plants and health insurers to Internet providers and for-profit colleges. Critics are already fighting back: The House voted earlier this month to block the rule, with support from both Republicans and some farm- and energy-state Democrats, and similar legislation is moving through the Senate." 'The input helped us understand the genuine concerns and interests of a wide range of stakeholders and think through options to address them,' McCarthy recently wrote on her blog. What McCarthy did not mention, and what was reported last week in The New York Times, is that the EPA used government resources to coordinate with environmentalist groups in order to achieve this 90 percent support. Through an intense effort in what is known as 'grassroots lobbying,' the government worked to encourage people on one side of the debate to make their voices heard, so as to skew perceptions of public opinion. In addition to meeting behind closed doors with environmentalist leaders supportive of the rule, the agency used a social media tool called Thunderclap. It is like Kickstarter, but users donate social media shares instead of money. By getting just under 1,000 left-wing activists to sign on, the EPA was able to urge 1.8 million people in their political circles, all at once, to comment favorably on the proposed rule. This helped generate levels of support for the rule more appropriate to Saddam Hussein's re-election results than to any serious issue discussed in a democracy. The agency's rigging of the result made a sham of the entire comment process. And it may have even been against federal laws that forbid government agencies from lobbying." [76081]

Klayman says, "It's a perfect RICO case, it fits completely. Our Congress doesn't even have the guts to subpoena her documents. They'd rather get on Fox News. So we felt had to bring that case. The material in question was prepared at Dugway Proving Ground, Utah, as part of what was described as a 'routine' research process. It was then sent out to Defense Department and commercial labs in nine states—the shipments were supposed to include only inactive, or dead, anthrax when they were transferred." [76080, 76098]

In the piece, he implicated anti-Muslim activist Steve Klein as a consultant on the Hollywood-produced film. 'Pls print,' Hillary Clinton wrote to her colleague, referring to Max Blumenthal's article. Where did Hillary get the link from originally? That part is redacted. Republicans in the House filed a lawsuit in November, saying administration officials unlawfully bypassed Congress. At issue are executive changes authorizing Treasury payments to healthcare insurers without the funding being agreed by Congress and delaying implementation of the law's employer mandate, which required employers with more than 50 employees to provide healthcare coverage." Collyer "repeatedly interrupted U.S. Justice Department lawyer Joel McElvain during the hearing in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia. 'So it is your position that if the House of Representatives affirmatively voted not to fund something... then that vote can be ignored by the administration, because after all, no one can sue them?' she asked. McElvain argued that the merits of the case were not being discussed at the hearing, and that any perceived injury was 'abstract.' 'I'm not asking you to give me your brief. I want you to explain... why it's not an insult to the Constitution?" Collyer said. [76110, 76125, 76131, 76156, 76169]

The threats were all similar and the caller claimed the flights were carrying some form of chemical weapons, the officials said, adding that some investigators' leading theory was that sympathizers of Islamic State were responsible." BloombergView.com's Eli Lake reports, "The U.S. watched Islamic State fighters, vehicles and heavy equipment gather on the outskirts of Ramadi before the group retook the city in mid-May. It surprised no one, one U.S. intelligence official told me." (Robert Spencer asks at JihadWatch.org, "Did they want the Iraqis to win a great victory over the Islamic State all by themselves? Rather than run anti-jihad ads from the American Freedom Defense Initiative the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority decides it will simply not run any ads that are political in nature. The AFDI's Pamela Geller calls the decision "an end run around the First Amendment." (HotAir.com comments, "Imagine being a D.C. bus driver and finding out you'll be spending the next few weeks joined at the hip to a giant Mohammed cartoon for eight hours a day. [Philadelphia] authorities also acknowledged fears of terrorism when they opposed Geller's ad; in fact, they said at the time that drivers who objected to being behind the wheel of a bus with it on the side would be 'given a level of understanding that would be different than in other situations.' Those acknowledgments are a minor victory for Geller even if her ad, and everyone else's ads, ends up being cashiered. She's forcing the state to admit that the threat of violence is so great that, as a matter of pure public safety, they'd rather give up easy revenue than take the chance of insulting 'the prophet.' And, thanks to D.C.'s new policy, she's gotten the state to spread the cost of censorship to other would-be issue-advertisers, which drives home the point to the wider public that the slippery slope on 'hate speech' might be more slippery than the lefties who disdain her tend to assume.") U.S. officials said three of the prisoners worked in private-sector [sic; private sector] jobs and that a fourth, whose occupation is unknown, has dual U.S.-Yemeni citizenship. Further, new information shows Bergdahl not only deserted, but started planning for his departure by sleeping on the floor and prepared himself for life outside of the military. The White House maintains officials weren't and still aren't sure about the circumstances

surrounding his capture by the Taliban. Bergdahl will stand trial at Ft. Sam Houston later this year." [76124]

The new measures would apply to federal lands in California, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah and Wyoming." Well, I've got news for the bullies of Wall Street, the presidency is not a crown to be passed back and forth by you between two royal families. Angela Byers states, "It's scary. And it's scary to us. I'm not sure the general public quite gets the gravity of it. ... It seems like once we get one guy, another guy pops up high on the radar. According to TheHill.com, the Department of Justice "plans to move forward this year with more than a dozen new gun-related regulations, according to list of rules the agency has proposed to enact before the end of the Obama administration. The regulations range from new restrictions on high-powered pistols to gun storage requirements. Chief among them is a renewed effort to keep guns out of the hands of people who are mentally unstable or have been convicted of domestic abuse. ...But the gun lobby contends that such a sweeping ban would unfairly root out a number of prospective gun owners who

(The State Department insists the nuclear talks with Iran will maintain the "exact same timetable as before his accident." The nuclear deal deadline is June 30.) [76176, 76177, 76215, 76223, 76331]

The Senate votes 77-17 to consider the USA Freedom Act, exceeding the 60 votes needed to stop a filibuster. Politico.com notes, "However, three key Patriot Act provisions are still set to lapse at midnight after Senator Rand Paul (R-KY) again blocked short-term extensions." Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) "hopes to pass the House bill, with modest alterations, as soon as possible, viewing it as the only viable option given the time constraint. That could take until the middle of the week." On the floor of the Senate, Paul says, "I'm not going to take it anymore. I don't think the American people are going to take it anymore. ... This is a debate over the Bill of Rights. This is a debate over the Fourth Amendment. This is a debate over your right to be left

alone." (The Senate then adjourns, leaving the three Patriot Act provisions to expire. On June 2 the Senate will likely approve the USA Freedom Act, which the House had already passed.) [76188, 76211, 76213]

Paul has more reverence for the U.S. Constitution and the Fourth Amendment than most in the House and the Senate—and the White House. The amendment states, "The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized." (Some argue that the NSA's collection of telephone "metadata" does not violate the Fourth Amendment because that information is owned by the telephone companies, not the telephone company customers. Of course, that argument ignores the fact that the Fourth Amendment also applies to telephone companies. In addition, it must be remembered that the Director of National Intelligence, James Clapper, lied to Congress about what intelligence agencies were collecting and they were doing with the information.)
